BYU STORYLINES

- **BYU and Houston meet for the first time in football Saturday.** The blue Cougars have faced the red Cougars 17 times in other sports.
- **BYU is 6-1 vs. American Athletic Conference teams.** BYU's last game vs. an AAC opponent resulted in a 24-17 victory vs. UCF in Provo in 2011.
- **BYU ranks No. 13 in the nation in rushing offense** with 263.0 yards per game earned on the ground. Houston ranks 26th in defensive rushing yards with 126.6 yards per game.
- **BYU has two players ranked in the top 20 nationally for rushing yards per game--Taysom Hill (19th) with 107.3 and Jamaal Williams (18th) with 108.6.**
- **Cody Hoffman enters the game tied with Dennis Pitta for No. 1 in career receptions at BYU.** He is tied for No. 2 at BYU for all-time career touchdown receptions and needs two more to surpass Austin Collie to become the leader in that category. He needs three more 100-yard receiving games to pass Collie in that category.
- **BYU's defense has 12 players with 20 or more tackles in 2013,** led by Uani 'Unga's 56. Kyle Van Noy has 40. Sixteen players have 10 or more tackles.
- **Kyle Van Noy has 26 career sacks, which is the second most nationally among active players.** The senior needs eight more sacks this season to pass the career sack record at BYU (33).

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

A postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Mendenhall and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Mendenhall's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

BYU RUNS PAST GEORGIA TECH

PROVO, Utah - Taysom Hill, Jamaal Williams and Algernon Brown each scored rushing touchdowns to lead the Cougars past Georgia Tech's rushing attack 38-20 Saturday night at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

BYU (4-2) opened the scoring in the first quarter as Taysom Hill hit Cody Hoffman down the middle of the field for a 45-yard touchdown pass. Hoffman made the grab over his shoulder, while going down to his knees.

The catch tied Hoffman for second in career touchdown receptions at BYU. Right before half, Hoffman moved into a tie with All-American Dennis Pitta for the career lead in receptions at BYU with 221.

Georgia Tech (3-3, 2-2 ACC) answered back on its next possession, taking six plays to go 70 yards. Yellow Jacket quarterback Vad Lee scored from the 2-yard line.

Jamaal Williams and the Cougars took back the lead on a two-yard rush of their own with 5:47 left in the first quarter. Williams finished the game with 86 yards on 17 carries and another 11 yards on two receptions.

The teams traded field goals, before Taysom Hill led an eight-play, 55-yard drive to add to the lead. Hill dove in from the 1-yard line for his first rushing touchdown of the game. Hill entered halftime having thrown for 226 yards on 16-of-20 passing, plus another 72 yards rushing. Hill finished 19-of-27 for 244 yards and the one touchdown. He ran for 65 yards on 15 carries and the one rushing touchdown.

In the fourth quarter, Alani Fua put points on the board for the Cougars as he returned an interception 51 yards to make it 30-13. It was his second career interception and the second straight game where BYU returned an interception for a touchdown.

BYU added to its lead with a 15-yard touchdown run by Algernon Brown with 3:11 left in the game. It was his first career touchdown.

With 53 seconds left in the game, Georgia Tech's backup quarterback Justin Thomas found Deon Hill for a five-yard touchdown reception for the Yellow Jackets' only points in the second half.

The BYU defense kept Georgia Tech out of the end zone for 51 minutes between touchdowns.

NOTES FROM BYU'S LAST GAME

- **Alani Fua returned an interception 51 yards** for a pick six in the fourth quarter to put BYU up 31-14. The defense has recorded a score in three straight games.
- **BYU held its 12th straight opponent to under 21 points.**
- **Jamaal Williams scored his first touchdown** of the season and 13th rushing touchdown of his career. His two-yarder in the first quarter moved him into a tie for 24th place all-time at BYU for career rushing touchdowns.
- **Algernon Brown recorded his first career** rushing touchdown on a 15-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- **Cody Hoffman had five catches for 99 yards** and one touchdown. On his touchdown catch, Hoffman tied Eric Drage for second all-time for touchdown receptions (29). On his fifth grab, he tied Dennis Pitta for first all-time career receptions (221).
- **Seniors Blake Morgan and Austen Jorgensen** each finished with a career-high 11 tackles, and Uani 'Unga recorded 10 tackles.
- **Linebacker Kyle Van Noy recorded two sacks**, three tackles for loss and six tackles in the game. The All-American is the national career active sack leader with 25. Van Noy has recorded a TFL in every game and has 10 this season.

OPPONENT OUTLOOK

HOUSTON'S LAST GAME

HOUSTON - John O'Korn threw for 198 yards and a touchdown and Kenneth Farrow ran for two second-half touchdowns as Houston overcame a slow start to defeat Memphis 25-15 Saturday and remain undefeated.

