ON THE TUBE

Saturday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on VERSUS. Joe Beninati will provide the play-by-play and will be joined by color analyst Kelly Stouffer. Lindsay Soto will cover the game from the sidelines.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- No. 4/5 TCU (6-0, 2-0 MWC) is the highest-ranked team BYU (2-4, 1-1) has faced since going against No. 3 Oklahoma in last year's season opener and is the highest ranked conference opponent BYU has played since meeting No. 5 Utah in 2004. The Horned Frogs are the fourth team BYU has played this season that is currently in the Top 25.
- TCU will be the fourth team BYU has played this season that is ranked in the latest national polls. The Cougars have already faced No. 16/17 Florida State, No. 19/21 Nevada and No. 23/23 Air Force. These four schools have a combined record of 22-2, with the two losses by Florida State and Air Force each coming against Oklahoma, currently ranked No. 6 in both polls.
- BYU looks to break a two-game losing streak to TCU, the longest current Cougar losing streak against a MWC opponent. BYU will attempt to win its first game at Fort Worth since 2006.
- Freshman quarterback Jake Heaps is just 13 pass completions away from setting the BYU freshman guarterback record in that category in just the seventh game and fourth start of his career. Heaps currently has 96 completions and would pass Matt Berry's current record of 108 completions.

THE BYU-TCU SERIES

The BYU series with TCU began in 1987 with the Horned Frogs winning the inaugural contest. BYU came back the following year to win behind Matt Bellini's 202 receiving yards. After winning the next two games in the series by three touchdowns apiece, the two teams began playing each other regularly after the Horned Frogs joined the MWC in 2005. Since then, TCU has won three-of-five games, including the last two years when both teams have been ranked in the Top 25. BYU last

won in Fort Worth in 2006 when the Cougars broke TCU's 13-game win streak, the longest in the nation at the time.

LAST TIME: TCU 38, BYU 7 (2009)

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 24, 2009) — Homecoming festivities and a visit from ESPN's College GameDay weren't enough to help pull off a win for No. 16 BYU as No. 8 TCU walked out of Provo with a 38-7 win at LaVell Edwards Stadium in front of 64,641 fans.

Cougar running back Harvey Unga was the highlight of the BYU offense, scoring BYU's lone touchdown in the second quarter. Unga, the Mountain West Conference's leading rusher, ran 21 times for 122 yards. Senior quarterback Max Hall threw for 161 yards, completing 18-of-28 passes and recording one touchdown pass. Tight end Dennis Pitta caught four receptions for 62 yards, leading the Cougars in catches, having done so in 7-of-8 games this season.

Pressure from the Horned Frogs defensive line created difficulties for the Cougars on offense in the second half. Besides being sacked five times, TCU forced BYU into one interception and one lost fumble, converting the two turnovers into a field goal and touchdown, respectively.

The Cougars finished with 298 total yards to TCU's 412 yards. The Horned Frogs' Andy Dalton threw for 241 yards to go with TCU's 127 yards on the ground. BYU recorded 188 yards passing and 110 yards rushing.

TCU LAST TIME: TCU 45, WYOMING O

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) - Andy Dalton stood in the pocket and spotted Bart Johnson about 40 yards away in the end zone with a defender in seemingly good position to make a play. The TCU quarterback threw it anyway.

Dalton's best throw of the day sailed over the defender's outstretched arms for a 31-yard touchdown that put to rest the TCU quarterback's worst game of the season a week earlier, and the No. 5 Horned Frogs recorded consecutive shutouts for the first time in 55 years in a 45-0 victory over Wyoming on Saturday.

Dalton was 14 of 17 for a season-high 270 yards and three touchdowns, surpassing his 116-yard total from a week ago against Colorado State on the strike to Johnson, which put TCU ahead 21-0 on the first play of the second quarter.

TCU (6-0, 2-0 Mountain West) led 31-0 at halftime a week after going to the break up just 6-0 against Colorado State, where Dalton finished 11 of 24 with a late TD pass in a 27-0 win.

BYU'S LAST OUTING

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 9, 2010) – Third down proved successful on both sides of the ball for the Cougars as BYU defeated conference foe San Diego State 24-21 at LaVell Edwards Stadium on Saturday.

