## COUGARS TO SQUARE OFF WITH SCHOOL UP NORTH

Following its 21-14 loss last Saturday to New Mexico, BYU faces a must-win game against the Utes on Saturday Nov. 20. BYU needs to win this game to become bowl eligible and to ensure a winning record for the first time since 2001. The Utes are currently 10-0 overall and 6-0 in the MWC. With a win against the Cougars on Saturday, Utah will become only the second school in the history of the MWC to go undefeated in MWC play. The 2001 Cougars are the only team to escape conference play without a loss. A loss by the Cougars would mark the first time in 40 years that BYU suffered three straight losing seasons. Last season, Utah defeated BYU, 3-0, on a snowy day at LaVell Edwards Stadium, snapping the Cougars NCAA record of 361 consecutive games without being shut out.

## CHANGING COLORS

BYU defensive line coach Steve Kafusi, Utah defensive coordinator Kyle Whittingham and tight ends coach Keith Uperesa have ties to Utah and BYU. Kafusi, Whittingham and Uperesa had stellar playing careers at BYU before moving on to the world of coaching. Whittingham and Uperesa were both graduate assistants under LaVell Edwards before moving on to other coaching gigs. Kafusi got his start at Utah in 1994 as a graduate assistant under then head coach Ron McBride. He coached the defensive line for the Utes until moving to coach the d-line at BYU in 2002.

## BATTLE FOR THE BOOT

First instituted in 1971, the Beehive Boot is the symbol for gridiron supremacy in the state of Utah. Estimated to be over 100 years old, the Beehive Boot is an authentic piece of Utah history. Unlike other rivalry trophies, the Beehive Boot is presented to the team with the best record against all in-state opponents. BYU has won the boot 19 times in the past 29 years, including five straight from 1983 to 1987. Utah has won the boot eight times, while Utah State has claimed it six times over the years. The boot currently resides at Utah after the Utes beat both Utah State and BYU last season.

## BYU'S RECORD IN THE MWC

After losing to New Mexico, the Cougars record in the MWC fell to 25-16. BYU has won one outright MWC title in football when it posted a 7-0 conference record in 2001, the only perfect conference record in the brief history of the MWC, and has tied for one championship (1999). In all sports, BYU has won an overwhelming number of MWC championships, bringing home 53 out of a possible 95 championship titles.

**UP OR DOWN**

The following BYU coaches will be working from the sidelines for the Boise State game: Gary Crowton (head coach), Todd Bradford (wide receivers), Bronco Mendenhall (defensive coordinator and safeties), Paul Tidwell (special teams coordinator), Jeff Grimes (offensive line) and Steve Kafusi (defensive line). The remaining assistant coaches, including Lance Reynolds (running backs), Mike Empey (tight ends), Barry Lamb (linebackers) and Brian Mitchell (cornerbacks), will coach from the booth.

**A LITTLE HISTORY: BYU vs. The School Up North**

Saturday's in-state battle between Utah and BYU will mark the 80th meeting between the two schools, dating back to 1922. Utah owns a 47-28-4 advantage in the rivalry. Prior to 1922, Utah and then B.Y. Academy met six times, posting an identical 3-3 record. (The two teams met three times in 1896, twice in 1897 and once in 1898 before the Academy disbanded its football team. For various reasons, including the death of a player, the Academy did not field a team again until 1922.) Over the past seven seasons no team has won by more than seven points. Interestingly, no team has ever won more than nine straight games in the series. Utah reeled off nine straight wins from 1929 to 1937, and while it took some 50 years, BYU managed nine straight from 1979 to 1987. The Utes are looking to win three straight for the first time since they won four in a row from 1968 to 1971. It wasn't until the 1969 season that BYU and Utah started playing each other at the end of the season, as opposed to earlier in the year. For many years, the Utah-Utah State game marked the end of the Utes' regular season. However, since 1969, BYU and Utah have met 25 different times in the regular-season finale (for one or both teams). This year's game will mark the regular-season ending for both teams. The Cougars own a 18-8 record against Utah when playing in the final game of the regular season, including a stretch of 13 straight victories from 1974 to 1992. Since 1993 however, the Utes have posted a 7-3 mark against the Cougars when playing in the regular-season finale. Since the MWC was formed in 1999, Utah holds a slight 3-2 advantage over BYU. With BYU needing a victory to win the outright title in 1999, the Utes upset the Cougars in Provo, 20-17. The following year in LaVell Edwards's last game as head coach of the Cougars, BYU overcame improbable odds to record one of the greatest come-back victories in BYU history, defeating the Utes 34-27. BYU won its second game in a row in 2001 to finish MWC play undefeated. Since then the Utes have won two in a row, including last year's 3-0 win in Provo.

