BYU (12-7, 2-4 MWC) hosts UNLV (12-6, 3-3 MWC) Saturday at 1 p.m. (MST) in the Mountain West Conference game of the week on ESPN+ Plus (KJZZ-TV in Utah). The game is available pay-per-view via ESPN Full Court. The radio broadcast can be heard on KSLNewsradio 1160, beginning with a one-hour pregame show. KSL's Greg Wrubell will call the play-by-play action with Mark Durrant providing analysis. COUGAR CAPSULE

The Cougars (12-7, 2-4) finished nonconference play with a 10-3 record, including the Cable Car Classic title and wins over No. 25 Oklahoma State and the Pac-10's USC. BYUhas played eight of its last 11 games on the road, going 5-6. The preseason favorite to win the Mountain West Conference, BYU returns four starters from last year's 23-9 co-championship team that advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Four-year starter Mark Bigelow and fellow senior Rafael Araujo were both named to the Preseason All-MWC Team. Senior guard Kevin Woodberry and junior forward Jared Jensen were also starters last season but are primarily come off the bench this year, with Jensen having missed the last three games with an injury. Key newcomers include junior transfer Mike Hall and freshmen Mike Rose and Garner Meads. Araujo is averaging 19.2 points and 10.3 rebounds to lead BYU this year. Bigelow adds 13.2 points and 4.1 rebounds while Hall contributes 11.9 points and 3.5 rebounds. First-year starter Luiz Lemes leads the team in assists (4.3). As a team, the Cougars shoot .484 from the floor, including .361 on threes, and .724 from the line while scoring 73.1 points per game. BYUallows 64.5 points while the opposition has shot .451 from the field and .345 from behind the arc. BYU has an average rebounding advantage of 6.0.

UNLV REBELS

UNLV returns four letterwinners, including three starters, from last year's team that finished 21-11 overall, tied for third in the Mountain West Conference with an 8-6 league record, and advanced to the NIT for the second consecutive year. This year UNLV is off to a 12-6 record overall and a 3-3 league mark. Heading into conference play, the Rebels had won eight of 10 games. In MWC play, the Rebels have won three of their last four games, including Monday's home victory over previously unbeaten league-leader Air Force. UNLV is 9-3 at home this year and 3-3 away, with a 2-1 home record in MWC play and a 1-2 road ledger. UNLV's league win on the road came at Wyoming. The Rebels lost at SDSU and fell in overtime at CSU. The Rebels' other league win at the Thomas & Mack was over New Mexico as UNLV swept its last two games. Utah defeated the Rebels in Las Vegas to open MWC play. The Runnin' Rebels are led in scoring and rebounding by 6-7 junior forward Odatrey Blankson, who is averaging a double-double of 17.1 ppg and 10.6 rpg. He is currently tied for second nationally for the most double-double games this season with 12 -- one more than BYU's Rafael Araujo. Two other players average double figures in scoring with 6-7 junior swingman Romel Beck averaging 14.0 ppg and 6-8 senior forward J.K. Edwards adding 13.5 ppg. Edwards is second on the team in rebounding at 6.1 rpg after missing the first six games of the year to a suspension. Louis Amundson, a 6-9 sophomore forward, is third on the team in rebounding, pulling down 5.4 boards and adding 6.3 points while primarily coming off the bench. The UNLV starting back court includes point guard Jerel Blassingame, a 5-10 junior, who is perhaps the quickest player in the league and adds 9.6 points and 5.7 assists, and 6-2 senior guard Demetrius Hunter, who contributes 8.5 points and has a team-leading 31 treys on a team-best .348 three-point shooting. As a team, the Rebels are shooting .482 from the floor but only .320 from long range. They are making free throws at a .686 clip. UNLV opponents have combined to shoot .427 from the field and .317 on threes. The Rebels are scoring 75.0 points and allowing 68.8. Opponents have a slight edge over UNLV on the boards at 35.1 to UNLV's 34.4. UNLV coach Charlie Sponhour is in his third year coaching the Rebels and has a 54-28 mark. He is 373-199 in his 19th year overall at the Division I level. He has led 13 teams to postseason tournaments, including eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

UNLV's LAST OUTING -- Rebels Hand League-Leading Falcons First MWC Defeat

LAS VEGAS -- J.K. Edwards scored a game-high 19 points to lead UNLV past Air Force 63-50 Monday night. Edwards made 9-of-11 shots against the Falcons. Edwards received help from Jerel Blassingame, who had 11 points and seven assists, and Demetrius Hunter, who added 10 points. UNLV's Odatrey Blankson had eight points and 15 rebounds. The Falcons dropped their first league game and had its 13-game victory streak come to an end. Air Force (15-3, 5-1) was led by A.J. Kuhle and Nick Welch with 13 points apiece. After Air Force jumped to an 11-2 lead, the Rebels went on a 14-0 run, leading 16-11 with 8:13 until half-time. The Falcons cut the UNLV lead to 18-17, but the Rebels ended the half on a 13-2 run, holding Air Force to no field goals in the final 6:19 of the half. The Falcons were out-rebounded 19-5 in the half. UNLV out-rebounded the Falcons 41-20 for the game. Air Force never got closer than 42-36 in the second half. For the game, the Rebels were 12-of-18 from the foul line for 66.7 percent, while the Falcons were 4-of-9 for 44.4 percent. UNLV outscored the Falcons in the paint 40-22 and on second-chance points 22-6.

SERIES NOTES

This will be the 16th meeting between the two schools dating back to 1981. The series has been a close one with UNLV currently holding a one-game edge at 8-7. The two teams have split the regular season series with home wins the past three years. BYU last won in Vegas and went on to sweep the two regular season meetings in 1999-2000. The Rebels came back that year to achieved their largest margin of victory over BYU (23 points) to win the 2000 MWC tournament title at the Thomas & Mack Center. BYU is 5-2 in Provo against UNLV and 2-6 in Las Vegas against the Rebels. BYU has won five of the nine games as MWC opponents.

AT BYU – COUGARS OPENED MWC PLAY WITH WIN IN PROVO

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 16, 2002) -- The BYU basketball team took a 15-7 lead seven minutes into the game, and the intensity didn't let up until the final buzzer. BYU extended its home-winning streak to 44 as the Cougars beat UNLV 85-77 Thursday. With their first Mountain West Conference game of the season, the Cougars are 1-0 in conference play and 12-4 overall. UNLV came into the game with the best overall record in the conference, but they dropped to 11-3 overall and 0-1 in the conference. BYU head coach Steve Cleveland said, Three BYU players scored 20 points or more for the first time under Coach Cleveland. Rafael Araujo led the charge with 22 points and 15 rebounds. Junior Mark Bigelow scored 21 and senior Travis Hansen marked up 20. In the first half, Bigelow knocked down four three pointers on five attempts. Bigelow's 140 career three pointers have brought him only one three-pointer away from tying BYU's individual career three-point record. Araujo lit up the crowd with several commanding dunks. On one UNLV possession, Araujo stole the ball under the Rebel's basket and then finished the play with a backboard-shaking slam. At the half, the Cougars led by 10 and maintained a solid lead throughout the second half until a pair of Marcus Banks' free throws brought UNLV within five, with three minutes remaining in the game. UNLV senior Dalron Johnson led all scorers with 25 points, including three treys. BYU's defense held Banks, who is second in scoring in the conference (19.0), to four points in the first half and only 5-for-14 field goals on the game. In his first game in the Marriott Center last year, Banks was held to 1-for-8 on field goals.

