No. 9 Cougars Look For 1,000th Win at Stanford Invite

The No. 9 BYU women's volleyball team (5-0) will attempt to become just the fourth program in NCAA volleyball history to record 1,000 wins this week as the Cougars head to the Stanford Invitational. BYU, just two wins away from 1,000, will face No. 17 Cal Poly on Thursday before taking on Saint Mary's on Friday and the No. 2 Cardinal on Saturday in the three-day event.

"This is another exciting week for us," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "The challenge that our program faces will be to play with the same type of intensity and personality on the road that we had at home last weekend."

With a 998-274-5 all-time record in the 39-year recorded history of BYU women's volleyball, the Cougars are on the verge of joining UCLA, Nebraska and Missouri State as the only programs in the nation to notch at least 1,000 all-time collegiate volleyball victories. Former BYU head coach Elaine Michaelis led BYU to 886 wins in her 33 recorded seasons, retiring second all-time in collegiate volleyball. Karen Lamb added 57 victories to the BYU total in her three seasons while current Cougar head coach Watson has gone 55-10 in just over two seasons. In the 38 years of recorded history prior to 2007, BYU has suffered only one losing season and has won 20 or more matches in 31 of the past 33 years.

"The tradition of volleyball at BYU is one of the best in the nation," said Watson. "We are all very honored to have the opportunity to be a part of this milestone and continue building on the legacy that has been established here."

BYU is also celebrating another achievement as the Cougars' No. 9 ranking in this week's AVCA Coaches' Poll is their highest since Nov. 22, 1999. BYU moved up from No. 15 after winning the BYU Molten Classic last weekend with an incredible five-game win over No. 10 Wisconsin and sweeps of American and Northern Iowa to improve to 5-0 on the year.

Action will kick off for the Cougars at 4:30 p.m. PST on Thursday against Cal Poly and will continue Friday at 4:30 p.m. against Saint Mary's and Saturday at 7 p.m. against Stanford. All three BYU matches can be heard on BYU Radio with the Stanford match being joined in progress following the BYU-UCLA football game beginning at 3:30 p.m. PST on Saturday. Live stats will also be available for all three contests, and the Cougar-Cardinal face-off will be streamed on the Internet for CSTV All-Access subscribers.

NO. 17 CAL POLY IN 2007

No. 17 Cal Poly is 3-3 so far this season with victories over North Texas, Wichita State and Creighton. The Mustangs are coming off a sweep at the hands of No. 1 Nebraska on Monday. Junior outside hitter Ali Waller, a transfer from San Diego State, leads the team with 4.00 kills per game while adding 2.32 digs and 1.00 blocks per contest. Rightside hitter Kylie Atherstone is right behind Waller with 3.77 kpg and is second on the team with 3.09 dpg. Junior middle blocker Jaclyn Houston paces Cal Poly with a .382 hitting percentage and 1.45 blocks per contest. Sophomore outside hitter Gaby Rivera is the third Mustang averaging at least one rejection per contest with 1.26. Senior libero Kristin Jackson keeps Cal Poly in system with 4.86 dpg. As a team, the Mustangs outperform their opponents in every statistical category.

LAST OUTING

LINCOLN, Neb. (Sept. 3, 2007) – No. 1 Nebraska limited 17th-ranked Cal Poly to a .120 team hitting percentage Monday afternoon as the Mustangs fell to the defending-national champions in the finale of the Holiday Inn Downtown Classic, 30-20, 30-19, 30-18, at the NU Coliseum.

Reigning Big West Conference Player of the Week and junior opposite Kylie Atherstone paced Cal Poly (3-3) with nine kills while junior Jaclyn Houston recorded a match-high three blocks and hit .444. The Cornhuskers (5-0), who led wire-to-wire, received a match-best 17 kills from 2006 AVCA National Player of the Year Sarah Pavan.

