#### ON THE TUBE

Saturday's game will be broadcast live to a national television audience on The Mtn. James Bates and Todd Christensen will be up in the booth while Toby Christensen will report from the sidelines.

#### WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU has won six-straight games against Wyoming, including eight in a row dating back to the late 1980s at LaVell Edwards Stadium. BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall has never lost to the Cowboys, going 5-0. Since Mendenhall took over, BYU has outscored Wyoming 222-38, with 21 Wyoming points coming in 2005 alone. In those five wins, Wyoming has 17 turnovers to BYU's zero.
- In the last two meetings between BYU and Wyoming, the Cougars have outscored the Cowboys 96-0, including a 52-0 win in 2009 and a 44-0 victory in 2008. BYU forced nine turnovers in the two games while giving up zero.
- All five of Wyoming's losses have come against teams ranked in the Top 25 at some point this season (Texas, Boise State, Air Force, TCU and Utah). The Cowboys have played the fifth-toughest schedule in the nation, according to Sagarin computer ratings.

To compare, four of BYU's five losses (Florida State, Air Force, Nevada and TCU) have come to teams ranked this season. The Cougars have played the fourth-toughest schedule in the nation, also according to Sagarin.

- Freshman quarterback Jake Heaps will start his fourth game, tied for second-most among BYU freshman quarterbacks all-time. Heaps already owns BYU freshman records for most pass completions and pass attempts and is second for most wins and third for most passing yards.

# THE BYU-WYOMING SERIES

BYU has simply dominated its series with Wyoming in recent memory. The Cowboys have not scored against the Cougars in the last nine-straight quarters of play. Since 2006, BYU has defeated Wyoming by an average score of 46.5-4.3 and outgained the Pokes in total yardage by an average of 464.5-225.3. The two teams challenged each other every year from 1929-1992 (excluding the war years) and every year since 1999, with the Cougars leading the series, 43-30-3 overall.

## LAST TIME: BYU 52, WYOMING O (2009)

LARAMIE, Wyo. (Nov. 7, 2009) – Highlighted by an impressive performance from quarterback Max Hall, No. 25 BYU dominated Wyoming 52-0 in Laramie to improve to 7-2 on the year and 4-1 in the Mountain West Conference.

Hall completed 20-of-22 passes for 312 yards and a season-high four touchdowns while rushing for an additional 30 yards in just over two quarters of action Saturday at War Memorial Stadium. His 90.9 percent completion percentage was just shy of the Steve Sarkisian's school-record 91.2 percent against Fresno State in 1995.

After missing the last four games due to injury, wide receiver McKay Jacobson made his presence known in his return, totaling 100 yards receiving, including a 79-yard touchdown reception. All-American tight end Dennis Pitta also set a school record by making a catch in 39 consecutive games, moving past former standout wide receiver Glen Kozlowski on BYU's all-time list.

The Cougars were dominating from the opening kickoff, scoring on all five first-half possessions while not allowing a Wyoming first down until the second quarter. In the first quarter, BYU totaled 175 yards of total offense to go up 10-0 while the Cougar defense held Wyoming without a single yard on its six offensive plays from scrimmage.

Running back J.J. Di Luigi was a top performer early for the Cougars, totaling 72 receiving yards on three catches in the first quarter. BYU opened the game with an 80-yard drive that was capped off with Hall finding Di Luigi down the right sideline for a 44-yard scoring play.

#### WYOMING LAST TIME: UTAH 30, WYOMING 6

LARAMIE, Wyo. - Jordan Wynn passed for 230 yards and two touchdowns, Matt Asiata ran for 109 yards and No. 11 Utah remained unbeaten with a 30-6 win over Wyoming on Saturday.

The Utes were held below their 49-point scoring average mostly due to three interceptions thrown by Wynn, including two in the end zone. But they still had no problem with Wyoming.

The Utes (6-0, 3-0 Mountain West) now will be heavily favored next week against Colorado State before testing their BCS credentials against No. 23 Air Force, No. 4 TCU and Notre Dame.

Wyoming (2-5, 0-3) ended an eight-quarter scoring drought and scored its first fourth-quarter points this season when backup quarterback Dax Crum threw a 10-yard TD pass.

#### BYU'S LAST OUTING



FORT WORTH, Tex. (Oct. 16, 2010) — No. 4 TCU earned a 31-3 home victory over BYU on Saturday at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

BYU's injury-riddled defense played well against TCU's high-scoring offense, but the hometown Horned Frogs used their No. 1-ranked defense to stifle the Cougar offensive attack and improve to 7-0 on the year. With the loss, BYU falls to 2-5 overall and 1-2 in the Mountain West Conference.