"What pleased me most about tonight's game was that we took care of the basketball. We were unselfish with the ball, and we had as good an execution offensively as we have had all year. AT UNLV – POOR SHOOTING, TURNS DOOM COUGARS

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (February 14, 2003) -- The UNLV Runnin' Rebels didn't show any love to BYU Valentine's night in Las Vegas, handing the Cougars their first conference road loss of the season 61-54. BYU played well defensively and out-rebounded UNLV 47-31 on the night, but its 23 turnovers were the most since the team lost at Creighton 74-64 earlier this season. BYU held UNLV to 40 percent shooting in their own gym, including 25 percent from behind the three-point arc. The Cougars' poor shooting and a season-high-equaling 23 turnovers led to their lowest scoring output of the season. BYU shot a season-low 34.5 percent as a team from the field and 25 percent from the three-point line. Marcus Banks and Dalron Johnson led UNLV with 19 points apiece. Johnson did most of his scoring before intermission, while Banks took over in the second half. Travis Hansen led BYU with 18 points. The only other Cougar in double figures was Jared Jensen with 12 points. Cleveland said the team looked tired, having played their third game in seven days. The game was tied at 27 after one half, and featured six lead changes and six ties. UNLV scored first in the second half, and never trailed the rest of the game. The Rebels pushed the lead to 16 in the second half before the Cougars cut it to seven to end the game. Junior forward Mark Bigelow was held scoreless in the first half, and finished the game with only four points, on 1-14 shooting (0-6 three pointers). Bigelow came in shooting 45 percent from the floor and 51 percent on threes in league games, and 44 percent on field goals and 48 percent on threes overall. The loss drops BYU to 6-2 in conference play and 17-6 overall.

WHAT BYU COACH STEVE CLEVELAND HAD TO SAY AFTER THE GAME IN LAS VEGAS LAST YEAR ...

"Turnovers and missed shots are a bad combination; you can't do that on the road and expect to win. We haven't practiced very much this week, and obviously it caught up with us tonight."

GAME 19 RECAP – UTES EARN COMEBACK WIN OVER BYU

SALT LAKE CITY (Jan. 31, 2004) -- Utah's Nick Jacobson and Andrew Bogut each scored 21 points and the Utes held BYU to just one field goal in the final six minutes as Utah overcame a 15-point halftime deficit to earn a 64-56 victory Saturday afternoon at the Huntsman Center. "We played well in the first half," BYU coach Steve Cleveland said. "We were able to stop them from getting second and third shots, but we weren't able to stop them from getting second and third opportunities in the second half." The Cougars jumped out to a 15-point lead in the first half behind the shooting of Mark Bigelow and Garner Meads. Bigelow scored 14 points in the first half on 5-5 shooting, including three 3-pointers, while Meads added 10 points. BYU used runs of 10-2 and 11-4 to build its lead in the first 20 minutes with Utah never leading, but the Utes came out of the locker room in the second half fired up behind the 3-point shooting of Jacobson and the inside play of Bogut. After a Mike Hall basket to open the second half, the Utes exploded for a 15-4 run to cut the BYU lead to six at 40-34. Utah would take its first lead of the game on a Jacobson 3-point basket with 7:16 remaining. Utah would take the lead for good a few minutes later on another 3-pointer by Jacobson, who finished the game with five triples, four in the second half. Then the Utes turned up the defensive pressure, holding BYU to just six points over the final four minutes. "In the last five minutes (of the game) they got their confidence back," Cleveland said. "And we weren't able to counter." Bigelow finished with a season-high 22 points to lead BYU, while Rafael Araujo added a team-high nine boards. Bogut pulled down a game-high 12 rebounds for Utah and also had an excellent game defensively, helping hold Araujo, who entered the game with a league-leading 19.8 scoring average, to just eight points. BYU forward Jared Jensen missed his third straight game with a back injury, and Cougar backup point guard Terry Nashif was not able to play, out with mononucleosis. With the loss, BYU falls to 2-4 in conference and 12-7 overall, while Utah improves to 4-2 in conference and 16-5 overall. The Cougars have lost three games in a row for the first time since a three-game skid in 2002. BYU has played eight of its last 11 games on the road, including the last three contests. The Cougars will play five of their final eight regular-season games in Provo.

GAME 18 RECAP – COUGARS LOSE WILD ONE AT NEW MEXICO

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (Jan. 26, 2004) -- In five seconds of playing time, the Cougars went from the highest of highs to the lowest of lows Monday night, losing a tight contest at New Mexico, 65-63. In an incredible finish, BYU guard Kevin Woodberry tipped in a Cougar miss to tie the game with 3.8 seconds left. A technical foul was then called on the Cougars as Mark Bigelow came onto the court from the bench to celebrate the shot, sending the Lobos' Troy DeVries to the line for two free shots (later scrutiny on video tape showed a whistle was blown after the Woodberry bucket, which prompted Bigelow onto the court; however, the officials did not acknowledge the whistle and consequently Bigelow was called for the technical foul). Amazingly, DeVries missed both attempts, leaving the game tied with 3.8 seconds still on the clock. But inbounding the ball near midcourt thanks to the technical foul, UNM executed a well-placed inbound pass over the out-stretched hands of Rafael Araujo and into the hands of New Mexico's Danny Granger, who scored the game-winning lay-up. Without any timeouts, BYU launched an unsuccessful desperation shot from the Cougar backcourt as time expired. "It was a difficult game to lose, one in which I thought we played very well and put ourselves in a position to win," said BYU coach Steve Cleveland. "I'm disappointed in losing, but I'm not disappointed in this basketball team." Cleveland has every reason to respect his team's effort. The Cougars outrebounded the Lobos 35-28 and outshot them, going 23-52 (.442) from the field. Turnovers, which have plagued the Cougars during the season, were actually even, with each team losing the ball just nine times. Against a New Mexico team that blew out Utah by 16 points just two days before, BYU kept the score tight, with 14 ties and 18 lead changes. "Almost everything that we wanted to do and that we challenged our team to do happened," said Cleveland. Rafael Araujo continued his dominance, scoring 21 points and grabbing 11 rebounds to pick up his 11th double-double of the season. Mike Hall also came up big for the Cougars, scoring 21 points, his second-largest scoring output of the season. No other Cougars scored in double figures. Kevin Woodberry came off the bench for eight points, including two big three-point shots in the first half and the game-tying shot with 3.8 seconds left. Mark Bigelow set a new season-high in rebounds as he pulled down nine boards. New Mexico's Granger, a 6-8 forward, led all scorers with 27 points. Hall and Araujo started BYU off right by scoring 15 of the Cougars' first 18 points. BYU went into the locker room at the half down just one point, 33-32, but missed two scoring opportunities at the line by failing to convert front-ends. Araujo scored 10 in the first half and Hall had nine points. With the loss, the Cougars fall to 2-3 in the Mountain West Conference and 12-6 overall. The Lobos improve to 2-2 in the MWC and 11-6 overall.

