BYU PLAYS NO. 25 MICHIGAN STATE SATURDAY IN DICK'S SPORTING GOODS SPARTAN CLASH

The Cougars (5-2) will travel to Michigan this weekend to take on the 25th-ranked Michigan State Spartans (8-2) in the Dick's Sporting Goods Spartan Clash played at The Palace of Auburn Hills. The 3 p.m. ET game will be televised nationally on ESPN2 with Brent Musburger and Steve Lavin making the call. Additionally, the radio broadcast can be heard on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the internet at ksl.com. The Spartan clash will feature the Michigan State women taking on Hartford at noon before the men take the court. The Cougars have won five of their last six games while the Spartans have won four of five. MSU will be the second ranked team BYU has faced this season. The Cougars suffered a season-opening loss (82-69) at then-No. 5 UCLA.

UP NEXT

BYU will once again play away from home as the Cougars travel to Beaumont, Texas, to take on Lamar University on Wednesday at 7 p.m. CT. The game will not be televised.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

— Cougar head coach Dave Rose guided BYU to a 20-9 record and an NIT appearance last season in his first year at the helm after eight years as BYU's lead assistant. He was named the Mountain West Conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year. Rose coached his team to a second-place MWC finish — one game behind league-champion San Diego State — while turning a 9-21 team into a 20-9 success that proved to be the second-best improvement among all Division I programs.

— BYU was picked to finish second in the Mountain West Conference in the preseason MWC media poll behind reigning champion San Diego State.

— BYU's roster this season includes a solid core of returning players, including six seniors and Trent Plaisted, the MWC Freshman of the Year last year. One of nine returning lettermen, Plaisted was named a Freshman All-American after leading BYU in both scoring (13.6) and rebounding (6.9) one year ago. 2006 All-MWC Third Team forward Keena Young leads BYU this year in scoring (17.1) and rebounding (6.6). Senior Austin Ainge leads BYU with 3.4 assists per game.

LOOKING AT MICHIGAN STATE

The Spartans are 8-2 this season, with seven of their eight victories coming at home, and ranked No. 25 in this week's ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Poll. MSU returns six lettermen, including one starter; from last year's team that finished the year 22-12 overall and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Junior guard Drew Neitzel, the team's lone returning starter; leads the Spartans this year with 16.9 points per game while dishing out 4.5 assists per game, second on the team. Neitzel is one of only two Spartans who have started all 10 games this season. Freshman Raymar Morgan is second on the team in scoring at 11.7 ppg and rebounding at 5.6 boards per game, one of four players averaging at least five rebounds per contest. The 6-foot-7 forward leads the team shooting .487 from the field. Sophomore guard Maurice Joseph is third on the team in scoring with 8.5 ppg, while sophomore center Goran Sutton is close behind at 8.3 ppg. The 6-foot-10 Sutton leads the Spartans in rebounds, averaging 6.0 rpg. Sophomore guard Travis Walton, who has started all 10 games, dishes out a team-best 5.3 assists per contest while scoring 7.3 ppg. As a team, the Spartans are averaging 68.4 ppg on .455 shooting from the field while holding opponents to 51.9 ppg on .346 shooting. MSU ranks among the top 20 teams in the nation in scoring defense (ninth), rebound margin (10th), field-goal percentage defense (12th), blocked shots per game (19th) and three-point field-goal percentage (20th). Spartan head coach Tom Izzo is in his 12th year at MSU with a 263-111 overall record.

MSU's LAST OUTING – Spartan Offense Spreads the Wealth in 80-43 Win

EAST LANSING, Mich. (Dec. 6, 2006) - Tom Izzo stepped to the microphone and for the fifth time this season said a Michigan State opponent was much better than it had played. That also might say something about the Spartans (8-2), who used a balanced attack and stunning defense to beat Indiana-Purdue-Fort Wayne 80-43 on Wednesday night. Drew Neitzel, Maurice Joseph and Marquise Gray were up for the challenge. Each scored 13 points for the Spartans, who played without No. 2 scorer and rebounder Raymar Morgan. With Morgan sidelined for two to four weeks by a stress reaction in his right shin, Izzo said other players had to improve, especially on defense. The result was 14.3-percent shooting from the field in the second half for IPFW (3-6). Starting guards Jakari Johnson and Chris Perkins were held to a combined two points with 1-for-12 accuracy. At least eight Spartans had to feel good about their performances. And that didn't include Izzo, who found a lot of good but more than enough bad to keep conducting practice. Michigan State's offense was almost as good. The Spartans shot 50.9 percent from the field and 40.9 percent from long range. Neitzel and Joseph each had four 3-point baskets. Gray was 6-for-9 from the field and had eight rebounds off the bench. Goran Sutton had 10 points and nine rebounds for Michigan State. Travis Walton added nine points and seven assists, and Isaiah Dahlman had nine points and six rebounds. Tyler Best scored 12 points and Jaraun Burrows 10 for the Mastodons, who shot 26.5 percent for the game. Michigan State shot 55.6 percent in a 39-24 first half. The Spartans tightened up their defense after the break and pulled away with 41-19 dominance in the last 20 minutes. "I don't want to compare them to last year's team, but they're just significantly tougher than I thought they would be. As a team they are just so much tougher." Michigan State had edges of 45-25 in rebounds and 22-11 in assists to improve to 7-0 at home this year.

SERIES NOTES

The Spartans and Cougars have met seven times in the history of the series dating back to 1930 with BYU holding a 4-3 advantage. The Cougars are 3-0 in Provo, 0-3 at Michigan State and 1-0 on a neutral court. After losing the first two games in the series, BYU won three straight from 1959-1980 before splitting the last two games. BYU's neutral court win came in the last meeting between the two teams as the Cougars picked up a 96-88 victory at the Cable Car Classic on Dec. 29, 1986.

QUOTING COACH ROSE

"Michigan State lost some really good players from last year's team to the NBA, but they have a lot of experience back. Their point guard runs the team really well. It's a great opportunity for our team to go back there and play. Our guys are excited."

BYU VS. THE BIG 10

Michigan State is the only Big Ten team on the Cougars' regular-season schedule. BYU has a 14-22 all-time record against Big Ten schools with the most meetings coming against the Spartans (seven). The Cougars have not played a Big Ten team since Dec. 29, 1997 - a 72-65 win over Ohio State in Honolulu. BYU also played Penn State on Dec. 2 of that season.

