FIRST OF THREE WEEKENDS IN CALIFORNIA

BYU's eighth-ranked men's volleyball team (7-6, 5-3 MPSF) travels to Stockton, Calif. this week for two matches against Pacific (2-14, 0-11 MPSF) on Friday and Saturday. The Cougars and Tigers met earlier this season on Jan. 10 at the UC Santa Barbara Elephant Bar Tournament. BYU defeated Pacific 3-0 in that meeting.

The Cougars are coming off back-to-back sweeps as they hosted No. 10 UC San Diego last weekend. This trip to California marks the first of three consecutive weekends BYU will spend in the Golden State before returning home to play Long Beach State on March 20.

The Tigers of the University of the Pacific recently suffered losses to No. 4 Cal State Northridge and No. 13 UC Santa Barbara, both sweeps. The Tiger, currently on a 10-match losing streak, have recorded two wins on the season, both against UC Santa Cruz.

SERIES INFORMATION

BYU holds a 21-5 lead in the series between these two teams dating back to Feb. 6, 1993. Despite holding an undefeated 13-0 record against the Tigers in Provo, the Cougars have only a slight 7-5 series advantage in Stockton. BYU has won the last seven meetings and 11 of the last 12. Three of the five wins Pacific has over BYU have come in five sets, while 14 of the Cougars' wins have been sweeps. Most recently, BYU defeated Pacific 3-0 in its final match of the 45th Annual UC Santa Barbara/Elephant Bar Collegiate Invitational.

COMING OFF...BACK-TO-BACK SWEEPS OVER UC SAN DIEGO

BYU's ninth-ranked men's volleyball team recorded its second sweep in as many nights with a 3-0 win over No. 10 UC San Diego on Feb. 21 (30-28, 30-18, 30-17). With the win the Cougars improved to 7-6 on the season and 5-3 in MPSF play.

Junior outside hitter Andrew Stewart recorded a match-high 12 kills on the night, marking his 11th consecutive night with double-digit kills this season. Redshirt freshman Futi Tavana added 10 kills and seven blocks. Also at middle blocker, freshman Russell Lavaja sparked in the second and third games, contributing nine kills and five blocks.

20-WIN SEASONS

After finishing the 2006 season with an 18-9 record, BYU was held without 20 wins for the first time since the 2000 season. With 2008's 25-5 finish, the Cougars have recorded 10 total 20-win seasons. The first BYU team to record 20 wins was the 1994 team. The 1994 team finished its season with a 21-6 record and advanced to the final of the MPSF Tournament, losing to Stanford in four games.

BYU IN THE MPSF TOURNAMENT

Since 1993, BYU has qualified for the MPSF postseason tournament in 13 of 14 seasons including 12 consecutive trips. The Cougars all-time record in the MPSF tournament is 19-12. BYU has won the MPSF tournament three times and holds an 11-5 record in the first round, 5-5 record in the semifinals and 3-2 record in tournament finals. The Cougars won consecutive MPSF tournament championships in 2003 and 2004.

BYU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Cougars have made four NCAA tournament appearances in the program's history. Impressively, BYU has brought home the hardware in three of its four NCAA tournament appearances. The Cougars boast a 7-1 overall record in NCAA tournament play and a perfect 4-0 record in national semifinal matches. The Cougars only loss in the NCAA tournament was in 2003 when they lost to Lewis in a five-game thriller. BYU has earned automatic bids to the Final Four by winning the MPSF tournament three times: 1999, 2003 and 2004.

This year the Smith Fieldhouse will serve as host to the 2009 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championships on May 7-9, 2009.

ALL-AMERICANS

With Russell Holmes (first team) and Ivan Perez (second team) being named AVCA All-Americans last year, it marked the 15th consecutive season the Cougars have had an All-American. Since 1993, 20 different players have earned 38 citations, 14 of which are first-team honors and 13 of which are second-team honors.

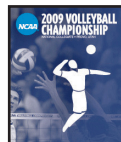
RETURNING TEAM

The Cougars return two starters for 2009 in junior outside hitter Andrew Stewart and junior libero Joel Silva. With the loss of two All-Americans and five contributing seniors in 2008, this year's team has six newcomers and no seniors. The Cougars also have two recently returned missionaries--Futi Tavana and Quentin Smith.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

BYU finished its 2008 season with a 14-1(.933) record at the Smith Fieldhouse, facing teams like No. 1 NAIA team Cal Baptist, No. 5 Pepperdine, No. 6 Cal State Northridge and No. 8 UC Irvine. The record was the fourth best mark in Cougar history behind the 1998 (11-0, 1.000), 2004 (16-1, .941) and 1999 (15-1, .938) seasons.

BYU HOSTS 2009 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP



BYU will host the 2009 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championship in the Smith Fieldhouse May 7-9, 2009. Both semifinal matches will be played on Thursday, May 7, with the national championship match held on Saturday, May 9. All session tickets are available at the Marriott Center Ticket Office. The ticket office may be reached at (801) 422-BYU1 or toll-free at (800) 322-BYU1. Tickets may also be purchased at byutickets.com.