The Cornhuskers raced out to a 6-1 advantage in the opening game. The Mustangs were able to whittle the Nebraska lead to 16-13, but the Cornhuskers earned nine of the ensuing 13 points to outdistance Cal Poly.

The Mustangs held Nebraska from taking a quick lead in the second game, but the Cornhuskers steadily pulled away during the set. A Pavan attack error shortened Nebraska's advantage to 22-17, but the Mustangs pulled no closer.

Cal Poly fell behind in the third game, 9-3, before posting an 8-5 run to halve the deficit. The Cornhuskers, however, compiled a 7-2 run en route to eliminating Cal Poly.

Cal Poly finished the Holiday Inn Downtown Classic with a 1-2 mark. The Mustangs began the competition Aug. 31 with a five-game loss to No. 3 Penn State, a match in which Cal Poly dropped the initial two sets before rallying to push the Nittany Lions to the limit. Atherstone, who averaged 4.64 kills per game during the competition, was named to the all-tournament team, along with senior libero Kristin Jackson, who compiled 4.82 digs per game.

SAINT MARY'S IN 2007

The Saint Mary's Gaels are off to an undefeated 5-0 record in 2007, including three sweeps and two five-gamers. Freshman outside hitter Megan York has been impressive in her SMC debut as she leads the team with 4.58 kills, 0.37 aces and 3.89 digs per game. Junior outside hitter Taylor Groess is second offensively with 3.58 kpg. The Gael block is paced by sophomore middle blocker Megan Burton with 1.58 rejections per contest. Burton also leads SMC with a .402 hitting percentage. Two other Gaels are also averaging over one block per game in junior Brittany Barker (1.31) and freshman Shannon Lowell (1.26). As a team, Saint Mary's outperforms its opponents in every statistical category.

LAST OUTING

FRESNO, Calif. (Sept. 2, 2007) - Saint Mary's defeated the Fresno State Bulldogs in three straight games, 30-23, 30-21, 30-22. The Gaels were once gain led by Megan York and Megan Burton, with 20 and 13 kills respectively. Burton hit for an impressive .550 hitting percentage, and added four block assists in the match. York was one dig shy of recording her fourth double-double of the season, tallying nine digs and two blocks. Freshmen setters Kapua Kamana'o and Christy Payne dished out 26 and 20 assists respectively, guiding their team to a .256 hitting percentage.

The Gaels would open up game one with a 6-0 serving run by Kelly Huston. York and Burton led Saint Mary's with five kills apiece, hitting .263 and .833 for the game. Barker added two kills on two swings for a perfect hitting percentage, while also contributing two assisted blocks. The Bulldogs would pull to within five, but the Gaels would not let up, winning the game 30-23. Saint Mary's recorded 25 digs and 19 kills in the game.

In game two the Gaels had their way with the Bulldogs, tagging a .264 hitting percentage. Once again Saint Mary's started off strong, taking a 5-0 lead, including consecutive kills by York and Lowell. The Gaels would record two more five point runs in the game, receiving back-to-back kills from Groess and York. York took control of the game, recording nine kills and four digs, guiding the Gaels to the 30-21 victory.

Saint Mary's continued to play consistently in game three, holding the Bulldogs to .131 hitting percentage. Sophomore libero, Alita Fisher, tallied 13 digs in game three alone helping the Gaels to a 30-22 win over the Bulldogs. Fisher tagged a game-high 39 digs in the match, leading to a remarkable 13 dig average per game.

