Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU `93, played `85-`88) is in his fifth season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013; 22-31 (.415) in 2014; 28-25 in 2015; and 37-17 in 2016 for an 119-95 (.556) record with the Cougars. The 49-year-old coach had a 219-128 (.631) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie `08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia `07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU `99), all in their fifth year at BYU.

Hitting Streaks

Brock Hale leads the team with a current four-game hitting streak. Kyle Dean, Nate Favero and Colton Shaver have current three-game hitting streaks. Keaton Kringlen's hitting streak ended at 13 games at Georgia State. Daniel Schneemann had a 10-game streak and Colton Shaver had a 12-game streak last season, while Tanner Chauncey had a hitting streak of 17 games.

Series vs. Northern Colorado, San Jose State

BYU has a 52-18 lead against Northern Colorado and San Jose State has a 14-11-1 lead over the Cougars.

BYU last played SJSU in 1999 when the Cougars won 2-of-3. The series vs. the Spartans began in 1963.

BYU last played UNC in 2013 in at the Brooks Wallace Classic in Lubbock, Texas and split a doubleheader there. The Cougars have a rich history with Northern Colorado, which was also known as Colorado State College. In 1958, Northern Colorado lost to BYU in District Seven play, but went in place of the Cougars to the College World Series because of the school's non-Sunday play policy.

Shaver WCC Player of Week vs. Portland in 2016

Colton Shaver was the Rawlings West Coast Conference Player for the Week against Portland. He hit .545 (6-11) with a double, home run and nine RBI and elevated his batting average from .453 to .464.

Chauncey WCC Player of Week vs. Gonzaga in 2016

Tanner Chauncey raised his batting average from .358 to .388. The junior designated hitter from Las Vegas hit his first home run of the season and second as a collegian, with a solo shot in the sixth inning of BYU's 11-2 victory over Gonzaga .In BYU's 5-4 comeback victory over Gonzaga on Saturday he had four consecutive singles, including knocking in BYU's first run of the game in the ninth inning.

Anderson WCC Player of Week vs. UVU, USF in 2016

Brennon Anderson raised his batting average from .319 to .341 in the four games culminating with the USF series, batting .538 with a slugging percentage of 1.000. He hit a pair of two-run homers in the San Francisco series, including the game-winning RBI in BYU's 12-6 victory.

Top 25 Teams

BYU lost at No. 21 Georgia Tech in the season opener, 5-3.

BYU won the first of three games in 2016 against No. 25 Creighton. In 2015 BYU played four nationally ranked teams: UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska, San Diego and upset No. 29 San Diego State.

In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball).

In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish fourth in the West Coast Conference after placing being tri-champs its fourth year in the league and third under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars return 22 lettermen for Littlewood's fifth season. Preseason WCC prognostications have BYU first by Baseball America, second (D1baseball.com) and fourth by Perfect Game.
