#### **BYU Hosts San Francisco Wednesday**

BYU (9-2) looks to extend its winning streak to eight games when it faces the University of San Francisco (4-7) Wednesday at 7 p.m. in the Marriott Center. The game is not being televised. The live radio broadcast of the men's game can be heard on KSLNewsradio 1160 with Greg Wrubell and Mark Durrant calling the action on the Cougar Sports Network. San Francisco is coming off a win over Michigan Saturday at the Pete Newell Challenge in Oakland, Calif. The Dons defeated BYU last year in San Francisco in the first meeting since 1979.

#### **Up Next**

After completing its three-game homestand Wednesday, BYU takes its fifth road trip of the year before beginning Mountain West Conference play next week at home. The Cougars travel to Malibu, Calif., to face the Pepperdine Waves Saturday at 5 p.m. PT (6 p.m. MT). The game will be televised by SportsWest Productions on KSL-TV, channel 5, in Salt Lake City and on Fox Sports West 2. After going 22-9 and winning at Wyoming in the NIT last year, the Waves are in their first year under former NBAplayer and coach Paul Westphal. Pepperdine (6-6) has already recorded wins over nationally ranked UCLAand USC while playing a tough schedule. Last week the Waves lost at No. 14 Arizona (94-71) and defeated West Virginia (97-65).

#### **Scouting San Francisco**

Coming off a win over Michigan Saturday at the Pete Newell Challenge, San Francisco travels to Provo with a 4-7 record. USF was picked to finish second behind Gonzaga in a tough West Coast Conference by the league's coaches. The WCC's Gonzaga has fared well this year with wins over St. John's, Texas and Fresno State, while Pepperdine has defeated UCLAand USC, and LMU topped Texas A&M on the road, and Portland defeated Oregon. USF has not had an easy road to its 4-7 mark. They have played a good schedule facing the likes of Seton Hall (lost 87-79), at Fresno State (lost 75-65), Xavier (lost 87-72), Pacific (lost 72-69), UC Santa Barbara (lost 69-49) and vs. Michigan (won 55-47). Other Don wins were at CS Fullerton (70-43), at Southern University (93-78) and at home vs. CSHayward (94-59). Three of the Dons' four wins have been away from home. The Dons defense was the story as USF defeated Michigan 55-47 Saturday evening at the Oakland Coliseum. The Dons held the Wolverines to just 24.6 percent shooting in the contest and just 47 points. USF was paced by Darrell Tucker who scored a team-high 14 points and added 11 rebounds for his fifth double-double of the year. He scored five straight USF points in the last 2:30 to enable the Dons to hold onto the victory. Hondre Brewer also had a big game with 8 points, 11 rebounds and five blocked shots. Tucker, who hails from nearby McClymonds High School that also gave USF Bill Russell, is playing well, scoring 17.8 points and averaging 9.6 rebounds per game. He scored his 1000th career point at Texas A&M Corpus Christi and is now 23rd on the USF career scoring list passing Mike Quick and Erwin Mueller. Tucker passed 500 career rebounds vs. Michigan Saturday. USF senior center Hondre Brewer is the WCC's all-time shot block leader. He has 217 career blocks after his five rejections vs. Michigan. The Dons are shooting 43.7 percent from the floor, 30.2 percent on threes, and 72.4 percent from the line. They average 36.4 rebounds and 70.9 points. Their field goal percentage defense is 41.4 percent. USF has two new assistant coaches this season in former USF star Billy Reid (who was a co-captain on the USF Bill Cartwright teams) and former Sonoma State aide Paul Trevor. Head coach Philip Mathews is 98-87 in his 7th season.

#### **Series Information**

BYU will face San Francisco in Provo for the first time since 1953. It will be the first meeting in the Marriott Center. The Dons lead the overall series, 4-3, having won the last four straight,including last year's 80-70 Don win in San Fransisco. The two teams had not met before last year since the 1979 NCAAtournament. The last game in Provo was in a newly constructed Smith Fieldhouse. Cougar fans were entertained as BYU pulled out a 68-61 victory against a Don team featuring basketball legends Bill Russell and K.C. Jones. Coming to Provo in 1952 and 1953, USF was the first real big-name basketball school to play in Provo, with schools like Michigan and UCLAsoon following with trips to Provo.

