



#### **BYU-WSU STORYLINES**

Record at Weber State

- This is just the third time BYU and Weber State will play despite being just 80 miles apart. The Cougars and Wildcats met two times in the 1970's with BYU grabbing both victories by an average score of 47-9. The Cougars won the last meeting in 1979 48-3 in Provo.
- Bronco Mendenhall and the Cougars have won five consecutive games dating back to 2011. It is tied for third-longest streak in the nation behind TCU (8) and Baylor (7). BYU's longest streak in program history is 25 games, spanning from 1983-1985, including the 1984 National Championship season.
- BYU has played eight of the current Big Sky teams, last losing to one in 1959. The Cougars hold a 38-16-2 record over the Big Sky, last winning against Idaho State 56-3 in 2011 and last losing to Montana 12-0 in 1959.
- BYU notched its first win of the season with a senior quarterback in Riley Nelson. The last 11 senior starting signal callers have put together a 118-23-2 record since 1977, a winning percentage of .831. That's an average of almost 11 wins per season. Steve Sarkisian led BYU to an NCAA record 14 victories in 1996. Ty Detmer and Kevin Feterik tied for the lowest win total in a senior season, still nabbing eight victories apiece. Weber State also has a senior quarterback in Milke Hoke.
- BYU wide receiver Cody Hoffman has a reception streak of 20 games and counting, the 19th longest streak in the nation. Weber State's wideout Shaydon Kehano has a grab in 10 consecutive games for the Wildcats.
- The Cougars have two staff members with ties to Weber State, secondary coach Nick Howell and defensive graduate assistant Jason Kaufusi. Howell graduated from Weber State in 2005 and Kaufusi spent two years coaching the defensive ends for the Wildcats.
- BYU has at least one player on the following award watch lists: Biletnikoff (WR Hoffman), Butkus (LB Kaveinga), Lombardi (Line or LB Hansen, Van Noy), Maxwell (Outstanding Player QB Nelson), Nagurski (Best Defensive Player Van Noy), Davey O'Brien (QB Nelson), Doak Walker (RB Alisa), Outland (Lineman Hansen) and Ray Guy (P Stephenson).

2012 BYU FOOTBALL LAST GAME/OPPONENT OUTLOOK

#### DOMINANT DEFENSE LEADS BYU TO WIN OVER WASHINGTON STATE

PROVO, Utah - With a dominant BYU defense holding Washington State to 224 total yards, the BYU football team opened its 2012 season with a 30-6 win over WSU at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

The game marked the seventh-consecutive game BYU (1-0) has held its opponent to under 300 yards. BYU also held WSU (0-1, 0-0) to minus-5 yards rushing. The last time BYU held an opponent to under negative rushing yards was against UTEP in 2010. Kyle Van Noy shined on defense with two sacks while Brandon Ogletree led the team with eight tackles. Linebacker Uona Kaveinga and defensive back Jordan Johnson each recorded an interception.

Nelson finished 25 for 36 for 285 yards and two touchdowns. Michael Alisa led the rushing attack with 54 yards on 13 attempts. Tight end Kaneakua Friel led receivers in the game with six catches for 101 yards and two touchdowns. Friel's two touchdown receptions in a single game are the first by a BYU tight end since Dennis Pitta in 2009. Friel notched his sixth catch in the third quarter for 23 yards to give him 101 for the game, also the first time since Pitta in 2009.

After Kaveinga's interception on WSU's first drive, the offense started rolling. Skyler Ridley made his first career reception, a 7-yard grab on his toes to keep the ball in back of the end zone and to put the home Cougars up 7-0 with 1:36 left in the first quarter. BYU posted points early in the second quarter. Facing a 4th and 1 on WSU's 18-yard line, freshman quarterback Taysom Hill entered the game for BYU and in his first collegiate play found Friel for an 18-yard touchdown to put BYU up 14-0.

Washington State and BYU traded field goals and then BYU added another touchdown on a 25-yard pass from Nelson to Friel, featuring the big tight end knocking over a WSU defender to walk in the end zone, giving BYU a 24-3 lead.

