#### TEAM CAPTAINS SELECTED

Mindy Bonham and Haley Hall have been chosen by their teammates as co-captians for the 2010-11 season. This is Hall's third straight co-captain selection.

#### PLAYER UPDATES/INJURIES

Freshmen Morgan Bailey and Stephanie Rovetti will redshirt the 2010-11 season.

Dayna Burgess is not expected to play in the first two games of the season due to a knee injury.

#### 2010-11 BYU TEAM NOTES

- ◆ BYU enters the 2010-11 with four returning starters, including the team's leading scorer Mindy Bonham (11.1), leading rebounder Kristen Riley (5.7), and the top assist (4.1) and steals (2.3) leader in Haley Hall.
- ◆ The Cougars 23-10 overall record during the 2009-10 campaign was the fourth 20-plus season for coach Judkins and ranks third best during his nine-year tenure.
- ♦ With an 11-5 MWC record, the team finished in second place in the league race after being picked to finish sixth. During conference play, the team went 7-1 at home. Overall, the Cougars ended the year 11-2 when playing in the Marriott Center.
- ◆ During league action, BYU had a successful campaign sweeping the series against Air Force, CSU, UNLV, and instate rival Utah.
- ♦ As the automatic qualifier from the MWC to the 2010 postseason WNIT, the team had an impressive showing advancing to the quarter-final round (Elite Eight). After a 62-58 home victory over Pepperdine, BYU embanked on a six-day, three game schedule where they grabbed victory over ASU, and league foe Wyoming before falling to eventual champion California.
- ♦ The BYU bench played an integral part in the team's success during the 2009-10 campaign. In points, the reserves scored a total of 533 points to opponents 388. In the rebound category, bench players grabbed a total of 517 boards compared with 370 for the opponents.
- ◆ Adding to the Cougar success last year was a very productive offense. The team scored at least 70 points in 13 games, compiling a 12-1 record with eight of those contests being played during the MWC race. And, in all games except three, at least two BYU players put up double figure points.

#### 2009-10 SEASON REVIEW

An impressive run in the 2010 WNIT, coupled with 20-plus wins, and a second place finish in the Mountain West Conference capped off the 2009-10 campaign as one of the best in recent memory.

BYU's 23-10 overall record is the fourth 20-plus win season for coach Judkins and it ranks third best during his nine-year tenure. That achievement was also recognized in basketball circles where the Cougars received votes in the polls once in January and once in early March.

Because of the team's impressive record, they received an automatic berth into the 2010 postseason WNIT where they advance to the quarterfinal round (Elite Eight). Their inspiring run began with a home win over Pepperdine before embarking on a six-day, three game schedule. During the run they beat Pac-10 foe Arizona State in Tempe, beat MWC member Wyoming in Laramie, before falling to eventual champion Cal in Berkeley. The WNIT invitation was the 12th overall postseason national tournament appearance and the fifth in the NIT. The three wins the team recorded in the 2010 WNIT were the most victories in any postseason tournament in the program's history.

With an 11-5 league record, the Cougars surprised several MWC foes by finishing second in the league after being picked to finish sixth.

The team also had success playing at home where they tallied an 11-2 overall record and went 7-1 in conference action.

During their nonconference portion of the schedule the Cougars captured road wins over Montana State and CS Fullerton. For the second year in a row, the team competed in the Hukilau Invitational, an event they co-sponsor with BYU-Hawaii. While in Laie, they beat the University of San Francisco, and the University of Hawai'i. Both games were played on the BYU-Hawaii campus.

Part of their schedule included playing all instate schools where they picked up wins over Southern Utah, Utah, Utah Valley University, and Utah State.

In league play BYU had a successful campaign sweeping the series against Air Force, Colorado State, Utah and UNLV. They split the series with WY, TCU, and SDSU and went on to finish second in the regular season race.

Five players were recognized for their season accomplishments when the league announced its MWC postseason awards. Junior Mindy Bonham led the way with two accolades being named to the All-MWC Second Team for the second year in a row. She was also named to the All-Defensive Team. Teammate Jazmine Foreman also made the All-Defensive Team. Junior forward Coriann Wood picked up the league's first ever Sixth Player of the Year award. Wood added her second MWC honor being named Honorable Mention All-MWC. Co-captain Haley Hall joined Wood on the Honorable Mention All-MWC list along with teammate and junior center Kristen Riley.

