COUGARS HOST UH WARRIORS

After spliting their two matches last weekend against Cal Baptist and Lewis, the No. 9 Cougars remain at home to host Mountain Pacific Sports Federation foe No. 11 Hawai'i on Thursday and Friday. BYU opens MPSF play against the Warriors, while Hawaii is coming off back-to-back losses to No. 3 Pepperdine last week.

SERIES INFORMATION

The Cougars have been consistently successful against the Warriors at home, winning five of the last six meetings in the Smith Fieldhouse, including four straight. BYU holds a 25-14 all-time advantage over Hawai'i, most recently winning both matches played at the Stan Sheriff Center in 2008.

Hawai'i won five fo the first seven matches played between the two teams. Since then, the Cougars have ruled the series. Since its victory on Feb. 1, 1997, BYU has posted a 19-6 record against the Warriors, including two separate streaks of five and six consecutive wins.

MATCH COVERAGE

Both matches will be televised live on BYU-TV with Jarom Jordan calling play-by-play and Steve Vail offering analysis.

Returning Team

The Cougars return two starters for 2009 in junior outside hitter Andrew Stewart and junior libero Joel Silva. With the loss of two All-Americans and five contributing seniors in 2008, this year's team has six newcomers and no seniors. The Cougars also have two recently returned missionaries--Futi Tavana and Quentin Smith.

COACHES OR PLAYERS?

BYU's entire coaching staff is coaching at its alma mater. Head coach Shawn Patchell starred for the Cougars in his playing days (1990-93) while assistant coach Rob Neilson earned All-MPSF honors for BYU in 2006.

20-WIN SEASONS

After finishing the 2006 season with an 18-9 record, BYU was held without 20 wins for the first time since the 2000 season. With 2008's 25-5 finish, the Cougars have recorded 10 total 20-win seasons. The first BYU team to record 20 wins was the 1994 team. The 1994 team finished its season with a 21-6 record and advanced to the final of the MPSF Tournament, losing to Stanford in four games.

BYU IN THE MPSF TOURNAMENT

Since 1993, BYU has qualified for the MPSF postseason tournament in 13 of 14 seasons including 12 consecutive trips. The Cougars all-time record in the MPSF tournament is 19-12. BYU has won the MPSF tournament three times and holds an 11-5 record in the first round, 5-5 record in the semifinals and 3-2 record in tournament finals. The Cougars won consecutive MPSF tournament championships in 2003 and 2004.

BYU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT



The Cougars have made four NCAA tournament appearances in the program's history. Impressively, BYU has brought home the hardware in three of its four NCAA tournament appearances. The Cougars boast a 7-1 overall record in NCAA tournament play and a perfect 4-0 record in national semifinal matches. The Cougars only loss in the NCAA tournament was

in 2003 when they lost to Lewis in a five-game thriller. BYU has earned automatic bids to the Final Four by winning the MPSF tournament three times: 1999, 2003 and 2004.

This year the Smith Fieldhouse will serve as host to the 2009 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championships on May 7-9, 2009.

ALL-AMERICANS

With Russell Holmes (first team) and Ivan Perez (second team) being named AVCA All-Americans last year, it marked the 15th consecutive season the Cougars have had an All-American. Since 1993, 20 different players have earned 38 citations, 14 of which are first-team honors and 13 of which are second-team honors.

PRESERSON EXHIBITION

BYU finished its exhibition schedule having won nine of 12 matches. The Cougars played against USC and Hawaii at the Warrior Fall Tournament in Honolulu, going 5-3 and finishing with the best record in the tournament.

The Cougars then returned home to host the BYU Tournament, going undefeated against teams from Utah Valley University, UC Irvine and Southern Alberta Institute of Technology. Redshirt freshman Futi Tavana was named tournament MVP and joined junior Kent Tuttle on the all-tournament team.

2008 RECAP

Two All-America honorees, a 12-match win streak to open the season, and a chance at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Tournament Championship were only three of the highlights in the successful 2008 BYU men's volleyball campaign.

The Cougars finished the season with a record of 25-5 overall and 20-5 against top-15 opponents. BYU also went 18-4 in MPSF regular-season action, earning the team a No. 2 seed in the conference tournament.

