Saturday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on The Mtn. James Bates and Todd Christensen will be up in the booth with Sammy Linebaugh working the sidelines.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- After playing in the same conference for over 89 years, BYU and Utah will play their final game as conference foes. Since joining the Mountain West Conference, the Cougars and Utes have won the most conference games of any MWC team, coming out on top in 64 and 62 games, respectively.
- In the last 13 matchups between BYU and Utah only two have been decided by more than seven points, including two overtime games. In that time Utah has won seven games and BYU has won six.
- This game will be the 47th-straight time these two teams have faced each other in the month of November. Next year, Utah will travel to play BYU in Provo on September 17, only the second time in the 86-year history of the rivalry that the game will be played in that month.
- Bronco Mendenhall is 16-3 all-time in the month of November in his almost six full seasons as the head coach at BYU and is currently on a seven-game win streak during the month dating back to the Cougars' loss to Utah in 2008.

THE BYU-UTAH SERIES

The rivalry between BYU and Utah is one of the fiercest and, lately, one of closest matchups in the country. Only two games in the last 13 years have been decided by more than a touchdown, with the other two contests coming in BCS seasons for Utah. BYU has won three of the last four meetings including a 33-31 win in Salt Lake City, the Cougars' only win in Rice-Eccles since 2000.

LAST TIME: BYU 26, UTAH 23 (OT) (2009)

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 28, 2009) -- BYU senior quarterback Max Hall split two defenders, hitting senior tight end Andrew George up the middle in overtime as BYU defeated rival Utah, 26-23, in front of 64,301 fans Saturday on senior night at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

Wearing throwback jerseys for the first time in program history in honor of the 1984 Cougar squad that won the national championship 25 years ago, 19 seniors earned redemption from a loss to Utah last season, walking out with the stadium's 200th win

Down 20-6, Utah scored 17 unanswered points in the fourth quarter before kicking a field goal in the Utes' first possession in OT. After a five-yard run by Hall was nullified due to an illegal motion penalty, the senior quarterback slipped a pass right between two diving Utes. George hauled in the pass, turning to find himself with nothing but open field 25 yards for the game-winning score.

Junior running back Harvey Unga rammed through a 2-yard touchdown, his eleventh on the season. Unga rushed for 117 yards on 23 carries and one touchdown, surpassing the 1,000-yard mark on the year and becoming the first Cougar to ever do so for three straight seasons.

Mitch Payne capped the drive off with a score, sending a 37-yard kick through the uprights for the 13-6 lead. Payne previously hit a 28-varder in addition to becoming the MWC career-leader in PATs with two in the game, passing his brother Matt for the record.

The BYU defense held up Utah's offense, holding Utah to 1-of-7 on third-down conversions and just nine rushing yards on 12 carries in the first half. For the game, Utah converted just 4-of-18 third downs.

UTAH LAST TIME: SAN DIEGO STATE 40, UTAH 39

SAN DIEGO (AP) - Jordan Wynn threw for a career-high 362 yards and Greg Bird's blocked punt set up the go-ahead score for No. 25 Utah in a 38-34 win over San Diego State on Saturday night.

The Utes were trailing 34-31 in the fourth quarter when Bird blocked Brian Stahovic's punt at the 10-yard line. Christian Cox recovered and ran to the 3-yard line. Eddie Wide scored from the 1 three plays later to give Utah it's first lead of the game.

Utah (9-2, 6-1 Mountain West Conference) broke a two-game losing streak in which the Utes were outscored 75-10.

Ryan Lindley threw for a career-high 528 yards and four touchdowns, but San Diego State (7-4, 4-3) could not hang on for its second win over a Top 25 team this season.

The teams combined for 1,087 yards of offense in a game played for much of the night in a steady drizzle.

CLUTCH COUGARS

With a late defensive stop by the Cougar defense to preserved a 25-20 win versus Wyoming, BYU has won 14-straight games decided by seven points or less. Three of BYU's wins this season, including a 23-17 victory over Washington, a 24-21 win against San Diego State and a 25-20 win vs. Wyoming have contributed to the streak. The last time BYU lost a game decided by seven points or less was in 2006 in a seven-point, double-overtime loss at Boston College.