The BYU defense held strong against TCU, holding the Horned Frogs to some of their lowest offensive totals of the season. The Cougars held TCU to 108 rushing yards, the Horned Frogs' lowest total of the season and far below their season average of 278.7 yards per game, seventh-best in the country. BYU also kept TCU 100 total offensive yards below its season average.

The Cougars set their strong defensive tone in the first half, holding a TCU team averaging 279 yards on the ground per game to just 37 rushing yards on 21 carries in the opening 30 minutes. The Horned Frogs had trouble getting on the scoreboard as well until scoring two late touchdowns on back-to-back short field possessions in the final two minutes of the half

Unfortunately for BYU, the Cougar offense could not get anything going against the nation's top defensive team, managing only one first down in the half and 13 total yards. TCU has led the NCAA in total defense each of the last two years and four times in the past 10 seasons.

#### TOUGHEST SCHEDULE IN THE COUNTRY?

BYU's 2010 schedule has proved to be one of the toughest among all FBS schools and is ranked the 4th-toughest in the nation by the Sagarin ratings. Four of BYU's five losses this season have come to opponents ranked in the national polls this season, including Nevada and Air Force and currently ranked No. 16/17 Florida State and No. 4/4 TCU. Those four schools have a combined record of 20-4, with two of the losses coming to Oklahoma, currently ranked No. 3 in both polls.

## BYU, GEORGIA TECH ANNOUNCE SERIES

PROVO, Utah (October 18, 2010) — Brigham Young University and Georgia Tech today announced the schools have agreed to a four-game football series beginning with the 2012 season.

The Cougars and the Yellow Jackets are scheduled to meet at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta on Oct. 13, 2012 and Oct. 11, 2014. Two games are also scheduled for LaVell Edwards Stadium in Provo, on Oct. 12, 2013 and Oct. 14, 2017.

"This should be a great series for our football program," said BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe. "As we fill our schedules for the coming years, we want to play storied football programs like Georgia Tech. It's a great opportunity for Cougar fans in the Southeast to see our football team play."

BYU and Georgia Tech have met twice previously, splitting a two-game series in 2002 and 2003. The Yellow Jackets defeated the Cougars 28-19 in Atlanta on Sept. 21, 2002, and BYU downed Georgia Tech 24-13 in the season opener the next year on Aug. 28, 2003 in Provo.

# MENDENHALL VS. RANKED FOES

Under Bronco Mendenhall, BYU is 4-8 vs. ranked foes, with its wins being a 31-17 victory over No. 15 TCU on Sept. 28, 2006, and three wins in 2009: a 14-13 win over No. 3 Oklahoma on Sept. 5, a 26-23 win over No. 21 Utah on Nov. 28 and a 44-20 win over No. 18 Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl on Dec. 22.

# BYU VS. BCS AQS

With its win against Washington in this year's season opener, BYU has defeated a team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference five-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 14 of the past 15 years dating back to 1996.

#### DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 44-4 when leading at halftime and 44-1 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter. Mendenhall's teams have won 28-straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 75 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987 when it lost 29-27 in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

#### **TEAM CAPTAINS**

BYU head football coach Bronco Mendenhall announced team captains for the 2010 season as well as several personnel notes entering the first week of the season.

Senior safety Andrew Rich and junior offensive tackle Matt Reynolds have been selected to serve as team captains. Both Rich and Reynolds have played in all 26 games the past two seasons and enter their third year as a starter for the Cougars.

Rich has started in 16 games and earned All-MWC Second Team honors in 2009. He is a 2010 Lott Trophy Award candidate. Reynolds has started all 26 games of his career and is a preseason All-American, Lombardi Trophy and Outland Trophy candidate in 2010. He was a Freshman All-American in 2008 and a CFN All-Sophomore selection in 2009 while earning first-team all-conference accolades.

BYU has also tabbed a special team captain for several games this year with holder Matt Marshall named captain against Washington while Riley Stephenson was a captain at Air Force.

## MOVE FORWARD, NOT BACKWARD

As a team, the Cougars are one of the least penalized squads in the nation, averaging just 4.86 penalties per game, tied for 14th among all FBS schools and third in the MWC. BYU's average of 35.0 penalty yards per game is 8th in the nation and the best in the conference. Against Nevada, BYU had one turnover for minus-five yards.

