COUGARS TO SQUARE OFF AGAINST REBELS

Following a victory over Colorado State in its first conference game, BYU (2-3, 1-0) looks to stay unbeaten in MWC play when UNLV travels to LaVell Edwards Stadium Friday, Oct. 8. UNLV is coming off of a 48-13 victory over in-state rival Nevada for its first win of the season. Last season the two teams played an overtime thriller. UNLV and BYU dueled to a 20-20 tie at the end of regulation. The Cougars scored a touchdown on their first possession of overtime and intercepted a desperation Kurt Nantkes pass on fourth down to preserve the narrow victory. BYU coach Gary Crowton holds a 2-1 record against the Rebels.

SERIES INFORMATION

The series between BYU and UNLV dates back to Dec. 2, 1978, when the two teams traveled to Yokohama, Japan for the Yokohama Bowl. The Cougars won the inaugural game 28-24. The Rebels and Cougars faced off four times between 1978 and 1982, with the Cougars winning three of the four games, but didn't meet again until UNLV joined the expanded WAC in 1996. From 1996 to 2001, the Cougars went 5-0 against the Rebels. BYU has won every game it has played against the Rebels in Las Vegas but holds only a 3-2 advantage against UNLV in Provo. The Rebels won the last meeting in Provo, 24-3, on Oct. 19, 2002.

VIVA LAS VEGAS

Despite Utah's proximity to Nevada, there is only one member of the Cougars' roster that hails from the state of Nevada. Fullback Moa Peaua calls Reno home and prepped at McQueen High School, where as a senior he helped lead his team to an 11-0 record and a state championship. Following the season he was named the Gatorade MVP for the state of Nevada. Two members of BYU's team served LDS church missions in the city of sin. Linebacker Richard Nehiring served in Las Vegas from 2001-2003. Washington State transfer Aaron Wagner also served there from 2001-2003. Two Cougar coaches have ties to the Rebels. Tight ends coach Mike Empey also coached tight ends for the Rebels from 1997-98, and linebackers coach Barry Lamb served in that same capacity at UNLV from 1981-1986.

BYU'S RECORD IN THE MWC

After defeating CSU in their conference opener, the Cougars improved their record in the MWC to 22-14. BYU has won one outright MWC title in football when it posted a 7-0 conference record in 2001, the only perfect conference record in the brief history of the MWC, and has tied for one championship (1999). In all sports, BYU has won an overwhelming number of MWC championships, bringing home 53 out of a possible 95 championship titles.

The following BYU coaches will be working from the sidelines for the Boise State game: Gary Crowton (head coach), Todd Bradford (wide receivers), Bronco Mendenhall (defensive coordinator and safeties), Paul Tidwell (special teams coordinator), Jeff Grimes (offensive line) and Steve Kafusi (defensive line). The remaining assistant coaches, including Lance Reynolds (running backs), Mike Empey (tight ends), Barry Lamb (linebackers) and Brian Mitchell (cornerbacks), will coach from the booth.

WATCH OUT FOR THESE GUYS

Four members of the 2004 BYU football team—Aaron Francisco, Brady Poppinga, Daniel Coats and Matt Payne—have been selected to various "watch lists" for post-season awards.

Aaron Francisco, **6-2**, **215**, **Safety:** Aaron Francisco has been selected to the Thorpe Award "watch list," which honors the nation's top defensive back. Francisco is a three-year starter, who led BYU in tackles and interceptions as a junior and was second in tackles as a sophomore. Last year he earned first-team All-MWC honors and was an honorable mention selection as a sophomore. Francisco is first on the team in tackles with 50, including three tackles for loss and one sack. He recorded back-to-back games of 16 tackles against No. 1 USC and No. 21 Boise State.

Brady Poppinga, **6-3**, **257**, **Defensive End:** Brady Poppinga has been selected to the Bronko Nagurski Award "watch list." The award honors the nation's top defensive player. Poppinga earned first-team All-MWC honors last season after ranking among the league leaders in tackles with 55 for the season, including 34 solo take downs and a team-leading six sacks. Poppinga ranks fourth on the team in tackles with 33, including five tackles for a loss and a team-leading three sacks. Against Notre Dame, Poppinga was a one-man wrecking crew, leading the team in tackles with twelve while recording one sack on Irish quarterback Brady Quinn for a loss of 10 yards.


