Cougars, Broncos to do Battle in Boise

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 14, 2006) – Coming off a hard loss to Southern Utah University last Friday, the BYU women's gymnastics team will travel to Boise State in their fourth road trip of the season February 20. The Cougars are 3-3 on the year.

"This is the time of the year when you're establishing yourself and finding out how good you really are. We're trying to get more solid, more consistent and more ready each meet," BYU coach Brad Cattermole said.

Despite reaching a season-high 194.050, and six gymnasts recording individual season and career highs, the Cougars fell to SUU 194.925 – 194.050 Friday.

In the first rotation at SUU, BYU achieved a season high on bars with 48.525, and Kacie Capra tied for first with a season-high 9.800. Capra also tied her career high with a 9.700 on vault, and recorded a season high in the all-around competition (38.950).

BYU recorded another season high of 48.875 in the floor routine. Sierra Jacobs (9.875) and Lisa Willis (9.800) both had season highs, and Dayna Smart had a career-high 9.850 on the event.

In injury updates for the Cougars, sophomore Aimee Walker Pond is out for the season after breaking her ankle at SUU. Freshman Haleigh Schofield tore her ACL in January and is redshirting this season and senior Kendra Stephenson tore her meniscus at SUU. There is no official word on how long she will be out.

Boise State will compete against Utah State and Seattle Pacific at home Friday, only three days before taking on BYU Monday. Boise State's season average is 190.425, while BYU holds a 192.756 season average.

Start time for the meet is 7 p.m. at the Boise State Pavilion. Stats updates after each event will be available on the schedule page of the women's gymnastics homepage on byucougars.com.

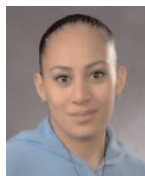
Cougar Notes

- This is BYU's fourth road meet of the season.
- **Vault:** Dayna Smart has led the Cougars in their last three meets. She posted a team-best 9.825 against Utah State.
- **Bars:** Sophomore Kylee Draper has posted the team's highest score (9.825). The Cougars recorded their best team score of the season (48.825) in their last meet against Southern Utah.
- **Beam:** Beam has been both BYU's strongest and weakest event this season. Smart and Kandis Kelly have posted the highest scores of the season at 9.875.
- **Floor:** The Cougars recorded a season-best 48.875 score at Southern Utah. Sierra Jacobs leads the team with a season-high 9.875.
- The last time the Cougars and Broncos faced off, Boise State won 194.225 - 193.900 in Boise.
- **Injury Update:** Sophomore Aimee Walker Pond is out for the season after injuring her ankle at Southern Utah. Freshman Haleigh Schofield is redshirting this season after hurting her knee in January. Senior Kendra Stephenson injured her knee exhibiting at SUU. There is no official word how long she will be out.

Bronco Notes

- Boise State's season high is 194.225. It came in a win over Southern Utah on February 3.
- The Broncos are entering their seventh meet this season.
- BSU is led by Junior Lindsay Ward. Ward, an NCAA Championship qualifier the last two seasons, leads the Broncos on bars and beam. She is also their best all-around participant. Seniors Katie Dinsmore and Kea Cuaresma have led the team on Vault. Freshman Taylor Jacobs has been a key contributor on floor.

Head Coach Brad Cattermole

Brad Cattermole begins his 18th season as the head coach of BYU gymnastics. Cattermole has quietly built the Cougar program into a respected national power.

Since taking over the program midway through the 1988 season, he promptly led the Cougars to the first 185 in school history. In 1998, the Cougars broke the 196 barrier for the first time, hitting a 196.325 against Utah in the final meet of the season in Provo. In 2000, once again in Provo, Cattermole's squad broke 196 for the second time, pulling off an upset victory over the University of Utah by a score of 196.05 to 195.975 in the last meet of the season. In 2001, the Cougars shattered all school records, surpassing the 196 mark five different times, a mark they had only reached three times in history. On March 16, 2001 against Utah State at home, BYU reached the 197 mark for the first time in history with a 197.325. Then one week later they broke that record again with a 197.375 at Utah, a full 1.450 points higher than any score they had received on the road. In the record-setting season, BYU set new team highs in each event and in the all-around. In 2004, the Cougars again set a new standard, scoring a record 198.025 at Utah State. During that same year, the team also set record high scores of 49.625 on vault, 49.675 on beam and 49.675 on floor.

Before conference meets were eliminated in 1994, Cattermole's teams were league runner-ups five times and seven athletes earned 10 all-conference honors. Seven gymnasts have earned 17 NCAA All-America awards under his tutelage.

His recruiting efforts have netted five U.S. National Team members, five Canadian National Team members and numerous Junior Olympic National and Elite champions.

Along with his duties at BYU, Cattermole owns and operates All-American Gymnastics in Orem. Highly successful since its establishment in 1976, All-American has earned more State Class I and Class II championships than any other club in Utah. Several athletes - former stars Marianne Williams Squires, Kelli Rose-Rhyssman, Korie Jackman, Cristen Cosgrave-Barlow, Angela Gunnell Anderson and Jessica Nelson-Taylor earned national club honors while competing for All-American gymnasts.

He is married to Dawn Niedert and they have three boys - Brad 28, Brett 25, and Mark 21. Brett is married and has two dogs, and Brad is married to Christy Garner. They have one grandchild - Ava Christine.