## CHAMBERS SUSPENDED FROM TEAM

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 18, 2010) — BYU head football coach Bronco Mendenhall today announced that junior wide receiver O'Neill Chambers has been suspended indefinitely for disciplinary reasons and will not participate with the team for the remainder of the 2010 season.

Chambers appeared in five of BYU's seven games this season, missing two games for a prior disciplinary suspension. In addition to five receptions for 48 yards as a receiver, Chambers totaled 316 yards on 15 kick returns and 45 yards on five punt returns.

#### YOUNG (NOT STEVE)

BYU's young, injury-riddled team this year has had 22 different players without prior starting experience start a game this season. On defense, 13 different players have started for the first time while on offense nine players have made their first-ever starts (see page 25).

The Cougars have played 17 freshmen this season, six of whom have started at least one game this year. True freshman quarterback Jake Heaps, running back Joshua Quezada and wide receiver Cody Hoffman have become regular starters on the offensive side of the ball while four freshman tight ends have caught at least one pass while rotating responsibilities.

#### YOU CAN'T HAVE IT

The BYU offense held the ball for a whopping 45:01 in its game against San Diego State, holding the Aztecs to 14:59 time of possession, all Mountain West Conference records. The Cougars' opening drive of the game lasted 8:28, going 19 plays and covering 78 yards for a touchdown, BYU's longest drive of the season. SDSU had just one drive lasting over three minutes, with 9-of-12 Aztec drives lasting less than two minutes. BYU held the ball for at least 10 minutes each quarter of the game.

# 2010 BYU FOOTBALL FIRESIDES

These firesides are a way for all of us to help consider our priorities through understanding the purpose of life."

There are 51 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 16 different countries, including Argentina, Bulgaria, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, Costa Rica, Ghana, Guatemala, Japan, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Russia, South Africa and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of eight different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Japanese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish and Tagalog.

#### SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga, is one of 74 players (62 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 24 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, England, Germany, India, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, Mozambique, New Zealand, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 18 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, Nevada, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and Washington.

Overall, 54 current members of the BYU football team speak a total of 17 different foreign languages and dialects, including Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

# WHAT IS A MISSION?

- \* The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- \* The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and John in the book of Acts).
- \* More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- \* Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- \* Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- \* Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Dominican Republic, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, the Philippines, South Africa and Spain.
  - \* Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- \*A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- \* In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- \* Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions except for their transportation to and from their field of labor and are not paid for their services.
- \* Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ

#### LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,725-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. Beginning in 2010, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63.275 after seating was removed to allow for additional wheelchair access.

## "FAN"TASTIC FANS

The attendance in BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sell-outs at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

#### TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWD

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah last season is currently tenth with 64,301 fans attending the game.

## **RUN, THEN RUN AGAIN**

The BYU offense compiled 62 rushing attempts for 271 yards against San Diego State, both new season highs. The Cougars' 62 rushing attempts are the most for the program since Nov. 23, 1996, when BYU rushed 63 times in a 37-17 win at Utah. It is also the 11th-highest number of carries by an FBS team this season. The last time BYU rushed for at least 270 yards as a team was last year against UNLV when the Cougars rushed for 291 yards. BYU's top three runners each set new career highs in rushing attempts and yards against the Aztecs.

#### FIRST FRESHMAN RECORD FALLS

Freshman quarterback Jake Heaps broke the BYU freshman quarterback record for most pass completions, completing his 109th pass against TCU to pass Matt Berry's previous record. Against Wyoming, Heaps will start his fourth game, tied for second-most among BYU freshman quarterbacks all-time. Heaps already owns BYU freshman records for most pass completions and pass attempts and is second for most wins and third for most passing yards.

# WHO NEEDS MARIO?

Junior running back JJ Di Luigi has led BYU in rushing six of the Cougars' seven games while also gaining the most receiving yards in three of the team's games. The junior currently leads the team in rushing yards, recieving yards and all-purpose yards and is second in scoring and total offense and fourth in kickoff returns.

Against SDSU, Di Luigi rushed for a career- and game-high 134 yards while averaging 6.1 yards on 22 carries in BYU's win. Di Luigi added 23 yards on three catches to total 157 all-purpose yards on the day—the third time this season he has totaled more yards than any other player on the field from either team. Di Luigi scored a 3-yard touchdown on BYU's opening drive converting one of his five first downs on the day with a critical 4-yard gain on a third-and-four play. On the day, he was a perfect 4-for-4 in converting third down opportunities. Di Luigi later ran for 40 yards on four carries to fuel BYU's fourth quarter touchdown. Di Luigi had two carries over 30 yards on the day, including a career-long 46-yard gallop.