BYU was up two sets to none against the No. 5 seed Pepperdine in the MPSF Tournament championship match and had a swing for the win. Despite the large lead, the Cougars were unable put the match away. The Waves won the next three sets, and BYU's remarkable season came to an unexpected close. Seniors Ivan Perez and Jonathan Charette were named to the All-Tournament team and each had 20 kills in the match.

The CBS College Sporst Network/AVCA Division I-II Men's Coaches Poll featured BYU at the No. 1 spot for the first 10 full weeks of the season. The Cougars spent only one week out of the top three in the nation before finishing the year at No. 4.

Much of the team's success was attributed to the senior-heavy roster and amount of experience among the players.

Among those seniors were three-time AVCA Division I-II Men's Volleyball All-Americans Russell Holmes and Perez. Holmes was recognized with First Team honors and Perez was named to the Second Team in 2008. Holmes and Perez were also named First Team All-MPSF and were joined by Sorensen as an Honorable Mention.

As a team, the 2008 BYU squad left its mark on the record books. It set a new school record with 1,178 digs as a team (previous record -- 994), finished third in school history in total blocks (342.5), tied for fourth in school history in service aces (115), and finished fifth in the record books in assists (1,631) (all records as of 2001 when rally scoring began).

Individually, there were also two Cougars who set school records. Perez set a school record with 16 digs in three sets against Stanford, Feb. 23 (rally scoring rules). His 236 digs on the season beat the school's previous all-time rally-scoring record, yet is second only to the 249 digs his teammate Joel Silva racked up in 2008 as well. Perez is also atop BYU's all-time digs list with 672 and total games played list with 391.

HOME COURT ROVANTAGE

BYU finished its 2008 season with a 14-1(.933) record at the Smith Fieldhouse, facing teams like No. 1 NAIA team Cal Baptist, No. 5 Pepperdine, No. 6 Cal State Northridge and No. 8 UC Irvine. The record was the fourth best mark in Cougar history behind the 1998 (11-0, 1.000), 2004 (16-1, .941) and 1999 (15-1, .938) seasons.

HEAD COACH SHAWN PATCHELL



With a career record of 48-11, Shawn Patchell is in his third year as head coach and seventh year overall as a member of BYU's staff. Patchell came to BYU from Laguna Beach High School where he was head coach for both the boys and girls volleyball teams.

In addition to his BYU coaching responsibilities, Patchell was selected to be the 2008-09 Junior National Team Head Coach. The Junior National Team competed in El Salvador last summer where they took the bronze medal and qualified for the World Championships held in India

in 2009. Patchell also coached the Youth National Team at the FIVB World Championships in Mexico in 2007, the first US team to qualify and participate in the Youth World Championships. In 2006 Patchell assisted the Youth National Team to a win over Cuba and a silver medal at the Dominican Republic NORCECA tourny which qualified team USA for the World Championships.

During the summer of 2005, Patchell coached the US World University Games team.

A member of BYUs first NCAA mens volleyball team, Patchell was a starter from 199093 and recorded a .398 career hitting percentage. In 1992, Patchells junior year, he led the nation in hitting percentage at .488 and was honored as AllAcademic Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. He was ranked fourth and 10th nationally in hitting and blocking his senior year. Patchell played professionally in Spain for the Euro Cup qualifier and No. 1ranked Gran Canaria Team in the Canary Islands and also represented the US in the Federation International Volleyball Association Sand Volleyball Circuit in Europe.

Patchell earned his BA in English with a minor in business management from BYU in 1993 and a masters degree in English Literature from the University of California at Irvine in 2000. He is a parttime member of the BYU English Department and Business School where he teaches literature and composition classes. Shawn and his wife Davis enjoy being outdoors with their four children: Jordan (12), Sage (10) Soren (6) and Kai (1).

Rob Neilson enters his third season as an assistant coach at BYU. Neilson has been coaching volleyball at summer camps since 2000. He played for and coached under former BYU coaches Carl McGown and Tom Peterson.