BYU'S LAST OUTING — PLAISTED LEADS BYU TO EXTEND HOME WINNING STREAK

PROVO, Utah (Dec. 6, 2006) – Extending their home winning streak to 18 games, the BYU Cougars defeated the San Jose State Spartans Wednesday night at the Marriott Center, 81-69. BYU is now tied for the fifth-longest streak in the nation. Once again senior Keena Young scored in double figures, making him the only Cougar to do so in all seven games this season. Also scoring in double figures were Trent Plaisted, Rashaun Broadus, Jimmy Balderson and Lee Cummar. Plaisted led the Cougars with a season-high 20 points to go along with eight rebounds. A change in the starting five consisted of both Broadus and Austin Ainge going in at the start, leaving Balderson to come off the bench. This was the fourth different starting lineup used by coach Dave Rose this season. With an early San Jose State turnover, the Cougars began the game with an 11-2 run. However, when Young and Plaisted found themselves in foul trouble early in the first half with two fouls each, the Spartans came back to take the lead with their own 15-3 run. Sam Burgess provided a much-needed lift as he sunk a three-pointer, pulling the Cougars within one with 10:10 left in the half. A jumper from Balderson put BYU in front again, and, minutes later, a breakaway layup by Broadus increased BYU's lead, 32-25. Going into halftime the Cougars led 36-28, earning a .485 field-goal percentage, compared to SJSU's .354. Coming out of the half the Spartans scored six points within the first minute, but their run was stopped short by a Broadus three-pointer. SJSU continued to put up a fight making it difficult for BYU to increase its lead. With just under 15 minutes left in the half, a dunk by Young revitalized both the team and the crowd. A missed layup by Balderson on the following play resulted in a dunk by Cummar. Both dunks were a first for Young and Cummar this season. Plaisted recorded his fourth dunk of the season with over eleven minutes to play, bringing the score to 60-46, the largest lead of the game. Two minutes later he earned his second dunk of the night. With less than three minutes to play and up by 11 points, Plaisted rescued a potential turnover, giving Young the chance to score. As time wound down with 27 seconds left on the clock, Plaisted recorded his third dunk of the night, bringing his season total to six. BYU ended the night 13-for-15 from the free throw line. The Cougars scored 29 points off of turnovers compared to SJSU's 18. Menelik Barbary led the Spartans with 14 points and eight rebounds. Jamon Hill recorded four assists.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

– "I thought we had a good overall effort tonight – consistent for 40 minutes. They had some big obstacles with their athleticism and length that we had to overcome. They are a big, strong team but we handled them. I'm proud of our guys."
– "Trent is physically getting better and better each practice [after returning from his ankle injury]. He's becoming a lot more active. Tonight was a good test for him, playing against a couple big guys. He had a good line tonight – points and rebounds."
– "When we got into crunch time, we handled the pressure, hit big shots and took care of the ball. We played well down the stretch."
– "Lee [Cummar] played a great game for us. He made a lot of things happen through pure hustle. He's going to be a great player for this program."

San Jose State Head Coach George Nessman

– "I was really impressed with BYU tonight. We've played a lot of good teams on the road this year and BYU was one of them. They are a good team with a lot of good veterans."
– "Keena Young and Trent Plaisted were too much for us tonight. Trent battled and battled against us. He has an outstanding jump hook, he's physical and he gets to the rim and finishes."

– The Cougars' win over San Jose State improved BYU's home victory streak to 18 games, which is tied for the fifth-longest in the nation.
– BYU's 81-69 margin of victory marked the fifth time this year the Cougars have reached the 70-point threshold. BYU is 5-0 this season when scoring at least 70 points and 4-0 when holding opponents under 70 points.
– The Cougars' point total also marked this third time this season BYU has scored 80 or more points in a game.
– The Cougars' .867 free-throw percentage marked their second-highest percentage of the year. Young (2-for-2), Broadus (2-for-2) and Balderson (5-for-5) were all perfect from the line.
– Five Cougars scored in double figures in the win for the first time since March 4, 2006. Plaisted led all scorers with 20 while Young added 16, Balderson and Cummar each posted 11 and Broadus added 10 points.
– Cummar and Broadus have now scored in double figures in back-to-back games.
– Trent Plaisted reached the 20-point threshold for the first time this season and the fourth time in his career against San Jose State.
– Young has been the most consistent scorer this season for BYU as he has scored in double figures in each of the Cougars' seven games, posting 16 points against San Jose State.
– BYU's 36-28 halftime lead marked the sixth time this season the Cougars have led at the half, outscoring their opponents by an average of 5.3 points in the first period of play. With the win, BYU is now 5-1 when leading at the break.
– The Cougars began the game with an 11-2 run, including four points each from Young and Plaisted.
– SJSU responded with a 15-3 run to take a 17-14 lead with 10:44 left to play. Balderson was the only Cougar to score during the run, converting a three-point play to end a 4:10 BYU scoring drought.
– With BYU trailing 20-19, Balderson again gave the Cougars a lift off the bench as he hit a jumper to give BYU a lead it would never relinquish.
– BYU recorded back-to-back dunks in the second half as Cummar and Young recorded their first dunks of the season. Plaisted added three slams in the period, bringing his season total to six and BYU's season total to nine.

WINNING STREAKS

With wins against Idaho State, Portland and Southern Utah, BYU put together a three-game win streak this season, which ended with a loss at Boise State. The Cougars have a chance to equal that streak with a win vs. Michigan State, having won their last two games. BYU had several winning streaks last season, including its longest since the 2003-04 season at six straight victories. That streak was tied for the seventh-longest active winning streak in the nation. The Cougars' prior victory streaks last year included one four-game streak, two three-game streaks and two two-game streaks. BYU won 10 of its last 13 games last year.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

BYU's win at Weber State marked the Cougars' first road win of the year. BYU is now 1-2 on the road this year with a loss at current No. 1 UCLA and a Nov. 29 setback at Boise State. The victory over the Wildcats snapped a three-game road losing streak dating back to last year's season-ending defeat at Houston in the NIT and a five-game nonconference road losing streak since defeating Washington State last year in Spokane Arena on Nov. 22, 2005. BYU finished last year 6-8 away from home, including a 4-4 mark during MWC play.

BOUNCE BACK COUGARS

The Cougars have bounced back from each of their two losses this season with wins, including back-to-back victories after their loss at Boise State on Nov. 29. BYU recovered from its season-opening loss at then No. 5 UCLA (now ranked No. 1 in the polls) with three straight wins. Last year with its 20-9 overall record, BYU suffered consecutive defeats only once - the last two games of the year, having bounced back from each prior loss with a victory.