#### A LONG ROAD

Defensive lineman Vic So'oto has come a long way to his spot in the starting lineup after originally joining the team in 2005. So'oto came in to the program as a tight end, playing in 11 games. After redshirting in 2006, So'oto enjoyed a sophomore season in which he saw action in all 13 games at both tight end and on special teams, grabbing 12 receptions for 124 yards.

It was after So'oto's sophomore year that the BYU coaching staff asked So'oto to switch sides of the ball, converting the tight end to a linebacker. Unfortunately, So'oto suffered a season-ending injury in just the second game of the season at Washington. After receiving an extra year of eligibility, So'oto returned in 2009, this time as a defensive lineman, backing up Mountain West Conference career sack leader Jan Jorgensen.

In 2010, So'oto has started every game and is seventh on the team in total tackles in addition to four tackles-for-loss, two sacks, three quarterback hurries and one interception.

#### SAME STARTERS

For the first time this season, the BYU defense started the same 11 players in back-to-back games versus San Diego State and TCU. Numerous injuries have been a key factor in the constant shakeup, with 13 players getting the first starts of their careers on the defensive side this year.

#### RICH ROLLING

Senior and team captain Andrew Rich is ranked 9th in the nation with an average of 6.14 solo tackles per game and is tied for 18th in the nation in total tackles per game at 10.3, both marks good for first in the MWC. Rich, who has seen time at both safety positions this year, has led BYU in tackles games while battling various injuries. He totaled a career-high 14 tackles against both Air Force and Nevada and 13, including a career-high 10 solo tackles, against TCU. Rich, a former walk-on from Snow College, entered the 2010 season as the top returner on the team in solo tackles, assisted tackles, total tackles and interceptions.

#### RESULTS WERE NEGATIVE

After holding San Diego State to minus-2 yards in the first half last week, the BYU defense held TCU to just 37 yards rushing on 21 carries in the first half. TCU's 108 yards rushing was easily the Horned Frogs lowest of the season, with the previous season low coming against SMU with 190 yards. TCU averaged 278.7 rushing yards a game coming in against BYU, good for 7th-best in the nation.

# STEPPING IN, STEPPING UP

Linebacker Jadon Wagner and safety Travis Uale totaled 10 tackles apiece at Utah State replacing regular starters James Frazier and Steven Thomas, respectively. The numbers were career highs for both defenders and the top two marks for the Cougars. The two players also started at TCU.

### TREE GROWS IN PROVO

Sophomore middle linebacker Brandon Ogletree started for the second time this season against San Diego State. Ogletree made a key interception on the first play of San Diego State's second possession, setting up BYU's second touchdown of the game after returning the pick 11 yards to the SDSU 24-yard line. In the fourth quarter, Ogletree twice made critical plays to help BYU maintain its advantage, first bringing down the MWC's leading rusher Ronnie Hillman for no gain on second-and three; later, with SDSU trailing by only three with three minutes to go in the game, Ogletree broke up the SDSU third-and-10 pass attempt to force a punt and allow the Cougars to run out the clock for the win.

#### MIGHTY HUNTER

Linebacker Shane Hunter led all players with a career-high 13 tackles against Utah State, including a BYU season-high 10 assisted tackles. Hunter has also come up with two of BYU's four turnovers created this season, recovering a fumble against Florida State and intercepting a pass at Air Force.

# **DISTANT COUSIN**

Deep snapper Reed Hornung comes to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. An award given beginning this season is named in his honor and will be awarded to the best all-around player in college football. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

# STEPHENSON NAMED MWC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU's Riley Stephenson earned Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week honors for his performance in the Cougars' season-opening victory over Washington.

The sophomore punter/kicker helped BYU control the field-position battle in the Cougars' 23-17 win, making the Huskies start inside the 15-yard line on three of six punts and inside the 20 on three of five kickoffs. Stephenson's six punts tied a career high.

# HERE COMES THE BOOM

MWC honorable mention honoree Riley Stephenson returns at punter for BYU after a successful freshman campaign. Stephenson is known for his ability to place punts near the goalline, putting eight kicks inside the 20 last season. The sophomore can also boom kicks when needed, totaling eight punts over 50 yards in 2009, including a career-high and BYU bowl game record 60-yard punt against Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl.

# IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 151 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9, 2006 when freshman McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards against Wyoming at Edwards Stadium. Forty-nine games have passed since then.

