#### PLAYING FOR AN OUTRIGHT MWC CHAMPIONSHIP

With BYU's convincing 55-7 win over second place Wyoming, the Cougars now have an opportunity to win their first outright Mountain West Conference championship since 2001. With a victory over New Mexico BYU will clinch the MWC crown as no other MWC team has one loss. The Cougars maintain a two game lead over second place Utah heading into this week's action.

#### **LAST WEEK RECAP**

No. 25 BYU (8-2, 6-0) guaranteed itself at least a share of the Mountain West Conference title, and its senior quarterback guaranteed his place in BYU history, as the Cougars kept their MWC-undefeated season alive with a 55-7 win over Wyoming (5-5, 4-2). A win against either of BYU's final two opponents (New Mexico on Nov. 18 or Utah on Nov. 25) will give the team its first outright conference title since 2001.

John Beck surpassed former Cougar-great Jim McMahon in both career passing and career total offense Thursday night with a 20-26, 313-yard performance. The highly acclaimed quarterback threw for two touchdowns and rushed for two more. Beck now has 9,805 career passing yards and 9,810 career yards of total offense, marking him as BYU's second most prolific in both categories.

#### **SERIES INFORMATION**



Even though the Cougars own a commanding 40-14-1 all-time record against New Mexico, BYU has not beat the Lobos in Provo since 2000, which was LaVell Edwards final home game as head coach and the day the stadium was officially renamed. Since 2000, BYU has won three consecutive games in Albuquerque while losing two consecutive games in Provo. Overall, BYU holds a 20-5 all time record against New Mexico in Provo. The two teams first

met in 1951 in New Mexico with the lobos winning the game 34-0. Prior to the Cougars loss to the Lobos in 2002, the two teams had played every year between 1974 and 2001 (28 games) with BYU winning 26. BYU won every matchup between 1980 and 1997 (18 consecutive games).

#### **IN THE TOP-25**

Following a 48-point victory over Wyoming on Thursday, BYU has cracked the BCS Standings for the first time since December 3, 2001. In addition, the Cougars moved up two spots to No. 23 in the Associated Press poll, and appeared in the top-25 in both the USA Today/Coaches Poll and the Harris Interactive Poll. BYU, which owns the nation's sixth longest win streak at seven games, ranks 25th in the BCS Standings and 24th in both the Coaches Poll and the Harris Interactive Poll.

The Cougars' No. 23 ranking in the AP Poll is the highest ranking in any poll since being ranked 19th in the December 9, 2001 Associated Press poll. This week also marks the first time BYU has been ranked in the Coaches Poll since September 8, 2002 -- a week before losing to Nevada, 31-28. It is the first time BYU has ever been ranked in the newly created Harris Interactive Poll, which, along with the Coaches Poll, is used in the calculation formula to determine the BCS Standings.

Since the 2000 season, with a few modifications along the way, the BCS Standings have been compiled using components of the USA Today/Coaches Poll, The Harris Interactive Poll and an average of six computer rankings.

The Cougars have been ranked a total of 219 different weeks since the 1974 season, including this week's ranking in the top-25. Following BYU's 55-7 win over Wyoming, the Cougars own a 132-41 (.763) record when playing as a ranked team. On Saturday, BYU will play host to New Mexico on Saturday, Nov. 18. The Cougars are 12-1 against New Mexico when playing as a ranked team.

BYU received its first-ever national ranking on Nov. 25, 1974 after beating Utah, 48-20, to improve to 7-3-1 on the season. The Cougars were ranked No. 20 in the AP Poll and No. 18 in the now-defunct UPI Poll. Prior to entering the Associated Press Top-25 last week, it had been 4 years, 10 months and one day since BYU was last ranked in the AP Top-25 poll -- the longest un-ranked drought since before BYU was first ranked in 1974.

#### **COUGARS ON NATIONAL TELEVISION**

All totaled, the Cougars have a total of six nationally televised games. BYU has played on TBS (Arizona), ESPN2 (Boston College), VERSUS (TCU and Air Force) and CSTV. Interstingly, BYU played in the first nationally televised games on ESPN (1985), TBS (1982) and VERSUS (2006). All three have been victories.

#### THE RANKED TEAMS

BYU's 31-17 victory over TCU was the first against a ranked opponent since beating No. 23 Colorado State, 34-13, on Sept. 16, 1999. Previous to the victory over TCU, the Cougars were 0-12 against ranked opponents, including a record of 0-3 at Edwards Stadium. Interestingly, BYU's victory over TCU was the first on the road against a ranked opponent since beating Arizona State, 13-10, on Sept. 20, 1997.

