BLUE/RED BOWL

After winning the outright Mountain West Conference championship and receiving an invitation to the Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Bowl, No. 21 BYU will finish the season in Salt Lake City in its annual rivalry game against Utah. The Cougars will be looking for their first undefeated MWC season since 2001, which is also the last year BYU beat Utah.

LAST WEEK RECAP

No. 23 BYU (9-2, 7-0) completed its season-long, home-field dominance the best way it possibly could--a 42-17 victory over New Mexico (5-6, 3-4) to clinch the outright 2006 Mountain West Conference championship. Not only did the win give the Cougars its 22nd overall conference championship, it marked BYU's first undefeated home season since 2001.

"I just want to say one thing to the fans who have stuck with us through the hard times," BYU quarterback John Beck said during the MWC championship trophy ceremony that followed the game, "It feels good doesn't it? It feels great to be the conference champs."

SERIES INFORMATION



The BYU vs. Utah rivalry has become one of the most-heated and mostanticipated matchups in the nation. The Utes and the Cougars have met 81 times since 1922. Utah dominated the rivalry until 1965 when the Cougars began to hold the advantage over the Utes. Sice 1965, BYU is 26-14 against the Utes. Except for 2004, the last seven meetings in this rivalry have been decided by seven points or less including two last-minute comebacks by BYU

in 2000 and 2001.

"I think people from the South and from he Midwest ought to see this. This is a big-time football rivalry," said current ESPN college football analyst and former Alabama coach Bill Curry.

IN THE TOP-25

Following a decisive 42-17 victory on Saturday over New Mexico, clinching the outright Mountain West Conference Championship, BYU climbed to No. 21 in the Associated Press top-25 poll and No. 23 in the USA Today/Coaches Poll. The Cougars also moved up to No. 21 in the Harris Interactive poll and now sit at No. 23 in this week's BCS rankings.

The Cougars racked up a season-high 653 yards of total offense against the Lobos, handing New Mexico its worst loss since December 24, 2003. BYU quarterback John Beck threw for 464 yards and four touchdowns, passing the 10,000-yard mark for his career. By halftime, the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and Davey O'Brien Award candidate had compiled 303 yards passing and three touchdowns. Senior running back Curtis Brown ran for 124 yards, including a 49-yard touchdown run to become BYU's all-time rushing leader.

"They're a very good football team," New Mexico head coach Rocky Long said. "I've been lucky enough to be around some good football teams, and to play against some good football teams. It's



too bad (BYU) had struggles the first part of the season, where they didn't make field goals, because they're as good as any team in the top-10. I promise you, they are."

Following BYU's victory over New Mexico, Mendenhall accepted an invitation to participate in the 15th annual Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Bowl. The Cougars will face an opponent from the Pac-10.

"We're excited to be returning to the Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Bowl--this time, as conference champions, not as the second-place team," he said. "We're excited to represent our great University and the Mountain West Conference. But, we still have one more game to play before we start thinking about a bowl game. As we have done all season, our focus will be on our next opponent."

Riding an eight-game win streak--the fourth longest in the nation--the Cougars head to Salt Lake on Saturday, Nov. 25 to take on in-state rival Utah in the regular-season finale for both teams. Entering the game nationally ranked, the Cougars own a 13-4 record against the Utes. Overall, BYU is 133-41 (.764) when playing as a ranked team.

COUGARS ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

All totaled, the Cougars have a total of six nationally televised games. BYU has played on TBS (Arizona), ESPN2 (Boston College), VERSUS (TCU and Air Force) and CSTV. Interstingly, BYU played in the first nationally televised games on ESPN (1985), TBS (1982) and VERSUS (2006). All three have been victories.

THE RANKED TEAMS

BYU's 31-17 victory over TCU was the first against a ranked opponent since beating No. 23 Colorado State, 34-13, on Sept. 16, 1999. Previous to the victory over TCU, the Cougars were 0-12 against ranked opponents, including a record of 0-3 at Edwards Stadium. Interestingly, BYU's victory over TCU was the first on the road against a ranked opponent since beating Arizona State, 13-10, on Sept. 20, 1997.

BOWL MOMENTUM

BYU is coming off its 24th bowl appearance. In seasons following a trip to a bowl game, the Cougars have recorded a combined record of 202-82-2 (.709). Of the 23 seasons following a bowl game, the Cougars have averaged nearly nine (8.8) wins per season. BYU has had only one losing season following a trip to a bowl game. (In 2002, BYU went 5-7 after playing in the Liberty Bowl in 2001.)