#### PAYNE SETS BYU RECORD

On his first of three PATs against San Diego State, senior kicker Mitch Payne passed former Cougar kicker Kurt Gunther (1980-82) for most PAT conversions in a career in BYU history, sending home his 163rd career conversion through the uprights. Payne is also currently 8 PAT attempts from passing Gunther's mark of 179 in the BYU record books. He is also 53 points away from scoring the most points of any Cougar player in BYU history, a record currently held by kicker Owen Pochman (1997-00) with 333 points.

In the MWC record books, Payne is 32 points away from passing his brother for first all-time in career kicking points. Payne kicked the third-most extra points in a season in MWC history in 2009 with 59 PATs. He also holds the MWC record for juniors for most PATs made in a game, converting eight against UNLV in 2009. With 59 PATs last season, Payne also became the BYU and Mountain West Conference career PATs made leader with 156, surpassing his brother Matt's record of 150 career PATs made.

#### PERFECT PAYNE

Senior kicker Mitch Payne kicked a 27-yard field goal against TCU, keeping him perfect inside the 30-yard line in his career. Payne has made 23-of-23 attempts inside the 30, including 8-of-8 this season.

#### STEPHENSON KICKS CAREER HIGH

BYU sophomore Riley Stephenson averaged 48.0 yards while punting a career-most seven times during BYU's game at TCU. He booted five of his seven punts more than 50 yards to help total a career-high 336 punting yards on the day. Two of his punts sailed a season-high 59 yards, one yard off his career mark, while he also had punts of 54, 53, and 50 yards.

#### CHAMBERS SETS BYU CAREER RECORD

Junior kick returner O'Neill Chambers became the Cougars' all-time career leader in kickoff return yardage on Saturday against TCU, taking five returns a total of 112 yards to give him 1,612 on his career. Chambers passed Mike Rigell (1998-01) who had 1,545 career return yards.

#### **FALSLEV TAKES OFF**

#### BRONCO MENDENHALL SIXTH SEASON

During his first five seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three losing seasons. Mendenhall has guided his teams to five straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and consistent national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, the Cougars earned a 49-15 record in his first five years--the best record of any first-time head coach over the past five seasons and a mark topped by only 11 coaches overall. Mendenhall's .766 wining percentage entering the season ranked No. 4 among all active FBS head coaches with at least five years of experience. Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in three of the last four years while achieving a 43-9 record in that span, a ledger topped by only four other teams--Boise State, Florida, Texas and Ohio State. In doing so, the Cougars have achieved four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

While recording an 11-2 record and 7-1 league mark, Mendenhall's 2009 team went 3-1 against ranked opponents, incluing a 14-13 season-opening win over No. 3 Oklahoma and a 44-20 season finale Maaco Bowl Las Vegas victory over No. 16 Oregon State. BYU finished No. 12 in the final polls to earn its highest finish since 1996 and earn the distinction of being one of only six programs nationally to be ranked in both the final polls the past four seasons. At No. 14 in the final 2009 BCS standings, Mendenhall's Cougars are one of just seven programs to finish in the final BCS standings the past four year and the only program to do so from a non-automatic qualifying

Cougars to back-to-back 11-win seasons and claimed consecutive MWC titles with a combined record of 16-0 against league opponents.

In 2008, BYU posted a 10-2 regular season to achieve three straight 10-win seasons for only the third time in school history. In doing so, Mendenhall's teams became the first in Cougar history to go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons.

The Cougars have received five straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first five teams to a bowl game.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, Mendenhall was named by the Football Writers Association of America one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

In 2007, BYU finished the season ranked No. 17 in the final BCS standings--three places higher than the 2006 Cougars. In the final polls of the season, BYU finished ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Poll. Defensively, BYU ranked 9th in the nation, allowing just 18.5 points per game.

In 2008, BYU earned a spot in the national polls each week of the season, including a ranking as high as No. 7. With just two regular-season blemishes on its resume with road losses at No. 6 Utah and No. 11 TCU, BYU earned a No. 16 ranking in the final BCS standings and an invitation to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl.

> Off the field, BYU has had five Academic All-Amerian citations in the past two seasons. In 2008, only Penn State (4) placed more student-athletes on the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America First Team. Cougar starters David Oswald (offensive tackle), Matt Bauman (linebacker) and Kellen Fowler (safety) each earned the high honor as BYU had three first-teamers for the first time during the same season. In 2009. Scott Johnson earned first-team honors and Bauman was a second-team selection.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.