BYU VS. BCS AQS

With its win against Washington in this year's season opener, BYU has defeated a team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference five-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 14 of the past 15 years dating back to 1996.

DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 48-4 when leading at halftime and 48-1 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter. Mendenhall's teams have won 31-straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 78 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987, when it lost 29-27 in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

DIVIDE AND CONQUER

When BYU has passed for 300 yards and run for 200 yards, the Cougars are 39-0 since 1972 when LaVell Edwards took over as head coach and 5-0 under current head coach Bronco Mendenhall. BYU finished with 300 passing yards and 216 rushing yards against UNLV. It was the first 300-yard passing game for the Cougars this year and the fifth 200-yard rushing game this year for BYU, which now has six such games this season, the most 200-yard rushing games in a season since 2001.

TAKING IT THE OTHER WAY

BYU freshman linebacker Kyle Van Noy returned a fumble 44 yards for a touchdown after junior defensive back Corby Eason forced the ball loose from a Ram receiver. It was the first points by a Cougar defensive player this season and the first fumble recovery for a touchdown for BYU since Matt Bauman's 34-yard return last season in the Las Vegas Bowl.

MOST WINS IN MWC HISTORY

With its victory over New Mexico, BYU has a 64-25 record in MWC play since the inception of the league in 1999—guaranteeing BYU the most conference wins over that 12-year span. BYU's next opponent, Utah, follows with a 62-27 MWC record.

ALL BUT PERFECT

BYU finished the game at CSU going 12-of-13 (.923) on third-down conversions, the first time BYU has had a third-down conversion of over 80-percent since going 12-of-14 (.857) at Washington in 2008. On the one failed third-down attempt, BYU still converted the ensuing fourth-down. As part of the third-down proficiency, BYU did not punt the entire game, accomplishing the feat for the first time since playing at Tulane in 2009.

THE OFFENSE IS ALIVE

After holding New Mexico to seven points, BYU has held its last three opponents to 10 points or less the last three games, the longest such streak since 1984. The Cougars held Colorado State to 10 points and UNLV to seven points the previous two games, matching the streak 17 years ago when BYU held New Mexico, UTEP and San Diego State to zero, nine and three points, respectively.

After leading UNLV 38-0 at halftime, the Cougars took a 35-0 lead into the half at Colorado State. It was the first time BYU has scored at least five touchdowns in the first half in back-to-back games since the Cougars scored seven touchdowns against Tulane and five touchdowns against Nevada in the first two games of the 2001 season.

The Cougars' 38 points against UNLV are the most by BYU in a first half since BYU's 42 points against UCLA in the third game of 2008. BYU's 55-0 lead is the Cougars' largest since the same game against UCLA in a 59-0 win.

ON THE GROUND

With 258 yards rushing against New Mexico, BYU has had four-straight games with over 200 yards rushing and six such games this season—the most 200-yard rushing games since 2001 (also six) when BYU had Doak Walker winner Luke Staley. Five of BYU's six wins this year have been 200-yard rushing games.

FIVE COUGARS HONORED

Based on their performances in BYU's 49-10 win at Colorado State, three BYU players won MWC weekly awards, the second time this season a school has swept all three awards in one week. Senior wide receiver Luke Ashworth won Offensive Player of the Week, senior safety Andrew Rich was named Defensive Player of the Week and senior kicker Mitch Payne took the Special Teams Player of the Year honor. Ashworth is the first Cougar to be named Offensive POW since; it is his first such award. Rich, honored for the second time in his career, is the second Cougar this season to be named Defensive POW--BYU has taken the award the last two weeks. Payne, also awarded for the second time in his career, is the third Special Teams POW from BYU to be honored by the MWC.

In addition, Ashworth was named the College Sports Performance Wide Receiver of the Week, his first national award. Freshman quarterback Jake Heaps and sophomore punter Riley Stephenson were also each honored with CPF honorable mentions.

