COUGARS TO PLAY CALIFORNIA IN LAS VEGAS BOWL

BYU (6-5 overall, 5-3 Mountain West Conference) will travel to Las Vegas to take on California (7-4 overall, 4-4 Pacific-10) in the Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Bowl. The game will be played at Sam Boyd Stadium (36,800) and televised on ESPN at 5 p.m. (PST). The game will be the BYU's 24th bowl appearance, and its first Las Vegas Bowl appearance. The last time the Cougars were in a bowl was 2001, when BYU lost to Louisville in the Liberty Bowl. The game will be BYU's ninth appearance in Sam Boyd Stadium, where the Cougars are 7-1. They are 6-0 in Vegas against UNLV and 1-1 in Western Athletic Championship games. BYU is coming off a 41-34 overtime loss to the University of Utah. The Cougars fell behind early and trailed 24-3 at the half but outscored the Utes 31-10 in the second half to force overtime. Utah scored on its first drive in overtime and BYU failed to convert.

A LOOK AT THE GOLDEN BEARS

California concluded the 2005 regular season with a 27-3 win over Stanford in Palo Alto, Calif. After leading 6-3 at the half, the Golden Bears put the game away with a 21-0 second half. Steve Levy passed for 125 yards and one touchdown while Marshawn Lynch rushed for 123 yards and one touchdown. California limited the Cardinal to 327 yards of total offense and just 3.9 yards per play. Lynch leads the Golden Bears with 1,052 yards rushing and seven touchdowns while Justin Forsett is close behind with 962 yards and six touchdowns. Forsett averages 7.8 yards per carry while Lynch averages 6.1 yards per carry. Joe Ayoob leads California with 1,707 passing yards and 15 touchdown passes. DeSean Jackson is the team's leading receiver with 471 yards and five touchdowns. The Golden Bears have been solid on defense all year, limiting their opponents to 20.5 points per game and 351.6 yards of total offense. California has recorded 80 tackles for loss, including 31 sacks.

COMPLETE BROADCAST PLANS

TELEVISION: The Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Bowl will be broadcast by ESPN on Thursday, Dec. 22 starting at 5 p.m. (PST). It will mark BYU's first appearance on ESPN this season. Shawn McDonough will call the action, Mike Gottfried will offer analysis and Alex Flanigan will report from the sidelines.

RADIO: Fans can also catch the game by tuning into KSL Radio, 1160 AM and 102.7 FM, and follow the game live as Greg Wrubell calls the action, Marc Lyons offers expert analysis and James Dye reports from the sideline. Sports USA Radio will broadcast the game nationally with Larry Kahn calling the play-by-play, John Robinson offering analysis and Troy West reporting from the sidelines.

SERIES INFORMATION

BYU is 25-52-1 all-time against current Pac-10 teams, including a 2-0 record against California. The first meeting between the Cougars and the Golden Bears was in 1999, a game BYU won 38-28 in Provo. The second meeting was in 2001 in California and the Cougars won 44-16. The Cougars are 1-1 against Pac-10 teams in bowl games, including a 38-36 win over Washington State in the 1981 Holiday Bowl and a 31-10 loss to UCLA in the 1986 Freedom Bowl. The Cougars did not play any Pac-10 teams and California did not play any MWC teams in 2005.

BYU-CALIFORNIA CONNECTIONS

- California Athletic Director Sandy Barbour served as the athletics director at Tulane University during the 1998 season when BYU played Tulane at the Liberty Bowl.
- BYU Athletics Director Tom Holmoe served as the head football coach at Cal for five seasons.
- BYU Head Coach Bronco Mendenhall will be coaching his first game against Cal; however, it will actually be the fifth time Mendenhall has faced the Golden Bears.
- The 2005 Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Bowl will mark the fifth time California Head Coach Jeff Tedford has faced the Cougars.
- Current BYU offensive coordinator, Robert Anae, served as the offensive line coach at Texas Tech last season.
- BYU is 1-1 against the Pac-10 in post-season bowl games.



BRONCO MENDENHALL



After 16 seasons as an assistant coach, including the past two years as the defensive coordinator for the Cougars, Bronco Mendenhall was promoted to head football coach at Brigham Young University on December 13, 2004. Mendenhall becomes the 14th head coach since the University first officially recognized football as an intercollegiate sport in 1922.

Mendenhall (38)--one of the youngest NCAA Division I-A head coaches in the country--has served the past two seasons as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach for the Cougars. During his first season in Provo, Mendenhall engineered the nation's 14th-ranked defense, holding opponents to just 307 yards per game. Under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars ranked eighth nationally in passing defense, giving up just 176.17 yards per game.

