Cougs Return Home for MWC Play

No. 15 BYU returns home to the friendly confines of South Stadium this week to take on Mountain West Conference foes San Diego State and Air Force in the second week of MWC action. The Cougars play SDSU Thursday and Air Force Saturday. Game times are slated for 7 p.m.

The Cougars played two games last week, winning 2-0 over TCU and falling 1-0 to Utah. Katie Larkin and Carolyn Swenson scored goals against the Horned Frogs. Saturday's match against the Utes was a tough battle between two talented teams. Although BYU controlled the second half of action, the Cougars could not find the back of the net and even the score.

Katie Larkin, who has been named the MWC Offensive Player of the Week and named to several national teams of the week, leads BYU with four goals and 11 points. Three of those goals were game winners. Katie Fellows has also netted three goals of her own. Also scoring goals for the Cougars are Alyssa Vander Veur (2), Brooke Bowman (2), Amberlea Anderson (1), Jessica Aquino (1), Haylee Cuthbert (1), Kelsea Kakadelas (1) and Swenson (1). Swenson and Larkin lead BYU with three assists. Goalkeeper Erika Woodbury has accumulated 40 saves on the season and now holds the record for most career saves at BYU with 165.

Jen Mello, scoring five goals and posting two assists, leads the Aztecs, while sidekick Erika Sutton leads the team with five assists and has scored three goals of her own. Cat Walker has also netted three goals. Keeper Cat Burson has saved 55 shots this season.

Air Force's offensive attack is spread evenly among its team with eight players netting goals on the season. Brittney Perkowski leads the team with 2 goals. Rachael Emory and Melinda Mokos have assisted on three and two goals, respectively. Goalkeeper Erin Wallace has recorded 56 saves so far this year.

BYU's all-time record against the Aztecs is 7-7-2, while BYU leads Air Force 8-1-1.

Thursday's game will be televised live on BYUTV with Natalyn Lewis and Rick Boullion as commentators. The game will be rebroadcast on the mtn. on Friday at 3 and 9 p.m., and Sunday at 2 p.m.

RECORD-BREAKING ATTENDANCE:

The No. 18 BYU Women's team took an early lead and fought hard to win an exciting game, 3-2, against No. 21 Colorado on Sept. 8, in front of a record 4,742 fans. The sell-out crowd was the second largest crowd for a women's athletic event in BYU history, beating out the previous weekend's attendance at the BYU vs. Stanford volleyball match.

Last year, BYU soccer broke its attendance record twice. On Sept. 12, 2005, 3,322 fans watched as BYU defeated No. 22 Texas, 1-0. Eleven days later, 3,810 onlookers cheered the Cougars as they defeated No. 9 California, 1-0, off a penalty kick from Natalie Nate.

Mountain West Conference: Week 1 in Review

Air Force: Freshman Jill Foss got her first career start in goal Friday for the Aztecs as they tied the Air Force Falcons, 2-2, in double overtime in their first game of Mountain West Conference play.

It was Ryan who started off the scoring for the Aztecs, knocking one in from 10 yards out on a pass from classmate Erika Sutton to make it, 1-0, Aztecs. San Diego State had control of the game in the first half, playing primarily on the Falcons' side of the field and holding them to just three shots in the first half.

The Aztecs picked up where they left off in the second half when junior co-captain Jessica Girdner scored her second goal of 2006 in the 47th minute to give SDSU a two-goal advantage. Air Force and SDSU continued to battle for the next 20 minutes of play but then a costly penalty set up Air Force for a penalty kick in the 72nd minute. Brittney Perkowski lined up and nailed the penalty kick to pull the Falcons within one at, 2-1.

A minute later, the Falcons' Kelsey Yip was left wide open in front of the net and sank it from 15 yards away to tie the game at two. Neither team would score for the remainder of the game.

UNLV: The Aztecs were looking for revenge Sunday after falling to UNLV in the semifinals of last year's conference tournament and they found it, defeating the Rebels, 4-1, at the SDSU Sports Deck.

