BYU Opens MWC Play Saturday Hosting Reigning Champion San Diego State

BYU (10-4, 0-0 MWC) opens its Mountain West Conference schedule at home Saturday against reigning conference champion San Diego State (11-4, 0-1 MWC). The game will be televised nationally on VERSUS at 3:30 p.m. MST. The radio broadcast can be heard beginning with the pregame show at 2:30 p.m. on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at ksl.com. The Cougars have won their last five games, including three victories last week to win the BYU Holiday Classic. The Aztecs began the year with eight straight wins on the way to an 11-3 nonconference record before being upset at home Wednesday by Wyoming, 66-65, in their league opener. The Cougars had a bye Wednesday as the lone MWC team not in action.

BYU stays at home to host TCU Wednesday at 7 p.m. MST. The game will be televised on the MountainWest Sports Network (the mtn.)

COUGAR QUICK HITS

- Cougar head coach Dave Rose guided BYU to a 20-9 record and an NIT appearance last season in his first year at the helm after eight years as BYU's lead assistant. He was named the Mountain West Conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year. Rose coached his team to a second-place MWC finish - one game behind leaguechampion San Diego State - while turning a 9-21 team into a 20-9 success that proved to be the second-best improvement among all Division I programs.

- BYU was picked to finish second in the Mountain West Conference in the preseason MWC media poll behind reigning champion San Diego State.

- BYU's roster this season includes a solid core of returning players, including six seniors and Trent Plaisted, the MWC Freshman of the Year last year. One of nine returning lettermen, Plaisted was named a Freshman All-American after leading BYU in both scoring (13.6) and rebounding (6.9) one year ago. 2006 All-MWC Third Team forward Keena Young leads BYU this year in scoring (16.6) and is second on the boards (7.0), while Plaisted is the top rebounder (7.2) and second in scoring (11.4). Senior Austin Ainge leads BYU with 3.6 assists per game.

LOOKING AT SAN DIEGO STATE

San Diego State is the defending Mountain West Conference regular-season and tournament champions, returning four starters and seven lettermen from last year's 24-9 team that earned a 13-3 conference record and an NCAA Tournament berth. The Aztecs began the year with eight straight wins and finished their nonconference schedule with an 11-3 record. San Diego State was upset at home Wednesday to open league play, falling 66-65 to Wyoming in a rematch of the 2006 MWC championship game. At 11-3 in nonconference play, San Diego State matched its best start in the last 21 seasons, three games ahead of its Division I-era record-setting 24-win total from last season, when SDSU was 8-6 after 14 games. Last year, SDSU did not win its 11th game until Jan. 18. The 2006-07 Aztec squad may go down as the best shooting squad in school history. Through Sunday's games, SDSU ranked 10th in field goal percentage (50.8

), 12th in three-point field goal percentage (42.0) and 46th in free throw percentage (42.9) of the 325 Division I teams. Four of the Aztecs' top five scorers shoot above 48 percent from the field, and the other, Heath, a John Wooden Award candidate, is 28th nationally in scoring. Heath, the MWC's all-time leader in scoring and steals, passed Michael Cage (1,846 points) Wednesday vs. Wyoming as SDSU's career scoring leader. The senior ranks fifth among all active Division I players in scoring. The Aztecs posted a .500 or better month for a seventh consecutive month by closing out December with a 78-68 victory over Lafayette. The victory was Steve Fisher's 300th of his career. SDSU is 7-2 at home, 2-2 on the road and 2-0 on neutral floors. The Aztec road wins were at St. Mary's (74-73) and UC Santa Barbara (76-72). The Aztecs are averaging 76.8 points on .495 shoooting from the floor, .400 on threes and .741 from the line. SDSU is allowing 69.7 points on .430 shooting, including .320 from long range. They are winning the battle of the boards 35.2-32.5.

SDSU'S LAST OUTING — Wyoming Edges San Diego State in Cox Arena

SAN DIEGO - James Spencer scored 22 points and hit a 3-pointer with 4.9 seconds left to lift Wyoming to a 66-65 win over San Diego State on Wednesday. San Diego State took a 65-61 lead on Brandon Heath's running jumper in the lane with 51.8 seconds left. Wyoming countered with a basket by Brandon Ewing with 30.7 seconds remaining. But Heath, who earlier had become San Diego State's career scoring leader, missed a free throw with 22.7 seconds to set up Spencer's game-winning shot. Wyoming (10-5, 1-0 Mountain West), which broke a two-game losing streak, has split its last four games by a total of seven points. Coach Steve McClain recorded his 150th career win in his ninth season at Wyoming. Heath led San Diego State (11-4, 0-1) with 26 points and surpassed Michael Cage's school-record 1,846 career points with a driving basket at the 12:30 mark of the second half. Heath, already the Mountain West Conference's career scoring leader, scored in double figures for the 40th straight game and has 1,856 points. Daaron Brown and Ewing each scored 19 points for the Cowboys, who outrebounded San Diego State 43-35

SERIES NOTES

BYU owns a 39-19 advantage over the Aztecs in a series that dates back to 1941. The Cougars are 24-3 in Provo, 15-15 in San Diego and 0-1 at a neutral site. BYU has won 12 of the last 18 games and owns an 9-6 advantage since the inception of the MWC, but the Aztecs had won three straight before BYU's win in the season finale between the two teams last year in the Marriott Center. SDSU's three game victory streak matched their longest ever in the series when the Aztecs won the first three outings (two in 1941 and one in 1977). During the most recent three-game streak, SDSU swept the 2005 season series - the first season sweep over BYU since 1985. Dave Rose is 1-1 against the Aztecs.

QUOTING COACH ROSE

San Diego State is a very talented team. Their top six players play a lot of minutes. Coach Fisher has a lot of good young players that he's playing more now than earlier. The stakes are a lot higher in conference play. Everybody's goal is to win a conference championship. To open at home with the defending champions is exciting for our team and our fans. The formula for winning championships is winning games at home. That makes this game that much more important.

