NOTABLES

- **HOLMES OFF TO FAST START**
Junior forward Jonathan Holmes leads the team in scoring (15.0 ppg) and ranks second on the squad in blocks (8) and tied for second in rebounding (6.0 rpg) while averaging 22.3 minutes per game through the first four contests. Holmes, who has reached double figures in scoring in each of the first four games, has converted 22-of-42 (.524) field goals, including 8-of-16 (.500) from three-point range, and 8-of-9 (.889) free throws.
- **DEPTH AND BALANCE**
Five UT players are averaging double figures in scoring and four individuals are averaging at least 6.0 rebounds per game through the first four contests. All 10 scholarship players for the Longhorns have seen action in all four games and are averaging double figures in minutes played. No individual is averaging more than 31 minutes per contest (Demarcus Holland leads team at 30.8 mpg).
- **CLEANING THE GLASS**
Texas has outrebounded each of its first four opponents, posting double-digit rebound advantages in three of its first four games. The Horns have registered a +11.8 rebound margin (43.0-31.3) through their first four contests this year.

TEXAS VS. BRIGHAM YOUNG

- Texas and BYU are meeting in Kansas City for a CBE Hall of Fame Classic Championship Round semifinal.
- The Longhorns and BYU are meeting for the sixth time. The Cougars own a 3-2 lead in the all-time series that dates back to a 63-50 BYU win on Dec. 9, 1967 in Provo.
- The last time the two squared off, the No. 13 Longhorns defeated BYU, 96-57, on Dec. 1, 1978 in Austin.
- UT and BYU are meeting at a neutral site for the second time in series history. The Cougars dealt UT a 91-86 overtime loss at the Kiwanis Tournament (Norfolk, Va.) on Dec. 29, 1975.

WHAT'S IN A WIN

- A win would mark the **1,679th** victory in program history.
- A win would mark head coach Rick Barnes' **363rd** victory at Texas, and his **565th** victory all-time as a head coach.
- A win would move the Horns to 5-0 for the first time since the 2009-10 campaign (started 17-0) and for the fifth time under Rick Barnes.

ABOUT THE CBE HALL OF FAME CLASSIC



The event is named after the College Basketball Experience, the award-winning and highly interactive college hoops fan facility adjacent to the Sprint Center arena. It also features the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. The College Basketball Experience is the nation's only facility that celebrates, in its

entirety, the sport of men's collegiate basketball. The tournament, in partnership with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), was established in 2001 as the Guardians Classic.

- **Texas has claimed the championship in each of its last two appearances at this tournament.**
- The Horns won the 2005 Guardians Classic with wins against West Virginia and Iowa.
- Texas returned to the event and captured the 2009 CBE Classic title with victories against Iowa and Pittsburgh.
- Texas, Wichita State, BYU and DePaul served as Regional Round hosts for the tournament, hosting a pair of games to open the tourney before advancing to Kansas City (Nov. 25-26) for the semifinals and consolation/championship games

SPRINT CENTER SUCCESS

Since the Sprint Center opened in October of 2007, UT has posted an 11-5 all-time record in the facility. The Horns have registered a 9-5 mark in five appearances at the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship at Sprint Center (league postseason tournament has been held there each year except in 2009). Texas advanced to the title game of the 2008 and 2011 Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship. UT also posted victories against Iowa (85-60) and Pittsburgh (78-62) en route to winning the 2009 O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic Championship.

HOUSTON BAPTIST POSTGAME NOTES

- The Longhorns improved to 136-19 against in-state foes during the Rick Barnes era.
- Texas' 89 points marked the most points scored in a game this season and the most since scoring 92 in an overtime win against Oklahoma on Feb. 27, 2013.
- Texas' 28-point margin of victory was the highest since beating Sam Houston by 28 points (65-37) on Nov. 27, 2012.
- Texas had 11 blocks, the most since the Horns rejected 12 shots against Mississippi State on Nov. 21, 2012.
- For the second time this season, all 10 of UT's scholarship players scored.
- All three of Texas' walk-ons (Danny Newsome, Brandon Allums and Tarale Murry) made their Longhorn debut. Newsome recorded three points and hauled down four rebounds.
- In the final 1:46, Texas played five first-year players at once for the first time this season.
- At least four players reached double figures in scoring for the second consecutive game.
- **Jonathan Holmes** - Recorded 15 points, reaching double figures for the fourth straight game this season and for the 20th time in his career (66 games). Matched his career high in blocks with three.
- **Javan Felix** - Reached double figures (14 points) for the fourth straight game this year (longest streak of career) and for the 13th time in his career (38 games).
- **Damarcus Croaker** - Scored a season-high in points (9), rebounds (4), assists (2) and minutes (15).
- **Kendal Yancy** - Made his first career start, scored a season-high seven points in 16 minutes while adding four rebounds and two steals.
- **Connor Lammert** - Recorded a season-high 13 points. Reached double figures in scoring for the second time this year and fifth time in his career (38 games). Also added a game-high nine rebounds and tied his career high in 3-pointers made (2-of-2)
- **Martez Walker** - Scored a season-high 10 points (4-of-8 FG, 2-of-3 threes).