NO. 2 STANFORD IN 2007

The second-ranked Stanford Cardinal is 4-0 so far in 2007 after winning the Diet Coke Classic last weekend. All four Stanford victories have come against ranked opponents in Long Beach State (then No. 19), San Diego (then No. 12), Minnesota (then No. 9) and Ohio (then No. 23). Last year's NCAA runner-up, Stanford's trio of returning All-Americans and newcomer Alix Klineman, the 2006 Gatorade National Player of the Year, have led the Cardinal to three sweeps and one four-game victory. Outside hitter Klineman leads the team with 4.23 kills per game to go along with 2.62 digs per contest. All-American outside hitter Cynthia Barboza is right behind with 3.85 kpg. Junior middle blocker Foluke Akinradewo, another 2006 All-American, is hitting a blistering .519 on the season with 3.62 kpg and leads the team with 1.15 blocks per contest. The All-America trio is rounded out by senior setter Bryn Kehoe, who averages 14.15 assists per game while pacing her team to a .313 attack percentage. Freshman libero Gabi Ailes puts up a team-best 3.85 dpg. As a team, the Cardinal outperforms its opponents in every statistical category.

LAST OUTING

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (Sept. 2, 2007) - The Stanford women's volleyball team completed a clean sweep of the field at the 2007 Diet Coke Classic, defeating Ohio, its third ranked opponent in less than 72 hours, 30-15, 30-25, 30-23. Freshman Alix Klineman led the Cardinal for the third day in a row, with 15 kills and eight digs, while Foluke Akinradewo put up 13 kills on 17 attempts (.706).

Junior outside hitter Cynthia Barboza, who finished the tournament with 32 kills, was named the weekend's MVP while Klineman and Akinradewo also earned places on the All-Tournament team. Setter Bryn Kehoe had 37 assists in the win and freshman Gabi Ailes chipped in three aces and led Stanford for the second straight match with 15 digs. Stanford hit .266 to Ohio's .033 for the match.

After going up two games to none, Stanford came back from the locker room anxious to finish the deal. Akinradewo and Klineman started game three with back-to-back kills and the Cardinal took nine of the first 12 points to jump out to an early 9-3 advantage. Akinradewo drilled three consecutive kills from the middle to run the score out to 14-5, and a Bobcat timeout only resulted in the Cardinal taking its first double-digit lead at 16-6. Ohio cut the lead in half at 17-12, but Fisher stopped any thoughts of a comeback with a kill from the back row. Stanford went on to take the next three points and held a solid lead for the rest of the match. Akinradewo kills started and finished a 5-1 Stanford run that gave the squad game point, and a Bobcat hitting error ended the game, 30-23.

Weekly Notes:**Week #2 In Review**

BYU opened its 2007 home season by capturing the BYU Molten Classic crown with an incredible five-game win over No. 10 Wisconsin (26-30, 30-25, 30-15, 26-30, 15-13) on Friday night and sweeps of American (30-18, 30-19, 30-28) and Northern Iowa (30-27, 30-26, 30-18) on Saturday. The Cougars' victory over the Badgers was witnessed by 3,880 fans, the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history. Junior middle blocker Rachel Dyer led the Cougars with a career-high 20 kills on a blistering .600 hitting percentage (20-3-30) to go along with seven blocks. Chelsea Goodman and Erica Lott each posted double-doubles in the win while sophomore middle blocker Ashton Hansen made the most of her 2007 home debut with a career-best 10 kills and a team-high eight blocks. Goodman led the Cougars in kills against American and Northern Iowa.

All-Tournament

Four Cougars have received All-Tournament honors for helping BYU claim the Hawkeye Challenge and Molten Classic crowns. Chelsea Goodman was named the tournament MVP of both events while Rachel Dyer was named to both all-tournament teams. Bryn Porter was named to the Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament Team, and Erica Lott received Molten Classic All-Tournament accolades.

Two Wins Away From 1,000

With a 998-274-5 all-time record in the 39-year recorded history of BYU women's volleyball, the Cougars are just two victories away from 1,000. Only three other teams have posted at least 1,000 wins all-time, including UCLA (in 2005), Nebraska (2006) and Missouri State (2006) (see below for all-time victory marks). Former BYU head coach Elaine Michaelis led BYU to 886 wins in her 33 recorded seasons, retiring second all-time in collegiate volleyball. Karen Lamb added 57 victories to the BYU total in her three seasons while current Cougar head coach Jason Watson has gone 55-10 in just over two seasons. In the 38 seasons of recorded history prior to this year, BYU has suffered only one losing season and has won 20 or more matches in 31 of the past 33 years.