FAST START

BYU has scored at least 14 points in the first quarter in each of the last four games, the first time the Cougars have done so in four-straight games in program history. BYU has scored 14 in the first quarter six times this season overall, the most since 1983. BYU also scored 14 in the first quarter six times in 1981 and 1980 and did so a record seven times in 1977. BYU has outscored its opponents 101-44 in the first quarter on the year.

DON'T CROSS THE LINE

UNLV did not earn a first down until 12:07 left in the second quarter. In BYU's outing against Wyoming, the Cowboys did not gain a first down until just over four minutes remaining in the first quarter.

SAME STARTERS

In eleven games this season, BYU has used seven different starting lineups on defense. Numerous injuries have been a key factor in the constant shakeup, with 13 players getting the first starts of their careers and 20 different players starting at least one game this season.

TEAM CAPTAINS

BYU head football coach Bronco Mendenhall announced team captains for the 2010 season as well as several personnel notes entering the first week of the season.

Senior safety Andrew Rich and junior offensive tackle Matt Reynolds have been selected to serve as team captains. Both Rich and Reynolds have played in all 26 games the past two seasons and enter their third year as a starter for the Cougars.

Rich has started in 16 games and earned All-MWC Second Team honors in 2009. He is a 2010 Lott Trophy Award candidate. Reynolds has started all 26 games of his career and is a preseason All-American, Lombardi Trophy and Outland Trophy candidate in 2010. He was a Freshman All-American in 2008 and a CFN All-Sophomore selection in 2009 while earning first-team all-conference accolades.

BYU has also tabbed a special team captain for several games this year with holder Matt Marshall named captain against Washington while Riley Stephenson was a captain at Air Force.

BOWLING

BYU has won its last four games to improve to 6-5 overall and become bowl eligible for the sixth straight season. BYU has been bowl eligible every year since head coach Bronco Mendenhall took over a program that had suffered three consecutive losing seasons prior to his leadership. A sixth straight bowl would mark BYU's the second-longest bowl streak in program history behind a 17-year run from 1978-94. BYU has won three of its last four bowl outings.

PUTTING THE YOUNG IN BYU

BYU's young, injury-riddled team this year has had 23 different players without prior starting experience start a game this season. On defense, 13 different players have started for the first time while on offense nine players have made their first-ever starts (see page 25).

The Cougars have played 17 freshmen this season, seven of whom have started at least one game this year. Freshman quarterback Jake Heaps, running back Joshua Quezada and wide receiver Cody Hoffman have become regular starters on the offensive side of the ball while linebackers Kyle Van Noy and Zac Stout are making regular contributions on defense.

TURNING IT AROUND

After averaging 15.2 points over the first five games while starting they year with a 1-4 record, BYU has averaged 32.6 points over the last six games to go 5-1 — the lone setback being at unbeaten TCU. BYU has scored in each of the past 14 quarters of play spanning more than three games. During that 14-quarter span, the Cougars hold a dominating 153-34 advantage on the scoreboard. On defense, BYU allowed 28.8 points during its 1-4 start but has improved to allowing 16.0 points over the last six games.

NO RUNNING START

BYU's defense has been stout against the run of late and particularly setting the tone to open the game. In the last five games the Cougars have held their opponents to first quarter rushing totals of minus-10 (SDSU), 20 (TCU), minus-31 (Wyoming), zero (UNLV) and 8 (CSU) yards, respectively.



FLAG BEARER

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition—an alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the

team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Their signatures reflect their commitment to uphold the tradition, spirit and honor of the BYU football program and to be a flag bearer of the University.

BYU'S LAST OUTING



FORT COLLINS, Colo. (Nov. 13, 2010) — Senior receiver Luke Ashworth had a record-setting day to help BYU drum Colorado State 49-10 Saturday at Hughes Stadium in Fort Collins, Colo.

The senior from Provo, Utah, become the first player in the history of the Provo-based school to score four touchdowns in the first half of a game while equaling the team record for the most scoring

receptions in an entire game. His four touchdown grabs also tied a Mountain West Conference record and set a new Hughes Stadium mark.

