# BYU HOSTS AIR FORCE MONDAY AT 8:30 P.M.

Riding a five-game winning streak, BYU (17-7, 7-4 MWC) hosts the league-leading Air Force Academy Falcons (19-4, 9-1 MWC) Monday at 8:30 p.m. (MST) in the Marriott Center. The SportsWest Productions telecast will be aired live in Utah on KPNZ-TV, Z-24 (UPN) and is available via ESPN Full Court. The radio broadcast can be heard on KSLNewsradio 1160, beginning with a one-hour pregame show. Live audio and live stats are available online by selecting the basketball schedule page of the official BYU athletics website, byucougars.com. Live audio is also available on KSL.com, via BYU Radio on the Dish Network and at byuradio.org.

#### **COUGAR CAPSULE**

The Cougars (17-7, 7-4) has won five straight games and is currently tied for second in the MWC standings. The preseason favorite to win the Mountain West Conference, BYU finished nonconference play with a 10-3 record, including the Cable Car Classic title and wins over No. 25 Oklahoma State and the Pac-10's USC. BYU returns four starters from last year's 23-9 co-championship team that advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Four-year starter Mark Bigelow and fellow senior Rafael Araujo were both named to the Preseason All-MWC Team. Senior guard Kevin Woodberry and junior forward Jared Jensen were starters last season but are primarily come off the bench this year. Newcomers include junior transfer Mike Hall and freshmen Garner Meads, Mike Rose and Austin Ainge. Araujo is averaging 18.3 points and 10.2 rebounds to lead BYU this year. Bigelow adds 13.4 points and 3.8 rebounds while Hall contributes 12.7 points and 3.6 rebounds. First-year starter Luiz Lemes, a senior combo guard in his second year in Provo, leads the team in assists (4.5). As a team, the Cougars shoot .483 from the floor, .350 on threes, and .730 from the line while scoring 73.7 points per game. BYUallows 64.7 points while the opposition has shot .444 from the field and .336 from behind the arc. BYU has an average rebounding advantage of 6.0.

#### AIR FORCE ACADEMY FALCONS

Air Force returns eight lettermen and three starters from last year's 12-16 team that finished last in the Mountain West with a 3-11 record. The Falcons are on top of the league standings this year with a 9-1 record and 19-4 overall mark. AFA's lone loss came at UNLV. The Falcons are 5-0 at home and 4-1 on the raod in MWC play this year after defeating second-place Utah Saturday in Salt Lake City. Prior to its loss at UNLV, Air Force won a school-record 13 consecutive games, including its blowout win over BYU at the Academy. Overall, the Falcons 11-0 at home this year, 7-4 away and 1-0 on a neutral floor. They will play at BYU Monday then host UNLV and San Diego State before finishing the regular season at Wyoming. Three players are scoring in double figures for the Falcons. Junior guard Tim Keller scores a team-high 10.9 points while sophomore forward/center Nick Welch scores 10.8 points and pulls down a team-leading 4.3 rebounds and sophomore guard Antoine Hood adds 10.1 ppg. Senior forwards Joel Gerlach and A.J. Kuhle add 8.0 and 7.9 points, respectively. Seven Falcons have made at least 15 three-point shots this year as the Falcons make 38.6 percent as a team from behind the arc. Matt McGraw and Jacob Burtschi have made 16 and 15 treys off the bench while all five starters have made at least 24 treys, led by Keller's 41 bombs. McGraw shoots 52 percent from long range, Welch has made 45 percent of his three attempts, and Gerlach and Hood have connected on 41 percent of their three attempts. From the floor overall, Air Force shoots 48.7 percent and makes 72.8 percent from the line to score 62.5 points. The Falcons give up a national-best 48.7 points per game while holding opponents to .434 shooting from the floor, including 28.8 percent from long range. Air Force is out rebounded by an average of 5.8 boards per game. In the latest NCAAstatistical rankings, the Falcons not only lead the nation in field goal percentage defense but also rank No. 4 in fewest turnovers per game, No. 12 in three-point shots made per game, No. 14 in field goal percentage, No. 16 in scoring margin and No. 17 in win-loss percentage. The disciplined, well-executing Falcons commit just 10.7 turnovers per game, while Falcon opponents have turned the ball over an average 16.5 times each game. Air Force is coached by Joe Scott (Princeton, 1987), who is in his fourth season with the Falcons. He has a 48-60 record in his tenure at Air Force. Scott came to AFA from his alma mater, Princeton, where he was an assistant coach from 1993-2000.

#### AIR FORCE'S LAST OUTING -- FALCONS EDGE UTES IN SALT LAKE CITY

SALT LAKE CITY -- Joel Gerlach made two free throws after being fouled on a layup attempt with 1.4 seconds remaining to lift Air Force to a 59-57 victory over Utah on Saturday, giving the Falcons their first ever season sweep of the Utes. Air Force rallied from an eight-point halftime deficit and increased its lead in the Mountain West Conference by winning in Salt Lake City for the first time in 15 years. The Falcons (19-4, 9-1) last won at Utah on Jan. 26 1989, beating the Utes 67-57. Utah (19-7, 7-4) led most of the second half, but Air Force battled back and won in the thrilling finish after Utah unsuccessfully went for the final shot. Nick Jacobson, who led the Utes with 22 points, gave Utah a 54-53 lead with a jumper from the top of the key, but Air Force came right back and regained the lead on a layup by Gerlach. Utah regained the momentum on the next possession, working the ball around to the right corner where Jacobson hit a 3-point-er with about a minute remaining to give Utah a 57-55 lead, but the Utes couldn't hang on to the lead. Nick Welch tied it on two free throws with 37.1 seconds left, then Utah stalled and tried the last shot. The strate-gy failed when Drisdom missed a layup and the rebound kicked out to midcourt, where Gerlach picked up the loose ball and took it in for a layup attempt. He missed, but was fouled by Drisdom with 1.4 seconds left. The officials took several minutes to decide on the call before Gerlach went to the line, where he was booed loudy but calmly hit both shots. Utah didn't get a shot off after the inbounds pass and the Falcons became the first visitor to win at the Huntsman Center this season. Gerlach finished with 15 points, Antoine Hood scored 13 and A.J. Kuhle had 12 points for Air Force, which won despite being outrebounded 29-15 Andrew Bogut had 15 points and seven rebounds, but he and Jacobson were the only Utes to score in double figures. Utah recovered from a slow start, then took a 32-24 halftime lead after Jacobson scored 12 points to lead the Utes on a 17-4 run. Air Force had gone back up 20-15 after the Utes had tied the game at 15all when Jacobson started the Utah rally with two free throws and a 3-pointer to tie it at 20. After a block by Tim Frost, Richard Chaney gave Utah its first lead with a jumper in the lane, then Jacobson added a pair of long jumpers. Frost put Utah ahead 29-24 on a three-point play with 52.8 seconds remaining, then Jacobson hit a 3-pointer just before the buzzer.

