TRIP TO PEPPERDINE ENDS REGULAR SEASON

After splitting a pair of matches at then-No. 5 Stanford, the No. 6 BYU men's volleyball team (16-11, 12-8 MPSF) goes to No. 2 Pepperdine (19-3, 17-3 MPSF) for two matches on Thursday and Friday nights. The visit marks the final two matches of the Cougars' regular season.

The Cougars finished 1-1 against the the Cardinal last weekend, defeating it 3-2 on Friday before suffering a sweep on Saturday. With the loss Stanford now stands alone at No. 4 in the MPSF standings, while BYU is tied with USC at No. 5.

Pepperdine enters the weekend coming off a 3-0 loss at then-No. 2 UC Irvine, snapping a 10-match win streak.

SERIES INFORMATION

The Waves lead the series against BYU, 22-15 and 14-5 in Malibu. Pepperdine won the first six matches in the series, dating back to 1990, before the Cougars picked up their first win in 1993. Five of the last nine meetings between these two teams have resulted in sweeps. The Cougars swept the regular-season series played last year in Provo, before falling to the Waves in five sets in the MPSF championship match.

COMING OFF...WEEKEND SPLIT WITH STANFORD

BYU notched a five-set win (26-30, 33-31, 30-24, 26-30, 15-11) over the Cardinal Friday night, breaking the Stanford's previous five-match win streak. The win also spoiled the Cardinal's eight-match win streak against MPSF opponents as well as its 10-match undefeated record at Maples Pavilion, dating back to 2007. Team captain Andrew Stewart led the Cougars with 16 kills and 13 digs, marking his first double-double of the 2009 season and second of his career. Futi Taviana and Mat Taylor each contributed 13 kills apiece, with Russell Lavaja recording 10 blocks, both match- and career-highs. Taviana also recorded eight blocks, including a career-high three block solos.

Just one night later, BYU suffered a 3-0 sweep (30-24, 30-19, 30-19) courtesy of Stanford. With the loss the Cardinal now stands alone as the No. 4 team in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation standings with only one week in the regular season remaining. Middle blocker Futi Taviana led BYU with 15 kills, tying his previous career-high. The redshirt freshman was the lone Cougar with double-digit kills. As a team BYU was out-hit by only one kill (45-44) but the difference-maker was attack percentage, with Stanford leading .386 to .138.

20-WIN SEASONS

After finishing the 2006 season with an 18-9 record, BYU was held without 20 wins for the first time since the 2000 season. With 2008's 25-5 finish, the Cougars have recorded 10 total 20-win seasons. The first BYU team to record 20 wins was the 1994 team. The 1994 team finished its season with a 21-6 record and advanced to the final of the MPSF Tournament, losing to Stanford in four games.

BYU IN THE MPSF TOURNAMENT

Since 1993, BYU has qualified for the MPSF postseason tournament in 13 of 14 seasons including 12 consecutive trips. The Cougars all-time record in the MPSF tournament is 19-12. BYU has won the MPSF tournament three times and holds an 11-5 record in the first round, 5-5 record in the semifinals and 3-2 record in tournament finals. The Cougars won consecutive MPSF tournament championships in 2003 and 2004.

BYU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Cougars have made four NCAA tournament appearances in the program's history. Impressively, BYU has brought home the hardware in three of its four NCAA tournament appearances. The Cougars boast a 7-1 overall record in NCAA tournament play and a perfect 4-0 record in national semifinal matches. The Cougars only loss in the NCAA tournament was

in 2003 when they lost to Lewis in a five-game thriller. BYU has earned automatic bids to the Final Four by winning the MPSF tournament three times: 1999, 2003 and 2004.

This year the Smith Fieldhouse will serve as host to the 2009 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championships on May 7-9, 2009.

ALL-AMERICANS

With Russell Holmes (first team) and Ivan Perez (second team) being named AVCA All-Americans last year, it marked the 15th consecutive season the Cougars have had an All-American. Since 1993, 20 different players have earned 38 citations, 14 of which are first-team honors and 13 of which are second-team honors.

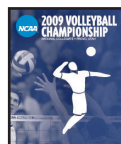
RETURNING TEAM

The Cougars return two starters for 2009 in junior outside hitter Andrew Stewart and junior libero Joel Silva. With the loss of two All-Americans and five contributing seniors in 2008, this year's team has six newcomers and no seniors. The Cougars also have two recently returned missionaries--Futi Tavana and Quentin Smith.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

BYU finished its 2008 season with a 14-1(.933) record at the Smith Fieldhouse, facing teams like No. 1 NAIA team Cal Baptist, No. 5 Pepperdine, No. 6 Cal State Northridge and No. 8 UC Irvine. The record was the fourth best mark in Cougar history behind the 1998 (11-0, 1.000), 2004 (16-1, .941) and 1999 (15-1, .938) seasons.