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

Nearly 350,000 fans attended six different home games at Edwards Stadium during the 2005 season, averaging 58,204 fans per game. BYU finished ranked seventh overall in the west behind USC (90,812), Washington (64,326), UCLA (64,218), Arizona State (61,157), California (60,377) and Oregon (58,434). Since the inception of the BCS, BYU has annually been the top school in average attendance for teams from conferences that do not receive automatic BCS bowl bids. BYU, which boasts the largest on-campus home stadium in the Mountain West Conference, has led the MWC in home attendance in all seven years of the league's existence. In fact, Edwards Stadium has been the site of the league's all-time top-seven crowds.

EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 64,000-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats. In 1982, 1988 and 1997, the Football Writers Association of America cited BYU for its "outstanding pressbox working area."

EVERY FIVE YEARS...

BYU is on a five-year cycle of fielding top-10 teams. Five years ago, the Cougars started the 2001 campaign 12-0 in Gary Crowton's first season. The BYU squad averaged 44.1 points per game and was ranked as high as eight going into the Hawai'i game.

Five years prior, the 1996 Cougars team, led by quarterback Steve Sarkisian went 14-1. BYU set NCAA records for wins (14) and games played (15) in a season. The Cougars 14-1 record ended in a WAC Championship and a Cotton Bowl victory over Kansas State. After BYU's Cotton Bowl victory, the Cougars finished the season ranked No. 5.

FINALLY...

McKay Jacobson's 77-yard punt return for a touchdown was the first punt return for a touchdown in 113 games for the Cougars. The last Cougar to return a punt for a touchdown was Jaron Dabney on Oct. 18, 1997 in BYU's 17-3 victory over Hawaii. Jacobson was 10 years old when BYU last returned a punt for a touchdown. More impressively, it was Jacobson's first-ever punt return.

BYU came up two yards shy of its first kickoff return for a touchdown in 101 games. The Cougars' Nate Meikle returned the opening kickoff 84 yards, getting knocked out of bounds at the two-yard line. Non-broadcast replay angles appeared to show that Meikle's return should have been a touchdown.

YOUNG GUN

While Mendenhall has 16 years of assistant coaching experience, he is now in his second year as a head coach for the first time in his career. Despite his extensive experience, he is the eighth youngest coach in NCAA Division I-A football at the age of 40.

BRONCO MENDENHALL



Bronco Mendenhall enters his second season as the head football coach at Brigham Young University. In his first year at the helm, he guided the Cougars to their first winning season and first bowl appearance since 2001. BYU finished the 2005 regular season at 6-5 and lost to California, 35-28, in the Las Vegas Bowl.

During the 2005 season, the Cougars finished second in the Mountain West Conference with a 5-3 record. Mendenhall and his staff coached an offense reminiscent of BYU's glory

days, ranking second in the MWC in scoring and sixth in the nation in passing. This season, Mendenhall will lead the Cougars against non-conference opponents Arizona, Tulsa, Boston College and Utah State, as well as a competitive conference schedule.

After 16 seasons as an assistant coach, including the past two years as the defensive coordinator for the Cougars, Bronco Mendenhall was promoted to head football coach at Brigham Young University on December 13, 2004. Mendenhall becomes the 14th head coach since the University first officially recognized football as an intercollegiate sport in 1922.

Mendenhall (40)--one of the youngest NCAA Division I-A head coaches in the country--has served the past two seasons as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach for the Cougars. During his first season in Provo, Mendenhall engineered the nation's 14th-ranked defense, holding opponents to just 307 yards per game. Under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars ranked eighth nationally in passing defense, giving up just 176.17 yards per game.

In 2004, the Cougars ranked third in the Mountain West in rushing defense, allowing 149.3 yards per game. The Cougars also ranked second in the league, with 34 sacks for a combined loss of 232 yards.

A native of Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1989 at his alma mater, Oregon State. After earning his master's degree in 1990, he moved to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he served as the secondary coach and defensive coordinator from 1991-92 under current BYU assistant coach Paul Tidwell. Following two seasons with the Badgers, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Northern Arizona, where the Lumberjacks boasted the top-ranked defense in the Big Sky Conference. He was elevated to co-defensive coordinator for the 1994 season.

In 1995, Mendenhall returned to Oregon State to become the defensive line coach under then defensive coordinator Rocky Long. When Long left to become the defensive coordinator at UCLA, Mendenhall was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 1996 season. At just 29 years of age, Mendenhall was the youngest defensive coordinator in Pac-10 history.

In 1997, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Louisiana Tech where he helped the Bulldogs to a remarkable 9-2 record as his defensive unit was credited with 17 interceptions, allowing just 15 touchdowns on the season.