#### SERIES NOTES

This will be the 51st meeting between the two teams, with BYU leading the series 41-9. The Cougars are 20-3 in Provo, 18-6 at Air Force, and 3-0 at a neutral site. BYU has won seven of the 10 games in the series since the inception of the Mountain West Conference. The Falcons handed BYU its largest margin of defeat in an MWC game in the first meeting this year at Air Force, downing the Cougars 74-52 while shooting 72.5 percent, the team's highest percentage ever against a Division I team. In the last meeting in Provo, the Cougars beat Air Force in a similar fashion, holding the Falcons to only 33 points in winning by the third largest margin in the series history at 65-33. The 33 points is the fewest scored by the Falcons in the series. AFA scored 40 points in a loss in 1982. BYU won the contest at Clune Arena last year, 56-43. BYU has won eight of the last 12 games in the Marriott Center since a 79-78 Falcon win in 1989 (Cleveland is 4-0 in Provo). Air Force has won four of the last siz at USAFA (Cleveland is 2-4 at Air Force). AFA has not won back-to-back games in the series since the first two games in 1961 and 1963.

## THIS YEAR AT AFA - FALCONS NEARLY FLAWLESS IN 74-52 WIN OVER BYU

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. (Jan. 24, 2004) -- Air Force opened with a 12-2 run and didn't look back as the Falcons defeated BYU 74-52 Saturday to extend their victory streak to 11 games. A Clune Arena record crowd of 6,359 watched the Falcons play nearly flawless basketball. Air Force (13-2, 3-0) executed its "Princeton"-style offense to perfection in the first half, creating open three-point shots and layups. The Falcons hit 6-of-11 three-point attempts in the first half, while the Cougars struggled, hitting only 1-of-6 attempts. Air Force got on a roll early, gaining confidence that didn't leave them the whole game. The Falcons field goal percentage was their second-highest percentage ever and their best against a Division I opponent. The Falcons also played an aggressive match-up zone, which helped create six Cougar turnovers in the game's first eight minutes. During that stretch, Air Force extended its lead to 20-7. The Cougars would counter with a run of their own, cutting the lead to seven at 23-16, but Air Force put the game away with a 19-3 run to close the half with a 42-19 lead. BYU failed to score 20 points in the first half for the first time since scoring 15 points at Auburn on Nov. 23, 1998. Air Force held BYU's leading scorer, Rafael Araujo, to just four points in the first half, while Falcon center Nick Welch lit up the Cougars for 11 points in the first 20 minutes and totaled 20 points for the game, including two three-pointers. Mark Bigelow opened the second half scoring five straight points to cut the Falcon lead to 18, but BYU would get no closer and Air Force would extend its final margin of victory to 22 -- the Cougars' largest-ever dificit to the Falcons and their largest losing margin in a MWC regulars season game. Bigelow finished the game with a season-high 19 points on 6-of-10 shooting to lead BYU, followed by Araujo who finished the game with 12 points and six rebounds.

#### WHAT BYU COACH STEVE CLEVELAND HAD TO SAY AFTER THE GAME AT AIR FORCE THIS YEAR ...

"They took us out of the game in the first 20 minutes. They gave us a good whooping. They shot 72 percent tonight. You can beat anyone shooting 72 percent. Welch was the difference in the game tonight. He really stretched the defense. But all five of the guys on the floor can score and shoot so it makes it really hard to defend."

#### LAST YEAR AT BYU - COUGARS DOWN FALCONS 65-33 IN PROVO

PROVO, Utah (February 3,203) -- Head coach Steve Cleveland records his 100th win at BYU in a 65-33 route over the Air Force Academy Monday night. Cleveland is now 100-74 in his sixth seasons. BYU held the Falcons to just 21.6 percent shooting on the night (11-of-51) and gave up a season-low 33 points to control the Falcons and earn the win. AFA's 10 first-half points was the lowest half of scoring ever in the Marriott Center. BYU improved to 15-4 overall (4-1 MWC) behind Travis Hansen. The senior guard led BYU in scoring with 16 points while grabbing five rebounds in just 23 minutes. Cleveland emptied his bench to allow other players to get minutes. All 13 Cougars played and all but two got on the board. Rafael Araujo was one point away from another double-double. The big man ended the game with nine points and 12 boards in 18 minutes. The Cougars shot a season-high 71.4 percent from behind the arc to gain an early lead on the Falcons, who tried countering the size of the Cougars by playing their slow-paced motion offense. Air Force made just four field goals in the first half and BYU took advantage by taking a 30-10 lead into the locker room. In the second half, the cold shooting continued for the Falcons and BYU blew the game wide open. The Cougars took their largest lead of the game of 37 points on a layup by Jake Shoff with 3:55 to play. The Cougars kept the Falcons off the boards all night and out-rebounded AFA 55-21. Tim Keller and Antoine Hood scored nine points each to lead the Academy. Keller dropped five threes on BYU last year at Colorado Springs in the Air Force win. With the loss, Air Force drops to 10-9 overall and 1-5 in the conference.

#### WHAT BYU COACH STEVE CLEVELAND HAD TO SAY AFTER THE GAME IN PROVO LAST YEAR ...

"I thought we did a nice job of containing their back cuts and contesting shots. There were 10 or 15 shots they missed that they will hit at their place. It will be a different game at Air Force."

