GAME ON...

Riding the nation's longest active win streak at 16 games, No. 8 BYU (6-0, 2-0 MWC) continues conference play on Thursday, Oct. 16, as it travels to Fort Worth, Texas to face the No. 24 TCU Horned Frogs (6-1, 3-0) at 7 p.m. CT. The game will be broadcast live nationally on VERSUS.

With last Saturday's win over New Mexico, BYU remains undefeated in conference action with a 2-0 record. The Cougars have won a MWC record 18 straight league games, dating back to a 31-17 road victory over No. 15 TCU in 2006. BYU has also won its past 11 MWC road games.

Head coach ronco Mendenhall became the first coach in BYU history to qualify for four straight bowl games in his first four years with the victory against New Mexico. TCU is coming off a 13-7 win over conference foe TCU.

THE BYU-TCU SERIES



BYU and TCU have met seven times over the past 21 years with the Cougars holding a 5-2 record over the Horned Frogs. As MWC opponents, the teams are 2-1 against each other. TCU won the first ever game against BYU, 33-12, in 1987. Back then, the Horned Frogs played in the Southwest Conference while the Cougars competed in the WAC. The following year, BYU exacted revenge with a 31-18 victory at Cougar Stadium. Interestingly, the Cougars' 2006 season 31-17 win against then-No. 15 ranked TCU in Fort Worth, Texas, began BYU's current

18-game winning streak against the MWC and was the Cougars' first road win over a nationally-ranked opponent since September 20, 1997 (at Arizona State). BYU defeated the Horned Frogs again in the last meeting between these two team on Nov. 8, 2007. Freshman running back Harvey Unga scored two rushing touchdowns helping the Cougars to a 27-22 victory.

ON THE TUBE



Thursday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on VERSUS. Joe Beninati will call the action, Glenn Parker will lend analysis and Tim Neverett will report from the sidelines. Beninati has worked for over a decade as the play-by-play announcer for the Washington Capitals. The Capital Region Emmy Award winning broadcaster has also called action for the NBA, WNBA, Major League Baseball and college football. Parker is a former NFL offensive lineman who, in his 12-year career, played for the Kansas City Chiefs, the New York Giants and the Buffalo Bills. Parker has been an analyst for the NFL Network show PLAYBOOK

and the main college football analyst for CSTV. Neverett, covers the Colorado Rockies, Colorado Crush and University of Denver hockey and lacrosse for FSN Rocky Mountain, various sporting events for CSTV and Versus, and anchors Press Box on KLZ-560 AM. Tim has covered three Olympic Games, and reported on hockey, skiing, baseball, soccer and softball for ESPN2 and ESPN International.

A LOOK BACK: BYU 21-NEW MEXICO 3



The No. 8 BYU football team improved to 6-0 on the season and became bowl eligible for the fourth-cons=ecutive year following a 21-3 victory over New Mexico (3-4, 1-2 MWC)at LaVell Edwards Stadium Saturday night. With the win the Cougars extended the nation's longest victory streak to 16 games, while remaining undefeated in Mountain West Conference play at 2-0. The BYU defense limited New Mexico to 285 total yards and kept the Lobos out of the end zone, while the Cougar offense produced 382 yards. Junior quarterback Max Hall was 22-for-34

with three touchdown passes for a total of 258 yards. Junior wide receiver Austin Collie was the beneficiary of nine of Hall's passes leading the team with a career-high 155 yards.

COUGARS CONTINUE TO WIN

With its 21-3 win over New Mexico, BYU currently owns the longest active winning streak among FBS (Division I-A) teams, having won 16 consecutive games. The Cougars have put together their longest win streak since winning 25 straight games over the 1983-85 seasons. BYU's 6-0 record this season marks its best start since the 2001 season. The top, current winning streaks in the NCAA are as follows:

NATIONAL RANKINGS

For the first time since 1997, BYU kicked off the season ranked among the nation's top-25 programs in both the USA Today Coaches Poll (No. 17), and the Associated Press Top 25 (No. 16). This marked the Cougars' highest preseason ranking since picked No. 16 in 1990. BYU finished the 2007 season ranked as high as No. 14 with an 11-2 record, including a 17-16 victory over UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl. Prior to this season, the last time the Cougars were in the top 10 in both polls was 2001, when BYU achieved rankings as high as No. 7 in the Coaches' Poll and No. 8 in the AP Top 25. The Cougars are currently the highest-ranked team from a conference without automatic qualification into a BCS bowl.