**PAYNE NAMED LOU GROZA, RAY GUY SEMI-FINALIST**

The Greater Augusta Sports Council last week announced BYU punter Matt Payne has been named one of 10 semifinalists for the fifth-annual Ray Guy Award. Payne was selected from a list of 41 initial candidates based upon his overall statistics and contribution to his team. The award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate punter. One of only seven players in the country who handles punting, field goals, point-after attempts and kickoffs, Payne ranks among the nation's leaders averaging 45.3 yard per punt. He ranks third nationally in net punting, averaging nearly 41.4 yards per punt. Payne, a 6-foot-4, 240-pound senior has been credited with 21 punts downed inside the 20-yard line, including 11 punts downed inside the 10-yard line. Payne was also named a semi-finalist for the Lou Groza award after setting an NCAA record for consecutive field goals from 40-49 yards at 14. Payne also holds the BYU record for consecutive PATs made, connecting on 67 straight before missing one against San Diego State. Payne has showed a knack for making long kicks, connecting on four out of five kicks from beyond 50 yards, including two from 53 yards. His only miss came on a 59-yard attempt against San Diego State, but that didn't mean something good didn't come from the miss. Payne's attempt was blocked, but he picked up the ball and scampered 25-yards for the first down.

## JOHNNY B. IS GOOD

Sophomore quarterback John Beck entered the New Mexico game with 2,967 career yards, needing just 33 yards to reach the 3,000-yard mark. With 4:03 remaining in the first quarter, on a 19 completion to Chris Hale, Beck eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark. On the day, Beck completed 22 of 37 passes for 247 yards and one touchdown. He is the third rated passer in the MWC with an efficiency rating of 128.39. He ranks first in the MWC in completions per game with an average of 17.5 per game. Beck has accumulated 2,350 yards on the season, trailing only Utah's Alex Smith in passing yards in the MWC. Also of note, Beck is on pace to reach over 3,300 yards this season. If he does, he would finish as the Cougars' third-ranked sophomore quarterback. Only Ty Detmer (5,812) and John Walsh (4,678) have posted more passing yards through their sophomore campaigns.

## KING OF PAYNE

After 10 games, Matt Payne is fourth in the nation in punting with an average of 45.45 yards per kick and second in net punting with an average of 41.83. He has pinned opponents inside the 20-yardline 23 times. In the third game of the season, Payne booted a career-long and a then MWC record 79-yard punt. Unlike most punters, Payne likes to get into the thick of it during kick coverage. He had two highlight-reel quality hits against Boise State kick returner Chris Carr. On the season, Payne has racked up seven tackles on special teams, including six solo takedowns. Payne is no slouch as a kicker either. The senior from North Ogden, Utah has booted 15 of 21 field goals, including a 12 of 15 from 40-yards or greater. Prior to last week's game against New Mexico, Payne's only miss from beyond 40 yards was a 59-yard attempt that was blocked against San Diego State. Payne promptly picked up the blocked kick and ran 25 yards for a first down. Also against the Aztecs, Payne broke the NCAA record of consecutive field goals from 40-49 yards—a record he tied during the Wyoming game. On the season, Payne has matched his career high of 53-yards twice, against Notre Dame and Air Force. On the season Payne has missed just one extra point, connecting on 25 of 26 attempts. His school-record of 67 consecutive extra points dating back to the 2002 season was snapped against the Aztecs.