In 1998, Mendenhall moved to Albuquerque, N.M., to become the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Mexico. Over the next five seasons, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West Conference in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in both the 2000 and 2002 season, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

At New Mexico, Mendenhall played a valuable role in the development of the

1999 Mountain West Player of the Year, Consensus All-American and first-round NFL Draft pick Brian Urlacher. The ninth overall selection in the 2000 NFL Draft, Urlacher was voted the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a Pro Bowl selection. Urlacher was one of two rookies to play all 16 games, starting at middle linebacker the final 14 games to establish a team record for starts at the position by a rookie. He shattered Bears rookie records with 165 total tackles and eight sacks, making him the second Chicago first-year player to lead the team in tackles. Urlacher finished his collegiate career ranked third on New Mexico's all-time list with 442 tackles.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to the former Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple have three sons: Cutter, Breaker and Raeder.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff leads the Mountain West Conference with five members of its coaching staff who have played football in the National Football League or the old USFL. Associate Head Coach and running backs coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Robert Anae was drafted in the third round by the New Jersey Generals of the USFL. Quarterbacks coach Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49'ers in 2002 and also played with the Washington Redskins. Jeff Grimes and Steve Kaufusi also have NFL experience.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS GAME

Prior to Spring practice, Bronco Mendenhall announced BYU would be implementing a 3-4 defensive scheme to replace the 3-3-5.

"We feel like we've assembled the best coaching staff possible," Mendenhall said. "After reviewing our defensive personnel, there are players on our team who we can design scheme elements around to make sure we get our best 11 football players on the field. We believe the coaching assignment changes are in direct alignment with the strengths of our returning defensive personnel."

While the Cougars will be going away from the 3-3-5 scheme, Mendenhall said the principles of the new scheme will not change.

"The principles are very similar to what we have already done," he said. "We will continue to emphasize pursuit and gang tackling."

SOMEBODY'S WATCHING YOU...

Six members of the 2006 BYU football team - John Beck, Curtis Brown, Jonny Harline, Daniel Coats, Cameron Jensen and Jake Kuresa - have been named to various "watch lists" for postseason awards.

John Beck, 6-2, 216, Quarterback: John Beck has been selected to the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award, the Johnny Unitas Award and the Sammy Baugh Award watch lists. Beck started all 12 games his junior year and threw for 3,709 yards and 27 touchdowns. He averaged an MWC-best 309.1 yards per game which was fifth nationally. Beck earned first-team All-MWC honors as a junior.

Curtis Brown, 6-0, 203, Running Back: Curtis Brown is the all-time leader at BYU for 100-yard rushing games (12). Brown rushed for 1,123 yards and scored a team-high 16 touchdowns last season. He needs just 759 yards rushing as a senior to break the school career rushing record. Brown was also second on the team in receptions with 53.

Daniel Coats, 6-3, 263, Tight End: Daniel Coats has been selected to the John Mackey Award watch list. He played in all 12 games for BYU as a junior. BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall said Coats' hard work in the offseason made him stand out in Fall Camp. As a freshman in 2003, Coats earned freshman All-America honors from The Sporting News.

Jake Kuresa, 6-4, 330, Offensive Line: Jake Kuresa has been named to the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award watch lists. He has started every game (35) in his threeyear career. As a freshman, he played both guard and tackle and played exclusively at tackle as a sophomore and junior. Kuresa earned second team All-MWC honors as a junior. Kuresa helped anchor an offensive unit that averaged 33.0 points per game, second in the MWC, and 462.4 total yards per game, second in the MWC and 13th in the nation, including 152.3 yards rushing and 310.1 yards passing in 2005.

Cameron Jensen, 6-2, 247, Linebacker: Cameron Jensen has been named to the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award watch lists. He started 11 of 12 games in 2005 and led the team in total tackles with 84, solo tackles with 44 and assisted tackles with 40. He had four pass break-ups and six tackles for a loss.

Jonny Harline, **6-4**, **238**, **Tight End:** Jonny Harline (pronounced has been selected to the John Mackey Award watch list. He started every game in 2005 and led the team in receptions (63) and yards (853). He leads all returning tight ends nationally in receptions and yards.

BYU, known traditionally for its high-octane offenses, rarely gets shutout. Until the Cougar's 3-0 loss to the University of Utah to end the 2003 season, BYU had scored in 361-consecutive games, which remains an NCAA record, dating back to the 1975 season. The Cougars started a new streak in 2004, and have scored in every game, extending their streak to 31 games. Since October 3, 1975, BYU has scored in 392 of 393 games.

The "Voice of the Cougars" is Greg Wrubell, now in his 6th season as play-by-play commentator. Joining Wrubell is game analyst and former BYU quarterback Marc Lyons, who enters his 26th year on the air. Former BYU receiver and kick return specialist James Dye begins his second season on the sidelines, while Jeff Austin debuts as studio host.

