COUGARS TO TAKE ON WYOMING

The Cougars are above .500 after defeating UNLV 55-14 Saturday in Las Vegas. It is the first time they have been above .500 since they were 5-4 last season. They are 5-4 overall and second in the Mountain West at 4-2. The UNLV game was BYU's second-consecutive game scoring 50-or-more points. The Cougars used a balanced attack to top the Rebels as John Beck passed for 267 yards and three touchdowns and the team racked up 224 rushing yards. Wayne Latu had a career-best 93 yards and one touchdown on 15 carries while Fahu Tahi had 62 yards and one touchdown. Curtis Brown scored one on the ground and one receiving. Jonny Harline was the leading receiver with six receptions for 80 yards and one score. Justin Maddux dominated the UNLV offensive line, recording 3.0 sacks for a combined loss of 22 yards. Justin Luettgerodt, Kayle Buchanan and Spencer White each recorded picks.

A LOOK AT THE COWBOYS

Wyoming is coming off a 43-13 loss to Utah and is currently 4-5 overall and 2-4 in the MWC. The Cowboys have now lost four-consecutive games, all in the conference, after starting the season at 4-1 overall and 2-0 in the league. Wyoming defeated Air Force and UNLV in conference action but has lost to TCU, New Mexico, Colorado State and Utah during the four-game skid. The Cowboys led 6-3 against Utah after the first quarter but could not contain the Utes the rest of the way. Wyoming was successful running the ball against Utah, totaling 146 yards on 32 carries. Corey Bramlet averages 224.8 passing yards and has thrown 15 touchdown passes and 13 interceptions. Wynel Seldon averages 79.9 yards rushing and has scored seven touchdowns. Receiver Jovon Bouknight has a conference best 11 touchdown receptions. He also averages 98.4 receiving yards per game. He also returns kicks for Wyoming and averages 29.4 yards per return, second in the conference.

COMPLETE BROADCAST PLANS

TELEVISION: BYU's game against Wyoming will be broadcast by SportsWest. Kickoff is scheduled for 4 p.m. (MST). The game can be seen locally on KSL-TV Channel 5. The Church Satellite System will also broadcast the game.

RADIO: Fans can also catch the game by tuning into KSL Radio, 1160 AM and 102.7 FM, and follow the game live as Greg Wrubell calls the action, Marc Lyons offers expert analysis and James Dye reports from the sideline.

SERIES INFORMATION

Saturday's game will be the 72nd meeting between BYU and Wyoming. The Cougars lead the series 38-30-3 overall but trail 13-18-3 in Laramie. The Cougars defeated the Cowboys 24-13 in Provo in 2004. BYU struck first when Curtis Brown hit Austin Collie for a 40-yard touchdown pass. The Cougars led 10-3 in the second after a Matt Payne field goal but fell behind 13-10. After the score, BYU answered when Brown scored on a nine-yard run, capping a nine-play, 80-yard drive. Fahu Tahi scored late in the game to seal it for the Cougars. Brown finished the game with 159 yards on 24 carries while Tahi added 70 yards on 12 carries.

BYU IN THE STANDINGS

With Saturday's 55-14 victory over UNLV, BYU improves to 5-4 on the season and 4-2 in the Mountain West Conference action. With the win, the Cougars moved into a tie with Colorado State for second place in the league standings after the Rams lost to TCU. With the victory on Nov. 5, the Cougars improved to 5-4 on the season and moved one game over the .500 mark for the first time since Nov. 6, 2004 (364 days). BYU has won its last four conference games, defeating New Mexico, Colorado State, UNLV and Air Force during the streak. It is the Cougars' first four-game conference win streak since 2001, when BYU went undefeated in the MWC.

BOWL STATUS

With five wins on the season, the Cougars must reach the six-win mark in order to become bowl eligible. BYU must win one of its final two games in order to be eligible for bowl consideration. BYU will next travel to Wyoming on Saturday, Nov. 12. (The Cowboys have lost four straight.) The Cougars will wrap up the season in Provo against in-state rival Utah.