LAST OUTING LAST YEAR IN PROVO — Fast-Paced Victory Over League-Leaders For Cougars

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 22, 2006) - In a furiously paced game between two of the Mountain West Conference's best teams, BYU ran past San Diego State, 100-90, Wednesday night at the Marriott Center. The Cougars [17-7, 9-4 MWC] shot a season-best 75.9 percent from the field in the second half while maintaining their place in the MWC and gaining a game on the first-place Aztecs (18-8, 11-3). Six Cougars scored in double figures, led by Keena Young with a career-high 20 points. Austin Ainge scored 16 off the bench while shooting a perfect 6-for-6 from the field and 4-for-4 from three-point range. BYU head coach Dave Rose was pleased with the all-around team effort. The game started out like a track meet, with BYU's fast-paced offense jumping out to an early 6-2 lead. SDSU came back behind Mohamed Abukar and Kyle Spain, who combined for 15 early points on a perfect 6-for-6 shooting from the field to give the Aztecs a 21-19 lead with 10 minutes remaining in the first half. Jimmy Balderson and Ainge came off the bench to spark BYU, leading the Cougars on a 7-2 run and giving them a 24-21 lead with 7:57 left. Balderson and Ainge started a combined 4-for-4 from behind the three point line. BYU also held the Aztecs' two-headed scoring monster of Marcus Slaughter and Brandon Heath to just three points on 1-for-9 shooting in the first 16 minutes. The Cougar defensive intensity powered a 7-0 run and put BYU ahead 35-31 at the 2:44 mark in the first half. The half ended at the same fast pace that it started with as BYU maintained a three-point lead, 41-38, after Abukar hit a desperation three-pointer at the buzzer. The Cougars were led in the first half by Balderson, who scored 12, and Ainge, who added 11 on 3-for-3 shooting from behind the arc. The second half started with the Aztecs running to take a 50-48 lead and forcing $\overline{\text{BYU}}$ to take an early time-out. Young began to establish inside presence, scoring on consecutive trips down the court. Jackson Emery came up with steal and a dunk and an assist setting up a Trent Plaisted dunk. The crowd intensified with the Cougars' run. BYU built a 76-68 lead with 7:30 remaining in the game. The Cougars built a double-digit lead at 80-70 and held on to the lead with clutch foul shooting and lights-out shooting from the field. BYU scored 100 points for the first time in a conference game since defeating San Diego State 101-87 in 1994. The win ended a three-game losing skid to the Aztecs and improved BYU's overall record against SDSU to 39-19. Picked to finish last in the MWC, BYU has won seven of its last eight games and has now defeated every team in the conference while earning in a third-place standing, one game back of the front-running Aztecs in the loss column.

FIRST OUTING LAST YEAR IN SAN DIEGO — AZTECS PROVE TOO MUCH FOR COUGARS

SAN DIEGO (Jan. 21, 2006) - The Cougars started strong but could not keep up with the Mountain West Conference's hottest team as BYU fell 88-61 to San Diego State Saturday night in Cox Arena. Keena Young was, once again, a bright spot for the Cougars in his first start of the season as he tied his career high with 16 points on 6-for-8 shooting while contributing a team-high nine rebounds. Young has scored 16 in three of the last five games. Trent Plaisted's scoring troubles on the road came to an end as he reached double figures with 12 points for the first time in $M\bar{W}C$ road play. Brock Reichner recorded 11 points while adding a career-high six boards. The two teams battled it out in the opening minutes, with a three-pointer from Brock Reichner giving BYU its largest lead of the game at 9-6. From there, the Aztecs went on a 6-0 spurt sparked by Marcus Slaughter to take their first lead of the game at 12-9. Slaughter scored 11 straight for SDSU to keep the Aztecs ahead as BYU continued to play tough and fight for the lead, trailing by just two points at 21-19. However, two consecutive turnovers from Rashaun Broadus bolstered the confidence of the Aztecs and sparked an 8-0 run. Keena Young put a stop to the BYU scoring drought with a jumper at the 5:45 mark but it was not enough to get the Cougars going as SDSU put together an 11-0 run from there to take a 40-21 lead. BYU managed just two baskets in the last 8:19 of the first half as the Aztecs outscored the Cougars 21-4 to take a 42-24 lead into the locker room. BYU came out confident in the second half, having outscored opponents in the second period of play in all but two games this season, and got two quick baskets, including Trent Plaisted's 15th dunk of the season. But the Aztecs were ready for the push and responded accordingly, doubling up the Cougars' makes for the first five minutes of the half to build a 65-39 lead. True freshman Jackson Emery entered the game at the 12:00 minute mark and made an immediate impact with a steal and a three-point make but could not spark BYU at either end of the floor. The Cougars continued struggling to find the hoop and could not stop the 1-2 punch of Slaughter and Brandon Heath, who rank first and third, respectively, in the conference in scoring and combined for 43 points. With the loss, BYU falls to 10-6 on the season and 2-3 in conference play while San Diego State improves to 12-6 overall and takes sole possession of first place in the MWC with a 5-1 record. The Cougars have now lost seven straight league road games dating back to last season

- "This is obviously a setback. But there are times when you get really discouraged with your team and this is not one of them. This team fought hard. We weren't very good tonight, but there's a lot of basketball left to play and this team is going to get better.

- "I've been on the other side of a game like this when playing BYU. It can happen. If it happens, it usually happens on your home territory. We just have to keep things up, keep digging, not think that we are better than we really are and should just enjoy this win tonight.'

