### BYU HOSTS HARTFORD TUESDAY AT 7:30 P.M.

BYU (3-0) plays in the second round of the Findlay Toyota Las Vegas Invitational when it hosts Hartford (1-3) on Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. BYU enters the game with the nation's second-longest active home victory streak at 33 games. The game will be televised nationally live on BYUTV and will also be broadcast live in Utah on KBYU, channel 11. The radio broadcast can be heard beginning with the pregame show at 6:30 p.m. MT on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com.

### UP NEXT

BYU travels to Las Vegas for a third-round matchup of the Findlay Toyota Las Vegas Invitational against No. 6 Louisville. The game is a 6 p.m. PT start Friday at Orleans Arena.

### COUGAR QUICK HITS

- Two-time reigning MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose helped make BYU the second-most improved program in the nation in his first season with a 20-9 record and guided the Cougars to the outright MWC title and a top-25 ranking in his second campaign in Provo as the Cougars went 25-9 last season.
- BYU has been picked in the preseason poll to finish first in the MWC race this year by the league's media.
- BYU currently owns the nation's second-longest active home win streak with 33 straight wins in the Marriott Center. The Cougars went 17-0 at home last year and are 2-0 at home this year.
- This year's BYU squad returns two starters among seven lettermen from last year's outright league leaders (13-3 MWC record) as well as returned missionary Chris Miles, who made six starts as a freshman in 2004-05. Headlining BYU's top returners in 2007-08 are MWC Player of the Year candidate Trent Plaisted, a two-time All-MWC Second Team selection in his first two seasons; versatile junior guard Lee Cummard, who earned All-MWC Third Team honors one year ago; and sophomore sharpshooter Jonathan Tavernari, who followed Plaisted's lead the prior season by being named the MWC Freshman of the Year in his first campaign as a Cougar.

**LOOKING AT HARTFORD**

The Hartford Hawks are 1-3 so far this season with a win over Sacred Heart and losses at St. Francis, Quinnipiac (2OT) and Louisville. The 104-69 defeat at the hands of the Cardinals was the Hawks' first game of the 2007 Findlay Toyota Las Vegas Invitational. Hartford returns three starters among nine letterwinners from last year's team that finished the season 13-18 under first-year head coach Dan Leibovitz. Sophomore guard Joe Zeglinski, the team's leading returning scorer with 12.7 points per game last season, has picked up where he left off with a team-best 14.5 scoring average through four games this year. Zeglinski also adds 3.5 assists per game to lead the Hawks while posting 4.8 rebounds per contest. Junior transfer Warren McLendon is second on the team averaging 14.0 ppg and is one of four Hawks posting at least 5.0 rebounds per game. The 6-foot-6 forward is also tallying 1.8 blocks per game. Junior guard/forward Michael Turner paces Hartford with 5.8 rpg while contributing across the board with 7.0 ppg, 2.8 apg and 2.3 spg. Turner is also shooting 46.7 percent from the field and has made three of six shots from three-point range. Senior guard Rich Baker (5.3 rpg) and junior guard Jaret Con Rosenberg (5.0 rpg) round out the Hawk quartet with at least 5.0 boards per contest. As a team, Hartford is averaging 69.2 ppg on .424 shooting from the field, including a .372 mark from three-point range. The Hawks are allowing opponents to score 76.5 ppg on .416 shooting from the floor with a .430 efficiency from long range. Hawk opponents outrebound Hartford 44.8-35.8.

**HARTFORD'S LAST OUTING — Hartford Shot Down at No. 6 Louisville**

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (Nov. 17, 2007) – Sixth-ranked Louisville University made a school record 22 three-pointers and handed the University of Hartford men's basketball team a 104-69 loss on Saturday afternoon at Freedom Hall. Louisville (1-0 overall) shot 63 percent from long distance in the game and had seven players finish in double figures in scoring. Andre McGee finished with a game-high 18 points while Terrence Williams recorded the third triple-double in school history with 14 points, 12 rebounds and a career-high 13 assists. Hartford (1-3 overall) shot 40 percent from the floor but just 31 percent from three-point range. Sophomore Joe Zeglinski led the Hawks with 13 points and a career-high 10 rebounds to post his first career double-double. Freshman Morgan Sabia also recorded his first double-digit scoring game with 11 points while junior Warren McLendon finished with 10 points. Louisville attacked the Hartford zone right away by bombing away from the outside. The Cardinals connected on nine three-pointers in the first half and shot 60 percent from downtown in the stanza. McGee made five of his six attempts from long range to lead the assault. The Cardinals used a 20-4 run over a five minute stretch to open up a 21-point lead at 38-17 with 5:47 to play in the first half. The Hawks then scored 10 of the next 12 points to claw their way back into the contest, with senior Brian Glowiak and freshman Andres Torres sinking three-pointers in the run. Hartford trimmed the deficit to 12 on a pair of Glowiak free throws, but McGee answered with a trey on the ensuing play to give Louisville a 46-31 lead. The Cardinals took the 15-point advantage into the locker room at the half. Louisville stepped up its outside shooting in the second half, connecting on 13 three-pointers at a 65-percent clip. Edgar Sosa (15 points) and Jerry Smith (14 points) combined for six three-pointers and 21 points over the final 20 minutes to lead the Cardinals.