#### **Looking Back at Last Year's Game**

The Dons handed BYUits first loss of the year last season in the Cougars first road game. The Cougars shot only 39 percent while USFmade 51 percent, including 6-of-9 threes. Guard Ali Thomas scored 25 points, including 4-5 treys, while this year's key returners for USF Darrell Tucker added 16 pts, 9 rbs and Hondre Brewer 11 pts, 5 rbs. Of BYU players who played last year, Matt Montague had the best outing, scoring in double figures for the only time last season with 12 points, going 4-of-6, including 2-of-3 on threes, while adding six assists. Eric Nielsen played only eight minutes before fouling out with four points. Travis Hansen played 11 minutes, going 0-6 from the floor and did not score, while Daniel Bobik played 12 minutes and totaled two points. Dan Howard gave a solid effort, playing a season-high 12 minutes before fouling out with four points and one block.

PROVO, Utah (December 29, 2001) - When BYU guard Travis Hansen got an emphatic dunk directly off the opening tip Saturday, the 10,266 fans in the Marriott Center got a pretty good idea of what would follow over the next 40 minutes. BYU stormed out to an 8-0 advantage and never looked back, leading by as many as 25 points before defeating Southern Utah 79-58. The Cougars, now 9-2 on the year, extended their win streak at the Marriott Center to 27 games, the fourth-longest home court streak in the nation, and their overall win streak to seven games, the longest by a BYU team since the 1994-95 season. BYU improved to 5-0 all-time against Southern Utah, who suffered its fourth straight loss to fall to 3-8 on the year. Led by sophomore Mark Bigelow's five threes and game-high 20 points, the Cougars used hot shooting and stingy defense to stifle the Thunderbirds' game. BYU shot 60 percent from the field and 50 percent from three-point range for the game. "One thing we did well tonight was shoot the ball," BYU head coach Steve Cleveland said. "I thought we were very efficient in the second half getting the ball in the post." Freshman Jared Jensen became the primary benefactor of BYU's ball entry into the post in the second half. Jensen failed to score in the first half, but scored 14 points in the second half to tie a career high. Jensen also scored 14 points in a loss at UC Santa Barbara. Jensen wasn't the only freshman who had an influence on the game's outcome. Guards Terry Nashif and Jimmy Balderson played quality minutes off the bench, with Balderson scoring 11 points in only 13 minutes and Nashif logging a season-high 10 minutes at the point. "I thought Nashif and Balderson showed composure in coming off the bench," Cleveland said. For the second straight game, Bigelow had the hot hand for the Cougars in the first half. Just like Thursday against Cal State Northridge, Bigelow scored 17 points in the first half on his way to a game-high 20 for the night. He also finished with a game-high six rebounds. Bigelow, who leads BYU in scoring at 18.4 points per game, has now scored at least 14 points in 10 straight games. "Mark Bigelow is a guy who knows how to get the ball into the basket," Southern Utah head coach Bill Evans said. The Cougars held Southern Utah to only 21 points in the first half on 28 percent shooting, but Cleveland still thinks BYU needs to improve its defense if it wants to succeed down the road. "Southern Utah was shooting poorly in the first half, but they did get good looks," Cleveland said. "They just couldn't knock them down and that concerns me a little bit." Hansen scored 16 points to join Bigelow, Jensen and Balderson in double figures for BYU. Dan Beus led Southern Utah with 16 points while Brian Gardner and Donnie Jackson each added 10. The Thunderbirds shot 36 percent for the game.

Bigelow Leads BYUto win over Cal State Northridge

PROVO, Utah (December 27, 2001) - Coming off their huge upset over Stanford, the BYU Cougars did just enough to beat Cal State Northridge 84-70. The victory extended BYU's win streak to six games, tying the longest in head coach Steve Cleveland's tenure, and extended their home-winning streak to 26 games, a BYU record. Mark Bigelow had a game high 27 points for the Cougars. Bigelow had 17 in the first half, matching the output of the rest of the team for the first 20 minutes. But while Bigelow led the Cougars, Cleveland was not impressed with BYU's overall play. "Mark was pretty solid all night long, but we were just inconsistent," Cleveland said. "Maybe their minds were still in Las Vegas or on Christmas, but it was apparent to me that this was not the same basketball team that played nine games." BYU now has an 8-2 record, matching its start from the 1999-2000 season. In that season, the Cougars went on to start 12-2. BYU controlled the game throughout, holding a double-digit lead for most of the second half. BYU used a 10-0 run early in both halves to take commanding leads, but the Matadors kept the game close enough to keep most of BYU's starters in the game. "I credit Northridge," Cleveleand said. "Northridge came in out-manned and unde sized, but played harder than we did for a full 40 minutes. Daniel Bobik played another strong offensive game, tying his career high with 17 points. He also hit all eight of his free throw attempts to give him 20 consecutive makes from the free throw line. Freshman Jared Jensen recorded his first double-double of his collegiate career. He tied his career high of 10 rebounds and poured in 13 points to give the Cougars a great inside presence. The Cougars held the Matadors to only 24 points in the first half and took a 10-point lead into the locker room as both teams struggled from the floor. It was a different story in the next half though, as both teams lit up the scoreboard. BYU held a slight edge in the second half, 50-46. "In the second half, we just didn't guard and that was disappointing to me," Cleveland said. Eric Nielsen, who had a career-high 29 points in the win over Stanford, only scored five points while taking only seven shots. Matt Montague, playing with a broken nose, chipped in with a season-high seven rebounds, six points and four assists. "We will really have to have a good practice tomorrow to get regrouped and refocused," Cleveland said.