#### GAME 24 RECAP - HOT-SHOOTING COUGARS DOWN LOBOS

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 21, 2004) -- Rafael Araujo led four Cougars scoring in double figures with 18 points while grabbing eight rebounds as the Cougars defeated New Mexico 88-71 Saturday night in front of 18,367 screaming fans at the Marriott Center. The Lobos used an early 9-0 run to jump out to a seven-point lead before the Cougars outscored New Mexico 22-3 to give BYU the lead for good at 32-23. New Mexico would pull within two points just before the half before Luiz Lemes buried a three to put BYU up by five at the half. The Cougars shot well in the first half, hitting 53.6 percent of their shots, including 50 percent from behind the arc. BYU didn't cool off in the second half, opening the half on a 13-2 run to put the game out of reach. Senior forward Mark Bigelow helped ignite the Cougar run, scoring nine of his 16 points during the run. The Cougars finished the game shooting a red-hot 60 percent from the floor and a season-high 52.3 from three-point land. Fan-favorite Mike Rose entered the game in the second half and promptly hit three of his four attempts from three-point range for nine points. The Lobos and Cougars tied a Marriott Center record set last year by the same two teams with a combined 23 three-pointers. The Lobos went 14-of-32 (.438) while BYU finished 9-of-17 from long range. "Certainly, offensively I felt like we got the touches I wanted and we shot well," BYU coach Steve Cleveland said. "We had good movement." BYU also had an excellent game on New Mexico's Dany Granger, who lit up the Cougars for 27 points in their previous meeting, holding him nearly 12 points below his average with just nine points. "I thought Mike Hall played extremely well," said Cleveland, who now has the second most victories by a BYU coach in the Marriott Center with an 82-18 record, "Guarding Granger is not easy and he responded really well. It was a solid win. It was exactly what we needed. We had a lot of guys step up and play well." Besides his excellent defense, Hall poured in 16 points and grabbed five rebounds. Lemes was BYU's fourth player to score in double figures, finishing with 12 points. Troy DeVries led the Lobos with 16 points on the strength of 5-of-9 three-point shooting. Javin Tindall contributed 12 points, including three treys. With the victory, the Cougars improve to 7-4 in conference (17-7 overall), while the Lobos fall to 4-6 in conference (13-10 overall).

#### **POSTGAME NOTES**

-- BYU has now won five games in a row, improving to 17-7 (7-4 MWC). -- The Cougars have won 16 straight in the Marriott center and 60 out of their last 61 at home.

-- Saturday night's attendance, 18,367, marks the highest attendance in the Marriott Center this season. -- With the victory, Coach Steve Cleveland has surpassed Frank Arnold as the second winningest coach at the Marriott Center, notching 82 wins. He is now just 10 behind Roger Reid for the top spot (92)

- Mark Bigelow, who scored 16 points, is now just 19 points behind Kenneth Roberts for eighth all-time on BYU's scoring list. Kenneth Roberts scored 1652 points at BYU. Bigelow now has 1633.

Guard Terry Nashif made his first appearance in 6 games after being out with mononucleosis. He last played at New Mexico Jan. 24.

- BYU scored 88 points, its highest scoring output in MWC play this season.

-- BYU is 7-0 this year when scoring above 80 points.

-- The Cougars had their best three-point shooting game of the season. BYU shot 9-17 (52.9%). -- BYU shot 60% overall, the second best field goal percentage of the season (BYU shot 62% against Utah State 12/23/03).

- Saturday's game marked the celebration of Cosmo's 50th birthday. Forty former cosmos were in attendance

-- More than half of New Mexico's shots were three-pointers. The Lobos attempted 32 threes out of 56 shots. -- New Mexico's Danny Granger, who hit the game winning shot against BYU last month, was held to 9 points, 3 boards (he averages 21 and 9).

#### BYU ACHIEVES RARE SUCCESS ON THE FRONT RANGE

BYUswept the Wyoming-CSU road trip for the second straight season. The last time BYU swept the Cowboys and Rams in back-to-back years was during the 1971-72 and 1972-73 seasons. BYU last won at CSUin consecutive years 10 years ago during the 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons. BYU last won consecutive trips to Wyoming in 1994-95 and 1995-96.

#### COUGARS PRODUCING IN TRANSITION

BYU has pushed the ball more during its current five-game winning streak. The Cougars averaged 3.7 fastbreak points to their opponents' 2.0 transition points over the first six MWC games, posting a 2-4 record. In the last five games -- all victories, BYUhas scored 13.0 points per game in transition, while opponents have averaged 4.0 fast-break points. Last Monday at CSU, BYUheld a 19-0 advantage in that category with several offensive explosions produced in transition. BYU's defense has helped start its break, coming up with double-digit steals in four of the last five games. BYUhas had three other games this season with 10 or more thefts (CSU in Provo, ISU and Weber State) and all were wins.

#### HALL NAMED MWC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK LAST MONDAY

BYU's Mike Hall and Utah's Tim Drisdom were named Co-Mountain West Conference Players of the Week Monday after leading their respective teams to 2-0 records last week. Hall, a junior guard from San Bernardino, Calif., shot 68.8 percent from the floor (11-of-16) and 82 percent from the free throw line (9-of-11), while averaging 16.5 points, three rebounds and three steals in two games last week. He scored a team-high 20 points in BYU's overtime win against San Diego State (83-69) last Monday. Hall connected on 6-of-10 field goals and 8-of-9 free throws, while grabbing five rebounds and recording a career-high five steals. He made 5-of-6 shots, including 2-of-3 treys, to score 13 points as BYU earned its first conference road win of the season at Wyoming Saturday, 67-53. A first-team NJCAA All-American at Dixie State College last year, Hall is BYU's third-leading scorer and rebounder in his first season in Provo, helping the Cougars to their current 16-7 record. This is the first MWC Player of the Week honor for Hall.

#### CLEVELAND ACHIEVED MARRIOTT CENTER MILESTONE SATURDAY -- NOW NO. 2 ON VICTORY LIST

Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland has guided BYU to the second-most Marriott Center wins. With his 82-18 record in the Cougars' home arena, he is currently second, just passing Frank Arnold who has 81 victo-ries. Roger Reid has the most Marriott Center wins with 92. Ladell Andersen is fourth with 71. With BYU's seventh win this season, Cleveland moved into fifth on BYU's career coaching victories list. He moved past Ladell Andersen (114-71 record from 1983-89). Cleveland now has a 125-85 record in his seventh season in Provo. Legendary Cougar coach Stan Watts has the most wins in school history with 372 triumphs from 1949-72. Ott Romney (1927-35) and Roger Reid (1989-96) both achieved 152 victories and Frank Arnold (1975-83) is fourth with 137 wins

#### FOCUS ON FINISHING

With its current five-game victory streak, the Cougars have gone from a tie at the bottom of the MWC standings at 2-4 to a tid for second at 7-4. The Cougars have traditionally finished strong under Steve Cleveland to earn postseason bids. They have shared the conference title in two of the last three years. BYU faces MWC-leader Air Force Monday with title hopes still a possibility. With its solid RPI rating, a strong finish to the regular season could likely put the Cougars in position to obtain another NCAA bid.

