Saturday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on The Mtn with Ari Wolfe on play-by-play, Blaine Fowler doing the color and Sammy Linebaugh on the sidelines.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- With his next PAT conversion, senior kicker Mitch Payne will break the BYU record for most in a career previously set by Kurt Gunther. Payne and Gunther are currently tied with 162 PATs apiece.

- BYU is 15-2 all-time versus San Diego State in Provo. The Aztecs have not won at Edwards Stadium since a 16-15 victory in 2000.

- The Cougars will look to win their third conference game in a row at home after defeating Air Force and Utah to end the 2009 season. The Cougars have a four-game victory streak in the series dating back to SDSU's 31-10 victory in San Diego in 2005.

- Senior safety Andrew Rich enters the game as one of the best defenders in the country, coming in at 16th in the nation in tackles and 11th in the nation in solo tackles per game. He has had two 14-tackle games so far this year.

- The Cougars finished Saturday's game at Utah State playing without five defensive starters who have been knocked out by injuries. BYU started the game without defensive tackle Romney Fuga, outside linebacker Jameson Frazier and free safety Steven Thomas and then lost the team's top two tacklers, strong safety Andrew Rich and outside linebacker Jordan Pendleton, during the game. Including the offensive side of the ball, BYU played without seven opening-day starters.

THE BYU-SAN DIEGO STATE SERIES

BYU and San Diego State have been a part of a few record-breaking performances together. Last season, the Cougars earned the program's 500th win in school history while Dennis Pitta passed Gordon Hudson for most receiving yards by a tight end in BYU history. In 2008, BYU defeated the Aztecs to wrap up three-straight undefeated seasons at Edwards Stadium. In 2005,

SDSU broke beat BYU in San Deigo for the first time since 1988. Finally, the two teams own an NCAA record that will likely never be broken: the highest-scoring game ever to end in a tie occured in 1991 when Marshall Faulk and the Aztecs tied the Cougars, 52-52. Overall, BYU leads the series 26-7-1 and has never allowed SDSU to win two-straight seasons.

LAST TIME: BYU 38, SAN DIEGO STATE 28 (2009)

SAN DIEGO (Oct. 17, 2009) - No. 18 BYU outpaced San Diego State 38-28 Saturday at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego with guarterback Max Hall throwing for a season-high 346 yards and running for a career-best 47 yards in the victory. With the win, the Cougars improve to 6-1 on the season and 3-0 in the Mountain West Conference.

Hall completed 27-of-39 passes for 346 yards and three touchdowns while carrying the ball a career-high 14 times for a personal-best 47 yards and one touchdown. His rushing score came at the end of the half in one of several key plays that proved to be difference-makers in the win.

As BYU approached the end zone at the end of the half, Hall was stopped for no gain at the 1-yard line with the final seconds ticking down. With the coaches motioning from the sideline for Hall to spike the ball to kill the clock, the senior signal caller instead took the snap and rolled left past the unsuspecting Aztec defense and into the end zone as the clock hit 0:00.

Hall's improvisation and safety Scott Johnson's diving interception in the end zone to set up that drive were two big plays that helped BYU maintain its advantage in a hard-fought contest against an improved Aztec team coming off a bye week. SDSU falls to 2-4 overall and 0-2 in the MWC with the defeat.

SAN DIEGO STATE LAST TIME: SDSU 41, USU 7

SAN DIEGO - Ryan Lindley threw for 362 yards and three touchdowns as San Diego State defeated Utah State 41-7 on Saturday night.

Vincent Brown, who surpassed 2,000 career receiving yards, caught five passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns for the Aztecs (3-1). His TD receptions were of 65 and 82 yards.

Ronnie Hillman rushed for 89 yards and a touchdown for the Aztecs.

The game marked the first time since 1977 the two schools have met, with San Diego State having won eight straight.

At 3-1, San Diego State has matched its best start in the last 29 seasons and won three games in September for the first time since the 1993 campaign.