**BYU'S LAST OUTING - COUGARS OPEN LAS VEGAS INVITATIONAL WITH HOME WIN OVER JACKSON STATE**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 16, 2007) – In the first round of the Las Vegas Invitational, junior Trent Plaisted and the BYU Cougars won easily over the Jackson State Tigers, 100-61, as Plaisted contributed a game-high 21 points. The Cougars improved to 3-0 in this young season, and the Tigers fell to 0-3. Plaisted was not alone in BYU's offensive effort as a total of five Cougars scored in double digits. Two of those five came off the bench as Michael Loyd Jr. finished with 15, and Vuk Ivanovic tied his career high with 10. The game did not start the way the Cougars wanted, though, as Jackson State scored the first eight points. That 8-0 start by the Tigers was not only the first time all year that BYU has trailed its opponent, but it is also the largest run that the Cougars have allowed this season. At the 17:49 mark, Cougar Lee Cummard helped BYU break onto the scoreboard for the first time as he made a three-pointer. Cummard went on to finish the game with 14 points, four rebounds, four steals and three assists. Both teams started the game applying pressure defensively, leading to multiple fast break opportunities. The Cougars had eight fast break points in the first period while the Tigers converted four fast break points of their own. The first half also saw major contributions by three BYU freshmen. Chris Collinsworth played 11 minutes, and both Loyd and Jimmer Fredette saw six minutes of action. In the last minutes of the half, BYU slowly opened a 12-point lead, with the halftime score at 41-29. The Cougars shot 55 percent from the field and went 7-for-9 from the free-throw line in the first stanza. The second half saw a much different start than the first half did as BYU went on a 23-4 run in the first six minutes of the half. The Cougars never looked back as they cruised to win by 39 points. BYU senior guard Ben Murdock recorded a new personal best with eight total assists in the game. Collinsworth also had a notable performance with a game-high and career-high 10 rebounds in the Cougars' winning effort. Freshman guard Chris Hyché led Jackson State with 14 points. The Cougars' defense held the Tigers to 33 percent shooting on the game.

**WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...****BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

– “For the most part, we did a good job competing on every play. Jackson State came out strong, and their quickness and ability to make plays surprised us. But we did a good job limiting their defensive boards.”  
– “Trent [Plaisted] came in and controlled the lower post both offensively and defensively. It allowed us to start our break, and it helped our energy and confidence.”  
– “Jackson State came out and was really good. They made a lot of plays and had a lot of energy, and it seemed they wore out as the night went on.”

**Jackson State Head Coach Tevester Anderson**

– “We were defeated tonight by a very fine team in BYU. They run the ball as well as anyone I've seen. They shoot well and rebound well too.”  
– “We executed well and made shots early on. I was proud of the way our guys played the first 15 minutes of the game. I think we got fatigued, and the elevation is always an issue for teams from the South.”  
– “Now we've got to go to Louisville on Sunday and play another team in the top five. They have a different style and do a lot of things well, but I'll think we'll have a little more gas in Kentucky.”

**BYU NOTES FROM LAST OUTING**

– BYU head coach Dave Rose has used the same starting lineup in BYU's first three games, calling on Ben Murdock, Sam Burgess, Lee Cummard, Jonathan Tavernari and Trent Plaisted to begin the game.  
– Individual Career Highs: Ben Murdock – 8 assists; Vuk Ivanovic – 10 points (tied); Chris Collinsworth – 10 rebounds; Michael Loyd Jr. – 4 rebounds  
– Loyd's 15 points were his first as a BYU Cougar.  
– The 100-61 Cougar victory extended BYU's home win streak to 33 games dating back to Nov. 18, 2005. The streak is the second-longest active home win streak in the nation.  
– Friday marks the first time BYU has reached the 100-point mark since Dec. 22, 2006 against Western Oregon, and the first time against a Division I opponent since Feb. 22, 2006 against SDSU.  
– With a 39-point win against Jackson State, BYU has posted a +33.3 average margin of victory in its first three games this season.  
– BYU is now 3-0 when scoring at least 70 points this season and 3-0 when holding opponents under the 70-point mark while averaging 88 points per game and allowing just 54.7 ppg.  
– In the win against Jackson State, five Cougars scored in double figures, marking the second time this has happened in as many games.  
– BYU trailed for the first time all season at the 19:24 mark in the first half after a field goal by Jackson State's Grant Maxey.  
– Jackson State went on an 8-0 run to begin the game, the longest run against the Cougars so far this season. Lee Cummard's three-pointer ended the run with 17:55 to play in the first half.  
– Plaisted's 21 points against Jackson State topped the 20-point mark for the first time this season. He has reached the mark 10 times in his career, including 6 times in the 2006-2007 season.  
– Plaisted was the first Cougar in double figures as he scored his 10th point of the game from the charity stripe with 3:57 left to play in the first half. Plaisted was the high scorer at the half on 5-for-7 shooting from the field, including a 3-for-4 mark from the free throw line. Tavernari joined him in double figures with a field goal to open the second half of play.  
– Plaisted gave the Cougars their first lead at 28-26 at the 7:09 mark just after subbing back in the game. His bucket was the beginning of an 11-2 Cougar run that gave BYU the momentum it would need to run away with the victory. During the key run, Plaisted scored eight of the 11 points and assisted the only other Cougar bucket, a three by Jonathan Tavernari.  
– With a 12-point advantage at the break against Jackson State (41-29), BYU has led by double digits at the half in all three of its games this season going 3-0. The Cougars held a double-digit lead at halftime in 14 games last year, going 13-1 in those games while going 22-4 in games BYU led at the half by any margin.  
– Between 10:06 and 8:29 in the second half, BYU's lineup consisted of four true-freshman (Fredette, Loyd, Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau) and one sophomore (Chris Miles). BYU went on a 9-2 run during this time.

