WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU is looking for its first win in four tries against Florida State. The game is the first the Cougars have ever played in Doak Campbell Stadium.
- Last season, quarterback Riley Nelson threw 3-for-3 for 61 yards, including a 29-yard touchdown pass to JJ Di Luiqi in the fourth quarter in BYU's 54-28 loss to the Seminoles.
- The Cougars have never won a football game in the state of Florida in four tries. BYU's first attempt was in the Tangerine Bowl where the Cougars lost, 49-21, to Oklahoma State. In the Citrus Bowl in 1985, BYU dropped a close decision to Ohio State, 10-7. The latest two games have been regular season contests with the Cougars falling at Miami, 41-17, and at Jacksonville against Florida State, 29-3.
- BYU has not defeated an ACC team since August 28, 2003, against Georgia Tech, a 24-13 win in Provo. The last time the Cougars defeated an ACC opponent on the road was a 38-35 win at Virginia on September 2, 2000.
- Former college football legends LaVell Edwards and Bobby Bowden faced off twice in the BYU/ Florida State series. With Bowden's retirement at the conclusion of last season, BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall and new Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher lead a new generation of two great football programs.

THE BYU-FLORIDA STATE SERIES



BYU has had little luck against Florida State and is still looking for its first win in the series. Last season, the Seminoles came into LaVell Edwards Stadium and upset BYU, ranked No. 7 in the country. BYU also played Florida State in two season openers in 1991 and 2000. In 2000, the two teams played in the Pigskin Classic in Jacksonville, Fla., where quarterback Chris Weinke lead Florida State to vic-

tory. In 1991, Ty Detmer and the Cougars traveled to Anaheim, Calif., for another Pigskin Classic in one of three losses for BYU that year.

LAST TIME: FLORIDA STATE 54, BYU 28 (2009)

PROVO, Utah (September 19, 2009) - In a barrage of points and offense, Florida State defeated No. 7 BYU, 54-28, to snap the Cougars' 18-game home win streak in front of 64,209 fans at LaVell Edwards Stadium on Saturday.

"I congratulate Coach Bowden and his program for playing well, not only technically but also emotionally from beginning to end," said BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall. "It was a frustrating loss for our program."

Cougar wideout McKay Jacobson had a career day in front of the 13th-straight Edwards Stadium sellout crowd, using a career-long 80-yard touchdown catch to finish with 111 yards, the young sophomore's single-game best. His score came on the first play of a new BYU possession late in the third quarter, resulting in a scoring drive of 12 seconds.

Senior quarterback Max Hall finished the night 20-for-31 for 306 yards and two touchdowns, but was hindered by three interceptions.

FSU LAST TIME: OKLAHOMA 47, FLORIDA STATE 17

NORMAN, Okla. - A week after a memorable start to the Jimbo Fisher era at Florida State, Saturday's 47-17 loss at No. 10 Oklahoma is one that the coaches and players at FSU would soon like to forget - except maybe for the valuable learning experiences that such an experience can provide.

Besides a nearly flawless first offensive possession to start the top-25 showdown, not much else went right for the No. 17 Seminoles in Norman, Okla. as the Sooners were able to successfully extend their super-successful home winning streak to 32 consecutive games.

The opening-day smack-down of Samford at home displayed a potent offensive attack and renewed defensive intensity that excited the fanbase and put the national media on notice. But against Oklahoma (2-0), the Seminoles (1-1) had 345 yards offensively and gave up 487 yards on the defensive side of the ball.

Starting quarterback Christian Ponder didn't look like his usually-dominant self, throwing for just 113 yards and two interceptions. Backup EJ Manuel had 108 yards and one touchdown.

BYU'S LAST OUTING

USAFA, Colo. (Sept. 11, 2010) — BYU fell to 1-1 on the season after suffering a 35-14 defeat at Air Force on Saturday. The Falcons improved to 2-0 on the year.

After a solid first quarter, BYU lost the momentum and the early advantage as the Falcons went on to end the Cougars' six-game winning streak in the series. The strong play of the Falcons' defense was noted by both coaches after the game.

"I was impressed with their defense," BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. "They played well, they had a good plan and they executed soundly. They deserved to win the game. They just played assignment football and played

"I just thought our defense was absolutely special today." Air Force head coach Troy Calhoun said. "After the initial drive, we probably played as well defensively against Brigham Young as we have maybe ever."

A sellout crowd of 46,692 attended the game, marking AFA's first sellout since hosting Notre Dame in 2006.