Daniel Coats, 6-3, 250, Tight End: Daniel Coats has been named to the John Mackey Award "watch list." The John Mackey Award is given annually to the nation's top tight end. Last season as a freshman, Coats recorded 30 receptions for 378 yards and four touchdowns, while earning freshman All-America honors from The Sporting News. On the season, Coats has hauled in six passes for 66 yards. He is seventh on the team in receptions and leads Cougar tight ends in both receptions and yards.

Matt Payne, 6-4, 234, Punter/Kicker: Matt Payne has been selected to the Lou Groza Award and Ray Guy Award "watch lists." The Groza Award is given annually to the nation's best place kicker, while the Ray Guy Award is gven to the nation's best punter. Payne is a three-year starter as both a punter and kicker. As a sophomore in 2002, Payne was second in the nation in punting with a 47.6 yard-per-punt average, earning an honorable mention All-America nod. Last year, Payne was selected to both the Lou Groza and Ray Guy "watch lists." Payne punted nine times against the Irish, pinning them inside their 20 six times. He also kicked two field goals—a 44- and a 53-yarder. Payne followed up his excellent performance against the Irish with a solid day against Stanford, punting the ball four times for 180 yards which averages out to 45 yards a kick. In the third game of the season against USC, Payne punted eight times for 386 yards (48.3), including a MWC record 79-yard punt, which is also the second longest punt in BYU's history. He also kicked a 46-yard field goal that gave BYU an early 3-0 lead He kicked two field goals against BSU he punted seven times for an average of 44 yards and kicked two field goals. Payne kicked 52-yarder at CSU and punted five times, averaging 47.6 yards per kick. He is currently third in the nation in punting with an average of 46.45 yards per punt.

HEAD COACH GARY CROWTON • Pq. 3





Head Coach Gary Crowton

Gary Crowton, entering his fourth season as the head coach at BYU, has guided the Cougars to a 21-17 record since arriving in Provo. This season Crowton will lead the Cougars against top teams such as Notre Dame, Stanford, USC and Boise State, as well as a tough league schedule.

In December 2000, Crowton took over a BYU program that had been under the direction of college football's sixth all-time winningest coach, LaVell Edwards, who posted a record of 257-101-3 (.716) over 29 seasons.

In his first season as head coach at BYU, Crowton constructed the nation's top-rated offense, posting a

12-2 record, including 10 straight victories to start his BYU career. For his efforts, he was named the MWC Coach of the Year as the Cougars won their first-ever, outright MWC championship.

Crowton, 47, came to BYU with a long and proven list of coaching accomplishments. Prior to serving as the offensive coordinator with the NFL's Chicago Bears, where his offense ranked third in the NFL in passing yardage during the 1999 season, Crowton was head coach at Louisiana Tech from 1996-1998. There he guided the Bulldogs to a 21-13 (.618) record over three seasons, including a 9-2 mark in 1997.

Competing as an independent for three straight years, Louisiana Tech recorded wins over the likes of Mississippi State, Cal and Alabama. Using its Crowton-designed, high-powered offense, the program also recorded impressive wins by scoring 50 or more points against eight different opponents, including games of 60 or more points in five different games. Crowton's offense ranked third in the nation, both in passing and total offense, while the Bulldogs racked up 12,746 yards passing in three years, an average of 4,249 yards per season. The prolific Tech offense also produced 115 touchdown receptions, averaging 38.3 TDs per season.

Under Crowton, NFL first-round draft pick Troy Edwards recorded a Techrecord 280 receptions and 4,352 yards receiving. Over a span of 34 games, Crowton's offense at Louisiana Tech engineered 22 different 300-yard passing games, including school-record 10, 300-yard outings during the 1998 season. In 1998, Crowton's final season at Louisiana Tech, the Bulldogs combined for a school record 4,943 yards passing.