#### **BOWL MOMENTUM**

BYU is coming off its 24th bowl appearance. In seasons following a trip to a bowl game, the Cougars have recorded a combined record of 202-82-2 (.709). Of the 23 seasons following a bowl game, the Cougars have averaged nearly nine (8.8) wins per season. BYU has had only one losing season following a trip to a bowl game. (In 2002, BYU went 5-7 after playing in the Liberty Bowl in 2001.)

#### "FAN"TASTIC FANS

Nearly 350,000 fans attended six different home games at Edwards Stadium during the 2005 season, averaging 58,204 fans per game. BYU finished ranked seventh overall in the west behind USC (90,812), Washington (64,326), UCLA (64,218), Arizona State (61,157), California (60,377) and Oregon (58,434). Since the inception of the BCS, BYU has annually been the top school in average attendance for teams from conferences that do not receive automatic BCS bowl bids. BYU, which boasts the largest on-campus home stadium in the Mountain West Conference, has led the MWC in home attendance in all seven years of the league's existence. In fact, Edwards Stadium has been the site of the league's all-time top-seven crowds.

#### **EDWARDS STADIUM**

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 64,000-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats. In 1982, 1988 and 1997, the Football Writers Association of America cited BYU for its "outstanding pressbox working area."

#### **EVERY FIVE YEARS...**

BYU is on a five-year cycle of fielding top-10 teams. Five years ago, the Cougars started the 2001 campaign 12-0 in Gary Crowton's first season. The BYU squad averaged 44.1 points per game and was ranked as high as eight going into the Hawai'i game.

Five years prior, the 1996 Cougars team, led by quarterback Steve Sarkisian went 14-1. BYU set NCAA records for wins (14) and games played (15) in a season. The Cougars 14-1 record ended in a WAC Championship and a Cotton Bowl victory over Kansas State. After BYU's Cotton Bowl victory, the Cougars finished the season ranked No. 5.

#### FINALLY...

McKay Jacobson's 77-yard punt return for a touchdown was the first punt return for a touchdown in 113 games for the Cougars. The last Cougar to return a punt for a touchdown was Jaron Dabney on Oct. 18, 1997 in BYU's 17-3 victory over Hawaii. Jacobson was 10 years old when BYU last returned a punt for a touchdown. More impressively, it was Jacobson's first-ever punt return.

BYU came up two yards shy of its first kickoff return for a touchdown in 101 games. The Cougars' Nate Meikle returned the opening kickoff 84 yards, getting knocked out of bounds at the two-yard line. Non-broadcast replay angles appeared to show that Meikle's return should have been a touchdown.

#### **YOUNG GUN**

While Mendenhall has 16 years of assistant coaching experience, he is now in his second year as a head coach for the first time in his career. Despite his extensive experience, he is the eighth youngest coach in NCAA Division I-A football at the age of 40.

#### **BRONCO MENDENHALL**



Bronco Mendenhall enters his second season as the head football coach at Brigham Young University. In his first year at the helm, he guided the Cougars to their first winning season and first bowl appearance since 2001. BYU finished the 2005 regular season at 6-5 and lost to California, 35-28, in the Las Vegas Bowl.

During the 2005 season, the Cougars finished second in the Mountain West Conference with a 5-3 record. Mendenhall and his staff coached an offense reminiscent of BYU's glory

days, ranking second in the MWC in scoring and sixth in the nation in passing. This season, Mendenhall will lead the Cougars against non-conference opponents Arizona, Tulsa, Boston College and Utah State, as well as a competitive conference schedule.

After 16 seasons as an assistant coach, including the past two years as the defensive coordinator for the Cougars, Bronco Mendenhall was promoted to head football coach at Brigham Young University on December 13, 2004. Mendenhall becomes the 14th head coach since the University first officially recognized football as an intercollegiate sport in 1922.

Mendenhall (40)—one of the youngest NCAA Division I-A head coaches in the country—has served the past two seasons as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach for the Cougars. During his first season in Provo, Mendenhall engineered the nation's 14th-ranked defense, holding opponents to just 307 yards per game. Under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars ranked eighth nationally in passing defense, giving up just 176.17 yards per game.