LAST WEEK (vs. New Mexico and Utah) ...

Mark Bigelow shared the team lead in points with Mike Hall and Rafael Araujo, averaging 14.5 points. He added 6.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists while shooting 45 percent from the floor and 44.4 percent from behind the three-point arc. He was perfect from the free throw line last week (7-7). Bigelow scored a season-high 22 points at Utah on 7-for-11 shooting. Bigelow pulled down a season-high nine rebounds at New Mexico.

Rafael Araujo again averaged a double-double last week (14.5 ppg, 10.0 rpg). His 21-point, 11-rebound effort at New Mexico was his 11th double-double of the year.

Kevin Woodberry saw more playing time. During his 22.5 minutes per game, he went 4-for-7 from the floor and 2-of-3 on threes. He had not played 20 minutes in any of the four prior games.

Luiz Lemes averaged only 2 points per game while going 1-for-8 from the floor, including 0-for-4 on threes.

Jared Jensen missed both games due to a back injury he sustained against Wyoming. Terry Nashif did not play at Utah (mononucleosis).

BYU shot only 41 percent from the floor in its two games while scoring 59.5 points per game. The Cougars shot 32 percent from behind the arc.

FREQUENT FLYERS RETURN HOME

BYU hasn't been home much over the past six weeks. The Cougars just ended a stretch where they played eight of 11 games on the road. BYU went 5-6 in those games, including its last three straight MWC losses. The last time BYU lost three games in a row was a three-game road skid during MWC play in 2002. The Cougars will play five of their final eight regular-season games in Provo beginning with Saturday's game against UNLV.

RECENT NOTABLES

Last Saturday at Utah, Mark Bigelow scored a season-high 22 points on 7-of-11 shooting, including three triples. Bigelow pulled down a season-high nine rebounds the prior outing at New Mexico. Mike Hall scored 21 points, one below his season-high, and Rafael Araujo recorded his 11th double-double (21 points, 11 rebounds) against the Lobos. Bigelow scored a 19 points on 6-of-10 shooting at Air Force. Freshman Garner Meads recorded his first double-double with career highs of 13 points and 10 rebounds vs. Wyoming. Bigelow dished out a career-best 9 assists vs. the Cowboys. Against CSU, Jared Jensen tied his career-high 10 rebounds, Terry Nashif set a new personal best of 6 rebounds, and Austin Ainge got his first extended playing time, logging 10 minutes and scoring a career-best 6 points while dishing out a high of 2 assists.

INJURY UPDATE

Junior forward Jared Jensen has missed the last three games with a back injury he suffered against Wyoming. His status is day-to-day. This is the first time Jensen has missed a game during his career, with the Air Force game ending a string of 78 straight games played, including 58 starts. Cougar backup point guard Terry Nashif missed the Utah game with mononucleosis and is listed as week-to-week. The status of both players for Saturday's game against UNLV is undetermined. The Cougars have played the entire season without guard Ricky Bower, who was the team's sixth man last year with five starts. He has been out with a back injury.

BIG NUMBERS

The Cougars have won their eight games at home this season by an average of 24 points. The closest final margin was their 14-point victory over Wyoming. BYU achieved its largest halftime lead of the season vs. CSU, taking a 26-point advantage to the break. The Cougars also equaled their largest first-half scoring output of the season with 49 points. The most points BYU has scored in a half this year is 51 points in the second half against Idaho State at the Cable Car Classic. The Cougars' 29-point victory over CSU, however, is not the largest margin of victory for the Cougars in Mountain West play. Last year BYU defeated Air Force in Provo by 32 points, 65-33. BYU's largest margin of victory this season overall was a 36-point win over Western Oregon. On the losing side of the big numbers, BYU was down 23 points at the half on the way to suffering its largest margin of defeat in a Mountain West Conference regular-season game with its 22-point setback at Air Force. The league-leading Falcons had their best shooting night ever against a Division I team (and second best against any team) at 72.5 percent.

HOME AND AWAY

BYU is averaging 61.9 points in true away games while shooting .450 from the floor, .323 on threes, and .750 from the line. BYU has lost by an average of 6.4 points in away games, giving up 68.3 points while earning a 2-7 record. Including BYU's two neutral court wins, BYU averages 65.7 points and allows 68.4 points away from home while shooting .462 on field goals, including .317 on threes, and .751 on free throws. At home where the Cougars are 8-0, BYU averages 83.1 points while giving up just 59.1. The Cougars shoot .511 in the Marriott Center, including .409 on threes, and .698 from the line. One big difference on the road has been the scoring output of BYU point guard Luiz Lemes. In eight home games where he is averaging 27.5 minutes, he has scored 11.0 ppg while shooting .569 from the floor and .545 (12-22) on threes. In nine true away games he has averaged 32.7 minutes while scoring 4.0 ppg and shooting .304 from the floor and .250 (5-20) on threes. Including the two neutral court games, he is averaging 4.5 points, shooting .345 and .308 (8-26) in 33.0 minutes. Araujo averages 19.9 ppg at home and 16.7 in true away games. Players who have scored more in true away games for BYU include Mark Bigelow (14.2 away, 12.1 at home) and Jared Jensen (5.7 away, 4.0 at home).

CLEVELAND NOW FIFTH ON BYU VICTORY LIST; THIRD IN MARRIOTT CENTER WINS

With BYU's seventh win this season, Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland moved into fifth on BYU's career coaching victories list. He moved past Ladell Andersen (114-71 record from 1983-89). Cleveland now has a 120-85 record in his seventh season in Provo. Legendary Cougar coach Stan Watts has the most wins in school history with 372 triumphs from 1949-72. Ott Romney (1927-35) and Roger Reid (1989-96) both achieved 152 victories and Frank Arnold (1975-83) is fourth with 137 wins. Cleveland currently has the third-most wins in the Marriott Center with a 79-18 record in the Cougars' home arena. Reid has the most Marriott Center wins with 92, followed by Arnold with 81. Andersen is fourth with 71.

CLEVELAND WAS 2003 MWCCOACH OF THE YEAR

BYU coach Steve Cleveland was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2003. At 23-9 last year, BYU achieved its fourth straight postseason tournament invitation and third 20-win season in the last four years. Only eight BYU teams have ever achieved more wins in a season than last year's team. The BYU record for wins is 28 (9 losses) in 1951 when the Cougars won the national title as NIT champs. The 2002-03 season was Cleveland's third 20-win season in the last four years, including a 24-9 record in 2001. The only BYU coaches to have more 20-win seasons are Stan Watts (7) and Roger Reid (6). Cleveland joins Frank Arnold and Ladell Andersen with three 20-win seasons.

