BYU STORYLINES

- **LAST MEETING.** This is the 85th meeting between BYU and Utah State. The Aggies won the last meeting 35-20 in Provo in 2014, the first win in Provo since 1978 for Utah State. The Cougars lost quarterback Taysom Hill to a leg injury in the first half and couldn't come back from an early deficit.
- **COUGARS TURNED AGGIES.** About 126 miles from BYU, Utah State has several staff members that spent time at BYU either as a coach or a player including associate head coach Mark Weber, director of player personnel Reed Hornung, special assistant Dave Kragthorpe and graduate assistant Kelly Bills.
- **MOUNTAIN WEST.** The Cougars are facing an opponent from the Mountain West for the fourth time this season with a chance to go 4-0 against their old league. BYU defeated Boise State, San Jose State and Fresno State earlier this year. The Cougars are 281-154-13 against current Mountain West teams.
- **PLAYING FRESHMEN.** BYU has played 29 freshmen this season (16 true, 13 redshirts), the third-most in the country. Only Rice (31) and TCU (30) have played more freshmen than the Cougars.
- **REGULAR SEASON FINALE.** Under Mendenhall, BYU is 7-3 in final regular season games.
- **BLUE ZONE SCORING.** BYU is the No. 1 offensive team in the FBS inside the 20, scoring at a rate of 95.3 percent, just ahead of San Diego State's No. 2 rank with 95.0 percent. The Cougars TD percentage of 72.1 percent is ranked No. 12, just behind Oklahoma State's 73.1 percent.

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

BYU ROLLS FRESNO STATE 52-10

PROVO, Utah – BYU football won its final home game of the season against Fresno State 52-10 on Senior Day to finish the season undefeated at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

BYU (8-3) outgained Fresno State (3-8, 2-5 Mountain West) 520 yards to 275. The Cougars were a perfect 5 for 5 on blue-zone attempts in the win and forced three turnovers leading to 21 points.

Tanner Mangum went 24 of 37 for 336 yards and one touchdown. Moroni Lauulu-Pututau led the Cougars with 95 receiving yards and one touchdown. In rushing yards, Algernon Brown led the team with 97 yards and one touchdown.

For the defense, Bronson Kaufusi filled out the stat sheet. He had a team-high five total tackles, four tackles for loss, one pass breakup and three sacks.

BYU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- **Tanner Mangum QB (Fr.)**
Had his fourth career game with 300 or more passing yards, finishing the game 24 of 37 for 336 yards and one touchdown.
- **Bronson Kaufusi DL (Sr.)**
Recorded three sacks, four tackles for loss, one pass breakup and a blocked field goal. His 10 sacks is a career high for a season and is the most for a BYU player since 2012 when Kyle Van Noy had 13. It is his fifth career game with two or more and second game this season with at least three sacks.
- **Francis Bernard RB (Fr.)**
Had four catches for 37 yards along with two rushing touchdowns for his first career multi-touchdown game.
- **Kai Nacua DB (Jr.)**
Picked off the quarterback two times to move into a tie with Daniel Sorensen for No. 2 at BYU in career interceptions (Since 2000). His six interceptions are the most since 2001 when Jernaro Gilford also had six.
- **Fred Warner DB (So.)**
Notched his second interception of the year and returned it 27 yards. He finished with four tackles and one tackle for loss.
- **Terenn Houk WR (Sr.)**
Scored BYU's first two-point conversion since 2011 vs. TCU. Also caught his second receiving touchdown of the season.

USU RALLIES TO STUN NEVADA 31-27

LOGAN, Utah - Junior running back Devante Mays rushed for 133 yards and two touchdowns, while senior linebacker Kyle Fackrell recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown, to help Utah State rally from 20 down in the third quarter and stun Nevada 31-27 on Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium on Saturday.

Senior WR Hunter Sharp had 160 all-purpose yards, including a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, as the Aggies (6-5, 5-3 Mountain West) became bowl eligible for the fifth consecutive season.

Utah State's 20-point comeback is its largest since rallying from 21 down to beat Hawai'i 35-31 on Nov. 5, 2011. The Aggies also erased a 27-0 deficit against Idaho State during the 2001 campaign, beating the Bengals 28-27 at home.