**BYU PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

**TRENT PLAISTED (NOV. 19)** — Junior Trent Plaisted led BYU to two wins last week as the team's top scorer and rebounder. He averaged 19.0 points and 7.5 rebounds while adding 1.5 assists in home wins over Idaho State and Jackson State. Plaisted made 65 percent of his shots on 13-of-20 shooting from the floor and converted 85.7 percent of his free-throw attempts, going 12-for-14 at the line. Plaisted put up a game-high 21 points against Jackson State Friday night on 8-for-11 shooting from the floor and 5-of-6 accuracy at the free-throw line. He provided the firepower for BYU to overtake Jackson State's early lead in the game. The Cougars trailed from the opening tip by as many as eight points until Plaisted gave the Cougars their first lead at 28-26 just after subbing back in at the 7:46 mark. His bucket was the beginning of an 11-2 Cougar run that gave BYU the momentum it would need to run away with the victory. During the key run, Plaisted scored eight of the 11 points and assisted the only other Cougar bucket, a three by Jonathan Tavernari. Plaisted added seven rebounds, two assists, one block and one steal in his 19 minutes on the floor against the Tigers. Against Idaho State on Wednesday, Plaisted totaled 17 points and eight rebounds with one assist while going 5-for-9 from the floor and 7-of-8 at the line. Plaisted's 21 points against Jackson State marked the 10th time in his career he has topped 20 points in a game.

**LEE CUMNARD (NOV. 12)** — Junior guard Lee Cumnard led BYU to a runaway 74-34 win over reigning Big West Champion Long Beach State at the Walter Pyramid in Long Beach, Calif. Cumnard helped BYU take quick control of the game by hitting his first three shots and assisting another Cougar bucket during the team's first seven possessions. BYU scored the first 10 points of the game and never looked back. Cumnard scored four of the Cougars' first five points and six of their first 12. He finished with a game-high 15 points and nearly achieved a double-double by adding nine boards to share team-high honors with sophomore Jonathan Tavernari. He also contributed two assists and a steal while shooting 6-of-12 from the floor and 2-for-3 at the free-throw line.

**WORTHY OF MENTION**

- Plaisted's 21 points against Jackson State marked the 10th time in his career he has topped 20 points in a game.
- Lee Cumnard became the first Cougar to record a double-double this season with 13 points and 10 rebounds against Idaho State, the fourth double-double of his career.
- Senior point guard Ben Murdock has 18 assists and only two turnovers in his first three starting assignments at the Division I level, easily leading all MWC players in assist/turnover ratio (9.00) while ranking second in assists per game (6.0). Last week he dished out 13 assists in two games with only one turnover, including a career-high eight assists Friday night against Jackson State.
- BYU is averaging 88 points per game and allowing just 54.7 ppg. BYU leads all MWC teams in scoring, scoring margin (+33.3), assists (22.7), assist/turnover ratio (1.55), defensive rebounds (33.0) and field goal percentage defense (.311).
- BYU has led by double digits at the half in all three of its games this season. The Cougars held a double-digit lead at halftime in 14 games last year, going 13-1 in those games while going 22-4 in games BYU led at the half by any margin.

**SIGNING DAY**

Forward Noah Hartssock and guard/forward Charles Abouo (pronounced a-BOO-oh) have signed National Letters of Intent while guard Jackson Emery has signed a scholarship agreement to return to the Cougars. Hartssock, who previously signed with BYU out of high school, and Emery, who played for the Cougars as a freshman in 2005-06, are both currently serving as missionaries for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

"I feel really good about this group of players," Rose said. "Jackson was an important part of our success as a freshman and got a lot of good experience that he will build upon when he returns. Noah and Charles are both talented student-athletes who will add a lot to our program."

A native of Bartlesville, Okla., the 6-foot-8 Hartssock had the third-best scoring average in the state with 27.6 points per game as a senior at Bartlesville High School in 2005-06 while earning GA Coaches Player of the Year and Tulsa World Player of the Year honors. Oklahoma's Jim Thorpe Award winner and a McDonald's High School All-America nominee, Hartssock added 8.0 rebounds and 3.7 blocks per contest as a senior.

An extremely athletic wing from Logan, Utah, Abouo is averaging double figures, including a team-high 17 points in his last outing, for Brewster Academy (Wolfeboro, N.H.) this year after helping Logan High School win Region 11 titles in each of his three varsity seasons. The 6-foot-4 swingman was named the 3A MVP by the Deseret Morning News last spring after averaging 21.1 points, 10.2 rebounds and 3.2 steals per game as a senior at Logan High School.