WHAT COACHES HAVE SAID ABOUT ARAUJO...

USC Head Coach Henry Bibby

"We haven't seen a player like Araujo. He's the best big guy I've seen since I've been in the Pac-10 nine years. We had no answer for him. He draws so much attention and scores in so many different ways; it's incredible. He can shoot the three, post up and is a good passer. There is no answer for him. He's an unbelievable player. You can't stop him one-on-one. He's too big, too smart and will take BYU a long way with Bigelow and other good players."

Oklahoma State Head Coach Eddie Sutton

"He's made remarkable progress since last year when we played him. We tried to button him down from behind near the basket, but once he got the ball and position he's just too big to get around and he had his way. In the first half, we held Araujo to six points, but in the second half he was just too good. He's an entirely different player (than last year). He's made remarkable progress. I watched lots of film on him and I couldn't believe how much niftier he is around the basket."

Weber State Head Coach Joe Cravens

"They've (BYU Cougars) got a lottery pick in the middle (Araujo)."

Utah State Head Coach Stew Morrill

"Obviously Rafael Araujo presents a tremendous challenge trying to figure out how to guard him. He's just so big and strong, with great hands. He's really improved himself as a player. He was a real good player last year and now he's become a first-round (NBA) draft pick if not a lottery pick. He's elevated his game a ton in a lot of different ways. He's become much better at feeling and figuring out where the ball is going to be and how he can get the basketball."

ARAUJO SELECTED TO WOODEN AWARD MIDSEASON TOP 30 LIST

Senior Rafael Araujo has been selected as one of the top-30 candidates for the Wooden Award Player of the Year and All-America Team by the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Committee. On March 30, the 10-player Wooden All-America Team will be announced. One member of the team will be selected April 10 to receive the Wooden Award as the nation's "Most Outstanding Collegiate Basketball Player of the Year." BYU's Danny Ainge was recognized as the nation's top player in 1981 when he received the Wooden Award.

MWC, ARAUJO RANK AMONG NATIONAL DOUBLE-DOUBLE LEADERS

Araujo has 11 double-doubles this year and 19 for his career. His 11 double-double games is the third-most double-double games nationally by a player this season, two behind national-leader Emeka Okafor of Connecticut (13). UNLV's Odatrey Blankson, Minnesota's Kris Humphries, Louisiana Tech's Paul Millsap and Mississippi State's Lawrence Roberts are tied for second with 12 double-doubles. Three of the top 11 double-double leaders in the country hail from the Mountain West Conference (Blankson tied for second, Araujo tied for sixth, and Andrew Bogut of Utah tied for ninth). The Mountain West is the only conference in the country to have four or more players averaging a double-double. The MWC is also the only conference to have four or more players averaging 10 or more rebounds per game. Araujo tied an MWC record by posting five consecutive double-doubles starting with the UVSC game until his streak ended with his 23 points and 7 rebounds in 24 minutes against Weber State Saturday. He tied the Mountain West record held by former Wyoming Cowboy Uche Nsonwu-Amadi. Nsonwu-Amadi recorded five in a row from the last game of the 2001-02 season through his first four appearances in 2002-03. Araujo is the only MWC player to record five consecutive double-doubles in the same season. During his five-game double-double streak, Araujo averaged 26 points and 13.6 rebounds.

ARAUJO RATES HIGH IN NATIONAL AND MWC STATISTICS

Senior center Rafael Araujo is ninth in the nation in rebounds, 37th in field goal percentage and 42nd in scoring in the latest release of NCAA statistics (Feb. 3). Among MWC players after Monday's games, he is the top scorer and rates second in offensive rebounds and defensive rebounds and third in total rebounds, tied for sixth in blocked shots and eighth in field goal percentage.

ARAUJO NAMED CABLE CAR CLASSIC MVP

Araujo was named MVP of the Cable Car Classic after averaging 20.5 points and 11.5 rebounds and leading BYU to wins over Idaho State and host Santa Clara. Against Idaho State, he made 10-of-13 shots, including his only three attempt, scored a team-high 23 points, added 11 rebounds, two blocks, two steals and one assist. Against host Santa Clara, he scored 18 points, all in the second half, against constant triple-teaming while dishing out three assists and grabbed 12 rebounds to help BYU win the Cable Car Classic. Araujo went 2-for-2 from behind the arc against the Broncos.

ARAUJO BECAME FIRST BACK-TO-BACK MWC WEEKLY PLAYER AWARD WINNER (DEC. 7-DEC. 13)

BYU senior center Rafael Araujo captured Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week honors for the second consecutive week after leading the Cougars to victories over Western Oregon (92-56) and Southern California (85-61). Araujo is the first MWC player to win the award on back-to-back weeks since the inception of the MWC in 1999-2000. This is Araujo's third career player of the week honor. In two games last week, Araujo, a Sao Paulo, Brazil (Arizona Western) native, averaged 21.5 points and 12.5 rebounds, while shooting 64 percent from the floor. He scored 15 points, grabbed 14 rebounds and blocked two shots in just 25 minutes of action against Western Oregon. In the 14-point victory over USC, Araujo netted 28 points, 11 boards and two steals. He hit 10-of-15 field goals, including a career-best two three pointers.

ARAUJO EARNED ESPNNATIONAL PLAYER SUPPORTING CAST RECOGNITION (DEC. 7-DEC. 13)

BYU senior center Rafael Araujo was recognized as one of the nation's top performers last week as supporting cast mention to ESPN's weekly national player honor. Araujo was one of seven players singled out by ESPN for outstanding play. ESPN also acknowledged it was the second consecutive week Araujo deserved the honor, stating, "OK, we admit we messed up by not including Araujo last week in the supporting cast." Araujo was named national player of the week that week by both the Sporting News and Collegeinsider.com.

ARAUJO EARNED NATIONAL, MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS (NOV. 30-DEC. 6)

BYU senior center Rafael Araujo was named the National Player of the Week by The Sporting News and by Collegeinsider.com for the week of Nov. 30-Dec. 6 after recording two double-doubles in victories at Boise State (75-69) and against 25th-ranked Oklahoma State (76-71). He was also named the Mountain West Conference Player of the Week. He averaged 31.5 points and 15.5 rebounds, while shooting 71.4 percent from the floor and 76.7 percent from the free throw line. In the win at Boise State, Araujo scored 31 points and pulled down 14 rebounds. He made 10-of-13 attempts from the field and earned 14 trips to the free throw line, knocking down 11. In the victory over Oklahoma State at the Delta Center in Salt Lake City, Araujo scored a career-high 32 points and grabbed 17 rebounds. He made 10-of-15 field goals and 12-of-16 free throws on the day and scored 26 of the Cougars' 40 second half points. His 17 rebounds, one shy of the entire OSU team, led the way for BYU as it dominated the boards against the Cowboys, 44-18.

ARAUJO IN 30-30 CLUB

Rafael Araujo scored back-to-back, 30 points games with his 31 points at Boise State and career-best 32 points against No. 25 Oklahoma State at the Delta Center. Araujo became the first Cougar to accomplish the feat since Terrell Lyday scored 35 points in a win at Utah State and followed that with a 30-point effort in a win at UNLV in January 2000.

