HOMECOMING WEEK

Coming off a bye week, BYU returns to action to take on UNLV for its annual homecoming matchup. The Cougars are riding a current three-game winning streak and are a half-game behind Mountain West Conference leader Air Force (3-0 in MWC play). BYU will be looking for its first four-game winning streak since 2001.

LAST GAME RECAP

BYU (4-2, 2-0 MWC) remained undefeated in Mountain West Conference play and extended its winning streak to three games, as the Cougars mauled San Diego State (0-5, 0-2) 47-17. BYU quarterback John Beck continued to add to his record-chasing season, passing for 267 yards and four touchdowns in just three quarters.

Beck now has 59 career touchdown passes, a new MWC career record. His efficiency rating of 245.85 was a career-high and the highest for a Cougar quarterback since Steve Sarkisian posted a 260.8 mark against Rice in 1996.

"They had a good game plan against us, and we were facing a great quarterback and an excellent offense," San Diego State head coach Chuck Long said of BYU. "We had a lot of young guys playing in the secondary. What a baptism that was for them, playing against one of the best quarterbacks in the country."

SERIES INFORMATION



Although BYU owns a 10-3 all-time series lead against UNLV, it has been the Rebels that have left Provo victorious the last two times the teams have met at LaVell Edwards Stadium. Interestingly, BYU owns a 6-0 all-time record when playing the Rebels in Las Vegas. The Cougars hold a 3-3 advantage over UNLV at home. The last time the two teams played in Provo, UNLV capitalized on six BYU turnovers to beat the Cougars 24-20. BYU last defeated UNLV, 10-7,

in Provo in 2000. The series started in 1978 when the Cougars defeated the Rebels, 28-24, in Yokohama, Japan.

2006 SCHEDULE SET

Due in part to the Mountain West Conference's new contract with CSTV and the development of The mtn. network, the Cougars already have game times and television programming plans completed for each of their 12 games. Two of BYU's first three games were televised nationally, including a season-opening trip Sept. 2 to Arizona (TBS) and a split national broadcast at Boston College (ESPN2). In addition to BYU's debut on VERSUS, the Cougars will also play two games on CSTV and one on VERSUS, including another CSTV Thursday night game. The remainder of their schedule (two games) will be played on The mtn.

QUARTER-BY-QUARTER

All totaled, the Cougars have outscored their opponents in 17 of 24 quarters this season, including eight shutout quarters. BYU has not trailed since the Boston College game, marking 12 consecutive quarters without trailing.

COUGARS ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

All totaled, the Cougars have a total of six nationally televised games. BYU has played on TBS (Arizona), ESPN2 (Boston College), VERSUS (TCU, and Air Force still to come) and has two games on CSTV. Interstingly, BYU played in the first nationally televised games on ESPN (1985), TBS (1982) and VERSUS (2006). All three have been victories.

THE RANKED TEAMS

BYU's 31-17 victory over TCU was the first against a ranked opponent since beating No. 23 Colorado State, 34-13, on Sept. 16, 1999. Previous to the victory over TCU, the Cougars were 0-12 against ranked opponents, including a record of 0-3 at Edwards Stadium. Interestingly, BYU's victory over TCU was the first on the road against a ranked opponent since beating Arizona State, 13-10, on Sept. 20, 1997.

BOWL MOMENTUM

BYU is coming off its 24th bowl appearance. In seasons following a trip to a bowl game, the Cougars have recorded a combined record of 202-82-2 (.709). Of the 23 seasons following a bowl game, the Cougars have averaged nearly nine (8.8) wins per season. BYU has had only one losing season following a trip to a bowl game. (In 2002, BYU went 5-7 after playing in the Liberty Bowl in 2001.)

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

Nearly 350,000 fans attended six different home games at Edwards Stadium during the 2005 season, averaging 58,204 fans per game. BYU finished ranked seventh overall in the west behind USC (90,812), Washington (64,326), UCLA (64,218), Arizona State (61,157), California (60,377) and Oregon (58,434). Since the inception of the BCS, BYU has annually been the top school in average attendance for teams from conferences that do not receive automatic BCS bowl bids. BYU, which boasts the largest on-campus home stadium in the Mountain West Conference, has led the MWC in home attendance in all seven years of the league's existence. In fact, Edwards Stadium has been the site of the league's all-time top-seven crowds.

EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 64,000-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats. In 1982, 1988 and 1997, the Football Writers Association of America cited BYU for its "outstanding pressbox working area."

"SENIOR"-LADEN SQUAD

Seven players on BYU's active roster are or will be turning 25 during the upcoming season. Backup quarterback Jason Beck, who turned 26 in April, is BYU's oldest player. Jared McLaughlin, at 26, is the oldest kicker in the nation.

EVERY FIVE YEARS...

BYU is on a five-year cycle of fielding top-10 teams. Five years ago, the Cougars started the 2001 campaign 12-0 in Gary Crowton's first season. The BYU squad averaged 44.1 points per game and was ranked as high as eight going into the Hawai'i game.

Five years prior, the 1996 Cougars team, led by quarterback Steve Sarkisian went 14-1. BYU set NCAA records for wins (14) and games played (15) in a season. The Cougars 14-1 record ended in a WAC Championship and a Cotton Bowl victory over Kansas State. After BYU's Cotton Bowl victory, the Cougars finished the season ranked No. 5.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has gone 98 games without scoring a touchdown on a kick return, which ranks the Cougars 10th in the nation in time between touchdown returns. The Cougars have also gone 110 games without returning a punt for a touchdown.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's offensive line checks in at an average 6-foot-4, 316.8 pounds. The Cougars' front line will be going up against a UNLV defensive front that averages just over 6-foot-2, 278.75 pounds. (Advantage: BYU +38.05 pounds per man.) BYU's defensive line weighs in at 6-foot-3, 280 pounds UNLV's offensive line averages 6-foot-4, 302 pounds. (Advantage: UNLV +22 pounds per man.)

YOUNG GUN

While Mendenhall has 16 years of assistant coaching experience, he is now in his second year as a head coach for the first time in his career. Despite his extensive experience, he is the eighth youngest coach in NCAA Division I-A football at the age of 40

BYU's six remaining games are against MWC opponents. BYU last had a similar set up--finishing its non-conference schedule before playing out its MWC schedulue--in 2004.

BRONCO MENDENHALL



Bronco Mendenhall enters his second season as the head football coach at Brigham Young University. In his first year at the helm, he guided the Cougars to their first winning season and first bowl appearance since 2001. BYU finished the 2005 regular season at 6-5 and lost to California, 35-28, in the Las Vegas Bowl.

During the 2005 season, the Cougars finished second in the Mountain West Conference with a 5-3 record. Mendenhall and his staff coached an offense reminiscent of BYU's glory

days, ranking second in the MWC in scoring and sixth in the nation in passing. This season, Mendenhall will lead the Cougars against non-conference opponents Arizona, Tulsa, Boston College and Utah State, as well as a competitive conference schedule.

After 16 seasons as an assistant coach, including the past two years as the defensive coordinator for the Cougars, Bronco Mendenhall was promoted to head football coach at Brigham Young University on December 13, 2004. Mendenhall becomes the 14th head coach since the University first officially recognized football as an intercollegiate sport in 1922.

Mendenhall (40)—one of the youngest NCAA Division I-A head coaches in the country—has served the past two seasons as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach for the Cougars. During his first season in Provo, Mendenhall engineered the nation's 14th-ranked defense, holding opponents to just 307 yards per game. Under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars ranked eighth nationally in passing defense, giving up just 176.17 yards per game.

In 2004, the Cougars ranked third in the Mountain West in rushing defense, allowing 149.3 yards per game. The Cougars also ranked second in the league, with 34 sacks for a combined loss of 232 yards.

A native of Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1989 at his alma mater, Oregon State. After earning his master's degree in 1990, he moved to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he served as the secondary coach and defensive coordinator from 1991-92 under current BYU assistant coach Paul Tidwell. Following two seasons with the Badgers, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Northern Arizona, where the Lumberjacks boasted the top-ranked defense in the Big Sky Conference. He was elevated to co-defensive coordinator for the 1994 season.

In 1995, Mendenhall returned to Oregon State to become the defensive line coach under then defensive coordinator Rocky Long. When Long left to become the defensive coordinator at UCLA, Mendenhall was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 1996 season. At just 29 years of age, Mendenhall was the youngest defensive coordinator in Pac-10 history.

