Cougar Soccer Quick Notes:

- -BYU started this season with back-to-back shutouts, a feat they haven't repeated since 2005
- -The Cougars began the season 5-0, their best start to a season since the 2005 campaign
- -Forward Jennie Marshall recorded three goals, in two games, for two weeks in a row between August 31 and September 11
- -Marshall has now exceeded her previous career-high four goals by netting seven this year to bring her total to 11
- -Sophomore defender Lindsi Lisonbee has also exceeded her previous career-high one goal by netting two this year to bring her total to three
- -Senior forward Auna Janis-Doria both recorded her first goals of the season against Weber State
- -Head coach Jennifer Rockwood has started the same 11 players in five of BYU's seven games this vear
- -Freshman forward Lynda Hercules recorded her second goal of her career in BYU's victory against Rice. Both of Hercules' goals have been gamewinners
- -Junior Lauren Anderson recorded her first two goals of the season in BYU's 4-0 victory over the Idaho State Bengals
- -BYU's overall home record is 128-41-17 and overall road record is 121-50-18
- -Head coach Jennifer Rockwood recorded her 250th NCAA career victory this season in BYU's win over Weber State on August 27
- -The Cougars have kept all their 2010 opponents, but one, to single-digit shot performances. Marquette is the only team to record double-figures against them
- -Season-high shots for BYU: 23 against Weber State
- -The Cougars are on a 14-game home unbeaten streak, dating back to their last home loss on Sept. 3, 2009, to William & Mary

Previous game recap:

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 29, 2010) - In its first home game in over two weeks, the No. 12 BYU women's soccer team got two goals from junior Lauren Anderson on their way to a 4-0 shutout over the Idaho State Bengals, Wednesday at South Field in front of a crowd of 2,118.

The Cougars (9-1-1) finished the night with 18 shots while limiting the Bengals (5-6-1) to just four. BYU remains undefeated when scoring the first goal of the game.

"I'm really pleased with our team effort and obviously the overall finish from the girls tonight," said BYU head coach Jennifer Rockwood. "We had some great looks at the goal. We came into this knowing it'd be our last regular season game before starting conference play so we wanted to put everything out there and I think we definitely came ready to play tonight."

Getting all the scoring BYU would need, junior Lauren Anderson led the Cougars to victory with two goals on the night.

In just the fourth minute of action, Anderson took a pass at mid-field from sophomore Jessica Ringwood where she quickly broke away from the Bengal defenders to streak to the net. The goal was her first of the season and first, of two, for the game. The second came after halftime with a double assist from senior Kassidy Shumway and sophomore Carlee Payne to secure the 4-0 victory.

"This year, more than any year, we've got five or more really talented players that can score for us," Rockwood said. "Lauren has played really well this year so we're excited she was able to score tonight."

Earlier in the night, BYU nearly tallied another goal in the 15th minute on a shot from senior Mercede Koning that bounced off the side post and went wide. It wouldn't be long, however, before the Cougars connected and did get on the board again with Payne scoring off an assist from Lindsi Lisonbee to put BYU up 2-0.

The Cougars didn't waste any time early in the second half adding to their lead with Ringwood scoring in the first two minutes. Ringwood took a team-high four shots, scored once and added one assist.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Katie Larkin, Aleisha Rose, Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading, Andrea Willis and Staci Reynolds. Rohbock, Hendershot, Reading and Reynolds each went on to play in the Women's United Soccer Association.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Ricks College (now BYU-Idaho) on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management. Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs and the high school level.

2009 Season Review

The BYU women's soccer team finished their 2009 season ranked No. 14 in the county with confidence and the knowledge that they could compete, and win, with other top-ranked teams in the nation. BYU's offense ranked No. 98 in the country with 38 goals in 24 games, their shutout percentage ranked No. 25 with a total of 13 shutouts and their The Cougars finished their season with an 18-4-2 overall record, going unbeaten in conference play and touting an all-time 245-73-23 record under head coach Jennifer Rockwood's 15-year tutelage.

The 2009 squad found themselves facing a talent-stricken schedule with teams around the country. The team started their season in Hawaii where they tied in double overtime. The following weekend, they knew a tie wouldn't cut it as they would be playing two top-25 ranked teams in the Penn State Invitational. The then-No.20 ranked Connecticut Huskies and the then-ranked No. 14 West Virginia Mountaineers were the first two ranked teams the Cougars would face in 2009. Both games ended in a 1-0 win for the Cougars as BYU realized it could compete with other top-20 ranked schools. After the two big wins, the Cougars found themselves constantly ranked in the top-25 in the nation.

BYU would face four ranked-schools during the season and would win each one, two of them coming on South Field in front of 3,628 fans. A total of 29,181 people saw the BYU women's soccer team play in 2009, 21,279 of those fans were from games played at South Field.

The 18 wins for BYU would tie the school's second-highest most wins. The Cougars led the Mountain West Conference all season for the total number of corner kicks they took that year. They finished the season also leading for the total number of points accumulated, the total number of goals scored and the number of shutouts recorded.

In conference play, the Cougars went for an undefeated 6-0-1 record, five of those games coming as shutout wins for BYU. The only tie came against the San Diego State Aztecs in San Diego.

The Cougars ended their regular season on a 14-game unbeaten streak.

BYU received its sixth first-place regular season finish and its eighth first-round bye for the MWC tournament. In its fourth time hosting the conference championships, the Cougars prepared to meet the fourth-seed New Mexico Lobos in the semifinals.

In a physical battle that would not soon be forgotten, the Cougars defeated the Lobos 1-0 to advance to the championship game where they would face San Diego State, the only team they did not defeat in the regular season.

A tired and recuperating BYU squad played hard against the Aztecs but eventually fell 0-1 after dominating the majority of the game.

NCAA Tournament

Without the automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, the Cougars learned what it was like to wait to hear where they would be playing for the first round. The announcement was made that BYU would play the UC Santa Barbara Gauchos, for the first time in school history, at Stanford for the first round of the 2009 NCAA women's soccer college cup.

This bid was BYU's fifth straight NCAA appearance, for a total of 11 in school history. Since becoming a MWC school in 1999, the Cougars have been invited to the NCAA tournament each year but one. In 2009, BYU and San Diego State were chosen to represent the MWC in the tournament.

The Cougars met the Gauchos in Palo Alto, Calif., where they defeated them 2-0 and out shot them 21-11. Freshman Carlee Payne scored first, recording her 13th goal of the season to lead the team. Senior Alyssa Vander Veur netted her third goal of the season, a bullet from just outside the box, for BYU's second goal in the win. The Cougars would now advance to play No. 1 seed Stanford at Stanford.