With 3:21 left in the game and San Diego State threatening a 24-21 BYU lead, the Cougar defense held the Aztecs on three-consecutive plays to force a punt and seal their first conference win of the season.

The BYU offense, led by freshman quarterback Jake Heaps, was 12-of-19 on third down. Heaps finished the game with 126 passing yards on 15-of-22 completions.

Three BYU running backs recorded career high marks in rushing attempts and yards as the Cougars tallied 271 total yards on 62 attempts.

Junior JJ Di Luigi led the running game with 22 rushes for 134 yards while junior Bryan Kariya added 85 yards on 22 attempts. True freshman Joshua Quezada tallied 50 yards on 11 carries.

TOUGHEST SCHEDULE IN THE COUNTRY?

BYU's 2010 schedule has proved to be one of the toughest among all 120 FBS schools. Three of BYU's four losses this season have come to opponents ranked in the latest national polls, including No. 16/17 Florida State, No. 19/21 Nevada and No. 23/23 Air Force. Those three schools have a combined record of 16-2, with the two losses both coming to Oklahoma, currently ranked No. 6 in both polls. This week, BYU travels to play at No. 4/5 TCU (6-0) and will later visit No. 11/10 Utah (5-0) next month.

BYU, WEST VIRGINIA TO MEET AT FEDEXFIELD

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 23, 2010) — FedExField, home of the Washington Redskins of the National Football League, will host Brigham Young University and West Virginia University in a neutral-site football game scheduled for Sept. 24, 2016

Home of the Redskins since 1997, FedExField is located in Landover, Md., and has a seating capacity of 91,704 — the largest stadium in the NFL in terms of regular capacity.

The Cougars and Mountaineers have never met before in football. West Virginia has been a member of the Big East Conference since 1991. Both BYU and WVU have been ranked in the top 25 during each of the past five years. Over the past four seasons both programs have won at least nine games per year with the Mountaineers posting a 40-12 record while the Cougars are 43-9.

"BYU has been one of the consistently powerful programs over the last 35-40 years," WVU Director of Athletics Oliver Luck said. "In so many ways, LaVell Edwards reminds me of Don Nehlen. Both built solid foundations at their respective schools. Anybody that has played quarterback in the NCAA has enormous respect for the quarterback tradition at BYU."

OPPONENT SNAPSHOT

MENDENHALL VS. RANKED FOES

Under Bronco Mendenhall, BYU is 4-7 vs. ranked foes, with its wins being a 31-17 victory over No. 15 TCU on Sept. 28, 2006, and three wins in 2009: a 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Sept. 5, a 26-23 win over No. 21 Utah on Nov. 28 and a 44-20 win over No. 18 Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl on Dec. 22.

BYU VS. BCS AQS

With its win against Washington in this year's season opener, BYU has defeated a team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference five-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 14 of the past 15 years dating back to 1996.

DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 44-4 when leading at halftime and 44-1 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter. Mendenhall's teams have won 28-straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 75 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987 when it lost 29-27 in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

TEAM CAPTAINS

BYU head football coach Bronco Mendenhall announced team captains for the 2010 season as well as several personnel notes entering the first week of the season.

Senior safety Andrew Rich and junior offensive tackle Matt Reynolds have been selected to serve as team captains. Both Rich and Reynolds have played in all 26 games the past two seasons and enter their third year as a starter for the Cougars.

Rich has started in 16 games and earned All-MWC Second Team honors in 2009. He is a 2010 Lott Trophy Award candidate. Reynolds has started all 26 games of his career and is a preseason All-American, Lombardi Trophy and Outland Trophy candidate in 2010. He was a Freshman All-American in 2008 and a CFN All-Sophomore selection in 2009 while earning first-team all-conference accolades.

BYU has also elected a special teams captain for several games this year including holder Matt Marshall against Washington and Riley Stephenson at Air Force.

THIRD DOWN IMPROVEMENTS

The Cougars finished the game against San Diego State going 12-of-19 (.632) on third-down conversions, the team's best percentage and most third-down conversions of the season. The Cougar defense also forced the worst third-down conversion numbers of any BYU opponent this season, forcing the Aztecs to 3-of-10 (.300). BYU has improved its season third-down success rate to 40.4 percent, which ranks 53rd overall and fifth in the MWC.

