GAME ON...

Coming off a narrow 45-42 victory over CSU last week, No. 15 BYU (8-1, 4-1) returns home to host San Diego State on Saturday--its last home game of the 2008 season.

SDSU (1-8, 0-5) enters Saturday's game coming off a 35-10 loss at Wyoming last weekend. The Aztecs' have yet to win a Mountain West Conference game this season, with their lone win of the season coming against Idaho.

Game time is scheduled for 12 p.m. (MT) and will be broadcast nationally on The Mtn.

THE BYU-SDSU SERIES



Saturday's contest will be the 33rd all-time between BYU and San Diego State. The Cougars have won six of the last seven games against SDSU, including a 48-27 victory last season in San Diego. During in those six games, the Cougars averaged 47 points. In the series that dates back to 1947, BYU enjoyed its longest winning streak against San Diego State from 1976-85 when it defeated the Aztecs nine straight times. Since the 1985 season the Cougars have not won more than five consecutive

games against SDSU, while the Aztecs have never beaten BYU twice in a row. The two teams played to a 52-all tie in 1991, the only draw in the history of the series.

ON THE TUBE



Saturday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on The Mtn. The game will mark the first of 12 televised games during the 2008 season. Rich Cellini will call the action and Jon Berger will lend analysis. Sammy Linebaugh will report from the sideline. Cellini's broadcasting work includes college football play-by-play, coverage for CSTV, ABC Sports and Fox Sports Net. He has also called play-by-play for NFL Europe on Fox and covered the NFL on Fox as a sideline

reporter. Berger entered broadcasting in 2003 as a co-host and analyst for the Big-12 Conference for Fox Sports' Nissan Football Saturday, Hardcore Football, The Big-12 Post Game Report, and the Southwest Sports Report. Berger is a 1992 graduate of the Ohio State University, where he was a special teams letterman. Linebaugh is an Emmy-winning TV reporter who currently freelances for several media outlets including the Mtn. Sports Network, NBC NewsChannel and ESPN radio.

A LOOK BACK: BYU 45-CSU 42



It was another close game on Saturday as No. 17 BYU defeated Colorado State 45-42. The first 30 minutes of play saw the Rams take the lead three times only to have the Cougars respond to tie the score. Just as he had the week before against UNLV, quarterback Max Hall led BYU on a come-from-behind drive for the winning score. The drive covered 76 yards in six plays and took just 1:14 on the clock. It was capped by a 17-yard strike to Dennis Pitta with just 22 seconds on the clock. BYU

rolled up 551 yards of total offense to CSU's 401. Davey O'Brien Award candidate Hall completed 28-of-37 passes for 389 yards and five touchdowns. Austin Collie, who was leading the nation in receiving coming into the game, had nine receptions for 156 yards and a career-high three touchdowns. Pitta a Mackey Award candidate, had a career-high 12 catches for 175 yards and two touchdowns, while Unga had 24 carries for 143 yards rushing.

NATIONAL RANKINGS

For the first time since 1997, BYU kicked off the season ranked among the nation's top-25 programs in both the USA Today Coaches' Poll (No. 17), and the Associated Press Top 25 (No. 16). This marked the Cougars' highest preseason ranking since picked No. 16 in 1990. BYU finished the 2007 season ranked as high as No. 14 with an 11-2 record, including a 17-16 victory over UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl. Prior to this season, the last time the Cougars were in the top 10 in both polls was 2001, when BYU achieved rankings as high as No. 7 in the Coaches' Poll and No. 8 in the AP Top 25. The Cougars spent three weeks in the top 10 earlier this season and were ranked No. 8 and No. 9 by the Coaches' and AP, respectively, before their loss at TCU. The Cougars have won 27 of their last 30 games and been ranked each week since cracking the polls on Nov. 18, 2007.

SCORING HALL PASSES

Quarterback Max Hall recorded five touchdown passes against CSU today. The junior has thrown a scoring pass in every game this season except for the Cougars' loss to TCU earlier in October. Hall has now thrown a touchdown pass in 20-of-22 career games. On the season, Hall has thrown 29 touchdown passes to seven different members of the BYU team.

COMPARED TO THE GREATS...

Through the first nine games of his junior season, quarterback Max Hall is putting up numbers equal to, if not better, than the legendary quarterbacks that came before him.