Neilson is no stranger to BYU volleyball. He was the starting setter for two years with the Cougars in 2005 and 2006. As a junior in 2005, Neilson earned All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Honorable Mention status while also being named Academic All-MPSF. He started every match in his junior and senior year. Neilson was

named the USA Today/AVCA National Player of the Week in his junior season from his play against Hawaii.

As a senior, Neilson earned All-MPSF Honorable Mention and Academic All-MPSF honors for his second consecutive season. All totaled, Neilson played in 314 career games for BYU which is seventh in BYU history. He was a member of BYU s 2004 National Championship team.

Neilson, who was raised in Pacific Palisades, Calif., served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Croatia. He earned a BS degree in neuroscience from BYU in 2006. Neilson married Sarah Wheatly in September 2006.

Volunteer Assistant Coach Rodrigo Gomes



Rodrigo Gomes is a native of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil who played one year on the BYU squad. He began his volleyball training on the beaches of Rio de Janeiro with his father as his coach. He went on to lead his Impacto High School team to a Rio de Janeiro Championship and two second place finishes in the national tournament. He also played two years of club volleyball for Tisuca Tenis Club, Fluminese under Gilberto Girino before coming to Provo.

As a freshman in 2006, Gomes played in 22 matches

and started one. He recorded 44 kills and eight aces on the year to go along with his 32 digs and five blocks at the outside hitter position. He recorded a career-high 13 kills, two aces and four digs against Ohio State in arguably his best performance of the year.

He is currently in his second year as a volunteer assistant coach with the team.

LAST YEAR AGAINST HAWAII April 3, 2008

One match closer to hosting the first round of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation playoffs and possibly throughout, the No. 3 BYU men's volleyball team (20-4, 15-4) beat No. 13 Hawaii (10-14, 7-12) in the first of two matches at the Stan Sheriff Center in four sets (30-26, 30-28, 24-30, 30-27).

The Cougars as a team hit .247 on the night and were led by senior Ivan Perez' 15 kills. Trent Sorenson, Russell Holmes, and Jonathan Charette each had 10 kills apiece on the night as well as setter Reed Chilton spread the wealth evenly to his attackers. The Warriors, on the other hand, were led by Joshua Walker's match leading 29 kills and had no other hitters in double figures.

"Our middles were very good," BYU head coach Shawn Patchell said. "We were able to get the ball to them well, and they only had two erros apiece. Andrew Stewart also came off the bench and hit well. Joel Silva also had a career-high 21 digs in a four game match to lead us defensively. Those guys really picked us up tonight."

BYU led early and throughout the first set and came from behind to win the second set. Hawaii controlled the third set, and the fourth was tight to the wire. The score was tied at 24-24 in the fourth, but Chilton set four different Cougars for five of the last six points as BYU earned the win.

April 4, 2008

With a first-round home match in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation playoffs set in stone, the No. 3 BYU men's volleyball (21-4, 16-4) team earned its 21st victory of the season in a three-set sweep (31-29, 30-19, 30-24) over No. 13 Hawaii (10-15, 7-13) in Honolulu.

Senior Jonathan Charette led all attackers with 11 kills on the night, but fellow-senior Trent Sorensen racked up 10 kills hitting .562 with a service ace, two digs, and six blocks. After allowing Hawaii standout Joshua Walker to knock down 29 kills in the match the night before, BYU held him to 10 kills on 42 swings with 10 errors and a .000 attack percentage in the sweep. In total, the Cougars held the Warriors to a .102 attack percentage on the night, the lowest the blue and white have allowed all season.

"Joel Silva had a nice weekend," BYU head coach Shawn Patchell said when asked about the matches' highlights. "He had 36 digs on the weekend, and 15 in a three set match is great. Our middles were great, both hitting high percentages and keeping the ball in play. Yamil Perez also came in off the bench and brought some great energy for us tonight as well."

The first set saw 11 ties and four lead changes between the Warriors and Cougars. BYU was down late in the set, but came from behind to take the set 31-29. The second set was all BYU as the Cougars held Hawaii to a .043 attack percentage in the set and won 30-19. It was more of the same in the deciding set. BYU hit .344 in the third set and won 30-24.