BYU HOSTS 2009 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP



BYU will host the 2009 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championship in the Smith Fieldhouse May 7-9, 2009. Both semifinal matches will be played on Thursday, May 7, with the national championship match held on Saturday, May 9. All session tickets are available at the Marriott Center Ticket Office. The ticket office may be reached at (801) 422-BYU1 or toll-free at (800) 322-BYU1. Tickets may also be purchased at byutickets.com.

BYU will host its first national championship event since hosting the 1989 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championship. Three other outdoor track championships were held at BYU in 1967, 1975 and 1982. BYU also hosted the NCAA Wrestling Championship in 1969.

PRESEASON EXHIBITION

BYU finished its exhibition schedule having won nine of 12 matches. The Cougars played against USC and Hawaii at the Warrior Fall Tournament in Honolulu, going 5-3 and finishing with the best record in the tournament.

The Cougars then returned home to host the BYU Tournament, going undefeated against teams from Utah Valley University, UC Irvine and Southern Alberta Institute of Technology. Redshirt freshman Futi Tavana was named tournament MVP and joined junior Kent Tuttle on the all-tournament team.

2008 RECAP

Two All-America honorees, a 12-match win streak to open the season, and a chance at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Tournament Championship were only three of the highlights in the successful 2008 BYU men's volleyball campaign.

The Cougars finished the season with a record of 25-5 overall and 20-5 against top-15 opponents. BYU also went 18-4 in MPSF regular-season action, earning the team a No. 2 seed in the conference tournament.

BYU was up two sets to none against the No. 5 seed Pepperdine in the MPSF Tournament championship match and had a swing for the win. Despite the large lead, the Cougars were unable put the match away. The Waves won the next three sets, and BYU's remarkable season came to an unexpected close. Seniors Ivan Perez and Jonathan Charette were named to the All-Tournament team and each had 20 kills in the match.

The CBS College Sports Network/AVCA Division I-II Men's Coaches Poll featured BYU at the No. 1 spot for the first 10 full weeks of the season. The Cougars spent only one week out of the top three in the nation before finishing the year at No. 4.

Much of the team's success was attributed to the senior-heavy roster and amount of experience among the players.

Among those seniors were three-time AVCA Division I-II Men's Volleyball All-Americans Russell Holmes and Perez. Holmes was recognized with First Team honors and Perez was named to the Second Team in 2008. Holmes and Perez were also named First Team All-MPSF and were joined by Sorensen as an Honorable Mention.

As a team, the 2008 BYU squad left its mark on the record books. It set a new school record with 1,178 digs as a team (previous record -- 994), finished third in school history in total blocks (342.5), tied for fourth in school history in service aces (115), and finished fifth in the record books in assists (1,631) (all records as of 2001 when rally scoring began).

Individuals, there were also two Cougars who set school records. Perez set a school record with 16 digs in three sets against Stanford, Feb. 23 (rally scoring rules). His 236 digs on the season beat the school's previous all-time rally-scoring record, yet is second only to the 249 digs his teammate Joel Silva racked up in 2008 as well. Perez is also atop BYU's all-time digs list with 672 and total games played list with 391.

COACHES OR PLAYERS?

BYU's entire coaching staff is coaching at its alma mater. Head coach Shawn Patchell starred for the Cougars in his playing days (1990-93) while assistant coach Rob Neilson earned All-MPSF honors for BYU in 2006.

HEAD COACH SHAWN PATCHELL



With a career record of 48-11, Shawn Patchell is in his third year as head coach and seventh year overall as a member of BYU's staff. Patchell came to BYU from Laguna Beach High School where he was head coach for both the boys and girls volleyball teams.

In addition to his BYU coaching responsibilities, Patchell was selected to be the 2008-09 Junior National Team Head Coach. The Junior National Team competed in El Salvador last summer where they took the bronze medal and qualified for the World Championships held in India

in 2009. Patchell also coached the Youth National Team at the FIVB World Championships in Mexico in 2007, the first US team to qualify and participate in the Youth World Championships. In 2006 Patchell assisted the Youth National Team to a win over Cuba and a silver medal at the Dominican Republic NORCECA tourny which qualified team USA for the World Championships.

During the summer of 2005, Patchell coached the US World University Games team.

A member of BYUs first NCAA mens volleyball team, Patchell was a starter from 1990-93 and recorded a .398 career hitting percentage. In 1992, Patchells junior year, he led the nation in hitting percentage at .488 and was honored as AllAcademic Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. He was ranked fourth and 10th nationally in hitting and blocking his senior year. Patchell played professionally in Spain for the Euro Cup qualifier and No. 1 ranked Gran Canaria Team in the Canary Islands and also represented the US in the Federation International Volleyball Association Sand Volleyball Circuit in Europe.