COLLIE HITS CENTURY MARK-EXTENDS MWC RECORD

Junior Austin Collie broke the 100-yard receiving mark for the seventh straight game with 156 yards on nine catches against the Rams. Collie's seven-consecutive games extend a MWC record he broke last week. The record was previously held by SDSU's J.R. Tolver (2002) with five.

CLIMBING UP THE BYU RECORD CHARTS

With his 156 yards receiving against CSU, Austin Collie now has 2,775 careerreceiving yards, surpassing Matt Bellini as No. 3 on BYU's all-time receiving list. The junior needs only 67 more yards to pass Margin Hooks (2,841 yards) and claim the No. 2 spot.

Collie reached the 100-yard receiving mark on his 15-yard touchdown reception with 8:20 remaining in the second quarter. The junior now has 13 career 100-yard receiving games, which sets a new BYU record, surpassing the current lead of Eric Drage with 12. He is also tied for first on the MWC record list, with the 13 games of SDSU's J.R. Tolver.

Counting his three touchdowns tonight, Collie now has 26 career touchdowns, tying Pete Van Valkenberg and Eric Lane as No. 10 on BYU's career touchdown list. Collie's 26 touchdowns put him only three behind the MWC leader, Jovon Bouknight of Wyoming (29). The junior's three touchdowns also marked a new career high. He had two touchdown receptions in five previous games.

UNGA SURPASSES 2,000 CAREER YARDS

With his 133 yards rushing on the day, sophomore running back Harvey Unga surpassed the 2,000-yard career mark. Unga racked up 1,227 yards on the ground in his freshman season last year.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh in at an average 326.4 pounds and average 6-feet-6. The front five will be going up against a SDSU defensive front that measures an average 6-feet-3, 253 pounds. Defensively, the Cougars' front three average 6-feet-3, 278 pounds, while the SDSU offensive line tips the scales at an average 6-feet-2, 305 pounds per man.

PAPER OR PLASTIC

Junior defensive lineman Jan Jorgensen's sack against CSU's Billy Farris in the fourth quarter gave him 21.5 career sacks, breaking the previous MWC record of 20.5 he shared with New Mexico's Michael Tuohy, TCU's Chase Ortiz and former Cougar Brady Poppinga. Jorgensen added a second sack and forced a fumble with just 22 seconds remaining to help secure the win and bring his career sack total to 22.5. He recorded four sacks his freshman season in 2006, 13.5 his sophomore season and five to date in 2008. Through nine games this season the Cougar defense has recorded 20 sacks.

TURNOVERS TRANSLATING TO POINTS

In the first nine games this season BYU has forced 21 turnovers, converting 13 of those into points. Of those 13 turnovers, 11 have resulted in touchdowns (77 points) for the Cougars.

CONSECUTIVE STARTS

The UNLV game marked senior offensive lineman Dallas Reynolds' 47th straight career start. During that streak, Reynolds has started at every position on the offensive line, including tackle, guard and center. Reynolds' younger brother Matt started at left tackle in the 2008 season opener. His father, Lance, is the associate head coach for the Cougars. Reynolds is currently tied at second for the most consecutive starts by an active Football Bowl Subdivision (Division I-A) player. Reynolds has started in every game of his BYU career, beginning with the Cougars' 20-3 loss to Boston College on Sep. 3, 2005.

HE WHO SCORES FIRST...

CSU's 20-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown with 12:58 remaining in the first quarter marked the third time this season BYU has failed to score first. The Cougars previously gave up touchdowns to New Mexico and TCU. BYU is 2-1 when failing to score first.

SCORING EARLY

CSU's touchdown with 12:58 remaining in the first quarter was the earliest score by a BYU opponent this season. The last time an opponent scored earlier than that was on Nov. 12, 2005 when Wyoming scored the first touchdown of the game with 13:32 remaining in the first quarter.

COIN TOSS

For the fourth time this season, BYU lost the opening coin toss, with CSU electing to receive. BYU is now 3-1 when losing the opening coin toss.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 127 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 32-4 when leading at halftime and 31-1 when taking a lead into the fourth guarter.

SCORING IN NO TIME...

Forced and recovered turnovers have resulted in fast scoring drives for the Cougars, who have put together nine scoring drives of a minute or less so far this season, including two against Utah State. In eight games, this number beats the total of seven recorded in 2007. BYU's second quarter scoring drive of six seconds agaisnt UCLA, marked the shortest Cougar scoring drive since a three-yard touchdown run by Harvey Unga against TCU on Nov. 8, 2007 knocked four seconds off the clock.