In 2004, the Cougars ranked third in the Mountain West in rushing defense, allowing 149.3 yards per game. The Cougars also ranked second in the league, with 34 sacks for a combined loss of 232 yards.

A native of Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1989 at his alma mater, Oregon State. After earning his master's degree in 1990, he moved to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he served as the secondary coach and defensive coordinator from 1991-92 under current BYU assistant coach Paul Tidwell. Following two seasons with the Badgers, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Northern Arizona, where the Lumberjacks boasted the top-ranked defense in the Big Sky Conference. He was elevated to co-defensive coordinator for the 1994 season.

In 1995, Mendenhall returned to Oregon State to become the defensive line coach under then defensive coordinator Rocky Long. When Long left to become the defensive coordinator at UCLA, Mendenhall was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 1996 season. At just 29 years of age, Mendenhall was the youngest defensive coordinator in Pac-10 history.

In 1997, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Louisiana Tech where he helped the Bulldogs to a remarkable 9-2 record as his defensive unit was credited with 17 interceptions, allowing just 15 touchdowns on the season.

In 1998, Mendenhall moved to Albuquerque, N.M., to become the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Mexico. Over the next five seasons, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West Conference in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in both the 2000 and 2002 season, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

At New Mexico, Mendenhall played a valuable role in the development of the

1999 Mountain West Player of the Year, Consensus All-American and first-round NFL Draft pick Brian Urlacher. The ninth overall selection in the 2000 NFL Draft, Urlacher was voted the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a Pro Bowl selection. Urlacher was one of two rookies to play all 16 games, starting at middle linebacker the final 14 games to establish a team record for starts at the position by a rookie. He shattered Bears rookie records with 165 total tackles and eight sacks, making him the second Chicago first-year player to lead the team in tackles. Urlacher finished his collegiate career ranked third on New Mexico's all-time list with 442 tackles.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to the former Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple have three sons: Cutter, Breaker and Raeder.

#### PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff leads the Mountain West Conference with five members of its coaching staff who have played football in the National Football League or the old USFL. Associate Head Coach and running backs coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Robert Anae was drafted in the third round by the New Jersey Generals of the USFL. Quarterbacks coach Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49'ers in 2002 and also played with the Washington Redskins. Jeff Grimes and Steve Kaufusi also have NFL experience.

#### **DEFENSIVE NUMBERS GAME**

Prior to Spring practice, Bronco Mendenhall announced BYU would be implementing a 3-4 defensive scheme to replace the 3-3-5.

"We feel like we've assembled the best coaching staff possible," Mendenhall said. "After reviewing our defensive personnel, there are players on our team who we can design scheme elements around to make sure we get our best 11 football players on the field. We believe the coaching assignment changes are in direct alignment with the strengths of our returning defensive personnel."

While the Cougars will be going away from the 3-3-5 scheme, Mendenhall said the principles of the new scheme will not change.

"The principles are very similar to what we have already done," he said. "We will continue to emphasize pursuit and gang tackling."

#### SOMEBODY'S WATCHING YOU...

Six members of the 2006 BYU football team - John Beck, Curtis Brown, Jonny Harline, Daniel Coats, Cameron Jensen and Jake Kuresa - have been named to various "watch lists" for postseason awards.

John Beck, 6-2, 216, Quarterback: John Beck has been selected to the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award, the Johnny Unitas Award and the Sammy Baugh Award watch lists. Beck started all 12 games his junior year and threw for 3,709 yards and 27 touchdowns. He averaged an MWC-best 309.1 yards per game which was fifth nationally. Beck earned first-team All-MWC honors as a junior.

**Curtis Brown, 6-0, 203, Running Back:** Curtis Brown is the all-time leader at BYU for 100-yard rushing games (12). Brown rushed for 1,123 yards and scored a team-high 16 touchdowns last season. He needs just 759 yards rushing as a senior to break the school career rushing record. Brown was also second on the team in receptions with 53.

Daniel Coats, 6-3, 263, Tight End: Daniel Coats has been selected to the John Mackey Award watch list. He played in all 12 games for BYU as a junior. BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall said Coats' hard work in the offseason made him stand out in Fall Camp. As a freshman in 2003, Coats earned freshman All-America honors from The Sporting News.

Jake Kuresa, 6-4, 330, Offensive Line: Jake Kuresa has been named to the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award watch lists. He has started every game (35) in his three-year career. As a freshman, he played both guard and tackle and played exclusively at tackle as a sophomore and junior. Kuresa earned second team All-MWC honors as a junior. Kuresa helped anchor an offensive unit that averaged 33.0 points per game, second in the MWC, and 462.4 total yards per game, second in the MWC and 13th in the nation, including 152.3 yards rushing and 310.1 yards passing in 2005.