COMEBACK HORNS

The Longhorns rallied for second-half comeback wins in each of their first three contests. UT overcame a nine-point deficit (62-53) with 9:44 left against Mercer (Nov. 8), going on a 23-11 run to close the game. The Horns also trailed South Alabama (Nov. 12) by 10 points (64-54) at the 11:51 mark, before closing the contest on a 30-13 run. In the win against SFA (Nov. 15), UT faced a five-point deficit (40-35) with 16:31 left. Tied at 60-60 at the 3:10 mark, the Horns closed the game with a 12-2 spurt.

DEFENSE WINS

Solid defense has been a trademark of the Texas program under Rick Barnes. Since Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 247 of their 517 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. Texas sports a 221-26 (.895) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat. UT has held its first four opponents to an average of 68.2 ppg on 40.0 percent FG shooting.

- UT held Mercer to 39.7 percent, Stephen F. Austin to 38.6 percent and Houston Baptist to 39.2 percent FG shooting.

- In the win against Houston Baptist, UT recorded team season highs in steals (8), turnovers forced (16) and blocked shots (11). The 11 blocks were two shy of the single-game record.

CLEANING THE GLASS

Texas has outrebounded each of its first four opponents, posting double-digit rebound advantages in three of its first four games. The Horns have registered a +11.8 rebound margin (43.0-31.3) through their first four contests this year.

PROTECTING THE ROCK

Texas has been an improved team when it comes to protecting the basketball through the first four contests this year. Last season, the Horns averaged 14.7 turnovers per game and recorded a 391-to-500 assist-to-turnover ratio on the year. This season, Texas is averaging just 12.5 turnovers per contest and sports a 51-to-50 assist-to-turnover ratio. The Horns committed a season-low nine turnovers in last Monday's win against Houston Baptist.

LOOKING TO GET BACK TO THE BIG DANCE

Last year, Texas had its streak of consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances snapped at 14. Prior to that, UT had advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of Rick Barnes' first 14 seasons in Austin (1999-2012). Prior to the Barnes era, UT's previous mark for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances was four (set twice).

AN "ELITE" PROGRAM

Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last eight years and three times in the last 11 seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).

IN "SWEET" COMPANY

Texas has advanced to at least the NCAA "Sweet 16" a total of five times in the last 12 years (2002, 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2008). The Longhorns are one of just 13 schools to accomplish this feat, joining Duke (9), Kansas (9), Michigan State (7), Connecticut (6), Kentucky (6), North Carolina (6), Syracuse (6), Arizona (5), Pittsburgh (5), Wisconsin (6), Louisville (5) and Xavier (5).

CONSISTENT SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12

Texas has reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 10 times in the first 15 seasons under Rick Barnes (the first 13 years featured 16-game league schedules). The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in all but one of Barnes' 15 seasons in Austin. UT has recorded at least 13 conference victories in six of Barnes' first 15 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11).

SUCCESS AGAINST ELITE PROGRAMS UNDER BARNES

Texas has been successful against several elite programs during the Rick Barnes era. UT is 3-1 under Barnes against UCLA, 4-4 vs. Michigan State and 4-1 vs. North Carolina. In addition, UT has posted a 4-4 mark in home games against Kansas under Barnes.

SUCCESS AGAINST THE AP TOP 25

During his first 15 seasons in Austin, Rick Barnes has registered a school-record 58 career victories against AP Top 25 opponents (previous mark: 10-44 by Tom Penders, 1989-98). Barnes has guided the Horns to a 58-82 (.414) record against ranked teams. Barnes has posted 88 career victories against AP Top 25 foes.