PAPER OR PLASTIC

In the third quarter against UNLV, Justin Maddux recorded back-to-back sacks for a combined loss of 12 yards on first and second down to put the Rebels in a 3-and-21 situation. He finished the day with a game-high 3.0 sacks for 22 yards. Maddux now has 5.0 sacks for a combined loss of 29 yards on the season. All totaled, the Cougars sacked UNLV quarterback Jarrod Jackson five times for a combined loss of 40 yards, while the Rebels sacked BYU quarterback John Beck twice for eight yards.

THREE PICKS

Justin Luettgerodt picked off UNLV quarterback Jarrod Jackson in the second quarter and returned it 28 yards to the Rebel 24-yard line. It was the second-consecutive game he recorded an interception. Against Air Force, he had an interception that set up a 12-yard touchdown run by Nathan Meikle. Kayle Buchanan recorded his first-career interception in the second quarter. He picked off a Jackson pass intended for Donell Wheaton. Spencer White added one of his own on UNLV's first drive of the second half when he snagged the ball out of the air after a Rebel receiver tipped it. Saturday's game marked the Cougars' second-consecutive game with three interceptions. BYU has recovered 17 turnovers this season, and given up 17 for a 0 turnover margin.

THE 50-POINT PLATEAU

By scoring 55 points against UNLV, the Cougars scored 50-or-more points in consecutive games for the first time since 2001. BYU scored 62 against Air Force, for a total of 117 points in two games. The last time the Cougars scored at least 50 in back-to-back games was in 2001 when they had 59 at San Diego State and 56 versus Colorado State for a total of 115 points. The last time BYU had at least 117 points in two games was in 2001, when the Cougars had 63 against Air Force and 59 at San Diego State for a total of 122 points. Texas has scored 109, USC 106 and Boise State 105 over the past two weeks. The 117 points is the third most scored in a two-week period in conference history. The top two are 122 point totals and were acheived by the Cougars in 2001. The first was came when the Cougars defeated Tulane (70-53) and Nevada (52-7). The second was against Air Force (63-33) and San Diego State (59-21).

STAT WATCH

John Beck and the Cougar offense are among national and conference leaders. Beck currently ranks fourth nationally in passing yards per game (318.8 p/g) and is third in total passing yards (2,869). He leads the Mountain West Confernce in both categories. He is tied for the conference lead and is ninth nationally with 20 touchdown passes. BYU's passing offense is sixth in the nation and first in the conference while its total-offense average of 463.6 yards per game is second in the conference and 12th in the nation. Beck is second in the conference and is ninth nationally in total offense (315.3 yards p/g). Jared McLaughlin is second and Curtis Brown is third in the conference in scoring (7.7 and 7.6 pts/g, respectively). As a team, the Cougars lead the conference in points per game and are 25th in the nation at 33.2. Brown is fourth in the conference in rushing yards per game (87.7). Jonny Harline is fifth in the conference in receiving yards per game and 44th nationally (78.0).

COMING OUT PARTY

Freshman Wayne Latu led the Cougars with 15 carries for 93 yards and scored the Cougars' final touchdown at UNLV. Latu had one carry for five yards prior to that game.

ON PACE

With 746 yards on the season, averaging 87.7 yards per game, Curtis Brown is on pace to run for over 964 yards this season. Should Brown eclipse the 1,000 yard mark, it would be the first time since the 2001 season a BYU running back had ran for 1,000 yards in a

SECOND ALL-TIME IN THE MWC

With 267 yards passing against UNLV, John Beck has amassed 6,296 career yards, the second most in Mountain West Conference history. Entering the game, he was 136 yards behind former Wyoming quarterback Casey Bramlet. He now needs 3,388 yards to claim first all-time in the conference. Beck is ninth in Cougar history for most career yards with 6,296. Beck is tied with Gifford Nielsen for ninth most 300yard games in Cougar history with nine.

CAREER TOUCHDOWN PASSES

John Beck threw three touchdown passes against UNLV, including scoring strikes to Curtis Brown, Todd Waktins and Jonny Harline. Beck now has 20 touchdown passes for the season and 40 in his career, moving him into third place in the Mountain West for most career touchdown passes.