In the Mountain West Conference the team and several players finished the season ranked in numerous statistical categories. BYU concluded the year in first place in assists in all games and in league contests and ranked second in 3-point field goal percentage. The Cougars placed third overall in defensive rebound percentage in all games, and finished second in two categories, field goal percentage and in rebounding margin.

Several players also placed high in a number of statistics led by Coriann Wood who ended the year in first place in 3-point field goal percentage in all games while teammate Haley Hall finished in seventh place. Hall along with Mindy Bonham and Jazmine Foreman ranked second, sixth and seventh, respectively, in the assists category in all games. Freshman Alexis Kaufusi ranked fifth in field goal percentage in all games followed by teammate Kristen Riley who placed sixth. Bonham ranked ninth, Foreman 12th and Wood 14th in the same category. Riley finished in ninth place in rebounding in league contests.

On the national record books BYU also placed high in a few categories. They were ranked 13th in assists per game, 28th in 3-point field goal percentage, 31st in assist/turnover ratio, 42nd in 3-point field goals per game, 43rd in field goal percentage, and 47th in scoring defense. Haley Hall placed 34th in assist/turnover ratio and 84th in steals per game.

Once again the strength of Cougar bench was unrelenting and played a vital role in the team's success. In points, the BYU bench scored a total of 533 points to opponents 388. In the rebound category, the Cougar reserves grabbed a total of 517 boards compared with 370 for the opponents.

A productive offense also added to the team's success during the 2009-10 season where they scored at least 70 points 13 times, compiling a 12-1 record, eight of those in league play. In all games except three, at least two BYU players put up double figure points.

- $\Rightarrow$  In the road win over the Utes on 1/30/10, BYU made 10 three pointers which tied for second best on the year and were the most in MWC action. The team put up 12 treys in the win vs. Hawaii on 12/5/09.
- $\Rightarrow$  The Cougar defense held Utah on 3/3/10 to just 14 first half points which are the lowest by a league opponent. In the nonconference schedule, the team held Hawaii to 16 points on 12/5/09.
- $\Rightarrow$  For the second time in league play, all 12 players that are eligible to play got playing time in the road win over the Air Force Falcons on 2/13/10, the first was in the victory at Utah on 1/30/10.
- $\Rightarrow$  The 1,783 in attendance at the home game vs. Utah on 3/03/10 is a team-high in the Marriott Center for the Cougars this season and in league play. The total attendance marks the third 1,000-plus fans at a home game this year. In the home game vs. TCU on 3/6/10 there were 1,381 fans present.
- ⇒ All 14 players on the Cougar roster played in the contest at SUU.
- $\Rightarrow$  In all games except three, at least two BYU players scored in double figures. The three games where just one player had double digit points were @ TCU on 2/3/10, @ UNM on 2/27/10, and vs. SDSU at the MWC Championships on 3/12/10.
- $\Rightarrow$  In the home game vs. San Diego State on 1/23/10, five players scored in double figures, a first this year. Under coach Judkins there's been three other contest where five players have had double digit performances. They are:

Nov. 18, 2008: BYU at Nevada (Foreman, Nielson, Moeaki, King, Wood)

Dec. 6, 2004: BYU vs. George Washington (D. Cheesman, Sullivan, Gillespie, Anderson, Kozlowski)

Feb. 7, 2002: BYU at Wyoming (Leitner, D. Cheesman, Thorn, Pearson, Jensen)

- ⇒ In the game vs. the University of San Francisco nine of the 11 players scored and all of them contributed in rebounds.
- ⇒ Head Coach Jeff Judkins improved to 8-1 in home openers with the 73-51 victory over Utah Valley University on Nov. 13
- ⇒ The Cougars scored at least 70 points 14 times on the year compiling a 13-1 record, eight of those were in league play. The 78 points scored at Air Force on Feb. 13 were the most in league play.
- ⇒ The three wins the team recorded in the 2010 WNIT were the most victories in any postseason tournament in the program's history.

#### TEAM HIGHLIGHTS - CONTINUED (2009-10)

 $\Rightarrow$  With the 67-63 win over Wyoming on 3/25/10, the Cougars improved their season record to 23-9. The 23 wins thus far tie for third best under head coach Judkins since taking over the women's program in the 2001-02 season. The road win over Wyoming on 3/25/10 improved the school's record in the postseason WNIT to 6-4. 2 The 61-53 road win over ASU on 3/23/10 improved coach Judkins record against Pac-10 teams to 10-6 overall and 1-1 this year.