COMPETING AS A RANKED TEAM

After Saturday's win against New Mexico, the Cougars are 144-41 when nationally ranked in the Top 25. Dating back to 2006, BYU has won 13 consecutive games while being nationally ranked.

NATIONALLY RANKED OPPONENTS

The last time BYU faced a ranked opponent was Sept. 8, 2007 when it traveled to Pasadena, Calif. to take on No. 13 UCLA. The Cougars lost that game 17-27. BYU's last win over a ranked foe was a year prior in 2006 against No. 16 TCU. Prior to the Cougars' victory over TCU, BYU was 0-12 in games against ranked opponents, dating back to the 1999 season.

SCORING HALL PASSES

Quarterback Max Hall's touchdown pass to junior tight end Andrew George with 6:34 in the second quarter against New Mexico marked the eight consecutive game Hall has recorded a touchdown pass, dating back to Dec. 1, 2007 at San Diego State. In fact, Hall has thrown a touchdown pass in 18-of-19 career games.

COMPARED TO THE GREATS...

Through the first six games of his junior season, quarterback Max Hall is putting up numbers equal to, if not better, than the legendary quarterbacks that came before him.

COLLIE HITS CENTURY MARK

On Saturday against New Mexico, junior Austin Collie broke the 100-yard receiving mark for the fourth straight game with a career-high 155 yards on 9 catches against the Lobos. The last time Collie accomplished this feat was over a four games in 2007 (Nov. 3-Nov. 24). He has caught a touchdown in BYU's last five games.

CLIMBING UP THE BYU RECORD CHARTS

With his 155 yards receiving against the Lobos, Collie now has 2,390 career receiving yards, surpassing Chris Smith as No. 7 on BYU's all-time record list. The junior needs only 40 more yards to pass Mark Bellini (2,429 yards) and claim the No. 6 spot.

Counting his touchdown against New Mexico, Collie now has 23 career touchdowns, needing only three more to make it into BYU's top 10. Pete Van Valkenberg and Eric Lane currently hold the No. 10 spot with 26 career touchdowns. Collie's 23 touchdowns put him only six behind the MWC leader, Jovon Bouknight of Wyoming (29).

Collie now has 10 career 100-yard receiving games, which is tied for third all-time at BYU with Phil Odle and Margin Hooks.

GOING FOR IT

BYU attempted its second fourth-down conversion attempt of the season on fourth-and-one on New Mexico's 20-yard line during the second quarter. The Cougars were successful, with Harvey Unga running for a three-yard gain. Coincidentally, Unga converted on the first fourth-down attempt by BYU with a four-yard rush against Utah State. In the national statistics, BYU is tied for first with 100-percent fourth-down efficiency.

PLAYING UNDER THE LIGHTS

BYU is currenty holds a 1-0 record when playing night games. The Cougars' game against Utah State (W. 34-14) marked BYU's first night game of the 2008 season.

OUARTER REPORT

The Cougars held the Lobos scoreless through three quarters on Saturday. All totaled, BYU has recorded 16 shutout quarters thru the first six games of the season, including two shutouts wins over UCLA and Wyoming. BYU has outscored or tied its opponent in every quarter except two.

Saturday's shutout first quarter marked the first time this season BYU has been held scoreless in the first 15 minutes, dating back to the 2007 Utah game.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

Junior defensive lineman Jan Jorgensen picked up his first fumble recovery this season in the second quarter against the Lobos. The recovery marked Jorgensen's first since 2006 when as a freshman he recorded two. BYU has recovered 12 fumbles throughout the first half of the season, tripling in that category since last year. The Cougars recovered only four fumbles the entire 2007 season.

