BYU PLAYS AT UTAH STATE WEDNESDAY IN FIRST OF HOME-AND-HOME SERIES THIS SEASON

BYU (1-3) faces the Utah State Aggies (3-1) in Logan Wednesday in the first game of a home-and-home series between the two teams this season. The Aggies come to Provo to play the Cougars on Dec. 18. Wednesday's game is being televised locally on KJZZ-TV. The radio broadcast can be heard on KSL Newsradio 1160 or online at KSL.com. BYU opened the year at the Maui Invitational with losses to No. 11 North Carolina and Stanford (listed 26th) and a win over Chaminade (77-56) and suffered a 67-64 loss to California at home Saturday. Utah State owns a 3-1 record, winning at home Saturday over Cal Davis (81-55) after going 2-1 at the Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska, with wins over Georgia Southern (71-61) and Northwestern (64-57) and a loss to Central Florida (55-52).

UP NEXT FOR THE COUGARS

BYU continues its stretch of five road games in its first six contests with a trip to Los Angeles to play USC (Fox Sports Net 2) on Saturday at 7:30 p.m. PST. (8:30 p.m. MST).

COUGAR QUICK HITS

 BYU's game at USU is its first on an opponent's home court this year but also its fourth game away from Provo. BYU played three neutral games in Maui to open the season. BYU goes to USC on Saturday to complete its fifth game away from home in the first six contests for Steve Cleveland's young squad. • Senior Jared Jensen has enjoyed his increased opportunities this year. After earning MWC Co-Freshman of the Year honors in 2002, he moved from center to power forward during All-American center Rafael Araujo's two years in Provo. Now with an improved jumper, Jensen has returned to the low post and has been the Cougars' most consistent player to date, averaging 11.8 points while shooting 58.6 percent from the floor and 76.5 percent from the line.

· Senior Mike Hall's play has been noticably better as his injured ankle has improved. After missing a full week of practice, he played in four games last week on the ankle. After poor shooting nights and less mobility the first two games, he has scored 14 and a career-high 23 points in the last two outings. Among BYU's newcomers, sophomore forward Keena Young was the most effective in Maui. He averaged 9.7 points and 6.7 rebounds, scoring 14 points starting for injured Garner Meads vs. Chaminade. • After shooting just 62 percent from the line in BYU's first two games, BYU has responded by making 26-of-29 (.897), including a perfect 10-for-10 from the line vs. Chaminade, in the last two games.

LOOKING AT UTAH STATE

Utah State is off to a 3-1 start, including a 1-0 record at home. The Aggies enjoyed a blowout win at home Saturday over Cal Davis (81-55) after going 2-1 at the Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska, to open the season. USU earned wins over Georgia Southern (71-61) and Northwestern (64-57), with its lone loss a close defeat to Central Florida (55-52). The Aggies return three starters and seven lettermen from last year's 25-4 team that earned a top-25 ranking and tied for first in the Big West at 17-1 before falling to Hawaii in the first round of the NIT. The Aggies are led by freshman guard Jaycee Carroll, who has averaged 12.3 points and 3.5 rebounds in his first four college games. Senior forward Spencer Nelson adds 11.8 points and a team-leading 8.5 rebounds while junior forward Nate Harris is contributing 9.5 points and 5.8 rebounds. As a team the Aggies are scoring 67 points per game while burning the nets at a .542 clip from the floor. Ten of the 11 Aggies to take a shot this year are making 50 percent or better from the field. USU's shooting percentage has not been as strong from long range where the Aggies are making 30.6 percent of their threes. Carroll has led the way on treys for USU, making 5 of his 12 attempts while junior guard Chris Huber has made 4-of-8 threes off the bench. USU is shooting .724 percent from the line. Aggie opponents have shot .433 from the floor, including .302 from three-point range, while scoring 57 points per game. Stew Morrill owns a 146-47 record in seven seasons in Logan and is 364-185 in his 19th year overall.

AGGIES AT HOME THIS YEAR

Spencer Nelson recorded a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds as Utah State shot a school-record 77.8 percent from the field en route to an 81-55 victory against UC Davis Saturday night. The Aggies hit 76.5 percent from the field in the first half before improving those numbers to 78.9 percent in the second half. For the game, USU made 28 of its 36 shots to best its old school record of 69.5 percent set against New Mexico State in 1985. Eleven of the 12 USU players that saw action scored in the game. In addition to Nelson's team-best 18 points on six of six shooting, Cass Matheus chipped in 16 points on five of five shooting. Marques Crane added nine points, while Nate Harris and Chris Huber each scored eight points. Huber added a game-high four assists as well.