BYU will host its first national championship event since hosting the 1989 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championship. Three other outdoor track championships were held at BYU in 1967, 1975 and 1982. BYU also hosted the NCAA Wrestling Championship in 1969.

PRESEASON EXHIBITION

BYU finished its exhibition schedule having won nine of 12 matches. The Cougars played against USC and Hawaii at the Warrior Fall Tournament in Honolulu, going 5-3 and finishing with the best record in the tournament.

The Cougars then returned home to host the BYU Tournament, going undefeated against teams from Utah Valley University, UC Irvine and Southern Alberta Institute of Technology. Redshirt freshman Futi Tavana was named tournament MVP and joined junior Kent Tuttle on the all-tournament team.

2008 RECAP

Two All-America honorees, a 12-match win streak to open the season, and a chance at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Tournament Championship were only three of the highlights in the successful 2008 BYU men's volleyball campaign.

The Cougars finished the season with a record of 25-5 overall and 20-5 against top-15 opponents. BYU also went 18-4 in MPSF regular-season action, earning the team a No. 2 seed in the conference tournament.

BYU was up two sets to none against the No. 5 seed Pepperdine in the MPSF Tournament championship match and had a swing for the win. Despite the large lead, the Cougars were unable put the match away. The Waves won the next three sets, and BYU's remarkable season came to an unexpected close. Seniors Ivan Perez and Jonathan Charette were named to the All-Tournament team and each had 20 kills in the match.

The CBS College Sports Network/AVCA Division I-II Men's Coaches Poll featured BYU at the No. 1 spot for the first 10 full weeks of the season. The Cougars spent only one week out of the top three in the nation before finishing the year at No. 4.

Much of the team's success was attributed to the senior-heavy roster and amount of experience among the players.

Among those seniors were three-time AVCA Division I-II Men's Volleyball All-Americans Russell Holmes and Perez. Holmes was recognized with First Team honors and Perez was named to the Second Team in 2008. Holmes and Perez were also named First Team All-MPSF and were joined by Sorensen as an Honorable Mention.

As a team, the 2008 BYU squad left its mark on the record books. It set a new school record with 1,178 digs as a team (previous record -- 994), finished third in school history in total blocks (342.5), tied for fourth in school history in service aces (115), and finished fifth in the record books in assists (1,631) (all records as of 2001 when rally scoring began).

Individually, there were also two Cougars who set school records. Perez set a school record with 16 digs in three sets against Stanford, Feb. 23 (rally scoring rules). His 236 digs on the season beat the school's previous all-time rally-scoring record, yet is second only to the 249 digs his teammate Joel Silva racked up in 2008 as well. Perez is also atop BYU's all-time digs list with 672 and total games played list with 391.

COACHES OR PLAYERS?

BYU's entire coaching staff is coaching at its alma mater. Head coach Shawn Patchell starred for the Cougars in his playing days (1990-93) while assistant coach Rob Neilson earned All-MPSF honors for BYU in 2006.

HEAD COACH SHAWN PATCHELL



With a career record of 48-11, Shawn Patchell is in his third year as head coach and seventh year overall as a member of BYU's staff. Patchell came to BYU from Laguna Beach High School where he was head coach for both the boys and girls volleyball teams.

In addition to his BYU coaching responsibilities, Patchell was selected to be the 2008-09 Junior National Team Head Coach. The Junior National Team competed in El Salvador last summer where they took the bronze medal and qualified for the World Championships held in India in 2009. Patchell also coached the Youth National Team at the FIVB World Championships in Mexico in 2007, the first US team to qualify and participate in the Youth World Championships. In 2006 Patchell assisted the Youth National Team to a win over Cuba and a silver medal at the Dominican Republic NORCECA tourny which qualified team USA for the World Championships.

During the summer of 2005, Patchell coached the US World University Games team.

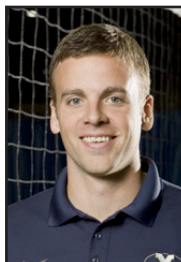
A member of BYUs first NCAA mens volleyball team, Patchell was a starter from 1990-93 and recorded a .398 career hitting percentage. In 1992, Patchells junior year, he led the nation in hitting percentage at .488 and was honored as AllAcademic Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. He was ranked fourth and 10th nationally in hitting and blocking his senior year. Patchell played professionally in Spain for the Euro Cup qualifier and No. 1 ranked Gran Canaria Team in the Canary Islands and also represented the US in the Federation International Volleyball Association Sand Volleyball Circuit in Europe.

Patchell earned his BA in English with a minor in business management from BYU in 1993 and a masters degree in English Literature from the University of California at Irvine in 2000. He is a parttime member of the BYU English Department and Business School where he teaches literature and composition classes. Shawn and his wife Davis enjoy being outdoors with their four children: Jordan (12), Sage (10) Soren (6) and Kai (1).

ASSISTANT COACH ROB NEILSON



Rob Neilson enters his third season as an assistant coach at BYU. Neilson has been coaching volleyball at summer camps since 2000. He played for and coached under former BYU coaches Carl McGown and Tom Peterson.