BYU'S LAST OUTING

LOGAN, Utah (Oct. 1, 2010) — BYU's 10-game winning streak over Utah State came to an end Friday in Logan as the Aggies defeated the Cougars 31-16 at Romney Stadium.

¹ The Utah State win marks the program's first over in-state rival BYU since a 58-56 shootout victory in

BYU quarterback Jake Heaps threw 27-of-54 for 271 yards. Junior wide receiver McKay Jacobson had 85 yards on eight receptions.

BYU trailed 31-10 entering the fourth before scoring on a 2-yard run by Di Luigi on the final drive of the game with 31 seconds remaining. Heaps threw five-straight completions on the drive, the last a nine-yard pass to Spencer Hafoka that was moved 15 more yards on an Aggie personal foul penalty.

On defense, Shane Hunter had a game-high 13 tackles while Jadon Wagner and Travis Uale had 10 tackles, apiece. All marks were career highs.

BYU, WEST VIRGINIA TO MEET AT FEDEXFIELD

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 23, 2010) — FedExField, home of the Washington Redskins of the National Football League, will host Brigham Young University and West Virginia University in a neutral-site football game scheduled for Sept. 24, 2016.

"This is a unique opportunity for our fans on the East Coast to see our football team play in person," said BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe. "West Virginia is a very good football program and FedExField is a fantastic NFL venue. It's a great opportunity for our program."

Home of the Redskins since 1997, FedExField is located in Landover, Md., and has a seating capacity of 91,704 — the largest stadium in the NFL in terms of regular capacity.

The Cougars and Mountaineers have never met before in football. West Virginia has been a member of the Big East Conference since 1991. Both BYU and WVU have been ranked in the top 25 during each of the past five years. Over the past four seasons both programs have won at least nine games per year with the Mountaineers posting a 40-12 record while the Cougars are 43-9.

"BYU has been one of the consistently powerful programs over the last 35-40 years," WVU Director of Athletics Oliver Luck said. "In so many ways, LaVell Edwards reminds me of Don Nehlen. Both built solid foundations at their respective schools. Anybody that has played quarterback in the NCAA has enormous respect for the quarterback tradition at BYU."

Information regarding television, tickets sales and kickoff time will be released at a later date.

Over the years, BYU has played in several NFL stadiums, including Cowboys Stadium, Louisiana Superdome, Alltell Stadium, Pontiac Silverdome, The Meadowlands, Veterans Stadium, Orange Bowl, QualComm Stadium, Anaheim Stadium and Sun Devil Stadium.

MENDENHALL **VS. RANKED FOES**

Under Bronco Mendenhall, BYU is 4-7 vs. ranked foes, with its wins being a 31-17 victory over No. 15 TCU on Sept. 28, 2006, and three wins in 2009: a 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Sept. 5, a 26-23 win over No. 21 Utah on Nov. 28 and a 44-20 win over No. 18 Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl on Dec. 22.

TEAM CAPTAINS

BYU head football coach Bronco Mendenhall announced team captains for the 2010 season as well as several personnel notes entering the first week of the season.

Senior safety Andrew Rich and junior offensive tackle Matt Reynolds have been selected to serve as team captains. Both Rich and Reynolds have played in all 26 games the past two seasons and enter their third year as a starter for the Cougars.

Rich has started in 16 games and earned All-MWC Second Team honors in 2009. He is a 2010 Lott Trophy Award candidate. Reynolds has started all 26 games of his career and is a preseason All-American, Lombardi Trophy and Outland Trophy candidate in 2010. He was a Freshman All-American in 2008 and a CFN All-Sophomore selection in 2009 while earning first-team all-conference accolades.

Also this year, BYU will elect a special teams captain for each game. Holder Matt Marshall was tabbed to be captain against Washington while Riley Stephenson was the captain at Air Force.

DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 43-4 when leading at halftime and 43-1 when taking a lead into the fourth guarter. Mendenhall's teams have won 28-straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 75 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987 when it lost 29-27 in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

PULLING OUT THE CLOSE ONES

After defeating Washington by six points in the first game of the season, BYU has won 12 consecutive games decided by seven points or fewer.

