- Player and Coach Whittingham interviews are typically conducted after practice on Mondays and Tuesdays. Media may observe the final 20 minutes of practice on Tuesdays. Note: Weeks of Thursday games, the only media access is the press conference
- Players at the Monday press conferences will not be available after practice that day
- One offensive and one defensive assistant coach will be available for interviews after Tuesday practices (no assts weeks of bye/Thur. games)
- 10-minute limit on player interviews

Five Facts

- > Utah head coach **Kyle Whittingham** needs four more victories to reach career win No. 100. Whittingham is 96-46 in his 12th season as head coach.
- > The Utes have sold out 39-straight games in Rice-Eccles Stadium since the 2010 season opener, including 36 standing room-only crowds.
- > Utah has won the last five games against BYU, most recently at the 2015 Las Vegas Bowl. See page 2 for the complete series history.
- > Utah is 18-1 in non-conference games since joining the Pac-12 in 2011. The lone loss was in overtime at Utah State in 2012.
- > Both head coaches in this week's game earned their first regularseason victory against Arizona: **Whittingham** in 2005 and BYU's **Kalani Sitake l**ast week. Whittingham's first career win came against Pittsburgh in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl as the co-head coach.

Utah-BYU Series (58-34-4)

Series Snapshot: Utah leads the series with BYU 58-34-4, although the Cougars don't recognize six games (split 3-3) when it was known as the Brigham Young Academy. Utah has beaten BYU five straight times and has won 10 of the last 13 games. Kyle Whittingham is 7-3 against the Cougars as Utah's head coach. After a two-year break from regular-season games, Utah beat BYU in the 2015 Las Vegas Bowl. Utah leads the Cougars 38-17-3 in Salt Lake City, where BYU last won in 2006.

Utah forced five-straight BYU turnovers in the first quarter—scoring touchdowns off all of them—en route to a 35-28 win over BYU in the Las Vegas Bowl. Bowl MVP Tevin Carter intercepted two passes, returning one for a touchdown. Utah's other takeaways came on fumble recoveries by Gionni Paul and Stevie Tu'ikolovatu and an interception by Dominique Hatfield. Joe Williams rushed for 91 yards and two touchdowns in a game where Utah took a 35-0 first-quarter lead before stalling on offense and surviving a BYU comeback attempt.

- > Utah was the only Power 5 Conference team to pitch a shutout during the opening week.
- > Utah allowed just seven first downs against Southern Utah, the fourth-fewest in the country, during the first weekend.
- > Utah allowed just 42 passing yards against SUU, fewest in the Pac-12 and the third-fewest allowed in the country. Its 41.82 pass efficiency defense rating also leads the conference and ranks third nationally.
- > Utah leads the Pac-12 and ranks eighth nationally in total defense (158.0).
- > Utah leads the Pac-12 and ranks third nationally in net punting (46.83) and is fifth nationally in total punt yards (333).
- > Utah leads the Pac-12 and ranks fourth nationally in time of possession (38:50).
- > Utah leads the Pac-12 in third-down conversion percentage defense (0.167), fourth-down conversion percentage defense (0.00) and red zone defense (0.00).

Connections

Utah has four former BYU football players on its coaching staff: head coach **Kyle Whittingham** (1978-81), co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Aaron Roderick** (1997-98), co-special teams' coordinator/linebackers coach **Justin Ena** (1997-2001) and tight ends coach **Freddie Whittingham** (1987-89). Kyle Whittingham was the 1981 Western Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year and a first-team all-conference linebacker. Ena was a three-time all-conference linebacker ... First-year Ute assistant coach **Guy Holliday** coached the receivers at BYU from 2013-15 ... BYU has three former Utah assistant coaches on its staff: head coach **Kalani Sitake**, defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Ilaisa Tuiki** and defensive line coach **Steve Kaufusi**.

Two-Minute Drill

Kyle Whittingham is 7-3 against BYU as the head coach. Utah leads the all-time series with BYU 58-34-4 and is 38-17-3 against the Cougars in Salt Lake City. See page 2 for the complete series history ... Utah is 3-3 all-time in games televised by FOX ... In his Ute and NCAA debut, sophomore **Mitch Wishnowsky** had the best punt average in the country during the first week of play. Wishnowsky's 55.5 average against SUU was also a school record. See Kicking Notebook for more ... Utah scored on three of five trips into the red zone against Southern Utah (2 touchdowns, 1 FG) for a 60% success rate.

In the Huddle

The only adjustment to the depth chart between week one and two is that sophomore **Cody Barton** is now the sole starter at rover linebacker ahead of junior college transfer **Kavika Luafatasaga**. Both started last week (Luafatasaga at stud), along with junior **Sunia Tauteoli** (at mac) ... Five Utes got their first career starts last week against SUU: offensive tackle **Garett Bolles**, wide receiver **Kyle Fulks** and linebackers **Tauteoli**, **Barton** and **Luafatasaga** ... Five true freshmen played against SUU: **Julian Blackmon**, **Terrell Burgess**, **Tyler Huntley**, **Demari Simpkins** and **Donavan Thompson**.

Game Day Activities

Halftime will feature a patriotic joint performance by the Utah and BYU marching bands ... During the first-quarter break, a giga-pixel image will be taken of Rice-Eccles Stadium. Following the game, fans will be able to view the photo online and tag themselves on social media ... The Ute Walk begins at 3 p.m. on the corner of Guardsman Way and 500 South.