BYU's LAST OUTING — Cougars Win BYU Holiday Classic with Victory over Seton Hall PROVO, Utah (Dec. 30, 2006) – The Cougar basketball team capped off the BYU Holiday Classic Saturday night beating Seton Hall 77-68 and becoming the 2006 tournament champions. The first game of Saturday's tournament play featured a blowout with Oral Roberts defeating Liberty 90-58. BYU improves its record to 10-4 on the season with the win, and Seton Hall falls to 8-4. BYU's Keena Young was the tournament's MVP and BYU's Lee Cummard, Seton Hall's Brian Laing, Liberty's Larry Blair and Caleb Green and Ken Tutt of Oral Roberts were selected to the 2006 BYU Holiday Classic All-Tournament Team. The Cougars took awhile to find their rhythm early on as they missed their first four shots and turned the ball over three times. Young finally got BYU going when he hit a fade-away baseline jumper to put BYU on the board. Young finished the night with 26 points and nine boards. Seton Hall started out hot claiming a 12-4 advantage over the Cougars, but guard Jimmy Balderson ignited the team taking a charge at the 14:30 mark. On the next two possessions, BYU hit back-to-back triples by Cummard and Ainge to cut the deficit to 12-10. The Arizonapossessions, BTO his back-to-back unpiles by climinard and Alinge to dut the deflict to 12-10. The Alizonia-native guards Cummard and Ainge had career nights with 16 points each and 12 and nine boards, respec-tively. All of those stats were career or season highs. Mike Rose and Vuk Ivanovic gave BYU a huge lift off the bench in the first half. Ivanovic had a career-high four blocks, and Rose grabbed a steal and hit a deep three to give BYU its first lead 21-20 with 10 minutes remaining. On the next possession Cummard crashed the boards and slammed home a one-handed dunk off a rebound that had all 10,103 fans in the Marriot Center on their feet screaming. The Pirates maintained control of the game throughout the half forcing 15 BYU firsthalf turnovers and scoring 24 points off them. Seton Hall led at the midway mark 43-35. The eight-point deficit marked the first time the Cougars have trailed at half for this season. The Cougars began the second half attacking the basket and forcing the Pirates to commit six fouls before the first media timeout but were only able to cut the deficit to seven. The Pirates had problems all night getting a body on Cummard as he once again grabbed an offensive board and converted a two-point bucket to tie the game at 58 with 7:52 The Cougars then tightened up with a zone defense on Seton Hall and took a six-point lead at 67-61 when Broadus nailed a three with 5:13 remaining. Plaisted then let the Pirates know how difficult it is to win in the Marriott Center when he got a huge block, ran the entire floor and ended up with a two-handed throw-down to give BYU its largest lead of the game, 71-64. Down the stretch the Cougars' defense was spectacular as they held Seton Hall to just seven points in the last five and a half minutes of the game. BYU held on to the lead and extended its current win streak to five games as the Cougars beat the Pirates 77-68

BYU will be facing San Diego State in the league opener for the fifth time in the eight years of the MWC. BYU is 2-2 against SDSU in MWC openers, with a 2-1 record at home and 0-1 record in San Diego. BYU's 59-57 loss to the Aztecs to open the 2005 MWC season is the Cougars lone home loss in an MWC opener. BYU has opened against either SDSU or UNLV every season but last year when the Cougars started league play at Air Force. BYU has gone on to earn a postseason invite in six of the seven previous MWC seasons, finishing as league champs twice (2001 and 2003) and MWC Tournament champions once (2001). BYU's opening opponent has advanced to postseason in four of the seven seasons, with one (UNLV in 2000) claiming a share of the league regular season and two (UNLV in 2000 and SDSU in 2002) winning the conference tournament.

WINNING STREAKS

With five straight wins against Utah State, Western Oregon, Liberty, Oral Roberts and Seton Hall, the Cougars are currently enjoying their longest winning streak of the season. Earlier this year with wins against Idaho State, Portland and Southern Utah, the Cougars put together a three-game win streak, which ended with a loss at Boise State. BYU had several winning streaks last season, including its longest since the 2003-04 season at six straight victories. That streak was tied for the seventh-longest active winning streak in the nation. The Cougars' prior victory streaks last year included one four-game streak, two three-game streaks and two two-game streaks. BYU won 10 of its last 13 games last year.

ON THE ROAD

BYU's win at Weber State marked the Cougars' first road win of the season. BYU is 1-3 on the road this year with a season-opening loss at current No. 1 UCLA, a Nov. 29 setback at Boise State and an overtime defeat at Lamar. The Cougars lost their only neutral court so far this season with a loss against No. 25 Michigan State at The Palace of Auburn Hills in Auburn Hills, Mich. The victory over the Wildcats snapped a three-game road losing streak dating back to last year's season-ending defeat at Houston in the NIT and a five-game nonconference road losing streak since defeating Washington State last year in Spokane Arena on Nov. 22, 2005. BYU finished last year 6-8 away from home, including a 4-4 mark during MWC play.

BOUNCE BACK COUGARS

The Cougars' back-to-back losses vs. then-No. 25 Michigan State and at Lamar marked the first time under Dave Rose that BYU has lost consecutive regular-season games. Prior to the Lamar loss, BYU had bounced back from each of its two losses this season with wins, including back-to-back victories after their loss at Boise State on Nov. 29. BYU recovered from its season-opening loss at then No. 5 UCLA (now ranked No. 1 in the polls) with three straight wins. Last year with its 20-9 overall record, BYU suffered consecutive defeats only once – against Utah in the Mountain West Conference Tournament and at Houston in the NIT in the last two games of the year, having bounced back from each prior loss with a victory.

MAGIC NUMBER: 70

This year the Cougars are scoring 76.5 points and allowing 66.7 points. BYU is 9-0 when opponents score less than 70 points this year and 1-4 when they score 70 or more. BYU is 10-1 when it scores 70 or more points (exception at Lamar) and 0-3 when scoring less than 70. Last year BYU was 12-0 when holding opponents under 70 points and 8-9 when allowing opponents to surpass the 70-point threshold. Cougar foes averaged 71.7 points per game last year. BYU was also 17-4 when scoring 70 or more points and 3-5 when falling below the 70-point mark. The Cougars led the MWC in scoring last year, averaging 76.2 ppg, and scored 100 points in conference play for the first time since Feb. 10, 1994 in their home game against league-champion San Diego State.

CLEANING OFF THE GLASS

BYU is 10-0 this season when outrebounding its opponents and 0-4 when losing the battle of the boards. Sophomore Trent Plaisted leads BYU with 7.2 rpg, followed by senior Keena Young at 7.0 rpg. BYU averaged 49.0 rebounds per game last week during the BYU Holiday Classic, including backto-back season-high efforts of 52 rebounds Friday vs. Oral Roberts and then 55 against Seton Hall on Saturday. BYU outre-bounded the Pirates 55-34 as four Cougars had nine or more rebounds (Cummard 12, Young, Plaisted and Ainge 9). Cummard and Ainge achieved new careeer highs.