Crowton's coaching career actually began in 1982 as a student assistant under Edwards at BYU. While at BYU, he worked with current Seattle Seahawks head coach Mike Holmgren and future NFL Hall of Famer Steve Young. From BYU, Crowton moved on to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he coached from 1983-86. While at Snow College, Crowton moved from defensive backs coach to offensive coordinator. Under his offensive leadership, the Badgers won the National Junior College Athletic Association National Championship in 1985.

From Snow College, Crowton moved to Western Illinois, where he directed the Leathernecks' passing game for a single season. In 1988, Crowton was hired as the offensive coordinator at New Hampshire, where the Wildcats were the top-rated passing team in the Yankee Conference from 1988-90.

In 1991, Crowton was hired as the quarterback coach at Boston College under head coach Tom Coughlin. There he helped develop quarterback Glenn Foley as a candidate for the Heisman Trophy. After three successful seasons with the Eagles, Crowton was hired as the co-offensive coordinator at Georgia Tech, where his offense led the Yellow Jackets to a No. 21 national ranking in his first and only season in Atlanta. In 1995, Crowton was hired as the offensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech, where he would become the head coach the following season.

Crowton was an all-league quarterback at Orem High School before earning All-American honors at Snow College. Crowton transferred to Colorado State, where he finished his career. Following an LDS Church mission to South Korea, Crowton attended Idaho State, where he ran track for the Bengals. After returning to BYU in 1982, Crowton earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1983.

Crowton, who is the first-ever head football coach at BYU to serve an LDS Church mission, is married to the former Maren Peterson of Bountiful, Utah. The couple was married on August 3, 1985. The Crowtons have seven children, Dane (18), Tara (16), Jenessa (13), Quinn (10), Mikauli (8) Toriana (4) and Macloud (2).

COUGARS FACE TOUGH SCHEDULE

BYU is scheduled to play the ninth toughest non conference schedule based on opponents' winning percentage last season. The Cougars non conference schedule includee Notre Dame, Stanford, co-National Champion and preseason No. 1 USC and Boise State who combined for a 34-16 record in 2003. The overall record of BYU's opponents including Mountain West Conference tea,s in 2003 was 82-54 (.603). Five of the Cougars' 11 opponents went to a bowl game last year. The teams finished with a 3-2 bowl record, including USC's victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl that earned the Trojans a share of the National Title. Following the fifth week of the season, BYU's opponents are 31-20 (.608), with their non-conference opponents posting a 15-3 (.833) record through Oct. 2. TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's projected starting offensive line averages an enormous 6-foot-4 and 312 pounds. They will face a UNLV defensive line that averages 6-foot-3 and 297 pounds. When the Rebels have the ball, Cougar defensive linemen that average 6-foot-4 and 293 pounds will face a UNLV front five that are listed at 6-foot-4 and 307 pounds.

SWEET REVENGE

Since 1999, BYU holds a 7-3 (.700) record in payback games against non conference opponents. Last year the Cougars defeated Georgia Tech in BYU's home opener 24-13 after losing to the Yellow Jackets 28-19 the previous year. This year BYU will have four payback opportunities on its non-conference schedule. The Cougars defeated Notre Dame 20-17, lost to Stanford 37-10 and lost to USC 42-10. BYU lost its final pay back game in a heart breaker, 28-27. Below is a listing of non conference payback games dating back to 1998, including this year's games:

PAYNE EARNS THIRD MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR

Matt Payne was named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time in five weeks. Payne connected on a 52-yard field goal to give BYU an early 3-0 lead with 9:55 left in the second quarter against CSU and split the uprights on four point-after attempts on the night. He was also credited with another bone-jarring tackle in kickoff coverage. Payne has scored 269 career points, including a team leading 32 points this season. Payne ranks third on BYU's all-time scoring list, needing 22 points to pass Luke Staley for second on that list. Payne averaged 47.6 yards per punt, marking his highest average since posting 48.3 yards per punt against top-ranked USC. Only two of his five punts were returned for a combined total of five yards, establishing a 46.6 net punting average. Three of Payne's punts were downed inside the 20-yard line, including two punts inside the five-yard line. As a result, Colorado State was forced to start five drives with an average field position from their own 14-yard line.