Ashworth's four TD grabs were his only receptions of the game, finishing with a career-high 113 yards. On the other end of the touchdowns was freshman quarterback Jake Heaps, who went 15-of-20 for 242 yards and a career-high four touchdowns in three quarters of play.

The Cougars opened the scoring with their longest drive of the year, highlighted by their longest play of the season. Culminating a four-play, 89-yard drive, the Cougars successfully executed a flea-flicker with Ashworth on the receiving end of a 62-yard bomb. Heaps handed off to Di Luigi on the play, who returned the ball to the freshman quarterback to deliver the long scoring strike down the right sideline.

BYU's defense ignited the next three Cougar scores as Andrew Rich and Corby Eason forced CSU fumbles and Rich followed with his first interception of the season.

PAYNE, KARIYA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 4, 2010) - Senior kicker Mitch Payne and junior running back Bryan Kariya were named to the ESPN Academic All-District VIII team on Thursday.

Both athletes are first time Academic All-District honorees. With the selections, nine Cougars in the last three years have be named Academic All-District, with five players going on to earn Academic All-America.

Payne, a Business Management major currently working on his Master's of Public Administration, is the lone representative at kicker on the team. Payne is the BYU and Mountain West Conference record holder in career in PAT conversions and will likely finish his career with the most PAT attempts and career kicking points in MWC history. He is 9-for-12 on field goal attempts and 11-of-12 on PAT attempts this season.

Payne was also selected as a semifinalist for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy and as a candidate for the 2010 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards earlier this year.

Kariya, a Chinese major with a 3.87 GPA, was one of two running backs named to the squad. The junior is coming off a career-high 88-yard rushing performance against Wyoming and has four touchdowns on the year, including two against San Diego State. He has caught a pass in every game but one this year.

As first-team honorees, both players will be eligible to be named Academic All-American when the team is announced on Nov. 23

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,725-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. Beginning in 2010, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63.275 after seating was removed to allow for additional wheelchair access.

The attendance in BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sell-outs at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWD

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah last season is currently tenth with 64,301 fans attending the game.

HOME BOYS

A majority of the BYU two-deep includes athletes who grew up in hometowns just a few miles from Provo. Wide receiver Luke Ashworth and offensive linemen brothers Matt and Houston Reynolds even went to high school in Provo at Timpview High. Others from Utah County include tight end Mike Muehlmann from American Fork and fullback Zed Mendenhall from Alpine.

Other Utahns on the depth chart include left guard Braden Hansen from Sandy, right guard Jason Speredon from West Valley City, right tackle Braden Brown from Salt Lake City, quarterback James Lark from St. George and running back Bryan Kariya from Kaysville.

HE'S GOT YOUR BACK

BYU starting offensive lineman Matt Reynolds enters the year as a preseason All-American after being named to the All-MWC First Team and College Football News All-Sophomore Team First Team. A Lombardi and Outland Trophy candidate, the 6-foo-6, 322-pound junior has started every game for the Cougars in his career and was named one of two team captains coming into 2010.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh in at an average 314 pounds and average 6-feet-5. In a season full of injuries for the Cougars, all five linemen have started every game of the season.

THE JUICE IS LOOSE

True freshman running back Joshua Quezada averaged 7.1 yards per carry while rushing for a career-high 107 yards to help fuel BYU's strong ground game in a 40-7 win over New Mexico on Saturday. The La Habra, Calif., native had a long run of 26 yards and scored a touchdown on a 14-yard carry. He carried the ball 15 times for his game-high 107 yards while catching one pass for two yards. He was consistent in his effort, running for 52 yards in the first half and 55 in the second half, including his 14-yard touchdown run with 14:10 to go in the fourth quarter. Nearly half of his carries, seven of 15, resulted in a BYU first down. Quezada's long run of 26 yards set a new personal best (previous was 17) while his 107 rushing total topped his previous high of 66 yards.