#### **First Half Success**

BYU has led at the half in all 10 of 11 games this season, trailing only Stanford (41-40). BYU is outscoring its opponents in the first half 326-248 (36.2 – 27.5). The Cougars have scored more points in the second half but also yield more points. BYU has outscored its opponents 432-383 in the second half (39.3 – 34.8). BYU has been outscored 15-6 in one overtime period this year.

#### **Shooting Numbers**

BYU is shooting 51 percent in its nine victories and 43.6 percent in its two losses. The Cougars are shooting about the same behind the arc (.441 in losses and .422 in wins). BYU shot 52 percent from the floor last week in its two wins. BYU shot 59.6 percent vs. Southern Utah, its second best shooting night of the season. BYU has shot 50 percent or better three times this year and is making just under 50 percent (.495) from the floor overall after 11 games.

#### From Three-Point Range

BYU made eight three pointers in the first half (season best) vs. Southern Utah and 11 for the game (tying a season high). The Cougars also had 11 three pointers against Idaho. BYU attempted a season-high 22 threes vs Southern Utah. BYU's 11 treys vs. SUU all came from four players with Mark Bigelow making five, and Travis Hansen, Daniel Bobik, and Jimmy Balderson each making two threes. On the year, seven Cougars have made a three-point shot. Mark Bigelow has made a team-high 31 threes (31-64, .484). He has made a trey in all 11 games. Daniel Bobik is 17-37 (.459) and Travis Hansen is 15-34 (.441). Bobik has also made five threes in a game, going 5-7 vs. Idaho.

#### One-Two Scoring Punch

BYU's Mark Bigelow and Travis Hansen are the Cougars one-two scoring punch. Bigelow has reached double figures in 10 of 11 games and Hansen in nine of 11. Bigelow scores 18.4 ppg and Hansen 15.0 ppg on the year.

#### Other Scoring Options

The Cougars have five players scoring at least nine points per game. After leaders Mark Bigelow (18.4) and Travis Hansen (15.0), senior Eric Nielsen averages 10.3 ppg and has scored a career-high 29 points vs. Stanford. Reserve guard Daniel Bobik is adding 9.9 ppg off the bench and has twice scored highs of 17 points. Freshman center Jared Jensen is averaging 9.0 ppg and has twice totaled a high of 14 points. He averaged 13.5 points and 7.5 rebounds last week. Freshman guard Jimmy Balderson has twice reached double figures with a high of 19 points while point guard Matt Montague has reached double digits once with 11 points at San Diego.

#### Consistency at the Line

BYU has made 80 percent or more of its free throws in six of 11 games this season, including five of the last eight. BYU is shooting 79.2 percent from the line for the year. Last year, BYU led the nation at 78 percent from the line. This year the Cougars are ranked second in the latest NCAA rankings (Nov. 17).

#### **More Free Throw Numbers**

Seven Cougars are shooting 70 percent or better from the free throw line and three are making 80 percent or better. Daniel Bobik makes a team-leading 92.9 percent (No. 1 among MWC players), followed by Mark Bigelow (.860), Jared Jensen (.818), Matt Montague (.794), Eric Nielsen (.783), Travis Hansen (.767) and Dan Howard (.750).

#### Receiving Votes

Last week BYU received votes for the first time this season in both the AP poll and the USA Today/ESPN poll. BYU received seven votes (T-36th) in this week's ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The AP poll will be released Monday. The Cougars receiving 18 points in last week's AP poll for a No. 37 ranking. BYU's win over then No. 13 Stanford was the Cougars' first win over a top-20 team since upsetting No. 15 New Mexico in The Pit in February 1998. Last year BYU lost to No. 13 USC, 70-67, at the Yahoo Sports Invitational in Laie, Hawaii, after leading by 18 at the half, 41-23. BYU played at No. 4 Arizona on Dec. 1, 1999 but lost 86-62. BYU took No. 11 Arizona to overtime in Provo on Nov. 24, 1998, before losing 78-74. BYU nearly won in regulation, but Arizona's Jason Terry hit a three-pointer to send the game to overtime.