The Nation's Best ...

The Cougars' 998-274-5 all-time record makes them one of the best teams in the nation, ranking fourth in all-time wins through Sunday's matches. UCLA tops the list with 1,041 victories while Missouri State ranks second at 1,008 and Nebraska is third at 1,004. The Cornhuskers passed up the Cougars at the end of 2006 with their six-match run to the NCAA Tournament title. The top 10 is rounded out by Long Beach St. (976), Penn State (945), Hawai'i (938), Texas (912), Minnesota (901) and Texas-Arlington (898).

Home Sweet Home

The Cougars made their home debut last weekend going 3-0 in the BYU Molten Classic and averaging 1,709 fans, 10th in the nation, including the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history with 3,880 fans Friday night against No. 10 Wisconsin. BYU went 12-1 in the Smith Fieldhouse last year and set a new program attendance record with an average of 1,902 fans, 13th in the nation. The Cougars are now 463-82 (.850) all-time at home and 25-1 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the last three years.

Double the Fun

With 37 career double-doubles to date, Chelsea Goodman is currently third on the MWC's all-time double-double list behind Wyoming's Michele Rauter (47; 2000-03) and San Diego State's Aspen McPartland (39; 2000-03). Goodman recorded an MWC-leading 18 double-doubles last year out of 29 matches in which she played and has posted three already this season. The next closest active player on the all-time list is UNLV's Brittani Lumsden with 25. BYU's Erica Lott also appears on the active list with 20 double-doubles in her Cougar career, including three so far in 2007.

Team Captains

The BYU women's volleyball team has selected two captains for its 2007 season in seniors Chelsea Goodman and Annie Pinegar. Goodman also served as a co-captain last year with Lindsay Hartsock.

BYU in the Polls

The Cougars moved up to No. 9 in this week's AVCA poll, their highest ranking since being ranked ninth on Nov. 22, 1999. BYU has a rich history of rankings in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. Among NCAA Division I programs entering the 2007 season, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (279) and 11th in weeks ranked in the top 10 (122) and weeks ranked No. 1 (4). The Cougars have also traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in both weeks ranked in the final poll (20) and weeks ranked in the top five to end the year (3) and tied for sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1).

Rivals in the Rankings

Three Cougar opponents also appear in this week's rankings. Wisconsin, whom BYU defeated last Friday, is ranked No. 10 while Stanford (No. 2) and Cal Poly (No. 17) will give the Cougars a run for their money in the Stanford Invitational this week. MWC rival Utah is receiving votes along with Colorado State.

Vs. Ranked Opponents

BYU's five-game win over No. 10 Wisconsin Friday night was the Cougars' first contest this season against a ranked opponent, making them 1-0 in such matches. BYU will face two more ranked foes this week in No. 17 Cal Poly (Thursday) and No. 2 Stanford (Saturday). The Cougars were 1-3 in 2006 vs. ranked teams with the lone win coming against then-No. 4 Stanford.

Tops in the MWC

BYU received a nod as the preseason favorite to win the Mountain West Conference regular-season title in 2007. Voted on by league coaches and selected media members, the Cougars received eight first-place votes while Colorado State was picked second with five first-place votes. Utah topped UNLV for third place while New Mexico, San Diego State, Wyoming, TCU and Air Force rounded out the preseason pecking order. The Cougars have been selected to win the league in each of the last three years (co-favorite in 2006). BYU made good on that prediction in 2005 with a league-best 14-2 MWC record and finished second in 2006 at 13-3.