NELSON INJURY PUTS OB OUT FOR SEASON

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 21, 2010) — BYU junior guarterback Riley Nelson had surgery to repair a shoulder injury suffered during the Florida State game and will be out the remainder of the 2010 season.

An MRI revealed the need for surgery on Nelson's non-throwing shoulder. The anticipated recovery time is 4-5 months.

"We will miss Riley's leadership, toughness and playmaking ability," BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. "Unfortunately, injuries are part of football. Riley is a great young man and we will look forward to his return."

Nelson, from Logan, Utah, has started each of BYU's first three games while sharing time with true freshman quarterback Jake Heaps. Nelson has completed 20-of-40 passes for 205 yards and two touchdowns while adding 148 yards and one touchdown on 31 rushing attempts.

"It's never fun to be injured," Nelson said. "I'm getting it taken care of as soon as possible so I can start my recovery and be back to help the team in the future."

MOVE FORWARD, NOT BACKWARD

As a team, the Cougars are one of the least penalized squads in the nation, averaging just five penalties per game, tied for 25th among all FBS schools and tied for second in the MWC. BYU's average of 40 penalty yards per game is tied for 18th in the nation and is second best in the conference just behind Wyoming's average of 39.6 yards per game. Against Nevada, BYU committed just one penalty for five yards, the first single-penalty game for the Cougars since 2003.

YOUNG (NOT STEVE)

The Cougars have played 15 freshmen this season, five of whom have started at least one game this year. True freshman quarterback Jake Heaps, running back Joshua Quezada and wide receiver Cody Hoffman have become regular starters on the offensive side of the ball while four freshman tight ends have caught at least one pass while rotating responsibilities.

Linebacker Zac Stout currently leads the defensive freshmen with 12 tackles on the year while Kyle Van Noy has seven tackles, all last week against Utah State.

2010 BYU FOOTBALL FIRESIDES

BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall, his wife, Holly, and members of the BYU football team will participate in an hour-long devotional prior to eight football games this season.

These devotionals will be conducted prior to all road games as well as the Washington and San Diego State home games. They are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches, and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth.

"The firesides have been a way for us to make a very clear statement of what our priorities are, or should be," Mendenhall says. "Football is simply the vehicle we use to help others come to a knowledge of what really brings joy and happiness to our lives. Football is not the priority. Some people don't understand that. These firesides are a way for all of us to help consider our priorities through understanding the purpose of life."

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 51 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 16 different countries, including Argentina, Bulgaria, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, Costa Rica, Ghana, Guatemala, Japan, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Russia, South Africa and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of eight different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Japanese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish and Tagalog.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga, is one of 74 players (62 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 24 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, England, Germany, India, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, Mozambique, New Zealand, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 18 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, Nevada, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Washington.

Overall, 54 current members of the BYU football team speak a total of 17 different foreign languages and dialects, including Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

* The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.

* The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and John in the book of Acts).

* More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.

* Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.

* Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.

* Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, South Africa and Spain.

* Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."

* A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.

* In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.

* Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services.

* Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,725-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. Beginning in 2010, Edwards Stadium official capacity is 63,275 after seating was removed to allow for additional wheelchair access.

The attendance in BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sell-outs at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWD

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah last season is currently tenth with 64,301 fans attending the game.





2010 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

HOME BOYS

A majority of the BYU two-deep includes athletes who grew up in hometowns just a few miles from Provo. Wide receiver Luke Ashworth and offensive linemen brothers Matt and Houston Reynolds even went to high school in Provo at Timpview High. Others from Utah County include tight end Austin Holt from Orem, tight end Mike Muehlmann from American Fork and fullback Zed Mendenhall from Alpine.

Other Utahns on the depth chart include left guard Braden Hansen from Sandy, right guard Jason Speredon from West Valley City, right tackle Braden Brown from Salt Lake City, quarterback James Lark from St. George and running back Bryan Kariya from Kaysville.