#### **Top JC Center Signs with Cougars**

Rafael Araujo, a 6-foot-11, 260-pound center at Western Arizona, in November signed an NCAA Letter-of-Intent to play at BYU. Considered one of the top five junior-college players in the country, Araujo was recruited by North Carolina, Illinois, UNLV and San Diego State among others. A physically strong athlete with great leaping ability, Araujo runs the floor well and has range on the perimeter. "We are thrilled to have Rafael decide to join the BYU basketball program," BYU coach Steve Cleveland said. "He is a great young man that people really enjoy being around. He's got legitimate NBAcenter size and has the potential to make a significant impact on the program. He's still got some things to learn, but he has all the tools to become an outstanding player at the Division I level." Araujo is averaging 21 points and 13 rebounds this year for No. 7-ranked Western Arizona, located in Yuma. He scored a season-high 35 points in 22 minutes in the seasonopener and has totaled a season-high 17 rebounds. A native of Sao Paulo, Brazil, Araujo will enter BYU as a junior. He will enroll next fall.

#### **Coaching Staff Additions**

Former BYU player Andy Toolson and Pine View High School (St. George, Utah) coach John Wardenburg were hired as assistant coaches in May. Toolson joins Cleveland's staff after an 11year professional career in Europe and the NBA, while Wardenburg comes to BYU with 11 years of coaching experience at the high school and junior college level. Former assistant coach Nathan Call was named director of basketball operations. Associate Head Coach Dave Rose remains in that capacity. Heath Schroyer, who had served alongside Cleveland, Rose and Call the past four seasons in Provo, left to accept an assistant position at Wyoming. Brian Santiago, Cleveland's administrative assistant the past four seasons, is BYU's assistant athletic director responsible for game operations.

#### **Nielsen Earns MWC Player of the Week Award after Stanford Victory**

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (Dec. 24, 2001) - BYU senior forward Eric Nielsen was named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week Monday after leading the Cougars to an 81-76 upset of 13th-ranked Stanford Saturday at the Las Vegas Showdown. It was Nielsen's first player of the week honor of his career. Nielsen, from Freemont, Calif. (Irvington HS) scored a career-high 29 points after making 11-of-16 shots from the floor (68.8 percent), including 2-for-2 from three-point range. He was also a perfect 5-for-5 from the free throw line and grabbed six rebounds, while dishing out two assists. Nielsen's two treys marked a career best and equaled the total number of threes he's made in the past two years combined. Nielsen scored 17 points in 18 first-half minutes, keeping BYU within one at intermission, 41-40. He added 12 points in the second half and helped the Cougars outrebound Stanford, holding the Cardinal nine boards their season average. Nielsen also set career highs with the 16 field goal attempts, 11 field goals made and free throw percentage (1.000).

#### Winning Streak

BYU has won seven straight games, the first seven-game streak by a BYU team since the 1994-95 season. Coach Cleveland's teams have had six five-game streaks over the last three seasons, which they twice extended it to six games before reaching seven straight wins for the first time Saturday.

#### **Home Winning Streak**

BYU has a 27-game home court winning streak. The streak, which is a school record besting the 24 straight won between March 1994 and Jan. 1996, is the fourth-longest current streak in the nation. BYU is 7-0 this year and was a perfect 15-0 in the Marriott Center last season. BYU's last loss in the Marriott Center was on Feb. 17, 2000 when New Mexico edged the Cougars 78-74.

#### **Home Winning Streak 2**

BYU has defeated 25 straight nonconference opponents in the Marriott Center. The last non-league foe to win in Provo was the California Bears, who edged BYU 71-70 on Dec. 19, 1998. BYU has a 31-6 home record against nonconference teams under Steve Cleveland. BYU is 24-0 vs. non-MWC teams at home since the conference was founded in 1999. The Cougars are the only MWC team with an unbeaten home nonconference mark.

#### From the Training Room

Starting point guard Matt Montague broke his nose during practice on Christmas day. He has not missed any playing time. Reserve point guard Shawn Opunui will be out for approximately six weeks after reinjuring his left thumb Saturday vs. Idaho (torn ligaments). He originally suffered ligament damage in his thumb while playing three minutes at Utah State on Dec. 1. It is anticipated the freshman guard will be in a hard cast for the next four weeks and then a removable splint for two weeks.