SERIES NOTES

Utah State is BYU's oldest rival. The rivalry is among the nation's longest ongoing rivalries. BYU and Utah State will be meeting for the 221st time on Wednesday. The first game played between the two schools was back on Feb. 23, 1906, with BYU winning 21-14. BYU leads the all-time series 133-87, while the Aggies hold the edge in Logan, 56-51. Utah State has won the last two meetings in Logan, defeating BYU 90-81 in overtime on Dec. 1, 2001 before last year's 76-74 Aggie win. In 2001 BYU had a chance to win in regulation but Daniel Bobik's finger roll fell fell off the rim. The Aggies took charge in the overtime period. Last year Utah State took a 26-point half-time lead but BYU erased the deficit in the second half prior to losing on a last-second shot by Spencer Nelson. BYU last won in Logan on Jan. 8, 2000, riding transfer Terrell Lyday's 35 points to an 82-73 victory. BYU has won the last 14 games played in the Marriott Center between the two rivals, dating back to Utah State's 88-76 win in Provo on Dec. 10, 1985. BYU has won six of the last 10 meetings in the series and 21 of the last 25 games between the two schools dating back to the 1985-86 season. Utah State won nine straight games. BYU has a 4-3 record against the Aggies under Steve Cleveland.

LAST YEAR'S OUTING - COUGARS UPENDED ON LAST-SECOND SHOT AT UTAH STATE

LOGAN, Utah (Dec. 23, 2003) - Spencer Nelson's driving layup with 1.2 seconds left ended BYU's comeback bid, giving Utah State a 76-74 victory over the Cougars on Tuesday night at the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum. The loss ends BYU's six-game victory streak and gives the Cougars a 7-2 record on the year. With its one-point defeat at California, BYU's two setbacks this season have come by a combined three points. The Aggies, now 6-1 on the year, jumped out to a 26point lead in the first half by pressuring the Cougars and doubling down on Rafael Araujo. Araujo only touched the ball twice on offense in the first 11 minutes and finished the half with four points. Utah State also hit six three-pointers in the half. BYU coach Steve Cleveland said the Aggies played with more urgency in the first half and dominated the first 20 minutes of the game. "They had more energy than we did," Cleveland said. "They shot the ball and executed well. Obviously, we didn't play with the kind of energy that we would have liked in the first 20 minutes. Don't ever come to a game and have your opponent have more energy than you." Trailing by 26 points, the Cougars did come out energized in the second half. They started the half scoring on six of their first seven possessions, including a three-pointer by Luiz Lemes and three baskets by Jared Jensen. BYU continued to whittle down USU's lead, eventually tying the game on a driving layup by Mark Bigelow with 21 seconds left, but the Cougars weren't able to stop the Aggies on their next possession. BYU's desperation attempt to tie the game on its last possession was halted when Nelson stole Lemes' length-of-the-court pass intended for Araujo. Araujo led four Cougars in double figures with 16 points, followed by Mike Hall (15), Bigelow (14) and Jensen (10). Araujo posted his sixth double-double of the season by adding 10 rebounds and also dished out a career-high four assists. Nelson and Cardell Butler each totaled 19 points to lead Utah State. The Cougars made 21-of-27 shots (.778) in the second half to shoot a season-high 62 percent for the game, but had their worst night at the free throw line in years, converting only 7-of-16 attempts, far below the team's typical touch (.725) this season from the charity stripe. The Aggies, conversely, made 16-of-20 free throws while shooting a solid 52 percent from the floor