KSL's gameday coverage begins two hours prior to kickoff with the "Cougar Countdown Show." The "Cougar Pregame Scoreboard Show" starts the second hour of the broadcast, with the "Cougar Pregame Coach's Show" 35 minutes before kickoff, followed by the "Cougar Kickoff Show."

After the game, KSL presents the "Cougar Postgame Scoreboard Show," followed by the "Cougar Lockerroom Show," "Cougar Postgame Coach's Show," and "Cougar Call-In Show." "Cougar Replay" concludes the broadcast with a play-byplay recap of the day's biggest plays.

CAREER 300-YARD GAMES

In BYU history, 22 different Cougars have thrown for 300 yards in at least one game. All totaled, BYU quarterbacks have hit the 300-yard mark a combined 187 games. Senior John Beck has made a contribution of 13 games to that list. Beck entered his senior campaign with 11 300-yard games. He threw for 436 yards against No. 23 Boston College and 321 yards against No. 15 TCU. Beck is now in fifth place for most 300-yard games. Ty Detmer tops the list with 34. Curtis Brown picked up his 14th 100-yard rushing game of his career against New Mexico, the same game he broke he all-time school record. With 153 yards against Utah in 2005, Brown registered the 11th 100-yard rushing game of his career, the most in BYU history. He tied the record at 10 with 153 yards against Wyoming. On the season, Brown has recorded six 100-yard rushing games, including 110 yards against Eastern Illinois, 104 yards versus New Mexico, 147 yards against Colorado State, a career-high 219 yards versus Air Force and 153 yards in the Utah and Wyoming games. CALLED TO SERVE

There are currently 61 returned missionaries (59 percent) on the BYU fall camp roster who have served full-time, two-year missions for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in over 25 different countries around the world. All totaled members of this year's team have served missions in Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, England, France, Germany, Ghana, Hong Kong, Honduras, Italy, Japan, Nicaragua, Philippines, Portugal, Russia, Samoa, Spain, Switzerland, Taiwan, Tonga, United States and Venzuela. Members of this year's team can communicate fluently in at least 10 different languages.

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints operates more than 330 missions around the world with approximately 56,000 missionaries.

PLAYERS TO WATCH... Fui Vakapuna-RB

Vakapuna had an impressive spring just three months after returning home from his church mission. The 6-0, 229-pound bruising running back rushed for 34 yards on just four carries (8.5 yards per carry). Vakapuna is a powerful runner that will compliment All-MWC performer Curtis Brown in the BYU backfield. Prior to his mission, Vakapuna played one season for the Cougars. In 2003, Vakapuna rushed for 157 yards on 30 carries, good for 5.23 yeards per carry. In addition to his punishing style of running, Vakapuna was clocked at 4.4 in the 40-yard dash while still in high school.

David Nixon-LB

Another recently returned missionary, Nixon led BYU tacklers in the annual Blue-White game. Nixon recorded four tackles and a sack for the defense. Prior to his mission in Ecuador, Nixon played one season for the Cougars in 2003. As a true freshman, Nixon played in all 12 games. He was tied for fourth on the team with 57 tackles and second in tackles for loss with 11. Nixon recorded career highs of 12 tackles and two sacks agains Colorado State.

Jacobson joined the Cougars for Spring practice after graduating high school in December 2005. He saw considerable time at wide receiver and as a return specialist. As a prep, Jacobson was named to the 55th annual Texas Sportswriters Association's All-State First Team while leading the state with 99 receptions for 1,631 receiving yards. Jacobson was the district champion in the 100 meter and 200 meter races as a sophomore.

Bryan Kehl-LB

Entering the 2006 season, Kehl is coming off his two most productive games at the collegiate level. In 2005, Kehl recorded a career-high nine tackles (five solo) against Utah. He followed the Utah game with a four-tackle effort in the Las Vegas Bowl against California. Kehl recorded BYU's only blocked punt of the year in the season opener against Boston College. Kehl totaled 30 tackles last season (15 solo).

Ben Criddle-DB

A walk-on, Criddle has shined in the early going. His physical play and sound tackling have him third on the team in total tackles. He also leads BYU in pass break ups, has two tackles for loss, one interception and leads the team with 35 solo tackles.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

In addition to English, there are 32 BYU football players that speak a second language fluently. Senior safety Aaron Gordon leads the Cougars with five languages: English, Samoan, Tongan, Italian and Hualapai. Other languages spoken by current BYU players are Spanish, Portuguese, Japanese, Chinese, Russian and German.

FAMILY MEN

There are 28 BYU players from the fall camp roster who are married. Five current players have children.