Neilson is no stranger to BYU volleyball. He was the starting setter for two years with the Cougars in 2005 and 2006. As a junior in 2005, Neilson earned All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Honorable Mention status while also being named Academic All-MPSF. He started every match in his junior and senior year. LAST TIME AGAINST PACIFIC

Jan. 10, 2009

BYU's No. 9-ranked men's volleyball team swept Pacific 30-28, 30-18, 30-26 in its final match of the 45th Annual UC Santa Barbara/Elephant Bar Collegiate Invitational. With the win the Cougars secured an eighth-place finish in the tournament and improved to 1-2 on the season.

"It was good to play and compete and to win our last match in this tournament," said BYU head coach Shawn Patchell. "We definitely had some rust after the five week break. This tournament was important to help us to get back to where we were a month ago."

Junior outside hitter Andrew Stewart led the Cougars with 13 kills and six blocks, while Mat Taylor added 10 kills of his own. Kent Tuttle recorded a match-high five digs.

The Cougars pulled out a close 30-28 win in the first set after a kill by Tuttle. Pacific came back and scored the first point of the second set, before BYU went on a 7-1 run. Up 27-18, the Cougars scored three consecutive points, including game point on a service ace.

Anxious to win its first match of the season, BYU came out strong in the final set. Kills by Stewart and Taylor gave the Cougars a 12-7 advantage, but the Tigers managed to score five-straight points to come within one. The tandem of Stewart and Taylor continued to dominate offensively, as a kill by Taylor for match point clinched BYU's first win of the season.

"We have to play with less unforced errors, we had too many this weekend," said Patchell. "This experience will help us play better when it counts and we start playing MPSF teams."

LAST YEAR AGAINST PACIFIC

Feb. 29, 2008

A week after losing its first match of the season, the BYU men's volleyball team rebounded, dropping Pacific in three straight games, 30-21, 30-23, 31-29. With the victory, the third-ranked Cougars improve to 13-1 on the season, including a record of 8-1 in MPSF play.

Senior Ivan Perez led the Cougars with 14 kills on the night and added five blocks. Senior Russell Holmes added nine kills, but paced the BYU defense with a match-high seven blocks. Trent Sorensen tallied six blocks and Jonathan Charette was credited with five blocks. All totaled, the Cougars out-blocked the Tigers 15.5 to 4.

In the first game of the match, BYU jumped out to a 14-11 lead on a Perez Kill, then went on a 4-1 run to take an 18-12 advantage. After UOP cut the lead to 20-15, the Cougars went on a five-point run behind a pair of blocks from Holmes. Charette iced the game on back-to-back kills to give BYU a 30-21 victory. Perez fueled the Cougars in game one, recording four kills and three blocks.

In the second game of the match, the Tigers held a 16-12 lead before the Cougars racked up six straight points to take an 18-16 lead. Pacific's Jeff Hendershot ended the BYU run with a kill, but it was short lived as the Cougars went on another scoring streak, going on a 6-1 run to take a 24-18 lead. Coming off the bench, freshman Kent Tuttle scored two of the Cougars' final three point to complete the 30-23, come-from-behind victory.

The two teams battled through a 27-27 tie before the Cougars got the break they were looking for. A UOP attack error gave BYU a 28-27 lead and the advantage; however, a Brian Congelliery service error equaled the score at 28-28 and gave the advantage back to Pacific. The Tigers then took the lead after Perez missed a hard shot. Looking to take game three, the Tigers committed a seventh service error of the night, notching the score at 29-29. On the next play Sorensen and Charette dominated the net to give BYU a one-point advantage. Charette sealed the victory with block on the final play.

March 1, 2008

The No. 3 men's volleyball team (14-1, 9-1) completed a weekend sweep against Pacific (1-16, 1-13) in a three-set win (30-24, 30-28, 30-20), propelling the Cougars back into the top spot in the talented Mountain Pacific Sports Federation.

Patchell's squad was led offensively by senior outside hitter Ivan Perez with 15 kills and a .500 hitting percentage. Senior opposite Jonathan Charette was not far behind with 12 kills on 23 swings. The setting tandem of senior Brian Congelliery and sophomore Yamil Perez also set the team to a combined .390 attack percentage. Defensively, the front line racked up eight total team blocks and held Pacific to a .153 attack percentage as a team.

Midway through the first set Pacific had the upper hand, up 14-12. BYU gained the advantage at 17-16 on a kill from Ivan Perez, though, and did not relinquish that advantage again. Ivan Perez led the Cougars with six kills on seven swings, and senior middle blocker Russell Holmes had two block assists. Senior middle blocker Trent Sorensen ended the set with a service ace for a first-set win at 30-24.

The second set was a tighter contest than the first. Neither team led by more than two points at any given time. Perez had another six kills and Holmes another two blocks. Charette chipped in his own five kills in the game and BYU won the set 30-28 on Ivan Perez' 12th kill of the match.

The third set was all Cougars. The team hit .611 collectively in the set with three total team blocks compared to the Tigers' .029 attack percentage and zero total team blocks. Congelliery tallied 13 assists in the set to seven different Cougars, and BYU took the deciding set 30-20.