EVEN AT THE HALF

Last Saturday's 21-21 halftime score marked the second consecutive game and third time this season the Cougars ended the first half tied with their opponent. A week prior BYU was also tied 21-21 with UNLV. The Cougars were tied at Washington on Sept. 6, 2008, with a score of 14-14.

PRECISION PAYS OFF

Quarterback Max Hall and the BYU offense were nearly perfect on their final two drives of the CSU game, with Hall completing 8-of-9 passes for 116 yards and one touchdown. The first of the two drives consisted of four plays for 80 yards, lasting 1:31. The drive was capped by a 40-yard touchdown run by sophomore Harvey Unga. BYU's game-winning drive was six plays for 76 yards, taking 1:14 off the clock.

PULLING OUT THE CLOSE ONES

With Saturda'ys 45-42 victory over the Rams, the Cougars have won eight consecutive games decided by seven points or fewer, including back-to-back nail-biters against UNLV and CSU.

DOUBLE TIME

Wide receiver Austin Collie and tight end Dennis Pitta finished the CSU game with 156 and 175 yards receiving, respectively. The last time BYU finished a game with two 100-yard receivers was on Nov. 3, 2007 against the Rams in Provo. In that game Collie recorded 111 yards, while Harvey Unga followed with 110 yards.

EDWARDS' STADIUM STREAK NOW SPANS THREE SEASONS-TIES SCHOOL RECORD

With BYU's 42-35 win over UNLV, the Cougars have not lost in Edwards Stadium since November 19, 2005. BYU has won 17 straight home games, dating back to September 9, 2006—tying a BYU record. The last time the Cougars won 17 consecutive home games was 16 seasons ago from Oct. 7, 1989 to Nov. 23, 1991. Over that span, the Cougars have beaten their opponents by an average of 27.5 points per game and have allowed just 11.2 points per game. The Cougars have allowed seven points or less in nine of the last 17 home games.

UNDEFEATED AT HOME

BYU finished the 2007 season with a perfect 6-0 record at home, for the second consecutive year. The last time BYU had a perfect record at home for two straight seasons was in 1990-1991. Since the stadium was built in 1964, BYU has gone undefeated at home 14 times:

EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 64,045-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats.

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

The 64,081 fans in attendance for the Cougars' 42-35 win over UNLV marked the 11th consecutive sell-out at Edwards Stadium. The current streak marks the longest streak of consecutive sellouts since the 1991-92 seasons. Over 320,000 (320,506) fans have attended the first five home games at Edwards Stadium this season, averaging 64,101 fans per game. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 28.67 points per game at home while limiting its opponents to just 11.33. The margin of difference had the Cougars beating their opponents by an average of 17.33 points. The 35.16-point differential in 2006 was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 42-year history (and the program's 84-year history):

OUARTER REPORT

All totaled, the BYU defense has recorded 17 shutout quarters thru the first nine games of the season, including two complete shutout wins over UCLA and Wyoming. The Cougars has outscored or tied their opponents in every quarter except eight in 2008.

BYU's 23-0 deficit heading in to the halftime break against the Horned Frogs marked the first time the Cougars have been shutout in the first half since their 20-3 loss to Boston College on Sept 3, 2005. Boston College held BYU scoreless while scoring 10 points in the first half. That game also marked the first time this season the Cougars have been trailing at halftime. BYU is now 0-1 when down at the half.

BLOCK PARTY

Freshman running back Bryan Kariya blocked a UNLV punt midway through the second quarter, which was caught by Brandon Bradley. The Cougars were able to quickly translate good field position into points as Harvey Unga ran for a two-yard touchdown two plays later.

As a team, BYU has blocked four kicks this season, already surpassing the three blocks recorded during the 2007 season. Along with Kariya's, Jan Jorgensen blocked a potentially game-tying PAT attempt at Washington, Russell Tialavea blocked a UCLA field goal attempt and Michael Alisa blocked a kick against New Mexico. The last time BYU recorded four blocked kicks in a season was back in 2000.

GOING FOR TWO

Against UNLV the Cougars were successful on their first 2-point conversion attempt of the season. Harvey Unga caught a pass from Max Hall in the endzone following a Dennis Pitta touchdown, putting BYU up 42-35 with 1:46 remaining in the game. The last time the Cougars attempted and were successful on a two-point converstion was during the 17-10 victory over Utah in 2007.