MAGIC NUMBER: 70

This year the Cougars are scoring 76.3 points and allowing 68.7 points after seven games. BYU is 4-0 when opponents score less than 70 points this year and 1-2 when they score 70 or more. BYU is 5-0 when it scores 70 or more points and 0-2 when scoring less than 70. Last year BYU was 12-0 when holding opponents under 70 points and 8-9 when allowing opponents to surpass the 70-point threshold. Cougar foes averaged 71.7 points per game last year. BYU was also 17-4 when scoring 70 or more points and 3-5 when falling below the 70-point mark. The Cougars led the MWC in scoring last year, averaging 76.2 ppg, and scored 100 points in conference play for the first time since Feb. 10, 1994 in their home game against league-champion San Diego State.

CLEANING OFF THE GLASS

BYU is 5-0 this season when outrebounding its opponents and 0-2 when losing the battle of the boards. The Cougars are ranked third in the MWC in both rebounding average (36.6) and rebounding margin (+4.3). Senior Keena Young leads BYU and ranks fifth in the league with 6.6 rpg, while sophomore Trent Plaisted is not far behind at 6.1 rpg, ninth in the conference.

JUST A LITTLE LONGER

The Cougars have already played two overtime games this season, winning 84-78 against Idaho State on Nov. 18 and 73-69 at Weber State on Dec. 2, marking the first time since the 2001-02 season that BYU has played multiple extra period games in one year. The Cougars have won five straight overtime games dating back to March 14, 2003, an 86-80 setback against Colorado State at the MWC Tournament. BYU is 50-44 (.532) all-time when playing past regulation.

VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

Michigan State is the second ranked opponent BYU has faced this season. The Cougars suffered a season-opening (82-69) loss at then-No. 5 UCLA. BYU's last win over a ranked team came at the Delta Center in Salt Lake City on Dec. 6, 2003 with a 76-71 victory vs. 25th-ranked Oklahoma State, who advanced to the Final Four that season.

REDSHIRTS

BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced Nov. 23 that 6-foot-6 freshman forward Jonathan Tavernari would not redshirt this season. Tavernari saw his first action on Nov. 24 when the Cougars hosted Southern Utah in the Marriott Center. A native of Sao Bernardo, Brazil, Tavernari did not play in BYU's first three regular-season games as a potential redshirt while a review of his two years of high school in the United States was being conducted by the NCAA. Freshmen swingmen Jordan Cameron and Brock Zylstra are expected to redshirt this season.

AINGE, BALDERSON, YOUNG SERVE AS TEAM CAPTAINS

Coach Rose and the Cougar coaching staff have announced this year's team captains, calling upon seniors Austin Ainge, Jimmy Balderson and Keena Young to lead this year's team. "I'm proud of the way these three players have developed and of their dedication to our team," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "They are totally committed to this program and have earned the respect and confidence of their teammates. They will provide us with good leadership as we work together as a team to achieve our goals." Ainge, a co-captain of last season's team, proved a valuable asset off the bench in 2005-06 after starting at the point guard spot and receiving All-Mountain West Conference honorable mention as a sophomore. Last season he ranked 11th in the MWC in assists while helping BYU lead the league in both scoring and assists. Balderson also provided a spark off the bench for the Cougars last season as he scored in double figures in 11 of the last 13 games and was the only player in the conference averaging more than 10 points per game off the bench with a 10.2 scoring average. Young led BYU in rebounding as a sophomore before becoming an All-MWC Third Team pick last year after starting the last 14 games of the year and ranking second on the team in rebounding (5.8 rpg) and third in scoring (10.3 ppg).

CONSISTENT COUGAR

BYU's most consistent player this year has been senior forward Keena Young, who is the only Cougar to score in double figures in every game and was the catalyst for BYU in two road games last week, leading the Cougars in points, rebounds and assists. He leads BYU and ranks seventh in the Mountain West Conference in scoring at 17.1 points per game while adding a team-best 6.6 rebounds per game, ranked fifth in the league. The senior co-captain has led BYU in scoring twice and rebounding four times, including a 27-point, 11-rebound performance at Weber State for his second double-double of the season. His 27 points marked the most by a Cougar since Dec. 13, 2003 (Rafael Araujo - 28).

VETERAN LEADERSHIP

Senior Austin Ainge has started the last five games at the point. He is averaging a team-best 3.43 assists, which ranks fifth in the MWC, and leads BYU in three-pointers (12) while shooting .545 from three-point range, eighth in the league, and .467 from the floor. He scored 14 points - all in the second half - to fuel BYU's furious comeback attempt at Boise State.

OUT OF THE GATE

Despite picking up two quick fouls against San Jose State, Trent Plaisted broke out for a season-high 20 points, just two points off his career high. He stayed out of foul trouble at Weber State, playing a season-best 35 minutes. He was slowed with two quick fouls at Boise State. Playing in foul trouble nearly the entire night, he finished with eight points and four rebounds against the Broncos. He has made a difference for the Cougars when he gets off to a quick start. After being slowed for two straight games by an ankle injury, Plaisted made it quickly known he was feeling better against Southern Utah, scoring 10 of BYU's first 12 points against the Thunderbirds on the way to a 19-point, 12-rebound performance in 27 minutes of action. Plaisted made 9-of-12 shots while scoring from many different locations, including a jumper from just inside the three-point arc. In addition to leading the Cougars in scoring and rebounding on the night, he added two steals and one assist toward the win. His double-double against Southern Utah was his first of the year and seventh of his career. "Trent (Plaisted) is really working hard," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "He suffered a setback with that sprained ankle, but his effort is improving. Trent's got a lot of different things on his mind; he wants to play the best he can, and he wants to do what he can to help our team win. As long as he keeps playing hard, things will work out well for him."

FOR STARTERS

BYU has used four different starting lineups so far this year. Austin Ainge and Rashaun Broadus started together for the first time against San Jose State after sharing the starting assignment earlier in the year. Vuk Ivanovic made his first career start in place of injury-slowed Trent Plaisted in the post vs. Portland. Starting the first two games were senior Rashaun Broadus, sophomore Lee Cumnard, senior Jimmy Balderson, senior Keena Young and sophomore Trent Plaisted. While all five started games last year, the UCLA game marked the first regular-season contest in which all five started together.