San Diego State got on the board in the 34th minute when freshman Jessica Gordon threaded the needle with a pass to Mello, who beat a defender and sank it in the right corner from 12 yards out to give SDSU a, 1-0, lead. In the 50th minute, Mello would once again find the net, this time on a pass from freshman Heather Vandevanter.

SDSU would go on to score two goals in the next 10 minutes to take the, 4-0, advantage. The first one came when freshman Cat Walker used her head on a pass from sophomore Mariko Strickland to sink her third goal of 2006. Sophomore Becky Ryan set up a Vandevanter goal, her second of the season, from 10 yards that found the upper right corner to give SDSU a commanding, 4-0, lead.

UNLV would score in the 82nd minute, but would get no closer.



SOUTH STADIUM

South Stadium is the place the Cougars love to call home, a home all opponents hate to visit.

For the past 11 years, South Stadium (formerly South Field), has been the battlefield for the Cougars as the team has taken on, and defeated, the top teams in their conference and in the NCAA.

The Cougars have amassed an 94-21-6 (.802) record at home, which is among the best in the nation over the same time period. Of those 97 home wins, an outstanding 55 have ended in a shutout.

BYU consistently manages to hold its opponents scoreless when playing at South Stadium with 59 percent of all the Cougars' wins ending in shutout victories, while BYU has been shutout only 10 times in the stadium's history.

Aside from the Cougars' history of defeating tough teams at home, another factor making South Stadium a formidable place for opponents is the large and loud crowd of fans that pack the stadium at every game.

Consistently among the top 15 in the NCAA, South Stadium packs in some of the largest crowds in the country. With an average attendance of 2,069 fans during the 2005 campaign, the Cougars rank among the highest every year for largest attendance average in the country. BYU also packed in a total of 24,830 fans over 12 games, recording the third-highest attendance mark in the nation and making South Stadium one of the toughest places for opponents to play in women's college soccer today.

Located just south of the Smith Fieldhouse, South Stadium boasts one of the best-maintained grass playing surfaces in the NCAA. The Wasatch Mountains serve as a scenic backdrop for the capacity crowd of 3,000 fans. South Stadium is also equipped with state-of-the-art field lights, making night games a favorite among fans.

Mountain West Conference: Week 1 in Review

SDSU: A pair of late-game goals, just over one minute apart, sparked the Air Force women's soccer team to a 2-2 tie with San Diego State, Friday afternoon in Mountain West Conference action at the SDSU Sports Deck.

San Diego State took an early 1-0 lead in the 26th minute as Becky Ryan scored from ten yards out. Arvada native Erika Sutton was credited with the assist. The Aztecs seemed to put the match away in the 47th minute, as Jessica Girdner scored from 25 yards out to put SDSU ahead 2-0.

Air Force got its break at the 71:55 mark getting a penalty kick chance. Senior Brittney Perkowski did not waste the opportunity, scoring the PK to make it a 2-1 SDSU lead. Just one minute and four seconds later, at the 72:59 mark, freshman Kelsey Yip chose a great time to score her first-career goal, tying the match up at 2-2. Senior Melinda Mokos was credited with the assist.

The two teams failed to score the rest of the match, which included two sudden-death overtime periods.

Wyoming: Tamika Wilson's two goals boosted Wyoming to a 3-1 win over Air Force in Mountain West Conference women's soccer action, Sunday morning at the UW Soccer Stadium.

Wyoming took the lead in the game just three minutes in, as Corey Thieman scored off Emily Layton's corner kick. Air Force came right back in the 11th minute though, as Alison Wood netted her first goal of the season from a free kick about 40 yards out. Rachael Emory and Brittney Perkowski were credited with assists.

Wilson then put the Cowgirls back ahead with a goal in the 28th minute, again off a corner kick from Emily Layton. Wilson later notched her second goal of the day, this one coming in the 65th minute, off a pass from Christine Nagel to make it a 3-1 game.

Air Force out-shot Wyoming 21-16 and 11-6 on shots on goal. Katherine Taylor and Ashley Collins both had four shots, two on goal for the Falcons. Erin Wallace had three saves at goalkeeper for AFA.