IN GOOD COMPANY

Through his freshman and sophomore years, John Beck compiled 3,427 passing yards. Only two BYU quarterbacks passed for more yards in their first two years of college football. Heisman trophy winner Ty Detmer recorded 5,812 yards in 1988-89, while John Walsh had 4,678 yards from 1991-93, He threw for 857 in 1992 before going down with a shoulder injury and being granted a medical redshirt. Eight games into his junior season, Beck has thrown for 6,296 career yards, including 2,869 yards this season. Following lists each players' total yards through nine games as a junior.

WHERE'S THE BEEF?

The BYU offensive line doesn't order salads when it goes out to eat. Each starter weighs over 300 pounds for an average of 325 and a total of 1,625 pounds. They will be going up against a Wyoming defensive line that weighs an average of 261.75 pounds. The Cowboy offensive line weighs on average of 305.2 pounds while BYU's defensive line weighs an average of 290 pounds.

NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER

Since 1972—LaVell Edwards first year as a head coach at BYU—the Cougars have posted an impressive 90-25-1 (.780) record in the month of November. There have been a total of 17 times over that span that BYU has gone undefeated during the month of November, including a stretch of seven straight seasons where the Cougars did not lose a single game in the month of November (1979-1985). Throughout his 29 seasons, Edwards won over 81 percent of his games during the month of November, including a record of 84-19-1 from 1972 until his final season in 2000. During that span, the Cougars had only three losing records during the month of November.

Since Edwards' retirement in 2000, the Cougars have tallied a 6-6 (.500) record in the month of November. During Gary Crowton's first season as head coach, BYU went 3-0 in November to finish as the first MWC team to sweep its league schedule. Since that time, the Cougars have gone 3-6 over the next three seasons during the month of November. Entering November this year, BYU needed to win two of its final three games to become bowl eligible. The Cougars defeated UNLV 55-14 and now need one win in their last two games, against Wyoming and Utah. Since 1922, BYU is 16-12-1 against Wyoming during the month of November, and has registered a mark of 25-20-1 against Utah during November. The Cougars have not been to a bowl game since the 2001 season.

QUARTER-BY-QUARTER SCORING

For the first time this season, BYU outscored its opponent in all four quarters. The Cougars posted a 7-0 lead in the first quarter, a 20-7 advantage in the second quarter, a 14-0 spread in the third quarter and posted a 14-7 margin in the final quarter against UNLV.

BRONCO MENDENHALL



After 16 seasons as an assistant coach, including the past two years as the defensive coordinator for the Cougars, Bronco Mendenhall was promoted to head football coach at Brigham Young University on December 13, 2004. Mendenhall becomes the 14th head coach since the University first officially recognized football as an intercollegiate sport in 1922.

Mendenhall (38)--one of the youngest NCAA Division I-A head coaches in the country--has served the past two seasons as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach for the

Cougars. During his first season in Provo, Mendenhall engineered the nation's 14th-ranked defense, holding opponents to just 307 yards per game. Under Mendenhall's direction, the Cougars ranked eighth nationally in passing defense, giving up just 176.17 yards per game.

In 2004, the Cougars ranked third in the Mountain West in rushing defense, allowing 149.3 yards per game. The Cougars also ranked second in the league, with 34 sacks for a combined loss of 232 yards.

A native of Alpine, Utah, Mendenhall began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1989 at his alma mater, Oregon State. After earning his master's degree in 1990, he moved to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he served as the secondary coach and defensive coordinator from 1991-92 under current BYU assistant coach Paul Tidwell. Following two seasons with the Badgers, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Northern Arizona, where the Lumberjacks boasted the top-ranked defense in the Big Sky Conference. He was elevated to co-defensive coordinator for the 1994 season.

In 1995, Mendenhall returned to Oregon State to become the defensive line coach under then defensive coordinator Rocky Long. When Long left to become the defensive coordinator at UCLA, Mendenhall was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 1996 season. At just 29 years of age, Mendenhall was the youngest defensive coordinator in Pac-10 history.

In 1997, Mendenhall became the secondary coach at Louisiana Tech where he helped the Bulldogs to a remarkable 9-2 record as his defensive unit was credited with 17 interceptions, allowing just 15 touchdowns on the season.

