BYU STORYLINES

- **SERIES HISTORY.** BYU and UCLA are meeting for the 12th time. The Bruins won the last meeting 24-23 with a comeback effort in Pasadena last year. The last time UCLA visited Provo it was a different story. The Cougars jumped all over the Bruins with a 59-0 drubbing in 2008 behind Max Hall's seven touchdown passes. It was UCLA's worst loss since 1929.
- **LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM.** BYU is 8-3 in home openers since 2005 and have won four straight. The Cougars have also won eight consecutive games at home dating back to 2014 after going undefeated at home last year. BYU has a .770 winning percentage at LaVell Edwards Stadium, No. 12 nationally in stadium winning percentage.
- **PAC-12.** The Cougars are facing their third and final Pac-12 team for the regular season. BYU is 72-123-6 overall against the Pac-12.
- **POWER 5 WINS.** BYU has defeated a team from the Power 5 conferences in 11 consecutive seasons after a win over Arizona to start the 2016 season. Since 2003, BYU has 21 wins over Power 5 schools, No. 2 among schools not in the Power 5 (Navy No. 1 w/22).
- **STADIUM STRIPES.** Fans sitting in odd sections are encouraged to wear blue and even sections and the ROC will wear white.

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

After home games, postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Sitake and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Sitake's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided with additional player quotes upon availability. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

UCLA FOOTBALL DOWNS UNLV, 42-21

JOSH ROSEN PASSES FOR 267 YARDS, SOSO JAMABO RUSHED FOR 90 YARDS AND THREE TOUCHDOWNS.

PASADENA, Calif. - Josh Rosen threw for 267 yards and Soso Jamabo rushed for three touchdowns as the UCLA football team defeated UNLV, 42-21, in a non-conference game at the Rose Bowl on Saturday night.

The Bruins (1-1) scored a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns to secure a 21-point lead after UNLV (1-1) had reduced UCLA's cushion to seven points, 28-21, midway through the third quarter.

Rosen, UCLA's sophomore quarterback, completed 23 of 38 passes in the team's second game of the season. He threw one touchdown pass and added a score on the ground.

The Bruins totaled 219 yards on the ground. Jamabo registered 90 yards on 11 carries, as all three of his touchdown runs came in the first half. Brandon Stephens finished with 71 yards on 11 attempts.

"It's good to get a win," UCLA head coach Jim Mora said. "That was a hard-fought game against a really worthy opponent. That's a [UNLV] team that has made a lot of improvement in a year, and their players are buying into their system."

UNLV quarterback Johnny Stanton completed 11 of 28 passes for 153 yards. Stanton had a 14-yard touchdown pass and one 11-yard touchdown run. UNLV running back Lexington Thomas recorded a game-high 112 rushing yards on 19 carries, including a long of 37 yards.

UCLA never trailed on Saturday night, playing before 63,712 fans in the team's home opener at the Rose Bowl.

The Bruins led by as many as 21 points late in the second quarter. UCLA secured a 28-7 lead with 3:49 to play before halftime on a 7-yard carry by Jamabo, his third rushing touchdown of the game.

UNLV tied the game, 7-7, on its next drive. Thomas found the end zone with a 12-yard run at the 2:15 mark in the opening quarter, before the Bruins pushed their margin to 28-7 with a trio of touchdowns in the second quarter.

The Bruins return to action at BYU on Saturday, Sept. 17. Game time in Provo, Utah, is slated for 7:15 pm (PT). UCLA's game will be nationally televised on ESPN2.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR SIX

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from eight different conferences and an independent team. Six games come against Power Five opponents, including teams from the Pac-12, Big 12, Big Ten and SEC. The schedule ranks No. 7 in Phil Steele's preseason schedule rankings. The opponents on the 2016 schedule posted a 97-57 record in 2015, with 10 bowl teams and an FCS playoff team.

The Cougars host six home games and have four true road contests with two neutral site games, both at NFL stadiums, in 2016. The home schedule consists of UCLA, Toledo, Mississippi State, Southern Utah, UMass and Utah State. Teams on the home schedule put together a 44-31 record in 2015, with four reaching bowl games and Southern Utah earned an FCS playoff berth. Road contests include Utah, Michigan State, Boise State and Cincinnati with neutral site games against Arizona (University of Phoenix Stadium - home of the Arizona Cardinals) and West Virginia (FedEx Field - home of the Washington Redskins). All six games away from home are against 2015 bowl teams with a combined record of 53-16 last year.

TEAM CAPTAINS

BYU will have four captains for the 2016 season in senior quarterback Taysom Hill, senior running back Jamaal Williams, senior defensive back Kai Nacua and senior defensive lineman Harvey Langi. Hill is serving as a captain for the third time. BYU offensive coordinator Ty Detmer was also a three-time team captain (89, 90, 91).

FLAG BEARERS

BYU's tradition of carrying team flags out of the tunnel adds some new looks for 2016. A United States service-man will carry an American flag for every game, with team flags carried by selected players and alumni flags carried by former BYU players for each game.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,470 after various refurbishments. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

Over 74,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 418 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

The 2016 team has 84 players that served church missions and there are another 27 currently serving. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

ALUMNI FIRESIDES

Former members of the BYU football team will produce firesides, or devotionals at local LDS churches the night before select road games during the 2016 season. Firesides are open to the public. Additional firesides may be announced. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. POLYNESIAN PIPELINE

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recruiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. More than 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. Sitake was raised in Laie, Hawaii and later moved to the mainland. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaisa Tuiaki, Steve Kaufusi, Reno Mahe, Nu'u Tafisi, Russell Tialavea, Tevita Ofahengaue, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Sione Kinikini, Vince Feula and Harvey Unga.