Head coach Jeff Judkins enters his 10th season at the helm of the BYU women's basketball program. During the 2009-10 campaign he guided the Cougars to a 23-10 overall record, marking his fourth 20-plus season, his third best during his tenure. The team also finished

second (11-5) in the MWC regular season race after being selected to finish fifth. During conference play, the team went 7-1 at home, and concluded the season with an 11-2 record in the Marriott Center.

Six players garnered 11 postseason MWC accolades. For the second straight year, junior Mindy Bonham was named to the All-MWC Second Team. She and teammate Jazmine Foreman were named to the All-Defensive Team. Junior Coriann Wood picked up the league's first ever Sixth Player of they Year award. Wood added her second conference citation being named Honorable Mention All-MWC. Co-captain Haley Hall, and forward Kristen Riley were also Honorable Mention All-MWC.

For the fifth time, the BYU team participated in the postseason WNIT as the automatic qualifier from the MWC. The team had an impressive run in the tournament, advancing to the quarterfinal round (Elite Eight) before losing to eventual champion California. After a 62-58 home victory over Pepperdine, BYU embarked on a six-day, three game schedule where they grabbed victories over ASU, and league foe Wyoming. The postseason appearance was the 12th overall for the school.

Judkins and his staff also guided the Cougar team to back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 2006 and 2007.

With the second youngest Division I women's basketball roster, he guided the 2008-09 squad to an 18-11, 8-8/t-fifth record with junior Mindy Bonham (Nielson) garnering two MWC honors on the All-Conference Third Team and on the All-Defensive Team. Graduating seniors and co-captains Shawnee Slade and Cassie King were named Honorable Mention All-MWC. King was also named to the CoSIDA ESPN The Magazine Academic District 8 University Second Team.

The Cougar team recorded back-to-back MWC Regular Season Titles in 2006 and 2007 with players Ambrosia Anderson and Dani Wright being named MWC Co-Players of the Year those same seasons.

During Judkins' fifth season, the 2005-06 campaign, the Cougar squad compiled its best finish in school history with a 26-6 record, clinched its first MWC regular season title since 1992 and received a no. 7 seed in the NCAA tournament, the highest seed for any BYU program.

For the first time since the 2002-03 season, the 2005-06 squad and its 13-1 record to start the year, broke into the women's basketball collegiate polls, ranked no. 23 by the AP Poll and the USA Today/ESPN/WBCA Coaches Poll. They would move up the poll to as high as 18 and 16 in the two respective polls, finishing the year at no. 20. In that same season Judkins picked up his 100th win, a 69-67

victory over CSU on Mar. 2, the same time the team clinched the league's regular season title.

Under Judkins tutelage the women's basketball program has had consistent success with four postseason appearances including three NCAA Championships, guiding the team to its first ever Sweet Sixteen finish in 2002. In 2005, the 19-11 team played in the first round of the WNIT.

Judkins has also coached two All-Americans in Erin Thorn and Ambrosia Anderson. Both have gone on to play in the WNBA. Thorn has been with the New York Liberty team for five years while Anderson completed one season with the Liberty team. The longtime University of Utah coach and player came to Provo with a proven record of success dating back to his high school days at Highland High School in Salt Lake City. An all-state selection in basketball, football and baseball, Judkins went on to play for the University of Utah from 1974-78.

While playing at Utah, Judkins helped lead the Utes to one conference championship and two berths in the NCAA tournament. He was a second-team academic All-American and three-time District VII academic selection. He also earned three First Team All-WAC honors and was a member of the 1977 United States World Games team that captured the gold medal.

Judkins also played five years in the National Basketball Association for the Boston Celtics, Portland Trailblazers, Detroit Pistons and Utah Jazz. He was a second-round pick of the Celtics in 1978, the same year the Celtics selected Larry Bird with the sixth pick overall.

After his NBA career, he returned to Utah in 1989 and was an instrumental part of the program's success during his 10 years with the program, recruiting such players as Keith Van Horn, Andre Miller, Mike Doleac, Hanno Mottola, Alex Jensen, Trent Whiting, Garner Meads, Jeff Johnsen and Britton Johnsen.

Judkins, graduated from the University of Utah in 1978 with a degree in physical and health education.

He and his wife Mary Kaye are the parents of five children: Jessica (30) {married to Paul}, Jordan (28), Jenna (26) {married to Whitney Neves} , Jaime (23) {married to Matt Weeks}, Jaxson (20), who's on an LDS mission in Mexico.