ASHWORTH TIES MULTIPLE BYU RECORDS, EARNS WEEKLY AWARDS

Senior wide receiver Luke Ashworth had a record-setting day to help BYU defeat Colorado State. He set career highs with 113 receiving yards, four touchdowns and a long reception of 62 yards. He caught the Cougars' first four offensive touchdowns of 62, 7, 36 and 8 yards, respectively, all in the first half—becoming the first BYU player to ever score four touchdowns in the first half. The four first-half touchdowns tied a program record for most touchdowns scored in any half in BYU history (RB Dick Felt had four rushing touchdowns in the second half in 1952) and tied the BYU record for most TD receptions in a game (previously accomplished by Kirk Pendleton in 1983 vs. New Mexico and John VanDer-Wouden in 1976 vs. Colorado State). The four receiving touchdowns also tied an MWC record for most touchdowns in a game (Utah's Travis LaTendresse 4 TD catches vs. Georgia Tech in 2005 bowl game) and set a Hughes Stadium record, breaking the old record set in 1974. The four touchdown catches were Ashworth's only catches of the game. It was the first multi-touchdown game of the senior's career. For his efforts, Ashworth earned his first-ever MWC Offensive Player of the Week award and was named the College Football Performance Awards Wide Receiver of the Week.

HEAPS BREAKS OUT

Freshman quarterback Jake Heaps threw for a career-high 294 yards and two touchdowns on 19-of-31 passing in BYU's win over UNLV. The freshman also passed Ty Detmer and Matt Berry on the BYU freshman passing yards list, taking the top spot at 1,351 yards. Heaps also became the first freshman in BYU history to win three games as a starting freshman signal caller and tied the record for most starts at quarterback as a freshman with six (equaling Matt Berry). Heaps built on his game against the Rebels by throwing a career-best four touchdowns, including a career-long completion of 62 yards. The freshman went 15-of-20 for 242 yards on the day, leading BYU to a 49-10 win, the fourth win for the Cougars in five games.

WHO NEEDS MARIO?

Junior running back JJ Di Luigi has led BYU in rushing eight of the Cougars' ten games while also gaining the most receiving yards in three games. The junior currently leads the team in rushing yards, receiving yards and all-purpose yards and is second in scoring and total offense.

A LONG ROAD

Defensive lineman Vic So'oto has come a long way to his spot in the starting lineup after originally joining the team in 2005. So'oto came in to the program as a tight end, playing in 11 games. After redshirting in 2006, So'oto enjoyed a sophomore season in which he saw action in all 13 games at tight end, grabbing 12 receptions for 124 yards.

It was after So'oto's sophomore year that the BYU coaching staff asked So'oto to switch sides of the ball, converting the tight end to a linebacker. Unfortunately, So'oto suffered a season-ending injury in just the second game of the season at Washington. After receiving an extra year of eligibility, So'oto returned in 2009, this time as a defensive lineman, backing up MWC career sack leader Jan Jorgensen.

In 2010, So'oto has started every game and is fifth on the team in total tackles in addition to 10 tackles-for-loss, four sacks, eight quarterback hurries, one forced fumble and one interception.

OUICK IMPROVEMENT

Since BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall took over the defensive coordinator duties one month ago, the Cougar defense has seen marked improvements in both its opponents' per-game averages and its national statistical rankings in its last five games. Highlights include:

vs. SDSU: Held #46 rushing offense 113 yards below its average, a season-low 53 yards...held #23 total offense 178.5 yards below average to a season-low 273 yards...held #27 scoring offense 13.9 points below its average to a season-low 21 points...held #19 passing offense 63 yards below its average to 220 yards, second-lowest on the season. at TCU: Held #10 rushing offense 162.9 yards below its average, a season-low 108 yards...held #8 total offense 104.7 yards below its average to 381 yards, second-lowest on the season...held #8 scoring offense to 9.8 points below its average to 31.

vs. Wyoming: Held the Cowboys to 63 yards rushing, 110 yards passing and 173 total yards while earning 12.0 tackles-for-loss, 3.0 sacks, seven pass breakups, six quarterback hurries, a fumble forced, a fumble recovered and a safety. All but the rushing and passing marks tied or set new season highs for the Cougar defense.

vs. UNLV: Held the Rebels to 11 pass completions, 22 yards rushing, 122 yards passing and 144 total yards, all season lows for UNLV. BYU also posted season highs of 5 sacks and 2 interceptions and season lows of 7 points and 11 first downs allowed. Did not allow a score with the first team defense on the field.

at Colorado State: Held Rams to 83 yards net rushing. Forced four turnovers (two interceptions & two fumbles), including one fumble return for a touchdown. Did not allow a score with the first team defense on the field. Only allowed the Rams inside the red zone once.