BYU'S LAST OUTING - COUGARS FALL SHORT VS. CAL

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 27, 2004) -- Mike Hall carried the Cougars late in the second half but the Cougars would come up short to the California Bears in a 67-64 thriller Saturday night in the Marriott Center that ended BYU's 18-game home winning streak. Hall delivered plenty of key baskets, finishing with a career-high 23 points for the Cougars. Cal's size and athleticism proved to be difficult to handle as the Cougars trailed at the half, 39-31. Despite the absence of last year's Pac-10 Freshman of the Year Leon Powe, who was sidelined from a knee injury, and starting point quard Ayinde Ubaka, who was out with a foot injury, the Golden Bears came out on fire. In the first half, the Golden Bears shot a stifling 48.5 percent led by Richard Midgley who finished with 15 points to the Cougars' 27.3 percent shooting from the field. The Cougars were out-rebounded 27-18 while the Golden Bears took advantage of many of their offensive rebounds and converted them into easy two-point baskets. "This ball game was determined in the first 20 minutes." BYU head coach Steve Cleveland said. "We didn't match their aggression level tonight." The Cougars and 9,857 screaming fans came alive early in the second half with a Hall 3-pointer, but Cal would bounce back with a Midgley 3-pointer and a DeVon Hardin put-back dunk. Throughout the half the Cougars and Golden Bears traded baskets, yet the Cougars were never able to bring the game closer than five points until the final minutes. The Cougars fought hard to bring the score to within two at 64-66 with under a minute to play after Mike Hall was fouled on a three point-shot and hit all three free throws. Cal guard Martin Smith was fouled with 171 seconds in the game but was only able to extended the Cal lead to three, giving the Cougars one chance to tie the game. In the end, the Cougars fell short on a desperate shot from beyond the arc by Jared Jensen. "In the second half, we competed and tried to win the game," Cleveland said. "We did better on the boards, but we lost the game on offensive rebounds." The Cougars struggled shooting throughout the game, finishing with 32.8 percent from the field, the Cougars' second-lowest shooting percentage of the season, to the Golden Bears' 44.8 percent. Terry Nashif's size didn't get in the way of his dominating play as he scored a season-high eight points while adding eight rebounds and a team-high five assists. After falling to 1-3 on the season with the loss, the Cougars' next two match-ups are away from the Marriott Center when they will face Utah State on Wednesday and USC on Saturday.

SLOW SHOOTING START

Despite some open looks, BYU has struggled shooting the ball thus far this season. The Cougars have made 35 percent or less of their attempts in three of their four games – all losses. In those three losses, BYU has not topped 30 percent from three-point range. In BYU's win over Chaminade, the Cougars shot 49 percent from the floor and 33 percent from behind the arc. Overall, BYU has converted on 37.5 percent from the field and 28 percent from long range. After shooting 62 percent from the free throw line in the first two games, the Cougars have improved the past two games (26-of-29) to increase their percentage to 74 percent for the season.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

BYU has held its opponents to .421 shooting from the floor and .275 from three-point range. BYU opponents have averaged 67.8 points against BYU. In the last three games after the loss to preseason No. 3 North Carolina, BYU has held Stanford, Chaminade and Cal to a combined 61.6 points while averaging 64.6 points.

TURNOVER TURNAROUND

After averaging 23 turnovers to only 6 assists in BYU's first two games, the Cougars have averaged 11.5 turnovers and 14 assists in the last two outings – both games totaling more assists than miscues.

THREE SENIORS GETTING MORE OPPORTUNITIES

With the departure of five seniors from last year's team who played significant roles, BYU's three seniors on this year's team have received new opportunities with a young team that includes seven sophomores and three freshmen. Compare their numbers after four games last year to this year after four outings.

BYU IN MWC STATS

CONFERENCE TITLES

BYU has won two regular season MWC titles (2001 and 2003) and one MWC Tournament crown (2001) during the five years of the Mountain West Conference. BYU finished second in the regular season this year and was the 2000 MWC Tournament runner-up.

MWC SUCCESS

With BYU's 10-4 conference record last year, Steve Cleveland now has the most MWC wins of any coach. He passed Wyoming's Steve McClain last season and now has 45 MWC wins compared to McClain's 41.

BYU SUCCESS EVIDENT BY MWC AWARDS

BYU players have earned 15 All-MWC honors in the five years of the league, including last year when Rafael Araujo (1st team), Mark Bigelow (2nd team) and Mike Hall (3rd team) were recognized. Two players, Mekeli Wesley in 2001 and Rafael Araujo last year, have earned MWC Player of the Year accolades, while two others, Travis Hansen in 2003 and Mike Hall last year, have been named Defensive Player of the Year. Cougar coach Steve Cleveland was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2003.

NONCONFERENCE SUCCESS

BYU has had the best success of any MWC team against nonconference competition in the first five years of the league. Cleveland coached BYU to a 56-21 (.727) record against nonconference teams in that five years span, including the league's only unbeaten home nonconference record at 39-0 over those five years. Overall, the Cougars defeated 40 straight non-conference opponents in the Marriott Center since starting the streak with a 61-59 win over Utah State as a member of the WAC on Jan. 2, 1999. Cal just ended the streak Saturday with its 67-64 win. BYU also achieved top nonconference wins with victories over nationally ranked opponents Oklahoma State (2003-04) and Stanford (2001-02).