VARIETY OF RECEIVERS

All totaled, 13 different receivers have at least one reception for the Cougars this season. Curtis Brown leads all receivers in receptions (51).

DEFENSIVE EFFORT

In week two, the Cougars held Tulsa to just 303 total yards. The 303 yards is 99 fewer than Tulsa averaged in 2005 and the fewest yards Tulsa picked up since Nov. 27, 2004 when Tulsa had 284 total yards. BYU only surrendered 182 passing yards to seasoned starter Paul Smith.

Against Utah State, BYU's defense recorded its first shutout since 1999 when the Cougars beat UNLV 29-0. BYU's defense surrendered only 122 passing yards which is the fewest the Cougars have given up since 2003.

BYU's defense shut out Air Force's triple option attack in the first half and held the Falcons to just 229 yards of total offense.

Against Colorado State the Cougars rolled again, holding the Rams to just three points while allowing just 151 yards of total offense.

QUARTER-BECK NOTES

BYU senior quarterback John Beck tied the Mountain West Conference singleseason and career record for most player-of-the-week honors after being selected as the league's offensive player of the week for the sixth time this season and the ninth time in his career. Beck led BYU to a 25-point, championship-clinching victory over New Mexico on Saturday, passing for a season-high 464 yards on 28-of-42 attempts. By halftime, Beck, who picked up his 20th career victory, had passed for 303 yards and three touchdowns, eclipsing the 10,000-yard mark for his career. The game marked the ninth time this season Beck had a completion percentage over 65 percent and the seventh time this year his efficiency rating has been over 160. (Beck had an efficiency rating of 181.4 against the Lobos.)

Beck helped lead the Cougars to BYU's greatest home season ever. With a perfect 6-0 record in Edwards Stadium, the Cougars averaged 47.16 points at home through six games, beating opponents by an all-time record average 35.17 points per game.

GOOD GRIEF, CURTIS BROWN

Against New Mexico, Curtis Brown's date with the BYU record books came early and in style. On Brown's second carry on the Cougars' first drive, he blew straight through the middle for a 49-yard touchdown run to become BYU's career rushing record holder. The 49-yard run was Brown's longest rush since going 64 yards for a touchdown against Utah on Nov. 19, 2005. Brown finished the night with 124 yards on 13 carries and one touchdown run. He also had five receptions for 44 yards with a touchdown reception from quarterback John Beck.

CAN'T MOVE THESE GUYS...OFF THE FIELD

BYU's Jake Kuresa and Dallas Reynolds have started or played significantly in every game that they have dressed in their respective careers. Kuresa, a senior, has played all three offensive line positions this year. He has started in 45 of 46 games but has played in all 46 games. Reynolds, who plays left tackle, is in his sophomore season and has started 23 consecutive contests.

SCORING DEFENSE

In the first 10 games of the 2006 season, BYU has allowed just 135 points. With an average of 13.5 points per game, the Cougars currently ranked ninth in the country in scoring defense. BYU's current average is less than half (27.5 points per game) of what it averaged last season through 10 games. BYU's current average is the lowest scoring defense mark over the first 10 games of a season since allowing just 12.1 points per game back in 1985.

TOUCHDOWNS: TAKE YOUR PICK

In the first 10 games of the 2006 season, BYU has scored 40 touchdowns (one against Arizona, seven against Tulsa, two against Boston College, five against Utah State, four against TCU, seven against San Diego State, seven against UNLV, four against Air Force, three against Colorado State and seven against Wyoming). All totaled, 14 different Cougars have found their way to the end zone for including Fui Vakapuna, Jonny Harline, Matt Allen, Manase Tonga, Daniel Coats, Curtis Brown, Zac Collie, John Beck, Harvey Unga, Justin Robinson, Michael Reed, Dustin Gabriel, McKay Jacobson and Mike Hague.

PLAYER AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16 vs. Boston College) Beck completed 38-of-59 passes for a season-high 436 yards in BYU's doubleovertime 30-23 loss at Boston College. He also threw one touchdown pass and added a rushing touchdown in the game. Beck's passing yardage is his highest output since posting a Mountain West record 517 yards against TCU last season.

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 28 vs. TCU)

For the second time in three weeks--and the fifth time in his career--BYU

quarterback John Beck has been named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week. The Davey O'Brien Award candidate helped lead the Cougars (3-2, 1-0) to a convincing 31-17 victory over 15th-ranked TCU on Thursday in Fort Worth, ending the Horned Frogs' nation's leading 13-game win streak.