Redshirts

BYU head coach Jason Watson has announced that four Cougars will redshirt the 2007 season. True freshmen Alessandra Beaumont (L/DS, 5-10), Casey Speredon (RS, 6-1) and Brooke Taulii (L/DS, 5-11) will spend the season on the sidelines as they transition into the BYU system along with junior libero Janvier Beaumont, who averaged 2.64 digs per game last season. Beaumont will redshirt the year to create more space between herself and starting libero Annie Pinegar, who will graduate after this season.

Sister Act

As fans check out the 2007 BYU roster, they may do a double take at the pair of Beaumonts listed. Janvier, a junior, and Alessandra, a freshman, are the ninth set of sisters to play for BYU, including eight who played on the same team for at least one season. Below is a list of Cougar sister acts.

With a feisty crowd of 3,880 packed in the Smith Fieldhouse on Friday night, the No. 15 BYU women's volleyball team upset No. 10 Wisconsin 3-2 (26-30, 30-25, 30-15, 26-30, 15-13) at the BYU Molten Classic.

The Cougars' opening-round match of the tournament coincided with BYU freshman orientation, bringing in the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history.

American BYU Molten Classic Saturday, Sept. 1 BYU, 3-0

BYU Improves To 4-0 With Sweep

With a dominating offensive performance, the No. 15 BYU women's volleyball team swept American (30-18, 30-19, 30-28) during the BYU Molten Classic Saturday afternoon at the Smith Fieldhouse.

"This was a good match for us," BYU head coach Jason Watson said. "We did a good job executing our offensive and defensive systems. We were also able to let some of our freshman see playing time."

BYU began the match with a phenomenal .517 hitting percentage in the first game, totaling 18 kills as a team. The Cougars jumped ahead early in the game with an 8-1 lead over American. The Eagles made a run at a comeback, getting to within four, but were unable to over come the Cougars' early lead. With an American service error to give the Cougars the game point, BYU took the game 30-18.

The second frame was more of the same as the Cougars continued to dominate on the net, hitting .368 while limiting the Eagles to a .083 hitting percentage. Goodman led the team with six kills during game two, and Lott claimed five kills for herself as the Cougars posted a game-two total of 19 kills.

American took its first lead of the match during game three. The teams battled down to the wire as the score was tied 27-27 when an Eagle service error gave the Cougars a one-point lead. Sweep Clinches Classic Crown For Cougars

The No. 15 BYU women's volleyball team completed the weekend in style with a sweep of Northern Iowa, 30-27, 30-26, 30-18 Saturday night at the Smith Fieldhouse.

"Each match we have played this season has challenged us to raise our level," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "These kinds of matches are important for what we want to be able to accomplish throughout the season."

After an emotional five-game victory Friday night over the 10th-ranked Badgers and an earlier match Saturday against the Eagles, BYU struggled to find its rhythm early in game one. However, after an 11-6 Panther lead, the Cougars came to life, scoring seven of the next eight to go up 13-12. Both teams put together scoring runs from there but neither was able to capitalize on the momentum, resulting in a 21-21 tie. The trend continued as the two squads neared the 30-point mark until an emphatic kill straight down the middle from Hansen and a Panther hitting error gave BYU the 30-27 win.

Despite the near-miss in game one, Northern Iowa came out firing in the second frame, keeping the Cougars playing catch-up through the first half. Back-to-back kills from Goodman brought the fans to their feet and tied things up at 13-13 before Bryn Porter put down consecutive cross-court kills of her own to give BYU its first lead of the game at 17-16. The Panthers battled back to a 21-21 tie, but a 5-0 Cougar scoring spurt gave BYU a lead it would ride to the 30-26 victory.

The Cougars sensed victory in game three and responded accordingly with an early 8-4 lead. It was all BYU from there with a resounding 30-18 game-three win on the strength of a 12-4 run to close out the match. The BYU block did the talking in the third frame as the Cougars put up five rejections, including three in a five-point span and five from Dyer, while holding UNI to a .083 hitting percentage.

