BYU STORYLINES

- **1-0.** BYU is facing UConn for just the second time in school history. The Cougars topped UConn 35-10 in the 2014 season opener. BYU totaled 513 yards of total offense, led by 308 passing yards from Taysom Hill to go along with 97 rushing yards, accounting for five total touchdowns. He threw three and ran for two more scores.
- **HOME SWEET HOME.** The team returns home after back-to-back road games and playing three out of four on the road to start the season. BYU won its home opener against Boise State with a 35-24 comeback win. The Cougars start a series of four straight home games with UConn, East Carolina (Homecoming), Cincinnati and Wagner.
- **LOOKING FOR 300.** BYU's record in Provo is 299-134-6 since 1922. A win over UConn will give the Cougars their 300th program win in Provo. Since moving into LaVell Edwards Stadium, BYU is 226-69. Under Mendenhall the Cougars have gone 51-11 at home.
- **GAME FIVE.** BYU is 8-2 under Mendenhall in the fifth game of the year. The Cougars have outscored opponents 30-20 in the fifth game of the year over the last 10 seasons.

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

After home games, postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Mendenhall and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Mendenhall's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

NO. 22 BYU SHUT OUT BY MICHIGAN 31-0
ANN ARBOR, Mich. – No. 22 BYU football concluded its September schedule with a 31-0 loss against Michigan at Michigan Stadium Saturday afternoon.

The Cougars (2-2) had just 105 total yards compared to 448 by the Wolverines (3-1, 0-0 Big 10). It is the first time BYU has been shut out since a 3-0 loss to Utah in 2003, snapping a streak of 143 games of getting on the board.

BYU freshman quarterback Tanner Mangum completed 12 of 28 passes for 55 yards. Running back Francis Bernard saw his first action as a Cougar, rushing four times for 30 yards.

Defensive backs Micah Hanneman and Michael Wadsworth led the defense, each posting 10 tackles each. Defensive lineman Logan Taele added two tackles for loss while Remington Peck and Harvey Langi each posted sacks.

BYU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- **Michael Wadsworth DB (Sr.)**
Wadsworth tallied double-digit tackles for the second time this season with 10 tackles against Michigan. He had 11 stops against Boise State.
- **Tanner Mangum QB (Fr.)**
Mangum threw 12 of 28 for 55 yards on Saturday. His longest pass of the day was a 14-yard heave for first down. He also rushed six times in the game, the largest a 9-yard dash.
- **Harvey Langi LB (Jr.)**
Langi was one of two players to get a sack against Michigan. In three of the four games this season, he has had at least one sack. He also tallied seven total tackles in the game, including one tackle for a loss of 10 yards.
- **Mitch Mathews WR (Sr.)**
Mathews had one reception against Michigan. He extended his streak to 28 consecutive games with a reception.
- **Micah Hannemann DB (So.)**
Hannemann had a career-high 10 tackles in the loss at Michigan. His previous high was six tackles against Nebraska.
- **Jonny Linehan P (Jr.)**
Linehan had a career-high 11 punts against Michigan. He punted a total of 475 yards, averaging 43.2 yards per punt. In his college football debut against Nebraska, he had two punts over 50 yards, averaging 51.0 yards per punt.



UConn DROPS 28-18 DECISION TO NAVY
EAST HARTFORD, Conn. - Navy beat the UConn football team by a 28-18 on Saturday before a crowd of 33,204 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field. UConn falls to 2-2 on the season and 0-1 in American Athletic Conference.

UConn redshirt sophomore quarterback Bryant Sherriffs (Jefferson, Ga.) threw for 219 yards on a 19 of 32 performance with a pair of TD passes. Freshman wide receiver Tyraiq Beals (East Orange, N.J.) caught six passes for 63 yards and a score for the Huskies.

Sophomore Arkeel Newsome (Ansonia, Conn.) got the start at tailback for the Huskies and had 14 carries on 69 yards. He also had five receptions for 51 yards while Thomas had five receptions for 78 yards.

UConn PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- **Bryant Sherriffs QB (So.)**
Sherriffs went 19 of 32 for 219 yards in the loss against Navy. He threw two touchdowns in the game.
- **Tyraiq Beals WR (Fr.)**
Beals set career highs in receptions and receiving yards against Navy. He caught six passes for 63 yards on Saturday, including a 39-yard touchdown.
- **Andrew Adams S (Sr.)**
Adams had a career-best 17 tackles on Saturday, leading all players. He leads the team this season with 34 total tackles.
- **Arkeel Newsome RB (So.)**
Newsome had 14 carries to lead the team with 69 rushing yards, which is just four shy of his career high. He also caught five passes for 51 receiving yards.
- **Noel Thomas WR (Jr.)**
Thomas had 78 receiving yards, a team-high. He caught a pass from Sherriffs to complete a two-point conversion against Navy. The longest completion in the game was for 26 yards.
- **Bobby Puyol PK (Jr.)**
Puyol connected on his only field goal attempt against Navy, a 38-yard kick in the first quarter. He has made all four of his field goal attempts this season.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR FIVE

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from 10 states and six conferences, including the American Athletic, Big Ten, Pac-12, Mountain West and SEC. BYU has four games scheduled against current Power 5 teams and seven against teams from the Group of 5 conferences. The 12 teams on the schedule had a record of 92-53 in 2014, with eight teams coming off bowl games in 2014.