RUSH TO THE DEFENSE

The Cougars held UNLV to a season-low 22 rushing yards, including zero in the first quarter, one in the third quarter, and minus-25 in the fourth quarter. The Rebels' 22 net rushing yards are the fewest by a BYU opponent since the Cougars held San Diego State to 20 net yards rushing last year.

RICH THE WRECK

Senior safety Andrew Rich led BYU in tackles and was responsible for two of BYU's our turnovers created to help BYU defeat Colorado State. He finished the day with a team-leading nine tackles, including three solo and a career-high six assisted, and assisted on a tackle for loss while adding a forced fumble and interception. Both of the turnovers he created set up BYU touchdowns. After BYU went up 7-0, Rich delivered a hit on CSU's next possession to force a fumble and give the Cougars the ball in CSU territory to set up the team's second touchdown. With BYU leading 21-0 after a defensive touchdown, Rich stopped the momentum CSU had created with the ensuing drive that had traveled deep into BYU territory by picking off a pass attempt, his first interception of the season, at the BYU 26-yard line. BYU's offense again turned the turnover into points on the next possession to turn the game strongly into BYU's favor.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung comes to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. An award given beginning this season is named in his honor and will be awarded to the best all-around player in college football. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

MWC POW

BYU has had three players named Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week this season, the most in the league this year. Punter Riley Stephenson took the award the first week of the season, while kick returner Cody Hoffman and kicker Mitch Payne have been honored late in the season.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 155 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9, 2006 when freshman McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards against Wyoming at Edwards Stadium. Fifty-three games have passed since then.

HERE COMES THE BOOM

MWC honorable mention honoree Riley Stephenson returns at punter for BYU after a successful freshman campaign. Stephenson is known for his ability to place punts near the goalline, putting eight kicks inside the 20 last season. The sophomore can also boom kicks when needed, totaling eight punts over 50 yards in 2009, including a career-high and BYU bowl game record 60-yard punt against Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl.

PAYNE EARNS MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

BYU senior kicker Mitch Payne converted all seven of his point-after attempts in BYU's 49-10 victory at Colorado State. His seven conversions equaled his season high, which he also accomplished the previous week against UNLV, and were just one shy of his career mark of eight PATs in a single game. The award is the second in Payne's career and the third MWC Special Teams Player of the Week award for BYU this season.

RECORD-SETTING SEASON

Senior kicker Mitch Payne set a new MWC record for most kicking points in a career last week against New Mexico. Payne passed his brother and former BYU kicker Matt for first all-time, now at 314 career points after kicking two field goals and four PATs against the Lobos.

The game before against UNLV, Payne set the BYU all-time record for most PAT attempts. He finished the day with 181 career PAT attempts as the Cougar kicker. He is 13-of-15 overall on field goals this year and 29-of-31 on PATs. He is also 20 points away from scoring the most points of any Cougar player in BYU history, a record currently held by kicker Owen Pochman (1997-00) with 333 points.

He also holds the MWC record for juniors for most PATs made in a game, converting eight against UNLV in 2009. With 59 PATs last season, Payne also became the BYU and Mountain West Conference career PATs made leader with 156, surpassing his brother Matt's record of 150 career PATs made.

CATCHING PASSES, CATCHING KICKS

Filling in an opening as a kickoff returner, redshirt freshman Cody Hoffman returned the first four kickoffs of his career against Wyoming, racking up a total of 104 yards while also fulfilling his duties at wide receiver. Hoffman is the first Cougar to pass the 100-yard kickoff return mark since Austin Collie totaled 134 yards against Utah in 2008. For his efforts, Hoffman was named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week, the first conference award of his career.