BYU BASKETBALL ON TELEVISION

BYU's game on Saturday vs. Michigan State will be televised nationally on ESPN2. The Mountain West Conference's 2006-07 men's basketball television schedule features an unprecedented 99 games on national and regional television, including 65 of the 72 conference contests and all eight MWC Championship matchups. The television coverage provided by the MWC broadcast partners in 2006-07 is more than triple the national and regional telecasts MWC men's basketball has received in previous years. Seventy-five games will be shown on the MountainWest Sports Network (the mtn.), with 17 to be broadcast nationally on College Sports Television (CSTV) and seven on VERSUS (formerly OLN). BYU will have 18 regular-season games televised as part of the 2006-07 MWC television schedule, including three games on CSTV, one on VERSUS and 14 on the mtn. With the exception of a road game at TCU, BYU's entire conference schedule will be televised in 2007. BYU's nonconference games featured in the MWC broadcast schedule include home dates with Southern Utah (Nov. 24, 8 p.m. MT), San Jose State (Dec. 6, 7 p.m. MT) and Utah State (Dec. 16, 4 p.m. MT). While not part of the MWC television package, BYU's regular-season opener at 2006 NCAA runner-up UCLA on Nov. 15 will be televised on Fox Sports Net Prime Ticket, while the BYU-Michigan State matchup on Dec. 9 at The Palace at Auburn Hills will be carried on ESPN2, BYU's game at Boise State on Nov. 29 will be aired on KTVB in Boise and the matchup with Weber State will be carried in Utah on KJZZ-TV.

DEFENDING THE HOME COURT

With 18 straight wins in the Marriott Center, the Cougars are currently tied for the fifth-longest active home victory streak in the nation. BYU has won its first four home games this season after going 14-1 at home last year including wins in their last 14 straight home contests.

HALFTIME REPORT

BYU has led at the half in six of the team's first seven games. The Cougars' 82-69 loss at UCLA after leading 39-36 at the half marked the first time since the 2004-05 season that BYU has lost when leading at the half. The Cougars are now 5-1 when leading at the half and 0-1 when trailing this season and have had a double-digit lead at the break twice. "This has always been a cause I feel strongly about," said BYU coach Dave Rose. "It has been such a positive experience for the coaches, players and families and is a tremendous opportunity for community members to be involved in brightening the holiday season for these children." Cheryl Rose, vice chairman of the Foundation and wife of coach Rose, discussed the challenges these families face financially and how the Foundation hopes to help these families now and in the future. HOME SWEET HOME

MWC teams have opened the home portions of their 2006-07 schedules with a combined 38-4 mark. Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State and Wyoming are a combined 27-0 at home this season. The Falcons have won 21 consecutive games in Clune Arena, which is the third-longest active home win streak in the nation, while BYU is tied for fifth with 18 straight wins in the Marriott Center.

RACKING UP THE WINS

In addition to their success at home, MWC teams are also piling up the wins on the road as the league sports a 9-11 record on opponents' home courts and a 7-3 tally in neutral settings. Overall, the MWC boasts a 54-18 record in nonconference play. Victories by MWC teams this year include wins over Wake Forest, Stanford, Kansas State, Colorado, Washington State, California and Texas Tech.

COUGAR CROWDS RANK NO. 2 IN MWC ATTENDANCE

BYU's attendance average of 8,411 through four games ranks second in the Mountain West Conference, behind New Mexico's 14,256 average. An average of 11,069 fans filled the Marriott Center last season for each BYU home game, second only to the Lobos' 13,387 average in the MWC. A total of 20,732 fans attended BYU's last home game during which former Cougar great Kresimir Cosic's jersey was retired. The mark is BYU's highest since March 1, 2004.

TAKING ON THE TOP 25

MWC teams will be in the national spotlight on Saturday, Dec. 9, as five of the league's eight contests that day will feature matchups with nationally ranked squads. In addition to No. 23 Air Force's home outing against Colorado College, Wyoming squares off against No. 10/No. 16 Wichita State in Casper, Wyo., while UNLV pays a visit to No. 20/No. 19 Nevada. Two other contests will be part of tournament action, as San Diego State takes on No. 14/No. 15 Arizona at the San Diego Slam in San Diego, Calif., while BYU faces off against 25th-ranked Michigan State in the Spartan Clash at The Palace in Auburn Hills, Mich.

FALCONS FLY INTO TOP 25

Air Force has landed its highest ranking in school history with a No. 23 spot in the Dec. 4 ESPN/USA Today coaches poll. The team's previous high was 25th in both the coaches' and Associated Press polls on March 8, 2004, the only other time the program had achieved a Top-25 ranking prior to this week. The Falcons' placement marks the first Top-25 ranking for an MWC squad since Utah was listed at No. 15 and No. 18, respectively, in the ESPN/USA Today and Associated Press polls during Week 17 of the 2004-05 season.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP

Youth continues to be served in the MWC as several sophomores are currently ranked among national and MWC statistical leaders. Utah forward Shaun Green (13.2 ppg/5.5 rpg) leads the nation with a blistering 68 percent conversion rate from 3-point range (17-of-25), while Wyoming guard Brandon Ewing ranks 12th nationally with an MWC-best 22.7 scoring average. Meanwhile, Utah center Luke Nevill boasts the nation's sixth-highest field goal shooting percentage (68.9%) - best in the MWC - while also ranking third and fourth, respectively, in the league in rebounding (8.2 rpg) and scoring (18.3 ppg).

BREAKING THE LANGUAGE BARRIER

The presence of returned missionaries and international players on BYU's roster leads to a variety of languages that can be heard on the Cougar bench. Six players speak a language in addition to English, including Austin Ainge (Spanish), Fernando Malaman (Portuguese), Jimmy Balderson (Marshallese), Jonathan Tavernari (Portuguese), Vuk Ivanovic (Serbian) and Gavin MacGregor (Dutch). Two BYU assistant coaches also speak other languages as Walter Roese speaks Spanish and Portuguese, and John Wardenburg speaks Dutch.

20-WIN SEASONS

With a win against New Mexico to conclude the regular season last year, the Cougars achieved their 29th 20-win season. BYU has averaged 20 wins every 2.7 years (BYU has played 78 seasons in which it has played at least 20 games in a season). BYU coach Dave Rose is the fifth Cougar head coach to reach 20 wins in his first season at the helm. He joins G. Ott Romney (20-10 in 1928-29), Stan Watts (22-12 in 1949-50), Ladell Anderson (20-11 in 1983-84) and Roger Reid (21-9 in 1989-90). Both Watts and Reid achieved six 20-win seasons in their BYU coaching careers while Romney posted five and Rose's predecessor, Steve Cleveland, achieved four.