BIGELOW PASSES COSIC AS THE NO. 9 ALL-TIME SCORER AT BYU

Senior Mark Bigelow (1,563 points) moved past former Cougar great Kresimir Cosic into ninth place on BYU's all-time scoring list against Wyoming. Cosic scored 1,512 points in only three seasons from 1971-73. Bigelow moved out of a tie with Jay Cheesman (1,408 points from 1974-77) in 10th place against Utah State on Dec. 23. He surpassed current BYU assistant coach Andy Toolson (1,388 points from 1985, 88-90) against USC on Dec. 13 after overtaking Roland Minson (1,375 from 1949-51) against Western Oregon on Dec. 10.

FRESHMAN ROSE SETS THREE-POINT RECORD IN HIS COLLEGE DEBUT

It didn't take long for freshman Mike Rose to put his name in the BYU record book. In his college debut, the true freshman guard out of Houston set a new BYU single-game record with eight 3-pointers while scoring a game-high 26 points to lead the Cougars to an 88-54 win over Southern Utah University. His 26 points is the most scored by a BYU freshman since Mark Bigelow totaled 33 points at Washington State in 1998. Rose's eight 3-pointers broke the BYU record of seven threes in a game, previously set by Nick Sanderson (1992) and Danny Bower (1998). Rose's performance behind the arc was just shy of tying the Marriott Center's record of nine 3-pointers in a game held by Utah State's Jay Goodman (1990). Rose also dished out six assists with only one turnover and added two rebounds and one steal in his 22 minutes off the bench. He made 61.5 percent of his 3-point attempts, going 8-of-13 from behind the arc, and finished 9-for-16 (.563) overall from the floor against Southern Utah's match-up zone. He scored 17 points in 11 first-half minutes on 6-of-8 shooting, including 5-of-7 on threes. He broke the school record with 7:01 left in the second half on a three taken several feet behind the arc. He made 5-of-10 threes and scored 14 points in 18 minutes against Western Oregon and went 4-for-4, including 3-of-3 on threes, for 11 points in nine minutes vs. USC.

ROSE CAN PROVIDE INSTANT OFFENSE

Mike Rose can provide instant offense. After mostly late action in seven straight games prior to not playing at all at San Diego State, the true freshman got off the bench early against CSU and sparked BYU's decisive first-half run. He logged 11 minutes in the first half, scoring 10 points, and got the crowd in a frenzy hitting 3-of-4 long-range bombs. He played a season-high 23 minutes for the night. It was his second game of more than 20 minutes (other was 22 minutes in season opener when he scored 26 points and hit a BYU record 8 threes). He has only played double-digit minutes in six games but his 23 triples is second on the team behind Mark Bigelow. He ranks second in three-point percentage among MWC players.

ROBERTS DISCONTINUED PLAYING, DRESSER ADDED TO ROSTER

Junior Marc Roberts decided to discontinue playing basketball prior to BYU's game vs. USC due to continued struggles with tendonitis in his knees. The walk-on guard appeared in 37 games with one start over his two-plus years with BYU, averaging 1.5 points and 0.8 rebounds in 5.3 minutes per game. This year Roberts was averaging 1.6 points and 1.4 rebounds in 8.6 minutes while playing in five of six games. With Ricky Bower out with an injury, the Cougars decided to add another walk-on player, Mike Dresser, to the roster for the USC game. Dresser is a 6-5, 195-pound freshman guard/forward from Sacramento, Calif., who had been practicing with the team. He wears jersey No. 15 at home and No. 33 on the road.

COUGAR OPPONENTS

BYU opponents have a combined 233-49 (.610) record this year, with MWC teams totaling an 86-49 (.637) mark and nonconference teams tallying a 147-100 (.595) record. The seven teams to beat BYU this year have a combined 92-40 (.697) record.

CLOSE CALLS

BYU has played seven games this year where the outcome was in question entering the final minute. The Cougars have gone 3-4 in those games. BYU lost the four close games by a combined nine points. BYU's nine other wins have been by a margin of 14 or more points, with six being by more than 20 points, including two 30-plus point blowouts. BYU has suffered two blowout losses, a 27-point setback at North Carolina State and a 22-point defeat at Air Force. BYU is 11-0 when leading with five minutes remaining and 11-1 when holding the advantage or is tied with one minute on the second-half clock.

ON THE ROAD

BYU is 4-7 away from the Marriott Center this year with a 2-7 away record and a 2-0 neutral court mark. BYU has played eight of its last 11 games on the road. For the second straight season, the Cougars played more nonconference games away from Provo than they did in the friendly confines of the Marriott Center. This year, BYU played six games at home and seven out-of-town contests while going 10-3 in nonconference. BYU went 6-0 at home and 4-3 away from Provo, with a 2-0 neutral court mark and a 2-3 record in an opponent's arena. Among those games included a neutral court win over then No. 25 Oklahoma State; a win at Boise State; and a victory over host Santa Clara to win the Cable Car Classic. Last season BYU played seven home games and eight away from the Marriott Center while earning an 11-4 record before starting Mountain West Conference play. BYU finished 4-4 away from home last year during nonconference play. The Cougars went 3-1 on a neutral floor, including a 3-0 mark to win the Paradise Jam, and were 1-3 in true away games, with a win over Arizona State.

IN THE MARRIOTT CENTER

BYU is 8-0 at home this year and has won 13 straight overall in the Marriott Center. BYU has won 57 of its last 58 games at home and is 52-1 over in the past four seasons. BYU finished last season 13-1 at home in 2002-03. Lone senior Travis Hansen concluded his three seasons as a Cougar having lost only once at home. BYU earned a 44-1 record in Hansen's three years at BYU – the best three-year home record in school history. The second-best home record over three years was a 39-2 mark from 1979-81 in Danny Ainge's final three seasons. The 44-1 record over the prior three seasons is the school's best-ever three-year home record. BYU won a school-record 44 straight home games in the Marriott Center before losing to Utah, 79-75, on Jan. 25. The streak was the longest active streak in the country over parts the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons. BYU continues its string of nonconference home wins.

NONCONFERENCE VICTORY STREAK IN THE MARRIOTT CENTER

The Cougars have defeated 40 straight non-conference opponents in the Marriott Center since starting the streak with a 61-59 win over Utah State on Jan. 2, 1999. The last non-league foe to win in Provo was the California Bears, who edged BYU 71-70 on Dec. 19, 1998.

COUGAR FANS SHOWING SUPPORT

BYU is ahead of last year's attendance pace with an average crowd of 13,991 after eight home games. Last year BYU averaged the 17th largest crowd in the nation overall at 14,468. The NCAA announced that BYU achieved the nation's largest average increase over the prior season in 2001-2002 (during the middle of the 2002 Winter Olympic Games in Salt Lake City). BYU's 22,702 attendance vs. CSU in its last home game last year was the largest crowd since 1992 and the 21st largest crowd in school history.