#### Hitting the Glass

BYU has done a good job on the boards this year. BYU averages 36.5 rebounds while its opponents grab on average 29.5. BYU has out boarded its opponents in nine games, including a 38-26 advantage over Southern Utah and a 39-32 edge over CSUNlast week. The Cougars had a slight 38-37 edge over Stanford. BYU is 9-0 when winning the rebounding battle. The Cougars have only been out boarded once, 35-24 in its overtime loss to Utah State. The Cougars and UCSB each had 35 rebounds. BYU out boarded Fort Lewis, 47-17. BYU's 42-26 rebounding advantage over ASU was the third worst margin suffered by ASU coach Rob Evan's in his coaching career and his worst at ASU.

#### 2001-02 Schedule Notes

#### **BYU Record - Comparing Recent Starts**

With its 9-2 record, BYU is off to its best start since starting 12-2 in 1999-2000. The Cougars have earned 11 nonconference wins in each of the last two years on their way to back-to-back 20-plus victory seasons. Last year BYU was 11-4 enter MWC play and went on to a 24-9 record. In 1999-2000 the Cougars were 11-2 and finished 22-11. BYU has a chance to reach 11 nonconference wins this year with a 9-2 record entering the final week before conference play begins.

#### **BYU Opponent Records**

Of the 20 opponents BYU will face this year, 13 have winning records as of Dec. 30. Five have a losing record and one, Pepperdine, is at .500 mark. Overall, they have combined to win 57 percent of their games with the nonconference teams having a 75-66 record and MWC teams boasting a 51-28 record. The 11 teams BYU has played already have won 55 percent of their games (65-53).

#### **Seven Conference Champions**

Seven conference champions, including Pac-10 champion Stanford, and 12 games against teams who qualified for postseason play last year highlight BYU's 2001-02 men's basketball schedule. Other conference champions include Creighton of the Missouri Valley Conference, Utah State of the Big West, Cal State Northridge of the Big Sky (playing in Big West this year), Southern Utah of the Mid-Continent Conference and fellow co-champions Utah and Wyoming of the Mountain West Conference. Pepperdine and New Mexico also advanced to post-season play in the NIT tournament. Pepperdine placed second in the WCC behind NCAAqualifier Gonzaga and earned a 22-9 record, including an NIT win in Laramie over Wyoming. The Waves enter their first year under former NBA player and coach Paul Westphal. New Mexico also advanced in the NIT, losing in the second round to Pepperdine. Including two exhibition contests, BYU has 29 games, including 17 in the Marriott Center, on its schedule. The MWC tournament is Mar. 7-9, at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas.

#### **Last Year's Winning Percentages**

BYU's 13 nonconference opponents earned a combined 234-156 (.600) record last year for an average record of 18-12. Instate rivals Utah State, Utah, Southern Utah and Weber State combined for an 87-38 record, winning nearly 70 percent of their games and earning two NCAA and one NIT berth. Nine teams who qualified for a postseason (five NCAA, four NIT).

#### **Nonconference Notes**

BYU will play seven nonconference opponents who were on the Cougars' schedule last year and six that are new to the schedule, including two first-time opponents. BYU had a 5-2 record last year against the seven teams it will play again this season, with home wins over UC Santa Barbara, Utah State, Idaho and Southern Utah and a road win at Weber State. The two losses both came during the first road trip of the season at San Francisco and Arizona State. Stanford, Creighton, Pepperdine, Cal State Northridge, San Diego and Fort Lewis are all new opponents this year, with San Diego and Fort Lewis playing BYU for the first time. BYU faces teams from seven different conferences in 2001-02.

#### Radio/TV

All BYU games will be carried live on the Cougar Sports Radio Network, originating from KSL Newsradio 1160 AM in Salt Lake City. BYU is featured six times this season in the Mountain West television package with ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN Regional Television (ESPN+Plus) and ABC. The Cougars play twice on ESPN and four times on ESPN+Plus. An additional 12 BYU games are part of the SportsWest Productions' package and KBYU will produce two games for taped-delay broadcast. In all 21-of-27 regular season games are slated for television broadcast.

#### MATT MONTAGUE / 6-0 • 190 • senior • point guard

CAPSULE: Montague provides leadership at the point having started 57 times and played in all 92 games in his first three years ... Last year he started 12 games, primarily before Trent Whiting joined the team in December, but still lead the team in assists (2.9) while playing mostly a reserve role ... He has led the team in assists during each of his three seasons ... A hard-nosed competitor, he sees the floor well and is a great transition passer ... Career averages entering this year are 3.6 points and 3.8 assists.

