#### **BYU STORYLINES**

- BITTERSWEET VICTORY. BYU is coming off a last-second win from a Hail Mary pass from Tanner Mangum to Mitch Mathews to stun Nebraska 33-28. Unfortunately Mangum had entered the game for an injured Taysom Hill who is likely out for the season after just one game.
- WHITEOUT. BYU will wear its white-on-white uniform combination for just the second time at home. The Cougars defeated Virginia 41-33 in the all-whites.
- HOME COOKIN'. In home openers, BYU is 7-3 under Coach Mendenhall and BYU is 57-32-1 overall.
- WHAT'S NEXT? After a season opening win, the Cougars are 4-3 in game two and 7-3 overall in game two of the season under Mendenhall.
- **BRONCO vs. BRONCOS**. Head coach Bronco Mendenhall is facing Boise State for the fourth time as a head coach. The Cougars lost a 7-6 defensive game n Boise in 2012 and BYU won in Provo in 2013 with a 37-20 victory. Last year Boise State won 55-30.
- FRESHMAN QUARTERBACKS. Tanner Mangum's debut at BYU began a little earlier than scheduled, but the freshman quarterback is poised to take over the reigns for runningmate Hill. Hill started two games a freshman in 2012, winning both. Jake Heaps started 10 games as freshman and went 6-4. He holds the true freshman BYU records for wins, passing yards, completions, attempts and touchdowns.
- VERSUS A RANKED TEAM. Under Mendenhall, BYU is 6-14 against ranked teams. The last time BYU beat a ranked team was No. 25 Texas in Austin last season.

#### MANGUM TO MATHEWS MIRACLE

LINCOLN, Neb. – In miraculous fashion, freshman quarterback Tanner Mangum made his collegiate debut, connecting with receiver Mitch Mathews on a 42-yard Hail Mary touchdown as BYU stunned Nebraska 33-28 on the road at Memorial Stadium in Lincoln.

With the Cougars facing a 28-27 deficit on fourth down with one second left on the game clock, Mangum notched his first career touchdown on the Hail Mary to help the Cougars (1-0) to beat the Cornhuskers (0-1, 0-0 Big 10). It is the first time in 30 years that Nebraska has fallen in its season opener.

With 48 seconds to go and no timeouts, the BYU offense took over at the 24-yard line after Nebraska missed a 41-yarder.

On second down and 10, Mangum converted an 11-yard run for a first down prior to Adam Hine's 16-yard rush up the middle. Two plays later another Mangum run pushed the Cougars to the 42-yard line, setting the stage for the eventual last-second pass.

#### **BYU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS**

#### • Taysom Hill QB (Sr.)

Hill completed 21 of 34 passes for 268 yards and rushing for another 72. He threw one touchdown pass and ran for two more scores. Unfortuantely, Hill was injured in the second quarter and returned to throw his one touchdown pass but left again for the remainder of the game in the fourth quarter.

#### Tanner Mangum QB (Fr.)

In relief of Hill, Mangum was a hero. He completed 7 of his 11 attempts for 111 yards and rushed five times for 27 yards. His one touchdown pass is now a thing of Cougar-legend as it went 42 yards on the last play of the game for the winning touchdown.

#### • Mitch Mathews WR (Sr.)

Mathews was quiet for most of the first half until he made his first reception, a 15-yard touchdown grab from Hill. He finished with three catches for 69 yards including the game-winner for 42 yards.

#### Nick Kurtz WR (Jr.)

Kurtz made a huge impact in his first serious action as a Cougar. He led BYU in receiving with five receptions and 123 yards. His first career catch was on a deep-ball, a 53-yarder over the middle from Hill.

#### • Logan Taele DL (Sr.)

Led BYU defense with 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack against Nebraska. He totaled six tackles.

#### • Jonny Linehan P (Jr.)

In his college football debut, Linehan punted fivetimes for 255 yards, an average of 51.0 yards. He dropped two inside the 20 and had a 77-yarder, No. 6 in distance for BYU history.



