COUGARS RETURN HOME TO HOST UC SAN DIEGO

After a month away from home, the No. 9 BYU men's volleyball team (5-6, 3-3 MPSF) returns home to the Smith Fieldhouse where it will host No. 10 UC San Diego (6-6, 2-5 MPSF) on Friday and Saturday.

The Cougars are coming off a week break after suffering two losses at No. 5 USC on Feb. 6 & 7. BYU lost 3-1 and 3-2 at the hands of the Trojans.

The Tritons of UCSD are coming off a three-game victory over No. 11 George Mason in the championship game of the 2009 Volleyball Hall of Fame Morgan Classic on Feb. 14. UCSD took the tournament crown with game scores of 30-18, 30-21, 30-15, thanks in part to tournament MVP Will Ehrman's 14 kill, 13 dig performance.

SERIES INFORMATION

The Cougars boast an undefeated, 24-0 record against UCSD, dating back to 1993. Of those 24 meetings, 18 resulted in sweeps, with the Tritons claiming only five games. No matchup between these two teams has ever gone to a fifth set. Last season BYU visited UCSD in San Diego on Jan. 11 & 12, coming away with 3-1, 3-0 victories.

Both matches will be televised live on BYU-TV with Jarom Jordan calling play-by-play, Steve Vail offering analysis and Kelli Ottesen as sideline reporter.

COMING OFF... A FIVE-SET LOSS AT USC

The No. 9 Cougars looked to be on the verge of victory in the second and third set but eventually fell 3-2 (34-32, 33-35, 29-31, 30-23, 15-10) to No. 5 USC on Feb. 7.

Despite the loss, several players recorded career and season highs on the night in kills, hitting percentage and assists. Freshman Russell Lavaja shattered his previous career record of 6 kills, contributing 13 of the Cougars' 79. Fellow freshman Futi Tavana also improved his career-high kills to 16. Junior Mat Taylor again lead the team with 18--the fifth time he has done so this season.

20-WIN SERSONS

After finishing the 2006 season with an 18-9 record, BYU was held without 20 wins for the first time since the 2000 season. With 2008's 25-5 finish, the Cougars have recorded 10 total 20-win seasons. The first BYU team to record 20 wins was the 1994 team. The 1994 team finished its season with a 21-6 record and advanced to the final of the MPSF Tournament, losing to Stanford in four games.

BYU IN THE MPSF TOURNAMENT

Since 1993, BYU has qualified for the MPSF postseason tournament in 13 of 14 seasons including 12 consecutive trips. The Cougars all-time record in the MPSF tournament is 19-12. BYU has won the MPSF tournament three times and holds an 11-5 record in the first round, 5-5 record in the semifinals and 3-2 record in tournament finals. The Cougars won consecutive MPSF tournament championships in 2003 and 2004.

BYU IN THE NCAR TOURNAMENT



The Cougars have made four NCAA tournament appearances in the program's history. Impressively, BYU has brought home the hardware in three of its four NCAA tournament appearances. The Cougars boast a 7-1 overall record in NCAA tournament play and a perfect 4-0 record in national semifinal matches. The Cougars only loss in the NCAA tournament was

in 2003 when they lost to Lewis in a five-game thriller. BYU has earned automatic bids to the Final Four by winning the MPSF tournament three times: 1999, 2003 and 2004.

This year the Smith Fieldhouse will serve as host to the 2009 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championships on May 7-9, 2009.

ALL-AMERICANS

With Russell Holmes (first team) and Ivan Perez (second team) being named AVCA All-Americans last year, it marked the 15th consecutive season the Cougars have had an All-American. Since 1993, 20 different players have earned 38 citations, 14 of which are first-team honors and 13 of which are second-team honors.

Returning Term

The Cougars return two starters for 2009 in junior outside hitter Andrew Stewart and junior libero Joel Silva. With the loss of two All-Americans and five contributing seniors in 2008, this year's team has six newcomers and no seniors. The Cougars also have two recently returned missionaries--Futi Tavana and Quentin Smith.

HOME COURT ROVANTAGE

BYU finished its 2008 season with a 14-1(.933) record at the Smith Fieldhouse, facing teams like No. 1 NAIA team Cal Baptist, No. 5 Pepperdine, No. 6 Cal State Northridge and No. 8 UC Irvine. The record was the fourth best mark in Cougar history behind the 1998 (11-0, 1.000), 2004 (16-1, .941) and 1999 (15-1, .938) seasons.

