Riding a three-game winning streak, the Cougars travel to California this week to face the No. 20 Cal Berkeley Bears on Thurs., Sept. 25 in an afternoon match that starts at 4:00 p.m. The Cougars are coming off of a strong 2-0 win over previously undefeated Michigan State at South Field last Saturday. Junior defender Andrea Willis and freshman forward Jennie Marshall scored for BYU. The win moved BYU to 4-0 at home this season and 6-4 overall.

Last Week: Cougars Upset No. 19 Miami, Beat Michigan State at Home

A strong team effort and freshman Auna Janis' second-half goal helped BYU upset No. 19 Miami in Coral Gables, Fl., Tuesday, 1-0. The loss was the Hurricanes' first of the season. Looking to start the game aggressively, BYU outshot Miami seven to six in the first half. Senior forward Katie Larkin, making her return to the team after missing two games with a broken wrist registered four shots in the first half.

The Cougars' goal came in the 68th minute when Janis was able to corral a ball crossed from the corner and put it past the Miami keeper. The goal was only the second goal allowed by Miami this season.

With solid play from the defense, BYU soccer stays perfect at home with the fourth win in history over Michigan State at South Field Friday night bringing their overall record to 6-4. BYU's two goals on the night were from junior starting defender Andrea Willis and freshman forward Jennie Marshall.

Honors Watch: Carter and Larkin named to 2008 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award Watchlist; Willis named to SoccerBuzz Elite Team of the Week

Senior defender Jessica Harmon and senior forward Katie Larkin have been announced as candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

Athletes are selected for consideration based on their dedication and achievement in the four separate areas: classroom, character, community and competition. The Lowe's Senior CLASS award is distinctive from many other honors in that on-the-field performance is only one phase in determining candidacy – a major emphasis is placed on off-the-field commitments and personal character.

Junior defender Andrea Willis, from Riverside, Calif., scored one of BYU's two goals in it's 2-0 win over previously undefeated Michigan State on Sept. 19. That goal was the Willis' first of the season. Her play also helped the Cougars to a 1-0 win over No. 19 Miami. As a key member of the Cougars' defensive formation, she has played a key role in the team's three-game winning streak, the last two of which have been shutouts.

Hermann Trophy Candidate Update

All-American Katie Larkin has again been selected as a Hermann Trophy Candidate for 2008. The Hermann Trophy is NCAA soccer's equivalent to football's Heisman Trophy, and recognizes the best overall player in the sport at the collegiate level. In 2007, Larkin and Jessica Carter were selected as Hermann Trophy Candidates.

Larkin also spent the majority of the summer with the U.S. U-23 Women's Soccer team and participated in the prestigious Nordic Cup in Sweden.

In 2007, Larkin led the team with 15 goals, 5 assists, and 72 shots.

Larkin returned from a wrist injury suffered during the Marquette game to six shots in the Miami and Michigan State games.

From sea to shining sea...

The Cougars are road warriors this season. The team has criss-crossed the country again in the past week, with games in California and Florida. The team's trips this season will cover more than 25,000 miles in the air. The team has a 108-37-13 record (.722) on the road all-time.

Pass the Ball

With 15 assists on the year, BYU is nearing their 2007 season total (21). Freshman forward Lauren Anderson leads the way with five, while six other players have also had a hand in helping the team score. The team has had at least one assist in every game except for a 2-0 win over Idaho State, in which both goals were unassisted. BYU had a season-high four against Georgia. The two goals scored against Idaho State were the team's first unassisted goals of the season.

Shots Away

The Cougars have out-shot their opponents 137 to 114 on the season. Sophomore forward Kassidy Christensen leads the team with 22 shots, and freshman forward Lauren Anderson is close behind with 20. Larkin has 19 shots.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Katie Larkin, Aleisha Rose, Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds. Rohbock, Hendershot, Reading and Reynolds each went on to play in the Women's United Soccer Association.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Ricks College (now BYU-Idaho) on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management. Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs and the high school level.

2007 Season Review

The 2007 BYU soccer season was one for the record books. Highlighted by the team's tenth trip to the NCAA tournament in 11 years and a number of new school records set, the 2007 campaign will be remembered as both a high point in history and a launching pad for successful teams to come.

Among the records set were career saves (261) and shutouts (40) as well as shutouts in a single season (13) by senior goalkeeper Erika Woodbury, the most shutouts in a row by a single team in school history with eight to start the season, and both the team's and head coach Jennifer Rockwood's 200th victory, which is the most in Mountain West Conference history.

Defensively, the team allowed only 11 goals for the second year in a row. A total of 14 shutouts were recorded, which is a new school record. Harmon-Carter, a junior defender, was a Hermann Trophy candidate, sophomore defender Andrea Willis was awarded First-Team All-MWC honors, and Woodbury earned Second-Team All-MWC honors as well. Harmon-Carter and Woodbury each earned MWC Defensive Player of the Week honors once during the season, and Willis was named to the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week once as well.

Offensively, junior forward/midfielder Katie Larkin was also a Hermann Trophy candidate and First-Team All-MWC selection. She earned MWC Offensive Player of the Week and Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week honors three times each, as well as Soccer America Team of the Week honors twice. She also led the team in shots (72), goals (15), and assists (5).

On her heels was freshman forward Kassidy Christensen who also was named First-Team All-MWC and earned one MWC Offensive Player of the Week honor during the season. She scored seven goals on the season and tied for second on the team with junior forward Katie Fellows with 48 shots.

When all was said and done, the team finished with a 17-4-2 record, taking Rockwood's record to 210-65-20.

At the end of a remarkable regular season during which the team spent every week in the national polls, the Cougars entered the MWC Championship Tournament on their home turf as the No. 3 seed. BYU knocked off No. 6 seeded TCU, 2-1, and No. 2 seeded SDSU, 2-1, on its way to a championship match against the No. 1 seed, UNLV.

UNLV had beaten BYU in Las Vegas 0-1 in double overtime in the final match of the regular season to squelch the Cougars' hopes of a regular season title. It was only fitting, then, that the same two teams would meet again to determine who would take home the MWC Tournament trophy and earn an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. In a flash of brilliance and a two-goal performance from Fellows, the Cougars brought the trophy home with a 2-1 win at South Stadium.

Fellows earned MWC Championship Tournament Most Valuable Player honors, and Swenson, Larkin, and Willis joined Fellows as All-Tournament selections.

The Cougars headed to College Station, Texas the week after winning the MWC Championship to face No. 11 Texas in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The team was excited to play on Texas A&M's home field because it had played there in previous spring seasons, but knew the task would be a difficult one. Despite outshooting the Longhorns 25-12 with a number of near misses in the contest, the Cougars fell in a heartbreaking 0-2 loss.

Despite the disappointing loss in the tournament, Rockwood's hope for future success has not diminished. She said her program has an extremely bright future, and she's never been more excited to get back out on the field. The team will be returning all but three starters and a highly touted incoming class of freshmen. All in all, 2007 was a remarkable season, and will prove to be a spark for the Cougar women's soccer teams to come.