BYU claimed a 14-7 lead after the first 15 minutes. The Cougars took the opening kick and put touchdowns on the board on two-of-three possessions in the first guarter with junior running back JJ Di Luigi scoring on a 1-yard rush and junior quarterback Riley Nelson on a 4-yard keeper. Sandwiched between those two Nelson-guided drives of 74 and 49 yards, freshman quarterback Jake Heaps led BYU on a drive that covered 80 yards and finished in the end zone but did not result in any points.

On back-to-back runs of 17 and 43 yards, Di Luigi carried the ball for 60 yards on the drive but was stripped from behind at the 10-yard line on his second gallop. Air Force linebacker Parker Hennessey eventually recovered the loose ball in the back of the end zone for a Falcon touchback to end the BYU threat.

The Cougars were effective on the ground in the opening quarter, rushing for 139 yards after totaling 140 during their win against Washington a week ago. Di Luigi topped his previous career-best of 71 yards against Tulane last season with 76 rushing yards in the first guarter alone. BYU totaled 183 yards to AFA's 105 in the guarter.

HAPPY 50TH!

The first win of 2010 gave BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall his 50th career win as a head coach in just his sixth season, all at BYU. He is only the second coach in Cougar history to reach the 50-win mark, with LaVell Edwards earning his 50th win in the middle of his seventh season against San Diego State, 21-3, in 1978. Mendenhall's 49 wins in his first five seasons as a head coach is tied for 10th all-time among FBS coaches.

NATIONAL RANKINGS

BYU has been among the nation's top-25 teams during 34 of the last 37 weeks from November 2007 to Week 1 of 2010, coming in at No. 24 in the USA Today Poll before falling back out in Week 2. BYU is 159-47 when ranked in the Top 25 and has won 28 of its last 34 games as a ranked team dating back to 2006. BYU started the season just outside both major polls, coming in 28th in the USA Today Coaches' Poll and 34th in the Associated Press Top 25. Last year, the Cougars finished 12th in the final USA Today and Associated Press polls and 14th in the final BCS rankings.

LONG ROAD STREAK ENDS

With the loss at Air Force, BYU ended its conference road win streak at six.

BYU has gone undefeated in MWC road games in 2001, 2006 and 2007.

TEAM CAPTAINS

BYU head football coach Bronco Mendenhall announced team captains for the 2010 season as well as several personnel notes entering the first week of the season.

Senior safety Andrew Rich and junior offensive tackle Matt Reynolds have been selected to serve as team captains. Both Rich and Reynolds have played in all 26 games the past two seasons and enter their third year as a starter for the Cougars.

Rich has started in 16 games and earned All-MWC Second Team honors in 2009. He is a 2010 Lott Trophy Award candidate. Reynolds has started all 26 games of his career and is a preseason All-American, Lombardi Trophy and Outland Trophy candidate in 2010. He was a Freshman All-American in 2008 and a CFN All-Sophomore selection in 2009 while earning first-team all-conference accolades.

Also this year, BYU will elect a special teams captain for each game. Holder Matt Marshall was tabbed to be captain against Washington while Riley Stephenson was the captain at Air Force.

PULLING OUT THE CLOSE ONES

After defeating Washington by six points last week, BYU has won 12 consecutive games decided by seven points or fewer.

DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 43-4 when leading at halftime and 43-1 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter. Mendenhall's teams have won 28 straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 75 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987 when it lost, 29-27, in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

MENDENHALL VS. ACC

Since head coach Bronco Mendenhall took over as BYU head coach, the Cougars are 0-3 against the ACC. BYU played a home-and-home series against Boston College in 2005-06, losing at home before forcing overtime at Massachuetts before the Golden Eagles won by a touchdown. Last season, Florida State came to Provo and left with a win.

MORE CLOUDS THAN SUN

BYU is 1-4 all-time against Sunshine State schools, with the lone win coming at home against No. 1 Miami (FL) in 1990. The Cougars lost to Miami (FL) in 1988 while also dropping contests to Florida State in 1991, 2000 and 2009.

FULL DEFENSE

After two games, 22 different BYU defenders have notched at least one tackle. Four players have double-digit totals while four others have nine tackles apiece. Seven defenders have at least 0.5 tackles for loss while the defense has two sacks, one interception, eight pass break-ups, two quarterback hurries and one forced fumble.

