Additional Team Notes:

BYU is currently on a nine-game winning streak, the longest of the season. The last time the Cougars won 10 consecutive games was in the 2003 season when BYU won a school record 12 in a row.

As a team, the Cougars have hit more home runs this season (65) than they did in all of 2006 (63). The school record for home runs in a season is 68 set by the 2005 team.

The team needs to win at least 11 of its last 14 games to secure its third consecutive 40-win season.

Additional Individual Notes:

Jodi Norton leads the MWC with 17 overall home runs (eight in conference games) on the season.

Norton is also closing in on BYU's single season home run record of 21 set by Oli Keohohou in 2001.

Norton's two homers in both games at Utah on April 13th and 14th gives her a total of four career two-home run games (2006 against Utah State and Texas Arlington).

Jennifer Whiteley has already passed her 2006 marks in hits (55) and RBI (17). Whiteley recorded 42 hits and seven RBI last season.

Angeline Quioco has 11 stolen bases. (The single-season record is 20 by Lindsey Hodgen-Kelly in 2000. Hodgen-Kelly also holds BYU's career record with 40).

After recording zero doubles in all of 2006, **Cortney Nix-Clark** leads the team with 12 this season. Ianeta Le'i and Andi Ramirez hold the single-season record for doubles (both recorded 15 in 2006).

Emi Snow was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for the week of Feb. 20, 2007.

Christie Zinanti was named Mountain West Conference Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 17, 2007.

Dani Urincho-Snow, Christie Zinanti and Christina Gwyn's no-hitter against UVSC on April 10 was the first time in program history that more than one pitcher combined to throw a no-hitter. It was also only the fourth overall no-hitter in program history.