FIRST HALF DOMINANCE

The Cougars last held a lead at halftime against New Mexico, marking the 16th time in the past 19 games BYU has held the lead at intermission. The Cougars have held their opponent to seven or fewer points in the opening half 12 times in 18 games. BYU is undefeated in those 12 games.

LONGEST MARCH DOWNFIELD

BYU's first touchdown drive against New Mexico of 95 yards marked the longest of the 2008 season in terms of yardage. The drive which lasted 5:04 minutes, ended with a one-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Max Hall to tight end Andrew George. The Cougars' longest drive in terms of time off the clock was in the second-quarter of the UCLA game. The 13-play drive of 48 yards took 6:43 minutes off the game clock.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

Junior linebacker Shawn Doman recovered a fumbled snap halfway through the second quarter against CSU, putting the Cougar offense back on the field where it went on to score on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Max Hall to Austin Collie. After recovering 12 fumbles in the first six games of the 2008 season, BYU had gone through a recent drought of two games. The Cougars' last fumble recovery was Jan Jorgensen's in a 21-3 win against New Mexico on Oct. 11.

FUMBLES FOR THE SCORE

In the first quarter against Utah State on Oct. 3, sophomore defensive back Brandon Bradley recovered the first fumble of his career, returning it for a 38-yard touchdown. The touchdown marked the second straight game the Cougars scored off a fumble recovery, as fellow defensive back Scott Johnson returned a loose ball for a touchdown in BYU's 44-0 victory over Wyoming on Sept. 20.

VERSUS THE PAC-10

After its 59-0 victory over UCLA, BYU is now 5-1 in the last six meetings with Pac-10 opponents, including back-to-back wins against Washington and UCLA. Overall the MWC has a 6-1 record against Pac-10 foes this season.

LARGEST LEAD OVER PAC-10

The 59-0 final score between BYU and UCLA marked a new BYU record-high lead over a Pac-10 opponent. The Cougars' largest lead prior to Saturday's game was 31-0 against Oregon in the fourth quarter of the 2006 Las Vegas Bowl.

PAYNE TIES SOPHOMORE MWC RECORD

Kicker Mitch Payne connected on a perfect 8-of-8 PAT attempts in BYU's win over UCLA, tying the number of extra points made by a sophomore in a single game.

HALL BREAKS MWC TOUCHDOWN RECORD

With his seven touchdown passes on the day against UCLA, junior quarterback Max Hall set a new Mountain West Conference record. His six touchdown passes in the first half alone broke the previous record of five. The previous record has been tied several times over the past nine years—most recently by TCU's Jeff Ballard in 2006 and SDSU's Kevin O'Connell in 2007. BYU's John Beck also reached the five touchdown passes mark as a junior in 2005.

HALL SETS BYU RECORD

Quarterback Max Hall's six touchdown passes in the first half against UCLA broke BYU's previous record of five, held by Marc Wilson (CSU 1977), Robbie Bosco (Baylor 1984) and Gary Sheide (UNM 1973). Halls seven touchdown passes on the day, matched a program record of seven, shared by Wilson and Jim McMahon (CSU 1981).

LARGEST LOSS SINCE 2005

For a team that averaged 37.8 points coming into the TCU game, the Cougars suffered their worst loss since a 49-23 loss at Notre Dame in 2005. TCU's 32 points marked a season-high for BYU opponents, who before Thursday, averaged only 10.2 points per game.

NATION'S LONGEST WINNING STREAK ENDS

With their 32-7 loss to TCU on Thursday, the Cougars' 16-game winning streak ended. Before today, BYU's last loss came on Sept. 15, 2007 at Tulsa. The Cougars lost that matchup 55-47.

GOING FOR IT

BYU attempted three fourth-down conversion attempts against TCU, successful on 1-of-3. The Cougars' successful conversion came late in the third quarter when quarterback Max Hall ran for a two-yard touchdown, giving the team its lone score of the game. BYU is now 3-2 on fourth-down conversion attempts.

PLAYING UNDER THE LIGHTS

After its loss to TCU, BYU now holds a 1-1 record when playing night games. The Cougars' game against Utah State (W, 34-14) marked BYU's first night game of the 2008 season.