PAPER OR PLASTIC

With less than one minute remaining in the game against New Mexico, junior linebacker Colebly Clawson recorded back-to-back sacks on Lobo quarterback Tate Smith. The sacks marked the third and fourth of Clawson's career and combined for a loss of 22 yards. Junior defensive lineman lan Dulan also recorded a sack against Smith earlier in the fourth quarter. Junior defensive lineman Jan Jorgensen is currently half a sack behind the MWC career record of 20.5, shared by New Mexico's Michael Tuohy, TCU's Chase Ortiz and former Cougar Brady Poppinga.

TAKE YOUR PICK

Defensive back David Tafuna's interception against New Mexico marked the fourth-straight game the Cougars have recorded a pick. BYU has totaled six interceptions in the first six games of the season.

FUMBLES FOR THE SCORE

In the first quarter against Utah State, sophomore defensive back Brandon Bradley recovered the first fumble of his career, returning it for a 38-yard touchdown. The touchdown marked the second straight game the Cougars scored off a fumble recovery, as fellow defensive back Scott Johnson returned a loose ball for a touchdown in BYU's 44-0 victory over Wyoming on Sept. 20.

TURNOVERS TRANSLATING TO POINTS

In the first six games this season BYU has forced 18 turnovers. converting 12 of those into points. Of those 12 turnovers, 10 have resulted in touchdowns (70 points) for the Cougars.

PROTECTING THE "BLUEZONE"

Despite its relative youth, the Cougar defense has successfully kept its opponents from scoring a single touchdown in three of the first six games of the season. Both UCLA and Wyoming were held scoreless through four quarters apiece, while New Mexico forced to settle for a single field goal.

SCORING IN NO TIME...

Forced and recovered turnovers have resulted in fast scoring drives for the Cougars, who have put together eight scoring drives of a minute or less so far this season, including two against Utah State. In only six games, this number beats the total of seven recorded in 2007. BYU's second quarter scoring drive of six seconds agaisnt UCLA, marked the shortest Cougar scoring drive since a three-yard touchdown run by Harvey Unga against TCU on Nov. 8, 2007 knocked four seconds off

BY GEORGE. I THINK HE'S GOT IT!

After averaging only 16.2 yards per game, and one touchdown with seven receptions on the season, tight end Andrew George came out strong against the Lobos. The junior caught BYU's first touchdown reception of the day with 6:34 remaining in the second guarter, giving the Cougars the 7-3 lead. George caught his second touchdown reception of the day later in the third quarter on an 11-yard pass from Max Hall. By the end of the game, George racked up 22 yards on three catches.

CONSECUTIVE STARTS

The UCLA game marked senior offensive lineman Dallas Reynolds' 44th straight career start. During that streak, Reynolds has started at every position on the offensive line, including tackle, guard and center. Reynolds' younger brother Matt started at left tackle in the 2008 season opener. His father, Lance, is the associate head coach for the Cougars. Reynolds is currently tied at seond for the most consecutive starts by an active Football Bowl Subdivision (Division I-A) player. Reynolds has started in every game of his BYU career, beginning with the Cougars' 20-3 loss to Boston College on Sep. 3, 2005.

WELCOME BACK REED

Saturday marked senior wide receiver Michael Reed's first game back after missing the past two games due to injury. Reed caught the first pass on BYU's first possession—a 16-yard reception from quarterback Max Hall. Reed ended the day with 23 yards on three receptions.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh in at an average 326.4 pounds and average 6-feet-6. The front five will be going up against a TCU defensive front that measures an average 6-feet-2, 276 pounds. Defensively, the Cougars' front three average 6-feet-3, 278 pounds, while the TCU offensive line tips the scales at an average 6-feet-4, 311 pounds per man.

HE WHO SCORES FIRST...

UNM's 27-yard field goal with 11:40 remaining in the second quarter marked the first time this season BYU has not been the first to score. The last time a BYU opponent was the first to score was at the 2007 Las Vegas Bowl when UCLA lead 3-0 after a 22-yard field goal. The Cougars went on to win the game 17-16.

TRAILING COUGARS

With UNM up 3-0 following its field goal in the second quarter, the Cougars trailed for the first time since finding themselves down 14-21 in the third quarter against the Washington Huskies on Sept. 6.