In 1997, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Louisiana Tech where he helped the Bulldogs to a remarkable 9-2 record as his defensive unit was credited with 17 interceptions, allowing just 15 touchdowns on the season.

In 1998, Mendenhall moved to Albuquerque, N.M., to become the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Mexico. Over the next five seasons, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West Conference in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in both the 2000 and 2002 season, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

At New Mexico, Mendenhall played a valuable role in the development of the

1999 Mountain West Player of the Year, Consensus All-American and first-round NFL Draft pick Brian Urlacher. The ninth overall selection in the 2000 NFL Draft, Urlacher was voted the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a Pro Bowl selection. Urlacher was one of two rookies to play all 16 games, starting at middle linebacker the final 14 games to establish a team record for starts at the position by a rookie. He shattered Bears rookie records with 165 total tackles and eight sacks, making him the second Chicago first-year player to lead the team in tackles. Urlacher finished his collegiate career ranked third on New Mexico's all-time list with 442 tackles.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to the former Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple have three sons: Cutter, Breaker and Raeder.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff leads the Mountain West Conference with five members of its coaching staff who have played football in the National Football League or the old USFL. Associate Head Coach and running backs coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Robert Anae was drafted in the third round by the New Jersey Generals of the USFL. Quarterbacks coach Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49'ers in 2002 and also played with the Washington Redskins. Jeff Grimes and Steve Kaufusi also have NFL experience.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS GAME

Prior to Spring practice, Bronco Mendenhall announced BYU would be implementing a 3-4 defensive scheme to replace the 3-3-5.

"We feel like we've assembled the best coaching staff possible," Mendenhall said. "After reviewing our defensive personnel, there are players on our team who we can design scheme elements around to make sure we get our best 11 football players on the field. We believe the coaching assignment changes are in direct alignment with the strengths of our returning defensive personnel."

While the Cougars will be going away from the 3-3-5 scheme, Mendenhall said the principles of the new scheme will not change.

"The principles are very similar to what we have already done," he said. "We will continue to emphasize pursuit and gang tackling."

SOMEBODY'S WATCHING YOU...

Six members of the 2006 BYU football team - John Beck, Curtis Brown, Jonny Harline, Daniel Coats, Cameron Jensen and Jake Kuresa - have been named to various "watch lists" for postseason awards.

John Beck, 6-2, 216, Quarterback: John Beck has been selected to the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award, the Johnny Unitas Award and the Sammy Baugh Award watch lists. Beck started all 12 games his junior year and threw for 3,709 yards and 27 touchdowns. He averaged an MWC-best 309.1 yards per game which was fifth nationally. Beck earned first-team All-MWC honors as a junior.

Curtis Brown, 6-0, 203, Running Back: Curtis Brown is the all-time leader at BYU for 100-yard rushing games (12). Brown rushed for 1,123 yards and scored a team-high 16 touchdowns last season. He needs just 759 yards rushing as a senior to break the school career rushing record. Brown was also second on the team in receptions with 53.

Daniel Coats, 6-3, 263, Tight End: Daniel Coats has been selected to the John Mackey Award watch list. He played in all 12 games for BYU as a junior. BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall said Coats' hard work in the offseason made him stand out in Fall Camp. As a freshman in 2003, Coats earned freshman All-America honors from The Sporting News.

Jake Kuresa, 6-4, 330, Offensive Line: Jake Kuresa has been named to the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award watch lists. He has started every game (35) in his three-year career. As a freshman, he played both guard and tackle and played exclusively at tackle as a sophomore and junior. Kuresa earned second team All-MWC honors as a junior. Kuresa helped anchor an offensive unit that averaged 33.0 points per game, second in the MWC, and 462.4 total yards per game, second in the MWC and 13th in the nation, including 152.3 yards rushing and 310.1 yards passing in 2005.

Cameron Jensen, 6-2, 247, Linebacker: Cameron Jensen has been named to the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award watch lists. He started 11 of 12 games in 2005 and led the team in total tackles with 84, solo tackles with 44 and assisted tackles with 40. He had four pass break-ups and six tackles for a loss.

Jonny Harline, 6-4, 238, Tight End: Jonny Harline (pronounced has been selected to the John Mackey Award watch list. He started every game in 2005 and led the team in receptions (63) and yards (853). He leads all returning tight ends nationally in receptions and yards.