HE'S GOT YOUR BACK

BYU starting offensive lineman Matt Reynolds enters the year as a preseason All-American after being named to the All-MWC First Team and College Football News All-Sophomore Team First Team. A Lombardi and Outland Trophy candidate, the 6-foo-6, 322-pound junior has started every game for the Cougars the past two years and was named a team captain coming into 2010.

BEHIND THE LINE

The Cougar offensive line was one of the best in the country in 2009, ranking eighth in the nation in tackles for loss allowed while protecting the backfield enough to give BYU the best conversion percentage on third down in the nation.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting five offensive linemen weigh in at an average 314 pounds and average 6-feet-5. In a season full of injuries for the Cougars, all five linemen have started every game of the season.

HERE, THERE AND EVERYWHERE

Junior running back JJ Di Luigi has racked up the yardage for the Cougars so far this season, leading the team with 374 rushing yards, 262 receiving yards and 690 all-purpose yards. Di Luigi also leads the team in rushing yards per game (74.8), receiving yards per game (52.4), kick return yards per game (27.0) and all-purpose yards per game (138.0). The junior has half of BYU's touchdowns with four and is tied with kicker Mitch Payne for the team scoring lead with 24 points on the year.

SHARING THROUGH THE AIR

At Utah State last week, 10 different BYU receivers caught a pass, including four freshman. In all, 16 players have caught a pass for the Cougars at this point in the season.

BLUE ZONE EFFICIENCY

Going 3-for-3 inside the red zone at Utah State, the Cougars have been perfect inside the 20 yardline in 4-of-5 games this season, going 13-of-15 overall (7 touchdowns, 6 field goals).

STARTING FAST

Starting at quarterback for the second time at Utah State, Heaps became the third freshman quarterback at BYU to start in more than one game after Matt Berry (6 starts) and John Beck (4 starts).

2010 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

WHERE IN THE USA?

The defensive two-deep hail from all corners of the country. Players hail from Alaska, Arkansas, California, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, Texas, Utah. One player, Jadon Wagner, is from Alberta, Canada.

WITH EXPERIENCE

BYU's secondary is as deep and talented as any in recent memory. Three of four starters return, including All-MWC strong safety Andrew Rich, SportsIllustrated.com All-America honorable mention Brian Logan and cornerback Brandon Bradley, fourth on the team with 64 tackles last season.

Junior corner Corby Eason and sophomore corner Robbie Buckner also have experience defending the passing game while lettermen Steven Thomas and Travis Uale are also on the two-deep after seeing playing time last season.

On the defensive line, Eathyn Manumaleuna, Vic So'oto, Jordan Richardson and Matt Putnum return while Jordan Pendleton, Brandon Ogletree and Shane Hunter bring experience to the linebacker corp. Junior Romney Fuga, a starter the first four games of the season, is out for the year with a knee injury.

A LONG ROAD

Defensive lineman Vic So'oto has come a long way to his spot in the starting lineup after originally joining the team in 2005. So'oto came in to the program as a tight end, playing in 11 games. After redshirting in 2006, So'oto enjoyed a sophomore season in which he saw action in all 13 games at both tight end and on special teams, grabbing 12 receptions for 124 yards.

It was after So'oto's sophomore year that the BYU coaching staff asked So'oto to switch sides of the ball, converting the tight end to a linebacker. Unfortunately, So'oto suffered a season-ending injury in just the second game of the season at Washington. After receiving an extra year of eligibility, So'oto returned in 2009, this time as a defensive lineman, backing up Mountain West Conference career sack leader Jan Jorgensen.

In 2010, So'oto has started every game and is fifth on the team in total tackles in addition to one sack and one interception.

TOP TACKLER

Senior and team captain Andrew Rich is ranked 11th in the nation with an average of 6.2 solo tackles per game and is tied for 16th in the nation in total tackles per game at 10.6, good for third in the MWC. Rich, who has seen time at both safety positions this year, has led BYU in tackles three out of five games while battling various injuries. He totaled a career-high 14 tackles against both Air Force and Nevada. Rich, a former walk-on from Snow College, entered the 2010 season as the top returner on the team in solo tackles, assisted tackles, total tackles and interceptions.