Cameron Jensen, 6-2, 247, Linebacker: Cameron Jensen has been named to the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award watch lists. He started 11 of 12 games in 2005 and led the team in total tackles with 84, solo tackles with 44 and assisted tackles with 40. He had four pass break-ups and six tackles for a loss.

**Jonny Harline**, 6-4, 238, Tight End: Jonny Harline (pronounced has been selected to the John Mackey Award watch list. He started every game in 2005 and led the team in receptions (63) and yards (853). He leads all returning tight ends nationally in receptions and yards.

#### **FOLLOWING A .500 SEASON**

BYU posted a 6-6 (.500) record last year. The last time BYU finished .500 on a season was LaVell Edwards' final season. In the 2000 season, the Cougars won its final two games to salvage a 6-6 record and a .500 season for their departing legendary coach. BYU followed the 2000 campaign with its memorable 2001 season where the Cougars reeled off 12 consecutive wins to start the season. BYU ended the year 12-2 and MWC Champions.

#### IT'S AUTOMATIC ... ALMOST

BYU, known traditionally for its high-octane offenses, rarely gets shutout. Until the Cougar's 3-0 loss to the University of Utah to end the 2003 season, BYU had scored in 361-consecutive games, which remains an NCAA record, dating back to the 1975 season. The Cougars started a new streak in 2004, and have scored in every game, extending their streak to 31 games. Since October 3, 1975, BYU has scored in 392 of 393 games.

#### 3,000 AND 1,000 IN THE SAME SEASON

John Beck and Curtis Brown became the first Cougar duo to pass for over 3,000 yards and rush for over 1,000 yards in the same season since 2001. The last time two players combined to reach that mark were Brandon Doman and Luke Staley in 2001. #### **CALLED TO SERVE**

There are currently 61 returned missionaries (59 percent) on the BYU fall camp roster who have served full-time, two-year missions for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in over 25 different countries around the world. All totaled members of this year's team have served missions in Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, England, France, Germany, Ghana, Hong Kong, Honduras, Italy, Japan, Nicaragua, Philippines, Portugal, Russia, Samoa, Spain, Switzerland, Taiwan, Tonga, United States and Venzuela. Members of this year's team can communicate fluently in at least 10 different languages.

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints operates more than 330 missions around the world with approximately 56,000 missionaries.

#### **PLAYERS TO WATCH...**

#### Fui Vakapuna-RB

Vakapuna had an impressive spring just three months after returning home from his church mission. The 6-0, 229-pound bruising running back rushed for 34 yards on just four carries (8.5 yards per carry). Vakapuna is a powerful runner that will compliment All-MWC performer Curtis Brown in the BYU backfield. Prior to his mission, Vakapuna played one season for the Cougars. In 2003, Vakapuna rushed for 157 yards on 30 carries, good for 5.23 yeards per carry. In addition to his punishing style of running, Vakapuna was clocked at 4.4 in the 40-yard dash while still in high school.

#### **David Nixon-LB**

Another recently returned missionary, Nixon led BYU tacklers in the annual Blue-White game. Nixon recorded four tackles and a sack for the defense. Prior to his mission in Ecuador, Nixon played one season for the Cougars in 2003. As a true freshman, Nixon played in all 12 games. He was tied for fourth on the team with 57 tackles and second in tackles for loss with 11. Nixon recorded career highs of 12 tackles and two sacks agains Colorado State.

#### McKay Jacobson-WR

Jacobson joined the Cougars for Spring practice after graduating high school in December 2005. He saw considerable time at wide receiver and as a return specialist. As a prep, Jacobson was named to the 55th annual Texas Sportswriters Association's All-State First Team while leading the state with 99 receptions for 1,631 receiving yards. Jacobson was the district champion in the 100 meter and 200 meter races as a sophomore.

#### **Bryan Kehl-LB**

Entering the 2006 season, Kehl is coming off his two most productive games at the collegiate level. In 2005, Kehl recorded a career-high nine tackles (five solo) against Utah. He followed the Utah game with a four-tackle effort in the Las Vegas Bowl against California. Kehl recorded BYU's only blocked punt of the year in the season opener against Boston College. Kehl totaled 30 tackles last season (15 solo).