COUGARS CLAIM CABLE CAR CLASSIC TITLE, ARAUJO MVP

SANTA CLARA, Calif. (Dec. 30, 2003) -- With its top three post players fouled out of the game, BYU looked to Mark Bigelow and he delivered a slashing bucket-and-one with 14.9 seconds remaining to lead the Cougars to a 68-66 win over host Santa Clara to claim the Cable Car Classic title at the Leavey Center. Senior center Rafael Araujo again loomed large, posting his eighth double-double in nine games with 18 points and 12 rebounds -- with all 18 points scored in the second half. Araujo was named the Cable Car Classic Most Valuable Player after combining for 41 points and 23 boards in the two Cougar wins. With its title this year, BYU won for the third time in four Cable Car appearances to tie the University of San Francisco for the second-most Cable Car Classic titles and the most of any non-Bay Area team. SCU leads with 13 titles and the Cougars have beaten the Broncos for each of their three titles. BYU also breaks SCU's six-game winning streak in the tournament, as the Broncos won the previous two titles.

TOP-25 OPPONENTS

Facing then No. 25 Oklahoma State, BYU played its first top-25 ranked team this season. The victory over the Cowboys was BYU's first over a top-25 team since an 81-76 victory over No. 13 Stanford on Dec. 22, 2001 at the Las Vegas Showdown.

RECORD AGAINST TOP TEAMS

BYU is 4-5 this year against teams that qualified for postseason last year (21-point win over Weber State at home; five-point win over No. 25 Oklahoma State on a neutral floor; 29-point win over CSU; 14-point win over Wyoming; two-point loss at Utah State; one-point loss at Cal, 27-point loss at North Carolina State, four-point loss at SDSU and eight-point setback at Utah). BYU finished last season with a 7-2 record against teams that were conference champions the prior season. BYU went 12-6 last year against teams that qualified for postseason play in 2002.

BYU WAS PRESEASON MEDIA FAVORITE TO CLAIM 2004 MWC CROWN

Bigelow, Araujo were selected to preseason All-MWC team
 The Mountain West Conference released its men's basketball preseason media poll and all-conference team at the league's media day being held at the Denver Marriott Tech Center. The league media selected BYU to claim the Mountain West Conference men's basketball title with 144 total points and 13 of the possible 19 first-place votes. Utah was picked second with 138 points and was the only other team to garner first place votes with six. Defending MWC Tournament Champion Colorado State came in third with 107 points, followed by UNLV fourth with 97. Wyoming placed fifth with 73 points, followed by San Diego State (55), New Mexico (36), and Air Force (35). BYU has earned a share of the conference titles in 2001 and 2003, but this is the first time in more than 10 years the Cougars have been the preseason MWC favorites. The Cougars and Utes shared the conference's regular season crown last season with 11-3 records. BYU went 23-9 overall and fell to Connecticut in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Utah finished the 2002-03 season 25-8, defeating Oregon in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to Kentucky in the second round. The Mountain West Conference has sent six of its eight teams to the postseason each of the past two seasons and is the only league in the country to have sent 75 percent of its members to the postseason two straight years. BYU seniors Mark Bigelow and Rafael Araujo were selected to the preseason first-team All-MWC team. Other athletes picked were Utah's Tim Frost and Nick Jacobson, Air Force's Tim Keller and the top MWC returnee Matt Nelson from CSU.

BYU SCHEDULE INCLUDED ACC, BIG XII AND PAC-10 OPPONENTS

Potential matchups with six nonconference opponents that made the 2003 NCAA Tournament, including teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference, Big XII Conference and Pac-10 Conference, an appearance in the Cable Car Classic, and 15 overall contests against teams that qualified for postseason play last year highlight the 2003-04 BYU men's basketball schedule. "We look forward to what should be a very challenging schedule with more than half our games being against teams that qualified for postseason last year," BYU coach Steve Cleveland said. "We face some very talented teams during nonconference and every game is a battle during the Mountain West season."

COUGARS COMING OFF SUCCESSFUL SUMMER TOUR TO AUSTRALIA

Getting an early jump on the upcoming season, BYU participated in a six-game tour of Australia against professional teams in Sydney, Brisbane and Cairns. "Four years ago when we went to Europe it helped us get a head start on the season," BYU Coach Steve Cleveland said. "This was a nice opportunity to implement our system and give the players some good experience. Everyone got a chance to play significant minutes." BYU earned the first of four consecutive postseason tournament berths under Cleveland in 2000 after its summer 1999 trip to England, Croatia and Italy. The NCAA allows a foreign tour once every four years. The team was also allowed 10 additional practice days to prepare for the trip. All of last year's returning players were allowed to make the trip, including redshirt freshmen Austin Ainge and Garner Meads. Newcomers Mike Hall and Michael Rose, along with returning missionary Derek Dawes, were not eligible for the trip. The Cougars played six games in seven nights, posting a 4-2 record. Senior Mark Bigelow led the team, scoring 21.6 points in 27 minutes per game. Senior center Rafael Araujo added 14.0 ppg and a team-high 7.7 rpg in 20 minutes of action. Redshirt freshman Garner Meads scored 9.3 ppg and pulled down 6.0 rpg. The tour also includes visits to the Sydney Opera House, Taronga Zoo, Manly Beach and the Great Barrier Reef.

NBA DRAFT

BYU's lone departing senior in 2003, guard Travis Hansen, was selected 37th overall in 2003 NBA Draft and has signed a two-year contract with the Atlanta Hawks. BYU rates second among Mountain West Conference teams with 42 NBA Draft selections after UNLV's 49.

WINNING BASKETBALL TRADITION

With its all-time record of 1462-938 (.609), BYU is the ranked 40th all-time in winning percentage among all Division I basketball programs. In terms of total wins, BYU is in the top 25. The Cougars have had 81 winning seasons in their 101 years of basketball and have made 29 postseason appearances, including 20 NCAA bids, and won 26 conference championships.

NCAA TOURNAMENT TRADITION

BYU appeared in its 20th NCAA Tournament with its at-large invite in 2003. BYU coach Steve Cleveland has guided the Cougars to the NCAA Tournament twice (in the last three years) in his six years at the helm since taking over a program that was 1-25 the season before his arrival. He has led BYU to postseason play in each of the last four years.

2002-03 RECAP

In 2002-03, BYU earned its fourth straight postseason berth and second NCAA bid in the last three years while claiming a share of the Mountain West Conference regular season title for the second time in the last three years. Playing among the nation's toughest schedules, including 11 different conferences on its non-league slate, the Cougars finished the year with a 23-9 overall record, going 11-4 through the pre-conference schedule before earning a share of the MWC regular season title with Utah at 11-3. The Cougars went 1-1 at the MWC Tournament before losing to No. 5-seed Connecticut at the NCAA Tournament in Spokane, Wash. BYU went 13-1 at home and 10-8 away, including a 4-3 neutral record and 6-5 road mark. The Cougars had the MWC's top defense and also won the preseason Paradise Jam title in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. BYU was led by senior guard Travis Hansen, junior swingman Mark Bigelow and junior center Rafael Araujo. Hansen, one of two first-team All-MWC consensus players, led the team in scoring (16.8) and blocks (20) and was second in assists (2.4) and rebounds (4.8). Bigelow, a third-team All-MWC selection, was second in scoring (13.9), third in rebounding (3.7) and the team's top three-point shooter (63). Araujo, a third-team All-MWC pick, was the third-leading scorer (12.0) and top rebounder (8.9). Sophomore forward Jared Jensen, who received All-MWC honorable mention, added 7.5 points and 3.3 rebounds while JC transfer Kevin Woodberry averaged 6.3 points and 2.5 assists at the point.