BEATING THE BEST

UT's win at No. 2 Kansas on Jan. 22, 2011 equaled the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Longhorns have defeated in school history. Six of Texas' nine all-time wins against AP Top Three teams have come during the Rick Barnes era.

HOLMES RETURNS AS LONE SCHOLARSHIP JUNIOR

The most experienced player on this year's roster, junior forward Jonathan Holmes leads the team in scoring (15.0 ppg) and ranks second on the squad in blocks (8) and tied for second in rebounding (6.0 rpg) while averaging 22.3 minutes per game through the first four contests. Holmes, who has reached double figures in scoring in each of the first four contests, has converted 22-of-42 (.524) field goals, including 8-of-16 (.500) from three-point range, and 8-of-9 (.889) free throws. Holmes has played in 66 career games (48 starts) and has reached double figures in scoring 21 times and in rebounds three times. Last year as a sophomore, he led the team in rebounding (5.6 rpg) despite averaging just 20.5 minutes per game.

HUGE NIGHT FOR HOLMES

In the win over South Alabama (Nov. 12), Holmes posted career highs in points (23), field goals made (8-of-16) and three-pointers made (4-of-7) while adding nine rebounds (five offensive), two blocks, one assist and one steal in 26 minutes.

FELIX'S FILE

The top returning scorer from last season's team (6.8 pg), sophomore guard Javan Felix ranks second on the team in scoring (13.8 ppg) and leads the team in assists (4.0 apg) through the first four contests this year. He has reached double figures in scoring in all four games this season (longest stretch of his career). The New Orleans native has played in 38 career games (26 starts).

DID YOU KNOW?

A HELPING HOLLAND

Sophomore guard **Demarcus Holland** was the catalyst in UT's comeback win against Stephen F. Austin (Nov. 15), as he dropped a career-high 21 points on 9-of-13 shooting. Through the first four games, Holland is ranked third on the team with 11.0 ppg and has seen 30.8 minutes per game, which is more than double the action he saw as a freshman. The second-year guard has appeared in 38 games (16 starts) during his career. Last year as a rookie, he ranked fourth on the team in steals (23) while averaging just 16.5 minutes per game. He earned the team's Outstanding Defensive Player honor following last season. Holland averaged 19.6 minutes per contest during the last 19 games of last season, compared to 12.7 minutes per game in the first 15 contests.

RIDLEY RISES

After playing in 33 of the 34 games (19 starts) as a freshman last year, sophomore **Cameron Ridley** has made starts in all four games as a sophomore. So far this season, he leads the squad with 10 blocked shots while ranking in a tie for second on the team in rebounding (6.0 rpg.). He led the team in blocked shots (47) and ranked fourth in rebounding (4.3 rpg) while averaging 16.4 minutes per contest last year.

RIDLEY'S BIG NIGHT

In UT's season-opening win against Mercer (Nov. 8, 2013), sophomore center **Cameron Ridley** recorded eight points (3-of-7 FG, 2-of-4 FT), 11 rebounds and five blocks in 27 minutes. He tied his career high in blocks (5 vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 21, 2012). Ridley reached double figures in rebounds (11) for the fourth time in his career (34 games). The 11 boards were one shy of his career high (12 vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 21, 2012).

PRINCE'S PRESENCE

After seeing action as a freshman in all 34 games (four starts), sophomore center Prince Ibeh ranks third on the team in blocks (7) and fifth in rebounding (4.0) while averaging 15.3 minutes per contest through the first four games this year. He ranked second on the team in blocked shots (40) despite averaging just 10.4 minutes per contest last year. Ibeh was voted the team's Most Improved Player last year following the season. He had his best game of the year in the season finale at Houston (March 20), posting 12 points, 11 rebounds and five blocks in 23 minutes.

LAMMERT PLAYING A LARGER ROLE

Sophomore forward Connor Lammert leads the team in rebounding (7.5 rpg) and ranks fourth in scoring (10.8 ppg) in 22.8 minutes per game while hitting 16-of-22 (.727) field goals, including 4-of-6 threes, and 7-of-8 (.875) free throws through the first four contests. He also ranks fourth on the team in blocked shots (5). By comparison, Lammert averaged 4.5 points and 4.2 rebounds in 21.0 minutes per game while hitting 48.1 percent (64-of-133) from the floor last year.