- BYU has had five 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools along with Utah. UNLV has had three, Wyoming three, New Mexico, San Diego State and Air Force two and Colorado State none.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second once and third on three occasions. The Cougars were third last year (67) behind Air Force (50) and San Diego State (56).
- BYU has played the toughest schedule on average of any team in the MWC (average strength of schedule rating the past seven years is 66, Utah is next at 78). BYU has had the league's toughest schedule in two of the past three seasons.
- BYU has the second-most overall wins in the seven years of the MWC (137, Utah leads at 155).
- BYU is also second in conference wins (60, Utah has 69).
- BYU has the second-most MWC regular-season titles (two) along with Wyoming (Utah leads with four).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

BYU AND MWC IN POSTSEASON

BYU has earned an invite to a postseason tournament in six of the seven years of the MWC, joining Utah in leading all MWC teams. BYU is second to Utah in NCAA appearances since the formation of the MWC (BYU has made three NCAA and three NIT while Utah has made five NCAA and one NIT). UNLV has received five invites (one NCAA, four NIT). New Mexico has received four (one NCAA, three NIT) while Wyoming has three (one NCAA, two NIT), San Diego State has three (two NCAA, one NIT) and Air Force has three (two NCAA and one NIT). Colorado State has been to one NCAA Tournament. TCU's first year was last season.

SEVEN MWC TOURNAMENTS, SIX DIFFERENT CHAMPIONS

San Diego State became the first team in the MWC to win the Tournament title twice with its victories in 2002 and 2006. New Mexico's win in 2005 marked the sixth Tournament winner in the first six years of the event. The only teams not to win an MWC title are Wyoming, Air Force and TCU, who made its MWC debut last season.

MWC TEAMS IN THE NCAA

In the first seven years of the MWC, eight of the nine conference members have advanced to the NCAA Tournament at least once. TCU is the lone team not to advance but the Horned Frogs played in the MWC for the first time last season. New Mexico became the last of the other MWC teams to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament by winning the 2005 MWC Tournament. 2006 MWC-Champion San Diego State received the league's automatic bid last season while Air Force was selected as an at-large team (BYU was the other postseason MWC team last year, advancing to the NIT).

BYU SCHEDULE INCLUDES NATIONAL RUNNER-UP UCLA, MICHIGAN STATE AND SETON HALL

The BYU men's basketball nonconference schedule includes dates with 2006 NCAA Tournament runner-up UCLA of the Pac-10 Conference, 2005 Final Four participant Michigan State of the Big Ten Conference and 2006 NCAA qualifier Seton Hall of the Big East Conference. In all, the Cougars' non-league slate includes 14 games against teams from 10 different conferences prior to beginning Mountain West Conference play.

"We are excited about our schedule," BYU coach Dave Rose said. "We look forward to the challenge of playing some of the best teams in the country and believe the BYU Holiday Classic will be a great event for our fans. This should be a balanced, competitive schedule that will help us prepare for the conference. We hope to continue to improve as a team and build on the success our program achieved last season."

BYU will play Michigan State of the Big Ten on a neutral court at The Palace of Auburn Hills – home of the Detroit Pistons – on Dec. 9. The Spartans, who finished 22-12 last season, will play BYU at the Delta Center in 2007. New to BYU's schedule this season is the BYU Holiday Classic, which will be conducted the last weekend of December to conclude non-league play. With a four-team field that includes Big South Conference foe Liberty (Dec. 28), Mid-Continent Conference champion Oral Roberts (Dec. 29) and Big East Conference contender Seton Hall (Dec. 30), BYU fans will see teams from across the nation convene in Provo to compete with doubleheader games each day of the exempt tournament. Seton Hall and Oral Roberts were both NCAA Tournament participants last season. The Pirates will be the first Big East team to visit the Marriott Center since 1990 when St. John's played in the Cougar Classic, although BYU's last three NCAA Tournament opponents – Syracuse in 2004, Connecticut in 2003, and Cincinnati in 2001 – are Big East teams. The Cougars and Pirates will meet for the first time since an 82-80 Seton Hall overtime win at the Queen City Invitational on Dec. 29, 1958.

UCLA, Michigan State, Seton Hall, Oral Roberts, Portland, Liberty, Idaho State, San Jose State and Western Oregon are new to the schedule for 2006-07, while Lamar, Boise State, Weber State, Utah State and Southern Utah are repeat opponents from last season. Liberty is the lone first-time opponent for BYU. The Cougars own a 228-123 (.650) all-time record against their 2006-07 nonconference opponents and lead or are tied in the overall series against each program. BYU will play a minimum of nine games against teams that qualified for last year's NCAA Tournament.

The MWC season begins in Provo against reigning MWC Champion San Diego State and culminates against in-state rival Utah in the Marriott Center – the first regular-season finale between the Cougars and Utes since the 1995-96 season.

"Our league will be very competitive this year," BYU coach Dave Rose said. "Seven of the nine teams return at least three starters and five return four or more. We are looking forward to the upcoming season. I think our fans will be treated to some outstanding basketball in the Marriott Center this year."

The Cougars will play 30 regular-season games in 2006-07 prior to the MWC Tournament at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas March 6-10.

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

— With the addition of freshman Jonathan Tavernari, 26 international players have played basketball at BYU.
 — The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 35 of the past 55 years.
 — Another international player, Jean Carlos Otero from Colombia, signed with BYU in November.
 — In the last five years, BYU has rostered six international players, including four on this season's team – Jimmy Balderson (Canada), Vuk Ivanovic (Serbia) and Fernando Malaman and Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil).
 — Foreign players at BYU have received eight all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen – 1985, Rafael Araujo – 2004) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic – 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo – 2004).
 — According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
 — BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
 — During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

FOUR RECRUITS COMMIT TO BYU DURING NOVEMBER SIGNING PERIOD

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 19, 2006) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose today announced that four players – two from the high school ranks and two from junior colleges – have committed to attend BYU next season by signing national letters of intent during November's early signing period. Joining the Cougar program for the 2007-08 season will be 6-foot-9 forward Chris Collinsworth out of Provo (Utah) High School; 6-foot-2 combo guard Jimmer Fredette from Glens Falls (N.Y.) High School; 5-foot-10 point guard Lamont Morgan out of Saddleback Community College (Mission Viejo, Calif.); and 6-foot-7 forward Jean Carlos Otero out of Miami-Dade College (Miami, Fla.). "We are excited about the early class," Rose said. "The common denominator is that all these guys come from winning programs and they are a key to that success. Since we are losing six seniors as well as others to missions after this year, it is important for us to address those changes, especially on the perimeter. This gives us a great start as we work toward completing our recruiting in the spring."