#### Ben Criddle-DB

A walk-on, Criddle has shined in the early going. His physical play and sound tackling have him third on the team in total tackles. He also leads BYU in pass break ups, has two tackles for loss, one interception and leads the team with 35 solo tackles.

#### INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

In addition to English, there are 32 BYU football players that speak a second language fluently. Senior safety Aaron Gordon leads the Cougars with five languages: English, Samoan, Tongan, Italian and Hualapai. Other languages spoken by current BYU players are Spanish, Portuguese, Japanese, Chinese, Russian and German.

#### **FAMILY MEN**

There are 28 BYU players from the fall camp roster who are married. Five current players have children.

#### **VARIETY OF RECEIVERS**

All totaled, 13 different receivers have at least one reception for the Cougars this season. Curtis Brown leads all receivers in receptions (43).

#### **DEFENSIVE EFFORT**

In week two, the Cougars held Tulsa to just 303 total yards. The 303 yards is 99 fewer than Tulsa averaged in 2005 and the fewest yards Tulsa picked up since Nov. 27, 2004 when Tulsa had 284 total yards. BYU only surrendered 182 passing yards to seasoned starter Paul Smith.

Against Utah State, BYU's defense recorded its first shutout since 1999 when the Cougars beat UNLV 29-0. BYU's defense surrendered only 122 passing yards which is the fewest the Cougars have given up since 2003.

BYU's defense shut out Air Force's triple option attack in the first half and held the Falcons to just 229 yards of total offense.

Against Colorado State the Cougars rolled again, holding the Rams to just three points while allowing just 151 yards of total offense.

#### **QUARTER-BECK NOTES**

BYU senior quarterback John Beck became the Mountain West Conference career leader in passing and total offense after posting 313 yards and four touchdowns (two rushing) to lead the 25th ranked Cougars to a 55-7 victory over Wyoming and secure at least a share of the MWC Championship. Beck carved up the nation's fourth-ranked pass defense, connecting on 20-of-26 attempts for a completion percentage of 76.9. His efficiency rating of 203.4 marked the fourth time this season he has had a rating of over 200. On the season Beck has thrown 22 touchdown completions, compared to just four interceptions. His +18 touchdown-to-interception margin is the highest since Brandon Doman had a margin of +25 during the 2001 season. Following his performance against Wyoming, Beck was named the Mountain West Conference Offense Player of the Week for the fifth time this season.

#### **GOOD GRIEF, CURTIS BROWN**

Against Colorado State, Curtis Brown led BYU with 92 yards on 22 carriers. Brown also caught three passes for 24 yards. Brown, who now has 2,932 career rushing yards, narrowed the gap between him and career rushing leader Jamal Willis (2,970) to 38 yards.

#### CAN'T MOVE THESE GUYS...OFF THE FIELD

BYU's Jake Kuresa and Dallas Reynolds have started or played significantly in every game that they have dressed in their respective careers. Kuresa, a senior, has played all three offensive line positions this year. He has started in 44 of 45 games but has played in all 45 games. Reynolds, who plays left tackle, is in his sophomore season and has started 22 consecutive contests.

#### **SCORING DEFENSE**

In the first 10 games of the 2006 season, BYU has allowed just 135 points. With an average of 13.5 points per game, the Cougars currently ranked ninth in the country in scoring defense. BYU's current average is less than half (27.5 points per game) of what it averaged last season through 10 games. BYU's current average is the lowest scoring defense mark over the first 10 games of a season since allowing just 12.1 points per game back in 1985.

#### **TOUCHDOWNS: TAKE YOUR PICK**

In the first 10 games of the 2006 season, BYU has scored 40 touchdowns (one against Arizona, seven against Tulsa, two against Boston College, five against Utah State, four against TCU, seven against San Diego State, seven against UNLV, four against Air Force, three against Colorado State and seven against Wyoming). All totaled, 14 different Cougars have found their way to the end zone for including Fui Vakapuna, Jonny Harline, Matt Allen, Manase Tonga, Daniel Coats, Curtis Brown, Zac Collie, John Beck, Harvey Unga, Justin Robinson, Michael Reed, Dustin Gabriel, McKay Jacobson and Mike Hague.

#### PLAYER AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16 vs. Boston College)
Beck completed 38-of-59 passes for a season-high 436 yards in BYU's doubleovertime 30-23 loss at Boston College. He also threw one touchdown pass and added a rushing touchdown in the game. Beck's passing yardage is his highest output since posting a Mountain West record 517 yards against TCU last season.