BYU posted a 6-6 (.500) record last year. The last time BYU finished .500 on a season was LaVell Edwards' final season. In the 2000 season, the Cougars won its final two games to salvage a 6-6 record and a .500 season for their departing legendary coach. BYU followed the 2000 campaign with its memorable 2001 season where the Cougars reeled off 12 consecutive wins to start the season. BYU ended the year 12-2 and MWC Champions.

IT'S AUTOMATIC ... ALMOST

BYU, known traditionally for its high-octane offenses, rarely gets shutout. Until the Cougar's 3-0 loss to the University of Utah to end the 2003 season, BYU had scored in 361-consecutive games, which remains an NCAA record, dating back to the 1975 season. The Cougars started a new streak in 2004, and have scored in every game, extending their streak to 29 games. Since October 3, 1975, BYU has scored in 391 of 392 games.

John Beck and Curtis Brown became the first Cougar duo to pass for over 3,000 yards and rush for over 1,000 yards in the same season since 2001. The last time two players combined to reach that mark were Brandon Doman and Luke Staley in 2001. There are currently 61 returned missionaries (59 percent) on the BYU fall camp roster who have served full-time, two-year missions for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in over 25 different countries around the world. All totaled members of this year's team have served missions in Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, England, France, Germany, Ghana, Hong Kong, Honduras, Italy, Japan, Nicaragua, Philippines, Portugal, Russia, Samoa, Spain, Switzerland, Taiwan, Tonga, United States and Venzuela. Members of this year's team can communicate fluently in at least 10 different languages.

Another recently returned missionary, Nixon led BYU tacklers in the annual Blue-White game. Nixon recorded four tackles and a sack for the defense. Prior to his mission in Ecuador, Nixon played one season for the Cougars in 2003. As a true freshman, Nixon played in all 12 games. He was tied for fourth on the team with 57 tackles and second in tackles for loss with 11. Nixon recorded career highs of 12 tackles and two sacks agains Colorado State.

McKay Jacobson-WR

Jacobson joined the Cougars for Spring practice after graduating high school in December 2005. He saw considerable time at wide receiver and as a return specialist. As a prep, Jacobson was named to the 55th annual Texas Sportswriters Association's All-State First Team while leading the state with 99 receptions for 1,631 receiving yards. Jacobson was the district champion in the 100 meter and 200 meter races as a sophomore.

Bryan Kehl-LB

Entering the 2006 season, Kehl is coming off his two most productive games at the collegiate level. In 2005, Kehl recorded a career-high nine tackles (five solo) against Utah. He followed the Utah game with a four-tackle effort in the Las Vegas Bowl against California. Kehl recorded BYU's only blocked punt of the year in the season opener against Boston College. Kehl totaled 30 tackles last season (15 solo).

Ben Criddle-DB

A walk-on, Criddle has shined in the early going. His physical play and sound tackling have him second on the team in total tackles. He also leads BYU in pass break ups, has two tackles for loss and leads the team with 17 solo tackles.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

In addition to English, there are 32 BYU football players that speak a second language fluently. Senior safety Aaron Gordon leads the Cougars with five languages: English, Samoan, Tongan, Italian and Hualapai. Other languages spoken by current BYU players are Spanish, Portuguese, Japanese, Chinese, Russian and German.

FAMILY MEN

There are 28 BYU players from the fall camp roster who are married. Four current players have children.

PACKED HOUSES

The Cougars played in front of their third-consecutive sold out crowd against Arizona. BYU also played in front of sold-out crowds against Utah (home) and California (Las Vegas Bowl). The ninth-largest crowd in Arizona Stadium history (58,450) was on hand for the BYU game. The game was the first sellout for Arizona since the 2000 season. It is estimated there were between 10,000 and 15,000 BYU fans at that game.

BYU's streak of games playing in front of sold-out crowds ended against Tulsa when 56,627 fans attended the Cougars 49-24 victory over the Golden Hurricane at Edwards Stadium.

DEFENSIVE EFFORT

BYU's new look (3-4) defense held Arizona to just 253 total yards including 186 passing and 67 rushing yards.