CLOSE CALLS

BYU is the only Mountain West Conference team that has not had a game decided by three points or less this season. The Cougars have had some close games, however, as three games have required overtime this season. BYU is 2-1 in overtime with an 86-77 loss at Lamar on Dec. 13 and an 84-78 win against Idaho State on Nov. 18 and a 73-69 victory at Weber State on Dec. 2. This is the first season since 2001-02 that BYU has played multiple extra period games in one year [BYU was 0-3 in overtime that season]. The Cougars' loss at Lamar ended a five-game overtime winning streak dating back to March 14, 2003, an 86-80 setback against Colorado State at the MWC Tournament. BYU is 50-45 (.526) all-time when playing past regulation.

VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

BYU is the only MWC team to face two ranked opponents during nonconference play. The Cougars lost 76-61 to then-No. 25 Michigan State (currenlty No. 24) at The Palace of Auburn Hills in Auburn Hills, Mich. BYU suffered a season-opening (82-69) loss at then-No. 5 UCLA (currenlty No. 1) on Nov. 15. BYU's last win over a ranked team came at the Delta Center (recently renamed EnergySolutions Arena) in Salt Lake City on Dec. 6, 2003 with a 76-71 victory vs. 25th-ranked Oklahoma State, who advanced to the Final Four that season.

CONSISTENT COLIGAR

BYU's most consistent player this year has been senior forward Keena Young, who has scored in double figures in 13 out of 14 games. He leads BYU in scoring (16.6) and is second in rebouding (7.0). The senior cocaptain has led BYU in scoring six times and rebounding six times, including his career-high 16-rebound performance against Oral Roberts for his fourth double-double of the season (21 points). His 27 points at Weber State is the most by a Cougar since Dec. 13, 2003 (Rafael Araujo - 28).

VETERAN LEADERSHIP

Senior Austin Ainge is averaging a team-best 3.6 assists and is second on the team in three-pointers (18). He totaled a season-high 16 points with a career-best nine rebounds off the bench Saturday against Seton Hall. He scored 11 points off the bench- all in the first half – to give BYU early control of the game against Utah State. His 14 points – all in the second half – against Boise State fueled BYU's furious comeback attempt. Ainge has started seven games at the point and come off the bench in seven outings.

DOING IT ALL

Lee Cummard contributes across the box score and on the defensive end of the floor for BYU. In the BYU Holiday Classic, he averaged 11.3 points, 9.0 rebounds and 3.3 assists while shooting .542 from the floor, .444 on threes and was perfect from the line. He was named to the all-tournament team. After coming one rebound away from the first double-double of his career against Oral Roberts with 13 points and a then career-high 9 rebounds to go along with 5 assists, he finished the Classic with career highs of 16 points and 12 rebounds vs. Seton Hall. He leads BYU with 19 treys. He has had at least one steal in 12 of 14 games. On the year, Cummard averages 9.9 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.9 assists, 1.6 steals and 0.5 blocks while shooting .531 from the floor, .463 on threes and .850 from the line. He guards the opponent's top perimeter player. One of his defensively highlights was helping hold Utah State's leading shooter Jaycee Carroll, who ranked 22nd in the nation shooting .629, to just .308 shooting (4-for-13) and seven points below his average.

FOR STARTERS

BYU has found success with its current lineup, winning the last five games since returning to the original starting five that began the season. Coach Rose has used four different starting lineups so far this year. The original starting lineup of the season includes Rashaun Broadus at the point, Lee Cummard and Jimmy Balderson on the wing, and Keena Young and Trent Plaisted in the post with Austin Ainge a key player coming off the bench. That lineup is 6-1 overall on the year, with the loss being at current No. 1 UCLA in the season opener. Sophomore Lee Cummard and senior Keena Young have started every game this year, while sophomore Trent Plaisted has missed just one start because of injury. Broadus has started 10 games and Ainge seven with the two points guards starting together on three occasions.

BYU BASKETBALL ON TELEVISION

BYU's next televised game will be on Jan. 6 when BYU hosts reigning MWC champion San Diego State to open conference play. The game will be aired nationally on VERSUS. The Mountain West Conference's 2006-07 men's basketball television schedule features an unprecedented 99 games on national and regional television, including 65 of the 72 conference contests and all eight MWC Championship matchups. The television coverage provided by the MWC broadcast partners in 2006-07 is more than triple the national and regional telecasts MWC men's basketball has received in previous years. Seventy-five games will be shown on the MountainWest Sports Network (the mtn.), with 17 to be broadcast nationally on College Sports Television (CSTV) and seven on VERSUS (formerly OLN). BYU will have 18 regular-season games televised as part of the 2006-07 MWC television schedule, including three games on CSTV, one on VERSUS and 14 on the mtn. With the exception of a road game at TCU, BYU's entire conference schedule will be televised in 2007. BYU's nonconference games featured in the MWC broadcast schedule include home dates with Southern Utah (Nov. 24, 8 p.m. MT), San Jose State (Dec. 6, 7 p.m. MT) and Utah State (Dec. 16, 4 p.m. MT). While not part of the MWC television package, BYU's regular-season opener at 2006 NCAA runner-up UCLA on Nov. 15 was televised on Fox Sports Net Prime Ticket, while the BYU-Michigan State matchup on Dec. 9 at The Palace at Auburn Hills was carried on ESPN2. BYU's game at Boise State on Nov. 29 was aired on KTVB in Boise and the matchup with Weber State was carried in Utah on KJZZ-TV.

DEFENDING THE HOME COURT

With 23 straight wins in the Marriott Center, the Cougars currently are tied with Air Force for the thirdlongest active home victory streak in the nation. BYU has won its first nine home games this season after going 14-1 at home last year including wins in its last 14 straight home contests.

