BYU STORYLINES

- **FCS GAMES.** BYU is playing an FCS team for the 8th time under head coach Bronco Mendenhall. BYU is 7-0, outscoring FCS opponents by an average of 50.3-9.0.
- **ABOUT WAGNER.** Located in Staten Island, New York, the school was founded in 1883 and first started playing football in 1927. Wagner plays in the Northeast Conference (NEC) at the FCS Division I level. The Seahawks have an all-time record of 398-346-19 with undefeated seasons in 1960, '64 and '67. Wagner won the Division III national championship in 1987 and moved to the FCS level in 1992. Travel distance for the Seahawks is just shy of 2,000 miles. There are just seven players on Wagner's roster from west of the Mississippi.
- **SEEKING BOWL ELIGIBILITY.** At 5-2, BYU is seeking its sixth win for bowl eligibility for the 11th consecutive year; every year under Mendenhall. Entering the 2015 season, BYU was one of only 12 programs to earn a bowl invitation each of the past 10 seasons. Of those teams, only Florida State with seven wins has won more than BYU's six postseason victories over that timespan. The Cougars are tied with Georgia, Oregon, Alabama and LSU with a 6-4 bowl record. BYU is expected to go to either the Las Vegas Bowl or Hawaii Bowl if not selected to a New Year's Six game.

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

After home games, postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Mendenhall and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Mendenhall's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

BYU DEFEATS CINCINNATI 38-24

PROVO, Utah – Facing another deficit, Tanner Mangum led the offense to three touchdowns in the fourth quarter and BYU's defense put the clamps down to come back and defeat Cincinnati 38-24 on Friday night at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

After a rough first half of offense, BYU (5-2) finished the game with 449 total yards to Cincinnati's (3-3, 0-2 American Athletic Conference) 341 yards. Led by Bronson Kaufusi's three sacks, the Cougar defense had eight sacks in the game for the first time since 1997 as it stymied the Bearcat offense over the final three quarters. The defense also had 12 tackles for loss.

Mangum ended the game throwing 19 of 32 for two touchdowns and one interception. Nick Kurtz led the BYU receivers with 119 yards and two touchdowns on six catches. The running backs split up the load with Algernon Brown running for 88 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries.

BYU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- **Tanner Mangum QB (Fr.)**
Mangum completed 19 of 32 passes for 252 yards, one interception and two touchdowns against Cincinnati with a long of 53. In the first half he had 80 yards and one interception, but in the second half he had 172 yards and two touchdowns.
- **Travis Tuiloma DL (Jr.)**
Tuiloma notched his first and second career sacks in the game on Saturday. His second forced the first punt of the game for the Bearcats.
- **Bronson Kaufusi DL (Sr.)**
Kaufusi's two sacks in the first half moved him into No. 3 in career sacks at BYU. He ended the game with three for his fourth multi-sack game of his career. He had a forced fumble and had his second block in as many games.
- **Algernon Brown RB (Jr.)**
Brown posted his second multi-touchdown game of his career and in as many weeks, rushing 88 yards on 20 attempts with two scores. He has six total touchdowns in the last two games (5 rush, 1 rec)
- **Nick Kurtz WR (Jr.)**
Kurtz recorded his first two touchdown catches of his BYU career, while notching his second game of at least 100 yards receiving. His six receptions are career high while his 53-yard touchdown catch tied a career long set in the Nebraska game.
- **Sione Takitaki LB (So.)**
Takitaki notched a career high in total tackles (9), solo stops (5) and assisted tackles (4) to go along with two tackles for loss.

WAGNER FALLS TO SAINT FRANCIS 43-14

Loretto, PA – Quarterback Zack Drayer completed 16-of-28 passes for 292 yards and three touchdowns in leading Saint Francis U (SFU) to a 43-14 Northeast Conference (NEC) victory at chilly DeGol Field this afternoon.