In 2004, the Cougars ranked third in the Mountain West in rushing defense, allowing 149.3 yards per game. The Cougars also ranked second in the league, with 34 sacks for a combined loss of 232 yards.

A native of Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1989 at his alma mater, Oregon State. After earning his master's degree in 1990, he moved to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he served as the secondary coach and defensive coordinator from 1991-92 under current BYU assistant coach Paul Tidwell. Following two seasons with the Badgers, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Northern Arizona, where the Lumberjacks boasted the top-ranked defense in the Big Sky Conference. He was elevated to co-defensive coordinator for the 1994 season.

In 1995, Mendenhall returned to Oregon State to become the defensive line coach under then defensive coordinator Rocky Long. When Long left to become the defensive coordinator at UCLA, Mendenhall was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 1996 season. At just 29 years of age, Mendenhall was the youngest defensive coordinator in Pac-10 history.

In 1997, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Louisiana Tech where he helped the Bulldogs to a remarkable 9-2 record as his defensive unit was credited with 17 interceptions, allowing just 15 touchdowns on the season.

In 1998, Mendenhall moved to Albuquerque, N.M., to become the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Mexico. Over the next five seasons, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West Conference in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in both the 2000 and 2002 season, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

At New Mexico, Mendenhall played a valuable role in the development of the 1999 Mountain West Player of the Year, Consensus All-American and first-round NFL Draft pick Brian Urlacher. The ninth overall selection in the 2000 NFL Draft, Urlacher was voted the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a Pro Bowl selection. Urlacher was one of two rookies to play all 16 games, starting at middle linebacker the final 14 games to establish a team record for starts at the position by a rookie. He shattered Bears rookie records with 165 total tackles and eight sacks, making him the second Chicago first-year player to lead the team in tackles. Urlacher finished his collegiate career ranked third on New Mexico's all-time list with 442 tackles.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many

accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to the former Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple have three sons: Cutter (5), Breaker (3) and Raeder (18 mo.).

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff leads the Mountain West Conference with five members of its coaching staff who have played football in the National Football League or the old USFL. Associate Head Coach and running backs coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played for Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Robert Anae was drafted in the third round by the New Jersey Generals of the USFL. Quarterbacks coach Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49'ers in 2002 and also played with the Washington Redskins. Cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons where he played for three seasons. He also played for the Dallas Cowboys.

GOOD GRIEF, CURTIS BROWN

Junior running back Curtis Brown has racked up a team-leading 1,095 yards on 198 carries this season. Brown is the first Cougar to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season since Luke Staley turned in 1,582 yards during the 2001 season. Brown is only the seventh running back in BYU history to run for 1,000 yards in a single season. Against Utah, Brown recorded his 11th career 100-yard game as he registered 153 yards on 20 carries. Six of those 100-yard games have come during the 2005 season. With his performance against Utah, he passed Luke Staley, Jamal Willis, John Ogden and Lakei Heimuli for the most career 100-yard games in BYU history. Brown and Staley are the only two backs to reach the 10-game mark during their junior seasons.

QUARTER-BECK PASSES 3,000-YARD MARK

Junior quarterback John Beck has passed for 3,357 yards this season, marking the first 3,000-yard performance since Brandon Doman totaled 3,542 yards during the 2001 season. It is also only the fourth time in the past nine seasons a BYU quarterback has eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark. The 6-foot-2, 212-pound QB has also totaled 24 touchdown completions on the season, also marking the most touchdowns by a BYU quarterback since Doman completed 33 TD's during the 2001 season. (Of note: Doman serves as BYU's quarterbacks' coach. Doman is also the quarterback who engineered the Cougars' last two victories over Utah, defeating the Utes in both 2000 and 2001.)