BYU Hosts 2009 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP



BYU will host the 2009 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championship in the Smith Fieldhouse May 7-9, 2009. Both semifinal matches will be played on Thursday, May 7, with the national championship match held on Saturday, May 9. All session tickets are available at the Marriott Center Ticket Office. BYU will host its first national championship event since hosting the 1989 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championship. Three other outdoor track championships were held at BYU in 1967, 1975 and 1982. BYU also hosted the NCAA Wrestling Championship in 1969.

PRESERSON EXHIBITION

BYU finished its exhibition schedule having won nine of 12 matches. The Cougars played against USC and Hawaii at the Warrior Fall Tournament in Honolulu, going 5-3 and finishing with the best record in the tournament.

The Cougars then returned home to host the BYU Tournament, going undefeated against teams from Utah Valley University, UC Irvine and Southern Alberta Institute of Technology. Redshirt freshman Futi Tavana was named tournament MVP and joined junior Kent Tuttle on the all-tournament team.

2008 RECAP

Two All-America honorees, a 12-match win streak to open the season, and a chance at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Tournament Championship were only three of the highlights in the successful 2008 BYU men's volleyball campaign.

The Cougars finished the season with a record of 25-5 overall and 20-5 against top-15 opponents. BYU also went 18-4 in MPSF regular-season action, earning the team a No. 2 seed in the conference tournament.

BYU was up two sets to none against the No. 5 seed Pepperdine in the MPSF Tournament championship match and had a swing for the win. Despite the large lead, the Cougars were unable put the match away. The Waves won the next three sets, and BYU's remarkable season came to an unexpected close. Seniors Ivan Perez and Jonathan Charette were named to the All-Tournament team and each had 20 kills in the match.

The CBS College Sporst Network/AVCA Division I-II Men's Coaches Poll featured BYU at the No. 1 spot for the first 10 full weeks of the season. The Cougars spent only one week out of the top three in the nation before finishing the year at No. 4.

Much of the team's success was attributed to the senior-heavy roster and amount of experience among the players.

Among those seniors were three-time AVCA Division I-II Men's Volleyball All-Americans Russell Holmes and Perez. Holmes was recognized with First Team honors and Perez was named to the Second Team in 2008. Holmes and Perez were also named First Team All-MPSF and were joined by Sorensen as an Honorable Mention.

As a team, the 2008 BYU squad left its mark on the record books. It set a new school record with 1,178 digs as a team (previous record -- 994), finished third in school history in total blocks (342.5), tied for fourth in school history in service aces (115), and finished fifth in the record books in assists (1,631) (all records as of 2001 when rally scoring began).

Individually, there were also two Cougars who set school records. Perez set a school record with 16 digs in three sets against Stanford, Feb. 23 (rally scoring rules). His 236 digs on the season beat the school's previous all-time rally-scoring record, yet is second only to the 249 digs his teammate Joel Silva racked up in 2008 as well. Perez is also atop BYU's all-time digs list with 672 and total games played list with 391.

COACHES OR PLAYERS?

BYU's entire coaching staff is coaching at its alma mater. Head coach Shawn Patchell starred for the Cougars in his playing days (1990-93) while assistant coach Rob Neilson earned All-MPSF honors for BYU in 2006.

HEAD COACH SHAWN PATCHELL



With a career record of 48-11, Shawn Patchell is in his third year as head coach and seventh year overall as a member of BYU's staff. Patchell came to BYU from Laguna Beach High School where he was head coach for both the boys and girls volleyball teams.

In addition to his BYU coaching responsibilities, Patchell was selected to be the 2008-09 Junior National Team Head Coach. The Junior National Team competed in El Salvador last summer where they took the bronze medal and qualified for the World Championships held in India

in 2009. Patchell also coached the Youth National Team at the FIVB World Championships in Mexico in 2007, the first US team to qualify and participate in the Youth World Championships. In 2006 Patchell assisted the Youth National Team to a win over Cuba and a silver medal at the Dominican Republic NORCECA tourny which qualified team USA for the World Championships.

During the summer of 2005, Patchell coached the US World University Games team.