## OH AUSTIN BEHAVE

Already the owner of BYU's freshman record for yards (697) and touchdowns (7), freshman receiver Austin Collie continued his bid for Freshman All-America and MWC Freshman-of-the-Year honors after grabbing four more receptions last Saturday. Collie needs just two more receptions this week against Utah to break Matt Bellini's record of 51 set in 1987. On the season he has 50 receptions for 697 yards. He leads the Cougars in touchdowns and touchdown receptions with seven. Five of his seven touchdowns have been 40-yards or greater, including an 82-yarder against SDSU. Collie is also second on the Cougars and ninth in the MWC in receiving yards per game, averaging 69.7 yards. He is second among freshman nationally in receiving yards per game and is first among freshman in receptions per game with an average of 5.0 catches per game.

## GOING DEEP

Junior College transfer Todd Watkins has made an immediate impact for the Cougars. He leads the team with 1001 receiving yards on 48 receptions and is second on the team in touchdown catches with five. He has caught touchdown passes of 68, 69, 70 and 79 yards on the season, leading Sports Illustrated to dub him the nation's top "deep threat." Despite being held to just one reception against New Mexico, Watkins is first in the conference and fifth nationally in receiving yards per game with a 100.1 yard average. He, along with freshman Austin Collie, have helped return the Cougars to one of the premier passing schools in the country. BYU currently ranks 12th in the nation in passing, averaging 286.2 yards per game.

## GOOD GRIEF CURTIS BROWN

Despite a slow start, sophomore running back Curtis Brown has picked up the pace in MWC games. Since MWC play began Brown has racked up 602 yards. Included in that stretch was a streak four straight games over 100 yards. Brown's four straight 100-yard games marked just the third time a Cougar running back has eclipsed the century mark in four consecutive games. On the season Brown has rushed for 705 yards and five touchdowns. Brown accounted for 230 of the Cougars' 416 total yards in the Cougars' 24-13 win over Wyoming. He carried 24 times for 159 yards, threw one time for 40 yards and had three receptions for 31 yards. He also scored one rushing touchdown on a nine-yard run in the fourth quarter to give the Cougars a 17-13 lead with 13:37 remaining in the game. Against New Mexico, Brown eclipsed the 1,000 yard mark for his career, becoming only the fourth Cougar to accomplish that feat by their sophomore season. He joins Ronney Jenkins, 2,179; Jamal Willis, 1,524; and Jeff Blanc, 1,026.

## COUGARS FACE TOUGH SCHEDULE

BYU was scheduled to play the ninth toughest non conference schedule based on opponents' winning percentage last season. The Cougars non conference schedule included games against Notre Dame, Stanford, co-National Champion and preseason No. 1 USC and Boise State who combined for a 34-16 record in 2003. The overall record of BYU's opponents including Mountain West Conference teams in 2003 was 82-54 (.603). Five of the Cougars' 11 opponents went to a bowl game last year. The teams finished with a 3-2 bowl record, including USC's victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl that earned the Trojans a share of the National Title. Following the tenth week of the season, BYU's opponents are 64-45 (.587), with their non-conference opponents posting a 29-10 (.744) record through Nov. 13. ## TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's projected starting offensive line averages an enormous 6-foot-4 and 312 pounds. They will face an Utah defensive line that averages 6-foot-2 and 294 pounds. When the Utes have the ball, Cougar defensive linemen that average 6-foot-4 and 293 pounds will face a Utah front five that are listed at 6-foot-4 and 308 pounds.

## SWEET REVENGE

Since 1999, BYU holds a 7-3 (.700) record in payback games against non conference opponents. Last year the Cougars defeated Georgia Tech in BYU's home opener 24-13 after losing to the Yellow Jackets 28-19 the previous year. This year BYU had payback opportunities on its non-conference schedule. The Cougars defeated Notre Dame 20-17, lost to Stanford 37-10 and lost to USC 42-10. Of the 105 players who participated in fall camp, 35 are married. The 35 married players have a total of eight children. Included among the nine children are new additions to Manaia Brown's, Brady Poppinga's and Jason Kukahiko's families. Brown's wife Tupusina gave birth to Manaia Vaega Vaifoa on Aug. 9, while Poppinga's wife Brooke gave birth to their new daughter, Jasmine Rene, on Aug. 12. There will be two more additions to the Cougar family later this fall. Kukahiko's wife Kristin gave birth to the couple's first child Kate Anna on Sept. 7. Defensive back Brett Cooper and his wife, Diana, are expecting their first child in October.