COUGARS READY FOR NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT IN 2007

After finishing the 2006 season ranked No. 20 in the nation with a 25-6 overall record, the BYU women's volleyball team is poised and ready to once again compete on the national stage in 2007. The fourth-winningest program in the country, BYU has all the pieces in place to make another run at the Mountain West Conference and NCAA titles.

The Cougars advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament last season for the first time since 2003, earning the program's first final national ranking since 2001. With an experienced squad seasoned by consecutive trips to the national championship tournament, BYU head coach Jason Watson expects to see continued success in his third year at the helm.

"I'm very optimistic about our upcoming season based on the success we had in 2006," said Watson, who has compiled a 50-10 record in the past two seasons. "We have a solid offensive core returning and athletes that have been together for quite some time. They're ready to do what it takes to excel at an extremely high level."

Watson, whose team has been tabbed as the preseason league favorites, will be relying on the experience of 11 letterwinners and six starters this season, including one All-American and three players who received All-MWC honors last year. Add to that the services of five newcomers, and BYU will once again be among the favorites to challenge for the league title and maintain its position among the nation's elite.

"Our program will be looking to these experienced players to provide leadership throughout the season," Watson said. "There are some significant challenges ahead and we have work to do, but our staff has tremendous confidence in each of our student-athletes."

OUTSIDE HITTER

One of the Cougars' most vocal leaders over the past three years has been senior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman, the preseason MWC Player of the Year. The 2006 All-American led the MWC and ranked 43rd in the nation last season with 4.49 kills per game while adding 3.15 digs per contest. She also racked up a league-leading 18 double-doubles on the year, bringing her career total to 34, which ranks third all-time in MWC history. A team captain last year known for her power and enthusiasm, Goodman's play and leadership will once again be vital to the Cougars' success this season.

The graduation of Kim Wilson Sorensen leaves an opening beside Goodman on the outside. While two newcomers may

compete for time, junior Bryn Porter enters the fall as the front-runner for the job. Porter averaged 2.50 kills and 1.11 digs per game last season while seeing action in 15 matches and posting double-digit kills in five contests. Her experience will be counted on as two incoming freshmen, Christy Carpenter and Christina Measom, also battle for time. The two Utah natives both come to BYU highly decorated after outstanding high school careers and are anxious to make their mark on the Cougars' 2007 campaign.

RIGHTSIDE HITTER

Senior Erica Lott, a preseason All-MWC pick, will continue what she started last season after sliding over to the rightside prior to her junior year. The move proved fruitful for the two-time All-MWC selection as she averaged 3.77 kills and 1.07 blocks per game while earning all-region honorable mention. Another of those who will be looked to for leadership, Lott is expected to be a heavy contributor to the Cougars' point totals this season.

Behind Lott at the rightside position is senior Catherine Parker. A steady contributor for BYU throughout her career, Parker will once again be poised and ready to step in when called upon. True freshman Casey Speredon, the third of the Cougars' trio of Utah recruits, also enters the BYU roster at the rightside this season.

MIDDLE BLOCKER

While the Cougars will be without the services of All-American middle blocker Lindsay Hartsock this season, junior Rachel Dyer has proven she is capable of filling Hartsock's shoes. Dyer had a breakout sophomore year culminating in an all-region honorable mention nod after finishing the season ranked third in the league in hitting percentage and sixth in blocks. Despite missing five matches due to injury, she hit .500 or better six times while reaching double-digit kills 10 times and double-digit blocks once. Another All-MWC honoree, Dyer has shown she is a force to be reckoned with and will be a dominating presence in the middle for BYU this season.

Two sophomores will compete for time alongside Dyer as Marisa Vandersteen and Ashton Hansen continue to hone their skills. Both saw action last season as redshirt freshmen and showed promise. They will look to build on that experience throughout 2007 and further develop BYU's blocking prowess.

SETTER

Junior setter Amy Schlauder hopes to continue her assault on the BYU record books this year after a sophomore campaign that saw her put up 13.15 assists per game, third all-time in Cougar history. Despite missing eight matches due to injury, Schlauder's

assist average led the league and ranked 24th in the nation. Known for her composure and control, Schlauder has developed excellent relationships with her hitters that will form the backbone of the Cougar offense.