CHRIS COLLINSWORTH

An athletic player known for his versatility and soft shooting touch, Collinsworth earned first-team all-state honors last season after averaging 14.1 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game for the 4A state runner-up Provo Bulldogs. He shot 56 percent from the field to help himself earn All-Valley Co-MVP honors by the Deseret Morning News, All-Valley First Team recognition by the Provo Daily Herald and first-team Region 7 accolades from a vote of area coaches. Showing his versatility, the 6-foot-9 forward has also played the point guard position. His inside-outside game has drawn comparisons to former BYU great Kresimir Cosic. Collinsworth received recruiting attention from schools such as North Carolina, Arizona State, West Virginia, USC and Oregon State in addition to several Mountain West Conference schools. "Chris has the ability to score in the post and on the perimeter," Rose said. "He is a tireless worker who brings a skill level that will be important to our transition offense. He's from right here in our backyard, and we are excited to have him join our program."

JIMMER FREDETTE

A talented scorer, Fredette averaged 29.3 points per game as a junior while leading Glens Falls High School to a 21-2 overall record and the state title game. A first-team all-state selection and the 2006 Times Union Player of the Year, Fredette is known for his outside shooting and playmaking ability. He made a team-leading 76 three-pointers last season while shooting 83 percent from the free-throw line and scoring more than 30 points in 12 of 23 games. The athletic combo guard also averaged 25 points for the Albany City Rocks AAU team over the summer, leading the squad to a third-place finish at AAU Nationals. An all-around athlete, he earned all-state honors as a wide receiver during his junior year before electing not to play football as a senior to concentrate on basketball. Utah, Syracuse, Wake Forest, Seton Hall, Marshall, Siena, George Mason, West Virginia, Virginia Tech and Penn State also recruited Fredette. "Jimmer is a terrific shooter who also has the ability to run a team," Rose said. "He is a very unselfish player and is very committed to hard work and getting better. He's a great addition to our team."

LAMONT MORGAN

A sophomore this year at Saddleback Community College, Morgan is an extremely quick point guard and strong team leader. He is averaging 8.7 points, 4.7 assists and 3.0 steals per game so far this season after playing in all 31 games as a freshman to help the Gauchos to a 22-9 record. Morgan has excellent defensive abilities and shot 81 percent from the free-throw line last year. As a freshman he recorded season highs of 13 points and seven rebounds while leading the team in assists 11 times. Prior to playing at Saddleback, Morgan prepped at Diamond Ranch High School in Pomona, Calif., earning first-team all-league honors. "Lamont is a winner," Rose said. "He is a team-oriented point guard who provides great leadership and is very competitive. He is extremely quick with the ball. One of the things we really like about Lamont is his ability to defend. His experience will be counted on."

JEAN CARLOS OTERO

Otero is an athletic perimeter player with excellent size and strength. Known for his ability to penetrate, he is currently averaging 15.4 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.0 assists while shooting 62 percent from the floor in his second year at Miami-Dade College. The 6-foot-7 swingman is also an excellent perimeter defender, often drawing the assignment to guard the opponent's top scorer. As a freshman at Miami-Dade, Otero averaged 8.4 points and 6.5 rebounds per game while shooting 48 percent from the floor. A native of Barranquilla, Colombia, Otero will be the 27th international player to play men's basketball at BYU. "Jean Carlos is an athletic wing player who can beat people off the dribble, penetrate and finish," Rose said. "He has good size and strength for a wing player. His perimeter defense is going to be counted on heavily."

FIRST-YEAR COACH MADE AN IMPACT

Picked last in MWC preseason, first-year head coach Dave Rose directed the Cougars to 20 wins. Their 20-9 record was an 11.5-game improvement over the year before. Rose earned a .746 winning percentage when he last served as a head coach at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, from 1990-97, as six of his seven teams earned a national ranking. His winning percentage last season with BYU was .690.

MOST IMPROVED

BYU was the most improved team in the nation last year through the regular season. The Cougars' .441 jump in winning percentage (.741 in 2006 from .300 in 2005) led the country as well as its overall 12.5-game improvement. BYU's +11 wins was tied with South Alabama for top honors. With its 20-9 overall record compared to the prior year's 9-21 mark, BYU's final .390 jump in winning percentage (.690 in 2006 from .300 in 2005) was second in the country as well as its overall 11.5-game improvement. BYU's +11 wins ranked third.

PLAYING STRONG DOWN THE STRETCH

The Cougars won six of their last eight and 10 of their last 13 games while avenging their three prior league losses with wins over MWC-champion San Diego State, Air Force and UNLV. BYU lost to Air Force in the league opener as the Cougars started 2-3 in league play but finished tied for second with the Falcons at 12-4. In this stretch, BYU also won at New Mexico, snapping the Lobos' 21-game home win streak, while going 4-1 on the road. BYU achieved a six-game victory streak, which ranked tied for seventh in the nation, before its MWC Quarterfinal loss to Utah.

NEW PLAYERS MADE SOLID CONTRIBUTIONS

Five of BYU's top seven scorers and rebounders were first-year players and a walk-on. While growing into their roles last year, three freshmen, two transfers and one walk-on accounted for 62.2 percent of team scoring and 55.3 percent of team rebounding while playing 63.4 percent of total minutes and making 80.7 percent of starts.

BALANCED ATTACK

BYU boasted a balanced attack with five players averaging between 9 and 14 points. BYU had five players in double figures on nine occasions this season, including seven times during league play and in each of BYU's last four wins. Experienced starters from last year, Austin Ainge and Jimmy Balderson, played key roles off the bench with the infusion of new players.

OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION

BYU was the first team to score 100 points in an MWC game since 2003 (100-90 win over San Diego State). BYU led the MWC in scoring and assists and ranked among the nation's top teams in three-point shooting (25th), assists (34th), scoring offense (36th), won-loss percentage (48th) and field-goal percentage (50th) in the final NCAA statistical rankings. Only 33 teams in the country finished with less than BYU's nine losses.