The home Cougars would cruise to a 30-6 victory, rolling up 426 total yards of offense and smothering WSU on defense for most of the game.

#### **OPPONENT OUTLOOK**

#### WEBER STATE'S LAST GAME

FRESNO, Calif. - Weber State opened the 2012 season with a 37-10 loss to the Fresno State Bulldogs at Bulldog Stadium.

The Bulldogs jumped out to a quick 21-0 lead early in the second quarter and led 24-3 at halftime.

The Wildcats came out stronger in the second half and Mike Hoke found Shaydon Kehano for a 36-yard touchdown pass and cut the FSU lead to 24-10 with 9:37 to play in the third quarter. That remained the score until mid-way through the fourth quarter. After a Hoke interception the Bulldogs responded the very next play with a 38-yard touchdown pass from Derek Carr to Davante Adams that gave the Bulldogs the 30-10 lead. They added a four-year run five minutes later to seal the victory.

Weber State finished the game with 274 yards of total offense and allowed the Bulldogs to total 515 yards of total offense. WSU had difficulty running the ball against the Bulldogs as they totaled just 67 yards rushing compared to 217 for Fresno State.

Senior quarterback Mike Hoke returned for the Wildcats and had a strong game, finishing 25-32 for 202 yards and one touchdown and one interception.



#### WEBER STATE WILDCATS 2012 OUTLOOK

Weber State returns 35 lettermen and 14 starters off last year's team. A total of 11 players that earned Big Sky All-Conference honors last season also return, including sophomore fullback Tevia Tolutau who was named to the first team.

On April 26, Weber State hired Jody Sears as head coach for the 2012 season.

The Wildcats were picked to finish sixth by the coaches and seventh by the media in the new-look Big Sky Conference preseason polls.

#### **NOTES FROM BYU'S LAST GAME**

BYU dominated Washington State on defense, holding them to just 224 total yards, including minus-5 rushing yards. The BYU offense put up 426 total yards, including 303 in the air to lead the home Cougars to a 30-6 victory on the opening night of college football.

- For the seventh consecutive game the BYU defense held an opponent to less than 300 total yards in a game and the 224 yards is the lowest during the streak. Head coach Mike Leach dropped only his second season opener as a head coach, with his team held to his lowest scoring output with six points along with the lowest total yards in season openers. It was only the third time in Leach's 10+ year career his team has not scored a touchdown in a game.
- Tight end Kaneakua Friel caught six passes for 101 yards and two touchdowns. His two touchdown receptions in a single game are the first by a BYU tight end since Dennis Pitta in 2009 in a 38-21 BYU victory vs. Air Force. That game was also the last time a tight end had 100 receiving yards (111).
- Wide receiver Skyler Ridley took advantage of his opportunity with an injured Cody Hoffman. Ridley recorded his first career catch in the first half, a 7-yard touchdown grab in the back of the end zone. Ridley went on to haul in six balls for 54 yards.
- BYU has held its opponents to 14 points or fewer in the first half in 13 of the last 14 games. BYU held Washington State to just 6 points total.
- Cody Hoffman caught his first pass of the game in the first quarter for six yards to extend his streak to 20 games with a reception. He has now caught a pass in 26 of 27 career games. Hoffman finished the game with 3 catches for 46 yards.

2012 BYU FOOTBALL **TEAM NOTES** 

#### INDEPENDENCE: YEAR TWO

2011 was the Cougars inaugural year as an independent. BYU went 10-3 and won its fifth bowl game in six years. The team played teams from the SEC, Pac-12, Big 12, Conference USA, Western Athletic Conference and Mountain West. The Cougars had all 13 games televised, including 12 to a national audience, 11 of which were featured on the ESPN family of networks. BYU had five on ESPN, four on ESPN2 and two on ESPNU. In 2012, BYU ups the ante with a more difficult schedule, featuring a road game at fellow independent Notre Dame along with three teams from the Pac-12 and matchups against the ACC, WAC and MW. To date BYU has five games scheduled to air on the ESPN family of networks along with one on NBC and another on BYUtv, all nationally televised games. The Cougars have future games scheduled with Wisconsin, West Virginia, Nebraska, Notre Dame, East Carolina, Georgia Tech, Texas, UCF, Houston, Washington State, Boise State, Utah and Hawai'i.