The Houston defense forced multiple turnovers for the 13th straight game and took the ball away four times in the game including three first-half takeaways.

Efrem Olipant led the Cougars in tackles for the second-straight week with 13 stops on the day and forced a fumble in the third quarter.

O'Korn finished 13 of 30 and Deontay Greenberry caught four passes for 76 yards for the Cougars (5-0, 2-0 American), who were out-gained 349 yards to 247.

Paxton Lynch was 21 of 41 for 222 yards passing, and Brandon Hayes rushed 12 times for 72 yards to lead the Tigers (1-4, 0-2), who committed four turnovers - all fumbles. Mose Frazier caught five passes for 81 yards.

Trailing 15-10 midway through the third, Farrow put the Cougars ahead with a 1-yard run and followed that by taking O'Korn's shovel pass in for a two-point conversion.



Farrow extended the lead to 25-15 with a 6-yard run with 10 minutes remaining. Fullback Luke Stice delivered a crushing block to spring Farrow into the end zone.

The touchdown gave Houston a score in every quarter this season and 27-straight quarters with points dating back to last season.

Jake Elliot had five field goals for Memphis. It was the first time since Houston's 56-3 win over East Carolina in 2011 the Houston defense held the opponent without a touchdown.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR THREE

BYU's 2013 schedule may be the toughest in program history. The 12-game schedule with six road games and six home games includes fellow independent Notre Dame and teams from eight different conferences, including the Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, American Athletic, Conference USA, Mountain West and Big Sky.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Selected by their peers, wide receiver Skyler Ridley, slot receiver JD Falslev, linebacker Uani 'Unga and safety Daniel Sorensen have been named team captains for the 2013 season. Three of the four captains started their BYU careers as walk-ons. In 2012, Ridley caught the first touchdown pass of the season and finished with 20 receptions for 206 yards and one touchdown. Falslev was second on the team with 37 receptions last season, while also returning punts and kickoffs. Sorensen is a three-year starter and led the team with three interceptions and was second on the team with 68 tackles. 'Unga recorded 28 tackles, three tackles for loss, one interception and one fumble recovery in his first year at BYU after transferring from Oregon State.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accommodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's 2012 average attendance of 61,161 ranked No. 3 in the West behind only USC (87,945) and UCLA (68,481).

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates 405 missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 75,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 330 missions around the world. Seventy-five percent of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years or 18 months for women and couples—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