HALFTIME REPORT

BYU has led at the half in 10 of the team's first 14 games. BYU's win over Seton Hall Saturday marked the first time the Cougars have won this year after trailing at the break. The Cougars' 82-69 loss at UCLA after leading 39-36 at the half marked the first time since the 2004-05 season that BYU has lost when leading at the half. KEENA YOUNG NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (JAN 2)

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (Jan. 2, 2007) - BYU senior Keena Young was named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week, marking his first career weekly honor. A 6-6 forward from Beaumont, Texas, Young was named tournament MVP at the BYU Holiday Classic as he led the Cougars to the title with victories over Liberty (73-59), Oral Roberts (72-62) and Seton Hall (77-68). He scored 17 points on 6-of-12 shooting against Liberty to open the Classic and followed with a career-high 16 rebounds to go along with 21 points scored versus Oral Roberts. Against the Golden Eagles, Young sank nine of his 13 shots from the floor, while his 16 rebounds is a team season-best. In the tournament finale against Seton Hall, he scored 18 of his season-high 26 points in the second half, helping BYU overcome an eight-point halftime deficit to claim the tournament crown. Young also added nine rebounds, a season-best tying three assists, while shooting 11-for-18 from the field and hitting all four of his free throw attempts. For the week, Young averaged 21.3 points and



9.7 rebounds per game, while shooting 60.5 percent (26-for-43) from the field and 75.0 percent (12-for-16) from the charity stripe.

IN THE FIRST SEVEN YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had five 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools along with Utah. UNLV has had three, Wyoming three, New Mexico, San Diego State and Air Force two and Colorado State none.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second once and third on three occasions. The Cougars were third last year (67) behind Air Force (50) and San Diego State (56).
- BYU has played the toughest schedule on average of any team in the MWC (average strength of schedule rating the past seven years is 66, Utah is next at 78). BYU has had the league's toughest schedule in two of the past three seasons.

BREAKING THE LANGUAGE BARRIER

The presence of returned missionaries and international players on BYU's roster leads to a variety of languages that can be heard on the Cougar bench. Six players speak a language in addition to English, including Austin Ainge (Spanish), Fernando Malaman (Portuguese), Jimmy Balderson (Marshallese), Jonathan Tavernari (Portuguese), Vuk Ivanovic (Serbian) and Gavin MacGregor (Dutch). Two BYU assistant coaches also speak other languages as Walter Roese speaks Portuguese, and John Wardenburg speaks Dutch.

AINGE, BALDERSON, YOUNG SERVE AS TEAM CAPTAINS

Coach Rose and the Cougar coaching staff have announced this year's team captains, calling upon seniors Austin Ainge, Jimmy Balderson and Keena Young to lead this year's team. "I'm proud of the way these three players have developed and of their dedication to our team," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "They are totally commitment to this program and have earned the respect and confidence of their teammates. They will provide us with good leadership as we work together as a team to achieve our goals." Ainge, a co-captain of last season's team, proved a valuable asset off the bench in 2005-06 after starting at the point guard spot and receiving All-Mountain West Conference honorable mention as a sophomore. Last season he ranked 11th in the MWC in assists while helping BYU lead the league in both scoring and assists. Balderson also provided a spark off the bench for the Cougars last season as he scored in double figures in 11 of the last 13 games and was the only player in the conference averaging more than 10 points per game off the bench with a 10.2 scoring average. Young led BYU in rebounding as a sophomore before becoming an All-MWC Third Team pick last year after starting the last 14 games of the year and ranking second on the team in rebounding (5.8 rpg) and third in scoring (10.3 ppg).

REDSHIRTS

Freshmen swingmen Jordan Cameron and Brock Zylstra are expected to redshirt this season. Fellow freshman Jonathan Tavernari sat out of BYU's first three games while a BYU-requested NCAA review of his two years of high school in the United States was being concluded. After the review was completed, Coach Rose announced the 6-foot-6 freshman forward from Sao Bernardo, Brazil, would not redshirt this season. He played in his first game on Nov. 24 when the Cougars hosted Southern Utah in the Marriott Center.

20-WIN SFASONS

With a win against New Mexico to conclude the regular season last year, the Cougars achieved their 29th 20-win season. BYU has averaged 20 wins every 2.7 years (BYU has played 78 seasons in which it has played at least 20 games in a season). BYU coach Dave Rose is the fifth Cougar head coach to reach 20 wins in his first season at the helm. He joins G. Ott Romney (20-10 in 1928-29), Stan Watts (22-12 in 1949-50), Ladell Anderson (20-11 in 1983-84) and Roger Reid (21-9 in 1989-90). Both Watts and Reid achieved six 20-win seasons in their BYU coaching careers while Romney posted five and Rose's predecessor, Steve Cleveland, achieved four.

20-win Seasons at BYU

Stan Watts had 6 seasons of 20 wins in 23 years of coaching Roger Reid had 6 seasons of 20 wins in 8 years of coaching 6. Ott Romney had 5 seasons of 20 wins in 9 years of coaching Steve Cleveland had 4 seasons of 20 wins in 8 years of coaching Ladell Anderson had 3 season of 20 wins in 6 years of coaching Frank Arnold had 3 seasons of 20 wins in 8 years of coaching Floyd Millet had 1 season of 20 wins in 8 years of coaching Dave Rose has 1 season of 20 wins in 1 year of coaching

BYU AND MWC IN POSTSEASON

BYU has earned an invite to a postseason tournament in six of the seven years of the MWC, joining Utah in leading all MWC teams. BYU is second to Utah in NCAA appearances since the formation of the MWC (BYU has made three NCAA and three NIT while Utah has made five NCAA and one NIT). UNLV has received five invites (one NCAA, four NIT). New Mexico has received four (one NCAA, three NIT) while Wyoming has three (one NCAA, two NIT), San Diego State has three (two NCAA, one NIT) and Air Force has three (two NCAA and one NIT). Colorado State has been to one NCAA Tournament. TCU's first year was last season.

SEVEN MWC TOURNAMENTS, SIX DIFFERENT CHAMPIONS

San Diego State became the first team in the MWC to win the Tournament title twice with its victories in 2002 and 2006. New Mexico's win in 2005 marked the sixth Tournament winner in the first six years of the event. The only teams not to win an MWC title are Wyoming, Air Force and TCU, who made its MWC debut last season.

MWC TEAMS IN THE NCAA

In the first seven years of the MWC, eight of the nine conference members have advanced to the NCAA Tournament at least once. TCU is the lone team not to advance but the Horned Frogs played in the MWC for the first time last season. New Mexico became the last of the other MWC teams to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament by winning the 2005 MWC Tournament. 2006 MWC-Champion San Diego State received the league's automatic bid last season while Air Force was selected as an at-large team (BYU was the other postseason MWC team last year, advancing to the NIT).