#### BOISE STATE HOLDS OFF WASHINGTON

BOISE, Idaho (AP) - Once the leader of Boise State's rise to prominence, Chris Petersen was on the verge of ending the Broncos' hopes for another special year in the season opener.

After nearly all of their 16-0 lead disappeared, the 23rdranked Broncos came up with enough plays to send Petersen home with a loss.

Jeremy McNichols rushed for 89 yards and two first-half touchdowns, and Boise State withstood a second half filled with special teams mistakes for a 16-13 victory over Washington on Friday night in Petersen's return to the school he helped grow into a national power.

Boise State (1-0) dominated the first half in building a 16-0 lead. But Washington's defense stymied the Broncos in the second half and three big plays on special teams -- including Dante Pettis' 76-yard punt return for a touchdown -- gave Washington a chance. Washington's Cameron Van Winkle's 46-yard field goal attempt with 21 seconds left was wide right. Van Winkle had hit from 40 and 28 yards earlier in the game.

#### **BSU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS**

#### · Jeremy McNichols RB (Jr.)

McNichols led the Broncos in all-purpose yards with 134. He led the team in rushing with 89 yards and had two touchdowns. He also caught three passes for 24 yards and one kick return for 21 yards.

#### • Ryan Finley QB (So.)

Finley quarterbacked the Broncos to a victory, completing 16 of his 26 passes for 129 yards with one interception. Also a threat to run, Finley ran the ball 11 times for 30 yards.

#### • Thomas Sperbeck WR (Jr.)

The wideout led the Broncos with three receptions for 28 yards. He caught a long pass of 15 yards. He even threw a pass, completing a 23-yarder, tying his quarterback for the longest pass play of the game.

#### • Tanner Vallejo LB (Jr.)

Vallejo recorded seven total tackles, including five solo stops. He led the Broncos in total tackles and also forced a fumble.

#### Kamalei Correa LB (Jr.)

The junior linebacker was in the backfield a lot for Boise State, posting 2.0 tackles for loss and getting a sack en route to his six total tackles.

#### • Darlan Thompson DB (Sr.)

Thompson recorded the first interception of the season for Boise State, returning it seven yeards. He also added four total tackles from the safety position.

2015 BYU FOOTBALL TEAM NOTES-5

#### INDEPENDENCE: YEAR FIVE

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from 10 states and six conferences, including the American Athletic, Big Ten, Pac-12, Mountain West and SEC. BYU has four games scheduled against current Power 5 teams and seven against teams from the Group of 5 conferences. The 12 teams on the schedule had a record of 92-53 in 2014, with eight teams coming off bowl games in 2014.

The Cougars will play six home games, five road contests and one neutral site game in 2015. The home schedule consists of Boise State, UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and Fresno State. The teams on the home schedule put together a record of 44-23, with four teams reaching bowl games in 2014. The road swing includes a big September with Nebraska, UCLA and Michigan. The Cougars visit San Jose State and Utah State with a game against Missouri at the Kansas City Chief's stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The road and neutral opponents combined for a 48-30 record in 2014, with four bowl games.

#### **FLAG BEARERS**

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

#### **TEAM CAPTAINS**

Selected by their teammates, senior quarterback Taysom Hill and senior defensive end Bronson Kaufusi will serve as team captains for the 2015 season.

#### LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accomodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

#### **MISSIONS**

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 85,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 406 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

91 members of the 2015 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

#### **BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS**

Nine different Cougars caught passes in the game, including seven that caught at least two receptions.

Two now famous plays in Cougar history. A 41-yard game-winning touchdown pass helped BYU win the 1980 Holiday Bowl and a 42-yard game-winning touchdown lifted the Cougars over Nebraska to complete two great victories in BYU history.

The Cougars were 100 percent in the Blue Zone, Each time inside the 20-vard line, BYU scored points. The offense picked up two touchdowns and two field goals.

BYU's 379 passing yards are the most in a season opener since the Cougars threw for 486 against Northern Iowa in 2008. BYU won that game 41-17.