RUNNING IT BACK...

Austin Collie's 75-yard kickoff return on BYU's opening drive against UNLV marked a season-long for the Cougars. The previous team-high was O'Neill Chamber's 51-yard return against Northern Iowa. The last time BYU had a kickoff return for more that 75 yards was Nate Meikle's 84-yard return against Wyoming on Nov. 9, 2006.

PROTECTING THE "BLUEZONE"

Despite its relative youth, the Cougar defense successfully kept its opponents from scoring a single touchdown in three of the first seven games of the season. Both UCLA and Wyoming were held scoreless through four quarters apiece, while New Mexico forced to settle for a single field goal.

UNANSWERED POINTS

The Cougars put together a run of 137 unanswered points over the span of three games before the Utah State Aggies scored a touchdown with 13:47 remaining in the fourth quarter. The stretch consisted of shutout wins over UCLA and Wyoming, 59-0 and 44-0, respectively, as well as a 24-0 lead heading into the fourth quarter against Utah State. Over that time BYU held its opponents scoreless in 11 straight quarters.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 45 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 13 different countries, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Germany, Japan, Korea, Madagascar, Mexico, Russia, Sweden and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions speak a total of nine different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, German, Japanese, Malagasy, Portuguese, Spanish and Swedish.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Of the 105 players on the team roster, 60 have served a church mission (57 percent). Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 14 different countries around the world, including Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, England, Germany, Puerto Rico, United States and Uruguay. Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 16 different states, including Alaska, California, Colorado, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, New Mexico, New York, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas and Washington. Current members of the BYU football team who have previously served church missions speak a total of nine different foreign languages, including Chinese, French, German, Portuguese, Samoan and Spanish.

WHAT IS A MISSION, YOU ASK?

The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. "Mormon" missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities. More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world. Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language. Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short

period of time at one of 17 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Guatemala, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, Spain and South Korea. A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m. In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize. Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services. Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Seniors Travis Bright and David Nixon, along with juniors Max Hall and Jan Jorgensen have been selected by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2008 football season.

Collectively the captains have 103 games of experience, with all four starting each game last season. Hall ended the 2007 season as the nation's top sophomore quarterback, passing for 3,848 yards. Bright, an offensive lineman, was part of an offensive unit that led the MWC and ranked 14th nationally in passing offense, averaging 298.4 yards per game. Over the course of the 2007 season, defensive lineman Jorgensen recorded 14 sacks for a combined loss of 115 yards, producing at least one sack in seven straight games. At linebacker, Nixon was credited with a career-high 66 tackles on the season, including a career-best 38 solo tackles.

Their accomplishments extend off the field as well, with each player earning 2007 Academic All-Mountain West Conference honors.

FLAG BEARER



BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition—an alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member

of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Their signatures reflect their commitment to uphold the tradition, spirit and honor of the BYU football program and to be a flag bearer of the University.

A FAMILY TRADITION

Several members of the football team have a relative that played a sport for the Cougars. The following is a list of players and their relative:

HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



After only his third season as the head coach at Brigham Young, Bronco Mendenhall has taken a program that had not enjoyed a winning season since 2001 and has turned it back into the Mountain West Conference's premier football program, and is steadily rebuilding the national prominence the Cougars once enjoyed.

In his first season, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5 regularseason record and earned an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl -- the team's first post-season bowl appearance in three

seasons. Since then, he has coached the Cougars to back-to-back, 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents. Under his direction, the Cougars have not lost a league game--at home or on the road--in two years and has finished the regular-season ranked among the nation's top-20 programs in the Bowl Championship Series standings.

With an invitation to attend the 2007 Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl, Mendenhall became the first coach in BYU football history to take a team to a bowl game in three straight seasons during his first three years as a head coach. On November 17, 2007, Mendenhall led the Cougars to a 35-10 victory over Wyoming to record his 25th career win. With the victory, Mendenhall became the only coach in BYU football history to win 25 games in his first 35 attempts.

Building on the success of his first-ever season as a head coach in 2005, Mendenhall and the Cougars posted an 11-2 record in 2006, winning the outright

Mountain West Conference Championship with a perfect 8-0 record. As a result, BYU returned to the Las Vegas Bowl to represent the MWC. In dominating fashion, and with a swagger similar to that of the glory years of BYU football, the Cougars handed Oregon a 38-8 defeat in the Las Vegas Bowl.