Last Game

Utah kicked off its season with a 24-0 win over Southern Utah in a game where the Thunderbirds crossed midfield only twice, gained just 158 total yards and picked up only seven first downs. Marcus Williams created both SUU turnovers, forcing and recovering a fumble on the Utah 33-yard line to end SUU's first offensive series, and later intercepting a pass. Kylie Fitts had three of Utah's nine tackles for loss, including 1.5 sacks, and Cody Barton had a team and career-high 11 tackles (1.0 TFL). In his first start as a Ute, junior quarterback Troy Williams passed for 272 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions. Tim Patrick had a career-high 105 receiving yards and two touchdowns.

Utah's All-Time Record

Utah's all-time football record is 653-449-31. The Utes are 397-186-16 at home (79-29 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 235-246-12 in road games and 21-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

Utah vs. the Pac-12

Utah is 20-25 in league games as a conference member and 96-145-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools. The series breakdown follows: Arizona (1-4/20-19-2), Arizona State (1-4/7-20), California (2-1/5-5), Colorado (4-1/28-31-3), Oregon (1-2/9-20), Oregon State (3-2/8-11-1), Stanford (2-0/4-3), UCLA (2-3/3-11), USC (1-4/4-10), Washington (1-2/1-8), Washington State (2-2/7-7).

Whittingham File

Twelfth-year head coach **Kyle Whittingham**—the 2008 National Coach of the Year—has participated in more Utah victories than any football coach in school history. As an assistant and head coach, Whittingham has played a role in 181 victories in 22 seasons at Utah. More than half of those have come as the head coach (96-46). Whittingham's 90-percent bowl winning percentage (9-1 record) ranks first all-time in the NCAA. His postseason victories include a 2-0 mark in BCS bowls games as the co-coach of Utah's 2005 Fiesta Bowl win

Quarterback Notebook

- > Utah quarterbacks averaged 12.96 yards per completion against Southern Utah, a mark that ranked fourth in the Pac-12 during the opening week.
- > Junior transfer **Troy Williams** completed 20-of-35 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns (0 INT) against SUU in his Ute debut.
- > Williams was the only Pac-12 quarterback with two completions of 50 yards or longer (57 and 52) in the opening week.
- > Williams ranks third in the Pac-12 in yards per completion (13.6) and is sixth in both total offense (287) and passing yardage (272).
- > Williams is second in the league in passing yards on second down (161), completing 7-of-14 attempts in that scenario against SUU.
- > **Williams**, who began his career at Washington where he played in five games with one start, has a career completion percentage of 60.6 (43-of-71), passing for 448 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions.
- > True freshman **Tyler Huntley** checked in for the final series of the SUU game, leading Utah to three first downs before time expired.
- > **Huntley** completed 3-of-4 passes for 26 yards, including an 11-yard completion on fourth and one for a first down.
- > Senior safety **Jason Thompson** is taking some quarterback reps in practice as Utah's third option. Thompson played quarterback at Wyoming before transferring to Utah.

Kicking Notebook

- > **Andy Phillips**, a three-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist and a two-time All-Pac-12 selection (first team in 2014), has handled all of Utah's field goal attempts since 2013 while playing in all 39 games.
- > **Phillips** went 1-for-2 in field goals against Southern Utah with a make of 26 yards and miss from 36. His miss snapped a streak of 11-straight makes dating back to last season.
- > **Phillips** is Utah's career record-holder for field goals made (64), field goal attempts (77) and points scored (327).

Punting Notebook

- > Utah is third in the nation in net punting (46.83) after one game. Its 333 punt yards ranks fifth nationally.
- > After one week, sophomore **Mitch Wishnowsky** leads the nation in punt average (55.5).
- > In his Utah debut, **Wishnowsky** set a school single-game punting record by averaging 55.5 yards per punt (6 punts, 333 yards) against SUU.
- > Wishnowsky broke the record previously held by fellow Australian and two-time Ray Guy Award and consensus All-American **Tom Hackett**, set in 2014.
- > **Wishnowsky** had five punts of 50 yards or more against SUU, which is the second-most 50-yard punts in a game in school history. His long was 66 yards.

Facility Upgrades

A high-tech massive video board rising 137 feet above the plaza behind the south stands of Rice-Eccles Stadium was installed in the summer. The overall LED display size of the board currently ranks among the largest in the country at 122 feet wide by 64 feet tall. The high-definition display has a 16:9 aspect ratio, allowing video to be shown fully without being cropped or stretched. Another feature of the \$13.5 million project (funded by the Department of Athletics and Auxiliary Services) is a distributed sound system that uses a series of speakers mounted around the top of the stadium and directs the sound downward, rather than outward, to improve the quality of the sound for those inside the stadium and reduce noise for the surrounding community. The Spence Eccles Football Complex was also upgraded over the summer with the addition of a new artificial turf practice field. The new FieldTurf practice field is adjacent to the current natural grass field behind the Spence and Cleone Football Center and the turf field inside the Spence Eccles Field House.

FanUp!

The University of Utah implemented a FanUp campaign in August of 2016 to encourage good sportsmanship from Ute fans and their athletic teams.