In week two, the Cougars held Tulsa to just 303 total yards. The 303 yards is 99 fewer than Tulsa averaged in 2005 and the fewest yards Tulsa picked up since Nov. 27, 2004 when Tulsa had 284 total yards. BYU only surrendered 182 passing yards to seasoned starter Paul Smith.

Last week the Cougars had a solid defensive effort. With the exception of a 79-yard pass play, the defense yielded only 16 yards in the first quarter. The BYU "D" also had several takeaways, including one in the final minute of the game to give the Cougars the last shot to win the game in regulation.

Against Utah State, BYU's defense recorded its first shutout since 1999 when the Cougars beat UNLV 29-0. BYU's defense surrendered only 122 passing yards which is the fewest the Cougars have given up since 2003.

QUARTER-BECK NOTES

With four touchdown passes, John Beck has thrown 59 career touchdown completions. Beck's eight-yard touchdown pass to Jonny Harline was his 57th career TD throw, breaking the all-time Mountain West Conference record of 56 touchdown passes previous held by Wyoming's Casey Bramlet. Beck finished the game 16-of-21 for 267 yards and four touchdowns for a career-high efficiency rating of 245.85. Beck's quarterback rating was the highest for a Cougar quarterback since Steve Sarkisian posted a 260.8 mark against Rice in 1996. Beck's 267 yards give him 8,689 in his career and moves him closer to second place (Jim McMahon 9,536).

GOOD GRIEF, CURTIS BROWN

Curtis Brown rushed for 46 yards on 11 carries and caught four passes for 33 yards. Brown had one rushing and one receiving touchdown. Brown also returned three kickoffs for 94 yards with a long return of 48 yards. Brown now has 2,569 yards rushing in his career, remaining in fourth place all time.

VARIETY OF RECEIVERS

All totaled, 12 different receivers have at least one reception for the Cougars this season. Curtis Brown leads all receivers in receptions (33) and yards (349).

CAN'T MOVE THESE GUYS...OFF THE FIELD

BYU's Jake Kuresa and Dallas Reynolds have started or played significantly in every game that they have dressed in their respective careers. Kuresa, a senior, is playing right guard this year. He has started in 40 of 41 games but has played in all 41 games. Reynolds, who plays right tackle, is in his sophomore season and has started 18 consecutive contests.

Left tackle Eddie Keele had played in every game the last three years. Keele, who played left tackle started 15 consecutive games and saw action in all but two games in his collegiate career (36 of 38 total games). Keele's streak came to a premature end when he tore his ACL against Boston College.

SCORING DEFENSE

In the first six games of the 2006 season, BYU has allowed just 104 points. With an average of 17.3 points per game, the Cougars currently ranked 32nd in the country in scoring defense. BYU's current average is the lowest scoring defense mark over the first six games of a season since allowing just 17 points per game back in 1988.

TOUCHDOWNS: TAKE YOUR PICK

In the first five games of the 2006 season, BYU has scored 26 touchdowns (one against Arizona, seven against Tulsa, two against Boston College, five against Utah State, four against TCU and seven against San Diego State). All totaled, 12 different Cougars have found their way to the end zone for including Fui Vakapuna, Jonny Harline, Matt Allen, Manase Tonga, Daniel Coats, Curtis Brown, Zac Collie, John Beck, Harvey Unga, Justin Robinson, Michael Reed and Dustin Gabriel.

PLAYER AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16 vs. Boston College)
Beck completed 38-of-59 passes for a season-high 436 yards in BYU's doubleovertime 30-23 loss at Boston College. He also threw one touchdown pass and added a rushing touchdown in the game. Beck's passing yardage is his highest output since posting a Mountain West record 517 yards against TCU last season.

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 28 vs. TCU)

For the second time in three weeks--and the fifth time in his career--BYU quarterback John Beck has been named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week. The Davey O'Brien Award candidate helped lead the Cougars (3-2, 1-0) to a convincing 31-17 victory over 15th-ranked TCU on Thursday in Fort Worth, ending the Horned Frogs' nation's leading 13-game win streak.

The 6-foot-1, 216-pound senior completed 23-of-37 attempts for 312 yards and three touchdowns, avenging last season's 51-50 overtime loss to TCU in Provo. The victory also gave the Cougars' their first road victory over a ranked opponent since 1997--the same year Beck quarterbacked the Mountain View High School (Mesa, Ariz.) junior varsity squad as a sophomore.