TURNOVERS PLAGUE BOTH TEAMS AS BYU FALLS 20-19 AT UTAH

SALT LAKE CITY – In a game that saw nine total turnovers, BYU football's comeback fell short on a failed two-point conversion to drop the game 20-19 at Utah in the Deseret First Duel on Saturday night at Rice-Eccles Stadium.

In the Cougars final drive, Taysom Hill marched down the field with big receptions from Jonah Trinnaman, Nick Kurtz and Mitchell Juergens. With 18 seconds left, Hill rushed 7-yards for the touchdown. BYU went for two to try to secure a win, but Hill and the comeback was stopped short after Hill slipped one tackle but not the next and was dropped shy of the goal line.

BYU (1-1) has now lost six games in a row to rival Utah (2-0, 0-0 Pac-12). Despite forcing the Utes to turn the ball over six times, the Cougars were only able to score 13 points off of turnovers. Utah managed just seven point off of three BYU interceptions.

Hill completed 21 of 39 passes for 176 yards with three interceptions. He also rushed for 87 yards to lead the Cougars and both of BYU's touchdowns. Juergens led the receiving core with eight catches for 52 yards.

On defense, Butch Pau'u led BYU in total tackles with nine, including four solo. Kai Nacua had two interceptions to go along with his two tackles before he was ejected in the third quarter on a targeting call. Francis Bernard filled out the stat sheet with eight tackles, one interception, one pass breakup and one forced fumble.

THE BYU OFFENSE

• **AN ENVIOUS QUARTERBACK SITUATION.** BYU has one of the best quarterback situations in the country. Fifth-year senior Taysom Hill takes the No. 1 spot after coming back from injury in 2015. The 6-foot-2, 235-pound dual-threat is No. 10 in BYU history with 7,320 career yards of total offense. Backing up Hill is Tanner Mangum, the Freshman of the Year in 2015 by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. After Hill went down in 2015, Mangum threw for 3,377 yards and 23 touchdowns, both BYU freshman records. In addition to Hill and Mangum, BYU boasts Beau Hoge, Koy Detmer Jr. and Hayden Livingston in the quarterback room ready to contribute.

• **NEW GUYS.** BYU has had some new faces contribute in the early 2016 season. Wideout Jonah Trinnaman is leading the receivers with eight receptions for 76 yards. Tight ends Hunter Marshall and Tanner Balderree have both caught balls this season for the first time in their careers. Receiver Aleva Hifo also recorded his first reception and fullback Brayden El-Bakri scored his first touchdown on his first career carry.

• **BALANCE.** Through two games, BYU has picked up 42 first downs with 20 coming via the run and 21 from the pass with one thanks to a penalty. The Cougars have also rushed for 356 total yards and passed for 387.

• **SCORING BY QUARTER.** BYU has scored six points in the first quarter, 16 in the second and 15 in the fourth quarter this season. The Cougars are still looking for a third-quarter score.

• **USING THE TIGHT ENDS.** It wasn't until the ninth game last season when Remington Peck caught a pass as tight end in BYU's offense. Both Hunter Marshall and Tanner Balderree caught passes in the season opener against Arizona.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- SACK ATTACK.** In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. In 2015, they went 8-1 and they started 2016 1-0 after sacking Arizona four times. Since 2005, BYU is 50-3 when notching three or more sacks in a single game. The Cougars sacked the opposing QB 40 times last year, which was the most at BYU since official defensive statistics were recognized by the NCAA in 2000.
- TFL.** The Cougars notched at least six tackles for a loss in 12 out of 13 games in 2015 and 14 so far in the 2016 season, six against Utah. BYU ranked No. 9 nationally with 7.5 tackles for loss per game last season.
- STAYING POSITIVE.** BYU is 56-9 since 2005 with a positive turnover margin. BYU was plus-2 with two picks against Arizona and plus-3 with three picks and three fumble recoveries against Utah. The Cougars recorded a positive turnover margin in seven games in 2015.
- NEW FACES, NEW PLACES.** A number of players have shuffled positions with the coaching change to Kalani Sitake. Notable changes include several linebackers transitioning to defensive line positions with more 4-3 elements in the defensive scheme including Harvey Langi moving from mostly playing middle linebacker to defensive end. Two offensive players of note jumped to defense, including Francis Bernard moving from running back to linebacker and Akile Davis moving from receiver to cornerback. Micah Hannemann, the starting field corner in 2015 also moved into the middle at one of the safety positions.

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) was named head coach overseeing the BYU football program on December 19, 2015, by director of athletics Tom Holmoe.

Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history. He comes to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake returns to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven years as defensive coordinator and four seasons as an assistant head coach.

Prior to serving as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Oregon State in 2015, Sitake spent 10 seasons at the University of Utah. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012.

Sitake has coached several Pac-12 and Mountain West Conference honorees, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014). He also helped mentor 14 NFL Draft picks during his time at Utah, including 12 all-league players and three freshmen All-Americans. He helped the Utes win seven of eight bowl games during his tenure.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake becomes the first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He is the 14th head coach in BYU history, and just the fourth since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program.

Sitake began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards.

He was named BYU's Football Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1998, Impact Player of the Year in 1999, along with team captain and the most valuable running back in 2000. He signed a free agent contract with the Cincinnati Bengals in 2001, but was forced to retire due to an injury.

Sitake graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. He and his wife Timberly have three children, Skye, Sadie and Kelaokalani (KK).