In 1998, Mendenhall moved to Albuquerque, N.M., to become the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of New Mexico. Over the next five seasons, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West Conference in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in both the 2000 and 2002 season, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

At New Mexico, Mendenhall played a valuable role in the development of the 1999 Mountain West Player of the Year, Consensus All-American and first-round NFL Draft pick Brian Urlacher. The ninth overall selection in the 2000 NFL Draft, Urlacher was voted the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a Pro Bowl selection. Urlacher was one of two rookies to play all 16 games, starting at middle linebacker the final 14 games to establish a team record for starts at the position by a rookie. He shattered Bears rookie records with 165 total tackles and eight sacks, making him the second Chicago first-year player to lead the team in tackles. Urlacher finished his collegiate career ranked third on New Mexico's all-time list with 442 tackles.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85. In his second season, Mendenhall captained the Badgers to a perfect 11-0 record and the NJCAA National Championship. That same season, he earned many

accolades, including first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

His older brother, Mat, played football at BYU from 1975-79, before spending four years in the NFL with the Washington Redskins. Another brother, Marty, was a former Mr. Utah bodybuilder. Mendenhall's father, Paul, was a defensive end at BYU from 1953-54.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to the former Holly Johnston of Missoula, Mont. The couple have three sons: Cutter (5), Breaker (3) and Raeder (18 mo.).

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff leads the Mountain West Conference with five members of its coaching staff who have played football in the National Football League or the old USFL. Associate Head Coach and running backs coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played for Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Robert Anae was drafted in the third round by the New Jersey Generals of the USFL. Quarterbacks coach Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49'ers in 2002 and also played with the Washington Redskins. Cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons where he played for three seasons. He also played for the Dallas Cowboys.

SOMEBODY'S WATCHING YOU...

Six members of the 2005 BYU football team - John Beck, Curtis Brown, Daniel Coats, Cameron Jensen, Jake Kuresa, Lance Reynolds and Todd Watkins - have been named to various "watch lists" for postseason awards.

John Beck, **6-2**, **210**, **Quarterback:** John Beck has been selected to the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award watch list, which honors the nation's best quarterback. Beck started 10 of 11 games his sophomore year and threw for 2,563 yards and 15 touchdowns. He averaged an MWC best 261.0 yards per game against league opponents. Beck earned second-team All-MWC honors as a sophomore.

Manaia Brown, 6-4, 310, Defensive Line: Manaia Brown has been named to the Lombardi Award watch list. Brown started eight of 11 games in 2004, registering 26 tackles, nine for a loss of 48 yards. He also registered 4.5 sacks. He was named All-MWC Honorable Mention.

Curtis Brown, 6-0, 210, Running Back: Curtis Brown has been named a Doak Walker Award candidate. In 2004, Brown had over 100 yards in four-straight games, including a season-high 159 against Wyoming. Against the Cowboys, he threw a 40-yard touchdown pass and ran for the score that put the Cougars ahead for good. He is only the fourth BYU player to crack the 1,000-yard rushing mark during his sophomore year.

Daniel Coats, 6-3, 250, Tight End: Daniel Coats has been selected to the John Mackey Award watch list. He played all 11 games for BYU as a sophomre, catching 13 passes for 160 yards. He had a season-best four receptions for 42 yards against Air Force. As a freshman in 2003, Coats earned freshman All-America honors from The Sporting News.

Jake Kuresa, 6-5, 330, Offensive Line: Jake Kuresa has been named to the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award watch lists. He has started every game (23) in his two year career. As a freshman, he played both guard and tackle and played exclusively at tackle as a sophomore. Kuresa helped anchor an offensive unit that averaged 24.3 points, 105.8 yards rushing and 279.5 yards passing per game in 2004.

Cameron Jensen, 6-5, 330, Linebacker: Cameron Jensen has been named to the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award watch lists. He started all 11 games in 2004 and led the team in total tackles with 103, solo tackles with 49 and assisted tackles with 54. His 12.0 tackles for loss and two fumble recoveries tied him for first on the team and he added two interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown against UNLV.

Lance Reynolds, 6-3, 293, Offensive Line: Lance Reynolds has been named to the Rimington Trophy watch list. He started every game in 2004 at center. He helped anchor an offensive unit that averaged 24.3 points, 105.8 yards rushing and 279.5 yards passing per game in 2004.