MOVE FORWARD, NOT BACKWARD

As a team, the Cougars are one of the least penalized squads in the nation, averaging just five penalties per game, tied for 22nd among all FBS schools and second in the MWC. BYU's average of 37.5 penalty yards per game is 15th in the nation and the best in the conference.

YOU CAN'T HAVE IT

Last Saturday against San Diego State, the BYU offense held the ball for a whopping 45:01 compared to the Aztecs' 14:59 time of possession. The Cougars' opening drive of the game lasted 8:28, going 19 plays and covering 78 yards for a touchdown, BYU's longest drive of the season. SDSU had just one drive lasting over three minutes, with 9-of-12 Aztec drives lasting less than two minutes. BYU held the ball for at least 10 minutes each quarter of the game.

PULLING OUT THE CLOSE ONES

After defeating San Diego State last week by three points, BYU has won 13-consecutive games decided by seven points or fewer.

YOUNG (NOT STEVE)

The Cougars have played 15 freshmen this season, five of whom have started at least one game this year. True freshman quarterback Jake Heaps, running back Joshua Quezada and wide receiver Cody Hoffman have become regular starters on the offensive side of the ball while four freshman tight ends have caught at least one pass while rotating responsibilities.

2010 BYU FOOTBALL FIRESIDES

BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall, his wife, Holly, and members of the BYU football team will participate in an hour-long devotional prior to eight football games this season.

These devotionals will be conducted prior to all road games as well as the Washington and San Diego State home games. They are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches, and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth.

"The firesides have been a way for us to make a very clear statement of what our priorities are, or should be," Mendenhall says. "Football is simply the vehicle we use to help others come to a knowledge of what really brings joy and happiness to our lives. Football is not the priority. Some people don't understand that. These firesides are a way for all of us to help consider our priorities through understanding the purpose of life."

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 51 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 16 different countries, including Argentina, Bulgaria, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, Costa Rica, Ghana, Guatemala, Japan, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Russia, South Africa and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of eight different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Japanese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish and Tagalog.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga, is one of 74 players (62 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 24 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, England, Germany, India, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, Mozambique, New Zealand, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 18 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, Nevada, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Washington.

Overall, 54 current members of the BYU football team speak a total of 17 different foreign languages and dialects, including Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

- * The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- * The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and John in the book of Acts).
- * More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- * Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- * Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- * Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, South Africa and Spain.
 - * Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- *A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- * In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- * Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions except for their transportation to and from their field of labor and are not paid for their services.
- * Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ

Since the Mountain West Conference was formed in 1999, BYU has posted a record of 59-24 against league opponents, marking the most wins of any other conference opponent. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past six seasons, including all five years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,725-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. Beginning in 2010, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63.275 after seating was removed to allow for additional wheelchair access.

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

The attendance in BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sell-outs at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWD

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah last season is currently tenth with 64,301 fans attending the game.

A majority of the BYU two-deep includes athletes who grew up in hometowns just a few miles from Provo. Wide receiver Luke Ashworth and offensive linemen brothers Matt and Houston Reynolds even went to high school in Provo at Timpview High. Others from Utah County include tight end Austin Holt from Orem, tight end Mike Muehlmann from American Fork and fullback Zed Mendenhall from Alpine.

Other Utahns on the depth chart include left guard Braden Hansen from Sandy, right guard Jason Speredon from West Valley City, right tackle Braden Brown from Salt Lake City, quarterback James Lark from St. George and running back Bryan Kariya from Kaysville.

HE'S GOT YOUR BACK

BYU starting offensive lineman Matt Reynolds enters the year as a preseason All-American after being named to the All-MWC First Team and College Football News All-Sophomore Team First Team. A Lombardi and Outland Trophy candidate, the 6-foo-6, 322-pound junior has started every game for the Cougars the past two years and was named a team captain coming into 2010.

TALE OF THE

BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh in at an average 314 pounds and average 6-feet-5. In a season full of injuries for the Cougars, all five linemen have started every game of the season.

WHO NEEDS MARIO?