NONCONFERENCE SCHEDULE INCLUDED NATIONAL RUNNER-UP UCLA, MICHIGAN STATE AND SETON HALL

The BYU men's basketball nonconference schedule this year included dates with 2006 NCAA Tournament runner-up UCLA of the Pac-10 Conference, 2005 Final Four participant Michigan State of the Big Ten Conference and 2006 NCAA qualifier Seton Hall of the Big East Conference. In all, the Cougars' non-league slate includeD 14 games against teams from 10 different conferences.

"We are excited about our schedule," BYU coach Dave Rose said before the season. "We look forward to the challenge of playing some of the best teams in the country and believe the BYU Holiday Classic will be a great event for our fans. This should be a balanced, competitive schedule that will help us prepare for the conference. We hope to continue to improve as a team and build on the success our program achieved last season."

BYU played Michigan State of the Big Ten on a neutral court at The Palace of Auburn Hills – home of the Detroit Pistons – on Dec. 9. The Spartans, who finished 22-12 last season, will play BYU at EnergySolutions Arena (formerly Delta Center) in Salt Lake City in 2007. New to BYU's schedule this season was the BYU Holiday Classic, which was conducted the last weekend of December to conclude nonleague play. The fourteam field included Big South Conference foe Liberty, Mid-Continent Conference champion Oral Roberts and Big East Conference NCAA qualifier Seton Hall. The Pirates became the first Big East team to visit the Marriott Center since 1990 when St. John's played in the Cougar Classic, although BYU's last three NCAA Tournament opponents – Syracuse in 2004, Connecticut in 2003, and Cincinnati in 2001 – are Big East teams.

UCLA, Michigan State, Seton Hall, Oral Roberts, Portland, Liberty, Idaho State, San Jose State and Western Oregon were new to the schedule for 2006-07, while Lamar, Boise State, Weber State, Utah State and Southern Utah being repeat opponents from last season. Liberty was the lone first-time opponent for BYU. BYU will play a minimum of nine games against teams that qualified for last year's NCAA Tournament.

The MWC season begins in Provo against reigning MWC Champion San Diego State and culminates against in-state rival Utah in the Marriott Center – the first regular-season finale between the Cougars and Utes since the 1995-96 season.

"Our league will be very competitive this year," BYU coach Dave Rose said. "Seven of the nine teams return at least three starters and five return four or more. We are looking forward to the upcoming season. I think our fans will be treated to some outstanding basketball in the Marriott Center this year."

The Cougars will play 30 regular-season games in 2006-07 prior to the MWC Tournament at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas March 6-10.

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

- With the addition of freshman Jonathan Tavernari, 26 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 35 of the past 55 years.
- Another international player, Jean Carlos Otero from Colombia, signed with BYU in November.
- In the last five years, BYU has rostered six international players, including four on this season's team –
 Jimmy Balderson (Canada), Vuk Ivanovic (Serbia) and Fernando Malaman and Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil).
- Foreign players at BYU have received eight all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards [Timo Saarelainen 1985, Rafael Araujo 2004] and eight All-America citations [Kresimir Cosic 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo 2004].
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

FOUR RECRUITS COMMIT TO BYU DURING NOVEMBER SIGNING PERIOD

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 19, 2006) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose today announced that four players – two from the high school ranks and two from junior colleges – have committed to attend BYU next season by signing national letters of intent during November's early signing period. Joining the Cougar program for the 2007-08 season will be 6-foot-9 forward Chris Collinsworth out of Provo (Utah) High School; 6-foot-2 combo guard Jimmer Fredette from Glens Falls (N.Y.) High School; 5-foot-10 point guard Lamont Morgan out of Saddleback Community College (Mission Viejo, Calif); and 6-foot-7 forward Jean Carlos Otero out of Miami-Dade College (Miami, Fla.). "We are excited about the early class," Rose said. "The common denominator is that all these guys come from winning programs and they are a key to that success. Since we are losing six seniors as well as others to missions after this year, it is important for us to address those changes, especially on the perimeter. This gives us a great start as we work toward completing our recruiting in the spring."

CHRIS COLLINSWORTH

An athletic player known for his versatility and soft shooting touch, Collinsworth earned first-team all-state honors last season after averaging 14.1 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game for the 4A state runner-up Provo Bulldogs. He shot 56 percent from the field to help himself earn All-Valley Co-MVP honors by the Deseret Morning News, All-Valley First Team recognition by the Provo Daily Herald and first-team Region 7 accolades from a vote of area coaches. Showing his versatility, the 6-foot-9 forward has also played the point guard position. His inside-outside game has drawn comparisons to former BYU great Kresimir Cosic. Collinsworth received recruiting attention from schools such as North Carolina, Arizona State, West Virginia, USC and Oregon State in addition to several Mountain West Conference schools. "Chris has the ability to score in the post and on the perimeter," Rose said. "He is a tireless worker who brings a skill level that will be important to our transition offense. He's from right here in our backyard, and we are excited to have him join our program."

JIMMER FREDETTE

A talented scorer, Fredette averaged 29.3 points per game as a junior while leading Glens Falls High School to a 21-2 overall record and the state title game. A first-team all-state selection and the 2006 Times Union Player of the Year, Fredette is known for his outside shooting and playmaking ability. He made a team-leading 76 three-pointers last season while shooting 83 percent from the free-throw line and scoring more than 30 points in 12 of 23 games. The athletic combo guard also averaged 25 points for the Albany City Rocks AAU team over the summer, leading the squad to a third-place finish at AAU Nationals. An all-around athlete, he earned all-state honors as a wide receiver during his junior year before electing not to play football as a senior to concentrate on basketball. Utah, Syracuse, Wake Forest, Seton Hall, Marshall, Siena, George Mason, West Virginia, Virginia Tech and Penn State also recruited Fredette. "Jimmer is a terrific shooter who also has the ability to run a team," Rose said. "He is a very unselfish player and is very committed to hard work and getting better. He's a great addition to our team."