Todd Watkins, 6-3, 194, Wide Receiver: Todd Watkins has been named to the Biletnikoff watch list. He led the Mountain West Conference with 1,042 yards receiving in 2004 and set a league single-season record, averaging 94.7 yards per contest. He also caught 52 passes and six touchdowns, four of which were for 68, 69, 70 and 79 yards.

BECK NOTES:

- With 267 yards against Air Force, Beck moved into second all-time in the MWC for the most career passing yards. He has 6,296 yards.
- With 383 yards passing against Air Force, Beck has nine career 300-yard games.
- With 40 career touchdown passes, Beck is in third place on the Mountain West Conference career touchdown completions list.
- With 517 yards against TCU, Beck became only the third player in league history to pass for over 500 yards in a game.
- Beck has passed for 2,869 yards this season, averaging 318.8 yards per game. Beck is on
 pace to pass for over 3,507 yards in 2005. While that total would not crack the single-sea
 son top-10 for a Cougar quarterback, it would give Beck over 7,000 career passing yards
 and rank ninth on BYU's all-time passing list with one year remaining.

LONG RUN

Fahu Tahi broke free for a 31-yard run in the second quarter against UNLV to put the Cougars in scoring position. It was his longest run of the season and the second-longest run by a BYU player this season.

ROOKIE HEAD COACHES

Bronco Mendenhall became BYU's 14th head coach, the 13th man to hold the job, on Dec. 13, 2004. Cougar coaches have had varied levels of success in their first year at the helm. Four head coaches have enjoyed winning records at the beginning of their tenures, including Eddie Kimball (twice), LaVell Edwards and Gary Crowton. Two coaches won half of their games while the rest had losing seasons. In their debut games, rookie coaches are 7-7. Following is a list of BYU football coaches' first year records.

HALFTIME LEAD

The Cougars led 27-7 at the half against UNLV. It was the fifth time this season BYU led at the half. The Cougars are 4-1 in games when leading at halftime. In those five games, BYU's average lead at the half is 18.8 points.

RUSHING DEFENSE

BYU held UNLV to just two yards rushing on the day, tying Air Force for the best performance by a rush defense this season. The Falcons held the Rebels to two yards. That total is a season-best and marks the fourth time this season the Cougars have held an opponent to 70 yards (or less) rushing. The Cougars held Notre Dame to just 44 yards rushing, gave up just 30 yards against Colorado State and 70 against Eastern Illinois. The two yards rushing by UNLV is the least allowed by BYU since 1988 when the Cougars held Colorado State to minus 26.

CLOSING THE GAP

Prior to the Air Force game, BYU had turned the ball over 15 times and forced nine, good for a -6 turnover margin which ranked 101st in the nation. The Cougars have closed the gap in the last two games, forcing five turnovers against Air Force and three versus UNLV. BYU only turned the ball over twice in that span, both against Air Force. The Cougars have now given the ball away 17 times while taking it away 17 times.

BROTHERS DON'T SIT, BROTHERS GOTTA PLAY

BYU has a long tradition of several members from the same family suiting up to hit the gridiron. Brothers Lance, Jr. and Dallas Reynolds have started all nine games this season. Lance, a senior, is on the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, awarded to the top center in the nation. Dallas, a freshman, was heavily recruited out of high school and joined the Cougars this season after serving an LDS mission in Seattle, Washington.

SECOND-MOST POINTS, LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY VS. UNLV

BYU's 55 points in Saturday's game against UNLV was the second most scored by the Cougars against the Rebels. In 1996, BYU scored 63 at home against UNLV and in 1980, the Cougars put 54 on the board in Vegas. The 41-point margin of victory was the largest by BYU against the Rebels. The Cougars won the 1980 game by 40, 54-14. BYU is now 6-0 in Las Vegas.

DOUBLE DUTY IN THE ENDZONE

Curtis Brown and Fahu Tahi both scored two touchdowns against UNLV. Tahi's TD's came on the ground, while Brown scored one rushing and one receiving. Tahi now has six touchdowns on the year, while Brown has 11. Brown scored four against Air Force to give him six in two games.