SAFETY FIRST

BYU scored its first points last weekend on a safety in the second quarter when Washington punter Erik Folk threw the ball out of the back of the end zone after a bad snap. It was the first safety for the Cougars since October 30, 2003, against Boise State on a similar play. Interestingly, Boise State also scored a safety that game.

AWARD WATCH

Based on their performances, Cougars are continuing to accumulate weekly awards on both the Mountain West Conference and national levels.

2010 BYU FOOTBALL FIRESIDES

BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall, his wife, Holly, and members of the BYU football team will participate in an hour-long devotional prior to eight football games this season.

These devotionals will be conducted prior to all road games as well as the Washington and San Diego State home games. They are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches, and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth.

"The firesides have been a way for us to make a very clear statement of what our priorities are, or should be," Mendenhall says. "Football is simply the vehicle we use to help others come to a knowledge of what really brings joy and happiness to our lives. Football is not the priority. Some people don't understand that. These firesides are a way for all of us to help consider our priorities through understanding the purpose of life."

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 51 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 16 different countries, including Argentina, Bulgaria, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, Costa Rica, Ghana, Guatemala, Japan, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Russia, South Africa and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of eight different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Japanese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish and Tagalog.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga, is one of 74 players (62 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga recently returned home from a mission to Madagascar.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 24 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, England, Germany, India, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, Mozambique, New Zealand, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 18 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, Nevada, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Washington.

Overall, 54 current members of the BYU football team speak a total of 17 different foreign languages and dialects, including Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

- * The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- * The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and John in the book of Acts).
- * More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- * Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- * Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- * Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, South Africa and Spain.
 - * Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- *A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- * In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- * Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions except for their transportation to and from their field of labor and are not paid for their services.
- * Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ

BEST IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,725-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. Beginning in 2010, Edwards Stadium official capacity is 63,275 after seating was removed to allow for additional wheelchair access.

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

The attendance in BYU's 23-17 win over Washington was 63,771, the 19th straight sell-out at LaVell Edwards Stadium. The current streak marks the longest streak of consecutive sellouts since the 1990-92 seasons. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWD

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah last season is currently tenth with 64,301 fans attending the game.



HOME BOYS

A majority of the BYU two-deep includes athletes who grew up in hometowns just a few miles from Provo. Wide receiver Luke Ashworth and offensive linemen brothers Matt and Houston Reynolds even went to high school in Provo at Timpview High. Others from Utah County include left guard Ryan Freeman from Orem, tight end Richard Wilson from Spanish Fork, tight end Mike Muehlmann from American Fork and fullback Zed Mendenhall from Alpine.

Other Utahns on the depth chart include left guard Braden Hansen from Sandy, right guard Jason Speredon from West Valley City, right tackle Braden Brown and running back Mike Hague from Salt Lake City, quarterback Riley Nelson from Logan and running back Bryan Kariya from Kaysville.

HE'S GOT YOUR BACK

BYU starting offensive lineman Matt Reynolds enters the year as a preseason All-American after being named to the All-MWC First Team and College Football News All-Sophomore Team First Team. A Lombardi and Outland Trophy candidate, the 6-foo-6, 322-pound junior has started every game for the Cougars the past two years and was named a team captain coming into 2010.

BEHIND THE LINE

The Cougar offensive line was one of the best in the country in 2009, ranking eighth in the nation in tackles for loss allowed while protecting the backfield enough to give BYU the best conversion percentage on third down in the nation.

TALE OF THE

BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh in at an average 314 pounds and average 6-feet-5.

COPY CATS

BYU rushed for 139 yards in the first quarter alone after gaining 140 yards total on the ground last week against Washington. The Cougars finished with 221 yards on 34 carries against Air Force.

RUN, RUN, RUN

JJ Di Luigi led the Cougars for the second week in a row on the ground, rushing for his first-ever 100-yard rushing game. Di Luigi ran for a career-high 103 yards on seven carries. The junior had 76 yards and a touchdown in the first half alone. He also set a new career-long rush of 43 yards in the first quarter.

Di Luigi is 24th in the country in all-purpose rushing, averaging 157.5 yards per game. That mark is also good for first in the MWC.

OH, THE IRONY

Last week against Washington, BYU quarterbacks Riley Nelson and Jake Heaps finished with identical passing yardage, totaling 131 yards apiece. Both players set career highs in every individual passing category (Heaps was playing in his first game as a true freshman): Nelson went 11-of-17 with two touchdowns, including a long of 48 yards to running back JJ Di Luigi while also rushing to score a two-point conversion. Heaps went 13-of-23 with a long of 25 yards. In the end, Nelson was in for 25 plays while Heaps was in for 24.