CLEVELAND ON RECRUITING CLASS

"I am very excited about this year's recruiting class," Cleveland said. "I believe this group of student-athletes represents a solid foundation for the program's success in the coming years."

ABOUT BURGESS ...

"David is an intelligent and strong low-post player who will have an immediate impact on our program," Cleveland said. "He is an aggressive rebounder and has a solid understanding of offensive low-post play. I'm excited about coaching David and helping him reach his full potential as a player."

ABOUT CUMMARD ...

"Lee is a versatile athlete who possesses outstanding offensive skills," Cleveland said. "He has great instincts on the floor and plays with a real passion for the game. I love his confidence and aggression level. Lee is a special player who will have a major role in our program."

ABOUT MILES ...

"Chris is an excellent defender and has developed into an outstanding shot-blocker," Cleveland said. "He runs the floor as well as any big man I've coached. Chris has shown real improvement with his offensive skill development and will be a major contributor in the program."

ABOUT PLAISTED ...

"I love Trent's ability to put the ball on the floor and attack the basket," Cleveland said. "He's left handed and very crafty around the basket. Trent will play on the perimeter and continue to develop his outside shooting skills. Trent is 6-foot-10 with great feet and has the potential to be an outstanding defender."

BYU LANDS TOP-20 RECRUITING CLASS

Four highly regarded high school recruits signed a letter-of-intent to play basketball at BYU during the November signing period. Rated one of the top-20 recruiting classes nationally and the third-best class in the West, BYU received official commitments from top prospects David Burgess (Irvine, Calif.), Lee Cummard (Mesa, Ariz.), Chris Miles (Provo, Utah) and Trent Plaisted (San Antonio, Texas).

DAVID BURGESS

Burgess is a 6-foot-10, 260-pound center considered one of the best big men in the country. He was the only high school player to compete on the USA Basketball World Championships Team that finished 7-1, losing only to eventual champion Australia, and went 5-0 to win the 2003 Global Games in Dallas. Burgess averaged 16.4 points, 12.4 rebounds and 2.6 blocks last year as a junior at Woodbridge High School in Irvine, Calif., leading the team to a 21-6 record. During the season, he recorded game highs of 31 points, 20 rebounds, eight assists, four steals and nine blocks. A Street & Smith All-America High Honorable Mention pick, Burgess was a 2003 All-CIF First Team selection and garnered 2003 league MVP and all-county honors. He was all-league and All-CIF as a sophomore while averaging 12 points, 10 rebounds and 2.5 blocks. Entering his senior season, he already has helped Woodbridge claim two CIF championships and one state crown. He played for the Southern California All-Stars during the summer and was an all-star and the leading rebounder at the adidas ABCD Camp. Among the many schools that recruited Burgess were Gonzaga, Louisville, Florida, UCLA, Kansas, Kentucky, Washington State and Utah.

LEE CUMMARD

Cummard is considered one of the top shooting guards in the West and has been rated the No. 1 prospect by some recruiting experts. The 6-foot-6, 175-pound wing player averaged 17 points and six rebounds as a junior last year at Mesa (Ariz.) High School while leading the Jackrabbits to the state tournament quarterfinals before a double-overtime loss. A good athlete with a natural feel for the game, he has all-around abilities and good leadership qualities. SI/CNN calls the versatile Cummard the fifth-best small forward in the West. Known as a fierce competitor, Cummard has good ball-handling skills, excellent shooting range and the toughness to rebound and finish in traffic. A Street & Smith All-America Honorable Mention, he was a member of the East Valley All-Region First Team as a junior after earning second-team honors as a sophomore. He was recruited by Arizona State, UCLA, Oregon, Oregon State, Stanford, Iowa State, Utah State, Utah, New Mexico, Miami, Gonzaga, Oklahoma State, San Diego State and Texas Tech.

CHRIS MILES

Miles is Utah's reigning 4A State MVP and 4A State Tournament MVP out of Timpview High School in Provo. The local standout averaged 11 points, eight rebounds and five blocks for a balanced Thunderbird team that won the state title in 2003 and is ranked No. 25 in the nation entering this season. He was invited to the NBA Players Camp during the summer, where he was rated No. 47 among the nation's top high school players. He has been ranked as high as the No. 2 post player in the West. A Street & Smith All-America High Honorable Mention selection, the 6-foot-10, 225-pound forward is a quick and versatile player, tough defender and outstanding shot-blocker. He is on track to become the No. 2 all-time shot-blocker in Utah high school history during his senior season behind former BYU and current NBA center Shawn Bradley. Gonzaga, Utah State, Utah, Kansas, Oregon State, Connecticut, UCLA, Vanderbilt, Wyoming and Texas Tech also recruited Miles.

TRENT PLAISTED

Plaisted is a 6-foot-10, 220-pound forward who led Clark High School in San Antonio to the 2003 District 28-5A title and regional quarterfinals in Texas' largest classification. The only junior named to the All-District 28 First Team, Plaisted averaged 12.5 points and 5.5 rebounds as a junior while helping his team (which is preseason No. 2 in Texas this season) achieve a 31-7 record. A left-handed shooter and young player who just turned 17 in October, he has earned MVP honors at numerous tournaments and has been nominated for McDonald's All-America recognition. He averaged 18 points and 10 rebounds this summer on his AAU team, the San Antonio Bulls, where he was given the opportunity to play more on the perimeter. Rated the No. 10 player in Texas, Plaisted impressed at the Texas Elite Camp and made a national name for himself at the 2003 Kingwood Classic in Houston. Long and athletic, Plaisted runs the floor well and has a soft shooting touch to 18 feet. He is a good shot-blocker and solid rebounder. Among schools recruiting Plaisted were Florida State, Stanford, Kansas, Oklahoma State, Washington State, Texas A&M, Utah, Arkansas, New Mexico, Texas Tech, and Vanderbilt.

Steve Cleveland is in his seventh year at the helm of the Cougars in 2003-04. During his tenure at BYU, Cleveland has proven to be a first-rate recruiter, an excellent coach and player developer, and above all, a winner.

He was honored as the MWC Coach of the Year in 2002-03, as voted by the league's coaches and media members, after guiding BYU to a share of the MWC regular season title and a 23-9 record. He has guided BYU to four straight post-season appearances and three 20-win seasons in the last four years. Only two other BYU coaches have ever achieved more 20-win seasons.