Kevin Woodberry played a strong game, holding Jay Straight to five points on 2-Of-9 shooting, twice blocking his three-point attempts. He added a season-high 5 rebounds with 6 points on the offensive end ... Freshman Garner Meads had a career-high 19 points along with 8 boards vs. SDSU ... Mike Hall recorded a personal-best 5 steals while scoring 20 points. He extended his free-throw streak to 18 straight before a miss, going 8-for-9 on the night ... Against UNLV, Luiz Lemes recorded a career-high 10 assists ... At Utah, Mark Bigelow scored a season-high 22 points on 7-of-11 shooting, including three triples. Bigelow pullled down a season-high nine rebounds the prior outing at New Mexico ... Mike Hall also scored 21 points, one below his season-high, and Araujo recorded a double-double (21 points, 11 rebounds) against the Lobos ... Bigelow scored a 19 points on 6-of-10 shooting at Air Force ... Meads recorded his first double-double with career highs of 13 points and 10 rebounds vs. Wyoming in Provo ... Bigelow dished out a career-best 9 assists vs. the Cowboys ... Against CSU, Jared Jensen tied his career-high 10 rebounds, Terry Nashif set a new personal best of 6 rebounds, and Austin Ainge got his first extended playing time, logging 10 minutes and scoring a career-best 6 points while dishing out a high of 2 assists.

The Cougars have won at home this year by an average of 20.5 points. BYU's three-point win over UNLV is the only home game in the Marriott Center, where BYU is 11-0 this year, with a final margin of less than 14 points. The Cougars, however, did win in overtime over SDSU by 14 and played a close game against Wyoming before the final margin of 14 points. BYU achieved its largest halftime lead of the season vs. CSU in Provo, taking a 26-point advantage to the break. The Cougars also equaled their largest first-half scoring output of the season with 49 points. The most points BYUhas scored in a half this year is 51 points in the second half against Idaho State at the Cable Car Classic. The Cougars' 29-point victory over CSU, however, is not the largest margin of victory for the Cougars in Mountain West play. Last year BYU defeated Air Force in Provo by 32 points, 65-33. BYU's largest margin of victory this season overall was a 36point win over Western Oregon. On the losing side of the big numbers, BYU was down 23 points at the half on the way to suffering its largest margin of defeat in a Mountain West Conference regular-season game with its 22-point setback at Air Force. The league-leading Falcons had their best shooting night ever against a Division I team (and second best against any team) at 72.5 percent.

#### ARAUJO SELECTED TO WOODEN AWARD MIDSEASON TOP 30 LIST

Senior Rafael Araujo has been selected as one of the top-30 candidates for the Wooden Award Player of the Year and All-America Team by the John R. Wooden Award Midseason Committee. On March 30, the 10-player Wooden All-America Team will be announced. One member of the team will be selected April 10 to receive the Wooden Award as the nation's "Most Outstanding Collegiate Basketball Player of the Year." BYU's Danny Ainge was rec-ognized as the nation's top player in 1981 when he received the Wooden Award.

#### ARAUJO AMONG NATION'S MOST PRODUCTIVE PLAYERS

Araujo has the fourth-highest combined scoring and rebounding averages among players nationally who are aver-aging a double-double this year. Kris Humphries of Minnesota, Emeka Okafor of Connecticut and Jaime Lloreda of Louisiana State are the only players averaging more combined points and rebounds than Araujo. Araujo has 13 double-double games this year and 20 for his career. Araujo tied an MWC record by posting five consecutive doube-doubles starting with the UVSC game double-double streak ended with his 23 points and 7 rebounds in 24 minutes against Weber State. During his five-game double-double streak, Araujo averaged 26 points and 13.6 rebounds.

#### ARAUJO LEADS NATION'S BIG CENTERS IN SCORING AND REBOUNDING

Araujo has the top scoring and rebounding averages of any of the nation's centers 6-11 or taller. Colorado's 7-foot David Harrison is second in scoring at 16.4 points, while Western Kentucky's 6-foot-11 Nigel Dixon is second to Araujo in rebounds at 9.9 boards per game.

#### ARAUJO RATES HIGH IN NATIONAL AND MWC STATISTICS

Senior center Rafael Araujo is ninth in the nation in rebounds in the latest release of NCAAstatistics (Feb. 17). Among MWCplayers entering Saturday's games, he is the top scorer and third rebounder and is second in steals. Araujo leads all MWCplayers in steals in league games.

#### ARAUJO NAMED CABLE CAR CLASSIC MVP

Araujo was named MVP of the Cable Car Classic after averaging 20.5 points and 11.5 rebounds and leading BYU to the title with wins over Idaho State and host Santa Clara. Against ISU, he made 10-of13 shots, including his only three attempt, scored a team-high 23 points, added 11 rebounds, two blocks, two steals and one assist. Against host Santa Clara, he scored 18 points, all in the second half, against constant triple-teaming while dishing out three assists and grabbed 12 rebounds. # ARAUJO BECAME FIRST BACK-TO-BACK MWC WEEKLY PLAYER AWARD WINNER (DEC. 7-DEC. 13)

BYU senior center Rafael Araujo captured Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week hon-Southern California (85-61). Araujo is the first MWCplayer to win the award on back-to-back weeks since the inception of the MWC in 1999-2000. It was Araujo's third career player of the week honor. In the two games, Araujo averaged 21.5 points and 12.5 rebounds, while shooting 64 percent. He scored 15 points, grabbed 14 rebounds and blocked two shots in just 25 minutes against Western Oregon. In the 14-point victory over USC, Araujo netted 28 points, 11 boards and two steals. He hit 10-of-15 field goals, including a career-best two treys.

#### ARAUJO EARNED ESPN NATIONAL PLAYER SUPPORTING CAST RECOGNITION (DEC. 7-DEC. 13)

BYU senior center Rafael Araujo was regognized as one of the nation's top performers last week as supporting cast mention to ESPN's weekly national player honor. Araujo was one of seven players singled out by ESPN for outstanding play. ESPN also acknowledged it was the second consecutive week Araujo deserved the honor, stating, "OK, we admit we messed up by not including Araujo last week in the supporting cast." Araujo was named national player of the week that week by both the Sporting News and Collegeinsider.com.