#### John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 28 vs. TCU)

For the second time in three weeks—and the fifth time in his career—BYU quarterback John Beck has been named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week. The Davey O'Brien Award candidate helped lead the Cougars (3-2, 1-0) to a convincing 31-17 victory over 15th-ranked TCU on Thursday in Fort Worth, ending the Horned Frogs' nation's leading 13-game win streak.

The 6-foot-1, 216-pound senior completed 23-of-37 attempts for 312 yards and three touchdowns, avenging last season's 51-50 overtime loss to TCU in Provo. The victory also gave the Cougars' their first road victory over a ranked opponent since 1997--the same year Beck quarterbacked the Mountain View High School (Mesa, Ariz.) junior varsity squad as a sophomore.

#### John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 7 vs. San Diego State)

For the third time in four weeks, and the sixth time in his career, BYU quarterback John Beck has been named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week after leading the Cougars (4-2, 2-0) to a 47-17 win over San Diego State on Saturday. With his four touchdown completions, Beck broke the MWC career touchdown completions record, improving to 59 TD's throughout his career.

Beck, a 6-foot-2, 216-pound senior from Mesa, Ariz., completed 16-of-21 attempts for 267 yards and a season-high four touchdowns in under three quarters of play. The Davey O'Brien Award candidate finished the game with a career-high efficiency rating of 245.9, marking the highest rating by a BYU quarterback since Steve Sarkisian posted a 260.8 rating against Rice in 1996.

#### Nate Meikle - National Scholar-Athlete Semifinalist

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame has announced BYU receiver Nate Meikle has been named a candidate for the NFF 2006 National Scholar-Athlete Awards and a semifinalist for the 2006 Draddy Trophy, presented by HealthSouth.

A senior at Brigham Young University, Meikle maintains a 3.8 cumulative grade-point average. The Idaho Falls, Idaho, native will graduate in December with a degree in business. Prior to coming to BYU, Meikle graduated Summa Cum Laude from Snow College in Ephriam, Utah with a 4.0 grade-point average. Last season, Meikle received second-team Academic All-America honors by CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine.

#### John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 7 vs. San Diego State)

Beck led BYU to a 33-14 victory at Air Force, completing 23-of-31 pass attempts for 258 yards and three touchdowns. Beck posted a completion percentage of 74 percent en route to his fifth three-touchdown performance of the season, including his fourth straight game with three or more touchdown completions. BYU had a total of eight drives during the game. The Beck-led offense engineered points in six of the eight drives, including a 14-play, 81-yard drive to mark the fourth straight game BYU has scored on the opening drive.

#### Cameron Jensen - MWC Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 4 vs. CSU)

Senior linebacker Cameron Jensen led BYU with nine tackles (seven solo), including a season-high two sacks for 15 yards, in the 24-3 win at Colorado State. The Jensen-led defense held Colorado State to just 151 yards of total offense, including just 26 yards rushing. Jensen's first sack came with Colorado State facing a third-and-two from its own 17 yard line. Jensen sacked Caleb Hanie for a 10-yard loss, forcing the Rams to punt from their own seven. His second sack of the night was a five-yard takedown of Hanie on a second-and-10 at the CSU 35 yard line.

#### John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Nov. 9 vs. Wyoming)

Beck had a completion percentage of 76.9, connecting on 20-of-26 attempts for 313 yards in BYU's 55-7 victory over Wyoming. Beck also had two touchdown







completions and two rushing touchdowns to help the Cougars secure at least a share of the MWC title. Beck became the Mountain West Conference all-time passing leader with 9,807 yards, surpassing the 9,684 yards by Casey Bramlet during his career at Wyoming (2000-03).

#### **HOME FIELD DOMINANCE**

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. This season, BYU is averaging 48.2 points per game at home while limiting its opponents to just 11. The margin of difference has the Cougars beating their opponents by an average of 37.2 points. The 37.2-point differential (through five games) ranks first in scoring margin in the Stadium's 42-year history:

#### **UNDEFEATED AT HOME**

#### **ALL-PURPOSE BACK**

Curtis Brown has been all over the field for BYU in its 10 games. In addition to leading the team in rushing yards and receptions, he has returned kickoffs for the Cougars. Brown returned a kick for 48 yards against San Diego State.