KEEPING THINGS DOWN

Saturday's game against the Lobos set new season lows in a couple categories: total elapsed time and scoring. The 4 p.m. MT game lasted only 2 hours and 26 minutes, the shortest time so far this season. BYU's 21 points also marked a new season low for a team until Saturday averaged 41 points per game.

COIN TOSS

BYU won the opening coin toss for the fifth time this season as the game against New Mexico got underway. The Cougars elected to defer. BYU is now 5-0 when winning the opening coin toss.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 124 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

LONGEST MARCH DOWNFIELD

BYU's first touchdown drive against New Mexico o 95 yards marked the longest of the 2008 season in terms of yardage. The drive which lasted 5:04 minutes, ended with a one-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Max Hall to tight end Andrew George. The Cougars' longest drive in terms of time off the clock was in the second-quarter of the UCLA game. The 13-play drive of 48 yards took 6:43 minutes off the game clock.

DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 32-4 when leading at halftime and 31-1 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter.

FIRST HALF DOMINANCE

The Cougars held a 7-3 lead at halftime against New Mexico, marking the 16th time in the past 17 games BYU has held the lead at intermission. The Cougars have held their opponent to seven or fewer points in the opening half 12 times in 17 games. During those 17 games BYU is 16-1.

BEST OF THE BUNCH

Following the 2004 season, Bronco Mendenhall was one of 13 men who received their first head football coaching job at the Football Bowl Subdivision (Division I-A) level. Of those 13 coaches, Bronco Mendenhall has compiled the best overall record to date. Following is a list of the coaches and their current records.

VERSUS THE PAC-10

After its 59-0 victory over UCLA, BYU is now 5-1 in the last six meetings with Pac-10 opponents, including back-to-back wins against Washington and UCLA. Overall the MWC has a 6-1 record against Pac-10 foes this season.

LARGEST LEAD OVER PAC-10

The 59-0 final score between BYU and UCLA marked a new BYU record-high lead over a Pac-10 opponent. The Cougars' largest lead prior to Saturday's game was 31-0 against Oregon in the fourth quarter of the 2006 Las Vegas Bowl.

PAYNE TIES SOPHOMORE MWC RECORD

Kicker Mitch Payne connected on a perfect 8-of-8 PAT attempts in BYU's win over UCLA, tying the number of extra points made by a sophomore in a single game.

HALL BREAKS MWC TOUCHDOWN RECORD

With his seven touchdown passes on the day against UCLA, junior quarterback Max Hall set a new Mountain West Conference record. His six touchdown passes in the first half alone broke the previous record of five. The previous record has been tied several times over the past nine years—most recently by TCU's Jeff Ballard in 2006 and SDSU's Kevin O'Connell in 2007. BYU's John Beck also reached the five touchdown passes mark as a junior in 2005.

HALL SETS BYU RECORD

Quarterback Max Hall's six touchdown passes in the first half against UCLA broke BYU's previous record of five, held by Marc Wilson (CSU 1977), Robbie Bosco (Baylor 1984) and Gary Sheide (UNM 1973). Halls seven touchdown passes on the day, matched a program record of seven, shared by Wilson and Jim McMahon (CSU 1981).

UNANSWERED POINTS

The Cougars put together a run of 137 unanswered points over the past three games before the Utah State Aggies scored a touchdown with 13:47 remaining in the fourth quarter. The stretch consisted of shutout wins over UCLA and Wyoming, 59-0 and 44-0, respectively, as well as a 24-0 lead heading into the fourth quarter against Utah State. Over that time BYU held its opponents scoreless in 11 straight quarters.

FOLLOWING A BOWL VICTORY...

In seasons following a BYU bowl victory, the Cougars have compiled a combined record of 77-23 (.758), averaging 9.6 wins per season. Of BYU's eight previous post-bowl victory teams, all but two teams have returned to a bowl game the following season.

EDWARDS' STADIUM STREAK NOW SPANS THREE SEASONS

With BYU's 21-3 win over New Mexico, the Cougars have not lost in Edwards Stadium since November 19, 2005. BYU has won 16 straight home games, dating back to September 9, 2006. The last time the Cougars won 16 consecutive home games was 16 seasons ago when the team won 17 in a row from Oct. 7, 1989 to Nov. 23, 1991. Over that span, the Cougars have beaten their opponents by an average of 28.8 points per game and have allowed just 9.7 points per game. The Cougars have allowed seven points or less in nine of the last 16 home games.

