Additional Team Notes

- BYU went on a school record 16-game winning streak this season.
- As a team, the Cougars have hit 80 home runs this season, breaking the previous team record of 68 set by the 2005 squad.
- Ranked 2nd in the nation in home runs per game.
- Ranked 6th in the nation in slugging percentage (.528).
- The team needs to win at least three of its last five games to secure its third consecutive 40-win season.
- Dani Urincho-Snow, Christie Zinanti and Christina Gwyn's no-hitter against UVSC on April 10 was the first time in program history that more than one pitcher combined to throw a no-hitter. It was also only the fourth overall no-hitter in program history.

Additional Individual Notes

Jana Anderson:

The team's first pinch-running option ... has scored 13 runs this season ... second on the team with 10 stolen bases.

Monica Gonzales:

Recorded a season high of three hits and three runs against Longwood on March 24 ... has seven stolen bases out of nine attempts.

Christina Gwyn:

Team-leader with 142 strikeouts ... recorded a season-high nine strikeouts against Idaho State on March 31 ... has made 34 appearances and 30 starts ... was named Mountain West Conference Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 24.

Tracee Hoch:

Has had three 3-RBI games this season, but has not had more than two hits in any single game ... has been hit-by-pitch four times this season, the most of any Cougar ... has four stolen bases out of five attempts.

Shaylyn Jenkins:

In only 18 at-bats this season, Jenkins has recorded five hits and four RBI ... the freshman also hit her only home run of the season against Southern Utah on Feb. 9.

Cortney Nix-Clark:

Leads the team with 14 doubles after recording zero in 2006 ... Ianeta Le'i and Andi Ramirez hold the single-season record for doubles (both recorded 15 in 2006)...recorded season-highs of three hits and five RBI at University of Utah on April 14.

Jodi Norton:

Leads the MWC with 22 overall home runs (10 in conference games) and 55 RBI on the season ... has set a new BYU single-season home run record breaking the previous record of 21 set by Oli Keohohou in 2001 ... her two homers in both games at Utah on April 13th and 14th and her two home runs against Southern Utah on April 24th gives her a total of five career two-home run games, which ties her with Keohohou for the all-time record ... second on the team with 55 hits ... named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for the week of May 1 ... is ranked fourth in the nation in home runs per game ... ranked 22nd in the nation in RBI per game.

Stephanie Platt:

Has hit all four career home runs this season ... has scored 13 runs on the year and has recorded nine RBI.

Angeline Quiocho:

Leads the team with 15 stolen bases, five shy of the Cougars' single-season record set by Lindsey Hodgen-Kelly in 2000 ... is on pace to shatter BYU's all-time stolen base record of 40 also set by Hodgen-Kelly ... only two multiple stolen base games came against University of Illinois-Chicago (2) on Feb. 24 and Utah Valley State (2) on May 1 ... has started in all 51 games she's appeared in ... leads the team with 41 runs off of 49 total hits ... leads the team with 43 strikeouts ... was named MWC Player of the Week for the week of April 24.

Andrea Ramirez:

Has seen limited action due to three bulging discs in her back ... has had two four-RBI games this season (March 31 against Idaho State and April 21 at New Mexico).

Emi Snow:

Recorded a season-high four hits and four RBI in four at-bats against Colorado State on April 19 ... second on the team with 15 home runs after hitting a total of eight homers in her previous two season at BYU ... was named Moutain West Conference Player of the Week for the week of Feb. 20.

Daniela Urincho-Snow:

Recorded a season-high two home runs and four RBI against Utah Valley State on Feb. 10 ... from the pitcher's circle, has a 5-2 record (31-12 career) ... has struck out 23 in 41.1 innings of play this season ... 2005 MWC All-Conference and All-Tournament.

Jennifer Whiteley:

Leads the team in batting average (.418), hits (69), runs, triples (4) and on-base percentage (.478) ... leads the MWC in hits and batting average ... is BYU's all-time leader in triples (13) ... ranks third all-time at BYU in hits ... she is aiming to become just the fourth player in team history to finish a season above .400 ... is ranked the 29th toughest player in the nation to strike out by the NCAA ... named to 2006 MWC All-Conference team ... 2006 BYU Scholar Athlete ... 2006 CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Region second team ... 2005 Academic All-Conference ... 2005 MWC Scholar Athlete.

Christie Zinanti:

Recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts against University of Utah on April 27 ... second in the MWC with 18 wins ... two-time Mountain West Conference Pitcher of the Week for the weeks of April 17 and May 1.