The 6-foot-1, 216-pound senior completed 23-of-37 attempts for 312 yards and three touchdowns, avenging last season's 51-50 overtime loss to TCU in Provo. The victory also gave the Cougars' their first road victory over a ranked opponent since 1997--the same year Beck quarterbacked the Mountain View High School (Mesa, Ariz.) junior varsity squad as a sophomore.

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 7 vs. San Diego State)

For the third time in four weeks, and the sixth time in his career, BYU quarterback John Beck has been named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week after leading the Cougars (4-2, 2-0) to a 47-17 win over San Diego State on Saturday. With his four touchdown completions, Beck broke the MWC career touchdown completions record, improving to 59 TD's throughout his career.

Beck, a 6-foot-2, 216-pound senior from Mesa, Ariz., completed 16-of-21 attempts for 267 yards and a season-high four touchdowns in under three quarters of play. The Davey O'Brien Award candidate finished the game with a career-high efficiency rating of 245.9, marking the highest rating by a BYU quarterback since Steve Sarkisian posted a 260.8 rating against Rice in 1996.

Nate Meikle - National Scholar-Athlete Semifinalist

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame has announced BYU receiver Nate Meikle has been named a candidate for the NFF 2006 National Scholar-Athlete Awards and a semifinalist for the 2006 Draddy Trophy, presented by HealthSouth.

A senior at Brigham Young University, Meikle maintains a 3.8 cumulative gradepoint average. The Idaho Falls, Idaho, native will graduate in December with a degree in business. Prior to coming to BYU, Meikle graduated Summa Cum Laude from Snow College in Ephriam, Utah with a 4.0 grade-point average. Last season, Meikle received second-team Academic All-America honors by CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine.

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 7 vs. San Diego State)

Beck led BYU to a 33-14 victory at Air Force, completing 23-of-31 pass attempts for 258 yards and three touchdowns. Beck posted a completion percentage of 74 percent en route to his fifth three-touchdown performance of the season, including his fourth straight game with three or more touchdown completions. BYU had a total of eight drives during the game. The Beck-led offense engineered points in six of the eight drives, including a 14-play, 81-yard drive to mark the fourth straight game BYU has scored on the opening drive.

Cameron Jensen - MWC Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 4 vs. CSU)

Senior linebacker Cameron Jensen led BYU with nine tackles (seven solo), including a season-high two sacks for 15 yards, in the 24-3 win at Colorado State. The Jensenled defense held Colorado State to just 151 yards of total offense, including just 26 yards rushing. Jensen's first sack came with Colorado State facing a third-and-two from its own 17 yard line. Jensen sacked Caleb Hanie for a 10-yard loss, forcing the Rams to punt from their own seven. His second sack of the night was a five-yard takedown of Hanie on a second-and-10 at the CSU 35 yard line.

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Nov. 9 vs. Wyoming)

Beck had a completion percentage of 76.9, connecting on 20-of-26 attempts for 313 yards in BYU's 55-7 victory over Wyoming. Beck also had two touchdown completions and two rushing touchdowns to help the Cougars secure at least a share of the MWC title. Beck became the Mountain West Conference all-time passing leader with 9,807 yards, surpassing the 9,684 yards by Casey Bramlet during his career at Wyoming (2000-03).

John Beck - MWC Offensive Player of the Week (Nov. 18 vs. New Mexico)

Beck completed 28-of-48 passes for a season-high 464 yards and five touchdowns as BYU defeated New Mexico, 42-17, to secure its first outright Mountain West title since 2001. Beck connected on touchdown passes of 20, 71, 9 and 4 yards as the Cougars improved to 9-2 overall and 7-0 in the MWC. Beck also rushed for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to cap off the day.

After outscoring New Mexico in three of four quarters on Saturday, BYU has now outscored its opponents in 33 of 44 quarters this season, including 21 shutout quarters. ALL-PURPOSE BACK

Curtis Brown has been all over the field for BYU in its 11 games. In addition to leading the team in rushing yards and receptions, he has returned kickoffs for the Cougars. Brown returned a kick for 48 yards against San Diego State.

POINTS OFF TURNOVERS

Not only is BYU third in the nation in turnover margin (+14 total and +1.27 turnovers per game), the Cougars are taking advantage of their turnovers. BYU has scored a total of 76 points off 25 turnovers. The Cougars are averaging 6.9 points off turnovers per game. BYU was held without points off turnovers in only two games (Boston College and Colorado State). The game the Cougars scored the most off turnovers was UNLV when BYU scored 24 points off six turnovers.

CONSECUTIVE WINS

BYU's eight consecutive victories over Utah State, TCU, San Diego State, UNLV, Air Force, Colorado State, Wyoming and New Mexico mark the first time the Cougars have won at least seven in a row since 2001.