UNDEFEATED AT HOME

BYU finished the 2007 season with a perfect 6-0 record at home, for the second consecutive year. The last time BYU had a perfect record at home for two straight seasons was in 1990-1991. Since the stadium was built in 1964, BYU has gone undefeated at home 14 times:

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

The 64,105 fans in attendance for the Cougars' 21-3 win over New Mexico marked the tenth consecutive sell-out at Edwards Stadium. The current streak marks the longest streak of consecutive sellouts since the 1991-92 seasons. Over 256,000 (256,425) fans have attended the first four home games at Edwards Stadium this season, averaging 64,106 fans per game. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 45 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 13 different countries, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Germany, Japan, Korea, Madagascar, Mexico, Russia, Sweden and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions speak a total of nine different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, German, Japanese, Malagasy, Portuguese, Spanish and Swedish.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Of the 105 players on the team roster, 60 have served a church mission (57 percent). Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 14 different countries around the world, including Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, England, Germany, Puerto Rico, United States and Uruguay. Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 16 different states, including Alaska, California, Colorado, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, New Mexico, New York, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas and Washington. Current members of the BYU football team who have previously served church missions speak a total of nine different foreign languages, including Chinese, French, German, Portuguese, Samoan and Spanish.

WHAT IS A MISSION, YOU ASK?

The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. "Mormon" missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities. More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world. Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language. Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 17 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Guatemala, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, Spain and South Korea. A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m. In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize. Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services. Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Seniors Travis Bright and David Nixon, along with juniors Max Hall and Jan Jorgensen have been selected by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2008 football season.

Collectively the captains have 103 games of experience, with all four starting each game last season. Hall ended the 2007 season as the nation's top sophomore quarterback, passing for 3,848 yards. Bright, an offensive lineman, was part of an offensive unit that led the MWC and ranked 14th nationally in passing offense, averaging 298.4 yards per game. Over the course of the 2007 season, defensive lineman Jorgensen recorded 14 sacks for a combined loss of 115 yards, producing at least one sack in seven straight games. At linebacker, Nixon was credited with a career-high 66 tackles on the season, including a career-best 38 solo tackles.

Their accomplishments extend off the field as well, with each player earning 2007 Academic All-Mountain West Conference honors.

A BYU COACHING FIRST

With a 21-3 win over New Mexico on Oct. 11, 2008, the Cougars picked up their sixth win of the season, qualifying for their fourth straight bowl game. BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall became the first coach in BYU history to qualify for four straight bowl games in his first four years. Mendenhall currently ranks second behind LaVell Edwards with the most postseason appearances in BYU football history.

A FAMILY TRADITION

HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



After only his third season as the head coach at Brigham Young, Bronco Mendenhall has taken a program that had not enjoyed a winning season since 2001 and has turned it back into the Mountain West Conference's premier football program, and is steadily rebuilding the national prominence the Cougars once enjoyed.

In his first season, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5 regular-season record and earned an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl — the team's first post-season bowl appearance in three seasons. Since then, he has coached the Cougars to back-to-back, 11-win seasons and

claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents. Under his direction, the Cougars have not lost a league game--at home or on the road--in two years and has finished the regular-season ranked among the nation's top-20 programs in the Bowl Championship Series standings.

With an invitation to attend the 2007 Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl, Mendenhall became the first coach in BYU football history to take a team to a bowl game in three straight seasons during his first three years as a head coach. On November 17, 2007, Mendenhall led the Cougars to a 35-10 victory over Wyoming to record his 25th career win. With the victory, Mendenhall became the only coach in BYU football history to win 25 games in his first 35 attempts.

Building on the success of his first-ever season as a head coach in 2005, Mendenhall and the Cougars posted an 11-2 record in 2006, winning the outright Mountain West Conference Championship with a perfect 8-0 record. As a result, BYU returned to the Las Vegas Bowl to represent the MWC. In dominating fashion, and with a swagger similar to that of the glory years of BYU football, the Cougars handed Oregon a 38-8 defeat in the Las Vegas Bowl.