In 2002, Cleveland coached BYU to a win over No. 13 Stanford and advanced to the second round of the NIT before losing at eventual champion Memphis despite having lost four starters and six of his top seven players from the prior season. In 2001, Cleveland guided BYU to its first NCAA tournament bid since 1995, its first conference regular season title since 1993 and its first conference tournament championship since 1992. While rebuilding a program that finished 1-25 before his arrival, he has posted records of 9-21, 12-16, 22-11, 24-9, 18-12 and 23-9. The 1999-2000, 2000-2001 and 2002-03 seasons all rank among of the school's best years ever in terms of wins. In fact, since BYU's first season in 1903, only five BYU teams have ever recorded more wins than the 24-9 team in 2000-01.

Cleveland has brought the magic of the Marriott Center back in Provo. BYU averaged 14,468 fans in 2002-03, including the largest crowd (22,702) since 1992. BYU had the nation's largest percentage increase in attendance in 2003. The Cougars owned the nation's longest homecourt victory streak for much of the 2002 and 2003 seasons until it finally ended at 44 games. BYU has won 49 of its last 50 games at home, including back-to-back unbeaten seasons of 15-0 and 16-0 in 2001 and 2002.

Cleveland's teams have traditionally been prepared to play their best at the end of the season. BYU went 5-2 in March in 2002-03 and earned its second conference regular season title and NCAA bid in the last three years. BYU has been to the post-season four straight years. In 2001-02 BYU won in the first round of the NIT before losing at eventual NIT champion Memphis. In 2000-01, BYU won five straight games on the road to secure a share of the MWC regular season title and earn the automatic NCAA bid by claiming the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas. The Cougars won six of their last eight games the prior season, including two MWC tournament wins and two NIT victo-

ries. In Cleveland's first year, BYU completed a rare sweep of New Mexico and UTEP on the road to earn a WAC tournament berth. The road sweep of New Mexico and UTEP was the first for BYU since 1990-91 and the 83-62 upset of No.15-ranked New Mexico in the Pit ended the Lobos' 41-game home winning streak. In Cleveland's second season the Cougars had a blowout win over UTEP before a 90-74 conference tournament upset victory over TCU to achieve BYU's first conference tournament win since 1994.

Cleveland's teams have advanced to the finals of the MWC tournament in two of the four seasons the event has been played, winning the title in 2001.

As a recruiter, Cleveland has made a similar impact on BYU's program. Cleveland's recruits have proven they are not only committed to Cleveland's vision but also are the kind of players to help make that vision a reality in Provo. Cleveland and his staff have been able to attract top talent from Utah and beyond.

Cleveland has a string of top conference newcomers. Six players have earned conference newcomer honors in Cleveland's six years as the Cougar coach, including four who have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. He would have added his seventh newcomer award if you consider the MWC did not have the award in 2002-03, but JC transfer Rafael Araujo was named the Newcomer of the Year by the conference media members in a poll conducted by the Las Vegas Review-Journal.

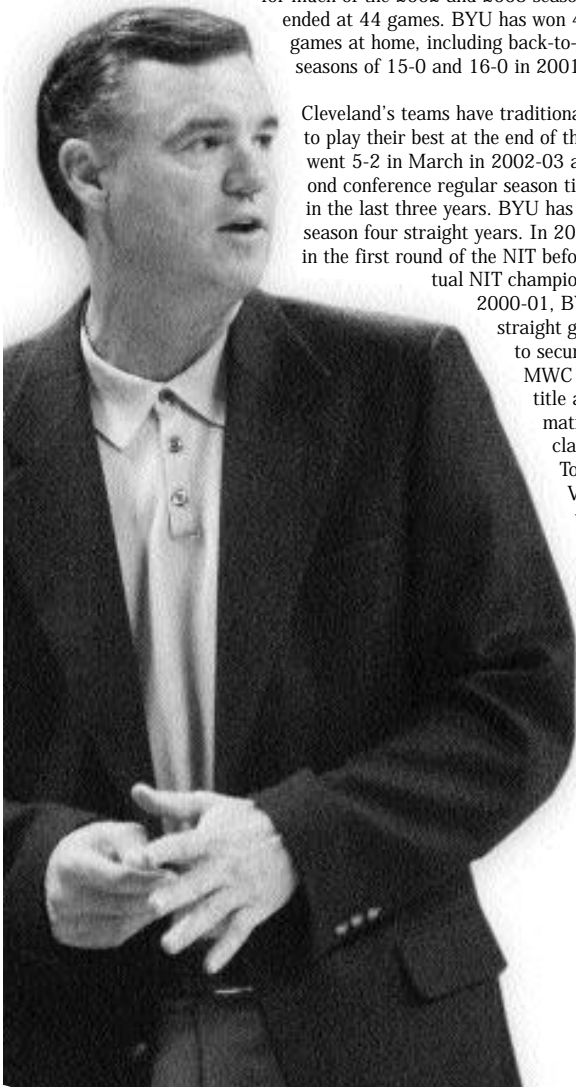
In October 2001, Cleveland signed a multi-year contract extension with BYU. Before taking the helm with the Cougars on March 11, 1997, Cleveland compiled a 157-77 record at Fresno City College in Fresno, Calif. Cleveland was named coach of the year two times while at FCC and led the Rams to post-season playoffs in each of his seven seasons in Fresno. Cleveland coached 10 years at Fresno's Clovis West High School, compiling a 180-70 record.

PLAYING CAREER

Cleveland played college basketball at UC Irvine and was the Anteaters' MVP and leading scorer his senior season in 1975-76. Prior to attending UC Irvine, Cleveland was Fresno City College's Most Outstanding Player in 1973-74. Cleveland received a B.A. degree in social science from UC Irvine in 1976, and received a Master's in education administration from Fresno Pacific in 1979.

PERSONAL

Cleveland, 51, was born in the Los Angeles area and spent most of his life in Fresno, Calif. He served a full-time mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to England from 1971-73. Cleveland was the first head basketball or football coach at BYU to have served a church mission. Cleveland and his wife Kip have three children: sons Casey (25) and Skyler (22) and daughter Katie (13).

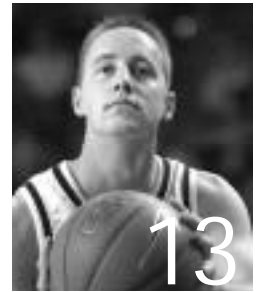

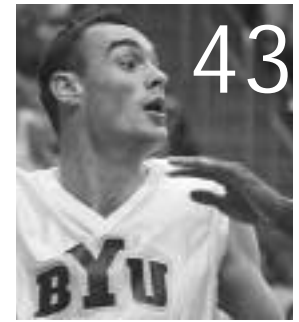
DEREK DAWES / 6-11 • 255 • sophomore • center

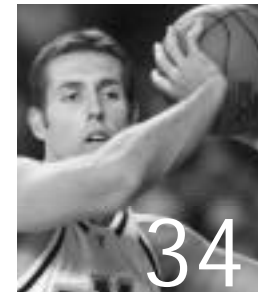