PLAYERS IN THE PROS

In the past five years the BYU program has helped several players go on to professional basketball opportunities. Rafael Araujo was the No. 8 overall pick in this year's NBA draft, selected by the Toronto Raptors. Travis Hansen was the second-round pick of the Atlanta Hawks in 2003. After playing one year with the Hawks he signed a lucrative one-year contract to play in Spain. Others to play professionally over the past five years include Mekeli Wesley (Belgium), Terrell Lyday (France), Trent Whiting (Italy), Eric Nielsen (Spain) and Silester Rivers (Chile). In addition to Araujo, Mark Bigelow (Germany) and Luiz Lemes (Brazil) joined the professional ranks overseas from last year's team.

BYU TOPS MWC IN ATTENDANCE

BYU led the Mountain West Conference in attendance and was ranked 11th nationally in home attendance after averaging 15,300 in 13 home games in 2003-04. The prior season in 2002-03, BYU averaged the 17th largest crowd in the nation overall at 14,468 and had the nation's largest percentage increase over the prior season (during the 2002 Olympic Games hosted in Salt Lake City). Last year BYU had a season-high 22,718 attendance vs. Utah, the largest crowd since 1992 and the 21st largest crowd ever in the Marriott Center.

WINNING BASKETBALL TRADITION

With its all-time record of 1472-943 (.610), BYU is No. 19 all-time in Division I victories. The Cougars rank 36th all-time in winning percentage among all Division I basketball programs. The Cougars have had 82 winning seasons in their 102 years of basketball and have made 30 postseason appearances, including 21 NCAA bids, and won 26 conference championships.

WINNING WAYS

• With its win at UNLV last year to conclude the regular season, BYU achieved its 28th 20-win season. The Cougars have averaged 20 wins every 2.7 years (BYU has played 76 seasons in which it has played at least 20 games in a season).

• Last year was BYU coach Steve Cleveland's fourth 20-win season in his seven years in Provo since rebuilding the program from its 1-25 season in 1996-97. Cleveland has the second-highest percentage of 20 win seasons (57%) in BYU history behind Roger Reid (75%). Only three BYU coaches have had more than four seasons of 20 wins:

CLEVELAND NO. 2 ON MARRIOTT CENTER VICTORY LIST; NO. 2 IN ALL-TIME BYU WINS ON HORIZON

Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland has guided BYU to the second-most Marriott Center wins. He needs nine more Marriott Center wins to have the most ever by a BYU coach. With his 84-19 record in the Cougars' home arena, he is currently second, having passed Frank Arnold's 81 victories with his win vs. New Mexico last year. Roger Reid has the most Marriott Center wins with 92. Ladell Andersen is fourth with 71. With a 130-90 overall record in his seven season in Provo, Cleveland is fifth on BYU's career coaching victories list but is only 23 wins from moving into second. He needs eight wins to move into fourth. He moved past Ladell Andersen (114-71 record from 1983-89) last season. Legendary Cougar coach Stan Watts has the most wins in school history with 372 triumphs from 1949-72. Ott Romney (1927-35) and Roger Reid (1989-96) both achieved 152 victories and Frank Arnold (1975-83) is currently fourth with 137 wins.

BYU AMONG 14 TEAMS TO HAVE PLAYER DRAFT EACH OF THE LAST TWO SEASONS

BYU is one of 14 teams to have at least one player drafted in each of the last two NBA drafts. Former BYU center Rafael Araujo was the No. 8 overall pick in the 2004 draft, being selected by the Toronto Raptors. Former BYU guard Travis Hansen was the No. 37 pick overall, taken in the second round by the Atlanta Hawks in the 2003 draft. NCAA TOURNAMENT TRADITION

BYU gained an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament after making a solid case for entry into the annual championship field. The Cougars achieved 21 wins even though they played more games (16) away (8-8 record) from home than they did in the Marriott Center where BYU was a perfect 13-0. The Cougars finished the season strong, winning nine straight games until being upset 54-51 by Utah in the MWC Tournament semifinals. BYU had an RPI of 31 and strength of schedule rated No. 35 when selected. BYU had quality wins, including a neutral court victory over nationally ranked and Final Four qualifier Oklahoma State, the Big 12 champs.


 \bullet BYU made its 21st NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars have an 11-24 record in the NCAA Tournament.