Sophomore quarterback Alex Thomson (Keyport, NJ/Keyport) completed 12-of-25 passes for 11 yards and one touchdown while being sacked four times. The 6-4, 220-pound Jersey Shore product also led the Seahawks in rushing with 74 yards (51 net with minus 23 yards in sacks) on 10 carries, while junior running back Matthias McKinnon (Albany, NY/Jireh Prep) added 50 yards on 13 carries.

In the receiving department, senior tight end Ryan Owens, a 2015 Preseason All-NEC selection, had three catches for 25 yards, while fifth-year senior wide receiver Anthony Carrington (Toms River, NJ/Toms River North) had three catches for 22 yards.

WAGNER PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- **Alex Thomson QB (So.)**
Thomson threw for 111 yards and one touchdown on 12 of 25 passing against Saint Francis. He also led the team in rushing with 51 yards, including one run of 35 yards.
- **Ryan Owens TE (Sr.)**
Owens led the receivers against Saint Francis with 25 yards on three receptions. In the season, he has 108 yards.
- **Matthias McKinnon RB (Jr.)**
By just one yard, McKinnon was the second-leading rusher against Saint Francis with 50 yards. He had a long run of 32 yards to make up the bulk of his total.
- **Tim Hayes DB (Jr.)**
Hayes led the team in defense with eight total tackles in the game on Saturday. He was also credited with the two pass breakups.
- **Andre Yevchinez WR (Jr.)**
Yevchinez leads the team in receiving yards this season with 238 and is tied for receive touchdowns with two. Against Saint Francis, he had one reception for seven yards.
- **Bryan Rafano P (Jr.)**
In the last game, Rafano punted eight times for a total of 310 yards. His longest kick went for 47 yards.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR FIVE

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from 10 states and six conferences, including the American Athletic, Big Ten, Pac-12, Mountain West and SEC. BYU has four games scheduled against current Power 5 teams and seven against teams from the Group of 5 conferences. The 12 teams on the schedule had a record of 92-53 in 2014, with eight teams coming off bowl games in 2014.

The Cougars will play six home games, five road contests and one neutral site game in 2015. The home schedule consists of Boise State, UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and Fresno State. The teams on the home schedule put together a record of 44-23, with four teams reaching bowl games in 2014. The road swing includes a big September with Nebraska, UCLA and Michigan. The Cougars visit San Jose State and Utah State with a game against Missouri at the Kansas City Chief's stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The road and neutral opponents combined for a 48-30 record in 2014, with four bowl games.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accommodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 85,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 417 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

81 members of the 2015 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before six games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

THE BYU OFFENSE

• **FOURTH QUARTER SCORING.** BYU has outscored its opponents 84-34 in the fourth quarter this year. BYU scored 20 or more points three times in the fourth quarter this year (Boise State, UConn and Cincinnati). The Cougars had never had 20-plus points in the fourth quarter in two games in any season under Mendenhall, let alone three. BYU has hit the 20-point mark in the fourth quarter in seven total games under Mendenhall. It marks the first time BYU has scored 20 or more fourth-quarter points in three games since the 1988 season, Ty Detmer's redshirt freshman year.

• **BRUISING BACKS.** The running back duo of bruisers Algernon Brown (6-1, 235) and Francis Bernard (6-0, 235) have accounted for 476 rushing yards and eight total touchdowns in the last three games. The duo is averaging 5.6 yards per carry in the last three games.

• **BIG AND TALL.** BYU's tall receiving combination of Mitch Mathews, Nick Kurtz and Terenn Houk stands at 6-foot-6, 6-foot-5 and 6-foot-4. The three big receivers have accounted for 75 receptions, 1,022 yards and nine touchdowns.

• **OFFENSIVE LINE EXPERIENCE.** BYU returns an experienced offensive line for 2015. The five projected starters for BYU have logged 97 starts between them and have played in 120 games. Offensive tackle Ryker Mathews has the most games under his belt with 29 starts in 40 games played.