#### **POINTS OFF TURNOVERS**

Not only is BYU leading the nation in turnover margin (+13 total and +1.30 turnovers per game), the Cougars are taking advantage of their turnovers. BYU has scored a total of 69 points off 22 turnovers. The Cougars are averaging 69 points off turnovers per game. BYU was held without points off turnovers in only two games (Boston College and Colorado State). The game the Cougars scored the most off turnovers was UNLV when BYU scored 24 points off six turnovers.

#### **CONSECUTIVE WINS**

BYU's seven consecutive victories over Utah State, TCU, San Diego State, UNLV, Air Force, Colorado State and Wyoming mark the first time the Cougars have won at least seven in a row since 2001.

BYU's longest winning streak last year was three games and the Cougars won five games during a six game stretch. In 2001, BYU won 12 consecutive games on its way to a perfect 8-0 MWC record and 12-2 season.

#### TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's offensive line checks in at an average 6-foot-4, 316.8 pounds. The Cougars' front line will be going up against a New Mexico defensive front that averages 6-foot-2, 250 pounds. (Advantage: BYU +66.8 pounds per man.) BYU's defensive line weighs in at 6-foot-3, 280 pounds, New Mexico's offensive line averages over 6-foot-3, 316.4 pounds. (Advantage: New Mexico +36.4 pounds per man.)

#### **DEFENSIVE LINEMAN BLOCKING**

Russell Tialavea has blocked a field goal in two games this season. Tialavea extended the game in overtime against Boston College when he busted through the line and blocked the Eagles game-winning field goal attempt. Against Utah State, Tialavea was a critical factor in BYU's first shutout since 1999 as he again broke through the line to block an Aggies field goal.

#### FIRST HALF DOMINANCE

BYU led Wyoming 31-0 at halftime, marking the 10th straight game this season the Cougars have had the lead at halftime. On the season, BYU is outscoring its opponents 192-44 in the first-half of play. The Cougars are averaging 19.2 points per game in the first half and holding opponents to just 4.4 points over the first two quarters.

#### **QUICK STARTERS**

BYU held a 21-0 first-quarter lead over Wyoming, marking the 10th straight game this season the Cougars have led after the first quarter of play. On the season, BYU has held its opponents scoreless in the opening quarter in seven different games. Overall, the Cougars are outscoring opponents 110-12 in the opening quarter of play. BYU has allowed just one first-quarter touchdown all season (at Boston College). The Cougars tallied 140 yards against Wyoming while the BYU defense held the Pokes to just 43 total yards in the opening quarter. BYU quarterback John Beck was 6-for-8 for 123 yards and two touchdowns in the first quarter.

#### **SCORING ON DEFENSE**

Dustin Gabriel's 38-yard interception touchdown against San Diego State marked the second home game BYU has recorded a defensive touchdown. Justin Robinson had a 64-yard interception return against Utah State. This season marks the first time BYU has scored two defensive touchdowns since 1998.

#### **BALL SECURITY**

BYU is currently leading the nation in turnover margin. The Cougars are coming off a game against Wyoming where they had two interceptions.

In addition to holding on to the ball, the Cougars have found a way to force 22 turnovers. The Cougars have a +1.30 (per game) turnover margin heading into this week's action.

#### **RECORD WATCH**

Against Wyoming, when BYU quarterback John Beck found Michael Reed for a 36-yard completion with eight minutes remaining in the first quarter, he became BYU's second all-time leading passer, moving past Jim McMahon (9,536). Beck finished the night with 313 yards passing. Beck also moved into second place in total offense after a 13-yard completion to Jonny Harline in the third quarter. Beck passed Jim McMahon, who had 9,723 yards of total offense.

Curtis Brown will be chasing down a BYU record against New Mexico. Brown has rushed for 2,932 yards in his career. Brown needs just 39 rushing yards to move into first place for all-time rushing yards at BYU.

#### **MILESTONES**

Both John Beck and Curtis Brown, who will both leave BYU with their names all over the BYU record books, have a chance to hit some milestones against New Mexico. Brown needs just 68 rushing yards to become the first running back in BYU history to rush for 3,000 yards in his career.

Beck needs just 193 passing yards to be the second BYU quarterback to reach 10,000 for his career. Also, Beck needs just 190 total yards to eclipse the 10,000-yard mark in total yardage.

#### **LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY**

BYU has now won 21 league championships, dating back to its first league title in 1974. BYU won a total of 10 straight conference championships from 1976-1985. Since the 1974 championship season, the Cougars have won 13 outright league titles. All totaled, BYU has recorded five seasons with a perfect league record (1979, 1983, 1984, 1996, 2001.)