A member of BYUs first NCAA mens volleyball team, Patchell was a starter from 199093 and recorded a .398 career hitting percentage. In 1992, Patchells junior year, he led the nation in hitting percentage at .488 and was honored as AllAcademic Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association. He was ranked fourth and 10th nationally in hitting and blocking his senior year. Patchell played professionally in Spain for the Euro Cup qualifier and No. 1ranked Gran Canaria Team in the Canary Islands and also represented the US in the Federation International Volleyball Association Sand Volleyball Circuit in Europe.

Patchell earned his BA in English with a minor in business management from BYU in 1993 and a masters degree in English Literature from the University of California at Irvine in 2000. He is a parttime member of the BYU English Department and Business School where he teaches literature and composition classes. Shawn and his wife Davis enjoy being outdoors with their four children: Jordan (12), Sage (10) Soren (6) and Kai (1).

LAST YEAR AGAINST UC SAN DIEGO

The No. 1 BYU men's volleyball team kicked off the 2008 season with a bang in San Diego with a 3-1 victory over UC San Diego and looked to remain perfect through the weekend with another match at UCSD on Saturday.

Senior opposite Jonathan Charette, a native of Fullerton, Calif., led the team with 16 kills, a .375 hitting percentage and nine digs. All-American senior middle blocker Russell Holmes of Fountain Valley, Calif., had nine kills and a .429 hitting percentage.

"It was a battle," BYU interim head coach Shawn Patchell said after the match. "We got the 'W' in the end, so we're pleased. We were up in the third game, but they caught all the momentum and made big plays when they needed to. In the fourth we were behind. Our seniors played like seniors in the end and led the way in a very tightly contested set."

BYU controlled the first match and won 30-21, but UCSD kept the next three games close. The Cougars won the second match 30-28, but dropped the third 27-30. In the forth and final match BYU tightened its play and won 31-29, preventing UCSD from forcing the first fifth game ever between the two teams. The Cougars retain a perfect record against the Tritons and improve to 23-0 all-time against the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation opponent.

Starting setter and 2007's National Newcomer of the Year Yamil Perez went down with an injury in the fourth game, but Patchell praised senior setter Brian Congelliere for his performance in taking Perez' place on the court.

Neither Ivan Perez nor Joel Silva were in attendance at the match as both are currently playing for their respective national teams of Puerto Rico and Venezuela. Patchell also credited sophomore outside hitter Mat Taylor of Orem, Utah and Leandro Silva of Sao Jose dos Campos, Brazil for starting in place of Ivan Perez and Silva and performing well.

"We missed those guys," Patchell said. "They're good enough to play on their national teams, but the guys that filled in for them stepped up and came through for us when we needed them to."

April 12, 2008

The first weekend of play for the No. 1 BYU men's volleyball team ended with a three-game sweep, 30-27, 30-22, 30-28, at UC San Diego as the team improved to 2-0 in the young season. Sophomore Andrew Stewart (Sandy, Utah) led both teams with 15 kills.

The sweep marked the 18th time in 24 matches that the Cougars have blanked the Tritons. BYU beat UCSD Friday in four games, and the two teams have never faced off in a fifth-game situation.

"We played well tonight," BYU head coach Shawn Patchell said. "It was a good win. UCSD is a good team, and we had to play well to beat them in three games. Stewart had another great night. His percentage was phenomenal, and he was the one who came through in the crunch."

Stewart recorded a hitting percentage of .591. All-American senior middle blocker Russell Holmes had 11 kills, a .688 hitting percentage, and 15 total points. Senior opposite Jonathan Charette also got into double figures with 10 kills of his own and a .400 hitting percentage.

The second game was the Cougar's best of the night. The team as a whole hit .667 and did not record an error in the game. UCSD was up 27-26 in the third, but BYU edged back into the lead and sealed the game with a kill then a block from Stewart for the final two points of the contest.

Neither Ivan Perez nor Joel Silva were in attendance at the match as both are currently playing for their respective national teams of Puerto Rico and Venezuela.

The Cougars' next match will be at Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne, of IPFW, next Friday at 7 p.m. CST. The team will then play at Lewis on Saturday at 7 p.m. CST before heading home to face Cal Baptist on Jan. 25 and 26 in the team's first home matches of the 2008 season.