Throughout the 2006 season, BYU climbed the national polls by winning nine straight games to finish the regular season. As a result, the Cougars earned top-20 rankings in the Associated Press Top-25, the USA Today Coaches Poll, the Harris Interactive Poll and the BCS rankings. The Cougars' nine-game win streak was the third longest in the country and marked only the seventh time in BYU football history the Cougars had recorded at least nine consecutive wins in a single season.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

The 2007 season started out in similar fashion, winning just one of the team's first three games; however, under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars rebounded to win the final 10 games of the season, and like the previous year, garnered the attention of local, regional and national voters. BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll, marking the highest finish for the Cougars since finishing No. 5 following the 1996 season.

Like the 2006 season, BYU ranked among the nation's leaders in several statistical categories. The Cougars led the MWC and ranked 14th in passing offense, averaging 298.4 yards per game. The Cougars also led the league and ranked 25th in total offense, averaging 442.8 yards per game.

Defensively, the Cougars ranked 10th nationally in total defense, allowing just 307.9 yards per game. During the regular season, the Cougars did not allow a single 100-yard rusher. BYU finished the year ranked 9th nationally, allowing an average 97.5 yards rushing per game. One of Mendenhall's jobs as the head coach and defensive coordinator is to manage points. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

From his first day as a head coach, Mendenhall has stressed the importance of winning at home. After finishing 3-3 in Provo during the 2005 season, Mendenhall and the Cougars registered a perfect 6-0 record at home in 2006 and another perfect, 6-0 mark in 2007. In 2006, the Cougars finished the season as the most dominate home team in the country, and the most dominate home team in BYU football history, winning games by an average 35.16 points per game. In 2007, the Cougars outscored opponents at Edwards Stadium by an average 17.3 points per game. BYU allowed just 11.3 points per game, marking the best scoring defense effort since the 1988 season when BYU held opponents to just 10.2 points per game.

A native of Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1989 at his alma mater, Oregon State. After earning his master's degree in 1990, he moved to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he served as the secondary coach and defensive coordinator from 1991-92 under current BYU assistant coach Paul Tidwell. Following two seasons with the Badgers, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Northern Arizona, where the Lumberjacks boasted the top-ranked defense in the Big Sky Conference. He was elevated to co-defensive coordinator for the 1994 season.

In 1995, Mendenhall returned to Oregon State to become the defensive line coach under then defensive coordinator Rocky Long. When Long left to become the defensive coordinator at UCLA, Mendenhall was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 1996 season. At just 29 years of age, Mendenhall was the youngest defensive coordinator in Pac-10 history.

In 1997, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Louisiana Tech where he helped the Bulldogs to a remarkable 9-2 record as his defensive unit was credited with 17 interceptions, allowing just 15 touchdowns on the season.

In 1998, Mendenhall moved to Albuquerque, N.M., to become the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Mexico. Over the next five seasons, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West Conference in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in both the 2000 and 2002 season, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

At New Mexico, Mendenhall played a valuable role in the development of the 1999 Mountain West Player of the Year, Consensus All-American and first-round NFL Draft pick Brian Urlacher. The ninth overall selection in the 2000 NFL Draft, Urlacher was voted the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a Pro Bowl selection. Urlacher was one of two rookies to play all 16 games, starting at middle linebacker the final 14 games to establish a team record for starts at the position by a rookie. He shattered Bears rookie records with 165 total tackles and eight sacks, making him the second Chicago first-year player to lead the team in tackles. Urlacher finished his collegiate career ranked third on New Mexico's all-time list with 442 tackles.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple has three sons.



JAIME HILL NAMED DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

During the off-season, BYU head football coach Bronco Mendenhall announced Jaime Hill (first name pronounced high-may) has been promoted to defensive coordinator.

The move formalizes the capacity Hill has served in over the past season. While Mendenhall will maintain play-calling responsibilities on game-day, Hill is responsible for managing the essential aspects of running the defensive unit.