SCORING MACHINE

Curtis Brown has produced five multiple-touchdown games this season, all in the last six games of the season. Four of those have come in the last four games of the season. He scored two against Colorado State, four against Air Force, two against UNLV, two against Wyoming and two against Utah. Against Air Force, he scored three in the fourth quarter, becoming the first Cougar to achieve the mark since Luke Staley in 2001. The four touchdowns scored in the game are the second most scored in a single game at BYU. Brown has 15 touchdowns on the season, including 14 rushing TD's and one touchdown reception. He is tied with Ronney Jenkins, Clay Brown and Roy Oliverson for the third most touchdowns scored in a season at BYU. He is one score behind Waymon Hamilton for second most touchdowns in a season. Hamilton scored 16 in 1981.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

BYU football players earned several conference player-of-the-week honors and a national player-of-the-week honor. Following are recaps of the honors:

JOHN BECK, MWC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (SEP. 25)

John Beck was named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week after posting a MWC record 517 yards passing in BYU's 51-50 loss to TCU. He completed 30-of-51 (.588) attempts, and became just the third player in league history to pass for over 500 yards in a game. Beck also tied a MWC single-game record with five touchdown passes. His third-quarter strike found wide receiver Todd Watkins for a 67-yard touchdown, marking the Cougars' longest score of the season. On the first play of the overtime period, Beck went to the corner of the end zone to find Watkins for the 25-yard touchdown, giving BYU a 50-44 lead in overtime.

HARLINE EARNS NATIONAL TIGHT END WEEKLY HONOR (Oct. 12)

After totaling over 100 yards receiving in back-to-back games against San Diego State and New Mexico, and helping BYU to a come-back win over New Mexico, tight end Jonny Harline was named the national John Mackey Tight End of the Week by the Nassau County Sports Commission (10/12/05). Against New Mexico, Harline grabbed a career-high 10 receptions and equaled a career-high 123 yards. A week earlier he had seven receptions for 123 yards against San Diego State. Harline is the first BYU tight end to record 246 yards over two games since Chris Smith totaled 284 yards over two games in 1990. Smith had 125 yards on eight receptions against Utah and eight receptions for 159 yards against Utah State. Gordon Hudson holds the tight end record for receiving yardage over a two-game stretch, posting 396 yards in two straight games during the 1981 season. He totaled 137 yards against Colorado State, followed by 259 yards against Hawaii the following week.

CURTIS BROWN, MWC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (OCT. 29)

Curtis Brown was named MWC Co-offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Air Force. He ran for a career-high 219 yards on 25 carries (8.8 yards per carry) and career-best four touchdowns in BYU's 62-41 victory over Air Force. Three of his four touchdowns came in the fourth quarter. Brown was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week in 2002 after his 217-yard, three-touchdown performance against Utah State.

JUSTIN LUETTGERODT, MWC DEF. PLAYER OF THE WEEK (NOV. 13)

Justin Luetterodt was credited with four of BYU's five turnovers, including three fumble recoveries and a late, game-clinching interception to lead the Cougars to a 35-21 victory over Wyoming. He totaled seven tackles (four solo) in the game, including one tackle for a loss of 11 yards. Luetterodt had one turnover in each quarter, with BYU converting his three fumble recoveries into 21 points. His third fumble recovery came at the Cougar 6-yard line with 1:59 remaining in the third quarter when Wyoming was threatening to tie the score at 28 apiece. Luetterodt's interception came on the Cowboys' final drive, which sealed the BYU victory. On the season, Luetterodt leads the Cougars with 9.0 tackles for a combined loss of 47 yards, including 4.5 sacks. He also leads the BYU roster with three interceptions and three fumble recoveries.

CURTIS BROWN, MWC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (NOV. 13)

Brown rushed for 153 yards on 25 carries (6.1 yards per carry) and had two touchdowns in BYU's 35-21 win at Wyoming. His first touchdown gave the game at 14 and his second gave the Cougars a 21-14 advantage. He also had two receptions for 24 yards. Brown tied a BYU record with his 10th 100-yard performance and is only the second Cougar running back, along with Luke Staley, to accomplish the feat during his junior season.

3,000 AND 1,000 IN THE SAME SEASON

John Beck and Curtis Brown became the first Cougar duo to pass for over 3,000 yards and rush for over 1,000 yards in the same season since 2001. The last time two players combined to reach that mark were Brandon Doman and Luke Staley in 2001. John Walsh and Jamal Willis are the only other duo to achieve the 3,000-1,000 plateau in the same season, which they accomplished in 1994. Following lists the duos and their yardage totals:

WHERE'S THE BEEF?

The BYU offensive line doesn't order salads when it goes out to eat. Each starter weighs over 300 pounds for an average of 325 and a total of 1,625 pounds. They will be going up against a California defensive line that weighs an average of 280 pounds. The Golden Bear offensive line weighs an average of 318.4 pounds while BYU's defensive line weighs an average of 285.25 pounds.