#### **FLAG BEARERS**

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition - the alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

#### **TEAM CAPTAINS**

Selected by their peers, quarterback Riley Nelson, linebacker Brandon Ogletree and running back David Foote have been named as team captains for the 2012 season. The three seniors are all new captains for the 2012 season. The threecaptains also represent the offense, the defense and special teams. Nelson will serve as the offense's captain, Ogletree for the defense and Foote for special teams. Nelson led BYU to a 6-1 record as a starter at quarterback last year. Ogletree led the Cougars in tackles in 2011 and Foote is a former walk-on who has averaged 9.5 yards per carry out of the backfield in his career.

#### LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accomidations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium will feature new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

#### **MISSIONS**

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics. Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates 347 missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 53,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 330 missions around the world. Seventy-five percent of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 19 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years or 18 months for women and couples - teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

There are currently 38 missionaries from the football team serving in 17 different countries. Members of the current team cover six of the seven continents around the globe and speak six different languages.

The BYU football team participates in hour-long devotionals prior to eight games this season. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with Holly and Bronco Mendenhall.

#### FBS INDEPENDENT PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week one's honorees include three BYU players. Quarterback Riley Nelson and tight end Kaneakua Friel were named co-offensive players of the week. Nelson completed 25 of 36 passes for 285 yards and two touchdowns while Friel grabbed six receptions for 101 yards and two scores. Friel was also named the College Football Performance Awards National Tight End of the Week. Kicker Riley Stephenson made three PATs, three field goals, recorded six kickoffs for 365 yards and had two punts for 98 yards, including one inside the 20 and one longer than 50 yards. Notre Dame's Manti Te'o nabbed the defensive player of the week award.

#### **BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS**

Tight end Kaneakua Friel was No. 2 in the nation among tight ends after one week with six catches for 101 yards and two touchdowns. He was one of 16 players to catch two scores in week one. He was one of four tight ends with two touchdowns.

Running back David Foote continued to prove why he is a reliable option in the backfield, finishing the first game with a 6.5 yards per carry average on four carries. That mark is good for No. 17 in the nation after one game.

Picking up where it left off in 2011, BYU continued to be a third-down savvy team, converting 10 of 17 for 58.82 percent, good for No. 18 nationally over the weekend.

BYU picked up 24 first downs against Washington State. The 24 first downs was No. 39 in the nation.

The Cougars' recorded 426 total yards of offense against WSU. BYU picked up 303 by the air and 123 on the ground.

- BYU's offense was one of 24 FBS teams to throw at least three touchdown passes in the season opener. Quarterback Riley Nelson tossed two scores and freshman quarterback Taysom Hill tossed another on a fourth-down play. Nelson was one of 12 quarterbacks to log two touchdown passes and Hill's quarterback efficiency rating of 581.2 is off the charts, though he only threw the one pass.
- · BYU is starting a senior quarterback in Riley Nelson, and has another senior in the wings if neccessary with James Lark. The last 11 senior starting signal callers have put together a 117-23-2 record since 1977, a winning percentage of .831. That's an average of almost 11 wins per season. Steve Sarkisian led BYU to an NCAA record 14 victories in 1996. Ty Detmer and Kevin Feterik tied for the lowest win total in a senior season, still nabbing eight victories apiece. Should Lark step in, the product of St. George is expected to continue the senior tradition.
- · Look for BYU's bigtime wide receivers . . . because they are big. The wide receiver tandem of Cody Hoffman, 6-foot-4, 215 pounds and Ross Apo, 6-foot-3, 207 pounds, accounted for 95 receptions, 1,396 yards and 19 total touchdowns last year. In the first game, Hoffman played just the first quarter (left early with a quad contusion) but still grabbed three receptions for 46 yards and Apo contributed four receptions for 31 yards.
- A renewed emphasis on nutrition has helped the offensive line transform from last year to 2012. BYU's big men checked in at an average of over 315 pounds in 2011. Through a dedicated conditioning and nutrition program started in the spring, the line in 2012 tips the scale at about 292 pounds. The Cougars hope the more athletic line will provide a bigger punch in the run game and give better protection. In game one the offense rolled up 426 yards of total offense, the 10th best mark nationally.
- Another left handed dual-threat quarterback takes the field in 2012 with Nelson. The southpaw will look to live up to BYU's most famous lefty quarterback Steve Young. Young started the '82 and '83 seasons for the Cougars, putting together a 1983 senior season with 3,902 yards passing and 444 yards rushing. That season he threw for 33 touchdowns and rushed for another eight. He is second in quarterback rushing yards at BYU with 1,084. Nelson is third with 680.
- The tight end position made a strong comeback in game one with Kaneakua Friel. Friel caught six passes for 101 yards and two touchdowns to be one of the top tight ends in the nation. Friel was honored as the FBS Independent Co-Offensive Player of the Week and CFPA National Tight End of the Week.