CLUTCH PLAY

BYU exhibited clutch play, solid mental toughness and strong coaching while going 11-2 in games decided by nine points or less last season after going 1-10 in games decided by a single digit the prior year.

In addition to the league's official honor, BYU's Dave Rose received the nod as the MWC Coach of the Year by several others last season. ESPN's Pat Forde named Rose his choice for MWC Coach of the Year, as did CollegeInsiders.com.

ROSE RANKED NO. 3 AMONG NATION'S FIRST-YEAR COACHES

BYU head coach Dave Rose received national notice for the outstanding job he did during his first season guiding the Cougars. In a Feb. 12 column on ESPN.com, Pat Forde lists Rose among the top-three first-year coaches in the nation this season. Among the nearly 40 first-year coaches in college basketball this year, Forde names the 10 he feels are doing the best job, ranking Rose No. 3 overall. Picked to finish last in the Mountain West Conference in the preseason poll of MWC media members, BYU finished tied for second at 12-4, one game behind league-champion San Diego State.

COUGAR RECRUITS HAVE EXCELLED

With Trent Plaisted receiving the 2006 MWC Freshman of the Year award, BYU has now had nine recruits earn conference freshman/newcomer or a major award in their first season as a Cougar in the nine years BYU coach Dave Rose has been in Provo. Rose was Steve Cleveland's recruiting coordinator and lead assistant the past eight seasons before taking over the program this season. Six BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year.

PLAISTED EARNED THREE NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS

BYU redshirt freshman forward/center Trent Plaisted received national recognition for his play. Plaisted was named the Nivea for Men Fresh Face Player of the Week by CBS.Sportsline.com, an honor handed out to top performers in the national freshman class, while ESPN's Dick Vitale also named Plaisted his Diaper Dandy of the Week for his play the week of Feb. 6. He also was named the Rivals.com Freshman Player of the Week for his outings against San Diego State and at TCU, which included a BYU freshman-record 18 rebounds against the Horned Frogs.

COUGAR FANS SHOW SUPPORT

BYU has consistently ranked among the national attendance leaders in the 35-year history of the Marriott Center. The Cougars average of 11,069 last season was more than the regular-season champions of 27 out of 31 conferences as well as over half of the teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Big 12, Big East and Southeastern Conference and all but Arizona in the Pac-10. BYU also averaged more fans than 12 of the NCAA Sweet 16 participants, including all of the Final Four teams.

A tireless worker, gifted motivator and strong strategist, Dave Rose guided BYU to a 20-win season while earning district and conference coach-of-the-year honors in his first season at the Cougar helm in 2005-06. Rose was named to succeed Steve Cleveland as BYU Men's Basketball Head Coach on April 11, 2005.

Rose received national notice for the outstanding job he did during his first season guiding the Cougars. Picked to finish last in the Mountain West Conference in the preseason poll of MWC media members, BYU instead earned a 20-9 record and NIT bid in 2005-06 under Rose's tutelage, including a 12-4 conference mark to tie for second place. Rose was named the USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year and received honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com. He was named MWC Coach of the Year by the league's media and coaches and by CollegInsider.com. ESPN analyst Bob Valvano called BYU "one of the great surprise teams in the country."

In a column on ESPN.com, Pat Forde listed Rose as one of the top first-year coaches in the nation, ranking Rose No. 3 overall among the nearly 40 first-year coaches in college basketball in 2005-06.

Rose, who served the prior eight seasons as Cleveland's lead assistant in Provo, was promoted to BYU's head job two days after Cleveland announced his resignation to take the head-coaching position at Fresno State. Rose served as BYU's associate head coach for five seasons and took over the Cougar program with 22 years of coaching experience, including 10 seasons as a head coach at the junior college and high school levels.

Since coming to Provo in 1997 with Cleveland, Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in six of the past seven seasons, including three NCAA bids, while claiming two MWC titles. As associate head coach, Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, and his efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Rose was the team's defensive coordinator and worked with the post players. He possesses a complete knowledge of the game and worked hard in developing the team's defensive game plans. An outstanding teacher, he coached defensive skill development and implemented the defensive game plan. BYU was the top defensive team in the Mountain West Conference two of the four seasons Rose oversaw the defense.

A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose managed BYU's recruiting efforts during his eight seasons as an assistant. Rose's success as a recruiter was evidenced by his being named one of the top 25 college basketball recruiters in 2004 by Rivals.com. Each year the Cougars have brought in talented newcomers to contribute to the BYU program. The 2004 class was rated No. 17 nationally and No. 3 in the West by Rivals.com. The 2000 recruiting class also ranked in the top 20 nationally.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, nine recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major conference award in their first season as a Cougar in the nine years Rose has been in Provo. Including Rafael Araujo being named the league's top newcomer by the MWC media members in 2003 (the MWC discontinued the newcomer award that year), six BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Trent Plaisted was named the 2006 MWC Freshman of the Year. The following is the list of player honors earned the last nine seasons by Cougar recruits in their first seasons in Provo.

Rose has also worked closely with scheduling. BYU has played many of the nation's top teams over the past several years thanks in part to relationships Rose has developed with programs across the country. His efforts have helped the Cougars receive invitations to tournaments like the 2004 EA SPORTS Maui Invitational where BYU faced that season's NCAA Champion North Carolina.

Prior to coming to BYU, Rose was head coach at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, where he compiled a 167-57 record in seven seasons. Rose guided six of his seven teams to national top-20 rankings, including a ranking as high as No. 2, while earning three conference titles. His peers honored him as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as longtime NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU he has recruited and coached two NBA Draft picks in Rafael Araujo and Travis Hansen.

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86.

Rose becomes the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie College before transferring to Houston, where he was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished second in the NCAA Tournament. At Houston, Rose played in 1980-81, redshirted in 1981-82 and played his final year in 1982-83.

At Dixie, Rose was first-team all-league in both basketball and baseball. Rose was also the Region 18 batting champion, hitting .421 as a center fielder. While playing basketball for Houston's Northbrook High School, he led the District 16AAAAA in scoring, was selected first-team all-district and All-Greater Houston and was named team MVP.