The Cougars will play six home games, five road contests and one neutral site game in 2015. The home schedule consists of Boise State, UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and Fresno State. The teams on the home schedule put together a record of 44-23, with four teams reaching bowl games in 2014. The road swing includes a big September with Nebraska, UCLA and Michigan. The Cougars visit San Jose State and Utah State with a game against Missouri at the Kansas City Chief's stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The road and neutral opponents combined for a 48-30 record in 2014, with four bowl games.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accommodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 85,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 417 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

81 members of the 2015 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before six games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

5-2:00 The Cougar offense has had five scoring drives of two minutes or less, including four touch-down drives.

70+ BYU is tied for the nation's lead with not one, but two 70+ yard pass plays. Only four other teams have had passing play of 70 yards or more this season.

84 Tanner Mangum's 84-yard pass to Mitchell Juergens for a touchdown against Boise State was the fifth-longest passing play in BYU history. The longest is a 97-yarder from Ty Detmer to Eric Drage against Utah in 1991. BYU is one of 16 teams with a pass of 80+ yards this season.

THE BYU OFFENSE

• **SPREADING THE WEALTH.** 12 different players have caught a pass for BYU this season. Nine of the 12 have recorded multiple catches. In the run game, nine different players have had touches running the ball in 2015.

• **MITCH AND MITCHELL.** BYU's pair of receivers both named Mitch have been go-to targets in the first four games. The combo of Mitch Mathews and Mitchell Juergens have combined for 33 receptions, 439 yards and five touchdowns.

• **THE BIG THREE.** BYU's receiving combination of Mitch Mathews, Nick Kurtz and Terenn Houk stands at 6-foot-6, 6-foot-5 and 6-foot-4. The three big receivers accounted for 38 receptions, 459 yards and three touchdowns.

• **OFFENSIVE LINE EXPERIENCE.** BYU returns an experienced offensive line for 2015. The five projected starters for BYU have logged 88 starts between them and have played in 107 games. Offensive tackle Ryker Mathews has the most games under his belt with 26 starts in 37 games played.

• **FRESHMAN WATCH.** The Cougars are starting a true freshman quarterback for just the fourth time. Tanner Mangum and Taysom Hill are the only two to win their first starts as true freshman. BYU has also had significant contributors as freshman this year with wide receiver Moroni Lauulu-Pututau and running back Francis Bernard.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **THIRD DOWN IS KEY.** In half their games in 2015, the Cougars have held opponents to a third-down conversion rate of under 20 percent. BYU held opposing offenses to under 20 percent in only two games in 2014 (vs. Savannah St. & Texas).
- **3 AND OUT.** The BYU defense has held opponents to three and out in 21 out of 52 drives this season, averaging 5.25 times per game holding opponents to four downs or less per possession. The Cougars are tied for No. 25 in the country along with Florida and Colorado.
- **STAYING POSITIVE.** BYU is 51-8 under Bronco Mendenhall with a positive turnover margin. Neither the Cougars nor the Wolverines had turnovers in last Saturday's game.
- **PICKS.** The Cougars have picked off opponents three times per game in the past three out of five games dating back to the bowl game in 2014, contributing to a 2015 season total of seven interceptions.
- **GETTING BEHIND THE LINE.** In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. In 2015, they are 2-0. Since 2005, BYU is 43-2 when notching three or more sacks in a single game.

BRONCO MENDENHALL**HEAD COACH****YEARS AT BYU**

11th year as head coach, 13th at BYU

YEARS OVERALL

27th year

Entering his eleventh season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to 10 straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned a 90-39 record to rank 13th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005 prior to the start of 2015. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage at .698 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience in the same time period.

The Cougars finished the 2014 season with an 8-5 record that included a 3-0 mark against Power 5 conference schools. Fueled by Heisman hopeful Taysom Hill, BYU won its first four games including a 41-7 win over then-No. 25 Texas. BYU then overcame a rash of midseason injuries to key players to finish the season with a 10th consecutive bowl game. In doing so, the Cougars became one of 12 programs to earn a bowl invitation in each of the last 10 years. Only Florida State (7) has achieved more than BYU's six bowl victories over that timeframe.

The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first 10 teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 129 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 90-39—similar to Edwards' 129-game mark of 93-35-1.

In 2006, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year following an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

He has also served as the defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. BYU has consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense over the past eight of nine seasons, including three top-10 ratings. In 2012, the Cougars featured one of the greatest defenses in school history, allowing just 266.1 yards, including 86.9 rushing yards, and 14.0 points per game. Ranked No. 3 in total defense, No. 3 in scoring defense and No. 2 in rushing defense, the Mendenhall-coached unit held its first six opponents under 300 total yards (part of a streak of 12 consecutive such games dating back to 2011) and kept opposing offenses without a touchdown six times during the year. Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since the program began in 2007.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.