Junior running back JJ Di Luigi rushed for a career- and game-high 134 yards while averaging 6.1 yards on 22 carries in BYU's win over San Diego State. Di Luigi added 23 yards on three catches to total 157 all-purpose yards on the day—the third time this season he has totaled more yards than any other player on the field from either team. Di Luigi scored a 3-yard touchdown on BYU's opening drive converting one of his five first downs on the day with a critical 4-yard gain on a third-and-four play. On the day, he was a perfect 4-for-4 in converting third down opportunities. Di Luigi later ran for 40 yards on four carries to fuel BYU's fourth quarter touchdown. Di Luigi had two carries over 30 yards on the day, including a career-long 46-yard gallop.

The junior currently leads the MWC in rushing in conference games with a 118.5 average in two contests and is second in all-purpose yards at 160.0. On the year he is fifth in the conference with 508 (84.7/avg) rushing yards and third in all-purpose yardage with 847 (141.2/avg).

RUN, THEN RUN AGAIN

The BYU offense compiled 62 rushing attempts for 271 yards against San Diego State, both new season highs. The Cougars' 62 rushing attempts are the most for the program since Nov. 23, 1996, when BYU rushed 63 times in a 37-17 win at Utah. It is also the 11th-highest number of carries by an FBS team this season. The last time BYU rushed for at least 270 yards as a team was last year against UNLV when the Cougars rushed for 291 yards. BYU's top three runners each set new career highs in rushing attempts and yards against the Aztecs.

UTILITY MAN

BYU junior Matt Marshall became the third Cougar to complete a pass in a game this season, converting a 16-yard pass to freshman tight end Mike Muehlmann off a fake field goal versus San Diego State. The pitch-and-catch kept the drive alive and ultimately resulted in BYU's first touchdown of the game. Marshall, usually a wide receiver and holder on field goals for the Cougars, also filled in for starting quarterback Jake Heaps for a few snaps with some options plays during the game. Marshall was an option quarterback during his high schools days at Skyline High in Salt Lake City.

A LONG BOAD

Defensive lineman Vic So'oto has come a long way to his spot in the starting lineup after originally joining the team in 2005. So'oto came in to the program as a tight end, playing in 11 games. After redshirting in 2006, So'oto enjoyed a sophomore season in which he saw action in all 13 games at both tight end and on special teams, grabbing 12 receptions for 124 yards.

It was after So'oto's sophomore year that the BYU coaching staff asked So'oto to switch sides of the ball, converting the tight end to a linebacker. Unfortunately, So'oto suffered a season-ending injury in just the second game of the season at Washington. After receiving an extra year of eligibility, So'oto returned in 2009, this time as a defensive lineman, backing up Mountain West Conference career sack leader Jan Jorgensen.

In 2010, So'oto has started every game and is seventh on the team in total tackles in addition to three quarterback hurries, one sack and one interception.

TREE GROWS IN PROVO

Sophomore middle linebacker Brandon Ogletree started for the second time this season against San Diego State. Ogletree made a key interception on the first play of San Diego State's second possession, setting up BYU's second touchdown of the game after returning the pick 11 yards to the SDSU 24-yard line. In the fourth quarter, Ogletree twice made critical plays to help BYU maintain its advantage, first bringing down the MWC's leading rusher Ronnie Hillman for no gain on second-and three to set up a third-down incompletion and force a punt. Later, with SDSU trailing by only three with three minutes to go in the game, Ogletree broke up the SDSU third-and-10 pass attempt to force a punt and allow the Cougars to run out the clock for the win. He finished with one tackle, one interception and one pass breakup. His interception and pass breakup were both firsts for the sophomore.

RESULTS WERE NEGATIVE

The Cougars held SDSU to minus-2 yards rushing in the first half, holding Ronnie Hillman to seven yards on five rushes and sacking Ryan Lindley once for minus-9 yards. In the first quarter, the BYU defense held San Diego State to just under four minutes of possession, one first down, eight yards of total offense and minus-10 rushing yards in the first quarter, helping the Cougars to a 14-0 lead.