Throughout the 2006 season, BYU climbed the national polls by winning nine straight games to finish the regular season. As a result, the Cougars earned top-20 rankings in the Associated Press Top-25, the USA Today Coaches Poll, the Harris Interactive Poll and the BCS rankings. The Cougars' nine-game win streak was the third longest in the country and marked only the seventh time in BYU football history the Cougars had recorded at least nine consecutive wins in a single season.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

The 2007 season started out in similar fashion, winning just one of the team's first three games; however, under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars rebounded to win the final 10 games of the season, and like the previous year, garnered the attention of local, regional and national voters. BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll, marking the highest finish for the Cougars since finishing No. 5 following the 1996 season.

Like the 2006 season, BYU ranked among the nation's leaders in several statistical categories. The Cougars led the MWC and ranked 14th in passing offense, averaging 298.4 yards per game. The Cougars also led the league and ranked 25th in total offense, averaging 442.8 yards per game.

Defensively, the Cougars ranked 10th nationally in total defense, allowing just 307.9 yards per game. During the regular season, the Cougars did not allow a single 100-yard rusher. BYU finished the year ranked 9th nationally, allowing an average 97.5 yards rushing per game. One of Mendenhall's jobs as the head coach and defensive coordinator is to manage points. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

From his first day as a head coach, Mendenhall has stressed the importance of winning at home. After finishing 3-3 in Provo during the 2005 season, Mendenhall and the Cougars registered a perfect 6-0 record at home in 2006 and another perfect, 6-0 mark in 2007. In 2006, the Cougars finished the season as the most dominate home team in the country, and the most dominate home team in BYU football history, winning games by an average 35.16 points per game. In 2007, the Cougars outscored opponents at Edwards Stadium by an average 17.3 points per game. BYU allowed just 11.3 points per game, marking the best scoring defense effort since the 1988 season when BYU held opponents to just 10.2 points per game.

A native of Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1989 at his alma mater, Oregon State. After earning his master's degree in 1990, he moved to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he served as the secondary coach and defensive coordinator from 1991-92 under current BYU assistant coach Paul Tidwell. Following two seasons with the Badgers, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Northern Arizona, where the Lumberjacks boasted the top-ranked defense in the Big Sky Conference. He was elevated to co-defensive coordinator for the 1994 season.

In 1995, Mendenhall returned to Oregon State to become the defensive line coach under then defensive coordinator Rocky Long. When Long left to become the defensive coordinator at UCLA, Mendenhall was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 1996 season. At just 29 years of age, Mendenhall was the youngest defensive coordinator in Pac-10 history.

In 1997, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Louisiana Tech where he helped the Bulldogs to a remarkable 9-2 record as his defensive unit was credited with 17 interceptions, allowing just 15 touchdowns on the season.

In 1998, Mendenhall moved to Albuquerque, N.M., to become the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Mexico. Over the next five seasons, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West Conference in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in both the 2000 and 2002 season, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

At New Mexico, Mendenhall played a valuable role in the development of the 1999 Mountain West Player of the Year, Consensus All-American and first-round NFL Draft pick Brian Urlacher. The ninth overall selection in the 2000 NFL Draft, Urlacher was voted the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a Pro Bowl selection. Urlacher was one of two rookies to play all 16 games, starting at middle linebacker the final 14 games to establish a team record for starts at the position by a rookie. He shattered Bears rookie records with 165 total tackles and eight sacks, making him the second Chicago first-year player to lead the team in tackles. Urlacher finished his collegiate career ranked third on New Mexico's all-time list with 442 tackles.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple has three sons.

JAIME HILL NAMED DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

During the off-season, BYU head football coach Bronco Mendenhall announced Jaime Hill (first name pronounced high-may) has been promoted to defensive coordinator.

The move formalizes the capacity Hill has served in over the past season. While Mendenhall will maintain play-calling responsibilities on game-day, Hill is responsible for managing the essential aspects of running the defensive unit.

"I'm very grateful for this opportunity for personal growth within this profession; especially with this great program at Brigham Young University," Hill said. "I truly believe the foundation was laid by Coach Edwards and his staff, along with the players. Coach Mendenhall's staff and players have brought back the past glory, and have created their own line of history that will be passed down. This is something we can build upon for the future, and the future looks bright."