#### ARAUJO EARNED NATIONAL, MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS (NOV. 30-DEC. 6)

BYU senior center Rafael Araujo was named the National Player of the Week by The Sporting News and by Collegeinsider.com for the week of Nov. 30-Dec. 6 after recording two double-dou-bles in victories at Boise State (75-69) and against 25th-ranked Oklahoma State (76-71). He was also named the MWC Player of the Week. He averaged 31.5 points and 15.5 rebounds, while shooting 71.4 percent from the floor and 76.7 percent from the free throw line. In the win at Boise State, Araujo scored 31 points and pulled down 14 rebounds. He made 10-of-13 attempts from the field and earned 14 trips to the free throw line, knocking down 11. #### **BIGELOW PASSED COSIC AS THE NO. 9 ALL-TIME SCORER AT BYU**

Senior Mark Bigelow (1,633 points) needs 19 to tie and 20 points to surpass Kenneth Roberts (1,652 points) and move into eighth place on BYU's all-time scoring list. Bigelow moved past former Cougar great Kresimir Cosic into ninth place against Wyoming in Provo. Cosic scored 1,512 points in only three seasons from 1971-73. Bigelow moved out of a tie with Jay Cheesman (1,408 points) in 10th place against Utah State on Dec. 23. He surpassed current BYU assistant coach Andy Toolson (1,388 points from 1985, 88-90) against USC on Dec. 13 after overtaking Roland Minson (1,375 from 1949-51) against Western Oregon on Dec. 10.

#### FRESHMAN ROSE SETS THREE-POINT RECORD IN HIS COLLEGE DEBUT

It didn't take long for freshman Mike Rose to put his name in the BYU record book. In his college debut, the true freshman guard out of Houston set a new BYU single-game record with eight 3-pointers while scoring a game-high 26 points to lead the Cougars to an 88-54 win over Southern Utah University. His 26 points is the most scoring a game-indi BYU freshman since Mark Bigelow totaled 33 points at Washington State in 1998. Rose's eight 3-pointers broke the BYU record of seven threes in a game, previously set by Nick Sanderson (1992) and Danny Bower (1998). Rose's performance behind the arc was just shy of tying the Marriott Center's record of nine 3-pointers in a game held by Utah State's Jay Goodman (1990). Rose also dished out six assists with only one turnover and added two rebounds and one steal in his 22 minutes off the bench. He made 61.5 percent of his 3-point attempts, going 8-of-13 from behind the arc, and finished 9-for-16 (.563) overall from the floor against Southern Utah's match-up zone. He scored 17 points in 11 first-half minutes on 6-of-8 shooting, including 5-of-7 on threes. He broke the school record with 7:01 left in the second half on a three taken several feet behind the arc.

#### **ROSE CAN PROVIDE INSTANT OFFENSE**

Mike Rose can provide instant offense. The true freshman got off the bench early against CSU in Provo and sparked BYU's decisive first-half run. He logged 11 minutes in the first half, scoring 10 points, and got the crowd in a frenzy hitting 3-of-4 long-range bombs. He played a season-high 23 minutes for the night. It was his second game of more than 20 minutes (other was 22 minutes in season opener when he scored 26 points and hit a BYU record 8 threes). He made 5-of-10 threes and scored 14 points in 18 minutes against Western Oregon and went 4-for-4, including 3-of-3 on threes, for 11 points in nine minutes vs. USC. He went 3-for-4 on treys for nine points in 12 minutes vs. UNM Saturday. He has only played double-digit minutes in seven games but he has 26 triples. He ranks first in three-point percentage in all games among MWC players.

#### COUGARS CLAIM CABLE CAR CLASSIC TITLE

SANTA CLARA, Calif. (Dec. 30, 2003) -- With its top three post players fouled out of the game, BYU looked to Mark Bigelow and he delivered a slashing bucket-and-one with 14.9 seconds remaining to lead the Cougars to a 68-66 win over host Santa Clara to claim the Cable Car Classic title at the Leavey Center. Senior center Rafael Araujo again loomed large, posting his eighth double-double in nine games with 18 points and 12 rebounds -- with all 18 points scored in the second half. Araujo was named the Cable Car Classic Most Valuable Player after combining for 41 points and 23 boards in the two Cougar wins. With its title this year, BYU won for the third time in four Cable Car appearances to tie the University of San Francisco for the second-most Cable Car Classic titles and the most of any non-Bay Area team. SCU leads with 13 titles and the Cougars have beaten the Broncos for each of their three titles. BYU also breaks SCU's six-game winning streak in the tournament, as the Broncos won the previous two titles.

#### **CLOSE CALLS**

BYU has played 10 games this year where the outcome was in question entering the final minute. The Cougars have gone 6-4 in those games. BYU's four losses in close games have come by a combined nine points. BYU's 10 other wins have been by a margin of 14 or more points, with six being by more than 20 points, including two 30-plus point blowouts. BYU has suffered two blowout losses, a 27-point setback at North Carolina State and a 22-point defeat at Air Force. BYUis 16-0 when leading with five minutes remaining and 16-1 when holding the advantage or it is tied with one minute left in the game.

#### COUGAR OPPONENTS HAVING STRONG SEA SONS

BYUhas played two of the nation's hottest teams this year, handing No. 7 Oklahoma State (21-2) one of its two losses and losing by two points at No. 25 Utah State (22-2). The seven teams to beat BYU this year have a combined 113-53 (.681) record. Of those seven teams, four are in the top 2 in their league standings.

#### ON THE ROAD

BYUis 6-7 away from the Marriott Center this year with a 4-7 away record and a 2-0 neutral court mark. BYU played a stretch this year of 8-of-11 games on the road. For the second straight season, the Cougars played more nonconference games away from Provo than they did in the friendly confines of the Marriott Center. This year, BYUplayed six games at home and seven out-of-town contests while going 10-3 in nonconference. BYU went 6-0 at home and 4-3 away from Provo, with a 2-0 neutral court mark and a 2-3 record in an opponent's arena. Among those games included a neutral court win over then No. 25 Oklahoma State; a win at Boise State; and a victory over host Santa Clara to win the Cable Car Classic. Last season BYUplayed seven home games and eight away from the Marriott Center while earning an 11-4 record before starting Mountain West Conference play. BYU finished 4-4 away from home last year during nonconference play. The Cougars went 3-1 on a neutral floor, including a 3-0 mark to win the Paradise Jam, and were 1-3 in true away games, with a win over Arizona State.