**MEN'S BASKETBALL HONORED FOR HIGH ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT**

The NCAA honored the BYU men's basketball team with a public recognition award for the Cougars' Academic Progress Rate scores. BYU posted multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all men's basketball teams in the country. "The athletes have really worked hard at striving to be good students," said E.J. Caffaro, Student Athlete Academic Center director and men's basketball academic coach. "We've worked hard to put together a strong academic program. Their high score is a result of their hard work and the success of that program." Out of the 336 Division I men's basketball programs in the country, BYU is one of 35 to be honored by the NCAA and the only basketball team from Mountain West Conference to receive the recognition. The Cougars are also one of only 10 teams to earn high academic achievement and also qualify for the past year's NCAA Tournament. Other NCAA Tournament teams who also received public recognition awards were Belmont (NCAA No. 15 seed), Holy Cross (No. 13 seed), Davidson (No. 13 seed), Illinois (No. 12 seed), North Carolina (No. 1 seed), Notre Dame (No. 6 seed), Pennsylvania (No. 14 seed), Villanova (No. 9 seed) and Xavier (No. 9 seed).

**BURGESS, CUMNARD, PLAISTED NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS**

BYU men's basketball head coach Dave Rose has announced that senior Sam Burgess and juniors Trent Plaisted and Lee Cumnard have been selected to serve as captains on this year's team. "Each of our captains have qualities we really want in all of our players," Rose said. "Sam is a hard worker and tough competitor who leads by example. Trent and Lee have proven their leadership ability both on and off the court over the past two years." Both Cumnard and Plaisted are two year starters who received all-conference accolades last season after helping the Cougars win their first outright league title since 1988 and achieve their first national ranking since 1993. A two-time All-MWC Second Team selection and Freshman All-American, Plaisted was second on the team last year in both scoring (12.6 ppg) and rebounding (6.2 rpg). The junior forward/center from San Antonio scored in double figures 21 times while posting three double-doubles on the year in 33 starts. Cumnard was named to the All-MWC Third Team last season after starting every game for the Cougars. He averaged 9.4 points, third on the team, on a team-best .553 shooting mark from the field. The junior guard from Mesa, Ariz., also led the team in steals and minutes, was second in assists and blocks and was third in rebounds with 5.6 per contest. He ranked among the top 15 in the conference in seven statistical categories. After redshirting the 2005-06 season, Burgess provided a spark off the bench for the Cougars last year, playing in 31 of 34 games and averaging 3.6 points and 1.5 rebounds in 10.2 minutes of action. The senior guard from Alpine, Utah, came on especially strong during BYU's run to the conference championship, playing double-digit minutes in eight of the Cougars' last 12 outings. The best-conditioned perimeter player on the team the past two seasons, Burgess averaged 15.0 points and 5.2 assists per game while shooting .615 from the floor during BYU's successful tour of France over the summer.

**IVANOVIC TABBED FOR SERBIAN NATIONAL TEAM**

BYU senior Vuk Ivanovic was selected to play on the Serbian National Team for the European Championship. The 6-foot-10 forward/center was one of 32 players on the Serbian roster, including NBA veterans Marko Jaric (Minnesota Timberwolves), Darko Milicic (Memphis Grizzlies) and Sasha Pavlovic (Cleveland Cavaliers). "Vuk answered my call while he was in the lab and couldn't believe that I was calling him to play for the national team," said newly appointed Serbian coach Zoran Slavnic in an interview reported by PA SportsTicker. "We need that kind of patriot, those who love their country, who are ready to play for it and who are great players." Serbia played in Group A of the EuroBasket, which began on Sept. 3, along with defending-champion Greece and Russia. Due to his commitment to the National Team, Ivanovic did not participate in BYU's foreign tour to France Aug. 15-25.

**DEFENDING THE HOME COURT**

With 33 straight wins in the Marriott Center, the Cougars currently own the nation's second-longest active home victory streak. The Cougars won their home opener this season, 90-69 over Idaho State and defeated Jackson State, 100-61. BYU won 17 home games last season after going 14-1 at home in 2005-06. BYU's last home loss was in the 2005-06 season opener against Loyola Marymount. BYU has since won 17 straight over nonconference opponents and 16 consecutive over MWC foes since losing its season finale in 2005 to UNLV. BYU is 405-116 (.777) all-time in the Marriott Center. The Cougars' longest home winning streak came from Feb 19, 2000 to Jan 16, 2003 when BYU won 44 straight in the Marriott Center.