LAMMERT'S CONSISTENT TREND

In the opening game of the season, sophomore **Connor Lammert** gathered nine points off the bench against Mercer. Since then, he has not scored less than that in a game and has made at least four field goals in all four contests. MAKING AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT

UT's quartet of freshmen guards (**Damarcus Croaker, Isaiah Taylor, Martez Walker and Kendal Yancy**) made an impact during the team's season-opening victory against Mercer. All four freshmen scored and combined to post 28 points (8-of-15 FG, 3-of-4 threes, 9-of-15 FT), eight rebounds and two assists in 58 minutes. So far in their early UT careers, Taylor has started all four games, while Yancy has made one start. All four frosh are averaging double figures in minutes played.

TAYLOR TIDBITS

Freshman **Isaiah Taylor** has earned the starting nod at point guard in each of the first four games to start his collegiate career. He ranks second on the team in assists (3.5 apg) and fifth in scoring (10.5 ppg) while averaging 27.8 minutes per contest. Taylor sports a 14-to-8 (1.75-to-1) assist-to-turnover ratio and also averages 3.5 rebounds per game. He has reached double figures in scoring in three of the first four contests. Taylor was rated as the No. 13 prospect in the state of Texas by ESPN.com following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 17.6 points, 10.8 assists and 6.0 steals per game while leading his team to a 23-5 mark as a senior.

TAYLOR HAS IMPRESSIVE FRESHMAN DEBUT

Freshman point guard Isaiah Taylor posted a team-high 17 points (4-of-10 FG, 9-of-14 FT) to go along with three rebounds and two assists in 29 minutes during his collegiate debut against Mercer on Friday night. The 17 points marked the sixth-highest scoring output by a UT player in his freshman debut and just three shy of the record held by Kevin Durant (20 vs. Alcorn State on Nov. 9, 2006). Taylor also became the 32nd freshman player in UT history to earn a start in the season opener since freshman became eligible beginning in the 1972-73 season.

WALKER'S WAY

Freshman **Martez Walker** played a season-high 18 minutes against Houston Baptist and set season highs in points (10) and rebounds (4). For the year, Walker is averaging 3.3 points, 2.3 rebounds and 11.0 minutes per game, while shooting 3-of-6 from three-point range. Walker was ranked as the No. 8 player in the state of Michigan by ESPN.com following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 20.4 points and seven rebounds per game while leading his team to a 25-1 mark and the Michigan Class A state quarterfinals as a senior.

CROAKER'S CREDENTIALS

Freshman **Damarcus Croaker** s averaging 3.8 points per game and his shooting 50 percent (4-of-8) from three-point range. Croaker was ranked as the No. 105 prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and tabbed the No. 6 prospect in the state of Florida following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 23.9 ppg and paced his team to the 2013 Florida High School Athletic Association regional quarterfinals.

YANCY'S YOUTH

Freshman **Kendal Yancy** made his first career start in Burnt Orange against HBU (Nov. 18, 2013). So far as a rookie, Yancy is averaging 3.0 points and shooting 50 percent (4-of-8) in 11.8 minutes per game. Yancy was ranked as the No. 85 prospect nationally in the ESPN100 following his senior year. He averaged 12.2 points, 6.6 rebounds and 7.8 assists per game while leading his team to a 33-6 record and a trip to the Texas 5A state semifinals as a senior.

TRIO OF WALK-ONS COMPLETE ROSTER

The Longhorns return one walk-on from last season in redshirt freshman **Danny Newsome** and gained two additional walk-ons in junior **Tarale Murry** and sophomore **Brandon Allums** this fall. All three walk-ons made their UT debut in the win over Houston Baptist (Nov. 18).

- After joining the team last year as a preferred walk-on during the Fall 2012 semester, **Newsome** did not see game action as a true freshman and claimed a redshirt season. He averaged 11.8 ppg, 7.8 rpg and 2.7 bpg as a senior while leading his team to a school single-season record 27 wins.
- **Allums** spent the 2012-13 season as a practice player for the UT women's basketball team. He averaged 4.6 points and 2.6 rebounds per contest in 34 games played as a senior.
- **Murry** joined the team as a walk-on during fall individual workouts. He set the school record for most career rebounds. Murry averaged 11.3 points and 10.0 rebounds per contest as a senior.

DUO COMMITS DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

A pair of high school basketball standouts have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. **Jordan Barnett** (St. Louis, Mo.) and **Obie Oleka** (Washington, D.C.) will join the Longhorns for the 2014-15 season.