 BYU coach Steve Cleveland has guided the Cougars to the NCAA Tournament three out of the last four seasons, including back-to-back appearances the last two years. In his seventh year at BYU, Cleveland has guided the Cougars to postseason play in each of the past five seasons. He has returned the Cougar program to an annual tournament participant since taking over a program that was 1-25 the season before his arrival.

ALL-AMERICA TRADITION

BYU senior Rafael Araujo was named to the Basketball Times All-America Second Team and was an Associated Press honorable mention pick last season. Regarded as the nation's No. 2 center by Basketball Times Araujo earned second team honors while Connecticut center Omeka Okafor received first-team accolades and Duke center Shelden Williams was selected to the third team. Araujo led the Cougars in scoring last season at 18.4 points per game and pulled down a team-leading 10.1 boards per game, which ranks 11th nationally. He had the fourth highest combined points and rebounds averages in the nation last year. The MWC Co-Player of the Year, Araujo also topped BYU in steals (1.4 spg) and blocks (0.8 bpg) and led all MWC players in steals in league action. The 6-foot-11 280-pound native of Sao Paulo, Brazil, recorded 16 double-doubles games, the fifth best single-season total all-time at BYU, while leading the Cougars to a 21-9 record and their second straight at-large NCAA Tournament berth. Araujo was joined on the second team by Wisconsin point guard Devin Harris, North Carolina wing Rashad McCants, Providence forward Ryan Gomes, and Mississippi State forward Lawrence Roberts. Araujo is the 19th Cougar basketball player to earn All-America honors and the first since 2001 when Mekeli Wesley earned Associated Press honorable mention honors. Araujo was also named an honorable mention AP selection, as Okafor was the only center selected to the three AP teams. Araujo is the first Cougar since Mike Smith in 1988 to receive second team honors. He recorded career highs of 32 points and 17 rebounds in BYU's win over now No. 3 Oklahoma State and finished his season with 24 points and 12 rebounds against defending national champion Svracuse in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Head Coach Steve Cleveland



Steve Cleveland is entering his eighth year at the helm of the Cougars in 2004-05. During his tenure at BYU, Cleveland has proven to be a first-rate recruiter, an excellent coach and player developer, and above all, a winner.

Cleveland has guided BYU to five straight postseason appearances and four 20-win seasons in the last five years. Only three other BYU coaches have ever achieved more 20win seasons. He ws recognized as the Mountain West Conference's top strategist in the 2004 Street & Smith College Basketball Preview. He was honored as the MWC Coach of the Year in 2002-03,

as voted by the league's coaches and media members, after guiding BYU to a share of the MWC regular season title and a 23-9 record.

In 2003-04, Cleveland coached the Cougars to a 76-71 win over then No. 25 and 2004 Final Four team Oklahoma State in the Delta Center. The Cougars finished second in the Mountain West Conference and advanced to the NCAA Tournament before losing 80-75 to defending national champion Syracuse. In 2002-03, Cleveland's team finished 23-9 and tied for the MWC title before earning an NCAA invite. In 2001-02, Cleveland coached BYU to a win over No. 13 Stanford and advanced to the second round of the NIT despite having lost four starters and six of his top seven players from the prior season. In 2000-01, Cleveland guided BYU to its first NCAA tournament bid since 1995, its first conference regular season title since 1993 and its first conference tournament championship since 1992. While rebuilding a program that finished 1-25 before his arrival, he has posted records of 9-21, 12-16, 22-11, 24-9, 18-12, 23-9 and 21-9. The 1999-2000, 2000-2001 and 2002-03 seasons all rank among the school's best years ever in terms of wins. In fact, since BYU's first season in 1903, only five BYU teams have ever recorded more wins than the 24-9 team in 2000-01.

Cleveland has brought the magic of the Marriott Center back in Provo. BYU averaged 15,300 fans in 2003-04, including the largest crowd (22,718) since 1992, to rank 11th nationally. BYU had the nation's largest percentage increase in attendance in 2003. The Cougars owned the nation's longest homecourt victory streak for much of the 2002 and 2003 seasons until it finally ended at 44 games. BYU has won 62 of its last 63 games at home, including unbeaten seasons in 2001, 2002 and 2004.