2010 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

WHERE IN THE USA?

The defensive two-deep hail from all corners of the country. Players hail from Alaska, Arkansas, California, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, Texas and Utah.

WITH EXPERIENCE

BYU's secondary is as deep and talented as any in recent memory. Three of four starters return, including All-MWC strong safety Andrew Rich, SportsIllustrated.com All-America honorable mention Brian Logan and cornerback Brandon Bradley, fourth on the team with 64 tackles last season.

Junior corner Corby Eason and sophomore corner Robbie Buckner also have experience defending the passing game while lettermen Steven Thomas and Travis Uale are also on the two-deep after seeing playing time last season.

On the defensive line, Eathyn Manumaleuna, Romney Fuga, Vic So'oto, Jordan Richardson and Matt Putnum return while Jordan Pendleton, Brandon Ogletree and Shane Hunter bring experience to the linebacker corp.

A LONG ROAD

Defensive lineman Vic So'oto has come a long way to his spot in the starting lineup after originally joining the team in 2005. So'oto came in to the program as a tight end, playing in 11 games. After redshirting in 2006, So'oto enjoyed a sophomore season in which he saw action in all 13 games at both tight end and on special teams, grabbing 12 receptions for 124 yards.

It was after So'oto's sophomore year that the BYU coaching staff asked So'oto to switch sides of the ball, converting the tight end to a linebacker. Unfortunately, So'oto suffered a season-ending injury in just the second game of the season at Washington. After receiving an extra year of eligibility, So'oto returned in 2009, this time as a defensive lineman, backing up Mountain West Conference career sack leader Jan Jorgensen.

In 2010, So'oto has started both games for the Cougars and is third on the team in total tackles and first in sacks.

RICH ON TOP

Senior and team captain Andrew Rich led BYU in tackles for the second consecutive game, finishing with a career-high 14 tackles against the Falcons after tallying nine tackles against Washington. The senior's tackle total is the 12th-best by an FBS defender this season while his solo tackle average is good for seventh. Rich also had two tackles for loss versus Air Force, a career high, along with a forced fumble. He entered the 2010 season as a team captain and the top returner on the team in solo tackles, assisted tackles, total tackles and interceptions.

PICKED OFF

Shane Hunter intercepted a Tim Jefferson pass in the middle of the third quarter for the first interception of his career. Hunter's pick was also the first turnover caused by the BYU defense this season.

NO SACKS

BYU did not allow a sack against Air Force, the second-straight game the Cougars have not allowed a sack, tied for first in the nation.

PLAYING LIKE IT'S 2009

Junior defensive back Brian Logan continued where he left off last year, defending three Washington passes in BYU's 23-17 win. Logan's three passes defended are fourth in the Mountain West Conference and tie him for 23rd nationally in that category. In 2009, Logan averaged 1.31 pass defended per game, ranking first in the MWC and tied for second in the nation.

BACK AS A COUGAR

After starting every game as a freshman in 2007, defensive lineman Eathyn Manumaleuna returns to the Cougars and the starting lineup after serving two years in the Oklahoma Oklahoma City Mission for the LDS Church. Best known for preserving a 17-16 win over UCLA in the 2007 Las Vegas Bowl by blocking a last-second Bruin field goal, Manumaleuna totaled 25 tackles and one sack during his first season. Coincidentally, Manumalenua thwarted a potential fourth-down conversion late against Washington by batting down quarter Jake Locker's pass at the line of scrimmage.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung comes to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. An award given beginning this season is named in his honor and will be awarded to the best all-around player in college football. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

HERE COMES THE BOOM

MWC honorable mention honoree Riley Stephenson returns at punter for BYU after a successful freshman campaign. Stephenson is known for his ability to place punts near the goalline, putting eight kicks inside the 20 last season. The sophomore can also boom kicks when needed, totaling eight punts over 50 yards in 2009, including a career-high and BYU bowl game record 60-yard punt against Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 146 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9, 2006 when freshman McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards against Wyoming at Edwards Stadium. Forty-four games have passed since then.

FIRST IN THE NATION

BYU's kickoff return defense has been ranked first in the nation both weeks of the 2010 football season. The Cougars allowed just 20 yards on three punts against Washington and 12 yards on one punt at Air Force for an average of 8.0 yards per game.

