BYU STORYLINES

- **Last meeting.** BYU last played UNLV as a conference opponent in the Cougars' final year in the Mountain West. BYU defeated the Rebels 55-7 at home Nov. 6, 2010.
- **BYU vs. MW.** BYU has 275 wins against Mountain West opponents. Its last victory against a team from its former conference was the 2013 win against Nevada. Its last matchup with a MW opponent was the Oct. 24 loss to Boise State.
- **10 seasons.** Bronco Mendenhall is now in his 10th season as head coach of the Cougars. Mendenhall has an 87-38 record, and BYU ranks 12th in total wins nationally during his tenure.
- **Beating the best.** Since 2003, BYU has 17 wins against Power 5 schools, which ranks second among non-Power 5 schools behind fellow independent Navy. BYU has the longest season streak, with nine straight seasons with a Power 5 win.
- **No. 1.** BYU punter Scott Arellano recorded the longest punt in BYU history and in the NCAA this season with an 81-yarder vs. Middle Tennessee. He broke former NFL punter Lee Johnson's BYU record set in 1983 vs. Wyoming.
- **10 weeks in the spotlight.** BYU's game Saturday will be its 10th straight on national TV. BYU has been on ESPN six times, ESPN2 once, Fox Sports 1 once and CBS Sports Network once. Saturday's game will be the Cougars' first time on ESPN2 this season.
- **Blackout.** Saturday's game is a blackout game. The team will wear black alternate jerseys.

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

After home games, postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. BYU VS. MIDDLE TENNESSEE

A Christian Stewart touchdown rush gave BYU football a 27-7 victory against Middle Tennessee Saturday, snapping a four-game losing streak.

Stewart completed a 33-yard pass to Kurt Henderson to put the ball on the 1-yard line, giving himself the chance to run in on the next play for the final score and his first win as a starting quarterback.

The win put the Cougars (5-4) one game away from bowl eligibility. The Cougars started their first drive of the second half with 12:44 on the clock after Teu Kautai sacked Grammer, caused a fumble and forced Middle Tennessee to punt. A series of short plays put BYU on the 19-yard line. Scrambling, Stewart launched the ball to Jordan Leslie who stumbled into the end zone to break the tie and put BYU back in the lead 14-7.

Williams made his longest catch of the season on BYU's next scoring drive, but went down after a hit to the legs with a knee strain. The 28-yard catch set up the Cougars to score on a 2-yard Paul Lasike rush in the final minute of the third quarter. BYU led 21-7 going into the fourth quarter.

BYU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- **Senior punter Scott Arellano set career** highs with punts inside the 20-yard line (5) and longest punt (81 yards). The 81-yard punt from the BYU 6-yard line to the MT 13-yard line set a BYU record for longest punt, surpassing the previous long of 80 yards by Lee Johnson against Wyoming in 1983.
- **Senior quarterback Christian Stewart** completed 28 passes on 45 attempts for 316 yards and two touchdowns for a 135.9 rating. His 1-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter is his second rushing TD this season. He also completed passes to 10 receivers for the second time this season (the other was vs. Nevada).
- **Junior running back Jamaal Williams rushed** for 49 yards, surpassing Doak Walker Award winner Luke Staley (2,493 yards) for No. 6 all-time at BYU. His 8-yard run with 4:04 left in the second quarter pushed him into sixth.
- **Junior linebacker Teu Kautai recorded the** first sack of his career in the first quarter. His second sack of the game forced a punt on Middle Tennessee's opening drive of the second half. He notched his third sack on second down and 11 yards to go from the Middle Tennessee 12-yard line, tying the school record for sacks in a game.



UNLV VS. AIR FORCE

Air Force (7-2, 3-2 Mountain West) scored on eight of its 13 drives to power past UNLV (2-8, 1-5) 48-21 on Saturday. The Falcons' high-powered rushing game led an offensive charge that saw them outgain UNLV 542-339 with 386 yards coming on the ground.

It was the second consecutive week the Rebels fell to a run-heavy offense after New Mexico rushed for 301 yards on 61 carries last week, and went to the air just seven times. This time, it was Kale Pearson completing 5 of 6 for 115 yards and a touchdown while he also ran for 67 yards on 15 carries and another score.

UNLV scored on the game's first possession, moving 75 yards in 13 plays in a little more than five minutes, capped by Blake Decker's 11-yard touchdown scramble.

Air Force, meanwhile, used its highly potent triple-option attack to trudge through UNLV's defense, methodically grinding out scores on all four of its first-half drives, other than kneeling out to end the first half.

UNLV PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- **Senior Devante Davis, who was injured in Game** Three and missed a total of five games, started at a wide receiver spot and made an immediate impact. He caught a 4-yard touchdown in the second quarter to give him 21 for his career, which moved him into a tie with Same Greene for third place in Rebel history.
- **Davis posted his 10th career 100-yard receiving** game, which moved him to just two behind UNLV record-holder Ryan Wolfe, who had 12 from 2006-09. His 114 yards gave him 2,568 for his career, which moved him from fifth to third on the Rebel record list. He is now just 36 yards behind second place.
- **Junior safety Kenny Keys poste a career-high** 13 total tackles, which led all players Saturday.
- **Returning to the lineup was UNLV junior Ron** Scoggins, who made his first start since Sept. 27 at San Diego State. He had missed the last four games.
- **Senior RB Shaquille Murray-Lawrence ran in for** a 1-yard touchdown in the third quarter, which gave the Canadian a team-leading six rushing scores on the season.
- **Redshirt freshman quarterback Jared Lebowitz** made his collegiate debut in the third quarter when starter Blake Decker was knocked out of the game. He completed his first pass attempt as a Rebel, hitting tight end Taylor Barnhill for 6 yards but finished just 3 of 12 for 18 yards.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR FOUR

The 12-game independent slate features teams from 10 states and seven conferences, including the American Athletic, Atlantic Coast, Big 12, Pac-12, Conference USA, Mountain West and Mid-Eastern Athletic.

