2008 Home Opener - Georgia, Arizona Visit South Field

The No. 18 Cougars begin defense of South Field this weekend when they face Georgia and Arizona. Coming off a difficult loss to LSU on the road, BYU looks to rebound and continue their home field success. The team is 104-31-7 all-time in the friendly confines of the newly renovated South Field. These games are two of eight that the Cougars will play in Provo during the 2008 season. Georgia, a tough SEC opponent faces the Cougars for the first time since 2006, while BYU looks to repeat last year's success against Arizona when they won 1-0 in Tucson.

Last Week: BYU Beats Cal Poly 2-1, loses to LSU 4-1 on the road

The Cougars defeated Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo on Aug. 22, scoring two goals in the second half for a come-from-behind win. Katie Larkin converted a penalty kick opportunity and freshman Auna Janis scored the game-winning goal.

In their second road game of the season, BYU fought hard but lost to LSU 4-1 on Aug. 25. Alyssa Vander Veur scored on a corner kick cross from Ashleigh Jameson in the first half for the lone Cougar goal. BYU had momentum going into the break, but couldn't hold on in the second half.

Hermann Trophy Candidate

All-American Katie Larkin has again been selected as a Hermann Trophy Candidate for 2008. The Hermann Trophy is NCAA soccer's equivalent to football's Heisman Trophy, and recognizes the best overall player in the sport at the collegiate level. In 2007, Larkin and Jessica Carter were selected as Hermann Trophy Candidates.

Larkin also spent the majority of the summer with the U.S. U-23 Women's Soccer team and participated in the prestigious Nordic Cup in Sweden.

In 2007, Larkin led the team with 15 goals, 5 assists, and 72 shots. When BYU faces off against Georgia on Aug. 25, she will face off against Georgia junior forward Carrie Patterson, another Hermann award candidate.

The game will be the second time Larkin has taken the field against another Hermann award candidate this season. LSU junior forward Malorie Rutledge is also a candidate. Larkin is 0-1 this year against other teams with Hermann Award candidates.

South Field Update

The renovation of South Field is complete, and parts of the field are now being re-sodded to prepare for the home opener against Georgia. The updated facility provides room for 3,228 fans and features a gated entrance and new and more powerful lights to enhance the experience at night games. Reserved seat season tickets are available for purchase.

Home Sweet Home

With an average attendance of 1,634 fans during the 2007 campaign, the Cougars rank among the highest every year for the largest attendance average in the country. BYU also packed in a total of 21,242 over 13 games, recording the fifth-highest attendance mark in the nation and making South Stadium one of the toughest places to play in women's college soccer today.

The games against Georgia and Arizona are the first of eight home games BYU will play at South Field this season.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Katie Larkin, Aleisha Rose, Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds. Rohbock, Hendershot, Reading and Reynolds each went on to play in the Women's United Soccer Association.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Ricks College (now BYU-Idaho) on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management. Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs and the high school level.

2007 Season Review

The 2007 BYU soccer season was one for the record books. Highlighted by the team's tenth trip to the NCAA tournament in 11 years and a number of new school records set, the 2007 campaign will be remembered as both a high point in history and a launching pad for successful teams to come.

Among the records set were career saves (261) and shutouts (40) as well as shutouts in a single season (13) by senior goalkeeper Erika Woodbury, the most shutouts in a row by a single team in school history with eight to start the season, and both the team's and head coach Jennifer Rockwood's 200th victory, which is the most in Mountain West Conference history.

Defensively, the team allowed only 11 goals for the second year in a row. A total of 14 shutouts were recorded, which is a new school record. Harmon-Carter, a junior defender, was a Hermann Trophy candidate, sophomore defender Andrea Willis was awarded First-Team All-MWC honors, and Woodbury earned Second-Team All-MWC honors as well. Harmon-Carter and Woodbury each earned MWC Defensive Player of the Week honors once during the season, and Willis was named to the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week once as well.

Offensively, junior forward/midfielder Katie Larkin was also a Hermann Trophy candidate and First-Team All-MWC selection. She earned MWC Offensive Player of the Week and Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week honors three times each, as well as Soccer America Team of the Week honors twice. She also led the team in shots (72), goals (15), and assists (5).

On her heels was freshman forward Kassidy Christensen who also was named First-Team All-MWC and earned one MWC Offensive Player of the Week honor during the season. She scored seven goals on the season and tied for second on the team with junior forward Katie Fellows with 48 shots.

When all was said and done, the team finished with a 17-4-2 record, taking Rockwood's record to 210-65-20.

At the end of a remarkable regular season during which the team spent every week in the national polls, the Cougars entered the MWC Championship Tournament on their home turf as the No. 3 seed. BYU knocked off No. 6 seeded TCU, 2-1, and No. 2 seeded SDSU, 2-1, on its way to a championship match against the No. 1 seed, UNLV.

UNLV had beaten BYU in Las Vegas 0-1 in double overtime in the final match of the regular season to squelch the Cougars' hopes of a regular season title. It was only fitting, then, that the same two teams would meet again to determine who would take home the MWC Tournament trophy and earn an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. In a flash of brilliance and a two-goal performance from Fellows, the Cougars brought the trophy home with a 2-1 win at South Stadium.

Fellows earned MWC Championship Tournament Most Valuable Player honors, and Swenson, Larkin, and Willis joined Fellows as All-Tournament selections.

The Cougars headed to College Station, Texas the week after winning the MWC Championship to face No. 11 Texas in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The team was excited to play on Texas A&M's home field because it had played there in previous spring seasons, but knew the task would be a difficult one. Despite outshooting the Longhorns 25-12 with a number of near misses in the contest, the Cougars fell in a heartbreaking 0-2 loss.

Despite the disappointing loss in the tournament, Rockwood's hope for future success has not diminished. She said her program has an extremely bright future, and she's never been more excited to get back out on the field. The team will be returning all but three starters and a highly touted incoming class of freshmen. All in all, 2007 was a remarkable season, and will prove to be a spark for the Cougar women's soccer teams to come.