Matt Montague played both games last week with a broken nose, an injury he sustained late Christmas day during practice. He tied his season high in rebounds with seven (also had seven in the upset victory over Stanford) vs. CS Northridge while scoring six points in 35 minutes. He had two points and 10 assists in 30 minutes vs. Southern Utah. It is the third time this year Montague has reached double-digit assists in a game. He averages a MWC-best 7.2 assists per game on the year and was tied for third in assists in the last release of NCAAstatistics (Nov. 17). Matt Montague had a season-high seven rebounds vs. CSUNand Stanford. He made a career-best eight free throws to seal the win for BYU vs. Stanford. He set a career-high with 15 assists vs. Idaho. It was the most assists by a Cougar in the last 25 years. He was one shy of the BYU and Marriott Center record of 16 assists set by Mike May vs. Niagara in 1976. He scored 11 points and had a game-high eight assists at USD in the season-opener. Montague reached double-digit points only once last year in 33 games, scoring 12 points at the University of San Francisco.

He is most effective when slashing to the basket but has range from the three-point arc ... He was fifth in scoring last year (5.5) and also grabbed 3.0 boards per game ... He earned a starting job midway through the year before missing nine games in the middle of MWC play because of a fractured right foot. He played primarily a reserve role to senior Nathan Cooper after returning from his injury ... He started nine games and the Cougars had a 7-2 record in those games with loses at Colorado State and Wyoming, where he suffered the foot injury ... He played his freshman year at Utah Valley State College before going on an LDS Church mission ... He sat out a year as a redshirt before joining the Cougars in 2000-2001.

Hansen leads BYU in rebounding (7.0 rpg) and is second in scoring (15.0 ppg). After taking 11 or more shots in the first four games, he did not take more than eight attempts in the next six games until going 5-10 Saturday vs. Southern Utah, scoring 16 points, his highest total in the last five games. He has reached double figures in nine of 11 games. He played a key defensive role against first-team All-American Casey Jacobsen of Stanford while adding a team-high 9 rebounds and 8 points. He had a team-high 18 points on 5-7 shooting along vs. Crieghton. Hansen scored a career-high 26 points against Utah State in an overtime loss. He went 10-15 from the floor, including a 3-5 from three-point range, and was 3-4 from the line. He added a team-high five rebounds. His 10 field goals, three treys and 38 minutes were all career highs. He has two double-doubles, the first of his career, with 14 points and 10 rebounds at UC Santa Barbara and 18 points and a career-high 15 rebounds vs. Arizona State.



CAPSULE – Bigelow could be one of the top performers in the Mountain West if he returns to his pre-mission form ... So far he has proved capable of returning to his pre-mission form ... He was BYU's leading scorer (15.0) and rebounder (6.3) in 1998-99 before going on a two-year LDS Church mission to Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. ... He returned from his mission in June having grown an inch to 6-7 ... He is an excellent shooter and extremely intelligent player ... A gifted offensive player with a great mid-range game ... He moves well without the ball ... He was the 1999 WAC Pacific Division Freshman of the Year, All-WAC Second Team and All-Newcomer Team.

Mark Bigelow leads BYU in scoring at 18.4 ppg. He has made a three in all 11 games this year, totaling 31 threes (2.8 per game) while making 48.4 percent of his three-point attempts. In addition to being BYU's leading scorer, he has been the team's most consistent offensive threat, totaling 14 or more points in 10 straight games after scoring nine points in the season-opener before fouling out. He has scored 20 or more points four times, including a BYU season-high 31. He had a game-high 27 points vs. CSUN. He matched a career high with 20 attempts vs. CSUN and set a new career high with 10 three-point attempts. He had game highs of 20 points and 6 rebounds while equaling a career-best five treys vs. Southern Utah Saturday. He scored half of BYU's points in the first half of each game last week, scoring 17 points in the first half of both games. For the week, he averaged 23.5 points and 4.0 rebounds while shooting 50 percent from both the floor and from three-point range. He averaged 4.5 made threes per game.

CAPSULE – A three-year starter, Nielsen will play a big role for the Cougars in 2001-02 with the loss of the team's other four starters ... An intelligent player with a good mid-range jumper, his 56.3 career field goal percentage ranks third all-time at BYU ... Nielsen and teammate Matt Montague were all freshmen members of the 1996-97 BYU team that finished 1-25 .... After returning from his mission, Nielsen has played the past two seasons for coach Cleveland , helping the Cougars earn a combined 46-20 record and two postseason tournament berths ... He is Academic All-MWC and a Cougar Scholar Athlete.

Nielsen is third on the team in scoring (10.3 ppg) and is second in rebounds (5.3 rpg). He was 3-of-3 for 6 points vs. SUU and 5 points and 6 rebounds vs. CSUN. He has reached double-figure points in four games. After scoring a season-low 2 points against Idaho in 25 minutes, taking only two shots, he scored a career-high 29 points vs. Stanford, taking a career-high 16 attempts while making a personal-best 11 shots. He had 14 points, 8 boards and 2 assists vs. Weber State. He had 14 at Utah State and had a then career-high 19 points vs. ASU in BYU's home opener (his prior best was 17 against Utah at the Thomas & Mack Center in the 2000 MWC tournament in Las Vegas). This year against ASU, he went 8-11 from the floor. Last year the most shots he took in a game was eight, when he averaged 3.8 shot attempts per game. This year he is taking 7.2 shots per game. He ranks third all-time at BYU in career field goal percentage and is making 58.2 percent of his shots so far this year.