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 7 vs. San Diego State)

For the third time in four weeks, and the sixth time in his career, BYU quarterback John Beck has been named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week after leading the Cougars (4-2, 2-0) to a 47-17 win over San Diego State

on Saturday. With his four touchdown completions, Beck broke the MWC career touchdown completions record, improving to 59 TD's throughout his career.

Beck, a 6-foot-2, 216-pound senior from Mesa, Ariz., completed 16-of-21 attempts for 267 yards and a season-high four touchdowns in under three quarters of play. The Davey O'Brien Award candidate finished the game with a career-high efficiency rating of 245.9, marking the highest rating by a BYU quarterback since Steve Sarkisian posted a 260.8 rating against Rice in 1996.

Nate Meikle - National Scholar-Athlete Semifinalist

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame has announced BYU receiver Nate Meikle has been named a candidate for the NFF 2006 National Scholar-Athlete Awards and a semifinalist for the 2006 Draddy Trophy, presented by HealthSouth.

A senior at Brigham Young University, Meikle maintains a 3.8 cumulative grade-point average. The Idaho Falls, Idaho, native will graduate in December with a degree in business. Prior to coming to BYU, Meikle graduated Summa Cum Laude from Snow College in Ephriam, Utah with a 4.0 grade-point average. Last season, Meikle received second-team Academic All-America honors by CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine.

ALL-PURPOSE BACK

Curtis Brown has been all over the field for BYU in its six games. In addition to leading the team in rushing yards, receptions and receiving yards, he has returned kickoffs for the Cougars. Brown returned a kick for 48 yards against San Diego State and currently leads BYU in kick returns.

CONSECUTIVE WINS

BYU's three consecutive victories over Utah State, TCU and San Diego State mark the first time the Cougars have won at least three in a row since last season. BYU beat Air Force Oct. 29, UNLV Nov. 5 and Wyoming Nov. 12, 2005 on the road to become bowl eligible for the first time in three years.

BYU's longest winning streak last year was three games and they won five games during a six game stretch.

The Cougars will be going for their fourth consecutive victory against UNLV. The last time BYU won four in a row was in 2001 when the Cougars swept the Mountain West Conference slate en route to a 12-2 season.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN BLOCKING

Russell Tialavea has blocked a field goal in two games this season. Tialavea extended the game in overtime against Boston College when he busted through the line and blocked the Eagles game-winning field goal attempt. Against Utah State, Tialavea was a critical factor in BYU's first shutout since 1999 as he again broke through the line to block an Aggies field goal.

UNLY CONNECTIONS

Despite the close proximity, UNLV has no players from the state of Utah on its current roster. BYU has three players on its current roster from Nevada (Aaron Attig, Cole Miyahira and Chris Warner).

BYU coaches Robert Anae and Barry Lamb each coached at UNLV. UNLV assistant Keith Uperesa played at BYU and was a graduate assistant after his playing days.

EARLY LEADS

BYU has scored first in five consecutive games. The last time a BYU opponent took an early lead was in the Cougars' opener when Arizona scored an early field goal to go ahead 3-0. All totaled, BYU has outscored its opponents 54-12 in the opening period. The Cougars have only surrendered one first quarter touchdown on the season (Boston College).







HALF TIME ADVANTAGE

BYU's 40-3 halftime lead over San Diego State extended the Cougars' streak of being ahead at half to six straight games. BYU has held a halftime advantage in every game this season. In the Cougars two losses, they held one-point halftime leads. In any game that BYU has led over a one point lead at the break, the Cougars have won.

HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. This season, BYU is averaging 44.66 points per game at home while limiting its opponents to just 13.66. The margin of difference has the Cougars beating their opponents by an average of 31 points. The 31-point differential (through three games) ranks fourth in scoring margin in the Stadium's 42-year history:

MWC START

With Saturday's 47-17 victory over San Diego State, the Cougars are off to a 2-0 start in Mountain West Conference play, marking the best league start for the Cougars since the 2001 season.

SCORING ON DEFENSE

Dustin Gabriel's 38-yard interception touchdown marked the second straight home game BYU has recorded a defensive touchdown. Justin Robinson had a 64-yard interception return against Utah State. This season marks the first time BYU has scored two defensive touchdowns since 1998.