Schlauder will be pushed at the setter position this year by redshirt freshman Kiana Rogers. A highly decorated setter from Diamond Springs, Calif., Rogers enters the season with the talent to compete at the highest levels and could see action this season. Senior setter Jenna Judkins is also in the mix after a successful stint at the net during Schlauder's injury last season. She has developed into a serving specialist for BYU. Her positive attitude and tremendous work ethic play a key role in the Cougars' team chemistry.

LIBERO/DEFENSIVE SPECIALIST

The Cougars' top two passers will once again battle for playing time this season as senior Annie Pinegar and junior Janvier Beaumont continue to push each other to the top. Beaumont began the 2006 season as the BYU libero until Pinegar earned the starting job midway through the year. She then proceeded to smash the Cougar record for digs in a game with 42 in BYU's incredible five-game comeback win over UC Santa Barbara in the NCAA Tournament while averaging 3.49 digs per game over the course of the season. Both players have the talent and experience to lead the Cougar defense and will play a big role this year.

Junior Stephanie Lau has also seen time in the back row during her BYU career, serving as a defensive and serving specialist for the Cougars. Joining the group at the libero and defensive specialist positions in 2007 are incoming freshmen Alessandra Beaumont (Janvier's sister) and Brooke Taualii.



2007 COUGAR SCHEDULE

Continuing its tradition of competitive scheduling, BYU will play seven teams that qualified for the 2006 NCAA Tournament, including four that were ranked in final CSTV/AVCA Top 25 Poll. In addition to a full slate of MWC action, the Cougars will play in three tournaments beginning with a three-team event hosted by the University of Iowa at the end of August. BYU will then host the Molten Classic featuring preseason No. 11 Wisconsin, American and Northern Iowa. The Cougars will finish preseason nonconference play at a tournament hosted by national runner-up and preseason No. 2 Stanford. BYU will play matches against preseason No. 14 Cal Poly, St. Mary's and the Cardinal, who the Cougars defeated last season in the Molten Classic. After starting the 16-match MWC schedule in mid-September, BYU will step out of league action to take on Weber State and Utah Valley State. This year's MWC Tournament will be hosted by UNLV in Las Vegas.

Of the Cougars' 2007 opponents, BYU has a winning record against all but two of its competitors, including a split with Wisconsin. The Cougars' all-time record versus this season's opponents is a dominating 387-83-1 (.823).

JASON WATSON

HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the team.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has compiled a 50-10 (.833) overall record while leading the Cougars to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and a return to the national rankings. He was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He returned to BYU in 2002 as an assistant head coach for the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001 and as an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight seasons. In addition to his 50-10 (.833) head-coaching record, Watson's team's compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson is only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnn Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

COACHING CAREER

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU women's volleyball head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1999. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best in school history. The winning trend continued in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second-round NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars finished the year ranked No. 20 in the nation, their first final national ranking since 2001.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the 2005 season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game.

In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartssock was second in the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both received AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition.



In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the MWC and were 13th and fifth in the nation in blocks per game in 2003 and 2004, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the Cougars had put up since 1997. Hartssock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by Collegiate Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable-mention All-America recognition as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No. 3 in school history) and a .245 team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts. Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.

PLAYING CAREER

As a player, Watson was a four-year starter and two-time captain from 1990-94 as the BYU men's program grew from its infancy to a national power. After a 2-25 season in the program's second year as an NCAA sport, the Cougars achieved a 21-6 record and No. 2 national ranking in Watson's senior season in 1994. Watson is still BYU's all-time assist leader with 4,649 and single-game assist record holder with 128 against Hawai'i on March 27, 1993. He was named a second-team American Volleyball Coaches Association All-American, Volleyball Magazine honorable-mention All-American and a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Third Team in 1994. He was a member of the Australian Men's National Team from 1990-91 and a member of the Junior National Team from 1987-90.