BYU's longest winning streak last year was three games and the Cougars won five games during a six game stretch. In 2001, BYU won 12 consecutive games on its way to a perfect 8-0 MWC record and 12-2 season.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN BLOCKING

Russell Tialavea has blocked a field goal in two games this season. Tialavea extended the game in overtime against Boston College when he busted through the line and blocked the Eagles game-winning field goal attempt. Against Utah State, Tialavea was a critical factor in BYU's first shutout since 1999 as he again broke through the line to block an Aggies field goal.

FIRST HALF DOMINANCE

BYU took a 28-3 halftime lead against New Mexico, making it the sixth game the Cougars have held a 21-point (or larger) advantage at half this season. BYU has enjoyed a 22.7-point advantage (average per game) at home this season and a 19.8-point advantage overall this season. The Cougars gained 419 total yards in the first half while Beck completed 15-for-26 passes for 303 yards and three touchdowns in the first half.

QUICK STARTERS

BYU held a 14-3 first-quarter lead over New Mexico, marking the 11th straight game this season the Cougars have led after the first quarter of play. On the season, BYU has held its opponents scoreless in the opening quarter in seven different games. Overall, the Cougars are outscoring opponents 124-15 in the opening quarter of play, including a 93-6 advantage at home. BYU has allowed just one first-quarter touchdown all season (at Boston College). The Cougars tallied 177 yards against New Mexico in the first half. BYU quarterback John Beck was 6-for-10 for 100 yards and one touchdown in the first quarter.

SCORING ON DEFENSE

Dustin Gabriel's 38-yard interception touchdown against San Diego State marked the second home game BYU has recorded a defensive touchdown. Justin Robinson had a 64-yard interception return against Utah State. This season marks the first time BYU has scored two defensive touchdowns since 1998.

BALL SECURITY

BYU is currently third in the nation in turnover margin. The Cougars are coming off a game against New Mexico where they had three turnovers. In addition to holding on to the ball, the Cougars have found a way to force 25 turnovers. The Cougars have a ± 1.27 (per game) turnover margin heading into this week's action.

MILESTONES

Both Beck and Brown hit personal milestones in the BYU win. In addition to breaking the career rushing record at BYU, Brown became the first BYU running back in school history to pass the 3,000 career yard mark. He finished the game with 124 yards rushing on 13 carries. Brown has now rushed for 3,056 in his career.

Beck became the second quarterback in school history to throw for 10,000 yards. He finished the game with a season-high 464 yards while completing 28-for-42 passes and four touchdowns. Beck has now thrown for 10,271 in his career. Beck's 464 yards passing are the most in his career in a victory and the second largest output of his career.

LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

BYU has now won 22 league championships, dating back to its first league title in 1965. BYU won a total of 10 straight conference championships from 1976-1985. Since the 1965 championship season, the Cougars have won 13 outright league titles. All totaled, BYU has recorded five seasons with a perfect league record (1979, 1983, 1984, 1996, 2001.)

SCORING EARLY

When Curtis Brown scampered into the end zone for a 49-yard touchdown early in the first quarter against New Mexico, it marked the ninth consecutive game. The only game in which BYU did not score first was in the Cougars season opener at Arizona. The Wildcats jumped to a 3-0 lead in that game.

VIVA LAS VEGAS

Shortly after BYU was presented with the MWC Championship trophy, Rueben Herrera, a member of the Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Executive Bowl Committee, extended the official invitation to the 15th Annual Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas Bowl. BYU athletic director Tom Holmoe officially accepted the invitation. BYU will take on an opponent from the Pac-10 on Thursday, Dec. 21 at 5 p.m. in Las Vegas.

FINISHING THE SEASON

When BYU plays Utah in its final regular season game and second to last game, the Cougars will be trying to reverse the trend of the last few season. Over the past five years, BYU has lost its final two games. The last time the Cougars won either of their final two games was in 2000 when BYU beat New Mexico at home and Utah on the road. BYU's final two opponents this season are New Mexico at home and Utah on the road. Since 2001, the Cougars final two games have been losses, making BYU 0-10 in its final two games:

SCORING DEFENSE

BYU has given up just 152 total points this season. The Cougars entered the game ninth in the nation in scoring defense. After giving up 17 points to New Mexico, 10 of which were scored by the offense, BYU is currently giving up 13.8 points per game. The Cougars currently rank ninth nationally in scoring defense.

BATTLE FOR THE BEEHIVE BOOT

First instituted in 1971, the Beehive Boot is the symbol of gridiron supremacy in the state of Utah. The idea for the rotating trophy originated with Dave Schulhess, former Sports Information Director of BYU, and was aggreed upon by SIDs from Utah, Utah State and Weber State. As the trophy would represent dominance within the confines of the Beehive State, it was decided that the trophy should be symbolic of the people Utah was built by--the Mormon pioneers.

