After suffering two disappointing road defeats, BYU looks to bounce back this week against Long Beach State and then continue its home success when it faces Idaho State on Saturday at South Field. While the Cougars have yet to find consistent success on the road, the team has been dominant at home, posting a 2-0 record so far this year, outscoring their two opponents 5-1. The team looks to gain momentum at the halfway point of the preseason, hoping to finish strong in preparation for a difficult conference schedule.

- Long Beach State has out-scored their opponents 11-4. Two of their wins were shutouts. They are also out-shooting their opponents by an average of 13.6 to 5.6 shots per game.
- Kristen Kiefer is the 49ers leading scorer on the season with three goals. Three players (Hayley Bolt, Kim Silos and Lindsay Bullock have all scored twice). Amazingly, the Beach has notched 37 corner kick attempts. They have allowed their opponents only seven.

- The Bengals were picked to finish sixth in the Big Sky Conference after posting a 2-2-3 conference record in 2007.
- Idaho State won its first two games before losing the next three. They are 1-1-0 on the road
- Statistically, the Bengals are being out-shot by their opponents 44-75. The team has scored five goals and allowed seven on the season. Five players have each scored one goal; junior midfielder Annamarie Hofstetter leads the team with 11 shots.

Last Week: BYU loses twice on the road

The Cougars fell twice in difficult games on the road this week. Against a strong William and Mary team featuring two Hermann Award candidates the team lost the match 4-1. Freshman Lauren Anderson scored her first career goal in the game.

After a back and forth 90 minutes that featured multiple opportunities for each team to score, BYU lost to Marquette 1-0 on a goal scored in the eighth minute of overtime. Freshman keeper McKinzie Olson recorded five saves in her second start.

Hermann Trophy Candidate Update

All-American Katie Larkin has again been selected as a Hermann Trophy Candidate for 2008. The Hermann Trophy is NCAA soccer's equivalent to football's Heisman Trophy, and recognizes the best overall player in the sport at the collegiate level. In 2007, Larkin and Jessica Carter were selected as Hermann Trophy Candidates.

Larkin also spent the majority of the summer with the U.S. U-23 Women's Soccer team and participated in the prestigious Nordic Cup in Sweden.

In 2007, Larkin led the team with 15 goals, 5 assists, and 72 shots.

Larkin broke her wrist in a hard fall during the Cougars' 1-0 loss to Marquette on Sept. 6 and underwent surgery. She is expected to miss a minimum of 8-10 days.

Frequent Fliers

Though the team stopped in Provo for two days, the trip to Long Beach is technically part of the second of five road trips for the team this season. The trips will cover more than 25,000 miles in the air. The team has a 107-36-13 record (.737) on the road all-time.

Pass the Ball

With ten assists on the year, BYU has already totalled almost half of their season total last year (21). Freshman forward Lauren Anderson leads the way with four, while five other players have also had a hand in helping the team score. The team has had at least one assist in each game, including a season-high four against Georgia.

Shots Away

The Cougars have out-shot their opponents 80 to 66 on the season. Larkin and sophomore forward Kassidy Christensen lead the team with 13 shots a piece. Freshman forward Lauren Anderson is close behind with 12.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Katie Larkin, Aleisha Rose, Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds. Rohbock, Hendershot, Reading and Reynolds each went on to play in the Women's United Soccer Association.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Ricks College (now BYU-Idaho) on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management. Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs and the high school level.

2007 Season Review

The 2007 BYU soccer season was one for the record books. Highlighted by the team's tenth trip to the NCAA tournament in 11 years and a number of new school records set, the 2007 campaign will be remembered as both a high point in history and a launching pad for successful teams to come.

Among the records set were career saves (261) and shutouts (40) as well as shutouts in a single season (13) by senior goalkeeper Erika Woodbury, the most shutouts in a row by a single team in school history with eight to start the season, and both the team's and head coach Jennifer Rockwood's 200th victory, which is the most in Mountain West Conference history.

Defensively, the team allowed only 11 goals for the second year in a row. A total of 14 shutouts were recorded, which is a new school record. Harmon-Carter, a junior defender, was a Hermann Trophy candidate, sophomore defender Andrea Willis was awarded First-Team All-MWC honors, and Woodbury earned Second-Team All-MWC honors as well. Harmon-Carter and Woodbury each earned MWC Defensive Player of the Week honors once during the season, and Willis was named to the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week once as well.

Offensively, junior forward/midfielder Katie Larkin was also a Hermann Trophy candidate and First-Team All-MWC selection. She earned MWC Offensive Player of the Week and Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week honors three times each, as well as Soccer America Team of the Week honors twice. She also led the team in shots (72), goals (15), and assists (5).

On her heels was freshman forward Kassidy Christensen who also was named First-Team All-MWC and earned one MWC Offensive Player of the Week honor during the season. She scored seven goals on the season and tied for second on the team with junior forward Katie Fellows with 48 shots.

When all was said and done, the team finished with a 17-4-2 record, taking Rockwood's record to 210-65-20.

At the end of a remarkable regular season during which the team spent every week in the national polls, the Cougars entered the MWC Championship Tournament on their home turf as the No. 3 seed. BYU knocked off No. 6 seeded TCU, 2-1, and No. 2 seeded SDSU, 2-1, on its way to a championship match against the No. 1 seed, UNLV.

UNLV had beaten BYU in Las Vegas 0-1 in double overtime in the final match of the regular season to squelch the Cougars' hopes of a regular season title. It was only fitting, then, that the same two teams would meet again to determine who would take home the MWC Tournament trophy and earn an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. In a flash of brilliance and a two-goal performance from Fellows, the Cougars brought the trophy home with a 2-1 win at South Stadium.

Fellows earned MWC Championship Tournament Most Valuable Player honors, and Swenson, Larkin, and Willis joined Fellows as All-Tournament selections.

The Cougars headed to College Station, Texas the week after winning the MWC Championship to face No. 11 Texas in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The team was excited to play on Texas A&M's home field because it had played there in previous spring seasons, but knew the task would be a difficult one. Despite outshooting the Longhorns 25-12 with a number of near misses in the contest, the Cougars fell in a heartbreaking 0-2 loss.

Despite the disappointing loss in the tournament, Rockwood's hope for future success has not diminished. She said her program has an extremely bright future, and she's never been more excited to get back out on the field. The team will be returning all but three starters and a highly touted incoming class of freshmen. All in all, 2007 was a remarkable season, and will prove to be a spark for the Cougar women's soccer teams to come.