Patchell earned his BA in English with a minor in business management from BYU in 1993 and a masters degree in English Literature from the University of California at Irvine in 2000. He is a parttime member of the BYU English Department and Business School where he teaches literature and composition classes. Shawn and his wife Davis enjoy being outdoors with their four children: Jordan (12), Sage (10) Soren (6) and Kai (1).

LAST YEAR AGAINST PEPPERDINE

March 7, 2008

In a renewed rivalry between top Mountain Pacific Sports Federation elites, the No. 2 BYU men's volleyball team (15-1, 10-1) topped No. 5 Pepperdine (8-6, 8-6) in four sets (30-20, 30-25, 31-33, 30-26) at the Smith Fieldhouse to remain atop the MPSF standings.

For only the second time this season five Cougar hitters tallied 10 or more kills. Ivan Perez led the way with 19 kills and a .343 attack percentage. He was followed by Jonathan Charette with 16, Russell Holmes and Andrew Stewart with 13 apiece, and Trent Sorensen with 12. As a team BYU hit .379 and kept Pepperdine to .269. The Cougars have yet to allow an opponent to hit .300 against them this season.

March 8, 2008

For only the first time since the 1999 championship season, the No. 2 BYU men's volleyball team (16-1, 11-1) swept No. 5 Pepperdine (8-7, 8-7) in three sets (30-28, 30-23, 30-26) and completed a weekend sweep of the Waves for the first time since the 2004 championship season.

As is per usual with the current Cougar squad, the seniors led the charge against Pepperdine. Ivan Perez had 13 kills and five blocks to lead the Cougars, and Jonathan Charette followed with 11 kills of his own. Russell Holmes tallied nine kills and five blocks, and Trent Sorensen had eight kills and three blocks. As a team, BYU hit .348 with sophomore Reed Chilton at setter and recorded nine total team blocks.

April 26, 2008

The BYU men's volleyball team (25-5) fell to Pepperdine (16-10) in a 2-3 loss (30-28, 30-28, 30-32, 27-30, 8-15) in the championship match of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Tournament at the Walter Pyramid in Long Beach, Calif.

The fifth-set loss is the first the team has suffered this season after going 5-0 in the fifth set during the regular season. The Cougars fall to 18-12 all-time in MPSF Tournament play and 3-2 in Tournament Championship matches.

Senior All-MPSF First Team honorees Ivan Perez and Jonathan Charette were named to the All-Tournament team. Perez tallied his team-leading 10th double-double of the season with 20 kills and 12 digs. Charette also had 20 kills, and senior Russell Holmes had 13 kills and five blocks on the night.

FUTI TAVANA: NATIONAL & MPSF PLAYER OF THE WEEK



PROVO, Utah (March 23, 2009) - Futi Tavana, a 6-8 redshirt freshman middle blocker from Kalaheo, Hawaii, has been named the Sports Imports/AVCA Division I-II Men's National Player of the Week and MPSF Molten Player of the Week after leading BYU to back-to-back five-game wins over then-No. 5 Long Beach State.

"Futi is very deserving of this award," said BYU head coach Shawn Patchell. "He continues to make improvements week to week."

In the first match-up with the 49ers, Tavana hit .500 with 11 kills in 20 attempts and one error. He also completed his first career double-double, getting 11 blocks, in addition to adding one ace in the match. Tavana started the night strong, recording three kills and a block early in the first set to contribute four of BYU's first five points against the 49ers. Forced into a comeback situation, with Long Beach State leading 2-1, he recorded a service ace to give the Cougars an 8-5 lead early in the fourth set, while another kill later tied the score 21-21. Tavana opened the final set with a kill, the first of his final three. With a five-point lead down the stretch, the redshirt freshman recorded a solo block as BYU went on to win the match.

In the second match against Long Beach, Tavana turned in an even better outing, notching the second double-double of his young career with 14 kills and 13 blocks. His 13 total blocks marked a new career high and tied a BYU record high (shared with Scott Bunker's 13 blocks vs. No. 1 Hawaii on April 14, 2001). Three of Tavana's 13 blocks came against reigning AVCA National Player of the Week Dean Bittner who only suffered nine attack errors on way to a career-high 42 kills. He also hit .636 in the match and picked up one dig. After a close loss in the fourth set, BYU found itself trailing 9-5 in the fifth. Tavana single-handedly brought his team back to within one point (12-11) with three kills and two blocks.

For the week, Tavana hit .571 and averaged 2.50 kills, 2.40 blocks and 3.85 points per game.

This is the first time Tavana had garnered either honor. He is the 18th athlete from BYU to earn the national award, with Yosleyder Cala being the last Cougar to receive the award in April 2007. Russell Holmes received the MPSF weekly honor in February 2008.