**ON THE ROAD**

The Cougars picked up their first road win of the year in their season opener at Long Beach State, continuing their success away from the Marriott Center. BYU won five of its last seven games on the road last season including wins at then-No. 20 Air Force (62-58), at TCU (85-72), at New Mexico (70-49), at Utah (76-66) and at Wyoming (77-73) and losses at San Diego State (86-74) and at then-No. 25 UNLV (78-70) in the MWC Tournament Championship game. The Cougars' win in the Huntsman Center was their first since 1994, and their win at Air Force snapped the Falcons' 30-game home winning streak. BYU was 6-7 on the road last year and 5-3 in conference play with a season-opening loss at then-No. 5 UCLA, a Nov. 29 setback at Boise State, an overtime win at Weber State, an overtime defeat at Lamar and league losses at UNLV and at CSU. BYU was the only Mountain West Conference team with a winning record on the road in league play last year. The Cougars were 2-2 in neutral court games last season with a loss against then-No. 25 Michigan State at The Palace of Auburn Hills in Auburn Hills, Mich. and against Xavier in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Lexington, Ky., and wins against TCU and Wyoming in the MWC Tournament.

**FROM DOWNTOWN**

The Cougars made 12 three-pointers against Idaho State while shooting 48.0 percent (12-for-25) from beyond the arc, marking just the 14th time in program history a BYU team has made at least 12 three-pointers in a game. With 256 three-pointers made last season, BYU set a new program record in that category, surpassing the mark of 214 set in 1992. The Cougars also set a school record with 15 three-pointers against UNLV on .682 (15-for-22) shooting from long range, the third time the Cougars shot above .600 from downtown last season. BYU shot above 40 percent from behind the arc 18 times on the year, including 12 of the last 15 games, and made at least 10 treys in a game on seven occasions. The Cougars ranked fifth nationally and led the MWC in three-point shooting (.415). BYU also paced the conference in three-point percentage (.457) in MWC play while Cougar players finished first (Austin Ainge - .525) and second (Mike Rose - .471) in the league in three-point shooting percentage in MWC action. Rose tied the BYU individual record he set in 2003 with eight triples against UNLV.

**MAGIC NUMBER: 70**

BYU is now 3-0 when scoring at least 70 points this season and 3-0 when holding opponents under the 70-point mark while averaging 88.0 points per game and allowing just 54.7 ppg. Last year the Cougars scored an MWC-leading 78.1 points and allowed 69.0 points. BYU was 20-0 when opponents scored less than 70 points and 5-9 when they scored 70 or more. BYU was 23-6 when it scored 70 or more points and 2-3 when scoring less than 70 with both wins coming against nationally ranked Air Force. The Cougars were also 12-0 last season when scoring at least 80 points. With its scoring output, BYU recorded its highest scoring average since 1996 (82.3 ppg) and highest scoring margin since 1993 (also +9.1).

**CLEANING THE GLASS**

BYU has won the battle of the boards in each game this year. The Cougars are averaging 45.7 rebounds to their opponents' 35.0. The Cougars posted a +15 rebounding margin at Long Beach State with a 55-40 advantage on the boards, matching last year's season high of 55 boards against Seton Hall. BYU was 24-2 last season when outrebounding its opponents and 1-7 when losing the battle of the boards. The Cougars led the MWC in rebounding average (37.4) and rebounding margin (+6.2). BYU posted its largest margin of the season with a +22 mark against then-No. 13 Air Force (42-20) and against TCU in the MWC Tournament (46-24). Senior Keena Young was fourth at 6.6 rpg while sophomore Trent Plaisted was tied for sixth on the glass at 6.2 rpg. The Cougars recorded back-to-back season-high efforts of 52 rebounds vs. Oral Roberts and 55 against Seton Hall in the BYU Holiday Classic. BYU outrebounded the Pirates 55-34 as four Cougars had nine or more rebounds (Cummond 12, Young, Plaisted and Ainge 9).

**COUGAR RECORD AMONG THE TOP IN SCHOOL HISTORY**

BYU finished with a 25-9 record in 34 games last year, making it one of the best BYU teams in program history. Last year's Cougars tied for third all-time in BYU history for most overall wins. In the 105-year history of BYU men's basketball, only the 1950-51 NIT Championship team (28-9) and the 1987-88 WAC champion team (26-6) finished the year with more total wins. One other BYU team equaled the 2006-07 Cougars' 25-9 record. At 23-7 prior to postseason play, last year's BYU team was just the sixth Cougar squad to record its 23rd win prior to the end of the regular season. The Cougar record for wins in the regular season is 24 achieved three times. Last year's BYU team is also tied for sixth all-time in program history with a .735 overall winning percentage.

**HOT START**

With a 3-0 record to begin the 2007-08 season, the Cougars are off to their best start since 2002-03 when BYU won its first five games before falling on Dec. 7 at Creighton. The Cougars have won in dominant fashion this season, besting opponents by an average of 33.3 points per game while scoring 88.0 ppg and allowing only 54.7 points per contest. BYU is also outshooting opponents .505-.311.

**TRUE BLUE FANS**

The Cougars opened the home season with 12,153 fans on Wednesday against Idaho State. BYU is averaging 10,398 this year. BYU averaged 12,073 fans last season, including the largest crowd in MWC history with 22,812 fans against Utah and another sellout crowd of 22,700 fans against then-No. 13 Air Force, marking the first time since 1981-82 that BYU has had multiple sellouts in the same year. BYU has consistently ranked among the national attendance leaders. The Cougars were second in the MWC in attendance in 2006-07 behind New Mexico's 12,853 average. BYU outdrew the regular-season conference champions of 26 of the nation's 30 other conferences as well as over half of the teams in the Atlantic Coast, Big 12, Big East and Southeastern Conferences and all but Arizona in the Pacific-10 Conference. BYU also averaged more fans than 11 of the 16 NCAA Sweet Sixteen participants, including three of the Final Four teams.