LAMONT MORGAN

A sophomore this year at Saddleback Community College, Morgan is an extremely quick point guard and strong team leader. He is averaging 8.7 points, 4.7 assists and 3.0 steals per game so far this season after playing in all 31 games as a freshman to help the Gauchos to a 22-9 record. Morgan has excellent defensive abilities and shot 81 percent from the free-throw line last year. As a freshman he recorded season highs of 13 points and seven rebounds while leading the team in assists 11 times. Prior to playing at Saddleback, Morgan prepped at Diamond Ranch High School in Pomona, Calif., earning first-team all-league honors. "Lamont is a winner," Rose said. "He is a team-oriented point guard who provides great leadership and is very competitive. He is extremely quick with the ball. One of the things we really like about Lamont is his ability to defend. His experience will be counted on."

JEAN CARLOS OTERO

Otero is an athletic perimeter player with excellent size and strength. Known for his ability to penetrate, he is currently averaging 15.4 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.0 assists while shooting 62 percent from the floor in his second year at Miami-Dade College. The 6-foot-7 swingman is also an excellent perimeter defender, often drawing the assignment to guard the opponent's top scorer. As a freshman at Miami-Dade, Otero averaged 8.4 points and 6.5 rebounds per game while shooting 48 percent from the floor. A native of Barranquilla, Colombia, Otero will be the 27th international player to play men's basketball at BYU. "Jean Carlos is an athletic wing player who can beat people off the dribble, penetrate and finish," Rose said. "He has good size and strength for a wing player. His perimeter defense is going to be counted on heavily."





A tireless worker, gifted motivator and strong strategist, Dave Rose guided BYU to a 20-win season while earning district and conference coach-of-the-year honors in his first season at the Cougar helm in 2005-06. Rose was named to succeed Steve Cleveland as BYU Men's Basketball Head Coach on April 11, 2005.

Rose received national notice for the outstanding job he did during his first season guiding the Cougars. Picked to finish last in the Mountain West Conference in the preseason poll of MWC media members, BYU instead earned a 20-9 record and NIT bid in 2005-06 under Rose's tutelage, including a 12-4 conference mark to tie for second place. Rose was named the USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year and received honor-

able mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com. He was named MWC Coach of the Year by the league's media and coaches and by CollegeInsider.com. ESPN analyst Bob Valvano called BYU "one of the great surprise teams in the country."

In a column on ESPN.com, Pat Forde listed Rose as one of the top first-year coaches in the nation, ranking Rose No. 3 overall among the nearly 40 first-year coaches in college basketball in 2005-06.

Rose, who served the prior eight seasons as Cleveland's lead assistant in Provo, was promoted to BYU's head job two days after Cleveland announced his resignation to take the head-coaching position at Fresno State. Rose served as BYU's associate head coach for five seasons and took over the Cougar program with 22 years of coaching experience, including 10 seasons as a head coach at the junior college and high school levels.

Since coming to Provo in 1997 with Cleveland, Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in six of the past seven seasons, including three NCAA bids, while claiming two MWC titles. As associate head coach, Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, and his efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street &Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Rose was the team's defensive coordinator and worked with the post players. He possesses a complete knowledge of the game and worked hard in developing the team's defensive game plans. An outstanding teacher, he coached defensive skill development and implemented the defensive game plan. BYU was the top defensive team in the Mountain West Conference two of the four seasons Rose oversaw the defense.

A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the A suring evaluation of talent with a vasc network of coaching connections across the country, Rose managed BYU's recruiting efforts during his eight seasons as an assistant. Rose's success as a recruiter was evidenced by his being named one of the top 25 college basketball recruiters in 2004 by Rivals.com. Each year the Cougars have brought in talented newcomers to contribute to the BYU program. The 2004 class was rated No. 17 nationally and No. 3 in the West by Rivals.com. The 2000 recruiting class also ranked in the top 20 nationally.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, nine recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major conference award in their first season as a Cougar in the nine years Rose has been in Provo. Including Rafael Araujo being named the league's top newcomer by the MWC media members in 2003 (the MWC discontinued the newcomer award that year), six BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Trent Plaisted was named the 2006 MWC Freshman of the Year. The following is the list of player honors earned the last nine seasons by Cougar recruits in their first seasons in Provo.

Rose has also worked closely with scheduling. BYU has played many of the nation's top teams over the past several years thanks in part to relationships Rose has developed with programs across the country. His efforts have helped the Cougars receive invitations to tournaments like the 2004 EA SPORTS Maui Invitational where BYU faced that season's NCAA Champion North Carolina.

Prior to coming to BYU, Rose was head coach at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, where he compiled a 167-57 record in seven seasons. Rose guided six of his seven teams to national top-20 rankings, including a ranking as high as No. 2, while earning three conference titles. His peers honored him as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as longtime NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU he has recruited and coached two NBA Draft picks in Rafael Araujo and Travis Hansen.

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86.

Rose becomes the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first eason in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie College before transferring to Houston, where he was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished second in the NCAA Tournament. At Houston, Rose played in 1980-81, redshirted in 1981-82 and played his final year in 1982-83.

At Dixie, Rose was first-team all-league in both basketball and baseball. Rose was also the Region 18 batting champion, hitting .421 as a center fielder. While playing basketball for Houston's Northbrook High School, he led the District 16AAAA in scoring, was selected first-team all-district and All-Greater Houston and was named team MVP.

PERSONAL

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and one granddaughter. Daughter Chanell played forward on the BYU women's basketball team from 2000-03 and is married to Brock Reichner, last year's lone senior on the BYU team. Rose's wife Cheryl is actively involved in helping families who have children with cancer as vice chairperson of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation. Rose follows Cleveland as the second returned missionary to serve as BYU men's basketball head coach. Rose served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie College. His son Garrett returned in August 2005 from a two-year mission in Little Rock, Ark., and married his wife Brooke in November 2006. Rose also has a daughter, Taylor, who is a sixth grader at Wasatch Elementary.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Dave Rose was one of the first coaches in Utah to become involved with Coaches vs. Cancer while at Dixie State College. He helps the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation and has been a volunteer coach for youth groups. He served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. Dave and his wife Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community. She received the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005. After Dave got her involved, she now serves as the Vice Chairperson for the Children with Cancer Christmas

DAVE RICE

2nd year (UNLV 1991)

Dave Rice joined the BYU coaching staff in May 2005. Rice has 15 years of coaching experience, including 13 seasons at the Division I level at BYU, UNLV and Utah State. As a player, Rice was a member of UNLV's 1989-90 National Championship and



1990-91 Final Four teams that won a school-record 45 consecutive games.