Cleveland's teams have traditionally been prepared to play their best at the end of the season. BYU ended the 2003-04 season on a nine-game winning streak through February and March until losing in the MWC semifinal game, earning its third NCAA bid in the last four years. BYU has been to the post-

season five straight years. In 2001-02 BYU won in the first round of the NIT before losing at eventual NIT champion Memphis. In 2000-01, BYU won five straight games on the road to secure a share of the MWC regular season title and earn the automatic NCAA bid by claiming the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas. The Cougars won six of their last eight games the prior season, including two MWC tournament wins and two NIT victories. In Cleveland's first year, BYU completed a rare sweep of No. 15 New Mexico and UTEP on the road to earn a WAC tournament berth. The road sweep of New Mexico and UTEP was the first for BYU since 1990-91 and the 83-62 upset of nationally ranked New Mexico in the Pit ended the Lobos' 41-game home winning streak. In Cleveland's second season the Cougars had a blowout win over UTEP before a 90-74 conference tournament upset victory over TCU to achieve BYU's first conference tournament win since 1994.



two of the five seasons the event has been played, winning the title in 2001. As a recruiter, Cleveland has made a similar impact on BYU's program.

Cleveland's teams have advanced to the finals of the MWC tournament in

Cleveland's recruits have proven they are not only committed to Cleveland's vision but also are the kind of players to help make that vision a reality in Provo. Cleveland and his staff have been able to attract top talent and develop them into better players.

Cleveland's recruits have been honored with a string of conference newcomer or major awards in their first seasons at BYU. Eight players have been honored in Cleveland's seven years as the Cougar coach, including five who have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. The last two years Rafael Araujo was named the Newcomer of the Year by the conference media members in a poll conducted by the Las Vegas Review-Journal (the MWC no longer has such an award) and Mike Hall was named MWC Defensive Player of the Year. In October 2001, Cleveland signed a multi-year contract extension with BYU. Before taking the helm with the Cougars on March 11, 1997, Cleveland compiled a 157-77 record at Fresno City College in Fresno, Calif. Cleveland was named coach of the year two times while at FCC and led the Rams to postseason playoffs in each of his seven seasons in Fresno. Cleveland coached 10 years at Fresno's Clovis West High School, compiling a 180-70 record.

PLAYING CAREER

Cleveland played college basketball at UC Irvine and was the Anteaters' MVP and leading scorer his senior season in 1975-76. Prior to attending UC Irvine, Cleveland was Fresno City College's Most Outstanding Player in 1973-74. Cleveland received a B.A. degree in social science from UC Irvine in 1976, and received a Master's in education administration from Fresno Pacific in 1979.

PERSONAL

Cleveland, 52, was born in the Los Angeles area and spent most of his life in Fresno, Calif. He served a full-time mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to England from 1971-73. Cleveland was the first head basketball or football coach at BYU to have served a church mission. Cleveland and his wife Kip have three children: sons Casey and Skyler and daughter Katie.

HALL LATELY: Achieved career-high 23 points vs. California Saturday, scoring the team's final 12 points, and now leads team in scoring on the year at 13.5 ppg ... Averaged a team-leading 14.5 points while adding 3.5 rebounds per game in BYU's two exhibition wins prior to being out with an injured ankle the week leading up to the season opener ... Averaged 10.3 ppg at the Maui Invitational but lacked usual explosivness while recovering from injury ... Dished out career-high 5 assits vs. Chaminade.

6-9 • 250 • senior • forward/center West Haven, Utah

JENSEN LATELY: Scored 12 points in a career-high 34 minutes vs. Cal Saturday ... Averaged team-leading 11.7 points at the Maui Invitational ... Led all players at the Maui Invitational with a .864 shooting percentage, going 13-of-19 from the floor in three games.

NOTING JENSEN: Jensen is an all-conference candidate who will play a much larger role as a senior with the departure of NBA lottery pick Rafael Araujo ... Jensen has played power forward much of the past two years with Araujo in the lineup but Jensen now has the opportunity to return to his more natural position at center ... He made 58 starts over his first three seasons ... Jensen earned All-MWC honorable mention in 2002-03 and MWC Co-Freshman of the Year honors in

2001-02 when he finished first in the Mountain West Conference with a team-leading 59.1 field goal percentage (sixth single-season best percentage in school history) ... A talented offensive player in the low-post, he can receive almost any entry pass with exceptionally soft hands ... NOTING NASHIF: Nashif is a solid floor leader with experience who has earned the start at the point ... MEADS LATELY: Started the first two games but has had to sit out the last two games due to an ankle injury ... Averaged 5.5 points and team-best 7.0 rebounds over first two games ... status vs. Utah State is questionable.

NOTING MEADS: Meads started 18 games, including 16 of the last 17 games, as a redshirt freshman in 2003-04 and showed promise of his abilities despite playing with injuries throughout much the year ...