The exclusive radio home of BYU Football and flagship of the Cougar Sports Network is KSL NEWSRADIO (1160 AM and 102.7 FM) in Salt Lake City. The "Voice of the Cougars" is Greg Wrubell, now in his 5th season as play-by-play commentator. A BYU alum, Wrubell joined the broadcast crew in 1992 as the sideline/locker-room reporter. He began calling BYU basketball games in 1996.

Joining Wrubell is game analyst and former BYU quarterback Marc Lyons. Lyons is a 24-year veteran of Cougar football broadcasts and co-host of the midweek "Bronco Mendenhall Show." A pair of BYU greats join the KSL Broadcast team this season, with two-time all-conference kick returner James Dye reporting from the sidelines and locker-room, and three-time NFL Pro-Bowl selection Chad Lewis joining Lyons and Dye on the pregame "Cougar Countdown Show." The gameday studio host is KSL's Scott Haws, a former BYU student-athlete and all-conference pitcher for the baseball Cougars.

Chief Engineer John Dehnel returns for his 21st season, while veteran statistician Ralph Sokolowsky and spotter Doug Martin complete the lineup in the booth.

HIGHEST SCORING REGULATION GAME

With 103 combined points in BYU's 62-41 win over Air Force, Saturday's game was the highest scoring regulation game and second highest scoring game in the NCAA this season, behind Ball State's 60-57 overtime-win over Western Michigan. The Cougars were also part of the third highest scoring game of 2005 in their 51-50 loss to TCU. The last time BYU scored 62 points was in 2001 when the Cougars defeated Air Force 63-33 on October 20. The 62 points is the second highest total ever allowed by the Air Force. The Cougars' 63-point outing in 2001 marked the most points ever allowed by an Air Force team.

TURNOVER SCORING

In BYU's win over UNLV, the Cougars scored 21 of its 55 points off three Rebel turnovers. All three turnovers were interceptions.

SCORELESS QUARTERS

Against UNLV, BYU led 7-0 at the end of the first quarter. It was the fifth time this season the Cougars have shut out their opponent in the opening frame and the fifth time they have led after the first quarter. BYU is 3-2 when leading after the first quarter. The Cougars also shut out the Rebels in the third quarter, giving BYU 10 quarter shutouts on the season.

GOOD GRIEF CURTIS BROWN

With a four-yard touchdown run with 57 seconds left in the fourth quarter against Air Force, Curtis Brown set new career highs in rushing yards and touchdowns. Brown finished the game with 219 yards and four touchdowns on 25 carries and did not have any negative rushes on the day. Curtis Brown now has nine-career 100 yard rushing games, including four this season. Brown's nine-100-yard games are second most in BYU history. He is one game behind Luke Staley, Lakei Heimuli, John Ogden and Jamal Willis.

FIRST DOWNS EQUALS SCHOOL RECORD

With 39 first downs against Air Force, the Cougars tied a team record set in 1983 against the Falcons. The Cougar won that game 46-28.

SLOW START, GOOD FINISH

While BYU fell 20-3 in its season opener to Boston College, historical trends indicate the Cougars should still have a successful season. Since 1974, BYU has opened 12 seasons with a loss. In those 12 seasons, the Cougars had winning records in 11 and were .500 in the other. The last time BYU opened the season with a loss and had a losing record was 1973 when the team finished 5-6. MOST POINTS IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

BYU's 62-point outing against Air Force marks the most points scored by a Mountain West Conference team this season. San Diego scored 52 points against San Jose State on Sept. 24. Air Force scored 41 points in the loss, including 27 points against the Cougars in the fourth quarter, marking the most points the Cougars have allowed in a single quarter this season. The previous high was 21 against Notre Dame and TCU.

CAREER 300-YARD GAMES

BYU has traditionally focused on the pass, leading to 21 different Cougars throwing for 300 yards in at least one game for a combined 182 games. Junior John Beck has made a contribution of eight games to that list. He entered the 2005 season with four but threw for 330 yards against No. 22 Boston College, 517 against TCU, 371 at New Mexico, 317 at Notre Dame and 383 against Air Force. MOST YARDS SINCE...