PERSONAL

A physical education and sports business management graduate of BYU in 1995, Watson is a native of Homebush, Australia. He and his wife, Larissa, have two sons and one daughter.

2006 SEASON REVIEW

The No. 20 BYU women's volleyball team continued its tradition of excellence in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second round NCAA Tournament appearance.

"I'm pleased with the progress we made this year," said BYU head coach Jason Watson, whose teams have gone 50-10 in his two years at the helm. "The season we were able to put together this year was representative of the direction we want the program to go. We feel like we have work to do, but we are going to get better."

The Cougars finished in second place in the Mountain West Conference with a 13-3 league record and spent the season ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Poll, ending the year at No. 20 after making their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance in the 26-year history of the Championship. The Smith Fieldhouse once again proved to be a dominant homecourt advantage as BYU went 12-1 on Elaine Michaelis Court during 2006 while setting a program attendance record with an average crowd of 1,902.

Injuries plagued the Cougars throughout the year as the team played 13 matches without the services of all of their starters. Sophomore setter Amy Schlauder sat out eight matches with a broken finger while junior rightside hitter Erica Lott missed two contests and sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer was unavailable on five occasions due to injury. However, despite going more than a month without their full starting rotation, the Cougars rallied around their teammates as several players stepped up and made the most of their playing opportunities, ensuring continued success.

BYU began the year taking consecutive tournament titles with three sweeps at the UCF Fall Invitational followed by a win over then-No. 4 Stanford, the eventual national runner-up, in Provo the next weekend in front of a record crowd of 4,050 while earning the BYU Molten Classic crown. The Cougars then took their 6-0 record on the road to the Jayhawk Invitational where they suffered their first defeat of the season against host Kansas after Schlauder broke her finger in the first game. But BYU bounced back the next day to beat Arkansas behind the play of back-up setter Jenna Judkins, who paced the Cougars to a 7-1 record in Schlauder's absence while leading the MWC in assists during her stint at the net.

After going 8-1 prior to starting league play, BYU won its first four conference matches, including its first home win over Colorado State since 2000. Without the services of Schlauder or Lott, however, the Cougars then suffered their only home loss of the year to in-state rival Utah in front of another record-breaking crowd of 4,455. But the loss was quickly forgotten with a seven-match winning streak, including four sweeps, that saw the Cougars improve to 19-2 overall and rise as high as No. 16 in the nation.

Unfortunately, BYU's winning streak came to an end when the Cougars suffered their only back-to-back defeats of the year at then-No. 9 Utah and at New Mexico. But BYU rebounded with five straight wins to end the regular season. As part of the run, the Cougars beat the Rams in Fort Collins, Colo., to complete the season sweep of CSU for the first time since 1995.

Postseason play did not begin as the Cougars hoped with an early exit from the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas, but the time off prepared BYU for a tough first round NCAA Tournament matchup against UC Santa Barbara in Los Angeles. The Cougars completed an incredible comeback from two games down to earn the five-game win behind the strength of Annie Kemp Pinegar's record-setting 42 digs, breaking the 22-year-old BYU mark. However, BYU could overcome host USC the following night, falling to the No. 6 Trojans to end the season with a 25-6 record.

In addition to being ranked No. 20 in the nation as a team to end the year, the Cougars finished 16th nationally in hitting percentage (.269), 24th in win/loss percentage (.806) and 33rd in blocks per game (2.96). Several individuals also excelled as Cougars led the MWC in four of the seven statistical categories tracked by the league including hitting percentage (Lindsay Hartsock), kills (Chelsea Goodman), assists (Schlauder) and points (Goodman). Hartsock ranked 17th nationally in hitting with a .389 mark while Schlauder ranked 24th in assists per game at 13.15 and Goodman was 43rd in the nation with 4.49 kills per game.