• **FRESHMAN QB RECORD WATCH.** Tanner Mangum broke the freshman quarterback records for completions (35) and passing yards (365) against UConn. Jake Heaps set the season records for freshman quarterbacks in 2010, going 219 of 383 for 2,316 yards, 15 touchdowns and had six wins as a starter. After seven games (six starts), Mangum is 144 for 232 with 1,668 yards, 11 touchdowns and has four wins as a starter.

- 5** BYU is tied at No. 5 with Ohio State, Arizona State and Michigan State in average team sacks per game with 3.43. The Cougars have sacked the opponents 24 times this season.
- 8** BYU sacked Cincinnati eight times in the 38-24 victory, tying No. 2 in school history for a single game. The last time the Cougars had at least 8 in a game was vs. Kansas State in the 1997 Cotton Bowl. Entering the Friday's game, the Bearcats had allowed only six sacks all season.

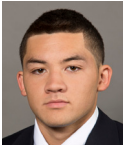

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **Getting Behind the Line.** In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. In 2015, they are 5-0. Since 2005, BYU is 46-2 when notching three or more sacks in a single game.
- **Sacks and TFLs.** BYU's defense recorded at least 12 tackles for a loss for the first time since a 2010 victory over Wyoming with a final tally of 13. The Cougars have notched at least seven tackles for a loss in six out of seven games this season. Friday's game was the first time the Cougars sacked an opponent at eight times since the 1997 Cotton Bowl against Kansas State. Entering the Friday's game, the Bearcats had allowed only six sacks all season.
- **Third Down is key.** On the season, the defense is holding the opponent to 31 of 95 on third down conversions for 32.6 percent. It is the best third-down conversion defense through seven games since 2012 (25.7%).
- **Staying Positive.** BYU is 52-8 under Bronco Mendenhall with a positive turnover margin. The Cougars recorded a positive turnover margin in four games this season.
- **FBS Active Career Leaders.** Bronson Kaufusi is No. 5 in career sacks (21.5) and No. 13 in TFLs (32.0) among active career leaders in FBS football.
- **Through Seven Games.** BYU's 10 interceptions and 24.0 sacks are the most through seven games for a Cougar defense under Bronco Mendenhall.
- **Total Yards.** Doubling down the effort on defense, BYU held Cincinnati to 341 yards of total offense for a season low for the Bearcats (previous low was against Miami with 446 total yards). After giving up 205 yards (158 pass, 47 rush) in the first quarter, the Cougars held the opposition to 136 yards (61 pass, 75 rush) over the final three quarters. Entering the game, Cincinnati was averaging 586.8 yards of total offense.

BRONCO MENDENHALL**HEAD COACH****YEARS AT BYU**

11th year as head coach, 13th at BYU

YEARS OVERALL

27th year

Entering his eleventh season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to 10 straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned a 90-39 record to rank 13th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005 prior to the start of 2015. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage at .698 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience in the same time period.

The Cougars finished the 2014 season with an 8-5 record that included a 3-0 mark against Power 5 conference schools. Fueled by Heisman hopeful Taysom Hill, BYU won its first four games including a 41-7 win over then-No. 25 Texas. BYU then overcame a rash of midseason injuries to key players to finish the season with a 10th consecutive bowl game. In doing so, the Cougars became one of 12 programs to earn a bowl invitation in each of the last 10 years. Only Florida State (7) has achieved more than BYU's six bowl victories over that timeframe.

The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first 10 teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 129 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 90-39—similar to Edwards' 129-game mark of 93-35-1.

In 2006, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year following an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

He has also served as the defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. BYU has consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense over the past eight of nine seasons, including three top-10 ratings. In 2012, the Cougars featured one of the greatest defenses in school history, allowing just 266.1 yards, including 86.9 rushing yards, and 14.0 points per game. Ranked No. 3 in total defense, No. 3 in scoring defense and No. 2 in rushing defense, the Mendenhall-coached unit held its first six opponents under 300 total yards (part of a streak of 12 consecutive such games dating back to 2011) and kept opposing offenses without a touchdown six times during the year. Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since the program began in 2007.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.