#### **SCORING EARLY**

When Curtis Brown bulled into the end zone from the one-yard line early in the first quarter against Wyoming, it marked the eighth consecutive game BYU scored first. Brown's touchdown was scored with 13:03 remaining in the first quarter, marking the second fastest time the Cougars have got on the board this season. (BYU scored with 13:19 remaining against San Diego State earlier this season.) The only game in which BYU did not score first was in the Cougars season opener at Arizona. The Wildcats jumped to a 3-0 lead in that game.

#### **FINISHING THE SEASON**

When BYU plays host to New Mexico in its final home game of the season and second to last game, the Cougars will be trying to reverse the trend of the last few season. Over the past five years, BYU has lost its final two games. The last time the Cougars won either of their final two games was in 2000 when BYU beat New Mexico at home and Utah on the road. BYU's final two opponents this season are New Mexico at home and Utah on the road. Since 2001, the Cougars final two games have been losses, making BYU 0-10 in its final two games:

#### LAST TIME OUT BYU 27, NEW MEXICO 24

The Cougars proved to be homecoming spoilers on Saturday, and gave BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall his first Division I-A victory, scoring 14 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to claim a 27-24 come-from-behind victory over New Mexico.

"I asked the players to take it one play at a time," Mendenhall said. "Knowing it wasn't going to be easy, knowing New Mexico is a good football team, knowing that they have a rich tradition that Coach Long has established; we just asked our team to play four quarters as hard as they could, and they did and I'm proud of them."

Leading 24-19 with 2:48 remaining in the game, it appeared New Mexico would claim its first victory at University Stadium over the Cougars since 1997. With under three minutes remaining in the game, junior quarterback John Beck led the Cougars on a five-play, 80-yard drive that ended with the Cougars taking a three-point lead.

After Beck completed a 14-yard pass to running back Curtis Brown for a first down, he hooked up with sophomore receiver Matt Allen for a 23-yard, game-winning touchdown with just 1:40 remaining in the game.

A tough defensive stand forced the Lobos to turn the ball over on downs with 45 seconds remaining, sealing the Cougars' first Mountain West victory of the season. With the win, BYU improves to 2-3 on the season, including a 1-2 league record, while New Mexico falls to 3-3 overall and 1-2 in MWC action.

"I think they had a sense the game was in doubt, but I didn't see any panic until the last drive," UNM head coach Rocky Long said. "I saw a lot of panic on the last (BYU) drive. I told them I knew they were disappointed and I thought we did a lousy job of coaching. When they disintegrate at the end of the game, it's not their fault, it's the coaches' fault."

Beck finished the night with a game-high 371 yards passing, completing 34-of-44 attempts (.773) with three touchdowns on the evening. Beck's performance marks his third 300-yard game of the season—the seventh of his career.

"John Beck has proven himself in many different situations," Mendenhall said. "He was prepared well by the offensive coaching staff. He executed the plan when asked to in critical times and the best quarterbacks, that's what they do."

Brown had a game-high 104 yards rushing, marking the seventh time in his career he has eclipsed the 100-yard mark. Tight end Jonny Harline had a team-high 10 receptions, equaling a season-best 123 yards. Todd Watkins added six receptions for 68 yards, including a critical 29-yard reception during the Cougars' game-winning drive. Brown totaled five catches for 35 yards. All totaled 11 receivers were credited with at least one reception against the Lobos.

The defense, led by linebackers Cameron Jensen and Paul Walkenhorst held the Lobos scoreless in the fourth quarter, limiting UNM to just 66 total yards in the final period. Jensen and Walkenhorst finished the night with a combined 24 tackles, including a team-high 13 and 11 stops, respectively. Both Jensen and Walkenhorst missed last week's game at San Diego State due to injury.

Mendenhall said he was pleased with the team's effort down the stretch, and was impressed by their focus and determination.

"As we talked at halftime, I sensed that they could win this game," he said. "I sensed that they believed. I think they were determined to make it happen and they did. That is to their credit. That shows maybe the true nature of this team is starting to come out.

"I think it's who they are. I'm fortunate to be the coach of this football team. To have young men with this kind of character, we've been through a lot already and they've been resilient. They overcame adversity to the end and continued to believe in themselves and their coaches. I am proud of them and their performance this evening."