PAYNE CLOSING ON RECORDS

With two PATs against Air Force, Payne is currently 15 PAT attempts from passing Kurt Gunther's (1980-82) mark of 179 in the BYU record books and three PAT conversions from jumping Gunther's BYU record in that category. He is also 78 points away from scoring the most points of any Cougar player in BYU history, a record currently held by kicker Owen Pochman (1997-00) with 333 points.

In the MWC record books, Payne is 57 points away from passing his brother for first all-time in career kicking points. Payne kicked the third-most extra points in a season in MWC history in 2009 with 59 PATs. He also holds the MWC record for juniors for most PATs made in a game, converting eight against UNLV in 2009. With 59 PATs last season, Payne also became the BYU and Mountain West Conference career PATs made leader with 156, surpassing his brother Matt's record of 150 career PATs made.

MAYBE THIS YEAR

BYU junior O'Neill Chambers added to his BYU career kickoff return record versus Air Force, now sitting at 61. Chambers is 26 returns away from breaking the Mountain West Conference record in the same category. Returning as the primary Cougar kick returner, Chambers returned a 97-yard kickoff return against UNLV and a 43-yard punt return against Utah, both career highs, in 2009. Last season Chambers averaged 25.6 yards per kick return to rank second in the MWC and 34th nationally. Also an All-MWC candidate at wide receiver this year, Chambers ranked 11th in all-purpose yards in the MWC in 2009 at 77.1 yards per game.

STEPHENSON NAMED MWC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU's Riley Stephenson earned Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week honors Monday for his performance in the Cougars' victory over Washington Saturday night.

The sophomore punter/kicker helped BYU control the field-position battle in the Cougars' 23-17 win, making the Huskies start inside the 15-yard line on three of six punts and inside the 20 on three of five kickoffs. Stephenson's six punts tied a career high.

Stephenson averaged 44.3 yards on three of his punts and placed the Huskies at the 1, 12 and 14 yard lines on the other three punts. His longest punt of the day was 47 yards. Overall, he averaged 37.2 yards on six punts.

While kicking off, the St. George, Utah, native helped BYU limit Washington to an average of 6.7 return yards with Huskie drives starting at the 2, 7 and 16 yard lines. Stephenson's two other kickoffs resulted in touchbacks.

BRONCO MENDENHALL SIXTH SEASON

During his five seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons. Mendenhall has guided his teams to five straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and consistent national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, the Cougars have earned a 49-15 record--the best record of any first-time head coach over the past five seasons and a mark topped by only 11 coaches overall. Mendenhall's .766 wining percentage ranks No. 4 among all active FBS head coaches with at least five years of experience. Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in three of the last four year while achieving a 43-9 record in that span, a ledger topped by only four other teams--Boise State, Florida, Texas and Ohio State. In doing so, the Cougars have achieved four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

While recording an 11-2 record and 7-1 league mark, Mendenhall's 2009 team went 3-1 against ranked opponents, incluing a 14-13 season-opening win over No. 3 Oklahoma and a 44-20 season finale Maaco Bowl Las Vegas victory over No. 16 Oregon State. BYU finished No. 12 in the final polls to earn its highest finish since 1996 and earn the distinction of being one of only six programs nationally to be ranked in both the final polls the past four seasons. At No. 14 in the final 2009 BCS standings, Mendenhall's Cougars are one of just seven programs to finish in the final BCS standings the past four year and the only program to do so from a non-automatic qualifying

the Cougars to back-to-back 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents.

In 2008, BYU posted a 10-2 regular season to achieve three straight 10-win seasons for only the third time in school history. In doing so, Mendenhall's teams became the first in Cougar history to go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons.

The Cougars have received five straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first five teams to a bowl game.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

In 2007, BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

In 2008, BYU earned a spot in the national polls each week of the season, including a ranking as high as No. 7. With just two regular-season blemishes on its resume with road losses at No. 6 Utah and No. 11 TCU, BYU earned a No. 16 ranking in the final BCS standings and an invitation to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl.

> Off the field, BYU has had five Academic All-Amerian citations in the past two seasons. In 2008, only Penn State (4) placed more student-athletes on the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America First Team. Cougar starters David Oswald (offensive tackle), Matt Bauman (linebacker) and Kellen Fowler (safety) each earned the high honor as BYU had three first-teamers for the first time during the same season. In 2009, Scott Johnson earned first-team honors and Bauman was a second-team selection.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, secondteam NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5 and earned an invitation to the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl -- the team's first postseason bowl appearance in three seasons. Over the next two seasons, he coached