#### IN THE MARRIOTT CENTER

BYUis 11-0 at home this year and has won 16 straight overall in the Marriott Center. BYU has won 60 of its last 61 games at home and is 55-1 over the past four seasons. BYU finished last season 13-1 at home. Lone senior Travis Hansen concluded his three seasons as a Cougar having lost only once at home. BYU earned a 44-1 record in Hansen's three years at BYU – the best three-year home record in school history. The second-best home record over three years was a 39-2 mark from 1979-81 in Danny Ainge's final three seasons. The 44-1 record over the prior three seasons is the school's best-ever three-year home record. BYU won a school-record 44 straight home games in the Marriott Center before losing to Utah, 79-75, on Jan. 25. The streak was the longest active streak in the country over parts the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons. BYU continues its string of nonconference home wins.

#### NONCONFERENCE VICTORY STREAK IN THE MARRIOTT CENTER

The Cougars have defeated 40 straight non-conference opponents in the Marriott Center since starting the streak with a 61-59 win over Utah State on Jan. 2, 1999. The last non-league foe to win in Provo was the California Bears, who edged BYU 71-70 on Dec. 19, 1998.

#### COUGAR FANS SHOWING SUPPORT

BYUis averaging 14,458 after 10 home games this year. BYU had a season-high 18,367 attendance Saturday vs. New Mexico. Last year BYU averaged the 17th largest crowd in the nation overall at 14,468. The NCAA announced that BYU achieved the nation's largest average increase over the prior season in 2001-2002 (during the middle of the 2002 Winter Olympic Games in Salt Lake City). BYU's 22,702 attendance vs. CSU in its last home game last year was the largest crowd since 1992 and the 21st largest crowd in school history.

#### OVERTIME

BYU's win over San Diego State in its last home game was the Cougars' first overtime game of the season. BYU's last OT game was an 86-80 OT loss to Colorado State in the MWC tournament last year. The Cougars had lost four straight overtime contests prior to beating SDSU. BYU's prior overtime victory came at Florida International on Dec. 23, 1999. The Cougars had last played in an overtime game at home on Nov. 28, 1998, losing to the Arizona 78-74. BYU's last home win in overtime before the SDSUvictory was on Jan. 26, 1995, against UTEP. BYU has a 1-3 record in overtime against New Mexico, including an 0-2 mark in Provo. The last time the Cougars and Lobos went an extra five minutes was in 1994, when UNM downed the Cougars 84-82 in Provo.

#### **TOP-25 OPPONENTS**

Facing then No. 25 Oklahoma State, BYUplayed its first top-25 ranked team this season. The victory over the (currently No. 7) Cowboys was BYU's first over a top-25 team since an 81-76 victory over No. 13 Stanford on Dec. 22, 2001 at the Las Vegas Showdown.

#### **RECORD AGAINST TOP TEAMS**

BYUis 8-5 this year against teams that qualified for postseason last year (21-point win over Weber State at home; five-point win over No. 25 Oklahoma State on a neutral floor; 29-point and six-point wins over CSU; two 14-point wins over Wyoming; three-point win over UNLY; 14-point OT win over SDSU; two-point loss at Utah State; one-point loss at Cal, 27-point loss at North Carolina State, four-point loss at SDSU and eight-point setback at Utah). BYU finished last season with a 7-2 record against teams that were conference champions the prior season. BYU went 12-6 last year against teams that qualified for postseason play in 2002.

#### BYU WAS PRESEASON MEDIA FAVORITE TO CLAIM 2004 MWC CROWN

Bigelow, Araujo were selected to preseason All-MWC team

The Mountain West Conference released its men's basketball preseason media poll and all-conference team at the league's media day being held at the Denver Marriott Tech Center. The league media selected BYU to claim the Mountain West Conference men's basketball title with 144 total points and 13 of the possible 19 first-place votes. Utah was picked second with 138 points and was the only other team to garner first place votes with six. Defending MWC Tournament Champion Colorado State came in third with 107 points, followed by UNLV fourth with 97. Wyoming placed fifth with 73 points, followed by San Diego State (55), New Mexico (36), and Air Force (35). BYU has earned a share of the conference titles in 2001 and 2003, but this is the first time in more than 10 years the Cougars have been the preseason MWC favorites. The Cougars and Utes shared the conference's regular season crown last season with 11-3 records. BYU went 23-9 overall and fell to Connecticut in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Utah finished the 2002-03 season 25-8, defeating Oregon in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to Kentucky in the second round. The Mountain West Conference has sent six of its eight teams to the postseason each of the past two seasons and is the only league in the country to have sent 75 percent of its members to the postseason two straight years. BYU seniors Mark Bigelow and Rafael Araujo were selected to the preseason first-team All-MWC team. Other athletes picked were Utahs Tim Frost and Nick Jacobson, Air Force's Tim Keller and the top MWC returnee Matt Nelson from CSU.

#### BYU SCHEDULE INCLUDED ACC, BIG XII AND PAC-10 OPPONENTS

Potential matchups with six nonconference opponents that made the 2003 NCAA Tournament, including teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference, Big XII Conference and Pac-10 Conference, an appearance in the Cable Car Classic, and 15 overall contests against teams that qualified for postseason play last year highlight the 2003-04 BYU men's basketball schedule. "We look forward to what should be a very challenging schedule with more than half our games being against teams that qualified for postseason last year," BYU coach Steve Cleveland said. "We face some very talented teams during nonconference and every game is a battle during the Mountain West season."

#### COUGARS HAD SUCCESSFUL SUMMER TOUR TO AUSTRALIA IN AUGUST

Getting an early jump on the upcoming season, BYU participated in a six-game tour of Australia against professional teams in Sydney, Brisbane and Cairns. "Four years ago when we went to Europe it helped us get a head start on the season," BYU Coach Steve Cleveland said. "This was a nice opportunity to implement our system and give the players some good experience. Everyone got a chance to play significant minutes." BYU earned the first of four consecutive postseason tournament berths under Cleveland in 2000 after its summer 1999 trip to England, Croatia and Italy. The NCAA allows a foreign tour once every four years. The team was also allowed 10 additional practice days to prepare for the trip. All of last year's returning players were allowed to make the trip, including redshirt freshmen Austin Ainge and Garner Meads. Newcomers Mike Hall and Michael Rose, along with returning missionary Derek Dawes, were not eligible for the trip. The Cougars played six games in seven nights, posting a 4-2 record. Senior Mark Bigelow led the team, socring 21.6 points in 27 minutes per game. Senior center Rafael Araujo added 14.0 ppg and a team-high 7.7 rpg in 20 minutes of action. Redshirt freshman Garner Meads scored 9.3 ppg and pulled down 6.0 rpg. The tour also includes visits to the Sydney Opera House, Taronga Zoo, Manly Beach and the Great Barrier Reef.