With 383 passing yards and 300 rushing yards, BYU accumulated 683 yards of total offense against the Falcons. The combined total surpasses the 614 the Cougars had against TCU earlier this season and is the most yards BYU has amassed since November 1, 2001 when the Cougars had 694 in a 56-34 win over Colorado State. In that game, BYU had 410 rushing yards and 284 passing yards. The 300 rushing yards was the most for the Cougar since the 2001 Colorado State game.

EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 64,045-seat capacity and immaculate surroundings, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000. In 1982, 1988 and 1997, the Football Writers Association of America cited BYU for its "outstanding pressbox working area."

RETURN FUTILITY

Saturday's game against UNLV marks the 101st game that the Cougars have not scored a touchdown on a punt return. The streak dates back to Oct. 18, 1997 when Jaron Dabney returned a punt 83 yards in the Cougars' 17-3 win at Hawaii. BYU has a streak of 279 punt returns without a return for touchdown. The UNLV game also marks the 89th game the Cougars have not returned a kickoff for a touchdown, marking a string of 285 kick returns without a touchdown. Mike Rigell was the last BYU player to return a kickoff (96 yards), leading the Cougars to a 31-9 win against Hawaii on Oct. 17, 1998 in Provo.

THE RANKED TEAMS

The Cougars' loss at No. 9 Notre Dame was their second against a ranked opponent this season. BYU started the season with a loss to then No. 22 Boston College. The Cougars are now 0-12 against ranked teams since defeating No. 23 Colorado State, 34-13, on Sept. 16, 1999. During that streak BYU is 0-3 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. BYU has not defeated a ranked opponent on the road since beating Arizona State, 13-10, on Sept. 20, 1997.

IT'S AUTOMATIC ... ALMOST

BYU, known traditionally for its high-octane offenses, rarely gets shutout. Until the Cougar's 3-0 loss to the University of Utah to end the 2003 season, BYU had scored in 361-consecutive games, which remains an NCAA record, dating back to the 1975 season. The Cougars started a new streak in 2004, scoring in every game and extending the streak to 20 games against UNLV, Nov. 5, 2005. Since October 3, 1975, BYU has scored in 381-of-382 games. MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Sept. 25)

John Beck was named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week after posting a MWC record 517 yards passing in BYU's 51-50 loss to TCU. He completed 30-of-51 (.588) attempts, and became just the third player in league history to pass for over 500 yards in a game. Beck also tied a MWC single-game record with five touchdown passes. His third-quarter strike found wide receiver Todd Watkins for a 67-yard touchdown, marking the Cougars' longest score of the season. On the first play of the overtime period, Beck went to the corner of the end zone to find Watkins for a 25-yard touchdown, giving BYU a 50-44 lead in overtime.

MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Oct. 8)

John Beck was named the MWC Player of the Week after completing 34-of-44 passes (77.3 percent) for 371 yards and three touchdowns in BYU's come-from-behind 27-24 victory at New Mexico. Trailing 24-13 with over seven minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, Beck put together two different scoring drives that led to 14 unanswered points. The comeback started on a 13-play, 93-yard drive that cut the Lobo lead to 24-19. During the drive, Beck was 8-of-10 for 94 yards. With the Cougars still down by five points with 2:48 remaining in the game, Beck drove BYU 80 yards in five plays, connecting on five straight pass attempts, including a 23-yard pass to Matt Allen for the game-winning touchdown. This marks his second player of the week award this season and the third of his career.

HARLINE EARNS NATIONAL TIGHT END WEEKLY HONOR (Oct. 12)

After totaling over 100 yards receiving in back-to-back games against San Diego State and New Mexico, and helping BYU to a come-back win over New Mexico, tight end Jonny Harline was named the national John Mackey Tight End of the Week by the Nassau County Sports Commission (10/12/05). Against New Mexico, Harline grabbed a career-high 10 receptions and equaled a career-high 123 yards. A week earlier he had seven receptions for 123 yards against San Diego State. Harline is the first BYU tight end to record 246 yards over two games since Chris Smith totaled 284 yards over two games in 1990. Smith had 125 yards on eight receptions against Utah and eight receptions for 159 yards against Utah State. Gordon Hudson holds the tight end record for receiving yardage over a two-game stretch, posting 396 yards in two straight games during the 1981 season. He totaled 137 yards against Colorado State, followed by 259 yards against Hawaii the following week.

MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (Oct. 29)

Curtis Brown was named MWC Co-offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Air Force. He ran for a career-high 219 yards on 25 carries (8.8 yards per carry) and career-best four touchdowns in BYU's 62-41 victory over Air Force. Three of his four touchdowns came in the fourth quarter. Brown was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week in 2002 after his 217-yard, three-touchdown performance against Utah State.

CAREER HIGHS AND SINGLE-GAME RECORDS

When John Beck completed a 37-yard pass to Jonny Harline against TCU, he had 420 passing yards, surpassing his career high of 390, which came against Boise State in 2004. He finished the day with a Mountain West single-game record 517 yards. Beck also set a new career high and tied a MWC record for touchdown passes with five when he completed a 25-yard scoring strike to Todd Watkins in overtime. Watkins finished with 176 yards and tied an MWC record with three touchdowns.

THE 100-YARD CLUB

Michael Reed's 50-yard reception in the fourth quarter against Air Force put him over the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career. He is the third Cougar to record over 100-yards receiving this season. Todd Watkins had 176 yards against TCU while Jonny Harline has recorded 100 or more yards three times, including 123 at San Diego State, 123 at New Mexico and 100 at Notre Dame. Should Reed have another 100-yard game this season, he will become only the second freshman receiver in BYU history to produce two 100-yard games during his freshman season. Matt Bellini is currently the only BYU receiver to have two 100-yard games during his freshman season (1987).

PARTY LIKE ITS 1999 ... or 98

Several Cougars began their BYU football careers before the start of the 21st century, including Spencer White, Fahu Tahi, Nate Soelberg, Brian Sanders, Chris Hale and Matt Berry, who joined the team in 1999 before serving missions. But they aren't the oldest Cougars. That honor belongs to Ryan Beck, who was born in 1979. Hale and Tahi both made big impacts in 1999. Hale made the game-winning 38-yard touchdown reception in the season opener against Washington at home. Tahi led the team in rushing yards, totaling 445 yards on 102 carries.

CALLED TO SERVE

There are currently 62 returned missionaries (59 percent) on the BYU roster who have served full-time, two-year missions for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in over 21 countries. Members of this year's team have served missions in Australia, Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, England, Germany, Guatemala, Nicaragua, Norway, Panama, Philippines, Portugal, Russia, Samoa, Spain, Tonga, United States and Uruguay. Members of this year's team can communicate fluently in at least 12 different languages. The Church of Jesus Christ operates more than 330 missions around the world with approximately 56,000 missionaries. There are four lettermen from last year's team who are currently serving missions, including Matt Bauman (Harrisburg, Pa.), R.J. Willing (Albuquerque, N.M.), Dennis Pitta (Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic) and Freshman All-American receiver Austin Collie (Buenos Aires, Argentina).

LONGEST GAME

The game versus TCU lasted 4 hours and 42 minutes. While the NCAA has been unable to verify the length of the longest game in history, it is believed that the BYU vs. TCU game is the longest. Arkansas has played in two, seven-overtime period games. The most recent was against Kentucky in 2003 and lasted 4 hours and 30 minutes. The other was against Ole Miss in 2001 and lasted 4 hours and 12 minutes. BYU's game versus Hawai'i in 2001 lasted 4 hours and 24 minutes.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

When Zac Collie caught a seven-yard touchdown pass from John Beck on BYU's first drive against TCU, it was the 13th touchdown scored by the Collie family for the Cougars. Zac's father, Scott Collie, scored four TD's when he played for the Cougars from 1979-82 and his brother Austin scored eight as a freshman in 2004. Zac added the 14th for the family later in the first quarter on a 37-yard reception from Beck to put BYU up 21-10. It was the second two-game touchdown for a member of the Collie family. Austin scored two against San Diego State in 2004.

YOUNG GUN

While Mendenhall has 16 years of assistant coaching experience, he is now a head coach for the first time in his career. Despite his extensive experience, he is the fourth youngest coach in NCAA Division I-A football at the age of 39. Mike Gundy of Oklahoma State is 38 and is one year, five months and 22 days younger than Mendenhall.