His 52-yard field goal was the second longest of the season. Payne is a perfect 6-for-6 from 40 yards or more on the season, and 2-for-2 from over 50 yards. With four PAT's on the night, Payne has connected on 55 straight PAT's, dating back to the Cougars' season-opening victory against Syracuse in 2002. His streak currently ranks as the 10th longest in the country. Payne has made 11 consecutive point-after attempts this season. This is the sixth time Payne has been named special teams player of the week in his career.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

Running backs coach Lance Reynolds is one of the few coaches in the country who have the opportunity to coach along side their sons at the collegiate level. Lance's son, Lance Jr., is the starting center for the Cougars this year. The younger Lance is a converted linebacker, who had to pack on about 40 pounds to play offensive line. The elder Reynolds is a former all-conference offensive lineman for the Cougars and is entering his 22nd year coaching at BYU. Lance Jr. is just the first in a long line of Reynolds boys that could play at BYU for their father. Lance's son Dallas signed a letter of intent in 2003 to play for BYU, but is currently serving an LDS church mission in Seattle, Wash. GOING DEEP

After five games, Todd Watkins is currently second in the MWC and ninth nationally in receiving yards per game, averaging 107.6 yards per contest. Through five games, Watkins has amassed 538 yards. Last year's leader, Toby Christensen, had only 547 yards in 12 games. Watkins has touchdown receptions of 69 and 79 yards and was referred to as possibly the nation's best "deep threat" by Sports Illustrated. Although he caught only four passes for 24 yards against Colorado State, his presence made it possible for Cougar running backs to rack up a season high 207 yards and three scores.

THE HOUSE OF PAYNE

Five games into the 2004 season Ray Guy award candidate Matt Payne has punted 33 times for 1,533 yards, including a 79-yarder against USC. He leads the MWC in punting and is third in the nation with a 46.45 yards-per-punt average. Payne also wreaks havoc on punt and kick coverage, recording two-highlight reel-quality hits on Boise State punt returner Chris Carr as well as on an unsuspecting kick returner for Colorado State. Payne also hasn't been a slouch when kicking field goals or extra points. The Lou Groza award candidate has scored a team-leading 32 points, including two field goals 52 yards or greater. He is a perfect 6-6 from 40-plus yards. Payne has hit all eleven of his extra points this season and seven of eight on field goals.

GOING DEEP PART II

Freshman wide receiver Austin Collie has caught 24 passes on the season for an average of 12.2 yards per catch and three touchdowns. His three touchdown receptions have all been 40 yards or greater with a long of 57 coming against Boise State.

Of the 105 players who participated in fall camp, 35 are married. The 35 married players have a total of eight children. ATHLETIC EXCELLENCE

The Cougars have experienced athletic success on a national level. Since 1970 when BYU captured its first NCAA title, the Cougars have won ten national championships, including four in cross-country and three in men's volleyball since 1997. BYU also won the national championship in football in 1984. BYU has also ranked high in the NACDA Director's cup, an award given to the nation's best athletic program. LAST WEEK: BYU at Colorado State

BYU opened up MWC play by traveling to Fort Collins to take on Colorado State. The Cougars jumped out to an early 10-0 lead in the second quarter, following a 52-yard field goal by Matt Payne and a 14-yard touchdown run by Curtis Brown. It looked like the Rams were going to be held scoreless in the first half before CSU quarterback Justin Holland drove Colorado State the length of the field, hooking up with David Anderson for a six yard touchdown pass with just under a minute to play in the half. Holland to Anderson would be a recurring theme the entire night as the two hooked up twelve times for 232 yards. The Rams scored first in the second half to take a 14-10 lead and led 21-17 following a five-yard Uldis Juanarajs touchdown run in the fourth quarter. The Cougars scored the game's final 14 points on a 40-yard pass from John Beck to Austin Collie and a three-yard run by Fahu Tahi to earn the 31-21 victory. BYU amassed a season-high 207 yards on the ground.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