RUSHING DEFENSE

BYU held UNLV to just two yards rushing, tying Air Force for the best performance by a rush defense this season. The Falcons held the Rebels to two yards. That total is a season-best and marks the fourth time this season the Cougars have held an opponent to 70 yards (or less) rushing. The Cougars held Notre Dame to just 44 yards rushing, gave up just 30 yards against Colorado State and 70 against Eastern Illinois. The two yards rushing by UNLV is the least allowed by BYU since 1988 when the Cougars held Colorado State to minus 26.

ON THE AIR

The exclusive radio home of BYU Football and flagship of the Cougar Sports Network is KSL NEWSRADIO (1160 AM and 102.7 FM) in Salt Lake City. The "Voice of the Cougars" is Greg Wrubell, now in his 5th season as play-by-play commentator. A BYU alum, Wrubell joined the broadcast crew in 1992 as the sideline/locker-room reporter. He began calling BYU basketball games in 1996.

Joining Wrubell is game analyst and former BYU quarterback Marc Lyons. Lyons is a 24-year veteran of Cougar football broadcasts and co-host of the midweek "Bronco Mendenhall Show." A pair of BYU greats join the KSL Broadcast team this season, with two-time all-conference kick returner James Dye reporting from the sidelines and locker-room, and three-time NFL Pro-Bowl selection Chad Lewis joining Lyons and Dye on the pregame "Cougar Countdown Show." The gameday studio host is KSL's Scott Haws, a former BYU student-athlete and all-conference pitcher for the baseball Cougars.

Chief Engineer John Dehnel returns for his 21st season, while veteran statistician Ralph Sokolowsky and spotter Doug Martin complete the lineup in the booth.

KSL's game day coverage begins two hours prior to kickoff with the "Cougar Countdown Show." The "Cougar Pregame Scoreboard Show" starts the broadcast's second hour, with the "Cougar Pregame Coach's Show" 35 minutes prior to kickoff, followed by the "Cougar Kickoff Show."

After the game, KSL presents the "Cougar Postgame Scoreboard Show," followed by the "Cougar Locker Room Show," "Cougar Postgame Coach's Show," "Cougar Call-In Show" and "IFA Country Store Replay."

In-week programming includes, "Coach's Corner with Bronco Mendenhall and Greg Wrubell," Mondays and Thursdays at 8:45 am and "Cougar Matchup," Thursdays and Fridays at 8:15 am and 4:15pm. The "Bronco Mendenhall Show" airs Wednesdays at 7:00pm, while the "Coordinators' Corner" with coaches Barry Lamb and Robert Anae hits the air Thursdays at 7:00pm. KSL's Tom Kirkland co-hosts the "Bronco Mendenhall Show" on Wednesdays, while Rod Zundel host the "Coordinators' Corner" on Thursdays.

LONGEST DRIVE

In the second quarter, Curtis Brown scored his second touchdown against Wyoming to complete a 17-play, 89-yard drive that lasted 8:21. The drive was the longest of the season as far as time (8:21) and the 17 plays were the most for any drive. The 89 yards makes the drive the third longest of the year. Later in the game, the Cougars had a 94-yard, 10-play drive that lasted 5:46, marking the longest (yardage) drive of the season. The previous long was a 93-yarder against New Mexico.

BOWL EXPERIENCE

While this marks BYU's first bowl appearance since 2001, several Cougars have played in bowl games. Paul Walkenhorst is the lone member from this year's roster who played in the 2001 Liberty Bowl. He finished third on the team with 69 tackles during that season. Four members of this year's team played in the Motor City Bowl in 1999, including Chris Hale, Justin Maddux, T.J. Sitake and Fahu Tahī. Tahī led the team in rushing during the 1999 season and Hale caught the game-winning touchdown pass from Kevin Feterik against Washington.

LONGEST GAME

BYU played two of the longest games in its history in 2005. The TCU game lasted four hours and 42 minutes, the longest in Cougar football history since 2001 when the Cougars played at Hawai'i and lost 72-45. That game lasted four hours and 24 minutes. COUGARS IN THE NFL

BYU leads the MWC with 20 former players on NFL rosters. A total of 80 players from MWC schools are in the NFL. THE RANKED TEAMS

The Cougars' loss at No. 9 Notre Dame was their second against a ranked opponent this season. BYU started the season with a loss to then No. 22 Boston College. The Cougars are now 0-12 against ranked teams since defeating No. 23 Colorado State, 34-13, on Sept. 16, 1999. During that streak BYU is 0-3 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. BYU has not defeated a ranked opponent on the road since beating Arizona State, 13-10, on Sept. 20, 1997.