**COUGARS PICKED TO WIN MWC CROWN**

In a vote by the Mountain West Conference coaches, BYU received four of eight first-place votes and was selected to win the 2006 MWC women's soccer regular-season championship in the preseason poll. The Cougars collected a total of 46 points to capture the top spot in the poll. Utah, which won the last year's MWC regular-season title, received three first-place votes and took second place in the poll with 44 points. San Diego State was picked to finish third with 35 points, while also tallying one first-place vote.

After completing her 11th season, head coach Jennifer Rockwood has taken the BYU women's soccer team to national prominence and established herself as one of the premier coaches in Division I soccer today.

Rockwood currently ranks 11th in winning percentage among active NCAA coaches with an impressive 180-58-14 overall record for her career. Over the last 11 seasons, Rockwood accumulated a .742 winning percentage.

In the past 11 years, Rockwood has guided the Cougars to five conference championships. On the national scene, her teams have made eight appearances in the NCAA Tournament in the last nine years and reached the Sweet Sixteen in 1998, 2000 and 2003. In 2005, BYU received its first-ever No. 4 seed in the NCAA tournament and was ranked as high as No. 6 in the country, the highest ranking awarded to the Cougars in school history. BYU regularly maintains a consistent top-25 ranking. During Rockwood's tenure, the team finished in the top-10 three times, including a recent run in the 2003 NCAA College Cup. The tournament ended with BYU finishing No. 5 in the country after making their first Elite Eight appearance in the program's history.

Among the many achievements and awards she has received over her career, Rockwood has been honored with two Coach of the Year citations, one by the Western Athletic Conference in 1996, and again by the MWC in 2000. She also became the first MWC coach to eclipse the 100-win total mark when the Cougars shutout Milwaukee-Wisconsin 2-0 on Sept. 23, 2000.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Jaime Rendich Beck, Aleisha Rose, and Michelle Jensen. Among the players who have been coached by Rockwood are four additional All-American athletes that were drafted by the women's United Soccer Association: Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot and Staci Reynolds. Sara Reading was also selected to play for the WUSA.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Rick's College on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management. Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs and high school teams.

CHRIS WATKINS • Assistant Coach

Assistant coach Chris Watkins' technical knowledge has helped guide the BYU women's soccer team to eight NCAA tournaments in the past nine years, including a No. 5 finish in 2003.

When Watkins was hired in 1996, he brought impressive credentials, both professional and collegiate, to a young but talented Cougar squad. He played four years for the semi-professional Salt Lake City Flamengo team (1992-95). Watkins was also the Gatorade Player of the Year in his home state of Kansas. Most recently, he played for the Utah Blitz in 2002, scoring the golden goal to win the Western Conference. During college, he played NCAA Division I soccer at Drake University and held the single-season scoring record there. He later graduated from BYU.

Watkins also coaches the BYU men's soccer team, compiling an overall record of 140-35-13 in ten years. Chris and his wife Karen live in Mapleton, Utah with their sons Drake, Ethan and Tanner.

ALEISHA ROSE • Assistant Coach

Aleisha Rose, a four-year All-American midfielder for BYU, enters her third season as an assistant for the women's soccer team. Rose became one of the Cougars' most prominent recruits after being named the 1999 National High School Player of the Year before joining the Cougars. She lived up to her billing as a freshman by scoring seven goals and contributing 13 assists. She also received All-Conference First-Team honors, as well as the ESPN/Soccer Times Freshman of the Year Award.

As a senior, Rose received her fourth All-America honor after being named to the NSCAA All-American Third Team. She was also a Soccer Post All-American First Team, Soccer American MVP and Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year. Among the numerous awards and citations Rose won during her career, she also graduated as the No. 1 all-time career assist leader at BYU with 47 assists.

After playing four seasons at BYU, Rose received a bachelor's degree in Marriage, Family & Human Development. She lives with her husband Chris and daughter Hannah in Provo.