- **Barnett** (6-7, 190), a forward from Christian Brothers College High School who played under coach Bob McCormack, is ranked as the No. 83 prospect in the nation by ESPN and No. 101 by Rivals.com. As a junior last season, Barnett led CBC with 17.1 points, 7.7 rebounds and 1.7 blocked shots per game while hitting 37.6 percent of his three-point attempts. In his sophomore year, he helped the Cadets to the Class 5 quarterfinals by leading the team with 14.2 points, 6.8 boards and 1.7 blocked shots per game. Barnett also knocked down a team-high 48 three-pointers and led the team with a 48.5 shooting percentage from beyond the arc.
- **Oleka** (6-7, 225), a power forward from State College of Florida (Bradenton, Fla.) who plays under head coach Elliot Washington, will enroll at UT this summer as a junior. In his freshman season at State College of Florida, he averaged 10.9 points and 6.2 rebounds per game while converting 55 percent from the floor. In his senior year at Florida Christian Institute (Cape Coral, Fla.), Oleka averaged 24.0 points and 11.0 rebounds per game.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

Texas Basketball has received public recognition awards for its multi-year NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last four years (2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013). The awards are given each year to teams scoring in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport. UT has earned a perfect 1.000 score in each of the last four multi-year APR reports. In seven of the last eight years, two or more student-athletes have represented Texas on the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team.

THREE-POINT STREAK

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. The Longhorns enter Monday's game having hit at least one 3-pointer in 760 consecutive games. In fact, UT has converted at least one three in 889 of 895 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

OFF THE COURT WITH THE HORNS

- **Brandon Allums** served as a practice player for the Texas women's basketball team last season.
- **Javan Felix** is oldest of four children (has three younger sisters). The Felix family was forced to relocate to Atlanta for four months while Javan was in sixth grade due to Hurricane Katrina (August 2005). The family was able to return to New Orleans in January 2006.
- **Demarcus Holland** moved to Dallas from Tyler when he was in the second grade. He has one older brother, Derrick, Jr., and three younger brothers, Craig, Desmond and Devon.
- **Prince Ibeh** was born in London and lived there for his first five years. He moved with his family to Amarillo, Texas at age five and lived there until he was 10 years old. The family then moved to Dallas when Prince was 10. His parents (Francis and Charity) lived in Mbaise, Nigeria before moving to London in 1987. Prince's middle name is Chinenye (pronounced KEN-yay). The name in Nigerian means "god's gift." Prince has three older brothers and one younger sister.
- **Connor Lammert** has an older brother, Clark, who is a sophomore on the basketball team at Texas Tech. His father, Dean Lammert, played basketball at Texas A&I University (now called Texas A&M University-Kingsville) from 1980-83. His mother, the former Christi Scherrey, played volleyball at Texas A&I University from 1979-82.
- **Isaiah Taylor's** uncle, Terrell Lowery, played basketball at Loyola Marymount (1989-92). As a sophomore on the 1990 LMU squad that advanced to the "Elite Eight" in the NCAA Tournament, Lowery also played professional baseball, including stints with the Chicago Cubs (1997-98), Tampa Bay Devil Rays (1999) and the San Francisco Giants (2000).
- **Kendal Yancy's** brother, Terrel Harris, played basketball at Oklahoma State and went on to play professionally with the Miami Heat (2011-2013) and New Orleans Hornets. Harris is currently playing for the Erie BayHawks of the NBA Developmental League.

Year 16 at Texas for Barnes

The all-time winningest coach in UT history, Rick Barnes, is in his 16th season at Texas. He has compiled over 500 wins in his 27 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson and Texas. During the 2010-11 season, Barnes earned his 500th career victory and became the 12th active Men's Basketball Division I coach to reach the 500-win milestone (counting victories only while at Division I schools). Barnes has guided his teams to a total of 20 NCAA and three NIT trips.

- UT has recorded at least 13 league victories in seven of Barnes' 15 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11). The Longhorns have reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 10 times in the 15 seasons under Barnes. Texas posted 9-7 conference marks in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2009-10 and a 9-9 league record in 2011-12. The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in 14 of Barnes' first 15 seasons in Austin.

- UT owns a 30-17 (.638) mark against AP Top 25 opponents at the Erwin Center under Barnes.

- Barnes carried a streak of 17 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances into the 2012-13 season. Barnes reached the NCAA tourney in each of his last three years at Clemson (1996-98) and in each of his first 14 seasons at Texas (1999-2012).