TOP TACKLER

Senior and team captain Andrew Rich is ranked 11th in the nation with an average of 6.2 solo tackles per game and is tied for 16th in the nation in total tackles per game at 10.6, good for third in the MWC. Rich, who has seen time at both safety positions this year, has led BYU in tackles three out of five games while battling various injuries. He totaled a career-high 14 tackles against both Air Force and Nevada. Rich, a former walk-on from Snow College, entered the 2010 season as the top returner on the team in solo tackles, assisted tackles, total tackles and interceptions.

STEPPING IN, STEPPING UP

Linebacker Jadon Wagner and safety Travis Uale totaled 10 tackles apiece at Utah State replacing regular starters James Frazier and Steven Thomas, respectively. The numbers were career highs for both defenders and the top two marks for the Cougars.

MIGHTY HUNTER

Linebacker Shane Hunter led all players with a career-high 13 tackles against Utah State, including a BYU season-high 10 assisted tackles. Hunter has also come up with two of BYU's four turnovers created this season, recovering a fumble against Florida State and intercepting a pass at Air Force.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung comes to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. An award given beginning this season is named in his honor and will be awarded to the best all-around player in college football. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

STEPHENSON NAMED MWC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU's Riley Stephenson earned Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his performance in the Cougars' season-opening victory over Washington.

The sophomore punter/kicker helped BYU control the field-position battle in the Cougars' 23-17 win, making the Huskies start inside the 15-yard line on three of six punts and inside the 20 on three of five kickoffs. Stephenson's six punts tied a career high.

HERE COMES THE BOOM

MWC honorable mention honoree Riley Stephenson returns at punter for BYU after a successful freshman campaign. Stephenson is known for his ability to place punts near the goalline, putting eight kicks inside the 20 last season. The sophomore can also boom kicks when needed, totaling eight punts over 50 yards in 2009, including a career-high and BYU bowl game record 60-yard punt against Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 150 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9, 2006 when freshman McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards against Wyoming at Edwards Stadium. Forty-eight games have passed since then.

PAYNE SETS BYU RECORD

On his first of three PATs against San Diego State, senior kicker Mitch Payne passed former Cougar kicker Kurt Gunther (1980-82) for most PAT conversions in a career in BYU history, sending home his 163rd career conversion through the uprights. Payne is also currently 8 PAT attempts from passing Gunther's mark of 179 in the BYU record books. He is also 56 points away from scoring the most points of any Cougar player in BYU history, a record currently held by kicker Owen Pochman (1997-00) with 333 points.

In the MWC record books, Payne is 35 points away from passing his brother for first all-time in career kicking points. Payne kicked the third-most extra points in a season in MWC history in 2009 with 59 PATs. He also holds the MWC record for juniors for most PATs made in a game, converting eight against UNLV in 2009. With 59 PATs last season, Payne also became the BYU and Mountain West Conference career PATs made leader with 156, surpassing his brother Matt's record of 150 career PATs made.

KICK COVERAGE

BYU's kickoff return defense is currently ranked 7th in the country after being ranked first in the nation the first four weeks of the 2010 season. The Cougars allow just 17.25 yards per kickoff return, the best mark in the Mountain West Conference. BYU has allowed 20 yards on three kicks against Washington, 12 yards on one kick at Air Force, two returns for 18 yards versus Florida State and 32 yards on two kick returns against Nevada.

BYU is also 26th in the nation and second in the MWC in punt return defense, allowing only 4.75 yards per punt return on the year after stifling Utah State for minus-1 yard on two punt returns.

PERFECT PAYNE

Senior kicker Mitch Payne kicked a 29-yard field goal against San Diego State, keeping him perfect inside the 30-yard line in his career. Payne has made 22-of-22 attempts inside the 30, including 7-of-7 this season.

STEPHENSON NAMED HONORABLE MENTION

BYU sophomore kicker Riley Stephenson was named a College Football Performance Awards honorable mention kickoff specialist performer of the week for his efforts against Utah State. Stephenson averaged 56.8 yards per kickoff, totaling 227 yards on four kickoffs with one touchback. In the punting game, Stephenson averaged 47.8 yards on four punts Saturday at Utah State, downing two of those punts inside the 20. He had a 35-yard punt downed at the 3-yard line and then boomed a 55-yarder that was downed at the 4-yard line. His other two punts traveled 56 and 45 yards and yielded a combined -1-yards on returns to give the Cougars a net punting of 48.0 yards for the game.

