NCAA Chapel Hill Regional

PROVO, Utah (May 12, 2008) – The BYU women's softball team (42-18) is scheduled to face No. 13 North Carolina (50-10-1) at 3:30 p.m. on Thursday, in the first game of the NCAA Chapel Hill Regional Tournament.

The double-elimination Tournament will continue through Saturday. The Chapel Hill Region is one of two regions that play a Thursday to Saturday format.

No. 23 Georgia (43-22) is the top seed in the Chapel Hill Region. Georgia will play Campbell (41-23) in the first round of the Regional

BYU is 4-7 against top-25 opponents this season. The Cougars four wins against ranked opponents came against teams outside of the top-10, where they are 4-2. Against top-10 teams BYU is 0-5 this season. BYU has not broken into the top-25 polls this season, but have received votes all season.

North Carolina, the Regional host school and is the Regional's second seed, recorded its first 50-win season and is making its sixth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. The Tar Heels hold a 6-12 mark in the post season.

BYU is 4-8 in its four years of NCAA competition. After recording defeating Cal Poly 9-0 in the first round of the Regional BYU lost to Arizona State 1-7. The Cougars rallied after the loss and defeated Southern Utah 10-5 to propel BYU to its furthest post-season appearance. In the Regional Championship game The Cougars matched Arizona State with a 3-3 tie after three innings, but gave the Sun Devils the lead with back-to-back homers in the fourth. BYU was unable to overcome the deficit and lost 3-6.

Following their first Regional game, BYU will play again on Saturday with the opponent and time depending upon the first round results.

Sunday Play

BYU and Campbell University share one thing in common, both are the only two schools in the nation who annually file a petition with the NCAA as a waiver to not play on Sundays.

BYU has never played on a Sunday, which accounts for the fact it is assigned to this NCAA Regional. In 1958 and 1961, BYU's baseball teams had qualified to advance to the College World Series, but withdrew because of potential Sunday play. In 1979 and 1996, BYU's baseball teams were participating in the NCAA Regionals at Austin, Texas and Tallahassee, Fla., respectively, and the tournaments were rested for Sunday before the Cougars were eliminated the following Monday.

Most recently, BYU's women's basketball team advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2002, which would have required a move of the championship game had it been further involved. In 1977, BYU's football team said it would not play in the Fiesta Bowl which was contested on Christmas Day, a Sunday. The Cougar football team did win the league title in 1977, but played instead in the Japan Bowl.

BYU In the NCAA Tournament

The Cougars are making their fifth NCAA Regional appearance in thier nine years of existence. BYU's Miller Park has been home to a Regional Tournament in both 2006 and 2007. In 2007 the Cougars made their furtherst post-season appearance in 2007 when they batteled Arizona State in the NCAA Provo Regional Chmapionship.

About the Team...

Last Week

The Cougars finished out the regular season with a 4-1 week. They defeated Utah Valley in a mid-week game, to take a break before completing conference play. The Cougars focused on specific areas of their play when they faced their cross-town foe only allowed one run, and totaled six from their offense to take the win, although it was the smallest winning margin against Utah Valley this season.

BYU met Colorado State for a doubleheader in Fort Collins, Colo. In the first game BYU fell 2-3. Despite out hitting the Rams 7-6, the Cougars couldn't capitalize on scoring opportunities and left 10 runners on base during game one. In the second game, BYU's offense cam alive, scoring 11 runs while Colorado State could only produce 6.

The Cougars entered their final two games of the season with a possibility of a conference championship. In the Friday's game against New Mexico, freshman hurler Paige Affleck threw her first collegiate no-hitter. She was supported by the BYU defense and the offense that was able to produce four runs. In Saturday's game BYU fought off the Lobos and won 8-4 to conclude the regular season 42-18.

2008 Mountain West Conference Runners-up

BYU finished the Mountain West Conference season 12-6, just behind San Diego State. The Cougars finished second in the Conference after being selected as per-season champions. San Diego State was selected pre-season runner-up. In 2007 BYU was named conference champions.

Cougars in the Conference

Freshmen Paige Affleck and Kristin Delahoussaye were two Cougars to add conference accolades to their names this season. Affleck was named MWC Co-Pitcher of the Week for her No-hitter performance against New Mexico. Delahoussaye was named MWC Player of the Week after hitting .567 in the Cougars' final regular season week. She totaled 8 RBI, including two multiple RBI games. Against New Mexico, Delahoussaye recorded a career high 4 RBI. Daniela Snow and Christina Gwyn-Trice have both recieved the honors this season.

- This year BYU carries four married players: Dani Snow, Emi Snow-Willing, Christina Gwyn-Trice and Stephanie Platt-Hopkins
- The Cougars enter the program's ninth season with seven-straight winning seasons.

Injuries Impacting the Cougars

With only minor injuries the Cougars have not been significantly affected his season. Andrea Ramirez has been out all season with a knee injury. Jessica Purcell saw reduced playing time after breaking her finger, but has begun playing in the field again.

Freshmen Making Big Impact

With three freshman in the starting lineup and one making big contributions from the circle, the young team has worked to gain experience early in the season. Jessica Purcell has seen significant time at both shortstop and catcher. Caschjen Davis has seen most of her time in left field and has made significant contributions offensivley. Kristin Dealhoussaye stepped in at second base for the Cougs while Paige Affleck brings a lot of power and speed to the circle.

From the Circle

Three skilled pitchers make up BYU's rotation. Both Christina Gywn-Trice and Christie Zinanti return from last season, with Paige Affleck joining the two. Gwyn Trice maintains a 1.61 ERA and freshman Paige Affleck carries a 1.40. Trice is 17-7 so far, and has broken all school records related to strikouts with her 225 total. Affleck recorded her first collegiate no-hitter against New Mexico and is 14-3 with 5 shut outs.

BYU is 4-7 against ranked opponents this season. The Cougars lost to No. 2 Arizona State, No. 3 Texas A&M, No. 5 Stanford, No. 6 Tennessee, No. 9 Oklahoma and No. 22 Louisiana Lafayette. In the Cougars second game against a ranked opponent they came out on top of No. 22 Missouri, 4-0. In a four-game series against No. 19 San Diego State the Cougars went 3-1 against the Aztecs.

BYU has hit 80 home runs on the season, with 17 coming from Angeline Quiocho and Daniela Snow. Amanda Vance has 8 to her name and Jessica Purcell has 11, while freshman Kristin Delahoussaye totals 7 this season, with 4 coming in the last six games. As a team, BYU has a .559 slugging percentage.