#### NBA DRAFT

BYU's lone departing senior in 2003, guard Travis Hansen, was selected 37th overall in 2003 NBADraft and has signed a two-year contract with the Atlanta Hawks. BYU rates second among Mountain West Conference teams with 42 NBA Draft selections after UNLV's 49.

#### WINNING BASKETBALL TRADITION

With its all-time record of 1467-938 (.610), BYU is the ranked 40th all-time in winning percentage among all Division I basketball programs. In terms of total wins, BYU is in the top 25. The Cougars have had 81 winning seasons in their 101 years of basketball and have made 29 postseason appearances, including 20 NCAA bids, and won 26 conference championships.

#### NCAA TOURNAMENT TRADITION

BYU appeared in its 20th NCAA Tournament with its at-large invite in 2003. BYU coach Steve Cleveland has guided the Cougars to the NCAA Tournament twice (in the last three years) in his six years at the helm since taking over a program that was 1-25 the season before his arrival. He has led BYU to postseason play in each of the last four years.

#### 2002-03 RECAP

In 2002-03, BYU earned its fourth straight postseason berth and second NCAA bid in the last three years while claiming a share of the Mountain West Conference regular season title for the second time in the last three years. Playing among the nation's toughest schedules, including 11 different conferences on its non-league slate, the Cougars finished the year with a 23-9 overall record, going 11-4 through the pre-conference schedule before earning a share of the MWC regular season title with Utah at 11-3. The Cougars went 1-1 at the MWC Tournament before losing to No. 5-seed Connecticut at the NCAA Tournament in Spokane, Wash. BYU went 13-1 at home and 10-8 away, including a 4-3 neutral record and 6-5 road mark. The Cougars had the MWC's top defense and also won the preseason Paradise Jam title in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. BYU was led by senior guard Travis Hansen, junior swingman Mark Bigelow and junior center Rafael Araujo. Hansen, one of two first-team All-MWC consensus players, led the team in scoring (16.8) and blocks (20) and was second in assists (2.4) and rebounds (4.8). Bigelow, a third-team All-MWC selection, was second in scoring (13.9), third in rebounding (3.7) and the team's top three-point shooter (63). Araujo, a third-team All-MWC pick, was the third-leading scorer (12.0) and top rebounder (8.9). Sophomore forward Jared Jensen, who received All-MWC honorable mention, added 7.5 points and 3.3 rebounds while JCtransfer Kevin Woodberry averaged 6.3 points and 2.5 assists at the point.



Steve Cleveland is in his seventh year at the helm of the Cougars in 2003-04. During his tenure at BYU, Cleveland has proven to be a first-rate recruiter, an excellent coach and player developer, and above all, a winner.

He was honored as the MWC Coach of the Year in 2002-03, as voted by the league's coaches and media members, after guiding BYU to a share of the MWC regular season title and a 23-9 record. He has guided BYU to four straight post-season appearances and three 20-win seasons in the last four years. Only two other BYU coaches have ever achieved more 20-win seasons.

In 2002, Cleveland coached BYU to a win over No. 13 Stanford and advanced to the second round of the NIT before losing at eventual champion Memphis despite having lost four starters and six of his top seven players from the prior season. In 2001, Cleveland guided BYU to its first NCAA tournament bid since 1995, its first conference regular season title since 1993 and its first conference tournament championship since 1992. While rebuilding a program that finished 1-25 before his arrival, he has posted records of 9-21, 12-16, 22-11, 24-9, 18-12 and 23-9. The 1999-2000, 2000-2001 and 2002-03 seasons all rank among of the school's best years ever in terms of wins. In fact, since BYU's first season in 1903, only five BYU teams have ever recorded more wins than the 24-9 team in 2000-01.

Cleveland has brought the magic of the Marriott Center back in Provo. BYU averaged 14,468 fans in 2002-03, including the largest crowd (22,702) since 1992. BYU had the nation's largest percentage increase in attendance in 2003. The

Cougars owned the nation's longest homecourt victory streak for much of the 2002 and 2003 seasons until it finally ended at 44 games. BYU has won 49 of its last 50 games at home, including back-to-back unbeaten seasons of 15-0 and 16-0 in 2001 and 2002.

> Cleveland's teams have traditionally been prepared to play their best at the end of the season. BYU went 5-2 in March in 2002-03 and earned its second conference regular season title and NCAA bid in the last three years. BYU has been to the postseason four straight years. In 2001-02 BYU won in the first round of the NIT before losing at eventual NIT champion Memphis. In

2000-01, BYU won five straight games on the road to secure a share of the MWC regular season title and earn the automatic NCAA bid by claiming the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas. The Cougars won six of their last eight games the prior season, including two MWC tournament wins and two NIT victories. In Cleveland's first year, BYU completed a rare sweep of New Mexico and UTEP on the road to earn a WAC tournament berth. The road sweep of New Mexico and UTEP was the first for BYU since 1990-91 and the 83-62 upset of No.15-ranked New Mexico in the Pit ended the Lobos' 41-game home winning streak. In Cleveland's second season the Cougars had a blowout win over UTEP before a 90-74 conference tournament upset victory over TCU to achieve BYU's first conference tournament win since 1994.

Cleveland's teams have advanced to the finals of the MWC tournament in two of the four seasons the event has been played, winning the title in 2001.

As a recruiter, Cleveland has made a similar impact on BYU's program. Cleveland's recruits have proven they are not only committed to Cleveland's vision but also are the kind of players to help make that vision a reality in Provo. Cleveland and his staff have been able to attract top talent from Utah and beyond.

Cleveland has a string of top conference newcomers. Six players have earned conference newcomer honors in Cleveland's six years as the Cougar coach, including four who have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. He would have added his seventh newcomer award if you consider the MWC did not have the award in 2002-03, but JC transfer Rafael Araujo was named the Newcomer of the Year by the conference media members in a poll conducted by the Las Vegas Review-Journal.

In October 2001, Cleveland signed a multi-year contract extension with BYU. Before taking the helm with the Cougars on March 11, 1997, Cleveland compiled a 157-77 record at Fresno City College in Fresno, Calif. Cleveland was named coach of the year two times while at FCC and led the Rams to post-season playoffs in each of his seven seasons in Fresno. Cleveland coached 10 years at Fresno's Clovis West High School, compiling a 180-70 record.