USU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- **Hunter Sharp WR (Sr.)**
Returned a kickoff 96 yards for his first career return for a touchdown. It is also tied for the sixth-longest kickoff return in school history.
- **Devante Mays RB (Jr.)**
Had two touchdown runs (5, 2) and now has a team-leading nine touchdown runs this year. For Mays, it is his third multi-touchdown game this year. Mays finished the game with 133 rushing yards on a career-high tying 22 carries for his second career 100-yard rushing game.
- **Chuckie Keeton QB (Sr.)**
Rushed a season-high 14 times for a season-best 52 yards.
- **Nick Vigil LB (Jr.)**
Had 13 tackles for his seventh double-digit tackle game of the season and the 13th of his career. Overall, Vigil has now led the team in tackles in 10 of its 11 games this season.
- **Kyle Fackrell LB (Sr.)**
Had 10 tackles for his third double-digit tackle game of the season and the ninth of his career. Fackrell also had 0.5 tackles for loss and now has 13.5 tackles for loss this year and 35.0 in his career.
- **Aaron Dalton P (Fr.)**
Had three punts downed inside the 20-yard line, giving him 22 punts this year downed inside the 20-yard line.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR FIVE

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from 10 states and six conferences, including the American Athletic, Big Ten, Pac-12, Mountain West and SEC. BYU has four games scheduled against current Power 5 teams and seven against teams from the Group of 5 conferences. The 12 teams on the schedule had a record of 92-53 in 2014, with eight teams coming off bowl games in 2014.

The Cougars will play six home games, five road contests and one neutral site game in 2015. The home schedule consists of Boise State, UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and Fresno State. The teams on the home schedule put together a record of 44-23, with four teams reaching bowl games in 2014. The road swing includes a big September with Nebraska, UCLA and Michigan. The Cougars visit San Jose State and Utah State with a game against Missouri at the Kansas City Chief's stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The road and neutral opponents combined for a 48-30 record in 2014, with four bowl games.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accommodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 85,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 417 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

81 members of the 2015 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before six games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

4 BYU has had four different players throw TD passes this season with Tanner Mangum (17), Taysom Hill (1), Beau Hoge (1) and Remington Peck (1). The last time BYU had four players throw TD passes in a season was 2004. That was also the last time a non-QB threw a TD pass when running back Curtis Brown threw a 40-yard TD to Austin Collie against Wyoming.

5-400 Five different Cougar receivers have at least 400 receiving yards. BYU has not had five players with at least 400 receiving yards in a season since 2006 (J. Harline 935, C. Brown 556, M. Jacobson 547, Z. Collie 437, M. Allen 420). The 2015 five are Mitch Mathews (571), Devon Blackmon (537), Nick Kurtz (509), Terenn Houk (422) and Mitchell Juergens (413).

95.3 BYU has the No. 1 blue-zone scoring offense in the nation. Inside the 20s, BYU is scoring 95.3 percent of the time, topping San Diego State's No. 2 mark of 95.0 percent. The Cougars' touchdown percentage of 72.1 ranks No. 12, just behind Oklahoma State's 73.1 percent.

19-2:00 The Cougar offense has had 21 scoring drives of two minutes or less, including 19 touchdowns.

3255 The 3,255 passing yards for BYU through 11 games are the most passing yards since 2009. The Cougars threw for 3,333 yards heading into the 12th game of the 2009 campaign.