"I'm very grateful for this opportunity for personal growth within this profession; especially with this great program at Brigham Young University," Hill said. "I truly believe the foundation was laid by Coach Edwards and his staff, along with the players. Coach Mendenhall's staff and players have brought back the past glory, and have created their own line of history that will be passed down. This is something we can build upon for the future, and the future looks bright."

Since arriving at BYU for the 2006 season, Hill has played a significant role in the defensive secondary's marked improvement. In the two seasons since his arrival, BYU is averaging 17 interceptions, 50.5 pass break-ups and is allowing just under 208 yards passing per game. In addition, due in part to improved coverage, sacks have also increased to an average 28 per season since Hill's arrival.

In 2007 the Cougars finished as the 10th ranked defense in the country. Rushing defense finished the season ranked 9th nationally, passing defense jumped to 32nd and the team finished ninth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

"Coach Hill has made a tremendous impact on our defense in the time he has been here and this is a way for us to recognize him for his contributions," Mendenhall said. "This promotion gives Coach Hill the formal responsibility of handling the day-to-day duties of running the defense, allowing me to focus my attention on other aspects of the program. I have a lot of respect for Coach Hill and the work he has done, and I am confident this will give our defense the opportunity to continue to improve."

OTHER PLAYERS TO WATCH...

Matt Bauman-LB

This season Bauman has stepped in to fill the leadership role left behind by graduated senior Kelly Poppinga. In 2007 Bauman was credited with a key fumble recovery in BYU's one-point bowl victory over UCLA. He also had an interception in the Cougars' win over Utah. Through the first six games of the 2008 season, Bauman currently leads the team with 46 tackles.

Travis Bright-OL

Bright returns as one of several veterans on the offensive line after suffering a broken leg in BYU's 17-16 victory over UCLA in the 2007 Las Vegas Bowl. Starting all 13 games last season, Bright was part of an offensive unit that led the MWC and ranked 14th in the nation in passing offense. During the spring Bright set the BYU weight room record, benching 540 lbs. He is currently serving as one of four team captains for the 2008 season.

O'Neill Chambers-WR/KR

A true freshman out of Harmony, Fla., Chambers currently ranks No. 17 nationally in kickoff returns, averaging 28.00 yards per return. His longest return was for 51 yards against Northern lowa, his first collegiate game.

lan Dulan-DL

Starting 12 of the Cougars' 13 games last season, Dulan was credited with 24 tackles, including 11 solo tackles. He recorded three sacks on the season for a combined loss of 15 yards. So far in 2008, Dulan has recorded three sacks for 29 yards.

Andrew George-TE

Together with Dennis Pitta, George looks to continue the tradition of success found by tight ends at BYU. George recorded 200 yards on 17 receptions in 2007, including a career-high three receptions for 62 yards during the team's regular-season matchup against UCLA. The junior tight end recorded his first touchdown of the season in BYU's 28-27 win over Washington. Against New Mexico, George totaled three receptions for 22 yards, including two of the three touchdowns of the game.

Scott Johnson-DB

Since starting the first six games of the 2008 season, Johnson is ranked second on the team in tackles with 40. He has recorded five pass breakups and one forced fumble. The junior recovered a fumble on Wyoming's opening drive and returned it for a 64-yard touchdown, the first of his career.

After suffering a groin injury during the majority of last season, Payne is healthy and ready for the 2008 season. Payne has converted 25-of-27 point-after attempts and scored a total of 34 points so far this season. In BYU's 59-0 win over UCLA in 2008, Payne made a perfect 8-of-8 PAT attempts, tying the MWC record for most PATs made by a sophomore in a single game. Kicked a career-long 45-yard field goal against Utah State.

Michael Reed-WR

An experienced outside receiver, Reed returns to the Cougars for his senior season after logging significant playing time over the past three years. Reed had 41 catches for 449 yards and four touchdowns a year ago. After sufferning from injury and missing the 2008 games against Wyoming and Utah State, Reed is fully recovered, resuming his starting position.

Fui Vakapuna-RB

Slowed by injury the majority of the 2007 season, senior Vakapuna is expected to make a large contribution to the experienced BYU offense. Vakapuna is known for his ability to break tackles and run over those standing in his way. He recorded his first carry and touchdown of the 2008 season against Washington.