**FANTASTIC FRESHMEN**

Four Cougar freshman made their collegiate debuts at Long Beach State with results that bode well for the future. Freshmen Jimmer Fredette and Chris Collinsworth led the newcomers in scoring with nine points each. Fredette went 3-for-6 from three-point range while adding three assists. Collinsworth shot 3-for-4 from the field and 3-for-3 from the free-throw line to go along with six rebounds, including three on the offensive glass. Collinsworth immediately made his presence felt after checking in at the 15:31 mark in the first half with two rebounds, including an offensive board leading to a bucket for Trent Plaisted. Fredette also made noise in the first half with two three-point makes during a 14-0 Cougar run. Michael Loyd, Jr. had three rebounds in 11 minutes while Nick Martineau made his only shot from the field while adding two rebounds in 11 minutes. Fredette tallied 10 points vs. Idaho State, and Loyd scored 15 points against Jackson State while Collinsworth pulled down 10 boards against the Tigers.

**FOR STARTERS**

Cougar head coach Dave Rose has used the same starting lineup in each of BYU's first three games, electing to use two seniors in Ben Murdock and Sam Burgess, returning All-Mountain West Conference selections Trent Plaisted and Lee Cumnard, both juniors, and 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year Jonathan Tavernari to begin the game. Cumnard started all 34 games last season, and Plaisted made 33 starts. Burgess made one start as a sophomore in 2004-05 while Murdock and Tavernari each earned their first career starts against Long Beach State. Rose used the same starting rotation in both of the Cougars' two exhibition games.

**WINNING BIG**

The Cougars have won their first three games by an average margin of 33.3 points, including a 39-point win over Jackson State (100-61), a 21-point victory (90-69) over Idaho State and a 40-point win (74-34) at Long Beach State. The win over the 49ers marked BYU's largest margin of victory over a Division I opponent since defeating Morgan State by 41 points (110-69) on Dec. 28, 1995. BYU held LBSU to just 19.1 percent shooting from the field while besting the 49ers in the rebound column, 55-40. The Cougars held a 36-12 lead at the half after allowing LBSU to make just three shots from the field in the first 20 minutes of the game and stretched the advantage to 40 in the second half, ending the game on a 14-0 run. BYU won 17 games by double-digits last year, including seven by 20 or more points, and was the only team in the Mountain West Conference to not have a regular-season game decided by less than four points. With an average scoring margin of +9.1 last season, the Cougars posted their largest margin of victory since 1993 over the course of the year.

**VICTORY STREAK**

With a 3-0 start to this season, BYU picked up right where it left off last season when the Cougars won 12 of their last 15 games overall with victories over New Mexico (twice), Air Force (twice), Utah (twice), UNLV, Wyoming (twice), TCU (twice) and Colorado State and losses at SDSU, at then-No. 25 UNLV and vs. Xavier. The Cougars had won eight straight prior to the SDSU loss, marking their longest victory streak since winning nine straight during the 2003-04 season and ranking tied for 10th nationally. The Cougars also won seven straight last year over Utah State, Western Oregon, Liberty, Oral Roberts, Seton Hall, San Diego State and TCU.

**HALFTIME REPORT**

The Cougars are now 3-0 this season when leading at the half with all three advantages coming by double digits. BYU put together strong defensive starts in its first two games, holding Idaho State and Long Beach State under 30 points, under 30 percent shooting from the field and under 10 field goals made in the first 20 minutes. The Cougars' 36-12 lead at the break in Long Beach marked their largest halftime advantage since being up by 28 points (51-23) against Western Oregon on Dec. 22, 2006. The 12 points given up by BYU in the first 20 minutes of the game at LBSU marked the fewest points allowed in a half by the Cougars since allowing a record-low 10 points against Air Force in 2003. The Cougars had a strong second half against Jackson State, posting 59 points on 55.6 percent shooting while outscoring the Tigers by 27 points. BYU led at the half in 26 of the team's 34 games last year, including a double-digit lead 14 times. The Cougars outscored their opponents by an average of 5.9 points in the first period of play. BYU's win over Seton Hall marked the first time the Cougars won this year after trailing at the break. The second breakthrough after trailing at the break came at Wyoming. The Cougars also won at AFA after trailing at the half. BYU's 82-69 loss at UCLA after leading 39-36 at the half marked the first time since the 2004-05 season that BYU lost when leading at the half. BYU also lost at CSU, at UNLV and vs. Xavier after leading at the break. The Cougars were 22-4 when leading at the half, 3-4 when trailing and 0-1 when tied last season.