IT'S AUTOMATIC ... ALMOST

BYU, known traditionally for its high-octane offenses, rarely gets shutout. Until the Cougar's 3-0 loss to the University of Utah to end the 2003 season, BYU had scored in 361-consecutive games, which remains an NCAA record, dating back to the 1975 season. The Cougars started a new streak in 2004, scoring in every game and extending the streak to 22 games against Utah, Nov. 19, 2005. Since October 3, 1975, BYU has scored in 383-of-384 games.

YOUNG GUN

While Mendenhall has 16 years of assistant coaching experience, he is now a head coach for the first time in his career. Despite his extensive experience, he is the fourth youngest coach in NCAA Division I-A football at the age of 39. Mike Gundy of Oklahoma State is 38 and is one year, five months and 22 days younger than Mendenhall.

MOST POINTS IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

BYU's 62-point outing against Air Force marks the most points scored by a Mountain West Conference team this season. San Diego scored 52 points against San Jose State on Sept. 24. Air Force scored 41 points in the loss, including 27 points against the Cougars in the fourth quarter, marking the most points the Cougars have allowed in a single quarter this season. The previous high was 21 against Notre Dame and TCU.

BROTHERS DON'T SIT, BROTHERS GOTTA PLAY

BYU has a long tradition of several members from the same family suiting up to hit the gridiron. Brothers Lance, Jr. and Dallas Reynolds have started all 11 games this season. Lance, a senior, is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, awarded to the top center in the nation. Dallas, a freshman, was heavily recruited out of high school and joined the Cougars this season after serving an LDS mission in Seattle, Washington.

SCORELESS QUARTERS

Against Wyoming, BYU shut the Cowboys out in the second and fourth quarters. The Cougars have 12 quarter shutouts on the season.

SECOND HIGHEST SCORING REGULATION GAME

With 103 combined points in BYU's 62-41 win over Air Force, it was the second highest scoring regulation game and third highest scoring game in the NCAA this season, behind Ball State's 60-57 overtime-win over Western Michigan and Boise State's 70-35 win in regulation over Idaho. The Cougars were also part of the fourth highest scoring game of 2005 in their 51-50 loss to TCU. The last time BYU scored 62 points was in 2001 when the Cougars defeated Air Force 63-33 on October 20. The 62 points is the second highest total ever allowed by the Air Force. The Cougars' 63-point outing in 2001 marked the most points ever allowed by an Air Force team.

THE 100-YARD CLUB

Michael Reed's 50-yard reception in the fourth quarter against Air Force put him over the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career. He is the third Cougar to record over 100-yards receiving this season. Todd Watkins had 176 yards against TCU while Jonny Harline has recorded 100 or more yards three times, including 123 at San Diego State, 123 at New Mexico and 100 at Notre Dame. Should Reed have another 100-yard game this season, he will become only the second freshman receiver in BYU history to produce two 100-yard games during his freshman season. Matt Bellini is currently the only BYU receiver to have two 100-yard games during his freshman season (1987).

MOST YARDS SINCE...

With 383 passing yards and 300 rushing yards, BYU accumulated 683 yards of total offense against the Falcons. The combined total surpasses the 614 the Cougars had against TCU earlier this season and is the most yards BYU has amassed since November 1, 2001 when the Cougars had 694 in a 56-34 win over Colorado State. In that game, BYU had 410 rushing yards and 284 passing yards. The 300 rushing yards was the most for the Cougars since the 2001 Colorado State game.

SLOW START, GOOD FINISH

Since 1974, BYU has opened 13 seasons with a loss, including 2005. In those 13 seasons, the Cougars have had winning records in 12 and were .500 in the other. The last time BYU opened the season with a loss and had a losing record was 1973 when the team finished 5-6. On the other hand, BYU opened with a win from 2002-04 and finished with a losing record. MILESTONE VICTORY

The Cougars' 62-41 victory over Air Force marked the 250th all-time home victory for BYU. It also marked the 460th victory in the program's 83-year history.

PARTY LIKE ITS 1999 ... or 98

Several Cougars began their BYU football careers before the start of the 21st century, including Spencer White, Fahu Tahī, Nate Soelberg, Brian Sanders, Chris Hale and Matt Berry, who joined the team in 1999 and T.J Sitake, who joined the team in 1998, before serving missions. But they aren't the oldest Cougars. That honor belongs to Ryan Beck, who was born in 1979. Hale and Tahī both made big impacts in 1999. Hale made the game-winning 38-yard touchdown reception in the season opener against Washington at home. Tahī led the team in rushing yards, totaling 445 yards on 102 carries.