#### **BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS**

The number of rushing yards the BYU defense allowed against Washington State. That number was No. 2 in the nation over the first weekend of college football, with Illinois posting a minus-6 yard effort over the weekend.

BYU's defense allowed 0 touchdowns to a a Mike Leach-coached offense, just the third time in his 10+ year history his teams haven't got into the end zone. The last time BYU held an opponent to no touchdowns was in its 56-3 win against Idaho St. in 2011.

**9** The Cougar defense ranks No. 9 in scoring defense after week one, however the eight teams in front of them all played FCS opponents, while BYU matched up with an opponent from the Pac-12.

92.5 Since Bronco Mendenhall has taken over the defensive coordinating duties again (21 games dating back to 2010), BYU has allowed an average of 92.5 rushing yards per game. That mark is bested by only one other team, Alabama.

BYU allowed just 224 total yards against Washington State. It was the seventh game in a row the defense has held a team under 300 total yards. The 224 total yards are the fewest yards given up during the streak.

A four-year starter, Manumaleuna will be another anchor for a stout defensive line. The 6-foot-2, 288 pounder racked up a tackle, pass breakup and guarterback hurry in his senior season debut.

#### #47 Ezekiel Ansah, LB/DL

One of the most amazing athletes to come through the program, Ansah proved to be a serious threat as a pass rusher in BYU's opening win against WSU. The former 200-meter track athlete, with his 6-foot-6, 270-pound frame, recorded a career high two tackles for loss among his three tackles.

#### #36 Alani Fua, LB

Fua has unique length and speed at 6-foot-5 and 215 pounds from the outside backer position. His pass rush ability helped to disrupt WSU's offense and slow down their production.

#### #50 Remington Peck, DL

After returning from a mission, Peck made his way onto the opening night depth chart and contributed with a sack against WSU.

2012 BYU FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

#### THE BYU DEFENSE

• Defensively, finished the 2011 season ranked No. 13 in overall defense. BYU allowed 312.9 total yards per game and held eight different teams to less than 300 total yards for the 2011 season, including its final six opponents. With seven returning starters on the defensive side of the ball, the Cougars plan to improve upon that number in 2012 as they showed in their opening night win against Washington State, holding the visiting Cougars to just 224 total yards, the 17th best mark nationally.