In his first season at BYU, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

Rice came to BYU from Utah State University where he helped Coach Stew Morrill and the Aggies earn a 24-8 record, Big West Conference Tournament title and an NCAA Tournament bid in 2004-05. In his one season at Utah State, Rice's coaching duties included working with the offense and coaching the guards. In 2004-05, the Aggies led the nation in field-goal percentage (school-record .525) and ranked fourth nationally in scoring margin [+14.6], 10th in assists [17.2] and 20th in three-point field goal percentage (.391).

Rice spent 11 seasons as an assistant coach at UNLV, which is the second-longest tenure ever for an assistant in that program. During his time at UNLV as both a player and a coach, the Rebels had 12 players go on to play in the National Basketball Association, eight of whom were drafted in the first round, including six lottery picks. While in Las Vegas, Rice worked under four head coaches in Jerry Tarkanian, Tim Grgurich, Bill Bayno and Charlie Spoonhour. In his last eight seasons at UNLV, the Runnin' Rebels received seven postseason invitations and averaged 20 wins per year.

In addition to his Division I experience, Rice served as an assistant coach for one season at Chaffey [Calif.] College in 1994, helping the Panthers to a 32-6 record and an appearance in the California State Final Four. He also spent one season at Claremont (Calif.) High School, where he was an assistant coach under his father Lowell, a long-time high school coach. That team went 21-7, winning the Baseline League Championship and reaching the CIF quarterfinals. Rice earned his bachelor's degree in political science from UNLV in 1991 and his MBA in 1993. He was also a two-time UNLV Scholar-Athlete of the Year and a Rhodes Scholar candidate.

Prior to playing at UNLV, Rice began his college career at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, Calif., where he earned All-South Coast Conference honors as a sophonore and was chosen from among more than 13,000 student-athletes as the 1989 California Junior College Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He graduated from Claremont High School. A native of Claremont, Calif., Rice and his wife Mindy have two sons, Travis (9) and Dylan (4).

JOHN WARDENBURG

6th year (BYU 1986)

John Wardenburg joined the BYU coaching staff as an assistant coach in May 2001 and served four seasons under former BYU coach Steve Cleveland before being retained on the staff by current BYU head coach Dave Rose.



In 2005, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

Wardenburg has 19 years of coaching experience. He came to BYU with 15 years of coaching experience at the high school and junior college levels. His primary responsibilities have included defensive skill development, game film preparation, summer basketball camp director, recruiting and assisting Coach Rose with defensive game plan preparation.

Wardenburg compiled a 105-62 record in seven years as a head coach at Payson High School (1988-93) and Pine View High School (1999-01) while guiding his teams to five league titles and seven state tournament berths. In those seven years, his teams earned three fifth-place state tournament finishes, one third-place finished and a 3A Utah State Championship with his 2001 Pine View team

After Wardenburg's Payson teams claimed three league titles and posted a 76-43 overall record, he served as an assistant coach from 1993-97 at Dixie State College under current BYU head coach Dave Rose and helped the Rebels to a 95-31 record and a national ranking as high as No. 2. Wardenburg left coaching for two years to serve as Dixie's Director of Athletics. He returned to coaching as the head coach at Pine View High School in St. George where he recorded two highly successful seasons before joining BYU's staff in 2001.

Wardenburg's Pine View teams won the league title both seasons he was the coach while achieving a 29-19 record. Wardenburg earned 3A Coach of the Year honors in 2000 after coaching his team to a third-place state finish and was named Championship Coach of the Year in 2001 after guiding his team to the state title.

Born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Wardenburg was a multisport athlete at Kiel High School in Kiel, Wis. He served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to The Netherlands from 1977-79 and earned a BA in political science from BYU in 1986 and an MA in health, physical education and recreation from Utah State in 1992.

Wardenburg and his wife Pam have four sons, Scott, Jonathan, Adam and Barrett, and one granddaughter.

Walter Roese was hired in June 2005 as an assistant coach under Coach Dave Rose, becoming the first Brazilian full-time assistant coach in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball.



With his outstanding knowledge of the game

and large international recruiting network, Roese is a valuable addition to the BYU coaching staff.

In 2005, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

A 1994 Cum Laude graduate in International Business Administration from BYU-Hawai'i, Roese earned an MBA at BYU in 2003 before serving as BYU's director of basketball operations under former Cougar coach Steve Cleveland for two years.

Roese coached the Brazilian Junior National Team this past summer, helping his native country qualify for the 2007 World Cup. He also previously served as a volunteer assistant at BYU-Hawai'i under Ken Wagner after finishing his professional playing career.

A native of Novo Hamburgo in southern Brazil, Roese played seven years professionally in Brazil and Italy after graduating from BYU-Hawai'i. He still holds the Brazilian professional league record with 23 assists in a single game. He has represented the Brazilian National Team and professional clubs at four World Cup tournaments and several international championships in Europe, Asia and South and North America, winning state, national and South American championships. In 1986, he was Brazil's top-rated junior player. Roese has continued to excel as an athlete. In August of 2003, he hit a three-quarter-court shot at the buzzer to give Brazil a one-point victory in the semifinals of the Masters World Basketball Championships (ages 35-40) in Orlando, Fla., before leading Brazil to the title win over Russia.

Roese has experience at nearly every level of the college game. Roese attended the University of Houston, West Texas A&M and BYU-Hawai'i while playing at the Division I, Division II and NAIA levels. He was the MVP of the Lone Star Conference in 1992 while playing at West Texas A&M and was a Scholar Athlete All-American at BYU-Hawai'i. He served as a volunteer director of athletic marketing and assistant basketball coach at BYU-Hawai'i from 2000-01 before attending the Marriott School of Management at BYU to obtain his MBA degree.

Roese comes from an athletic family that has seen six members participate at the Olympic level in basketball, volleyball and tennis. Fluent in English, Spanish and Portuguese, Roese and his wife Monique are the parents of two children, Leonardo and Agatha.