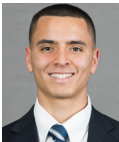

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **FOURTH QUARTER SCORING.** BYU has outscored its opponents 114-61 in the fourth quarter this year. The Cougars scored 102 points in the fourth quarter for all of the 2014 season. BYU scored 20 or more points three times in the fourth quarter this year (Boise State, UConn and Cincinnati). The Cougars had never had 20-plus points in the fourth quarter in two games in any season under Mendenhall, let alone three. BYU has hit the 20-point mark in the fourth quarter in seven total games under Mendenhall. It marks the first time BYU has scored 20 or more fourth-quarter points in three games since the 1988 season, Ty Detmer's redshirt freshman year.
- **BIG AND TALL.** BYU's tall receiving combination of Mitch Mathews, Nick Kurtz and Terenn Houk stands at 6-foot-6, 6-foot-5 and 6-foot-4. The three big receivers have accounted for 111 receptions, 1,502 yards and 13 touchdowns.
- **FRESHMAN QB RECORD WATCH.** Tanner Mangum now holds the BYU freshman season records for completions (226), passing yards (2,778), passing touchdowns (17), wins (7) and consecutive games with a TD pass (7). Earlier this year he set the single game freshman records for completions (35) and passing yards (365) against UConn. With 360 attempts, he is on track to pass Jake Heaps for the freshman attempts record of 383.
- **SPREADING THE BALL.** BYU has had 19 players catch a pass this season. Six players have at least 20 receptions. Only three other FBS teams have more players with 20 or more receptions. Five players have over 400 yards receiving and three have over 500 for the first time at BYU since 2008.
- **CHUNK PLAYS.** BYU has 33 plays from scrimmage gaining 30 yards or more this season, tied No. 16 in the nation. The Cougars have had 24 passing plays of 30+ and nine rushing plays of 30+. The 24 passing plays mark ties for No. 14 nationally. BYU has had 12 pass plays go for 40+ (ranked No. 21) and five go for 50+ (tied No. 26).

THE BYU DEFENSE

- GETTING BEHIND THE LINE.** In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. In 2015, they are 8-0. Since 2005, BYU is 49-2 when notching three or more sacks in a single game. The Cougars have sacked the opposing QB 35 times this season, which is the most since the 1999 campaign when the team had 38.
- SACKS AND TFLS.** Against Fresno State, BYU's defense recorded four sacks and 11 tackles for loss. The Cougars have notched at least six tackles for a loss in 10 out of 11 games this season.
- STAYING POSITIVE.** BYU is 54-8 under Bronco Mendenhall with a positive turnover margin. The Cougars have recorded a positive turnover margin in five games this season.
- FBS ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS.** Bronson Kaufusi is No. 2 in career sacks (25.5) and No. 5 in TFLs (40) among active career leaders in FBS football.
- PASS DEFENSE.** BYU has held opponents to under 200 yards passing in six games this season. In 2014, Cougar opponents threw for under 200 yards on three occasions. The defense has given up 2,310 pass yards this season, which is the fewest through 11 games since 2012 when the team had allowed 2,027.
- 3 AND OUT.** The BYU defense has held opponents to three and out in 51 out of 139 drives this season, averaging 4.64 times per game holding opponents to four downs or less per possession which is tied with Penn State, Arizona State and Oklahoma State for No. 14.
- LeBRONSON.** The senior defensive end is in the top 5 in BYU history in four categories: 25.5 sacks (3rd), 40 tackles for loss (4th), 16 quarterback hurries (3rd) and five forced fumbles (3rd).

BRONCO MENDENHALL**HEAD COACH****YEARS AT BYU**

11th year as head coach, 13th at BYU

Entering his eleventh season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to 10 straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned a 90-39 record to rank 13th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005 prior to the start of 2015. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage at .698 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience in the same time period.

The Cougars finished the 2014 season with an 8-5 record that included a 3-0 mark against Power 5 conference schools. Fueled by Heisman hopeful Taysom Hill, BYU won its first four games including a 41-7 win over then-No. 25 Texas. BYU then overcame a rash of midseason injuries to key players to finish the season with a 10th consecutive bowl game. In doing so, the Cougars became one of 12 programs to earn a bowl invitation in each of the last 10 years. Only Florida State (7) has achieved more than BYU's six bowl victories over that timeframe.

The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first 10 teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 129 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 90-39—similar to Edwards' 129-game mark of 93-35-1.

In 2006, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year following an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

He has also served as the defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. BYU has consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense over the past eight of nine seasons, including three top-10 ratings. In 2012, the Cougars featured one of the greatest defenses in school history, allowing just 266.1 yards, including 86.9 rushing yards, and 14.0 points per game. Ranked No. 3 in total defense, No. 3 in scoring defense and No. 2 in rushing defense, the Mendenhall-coached unit held its first six opponents under 300 total yards (part of a streak of 12 consecutive such games dating back to 2011) and kept opposing offenses without a touchdown six times during the year. Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since the program began in 2007.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.