RETURN TO RETURNS

Junior wide receiver/kick returner McKay Jacobson ran a Nevada kickoff back 39 yards for a new team season high last weekend. Jacobson had three kick returns, his first of 2010 after returning three kickoffs last season and seven in 2006. Jacobson also rushed for eight yards on a return before handing the ball off to teammates Cody Hoffman who rushed for an additional 31 yards.

FALSLEV TAKES OFF

Freshman JD Falslev returned the first kickoff of his career 34 yards to the BYU 46-yard line, setting up the Cougars' first points of the game at Utah State. Falslev finished with three returns for 64 yards in his hometown of Logan.

BRONCO MENDENHALL SIXTH SEASON

During his first five seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons. Mendenhall has guided his teams to five straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and consistent national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, the Cougars earned a 49-15 record in his first five years--the best record of any first-time head coach over the past five seasons and a mark topped by only 11 coaches overall. Mendenhall's .766 wining percentage entering the season ranked No. 4 among all active FBS head coaches with at least five years of experience. Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in three of the last four years while achieving a 43-9 record in that span, a ledger topped by only four other teams--Boise State, Florida, Texas and Ohio State. In doing so, the Cougars have achieved four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

While recording an 11-2 record and 7-1 league mark, Mendenhall's 2009 team went 3-1 against ranked opponents, incluing a 14-13 season-opening win over No. 3 Oklahoma and a 44-20 season finale Maaco Bowl Las Vegas victory over No. 16 Oregon State. BYU finished No. 12 in the final polls to earn its highest finish since 1996 and earn the distinction of being one of only six programs nationally to be ranked in both the final polls the past four seasons. At No. 14 in the final 2009 BCS standings, Mendenhall's Cougars are one of just seven programs to finish in the final BCS standings the past four year and the only program to do so from a non-automatic qualifying

Cougars to back-to-back 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents.

In 2008, BYU posted a 10-2 regular season to achieve three straight 10-win seasons for only the third time in school history. In doing so, Mendenhall's teams became the first in Cougar history to go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons.

The Cougars have received five straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first five teams to a bowl game.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

In 2007, BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

In 2008, BYU earned a spot in the national polls each week of the season, including a ranking as high as No. 7. With just two regular-season blemishes on its resume with road losses at No. 6 Utah and No. 11 TCU, BYU earned a No. 16 ranking in the final BCS standings and an invitation to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl.

> Off the field, BYU has had five Academic All-Amerian citations in the past two seasons. In 2008, only Penn State (4) placed more student-athletes on the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America First Team. Cougar starters David Oswald (offensive tackle), Matt Bauman (linebacker) and Kellen Fowler (safety) each earned the high honor as BYU had three first-teamers for the first time during the same season. In 2009. Scott Johnson earned first-team honors and Bauman was a second-team selection.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

In his best game as a Cougar, Ashworth caught five passes for a career-high 91 yards and one touchdown against Utah State on Oct. 2, 2009, including a long pass for 48 yards. He ranked second on the team with 29 receptions and has averaged 14.2 yards per catch in his three-year career.

BRANDON BRADLEY-DB

Bradley's 48 solo tackles in 2009 ranked second on the team while ranking fourth with 64 tackles overall. He is a three-year letterwinner, playing 32 games with 16 starts in his career.

BRADEN BROWN-OL

Brown saw action in all 13 games in 2009, including two starts. The redshirt sophomore has started every game for the Cougars this year and is an Academic All-MWC honoree.

TERENCE BROWN-OL

Brown received College Football News All-Sophomore Team honorable mention last year after starting every game at right guard. The starting center this season, Brown helped the offensive unit rank No. 1 in the nation in third-down conversion percentage in 2009. He has started every game in 2010 after converting to the center position for the first time.

O'NEILL CHAMBERS-WR/KR/PR

Chambers ranked second on the team with 32 receptions last season while ranking No. 2 in the MWC and 34th nationally with a 25.6 yard per kickoff return average. In 2009, Chambers had a career-long kick return of 97 yards and a career-long punt return of 43 yards. In 2008, his 35 kick returns set a BYU and MWC record for most kickoff returns in a season.