Since arriving at BYU for the 2006 season, Hill has played a significant role in the defensive secondary's marked improvement. In the two seasons since his arrival, BYU is averaging 17 interceptions, 50.5 pass break-ups and is allowing just under 208 yards passing per game. In addition, due in part to improved coverage, sacks have also increased to an average 28 per season since Hill's arrival. In 2007 the Cougars finished as the 10th ranked defense in the country. Rushing defense finished the season ranked 9th nationally, passing defense jumped to 32nd and the team finished ninth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

"Coach Hill has made a tremendous impact on our defense in the time he has been here and this is a way for us to recognize him for his contributions," Mendenhall said. "This promotion gives Coach Hill the formal responsibility of handling the day-to-day duties of running the defense, allowing me to focus my attention on other aspects of the program. I have a lot of respect for Coach Hill and the work he has done, and I am confident this will give our defense the opportunity to continue to improve."

OTHER PLAYERS TO WATCH...

Matt Bauman-LB

This season Bauman has stepped in to fill the leadership role left behind by graduated senior Kelly Poppinga. In 2007 Bauman was credited with a key fumble recovery in BYU's one-point bowl victory over UCLA. He also had an interception in the Cougars' win over Utah. Through the first eight games of the 2008 season, Bauman currently leads the team with 74 tackles. He also has two sacks for 11 yards, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Travis Bright-OL

Bright returns as one of several veterans on the offensive line after suffering a broken leg in BYU's 17-16 victory over UCLA in the 2007 Las Vegas Bowl. Starting all 13 games last season, Bright was part of an offensive unit that led the MWC and ranked 14th in the nation in passing offense. During the spring Bright set the BYU weight room record, benching 540 lbs. He is currently serving as one of four team captains for the 2008 season.

Coleby Clawson-LB

In his first season as a Cougar, after transferring from Snow College, Clawson has started the past six games. He is currently second on the team in sacks with four for 29 yards. He also has a team-high three forced fumbles, along with 7.5 tackles for loss.

O'Neill Chambers-WR/KR

A true freshman out of Harmony, Fla., Chambers currently averages 23.8 yards per kick return. His longest return was for 51 yards against Northern lowa, his first collegiate game. With senior Michael Reed out with injury, Chambers recorded his first career start against Utah St. His first touchdown came late in the first quarter against UNLV--a 20-yard reception from Max Hall.

lan Dulan-DL

Starting 12 of the Cougars' 13 games last season, Dulan was credited with 24 tackles, including 11 solo tackles. He recorded three sacks on the season for a combined loss of 15 yards. So far in 2008, Dulan has recorded three sacks for 29 yards.

Andrew George-TE

Together with Dennis Pitta, George looks to continue the tradition of success found by tight ends at BYU. George recorded 200 yards on 17 receptions in 2007, including a career-high three receptions for 62 yards during the team's regular-season matchup against UCLA. The junior tight end recorded his first touchdown of the season in BYU's 28-27 win over Washington. Against New Mexico, George totaled three receptions for 22 yards, including two of the three touchdowns of the game.

Mitch Payne-K

After suffering a groin injury during the majority of last season, Payne is healthy and ready for the 2008 season. Payne has converted 25-of-27 point-after attempts and scored a total of 34 points so far this season. In BYU's 59-0 win over UCLA in 2008, Payne made a perfect 8-of-8 PAT attempts, tying the MWC record for most PATs made by a sophomore in a single game. Kicked a career-long 45-yard field goal against Utah State.

Michael Reed-WR

An experienced outside receiver, Reed returns to the Cougars for his senior season after logging significant playing time over the past three years. Reed had 41 catches for 449 yards and four touchdowns a year ago. After suffering from injury and missing the 2008 games against Wyoming and Utah State, Reed is fully recovered, resuming his starting position.

Fui Vakapuna-RB

Slowed by injury the majority of the 2007 season, senior Vakapuna is expected to make a large contribution to the experienced BYU offense. Vakapuna is known for his ability to break

tackles and run over those standing in his way. He recorded his first carry and touchdown of the 2008 season against Washington. Against UNLV, Vakapuna had 9 carries for 72 yards, averaging 7.9 yards per carry.

Interviews with players and coaches may be conducted after practice sessions on Mondays-Wednesdays. Practices on those three days are open to media. Player interviews with out-of-town media may be scheduled through the BYU Athletic Media Relations office.