#### **PLAYING CAREER**

Cleveland played college basketball at UC Irvine and was the Anteaters' MVP and leading scorer his senior season in 1975-76. Prior to attending UC Irvine, Cleveland was Fresno City College's Most Outstanding Player in 1973-74. Cleveland received a B.A. degree in social science from UC Irvine in 1976, and received a Master's in education administration from Fresno Pacific in 1979.

#### PERSONAL

Cleveland, 51, was born in the Los Angeles area and spent most of his life in Fresno, Calif. He served a full-time mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to England from 1971-73. Cleveland was the first head basketball or football coach at BYU to have served a church mission. Cleveland and his wife Kip have three children: sons Casey (25) and Skyler (22) and daughter Katie (13).

BYU is 7-1 in MWCplay with Jensen in suited up and and 0-3 without him ... He had 3 points and 2 rebounds in 9 minutes vs. New Mexico and had 6 points, 2 rebounds and 1 assist while playing solid defense in only 10 minutes at CSU Monday ... He also played only 10 minutes at Wyoming but hit two key free throws to help stave off a Cowboy run, his first free throw attempts since Jan. 17 vs. CSU ... He is 13-15 (.867) from the line in MWCgames ... He missed the first game of his career at Air Force after playing in 78 straight games for BYU, including 58 starts ... In part due his recovery from an earlier hand injury and most recently his back, he has seen more limited playing time this season, topping more than 20 minutes in a game only three times after averaging 20 minutes or better his first two years ... He played 22 minutes vs. CSU in Provo, scoring 8 points and equaling a career-high 10 rebounds ... His 10 points at Utah State is his first double-figure game of the year ... Last year BYU had a 10-1 record when he reached double figures ... 





# TERRY NASHIF / 5-10 • 165 • junior • point guard

SEASON NOTES: Nashif saw his first action, playing 7 minutes, vs. New Mexico after not playing in the prior five games, missing three straight with mononucleosis before not having his number called at Wyoming and CSU while still not 100 percnet ... He has played double-digit minutes in eight contests ... He started at Air Force and had 2 points, 2 steals and 1 aassist in 13 minutes ... He had a career-best 6 rebounds and added 4 points and 3 assists in only 8 minutes on a sore ankle vs. CSU ... He provided a spark in 12 minutes at SDSUbefore leaving with an injured ankle ... He has had BYU's high assist game once this year, dishing out a career-best 8 assists against Idaho State at the Cable Car Classic in 18 minutes ... He had season-high 21 minutes and 6 points vs. Western Oregon.

**PRESEASON CAPSULE**: Nashif is a solid floor leader with experience who will compete for playing time at the point ... He has been the primary backup the past two seasons ... He made six starts and averaged 14.7 minutes playing in all 32 games last year after averaging 2.9 minutes in 21 games his freshman season behind senior starter and BYU assist record-holder Matt Montague ... A smart player and good distributor of the ball, he led BYU in assists (3.0) and ranked first among MWC players in Assist/TO Ratio during league games last year ... He averaged 2.2 assists overall while adding 2.1 ppg ... He has a nice shot from three-point range and is perhaps BYU's best ballhandler.



SOPHOMORE(2002-03): Nashif played in every game and started in six contests, averaging 14.7 minutes per game ... a good playmaker, in

MWC games he led BYU in assists (3.0) and ranked first among MWC players in Assist/TO Ratio ... got his first-ever start vs. Idaho State, playing 27 minutes, hitting a trey and dishing out 3 assists with 3 rebounds. ...guarding UNLV's Marcus Banks, who went onto become an NBA first-round draft selection, he had career highs of 2 blocks and 7 assists (1 turnover), adding 4 boards in Provo ... set career highs in points (11), FG (3), 3FG (3), 3FGA (3), FG% and 3FG% (3-3), and minutes played (30) at SDSU in BYU's win ... in the win, he helped BYU start fast, hitting three treys as BYU hit its first seven threes of the game ... his 3-3 treys was the first time a Cougar has been perfect on at least three attempts since Daniel Bobik went 4-4 at Memphis in the 2002 NIT ... hit a timely trey in the late-going at CSU and silenced UNM fans with a trey after a Ruben Douglas dunk got the crowd going ... tied his career-high 7 assist at UNM without a turnover.

FRESHMAN(2001-02): Nashif was the only true point guard backing up Matt Montague after the loss of Shawn Opunui to injury in the eighth game of the year ... with starter Matt Montague playing a team-high 37 minutes per game Nashif averaged 2.9 minutes while appearing in 21 games ... played one minute or less in nine games ... averaged 0.5 points, 0.4 rebounds and 0.5 assists per game ... equalled his season high playing 10 minutes vs. Southern Utah, recording a high of 3 rebounds ... played 10 minutes against Fort Lewis, and had 2 points and 3 assists ... had 3 points, going 3-6 from the line, while playing five minutes vs. CSUN ... set a career high with 4 points in 4 minutes at Wyoming, going 4-4 from the line, a career-best percentage and personal best in free throws made... scored two points on two free throws in 2 minutes vs. UC Irvine in the NIT First Round victory.





## GARNER MEADS / 6-8 • 230 • redshirt freshman • forward

SEASON NOTES: Meads has 12 starts this year, including 10 of the last 11 games ... He has played double-digit minutes in 17 games this year, including 11 of the last 13 ... He has four double-figure scoring games and one double-digit rebounding outing ... In MWC games, he is fourth on the team in scoring at 7.2 ppg, and he is second in rebounds at 4.3 rpg ... He has led BYU in rebounds in two games this year ... He played only eight minutes but scored 6 points on 2-2 shooting from the floor and the line vs. UNM ... He had 5 points, including a powerful drive and one-handed slam in traffic, while adding 7 rebounds, 1 block and 1 steal at CSU ... He had a career-high 2 steals at Wyoming ... He played a career-best 34 minutes vs. SDSU, scoring a personal-best 19 points on 7-of-11 shooting, including an aggressive one-handed slam through traffic in transition, and added 8 rebounds ... He scored 10 points at Utah, all in the first half, and added 5 rebounds, 1 atsist, 1 steal and 1 blocked shot while logging 29 minutes ... He came off the bench at Air Force, scoring 5 points and grabbing 5 rebounds in 11 minutes ...