BYU is currently seventh in the MWC and 80th in the nation in total offense, averaging 336.20 yards per game. Even after punishing the Colorado State defense with 207 yards rushing, the Cougars still rank next to last in the nation in rushing offense, averaging just 61.6 yards per game. BYU is one of the top passing teams in the nation, ranking third in the conference and 17th in the nation, amassing 274.6 yards per game. Against UNLV, the Cougars will face off against the MWC's fifth best defense. The Rebels rank third in the conference in pass defense (201 y.p.g.) and sixth against the run (181.4 y.p.g.).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

The Cougars' defense ranks sixth in the conference and 83rd in the nation, yielding 404 yards per game. After facing Boise State and Colorado State, who both rank among the top-10 in the nation in passing offense, BYU is last in the MWC against the pass. The Cougars give up 293.4 yards per game through the air. BYU has faired a little better against the rush, ranking second in the conference and 33rd in the nation, giving up 110.6 yards per game on the ground. The Cougars will face off against a balanced Rebel offense that ranks sixth in the conference in passing offense (169.6), fourth in rushing offense (167.8) and sixth in total offense. They boast the conference's top rusher in Dominique Dorsey, who ranks 15th in the nation in rushing yards per game with an average of 112.4 yards per contest.


GRIDDERS GET NEW, COMFORTABLE UNIFORMS

1984 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP HONORED AT FIRST HOME GAME



Marking the 20th anniversary of the Cougars' 1984 National Championship the teamwas this year's sole induction into the BYU Athletic Hall of Fame. The induction ceremony took place Friday evening, Sept. 3, at the Wilkinson Center Ballroom. The team was honored the next day at Lavell Edwards Stadium during the BYU-Notre Dame game in pre-game and halftime ceremonies. Only two other Cougar teams have been inducted into the Hall of Fame: the 1951 NIT Championship Basketball team and the 1966 NIT Championship Basketball team. Cosmo, the Cougarettes and the BYU Marching Band played a part in the game-day festivities. There was also be an informal golf tournament Friday afternoon where some of the players participated as celebrity guests. In addition to the celebration in the stadium, a lithograph has been commissioned in honor of

the '84 team. 1,984 numbered lithographs will be available for purchase. The artwork will feature individually autographed pictures of the 24 starters, including Vai Sikahema and Lee Johnson, along with a team picture and a picture of coach LaVell Edwards.

Familiar players like Glen Kozlowski, Vai Sikahema, Lee Johnson, Mark Bellini and Kelly Smith put Provo on the map in the world of college football. All-Americans like Robbie Bosco, Kyle Morrell, David Mills, Leon White and Mary Allen helped make the team a threat on both sides of the ball. In total, 15 players from the 1984 squad were drafted by 12 different NFL teams. Now, these players—hopefully all 120 of them—will be returning to LaVell Edwards Stadium to be recognized by their alma mater on the 20th anniversary of their epic season. After a perfect 12-0 season, the Cougars went on to defeat Michigan in the Holiday Bowl at Jack Murphy Stadium. Robbie Bosco's heroic return from an early, second-quarter knee injury, along with a circus catch from Kelly Smith, was only part of the 13-game saga. Many fans remember the famous goal-line stand against Hawaii where Kyle Morrell soared over the offensive line to sack the Warrior quarterback and in the process kept their season unblemished.

ELECTION YEAR RECORD

Since 1972, BYU has posted a 80-27 (.748) record during election years, including this 2004. Some of BYU's most significant moments on the gridiron have occurred while republicans and democrats are fighting for a seat in the oval office. During the 1972 presidential election, LaVell Edwards took over as BYU's head coach. In 1976, BYU was invited to its first bowl game, the Fiesta Bowl against Oklahoma State. The 1980 presidential election year brought the Cougars their first bowl victory and a 12-1 record. BYU won the national championship in 1984, and in 1996, the Cougars posted 14 victories and earned their first trip to a New Year's Day bowl game.

The exclusive radio home of BYU Football and flagship of the Cougar Sports Network is 50,000-watt KSL Newsradio 1160 in Salt Lake City. The "Voice of the Cougars" is Greg Wrubell, now in his 4th season as play-by-play commentator. A BYU alum, Wrubell joined the broadcast crew in 1992 as

the sideline/lockerroom reporter. He began calling BYU basketball games in 1996.