- For BYU, a low jersey number on defense means business. The numbers 1-9 on defense are all significant contributors. No. 1 Joe Sampson may start at free safety or as the fifth defensive back in the nickel formation. No.'s 2, 3, 4 are three of the four possible starters at linebacker with No. 2 Spencer Hadley and No. 3 Kyle Van Noy on the outside and No. 4 Uona Kaveinga on the inside. No. 6 and No. 7, Jordan Johnson and Preston Hadley, respectively, will lock down the corner positions and No. 9 Daniel Sorensen will man the KAT safety position. The group combined for 26 tackles, three tackles for loss, two sacks, two interceptions, four pass breakups and five quarterback hurries in the first game of 2012.
- The Cougars will feature good size at the safety position. Starting KAT safety Daniel Sorensen checks in at 6-foot-2, 215 pounds and looks to lay the wood on any opponents reaching the secondary. Sorensen started all 13 games in 2011, totaling 61 tackles, good for third on the team. At times right next to him will be another hard-hitting safety in sophomore Craig Bills, a 6-foot-2, 209-pounder. Bills earned the nickname "The Human Missile" on special teams and playing in all 13 games as a true freshman in 2009, including one start at safety. Bronco Mendenhall deemed this year's secondary the most athlete he's seen since at BYU.
- Going from inside linebacker to outside linebacker junior Spencer Hadley adds some more athleticsm and experience to BYU's outside linebacking group. Hadley played in all 13 games as an inside linebacker in 2011 and started one game, at Texas. Hadley, a 6-foot-1, 227 pounder out of Connell, Wash. will play along side Van Noy, Kaveinga and Brandon Ogletree to help keep BYU's defense stout as one of the strongest position groups on the team.
- Stopping the run is often a theme and BYU is pretty good at it. The Cougars finished the 2011 season ranked No. 19 in rushing defense, allowing just over 112 rushing yards per game. BYU's run-stopping effort held opponents under 100 total yards rushing eight times on the season and allowed less than 40 yards three times. The Cougars continue the trend going into the 2012 season, holding WSU's offense to -5 total yards rushing, the second time in three years allowing a team to negative rushing yards.
- The Cougars don't just stop the run, their pass defense is good too. BYU's pass efficiency defense finished 2011 at No. 15, allowing a rating of 112.58. BYU held five teams to less than 150 passing yards. The Cougars racked up 56 pass breakups, the most since 1998, to land the No. 11 ranked pass breakup defense. Preston Hadley tied for the ninth-best mark nationally in 2011 with nine breakups and returns to the Cougars for his senior season. In BYU's 2012 home opener, the pass defense continued to shine, shutting down a Mike Leach-coached "Air Raid" offense to 229 passing yards and keeping WSU out of the endzone. The team came up with two interceptions and six pass break-ups.

Running back and special teams captain David Foote was at it again, picking up BYU's first punt block of the season. Foote also recorded two tackles on special teams.

The number of roles BYU punter Riley Stephenson filled in his senior season debut. Stephenson stretched his legs Thursday night as he kicked field goals, PATs, punts and kickoffs. His field goals and PATs were the first of his collegiate career.

Stephenson had a net punting average of 40.5 yards against WSU. Thanks to a successful offense, Stephenson was only called on twice to punt, for a total of 98 yards during the

BYU made 100 percent of its PATs against Washington State. Stephenson went 3 of 3, following the mold of 2011 when Justin Sorensen went 48 of 48.

Stephenson wracked up 365 kickoff yards off of six attempts for an average of 60.8 yards. He has not regularly kicked off since the 2010 season.

## **HEAD COACH/DEF. COORDINATOR BRONCO MENDENHALL**

YEARS AT BYU

Entering 8th year as head coach, 10th at BYU YEARS OVERALL

Entering 24th year

During his seven seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to seven straight bowl invitations, two outright conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings. The Cougars finished their first season as a football independent in 2011 with a 10-3 record and No. 25 final ranking to finish nationally ranked for the fifth time in the last six seasons.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 67-24 (.739) record to date to rank No. 15 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received seven straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first seven teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in five of the last six seasons to become the first Cougar teams to ever win five bowls in a six-year span. Nationally, BYU is one of only seven programs to win five bowl games in the last six seasons. The Cougars have also won 10 or more games in five of the past six seasons and five of Mendenhall's seven seasons overall. In fact, only four programs have had more 10-win seasons over the past seven years.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident in the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 88 times in the past seven seasons (46 offense, 32 defense, 9 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 55 top-15 statistical rankings, 37 top-10 rankings and 19 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past six seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic allconference honorees each season as a conference member is tied for third nationally for Academic All-America recipients over Mendenhall's seven seasons at the helm. Seven Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans in that span. Among all FBS schools only Penn State and Nebraska have had more during that period.

Mendenhall also serves as the team's defensive coordinator. The Cougars had the nation's No. 13 defense in 2011 to help BYU become one of only 11 programs to receive a final Top 25 overall team ranking in at least one of the two major polls during five of the past six seasons. BYU is one of only nine teams to do so in the USA Today Coaches Poll.