**PRESEASON MWC POLL**

The Mountain West Conference released its men's basketball preseason media poll and all-conference team at the league's media day held at the The Mtn. studios in Littleton, Colo. Conference media selected defending regular-season champion BYU to repeat as the MWC men's basketball champion. The Cougars' Trent Plaisted was named to the five-member preseason team and BYU newcomer Jimmer Fredette was tabbed the top freshman. "Obviously, these picks are a compliment to our team as well as to Trent and Jimmer," BYU coach Dave Rose said. "I think this is a tribute to how hard our guys have worked and speaks to the credibility of our program." BYU returns seven lettermen and two starters from last year's 25-9 team that finished the year ranked No. 24 in the final Associated Press Poll. BYU captured 15 of 22 first-place votes and 181 points for the top spot in the preseason media poll. Five MWC teams earned at least one first-place vote. 2007 MWC Tournament champion UNLV (146 points) and Utah (142 points) each earned two first-place votes to finish second and third, respectively, while New Mexico garnered two first-place votes and 128 points to tie for fourth with San Diego State, who received one first-place vote and 128 points. Wyoming collected 120 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU in seventh with 58 points. Air Force was chosen eighth with 54 points, while Colorado State rounded out the poll in ninth place with 33 points. BYU and UNLV earned NCAA Tournament berths last season, while Air Force and San Diego State were NIT participants. The Cougars captured the regular-season Mountain West title with a 13-3 mark and received an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament following a runner-up finish in the MWC Tournament. UNLV posted a second-place finish in regular-season play (12-4) and became the second Mountain West team in three years to advance to the Sweet 16, earning the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament after capturing the MWC Tournament crown on their home floor with a win over the Cougars. Overall, the MWC has had 18 NCAA Tournament appearances the past eight years. Since 2003, all nine MWC teams have participated in postseason play at least once. Five institutions were represented on the preseason all-MWC team. Wyoming's Brandon Ewing was named the Top Returning Player, while San Diego State's Ryan Amoroso garnered Top Newcomer accolades and Fredette received Top Freshman kudos. One senior and four juniors make up this year's preseason all-MWC team.

**IN THE FIRST EIGHT YEARS OF THE MWC ...**

- BYU has had six 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had five, UNLV four, Air Force, Wyoming and San Diego State three and New Mexico two.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second twice and third on three occasions. The Cougars were second last year (18) behind UNLV (10).
- BYU has played the toughest schedule on average of any team in the MWC. Last year, BYU's schedule was rated third behind Utah and UNLV. BYU had the league's toughest schedule in two of the previous three seasons.
- BYU has the second-most overall wins (162, Utah leads at 166).
- BYU is also second in conference wins (73, Utah has 75).
- BYU has the second-most MWC regular-season titles (three). Utah leads with four.
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

**INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU**

- Including junior transfer Archie Rose, 27 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 36 of the past 56 years.
- In the last six years, BYU has rostered seven international players, including three on this season's team - Vuk Ivanovic (Serbia), Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Archie Rose (Bahamas).
- Foreign players at BYU have received eight all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

**SUMMER FOREIGN TOUR A SUCCESS**

The BYU men's basketball team completed a five-game, 11-day foreign tour of France and Monaco in August with a perfect 5-0 record. The Cougars impressed the opposition by scoring 89.2 points per game for a 23.4 average margin of victory. "It was a great trip," BYU coach Dave Rose said. "From a coach's perspective it went just as we wanted. Everyone got to play, and we really played well and shot the ball well." Sophomore forward Jonathan Tavernari paced the team in the scoring column, pouring in 21.4 points per game. Junior forward/center Trent Plaisted followed in point production after his injury-shortened final outing dropped his scoring average of 20.6 over the first three games to 17.5 points for the trip. Tavernari shot 47.8 percent on the trip, including .439 accuracy on threes while making a team-high 15 triples. He added 5.4 rebounds and 3.0 assists. Plaisted converted a blazing 65.1 percent of his field-goal attempts and pulled down a team-best 10.3 rebounds per game. Junior guard Lee Cummond recorded three double-double outings and nearly posted a triple-double while averaging 14.4 points and 9.8 rebounds. Cummond added 4.6 assists per contest while shooting 60.9 from the floor. He had highs of 19 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists. Senior guard Sam Burgess scored in double figures in every contest, including 22 points on 10-of-12 shooting to lead the team in its last game, which BYU played without Plaisted while he nursed an ankle sprain. Burgess averaged 15 points, 3.6 rebounds and a team-leading 5.2 assists while shooting .615 from the field and .421 from long range. Senior Ben Murdock ran the point while averaging 9.4 points, 4.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists and made a team-best .474 from behind the three-point arc. Junior forward/center Gavin MacGregor had a strong showing with averages of 10 points, 8.2 rebounds and a team-high .710 shooting percentage. Recently returned missionary Chris Miles, a sophomore forward/center, added 4.2 ppg and 4.2 rpg while senior point guard Chase Ulicny pitched in 0.8 ppg, 1.6 rpg and 1.2 apg. BYU started the trip by defeating the Paris All-Stars, 90-68, on Aug. 17 before earning an 89-59 victory over Lyon BBC on Aug. 20. The next night the Cougars played again in Lyon, defeating Saint Etienne, a Pro B level squad, by a score of 92-73. BYU downed Golfe-Juan in Cannes, 89-68, on Aug. 23 before finishing with an 86-61 victory over AS Monaco on Aug. 24. The team also had the chance to do some sightseeing in France and Monaco. The Cougars spent time in Paris visiting the Eiffel Tower and other sites such as the Louvre Museum and Notre Dame Cathedral. They enjoyed the opportunity to attend Church in Paris. The Cougars also visited Cannes and Monaco before returning home. "The trip was great," Tavernari said. "We got a lot closer as a team, and we got to see some sites. But most important was that we got to practice and play games and get an early start on the season as we get ready to defend our Mountain West Conference title."