The Cougars will play six home games and six road contests in 2014. BYU will face teams that hail from Connecticut, Virginia, Florida, Georgia, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Idaho, Nevada and California, including seven programs—Texas, Houston, Utah State, Central Florida, Boise State, Middle Tennessee and UNLV—that qualified for a bowl game last season.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accommodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's 2012 average attendance of 61,161 ranked No. 3 in the West behind only USC (87,945) and UCLA (68,481).

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 88,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 406 missions around the world. Seventy-five percent of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

Eighty-eight members of the 2014 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in 28 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before eight games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

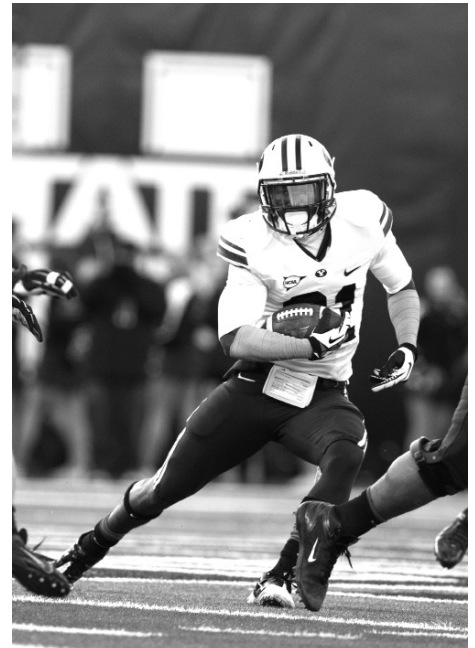

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **Go fast, go hard** has been the mantra of offensive coordinator Robert Anae. In 2014 the team is averaging one play every 20.4 seconds and 80.8 plays per game. Last year with a new offense, the Cougars averaged 89.9 plays per game, the second most of any team in the country only behind Texas Tech. Comparatively, BYU ran 79.2 plays per game in 2012.
- **BYU has not been shut out for 133 consecutive games.** The last time the Cougars failed to score was in 2003 in a 3-0 loss to Utah. That loss was the only time BYU has not produced points since 1975. BYU has scored in the last 490 of 491 games since 1975.
- **Running back Jamaal Williams ends season on injury.** Prior to his season-ending knee injury, the junior surpassed Luke Staly for No. 6 at BYU in career rushing yards (2,525). He also earned the No. 7 spot in school history for career carries (492) and tied for 9th in BYU career rushing touchdowns (23).
- **First drive scoring.** The Cougar offense scored on its first drive in a game for the third time this season in the win against Middle Tennessee. It previously had only done that twice this season, against UConn and Utah State.
- **First downs.** BYU's offense is averaging 25.2 first downs per game, tying it for No. 15 in the nation.
- **C-Stew measuring up.** With his 316 yards and his 62.2 completion percentage, Christian Stewart became the the fourth quarterback since 2000 and the 13th since 1977 to pass for at least 250 yards and complete at least 60 percent of his passes in three consecutive games. The last player to achieve that feat was Max Hall in 2009 during a stretch of wins against Wyoming, New Mexico and Air Force. Other quarterbacks to do this since 2000 are John Beck and Brandon Doman.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **BYU's run defense has been dominant.** At 112.8 rushing yards allowed per game, BYU ranks No. 12 in the country.
- **In the past nine seasons, BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in various national statistical categories 61 times on defense.** Currently, BYU ranks in the top 25 in defensive rushing yards per game and in opponent rushing yards per attempt and total pass breakups.
- **Lengthening the field.** The Cougars have allowed 27 rushing plays of 10 or more yards this season, ranking them in a tie at No. 20 in the nation. For the 2013 season, BYU allowed opponents 54 run plays of 10 yards or more to rank No. 26 in the country.
- **Pass Defense.** The Cougar defense stalled the pass attack against Middle Tennessee, allowing only 119 yards through the air en route to allowing only 228 total yards.
- **Shutout.** BYU shut out the offense in the second half of the win over the Blue Raiders. It was the second time the Cougars held the opposing offense scoreless for a half. The other time this season was a first-half shutout against Texas.

HEAD COACH**BRONCO MENDENHALL****YEARS AT BYU**

10th year as head coach, 12th at BYU

YEARS OVERALL

Entering his tenth season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to nine straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned an 87-38 record to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005. Mendenhall also ranks 12th in winning percentage at .696 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience.

The Cougars finished the 2013 season with an 8-5 record after playing one of the toughest schedules in school history. BYU earned six of its eight wins over bowl teams, including then-No. 15 Texas, and faced nine bowl teams overall. Under Mendenhall BYU is one of only 12 programs to earn a bowl invitation each of the past nine years. Only Florida State (7) has achieved more than BYU's six bowl victories over that timeframe.

The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first nine teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 116 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 82-34—almost identical to Edwards' 116-game mark of 83-32-1.

In 2006, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year following an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

He has also served as the defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. BYU has consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense over the past eight seasons, including three top-10 ratings. In 2012, the Cougars featured one of the greatest defenses in school history, allowing just 266.1 yards, including 86.9 rushing yards, and 14.0 points per game. Ranked No. 3 in total defense, No. 3 in scoring defense and No. 2 in rushing defense, the Mendenhall-coached unit held its first six opponents under 300 total yards (part of a streak of 12 consecutive such games dating back to 2011) and kept opposing offenses without a touchdown six times during the year. Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since the program began in 2007.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.