He averaged 17 points and 10 rebounds per game as a high school junior when he also earned Salt Lake Tribune and Deseret News All-State honors. He is a talented offensive player in the low-post who can also score with his jumper. He should get the opportunity to play as a freshman with the loss of 2001 Mountain West Conference Player of the Year Mekeli Wesley in the post.

Jensen equaled his career high with 14 points vs. Southern Utah. All of his points came in the second half. Jensen had his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds vs. CSUN. His 10 boards matched his career high. He averaged 13.5 points and 7.5 rebounds for the week while shooting 83.3 percent (10-12) from the floor and 77.8 percent (7-9) from the line. He also had a career-best 2 steals vs. CSUN. Jensen has reached double-digit points in four of the last five games and five times overall this year. He had 9 points vs. Stanford. He went 4-4 from the floor and 4-4 from the line vs. Idaho. He is shooting a MWC-best 70.6 percent from the floor. He had 12 points in 20 minutes vs. Idaho and 12 points in 16 minutes vs. Fort Lewis. He and Mark Bigelow were the first recruits to sign with BYU under Steve Cleveland.

Bobik plays the sixth-man role. He is averaging 22.2 minutes, 9.9 points and 3.4 rebounds. He has made 20 straight free throws. The all-time BYU record is 32, set by Michael Smith. Bobik hasn't missed a free throw since the Arizona State game. He set career bests with in free throws made, attempted and percentage going 8-8 vs. Cal State Northridge. He did not go to the line vs. Southern Utah. Bobik has scored in double digits three of the last four games. He had a career-high 17 against Idaho, 10 against Stanford and 17 again vs. CS Northridge before making two threes for six points in 18 minutes vs. Southern Utah. Bobik also set career highs vs CSUN with four assists and three steals. He shoots a MWC-best 92.9 percent from the line. He is fourth on the team in scoring. 

CAPSULE: Balderson is a 6-foot-6 combo guard who averaged 34 points, 9.2 rebounds and 6.8 assists while leading Magrath High School in Alberta, Canada to a 32-3 record this past season ... He has excellent range from the three-point line and has good size ... He shot 54 percent from the floor and 91 percent from the free throw line at Magrath High ... A skilled young player, he could factor in on perimeter this year ... He plans to leave in the spring on a two-year mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Balderson has played in eight games and averages 10 minutes. He has reached double figures twice, scoring 11 points in 13 minutes vs. Southern Utah Saturday and totaling a career-high 19 points to lead all BYU scorers against Fort Lewis in 22 minutes. He went 8-10 from the floor vs. Fort Lewis. He also recorded career highs with 7 rebounds and 3 steals, sharing team-high honors in both categories. He has been able to score when he has gotten the playing time. He has played double-digit minutes in four games, averaging 14.5 minutes and 9.8 points. He could get some opportunities to play the point with Opunui out with an injury.



CAPSULE: Opunui averaged 21.7 points and 6.1 assists as an all-state point guard at Orem High School in 1999 before leaving for an LDS Church mission ... A strong offensive player and solid defender, Opunui shot nearly 91 percent from the free throw line, third best in state history, and 40 percent on three-point attempts ... His 401 assists put him on the state's top-10 all-time list ... He is an athletic point guard who has excellent open court passing skills and is an outstanding three-point shooter ... His ability to break defenses down with the dribble should create offensive opportunities for his teammates ... He loves pushing the ball up the floor as a true point guard with great court vision ... A super passer and great penetrator, Opunui should have the opportunity to play with the loss to graduation of all-MWC guards Trent Whiting and Terrell Lyday and loss to injury of Michael Vranes.

It is anticipated Opunui will be out for at least six weeks after reinjuring his left thumb vs. Idaho (torn ligaments). He originally suffered ligament damage in his thumb while playing three minutes at Utah State on Dec. 1. The freshman guard will wear a hard cast for the next four weeks and then a removable splint for two weeks. He had played in four games. His only significant playing time was against Fort Lewis when he played 20 minutes. It was his first action in three games after injuring his thumb at Utah State. He dished out a career-best 10 assists and had career highs with six points, four rebounds and three steals in 20 minutes vs. Fort Lewis. He had six assists in the first half in only seven minutes.