Hoffman followed up his newfound special teams excellence with a 50-yard kickoff return against UNLV, the longest for BYU this season and the longest kickoff return by a Cougar since Austin Collie's 70-yard return against Utah in 2008. He also caught his second touchdown pass of the season against the Rebels.

FALSLEV TAKES OFF

Freshman JD Falslev returned the first kickoff of his career 34 yards to the BYU 46-yard line, setting up the Cougars' first points of the game at Utah State. Falslev finished with three returns for 64 yards in his hometown of Logan. Since then, the freshman's has become BYU's primary punt and kick returner. Falslev leads the team with 11 punt returns for 93 yards and has returned five kickoffs a total of 117 yards. He also had his first-career rush attempt against Colorado State, going 15 yards.

These devotionals will be conducted prior to all road games as well as the Washington and San Diego State home games. They are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches, and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth.

"The firesides have been a way for us to make a very clear statement of what our priorities are, or should be," Mendenhall says. "Football is simply the vehicle we use to help others come to a knowledge of what really brings joy and happiness to our lives. Football is not the priority. Some people don't understand that. These firesides are a way for all of us to help consider our priorities through understanding the purpose of life."

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 51 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 16 different countries, including Argentina, Bulgaria, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, Costa Rica, Ghana, Guatemala, Japan, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Russia, South Africa and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of eight different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Japanese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish and Tagalog.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga, is one of 74 players (62 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 24 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, England, Germany, India, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, Mozambique, New Zealand, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 18 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, Nevada, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Washington.

Overall, 54 current members of the BYU football team speak a total of 17 different foreign languages and dialects, including Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

- * The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- * The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and John in the book of Acts).
- * More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- * Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- * Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- * Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, South Africa and Spain.
 - * Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- *A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- * In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- * Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions except for their transportation to and from their field of labor and are not paid for their services.
- * Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ

BRONCO MENDENHALL SIXTH SEASON

During his first five seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to five straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and consistent national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, the Cougars earned a 49-15 record in his first five years—the best record of any first-time head coach over the past five seasons and a mark topped by only 11 coaches overall. Mendenhall's .766 wining percentage entering the season ranked No. 4 among all active FBS head coaches with at least five years of experience. Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in three of the last four years while achieving a 43-9 record in that span, a ledger topped by only four other teams—Boise State, Florida, Texas and Ohio State. In doing so, the Cougars have achieved four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

While recording an 11-2 record and 7-1 league mark, Mendenhall's 2009 team went 3-1 against ranked opponents, incluing a 14-13 season-opening win over No. 3 Oklahoma and a 44-20 season finale Maaco Bowl Las Vegas victory over No. 16 Oregon State. BYU finished No. 12 in the final polls to earn its highest finish since 1996 and earn the distinction of being one of only six programs nationally to be ranked in both the final polls the past four seasons. At No. 14 in the final 2009 BCS standings, Mendenhall's Cougars are one of just seven programs to finish in the final BCS standings the past four year and the only program to do so from a non-automatic qualifying

two seasons, he coached the Cougars to back-to-back 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents.

In 2008, BYU posted a 10-2 regular season to achieve three straight 10-win seasons for only the third time in school history. In doing so, Mendenhall's teams became the first in Cougar history to go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons.

The Cougars have received five straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first five teams to a bowl game.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

In 2007, BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

In 2008, BYU earned a spot in the national polls each week of the season, including a ranking as high as No. 7. With just two regular-season blemishes on its resume with road losses at No. 6 Utah and No. 11 TCU, BYU earned a No. 16 ranking in the final BCS standings and an invitation to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl.

Off the field, BYU has had five Academic All-Amerian citations in the past two seasons. In 2008, only Penn State (4) placed more student-athletes on the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America First Team. Cougar starters David Oswald (offensive tackle), Matt Bauman (linebacker) and Kellen Fowler (safety) each earned the high honor as BYU had three first-teamers for the first time during the same season. In 2009, Scott Johnson earned first-team honors and Bauman was a second-team selection.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.