STEPPING IN, STEPPING UP

Linebacker Jadon Wagner and safety Travis Uale totaled 10 tackles apiece at Utah State replacing regular starters James Frazier and Steven Thomas, respectively. The numbers were career highs for both defenders and the top two marks for the Cougars.

MIGHTY HUNTER

Linebacker Shane Hunter led all players with a career-high 13 tackles against Utah State last Friday, including a BYU season-high 10 assisted tackles. He is currently ranked eighth in the conference with an average of 8.6 total tackles per game. Hunter has also come up with two of BYU's four turnovers created this season, recovering a fumble against Florida State and intercepting a pass at Air Force.

INJURY ENDS FUGA'S SEASON

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 27, 2010) — BYU junior defensive tackle Romney Fuga will have surgery to repair a knee injury suffered Saturday during the Nevada game and will be out the remainder of the 2010 season.

An MRI revealed the injury that knocked Fuga out early in the second quarter of Saturday's game is an anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) and lateral collateral ligament (LCL) injury that requires surgery. The 6-foot-2, 307-pound native of Huntington Beach, Calif., is anticipated to return in time for 2011 fall camp.

Fuga has started all four BYU games this season anchoring the defensive front. He started seven contests while appearing in all 13 games in 2009 and played in all 13 games as a freshman in 2006 prior to serving a mission in Mada-gascar for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

After totaling 40 tackles last year, the Academic All-Mountain West Conference defender has contributed 15 tackles, 0.5 tackles for loss and 0.5 sacks this season.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung comes to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. An award given beginning this season is named in his honor and will be awarded to the best all-around player in college football. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

STEPHENSON NAMED MWC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU's Riley Stephenson earned Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his performance in the Cougars' season-opening victory over Washington.

The sophomore punter/kicker helped BYU control the field-position battle in the Cougars' 23-17 win, making the Huskies start inside the 15-yard line on three of six punts and inside the 20 on three of five kickoffs. Stephenson's six punts tied a career high.

HERE COMES THE BOOM

MWC honorable mention honoree Riley Stephenson returns at punter for BYU after a successful freshman campaign. Stephenson is known for his ability to place punts near the goalline, putting eight kicks inside the 20 last season. The sophomore can also boom kicks when needed, totaling eight punts over 50 yards in 2009, including a career-high and BYU bowl game record 60-yard punt against Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 149 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9. 2006 when freshman McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards against Wyoming at Edwards Stadium. Forty-seven games have passed since then.

KICK COVERAGE

BYU's kickoff return defense is currently ranked 7th in the country after being ranked first in the nation the first four weeks of the 2010 season. The Cougars allow just 16.9 yards per kickoff return, the best mark in the Mountain West Conferece. BYU has allowed 20 yards on three kicks against Washington, 12 yards on one kick at Air Force, two returns for 18 yards versus Florida State and 32 yards on two kick returns against Nevada.

BYU is also 15th in the nation and first in the MWC in punt return defense, allowing only 2.83 yards per punt return on the year after stifling Utah State for minus-1 yard on two punt returns.

PERFECT PAYNE

Senior kicker Mitch Payne kicked a 24-yard field goal at Utah State, keeping him perfect inside the 30-yard line in his career. Payne has made 21-of-21 attempts inside the 30, including 6-of-6 this season.

PAYNE CLOSING ON RECORDS

With one PAT against Nevada, Payne is now tied with former Cougar kicker Kurt Gunther (1980-82) for most PAT conversions in a career with 162. Payne is also currently 11 PAT attempts from passing Gunther's mark of 179 in the BYU record books. He is also 64 points away from scoring the most points of any Cougar player in BYU history, a record currently held by kicker Owen Pochman (1997-00) with 333 points.

In the MWC record books, Payne is 43 points away from passing his brother for first all-time in career kicking points. Payne kicked the third-most extra points in a season in MWC history in 2009 with 59 PATs. He also holds the MWC record for juniors for most PATs made in a game, converting eight against UNLV in 2009. With 59 PATs last season, Payne also became the BYU and Mountain West Conference career PATs made leader with 156, surpassing his brother Matt's record of 150 career PATs made.