QUARTER-BY-QUARTER SCORING ADVANTAGE

Overall, BYU has outscored its opponents 201-104. The Cougars are averaging 34 points per game in comparison to their opponents 17.3.

BYU has dominated its opponents in the first, second and fourth quarters. The Cougars have outscored their opponents 54-12 in the first quarter, 61-22 in the second quarter and 48-20 in the fourth quarter. In the third quarter, BYU's opponents have a 38-43 advantage.

UNDEFEATED AT HOME

BYU will be looking to improve its home record to a perfect 4-0 this week against UNLV. If the Cougars beat the Rebels it will mark the first home winning record since 2002 when BYU posted a 4-2 record. The Cougars recorded back-to-back 3-3 seasons in 2005 and 2004 after a 1-5 record in 2003. The last time BYU had a perfect record at home was 2001 when the Cougars went 6-0 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. LAST TIME OUT BYU 55, UNLV 14

BYU forced three interceptions and had five sacks en route to a 55-14 Mountain West victory over UNLV on Saturday. With the win, the Cougars improve to 5-4 overall and 4-2 in league play, while the Rebels fall to 2-7, 1-5 on the year.

BYU held the Rebels to a season-low two yards rushing, marking the fourth time this season the Cougars' defense has held its opponent under 100 yards rushing.

Senior Justin Maddux was credited with a team-leading 3.0 sacks for a combined loss of 22 yards. Fifth-year senior Kyle Tew and sophomore defensive back Dustin Gabriel were also credited with a sack each.

For the second straight week, the Cougars were credited with three interceptions. The three picks led to 21 of BYU's 55 points.

"We played three or four more concepts than we've shown in previous games," Mendenhall added. "We created turnovers and turned them into points. The number of points (55) was directly tied to turnovers, which was the same as last week. I think our team can play better. I'm glad we are scoring and putting up points."

Offensively, the Cougars rolled up 224 yards rushing and added 267 yards passing, marking the second straight week BYU used a balance attack to post big numbers on the scoreboard. BYU quarterback John Beck passed for 267 yards, completing 23-of-34 attempts and had three touchdown receptions. Interestingly, all three of Beck's touchdown completions went for 11 yards.

The Cougars got on the board first for the fifth straight game, scoring on Fahu Tahi's one-yard run with 6:15 remaining in the opening quarter. Tahi's run capped a sixplay, 38-yard drive that was set up after the BYU defense forced UNLV to punt from its own 4-yard line.

After holding the Rebels scoreless in the first quarter—the fifth time this season the BYU defense has posted a first-quarter shutout—the Rebels drove to the BYU five-yard line before Jarrod Jackson hooked up with tight end Greg Estandia for the five-yard touchdown reception. The 11-play, 80-yard touchdown drive tied the score at 7-7 with 12:21 remaining in the second quarter.

On the following drive, the Cougars took a 10-7 lead on Jared McLaughlin's 45-yard field goal with 8:42 left in the second quarter. BYU drove to the UNLV 18-yard line after Tahi rolled down the field for a season-high 31-yard gain. Manase Tonga added a five-yard run on the following play; however, a holding penalty and a UNLV sack forced the Cougars into a fourth-and-14 situation from the Rebels' 35-yard line.

On the following drive, Justin Leuttgerodt picked off Jackson at the BYU 48-yard line--his second pick in as many weeks--and returned it 28 yards to the UNLV 24-yard line. The Rebels forced BYU to kick a 38-yard field goal; however, a UNLV personal foul gave the Cougars a first down on the 11-yard line. On the next play, Beck went over the top to Todd Watkins for the 11-yard touchdown pass, giving the Cougars a 17-7 lead with 6:17 remaining in the second quarter. The play marked Watkins' team-leading seventh touchdown reception of the season.

Kayle Buchanan stopped UNLV's next drive with his first-career interception. Six plays later, the Cougars took a 24-7 lead with 3:22 left in the half on Curtis Browns' one-yard run--his 10th rushing touchdown of the season.

The Cougars will look to pick up their sixth win next weekend at Wyoming. The Cowboys have lost four straight, including a loss at Utah on Saturday.