The 511 yards of total offense is the third-best mark in the Mendenhall Era. No. 1 was 563 against Northern Iowa in 2008 and 513 last year at UConn.

#### THE BYU OFFENSE

- **GAME-WINNER.** The BYU offense has engineered its fair share of game-winning drives over the years. The last time BYU won the final play of the game was 2009's overtime game, a 26-23 triumph over the University of Utah. Max Hall threaded the needle and hit Andrew George for a 25-yard touchdown reception.
- 30 OR MORE. BYU's offense scored 33 points against Nebraska, the third-most of a Bronco Mendenhall coached team in its season opener. BYU has topped 30 points four times in openers. The Cougars scored 41 against Northern Iowa in 2008, 35 last year against UConn and 30 in 2012 against Washington State. For the first time since 2002-2003, the BYU offense scored 30 or more points in back-to-back season openers.
- MOVING THE CHAINS The Cougar offense accounted for 21 first downs, about four shy of its average in 2014.
- TOTAL OFFENSE. BYU's 511 yards of total offense are the third-most in the Mendenhall era of season openers. BYU had never gone back-to-back years with 500 or more yards in the opener under Mendenhall.
- THE BIG THREE. BYU's receiving combination of Mitch Mathews, Nick Kurtz and Terenn Houk stands at 6-foot-6, 6-foot-5 and 6-foot-4. All three were in the game when Mathews caught the winning touchdown against Nebraska. The three big receivers accounted for 12 receptions, 251 yards and two touchdowns.
- OFFENSIVE LINE EXPERIENCE. BYU returns an experienced offensive line for 2015. The five projected starters for BYU have logged 73 starts between them and have played in 96 games. Offensive tackle Ryker Mathews has the most games under his belt with 23 starts in 34 games played.

#### THE BYU DEFENSE

- BYU's run defense has been dominant. At 121.8 rushing yards allowed per game, BYU ranked No. 20 in the country in 2014. BYU allowed 126 yards rushing in the win over Nebraska.
- In the past 10 seasons, BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in various national statistical categories 65 times on defense. In 2014, BYU ranked in the top 25 in defensive rushing yards per game, opponent rushing yards per attempt, total opponent yards per play and total pass breakups.
- Lengthening the field. The Cougars allowed 40 rushing plays of 10 or more yards last season, ranking them in a tie at No. 2 in the nation with East Carolina and Oklahoma. For the 2013 season, BYU allowed opponents 54 run plays of 10 yards or more to rank No. 26 in the country.
- Staying Positive. BYU is 49-7 under Bronco Mendenhall with a positive turnover margin. The Cougars forced an interception and fumble recovery to the Cornhuskers' interception.
- Getting Behind the Line. In the season-opening win over Nebraska, BYU recorded seven tackles for loss and three team sacks. In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. Since 2005, BYU is 42-2 when notching three or more sacks in a single game.

Senior placekicker Trevor Samson has converted six consecutive field goal attempts dating back h to 2014. He has also made 29 straight PATs and 66 of 67 in his career.

Senior Adam Hine was one of seven players in 2014 to score at least one touchdown rushing, receiving and returning.

BYU special teams averaged 46.0 yards in net punting last week, ranking No. 9 in the country. The unit was No. 10 in the FBS last season in net punting with 41.19 yards per punt.

Entering his eleventh season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to 10 straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned a 91-39 record to rank 13th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage at .698 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience at the start of 2015.

The Cougars finished the 2014 season with an 8-5 record that included a 3-0 mark against Power 5 conference schools. Fueled by Heisman hopeful Taysom Hill, BYU won its first four games including a 41-7 win over then-No. 25 Texas. BYU then overcame a rash of midseason injuries to key players to finish the season with a 10th consecutive bowl game. In

doing so, the Cougars became one of 12 programs to earn a bowl inviation in each of the last 10 years. Only Florida State (7) has achieved more than BYU's six bowl victories over that

The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first 10 teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 129 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 90-39—similar to Edwards' 129-game mark of 93-35-1.

an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.



Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf. Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in