CALLED TO SERVE

There are currently 62 returned missionaries (59 percent) on the BYU roster who have served full-time, two-year missions for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in over 21 countries. Members of this year's team have served missions in Australia, Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, England, Germany, Guatemala, Nicaragua, Norway, Panama, Philippines, Portugal, Russia, Samoa, Spain, Tonga, United States and Uruguay. Members of this year's team can communicate fluently in at least 12 different languages. The Church of Jesus Christ operates more than 330 missions around the world with approximately 56,000 missionaries. There are four lettermen from last year's team who are currently serving missions, including Matt Bauman (Harrisburg, Pa.), R.J. Willing (Albuquerque, N.M.), Dennis Pitta (Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic) and Freshman All-American receiver Austin Collie (Buenos Aires, Argentina).

SCORING FIRST

BYU jumped out to a 7-0 lead over UNLV when Fahu Tahī scored on a one-yard run in the first quarter. It was the fifth consecutive game the Cougars scored first and the seventh time in nine games this season. BYU is 5-2 in those seven games.

COUGARS LEAD MWC IN HOME ATTENDANCE

BYU, which boasts the largest on-campus home stadium in the MWC, led the conference in home attendance in 2005 with an average of 58,204 in six games. In fact, the Cougars have led the conference in attendance in each season since the league was formed in 1999. Edward's Stadium has been the site of the 10 largest crowds in conference history. In BYU's seven seasons in the MWC, the average attendance at Edward's Stadium has been 60,943.

ROOKIE HEAD COACHES

Bronco Mendenhall became BYU's 14th head coach, the 13th man to hold the job, on Dec. 13, 2004. Cougar coaches have had varied levels of success in their first year at the helm. Four head coaches have enjoyed winning records at the beginning of their tenures, including Eddie Kimball (twice), LaVell Edwards and Gary Crowton. Two coaches won half of their games while the rest had losing seasons. Mendenhall finished his first regular season at 6-5. In their debut games, rookie coaches are 7-7. Following is a list of BYU football coaches' first year records.

THE 50-POINT PLATEAU

By scoring 55 points against UNLV, the Cougars scored 50-or-more points in consecutive games for the first time since 2001. BYU scored 62 against Air Force, for a total of 117 points in two games. The last time the Cougars scored at least 50 in back-to-back games was in 2001 when they had 59 at San Diego State and 56 versus Colorado State for a total of 115 points. The last time BYU had at least 117 points in two games was in 2001, when the Cougars had 63 against Air Force and 59 at San Diego State for a total of 122 points. BYU's 117 points was the most scored by any team in the nation during those two weeks. Texas scored 109, USC 106 and Boise State 105 over those two weeks. The 117 points is the third most scored in a two-week period in conference history. The top two are 122 point totals and were achieved by the Cougars in 2001. The first was came when the Cougars defeated Tulane (70-53) and Nevada (52-7). The second was against Air Force (63-33) and San Diego State (59-21).

NOT GONNA GET THESE GUYS OFF THE FIELD

BYU has 19 players with 11-or-more career starts. Paul Walkenhorst leads with 43. Walkenhorst started 33 from 2000-02 before injuries derailed him. He has started 10 games in 2005. Fahu Tahī's first starts date back further than anyone on the team as he started seven games as a freshman in 1999. Seven players have started all 11 games this season (Todd Watkins, Eddie Keele, Dallas Reynolds, Lance Reynolds, Brian Sanders, John Beck and Justin Luettergerodt). TURNOVER SWING

Prior to the Air Force game, the Cougars were last in the conference and 101st in the nation in turnover margin at -6. Against the Falcons, BYU forced five turnovers and had two giveaways. Over the next two games, the Cougars recorded 11 takeaways and just one turnover. The swing in turnovers gave BYU a +4 margin, good for second best in the conference and 39th in the nation.

MEIKLE NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

Junior receiver Nathan Meikle was named Academic All-District by ESPN the Magazine and the College Sports Information Directors of America. He was one of 24 athletes from 15 schools named to the District 8 team. A native of Idaho Falls, Idaho, Meikle is a business major with a 3.85 cumulative grade point average. Meikle is playing in his first season with the Cougars and has made an immediate impact. Through nine games, he has caught 24 passes for 199 yards, rushed seven times for 41 yards and returned 20 punts for 143 yards. His first-career touchdown came against Air Force on a 12-yard run in the first quarter that put the Cougars up 14-0.