PERSONAL

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and one granddaughter. Daughter Chanell played forward on the BYU women's basketball team from 2000-03 and is married to Brock Reichner, last year's lone senior on the BYU team. Rose's wife Cheryl is actively involved in helping families who have children with cancer as vice chairperson of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation. Rose follows Cleveland as the second returned missionary to serve as BYU men's basketball head coach. Rose served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie College. DAVE RICE

2nd year (UNLV 1991)

Dave Rice joined the BYU coaching staff in May 2005. Rice has 15 years of coaching experience, including 13 seasons at the Division I level at BYU, UNLV and Utah State. As a player, Rice was a member of UNLV's 1989-90 National Championship and 1990-91 Final Four teams that won a school-record 45 consecutive games.



In his first season at BYU, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

Rice came to BYU from Utah State University where he helped Coach Stew Morrill and the Aggies earn a 24-8 record, Big West Conference Tournament title and an NCAA Tournament bid in 2004-05. In his one season at Utah State, Rice's coaching duties included working with the offense and coaching the guards. In 2004-05, the Aggies led the nation in field-goal percentage (school-record .525) and ranked fourth nationally in scoring margin (+14.6), 10th in assists (17.2) and 20th in three-point field goal percentage (.391).

Rice spent 11 seasons as an assistant coach at UNLV, which is the second-longest tenure ever for an assistant in that program. During his time at UNLV as both a player and a coach, the Rebels had 12 players go on to play in the National Basketball Association, eight of whom were drafted in the first round, including six lottery picks. While in Las Vegas, Rice worked under four head coaches in Jerry Tarkanian, Tim Grgurich, Bill Bayno and Charlie Spoonhour. In his last eight seasons at UNLV, the Runnin' Rebels received seven postseason invitations and averaged 20 wins per year.

In addition to his Division I experience, Rice served as an assistant coach for one season at Chaffey (Calif.) College in 1994, helping the Panthers to a 32-6 record and an appearance in the California State Final Four. He also spent one season at Claremont (Calif.) High School, where he was an assistant coach under his father Lowell, a long-time high school coach. That team went 21-7, winning the Baseline League Championship and reaching the CIF quarterfinals. Rice earned his bachelor's degree in political science from UNLV in 1991 and his MBA in 1993. He was also a two-time UNLV Scholar-Athlete of the Year and a Rhodes Scholar candidate.

Prior to playing at UNLV, Rice began his college career at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, Calif., where he earned All-South Coast Conference honors as a sophomore and was chosen from among more than 13,000 student-athletes as the 1989 California Junior College Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He graduated from Claremont High School. A native of Claremont, Calif., Rice and his wife Mindy have two sons, Travis (9) and Dylan (4).

JOHN WARDENBURG

6th year (BYU 1986)

John Wardenburg joined the BYU coaching staff as an assistant coach in May 2001 and served four seasons under former BYU coach Steve Cleveland before being retained on the staff by current BYU head coach Dave Rose.



In 2005, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

Wardenburg has 19 years of coaching experience. He came to BYU with 15 years of coaching experience at the high school and junior college levels. His primary responsibilities have included defensive skill development, game film preparation, summer basketball camp director, recruiting and assisting Coach Rose with defensive game plan preparation.

Wardenburg compiled a 105-62 record in seven years as a head coach at Payson High School (1988-93) and Pine View High School (1999-01) while guiding his teams to five league titles and seven state tournament berths. In those seven years, his teams earned three fifth-place state tournament finishes, one third-place finish and a 3A Utah State Championship with his 2001 Pine View team.

After Wardenburg's Payson teams claimed three league titles and posted a 76-43 overall record, he served as an assistant coach from 1993-97 at Dixie State College under current BYU head coach Dave Rose and helped the Rebels to a 95-31 record and a national ranking as high as No. 2. Wardenburg left coaching for two years to serve as Dixie's Director of Athletics. He returned to coaching as the head coach at Pine View High School in St. George where he recorded two highly successful seasons before joining BYU's staff in 2001.

Wardenburg's Pine View teams won the league title both seasons he was the coach while achieving a 29-19 record. Wardenburg earned 3A Coach of the Year honors in 2000 after coaching his team to a third-place state finish and was named Championship Coach of the Year in 2001 after guiding his team to the state title.

Born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Wardenburg was a multi-sport athlete at Kiel High School in Kiel, Wis. He served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to The Netherlands from 1977-79 and earned a BA in political science from BYU in 1986 and an MA in health, physical education and recreation from Utah State in 1992.

Wardenburg and his wife Pam have four sons, Scott, Jonathan, Adam and Barrett, and one granddaughter.

2nd year (BYU-Hawaii 1994)

Walter Roese was hired in June 2005 as an assistant coach under Coach Dave Rose, becoming the first Brazilian full-time assistant coach in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball.



With his outstanding knowledge of the game and large international recruiting network, Roese is a valuable addition to the BYU coaching staff.

In 2005, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

A 1994 Cum Laude graduate in International Business Administration from BYU-Hawaii, Roese earned an MBA at BYU in 2003 before serving as BYU's director of basketball operations under former Cougar coach Steve Cleveland for two years.

Roese coached the Brazilian Junior National Team this past summer, helping his native country qualify for the 2007 World Cup. He also previously served as a volunteer assistant at BYU-Hawaii under Ken Wagner after finishing his professional playing career.

A native of Novo Hamburgo in southern Brazil, Roese played seven years professionally in Brazil and Italy after graduating from BYU-Hawaii. He still holds the Brazilian professional league record with 23 assists in a single game. He has represented the Brazilian National Team and professional clubs at four World Cup tournaments and several international championships in Europe, Asia and South and North America, winning state, national and South American championships. In 1986, he was Brazil's top-rated junior player. Roese has continued to excel as an athlete. In August of 2003, he hit a three-quarter-court shot at the buzzer to give Brazil a one-point victory in the semifinals of the Masters World Basketball Championships (ages 35-40) in Orlando, Fla., before leading Brazil to the title win over Russia.

Roese has experience at nearly every level of the college game. Roese attended the University of Houston, West Texas A&M and BYU-Hawaii while playing at the Division I, Division II and NAIA levels. He was the MVP of the Lone Star Conference in 1992 while playing at West Texas A&M and was a Scholar Athlete All-American at BYU-Hawaii. He served as a volunteer director of athletic marketing and assistant basketball coach at BYU-Hawaii from 2000-01 before attending the Marriott School of Management at BYU to obtain his MBA degree.

Roese comes from an athletic family that has seen six members participate at the Olympic level in basketball, volleyball and tennis. Fluent in English, Spanish and Portuguese, Roese and his wife Monique are the parents of two children, Leonardo and Agatha.