There are 73 returned missionaries on the 2013 team. There are 57 missionaries from the football team currently serving in 18 different countries. Members of the team cover five of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before eight games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with Bronco Mendenhall.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **Quarterback Taysom Hill ranks No. 19 in the country** in rushing yards per game with 107.3 per contest. His seven rushing touchdowns are tied for the second most among quarterbacks this season. Hill is currently No. 4 all-time at BYU among quarterbacks with 980 career rushing yards. Steve Young is ranked No. 3 with 1,084.
- **Five different Cougars scored in last week's game against Georgia Tech.** Cody Hoffman caught his 29th career touchdown on a 45-yard pass from Taysom Hill in the first quarter. Hill scored on a 1-yard run, his seventh rushing TD of the year. Jamaal Williams and Algernon Brown both scored their first TDs of the season. Linebacker Alani Fua intercepted a GT pass late in the game and returned it 51 yards for the score, his second career interception.
- **Sophomore Jamaal Williams rushed for a career-high** 182 rushing yards against Texas in Week 2. After an 86-yard output against Utah State, the sophomore ranks No. 19 at BYU for career rushing yards with 1,318 yards. He needs just 41 yards to jump to the No. 18 ranking. Williams ranks 18th nationally with 108.6 yards per game.
- **Keep an eye out for Hill Hoff Show.** Wideout Cody Hoffman has an opportunity to end his Cougar career as possibly the best receiver in BYU history. He enters this week needing just one reception, 227 yards and two touchdowns to take the top spot among the all-time leaders. As of now, Hoffman has amassed 221 receptions, 3,029 yards and 29 receiving touchdowns in his career--good for first (tied), third and second (tied), respectively, at BYU. Hoffman holds the record for receiving touchdowns in a game (5) and needs three 100-yard receiving games to have the most in program history.
- **Go fast, go hard** has been the mantra of coach Anae. With coach Anae leading the offense again, he's brought the credo of "Go fast, go hard" to the team. The Cougars average a play every 19.2 seconds.
- **BYU has not been shutout for 118 consecutive games.** The last time the Cougars failed to score was in 2003 in a 3-0 loss to Utah. That loss was the only time BYU has not produced points since 1975. BYU has scored in the last 480 of 481 games since 1975.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **BYU defense likes to get off the field, a lot.** The defensive unit has forced 5.5 three and outs per game to rank 17th nationally in that category. In the 93 opponent drives this season, the defense has gotten off the field in three plays or less 33 times, meaning that the defense has either forced a punt after three plays or has caused a turnover before the opposing team recorded a first down of any kind. At the same time, BYU has forced 9.3 punts per game and 5 punts overall to lead both categories nationally.
- **The Kyle Van Noy Show.** The 2013 All-America candidate, who is also on the Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award, Lombardi Award, Lott Impact Trophy, Maxwell Award and Walter Camp Award watch lists, is second nationally among active players with 25 career sacks and tied for fifth all-time at BYU. The senior was named College Performance Awards Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week for his six tackle, two sack, and three tackle for loss performance against Georgia Tech. Currently, Van Noy is second on the team with 39 tackles, first on the team in tackles for loss with 10.0, first on the team with three sacks, tied for first with one interception and first on the team with 10 quarterback hurries. To record every defensive stat for the third straight year, Van Noy needs to cause a fumble, recover a fumble and block a kick.
- **Making a name for themselves.** A strong fall camp earned Alani Fua a starting role at outside linebacker. Currently Fua is seventh on the team in tackles with 27, fourth on the team with 2.5 tackles for loss and tied for second with two sacks. He recorded his first career touchdown on an interception that he ran back 51 yards against Georgia Tech. Senior Spencer Hadley returned from a suspension and had three tackles, one sack, 1.5 tackles for loss, a quarterback hurry and a fumble recovery.
- **A large defensive line will help anchor the defense.** Eathyn Manumaleuna returns to the field after suffering a season-ending knee injury last year and receiving a medical redshirt. The fifth-year senior and Outland Trophy candidate has started 38 games over his four-year career at both defensive end and defensive tackle. True sophomore and Ted Hendricks candidate Bronson Kaufusi and redshirt sophomore Remington Peck join Manumaleuna on the line, as defensive ends. In the mix for extensive playing time is junior Marques Johnson who redshirted last season. Combined, the four average a commanding 6-foot-4 and 283 pounds, and will look to wreck havoc in opposing backfield's all year long.
- **Behind enemy lines.** In five games this season, the defense has averaged 5.67 tackles for loss per game, ranked T-No. 74 nationally. Overall, the unit has recorded 34 TFL this season to rank T-69 nationally. Since last season, the defense has recorded 5.0 TFL in 16 of 19 games. Eathyn Manumaleuna, Uani 'Unga, Alani Fua, Daniel Sorensen, Tyler Beck, Remington Peck and Kyle Van Noy each have recorded 2.0 TFL or more with Van Noy tallying 10.0 to rank T-No. 6 nationally.
- **Teams don't score well against BYU.** The defensive unit is ranked No. 15 nationally in points per game, allowing 17.3 points per contest. In terms of points per play, BYU holds opposing offenses to just .221 points per play to rank sixth nationally in that category. Opposing offenses have struggle to score against BYU as four opponents have been held to their lowest scoring output this season by the Cougars (Texas, Utah, Middle Tennessee and Utah State). BYU held Georgia Tech to its second lowest scoring game and Virginia to its third lowest scoring game. As a whole, the defense is holding opposing offenses 14 points below their season averages for scoring on the season.

HEAD COACH**BRONCO MENDENHALL****YEARS AT BYU**

Entering 9th year as head coach, 11th at BYU

YEARS OVERALL

In his first eight seasons as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored tradition to the Cougars as one of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to eight straight bowl invitations, two outright conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings. The Cougars finished the 2012 regular season 8-5, with a program-record fourth consecutive bowl victory, won four of their last five games and had the No. 3-ranked total defense in the nation.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 78-31 (.716) record to date to rank No. 12 in total wins among all teams in the nation since 2005. The Cougars have received eight straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history that took his first eight teams to a bowl game and has the highest winning percentage of any coach in school history. He also has more wins in his first 100 contests at BYU than Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in six of the last seven seasons to become the first Cougar teams to ever win six bowls in a seven-year span and win four in a row. Nationally, no one has won more bowl games over the past eight years and BYU is one of only seven programs to win six bowl games in the last eight seasons. The Cougars have won 10 or more games in five of Mendenhall's eight seasons overall.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident in the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 127 times in his eight seasons (47 offense, 58 defense, 20 special teams, 2 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 78 top-15 statistical rankings, 58 top-10 rankings and 27 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during seven of the past eight seasons and finished ranked in five seasons, including No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only three teams have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. BYU has led all FBS programs three of the last four years for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career.)

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State and went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.

Hailing from Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. They have three sons, Cutter, Breaker and Raeder.