He played five minutes vs. CSUN and recorded a career-high 3 points, going 3-6 from the line. He took one three-pointer. He has played in seven games, including a brief appearance vs. Stanford at the end of the game. He played 10 minutes against Fort Lewis, and had 2 points and 3 assists. He is averaging 4.6 minutes.

#### STEVE CLEVELAND / head coach

Steve Cleveland enters his fifth season at the helm of the Cougars in 2001-02. In his four seasons at BYU, Cleveland has proven to be a firstrate recruiter, an excellent coach and player developer,

and above all, a winner.

Last year Cleveland guiding BYU to its first NCAA tournament bid since 1995, its first conference regular season title since 1993 and its first conference tournament championship since 1992. While rebuilding a program that finished 1-25 before his arrival, he has improved the Cougars each season, posting records of 9-21, 12-16, 22-11 and 24-9. The Cougars also improved upon an NIT season in 1999-2000 to earn an NCAA berth last year.

The past two seasons both rank among of the school's best year's ever in terms of wins dating back to the Cougars first season in 1902. In fact, only five BYU teams have ever recorded more wins than last year's 24-9 team and only seven have improved upon the 22-11 record in 1999-2000.

The Cougars have improved their conference record each year under Cleveland (4-10 first year; 6-8 second year; 7-7 third year, 10-4 last year). The Cougars are an impressive 29-2 at home the past two years and have improved on the road with 17 away/neutral wins the past two seasons. BYU was a perfect 15-0 in the Marriott Center last year.

Cleveland's teams have come on strong at the end of each season. Last year BYU won five straight games on the road to secure a share of the MWC regular season title and earn the automatic NCAA bid by claiming the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas. The Cougars won six of their last eight games the prior season, including two MWC tournament wins and two NIT victories. In Cleveland's first year, BYU completed a rare sweep of New Mexico and UTEP on the road to earn a WAC tournament berth. The road sweep of New Mexico and UTEP was the first for BYU since 1990-91 and the 83-62 upset of No.15-ranked New Mexico in the Pit ended the Lobos' 41-game home winning streak. In Cleveland's second season the Cougars had a blowout win over UTEP before a 90-74 conference tournament upset

victory over TCU to achieve BYU's first conference tournament win since 1994.
Cleveland has improved BYU each year in post season as well. After guided his team to the 2000 Mountain West Conference Tournament finals and the quarterfinals of the NIT in 2000, last year he coached the Cougars to the 2001 MWC Tournament Championship and an NCAA berth.

As a recruiter, Cleveland has made a similar impact on BYU's program. Cleveland recruits have proven they are not only committed to Cleveland's vision but also are the kind of players to help make that vision a reality in Provo. Cleveland and his staff have been able to attract top talent from Utah and beyond. BYU has had one of the conference's top players in each of his four seasons. Last year Trent Whiting transferred from Utah even though he had to give up a year of eligibility. He was named to the MWC Newcomer Team and earned All-MWC Second Team honors while averaging 14.2 points. In 1999-2000, Terrell Lyday was the MWC Newcomer of the Year and was fourth in the league in scoring with a BYUbest 17.1 ppg. He followed in the footsteps of Mark Bigelow, who led the Cougars in scoring (15.0) and rebounding (6.3) while being named the Western Athletic Conference Pacific Division Freshman of the Year and second-team All-WAC in 1998-99 before departing for a two-year LDS Church mission. Ron Selleaze transferred to BYU in Cleveland's first season and earned WAC

Newcomer of the Year and second-team allconference honors.

He signed a multi-year contract extension in October. Before taking the helm at BYU on March 11, 1997, Cleveland compiled a 157-77 record at Fresno City College in Fresno, Calif. Cleveland was named coach of the year two times while at FCC and led the Rams to post-season playoffs in each of his seven seasons in Fresno. Cleveland coached 10 years at Fresno's Clovis West High School, compiling a 180-70 record.

#### PLAYING CAREER

Cleveland played college basketball at UC Irvine and was the Anteaters' MVP and leading scorer his senior season in 1975-76. Prior to attending UC Irvine, Cleveland was Fresno City College's Most Outstanding Player in 1973-74. Cleveland received a B.A. degree in social science from UC Irvine in 1976, and received a Master's in education administration from Fresno Pacific in 1979.

#### **PERSONAL**

Cleveland, 49, was born in the Los Angeles area and spent most of his life in Fresno, Calif. He served an LDS Church mission to England from 1971-73. Cleveland was the first head basketball or football coach at BYU to have served a church mission. Cleveland and his wife Kip have three children: sons Casey (23) and Skyler (20) and daughter Katie (11).