Wrubell also hosts the weekly "Gary Crowton Show" Wednesday's at 6 p.m. and "Coordinators' Corner" with Lance Reynolds and Bronco Mendenhall live from Tucano's Thursday's at 6 p.m.

Joining Wrubell is game analyst and former BYU quarterback Marc Lyons. Lyons is a 23-year veteran of Cougar football broadcasts and contributes to KSL's extensive midweek and game day coverage with Andy Boyce reporting from the sidelines

Chief Engineer John Dehnel returns for his 19th season, while veteran statistician Ralph Sokolowsky and spotter Doug Martin complete the lineup in the booth.

KSL's game day coverage begins two hours prior to kickoff with the "Cougar Countdown Show." The "Cougar Pregame Scoreboard Show" starts the broadcast's second hour, with the "Cougar Pregame Coach's Show." 35 minutes prior to kickoff, followed by the "Cougar Kickoff Show."

After the game, KSL presents the "Cougar Postgame Scoreboard Show," followed by the "Cougar Lockerroom Show," "Cougar Postgame Coach's Show," "IFA Country Store Replay," and "Cougar Call-In Show."

EDWARDS SELECTED TO HALL OF FAME



The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame has announced the 2004 College Football Hall of Fame Division I-A Class. Former BYU head football coach LaVell Edwards is among the list of 14 inductees to this year's class. A coaching icon, whose success and longevity are paralleled by few, Edwards guided BYU to heights never before reached in the program's history. Edwards posted a record of 257-101-3 (.716) over a span of 29 seasons at BYU. From 1972 until his retirement following the 2000 season, Edwards roamed the sidelines at BYU—a tenure that ranks fifth all-time among coaches at one school. In 21 of those 29 seasons, the Cougars claimed the league title. Guiding BYU to 22 bowl game appearances,

including a streak of 17 straight bowl appearances, Edwards reached the pinnacle of coaching success in 1984 by winning the National Championship. His 257 wins rank him sixth in NCAA Division I-A history, and he has more victories than every other coach in BYU history combined. At the helm, Edwards compiled a program best .716 win percentage, coached one Heisman Trophy winner, two Outland Trophy recipients, four Davey O'Brien award winners and 32 All-Americans—not to mention countless players who went on to professional careers in the NFL. BYU's success didn't come without personal reward for Edwards either. He was named NCAA District 8 Coach of the Year eight times, the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in 1979 and AFCA National Coach of the Year in 1985. Named the State of Utah's Coach of the Century, Edwards is a member of the State of Utah Sports Hall of Fame. Edwards becomes the fifth person affiliated with BYU football to be inducted in to the College Football Hall of Fame. It is no surprise that the four BYU players who are currently enshrined in the Hall of Fame often credit Edwards for their success. BYU's other College Football Hall of Famers include Steve Young (Class of 2001), Jim McMahon (Class of 1998), Marc Wilson (Class of 1996), Gifford Nielsen (Class of 1994). Edwards, who will turn 74 in October, recently returned from an LDS Church mission to New York City. Along with his wife, Patti, the Edwards' served as public affairs missionaries for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the Northeastern United States, as well as Eastern Canada. The Edwards have been married for nearly 53 years and have three children, Ann, John and Jim. The Edwards have 14 grandchildren.

RECORD WATCH

After kicking two field goals and two extra points against Notre Dame, senior kicker Matt Payne moved past Jamal Willis and Kurt Gunther into third place on BYU's all-time scoring list. One of Payne's field goals was a 53-yarder that matched his career-high that was set in 2003 against USC. In the history of Cougar football there have only been four kicks of 53 yards or more. Matt Payne has two of those kicks. During his sophomore and junior campaigns, he led the team in scoring. Now that Payne has passed Gunther and Willis his climb will be a little steeper. After scoring seven points against Colorado State, he needs 21 more points to catch Luke Staley, who is currently second on BYU's all-time scoring list. Safety Aaron Francisco currently has 292 career tackles. He trails former Cougar and current Indianapolis Colts linebacker Rob Morris by 53 tackles for ninth place on BYU's all-time career tackle list.