STEPHENSON NAMED HONORABLE MENTION

BYU sophomore kicker Riley Stephenson was named a College Football Performance Awards honorable mention kickoff specialist performer of the week for his efforts against Utah State. Stephenson averaged 56.8 yards per kickoff, totaling 227 yards on four kickoffs with one touchback. In the punting game, Stephenson averaged 47.8 yards on four punts Saturday at Utah State, downing two of those punts inside the 20. He had a 35-yard punt downed at the 3-yard line and then boomed a 55-yarder that was downed at the 4-yard line. His other two punts traveled 56 and 45 yards and yielded a combined -1-yards on returns to give the Cougars a net punting of 48.0 yards for the game.

RETURN TO RETURNS

Junior wide receiver/kick returner McKay Jacobson ran a Nevada kickoff back 39 yards for a new team season high last weekend. Jacobson had three kick returns, his first of 2010 after returning three kickoffs last season and seven in 2006. Jacobson also rushed for eight yards on a return before handing the ball off to teammates Cody Hoffman who rushed for an additional 31 yards.

FALSLEV TAKES OFF

Freshman JD Falslev returned the first kickoff of his career 34 yards to the BYU 46-yard line, setting up the Cougars' first points of the game at Utah State. Falslev finished with three returns for 64 yards in his hometown of Logan.

2010 COUGAR FOOTBALL HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



BRONCO MENDENHALL SIXTH SEASON

During his first five seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to five straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and consistent national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, the Cougars earned a 49-15 record in his first five years--the best record of any first-time head coach over the past five seasons and a mark topped by only 11 coaches overall. Mendenhall's .766 wining percentage entering the season ranked No. 4 among all active FBS head coaches with at least five years of experience. Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in three of the last four years while achieving a 43-9 record in that span, a ledger topped by only four other teams-Boise State, Florida, Texas and Ohio State. In doing so, the Cougars have achieved four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

While recording an 11-2 record and 7-1 league mark, Mendenhall's 2009 team went 3-1 against ranked opponents, incluing a 14-13 season-opening win over No. 3 Oklahoma and a 44-20 season finale Maaco Bowl Las Vegas victory over No. 16 Oregon State. BYU finished No. 12 in the final polls to earn its highest finish since 1996 and earn the distinction of being one of only six programs nationally to be ranked in both the final polls the past four seasons. At No. 14 in the final 2009 BCS standings, Mendenhall's Cougars are one of just seven programs to finish in the final BCS standings the past four year and the only program to do so from a non-automatic qualifying BCS conference.

In his first season, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-5

> regular-season record and earned an invitation to the Pioneer Las Vegas Bowl -- the team's first postseason bowl appearance in three seasons. Over the next two seasons. he coached the

Cougars to back-to-back 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents.

In 2008, BYU posted a 10-2 regular season to achieve three straight 10-win seasons for only the third time in school history. In doing so, Mendenhall's teams became the first in Cougar history to go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons.

The Cougars have received five straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first five teams to a bowl game.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

In 2007, BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

In 2008, BYU earned a spot in the national polls each week of the season, including a ranking as high as No. 7. With just two regular-season blemishes on its resume with road losses at No. 6 Utah and No. 11 TCU, BYU earned a No. 16 ranking in the final BCS standings and an invitation to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl.

> Off the field, BYU has had five Academic All-Amerian citations in the past two seasons. In 2008, only Penn State (4) placed more student-athletes on the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America First Team. Cougar starters David Oswald (offensive tackle), Matt Bauman (linebacker) and Kellen Fowler (safety) each earned the high honor as BYU had three first-teamers for the first time during the same season. In 2009, Scott Johnson earned first-team honors and Bauman was a second-team selection.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

Bradley's 48 solo tackles in 2009 ranked second on the team while ranking fourth with 64 tackles overall. He is a three-year letterwinner, playing 32 games with 16 starts in his career.

TERENCE BROWN-OL