A tireless worker, gifted motivator and strong strategist, Dave Rose has guided BYU to consecutive 20-win seasons and the program's first national ranking since 1993 after succeeding Steve Cleveland as BYU Men's Basketball Head Coach on April 11, 2005.

Rose coached last year's team to a 25-9 overall record and the MWC regular-season title (13-3) while earning his second consecutive MWC Coach of the Year award. He was district and conference coach of the year in his first season at the Cougar helm in 2005-06. Taking over a 9-21 team, Rose's Cougar squad was picked to finish last in his first season in the Mountain West Conference (preseason poll of MWC media members) but BYU instead earned a 20-9 record and NIT bid in 2005-

06 under Rose's tutelage, including a 12-4 conference mark to tie for second place. His team ranked second nationally for the most improvement over the year before.

Rose was named the USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year and received honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com. He was named MWC Coach of the Year by the league's media and coaches and by CollegeInsider.com. In a column on ESPN.com, Pat Forde listed Rose as one of the top first-year coaches in the nation, ranking Rose No. 3 among the nearly 40 first-year coaches in college basketball in 2005-06.

Rose, who served the prior eight seasons as Cleveland's lead assistant in Provo, was promoted to BYU's head job two days after Cleveland announced his resignation to take the head-coaching position at Fresno State. Rose served as BYU's associate head coach for five seasons and took over the Cougar program with 22 years of coaching experience, including 10 seasons as a head coach at the junior college and high school levels.

Since coming to Provo in 1997 with Cleveland, Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in seven of the past eight seasons, including four NCAA bids, while claiming three MWC titles. As associate head coach, Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, and his efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Rose was the team's defensive coordinator and worked with the post players. He possesses a complete knowledge of the game and worked hard in developing the team's defensive game plans. An outstanding teacher, he coached defensive skill development and implemented the defensive game plan. BYU was the top defensive team in the Mountain West Conference two of the four seasons Rose oversaw the defense.

A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose managed BYU's recruiting efforts during his eight seasons as an assistant. Rose's success as a recruiter was evidenced by his being named one of the top 25 college basketball recruiters in 2004 by Rivals.com. The 2004 class was rated No. 17 nationally and No. 3 in the West by Rivals.com. The 2000 recruiting class also ranked in the top 20 nationally. Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 10 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 10 years Rose has been in Provo. Including Rafael Araujo being named the league's top newcomer by the MWC media members in 2003 (the MWC discontinued the newcomer award that year), seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Jonathan Tavernari was named the 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year. Rose has also worked closely with scheduling. BYU has played many of the nation's top teams over the past several years thanks in part to relationships Rose has developed with programs across the country. His efforts have helped the Cougars receive invitations to tournaments like the 2004 EA SPORTS Maui Invitational where BYU faced that season's NCAA Champion North Carolina.

Prior to coming to BYU, Rose was head coach at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, where he compiled a 167-57 record in seven seasons. Rose guided six of his seven teams to national top-20 rankings, including a ranking as high as No. 2, while earning three conference titles. His peers honored him as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as longtime NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU he has recruited and coached two NBA Draft picks in Rafael Araujo and Travis Hansen.

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose becomes the 17th

person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

### PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie College before transferring to Houston, where he was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished second in the NCAA Tournament. At Houston, Rose played in 1980-81, redshirted in 1981-82 and played his final year in 1982-83.

At Dixie, Rose was first-team all-league in both basketball and baseball. Rose was also the Region 18 batting champion, hitting .421 as a center fielder. While playing basketball for Houston's Northbrook High School, he led the District 16AAAA in scoring, was selected first-team all-district and All-Greater Houston and was named team MVP.

### PERSONAL

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Daughter Chanell played forward on the BYU women's basketball team from 2000-03 and is married to Brock Reichner. Rose's wife Cheryl is actively involved in helping families who have children with cancer as vice chairperson of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation. Rose served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie College. His son Garrett returned in August 2005 from a two-year mission in Little Rock, Ark., and married his wife Brooke in November 2006. Rose also has a daughter, Taylor, who is a seventh grader at Centennial Middle School.

### COMMUNITY SERVICE

Dave Rose was one of the first coaches in Utah to become involved with Coaches vs. Cancer. He helps the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation and has been a volunteer coach for youth groups. He served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. Dave and his wife Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community. She received the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005. After Dave got her involved, she now serves as the Vice Chairperson for the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation.

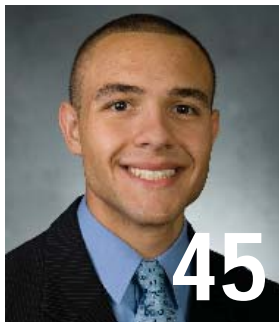