As BYU and Utah have both beat Utah State, the annual BYU-Utah rivalry game will be for possession of the Beehive Boot. The Beehive boot lived its first four years at Utah State. BYU then began a dominant run as it ascended into the realms of football's elite, claiming the Boot 19 times in the past 30 years. Utah has won the Boot nine times. The longest streak in the history of the Beehive Boot is a five-year span from 1983 to 1987 by BYU. After a two-year stint in Provo, the Boot currently resides in Salt Lake City since the 2002 season.

PLAYING AS A RANKED TEAM AGAINST UTAH

Riding an eight-game win streak--the fourth longest in the nation--the Cougars head to Salt Lake on Saturday, Nov. 25 to take on in-state rival Utah in the regular-season finale for both teams. Entering the game nationally ranked, the Cougars own a 13-4 record against the Utes. Overall, BYU is 133-41 (.764) when playing as a ranked team.

RECORD AGAINST UTAH IN CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON

BYU clinched its 22nd conference championship last week with a 42-17 victory over New Mexico. In previous seasons that BYU won conference championships, the Cougars hold a 17-4 record in games against Utah. However, in BYU's past five conference championship seasons, the Utes have won three of the games in champion ship years.

LAST TIME OUT November 19, 2005 **UTAH 41, BYU 34 BYU vs Utah** BYU's Curtis Brown racked up 237 yards of total offense and two touchdowns as the Cougars (6-5, 5-3) fell to Utah (6-5, 4-4) by a score of 41-34 in an overtime thriller in front of 64,312 fans Saturday. In overtime, Utah scored on their second play with a 25-yard touchdown pass from Brett Ratliff to Travis LaTendresse giving them a 41-34 lead. Scoring Summary: On the Cougars' overtime possession they were unable to find the end zone and the Utes held on to pick up the victory. After being held to only three points in the first half, the Cougars made a solid comeback, outscoring the Utes 31-10 in the second half and forcing the game into overtime. Brown led BYU in rushing with 20 caries for 153 yards and two touchdowns. He also led all Cougar receivers with 84 yards on seven receptions. John Beck finished the day with 309 yards passing with 27 completions on 47 attempts and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 10 yards and caught one of his own passes, which was deflected by an official, for three yards. After last week's injury to Utah quarterback Brian Johnson, Ratliff started the game for the Utes and completed 17-of-32 passing attempts for 240 yards and four touchdowns. He also carried the ball 19 times for 112 yards and a touchdown. The Utes took an early first-quarter lead, scoring on their first two drives. The first score came on a three-yard touchdown pass from Ratliff to Brian Hernandez ending a five-play 60-yard drive with 11:51 remaining in the first quarter. The second came when Ratliff hooked up with Chad Jacobsen for a 15-yard touchdown pass to cap a nine-play, 76-yard drive to give the Utes a 14-0 lead with 5:25 left in the first quarter. BYU got on the scoreboard with 19 seconds remaining in the first quarter with a 31yard field goal by Jared McLaughlin topping an 11-play 66-yard drive. Utah added a field goal in the second quarter with 8:05 remaining with Dan Beardall kicking it in from 35 yards out ending a seven-play 48-yard drive and giving the Utes a 17-3 lead. On BYU's next possession, running back Fahu Tahi had the ball stripped by Utah's s By: Number-Yards Casey Evens and returned 30 yards to the BYU seven yard line setting up a seven yard touchdown run by Ratliff with 4:37 remaining in the second quarter giving Utah a 24-3 halftime lead. 1-minus 2 The Cougars struck first in the third quarter with a five-yard touchdown run by Brown capping an eight-play 72-yard drive with 11:37 left in the third quarter. Brown accounted for 54 of the team's 72 total yards on the drive. Brown's five yard touchdown run gave him 58 yards rushing in the game and 1,000 yards on the season, becoming the first 1,000 yard rusher for the Cougars since the 2001 season when Doak Walker Award winner Luke Staley rushed for 1,582 yards. Just 1:33 later, and after BYU force the Utes to punt on their next possession, the Cougars found the end zone again with a 64-run by Brown. The run ended a twoplay 64-yard drive and cut the Utah lead to 24-17. The run was also a career long for Brown. Despite being penalized five times for forty total yards on their next possession, Utah answered back with a 48-yard touchdown pass from Ratliff to Hernandez, their second hook up of the game. The score ended an eight-play 65-yard drive with 5:47 remaining in the third quarter and gave Utah a 31-17 lead. With six wins, BYU finished the season with a winning record for the first time since 2001 when the Cougars went 12-2.