### ATHLETIC EXCELLENCE

The Cougars have experienced athletic success on a national level. Since 1970 when BYU captured its first NCAA title, the Cougars have won ten national championships, including four in cross-country and three in men's volleyball since 1997. BYU also won the national championship in football in 1984. BYU has also ranked high in the NACDA Director's cup, an award given to the nation's best athletic program. 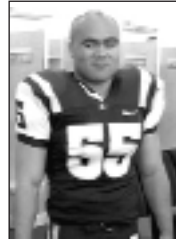


## GRIDDERS GET NEW, COMFORTABLE UNIFORMS

## 1984 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP HONORED AT FIRST HOME GAME



Marking the 20th anniversary of the Cougars' 1984 National Championship the team was this year's sole induction into the BYU Athletic Hall of Fame. The induction ceremony took place Friday evening, Sept. 3, at the Wilkinson Center Ballroom. The team was honored the next day at Lavell Edwards Stadium during the BYU-Notre Dame game in pre-game and halftime ceremonies. Only two other Cougar teams have been inducted into the Hall of Fame: the 1951 NIT Championship Basketball team and the 1966 NIT Championship Basketball team. Cosmo, the Cougarettes and the BYU Marching Band played a part in the game-day festivities. There was also be an informal golf tournament Friday afternoon where some of the players participated as celebrity guests. In addition to the celebration in the stadium, a lithograph has been commissioned in honor of

the '84 team. 1,984 numbered lithographs will be available for purchase. The artwork will feature individually autographed pictures of the 24 starters, including Vai Sikahema and Lee Johnson, along with a team picture and a picture of coach LaVell Edwards.

Familiar players like Glen Kozlowski, Vai Sikahema, Lee Johnson, Mark Bellini and Kelly Smith put Provo on the map in the world of college football. All-Americans like Robbie Bosco, Kyle Morrell, David Mills, Leon White and Marv Allen helped make the team a threat on both sides of the ball. In total, 15 players from the 1984 squad were drafted by 12 different NFL teams. Now, these players—hopefully all 120 of them—will be returning to LaVell Edwards Stadium to be recognized by their alma mater on the 20th anniversary of their epic season. After a perfect 12-0 season, the Cougars went on to defeat Michigan in the Holiday Bowl at Jack Murphy Stadium. Robbie Bosco's heroic return from an early, second-quarter knee injury, along with a circus catch from Kelly Smith, was only part of the 13-game saga. Many fans remember the famous goal-line stand against Hawaii where Kyle Morrell soared over the offensive line to sack the Warrior quarterback and in the process kept their season unblemished.

## ELECTION YEAR RECORD

Since 1972, BYU has posted an 83-29 (.741) record during election years, including 2004. Some of BYU's most significant moments on the gridiron have occurred while republicans and democrats are fighting for a seat in the oval office. During the 1972 presidential election, LaVell Edwards took over as BYU's head coach. In 1976, BYU was invited to its first bowl game, the Fiesta Bowl against Oklahoma State. The 1980 presidential election year brought the Cougars their first bowl victory and a 12-1 record. BYU won the national championship in 1984, and in 1996, the Cougars posted 14 victories and earned their first trip to a New Year's Day bowl game.

## FIVE OF FIRST SIX GAMES ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

The Cougars will play in five nationally televised games during the 2004 season. BYU opened the season on Saturday, Sept. 4 against Notre Dame on ESPN, marking the 10th straight season the Cougars have opened the season playing on either ESPN, ESPN2 or ABC. On Sept. 11, BYU will participate in the first Division I-A football game broadcast on CSTV. The Cougars will host defending National Champion USC on Sept. 18 in a nationally broadcast game on ESPN, beginning at 8 p.m. (MT). The following week, BYU will travel to Boise State for a second straight nationally televised game on ESPN. On Oct. 8, the Cougars will host UNLV for a prime time, MWC match-up on ESPN2.



Head Coach Gary Crowton

Gary Crowton, entering his fourth season as the head coach at BYU, has guided the Cougars to a 21-17 record since arriving in Provo. This season Crowton will lead the Cougars against top teams such as Notre Dame, Stanford, USC and Boise State, as well as a tough league schedule.

In December 2000, Crowton took over a BYU program that had been under the direction of college football's sixth all-time winningest coach, LaVell Edwards, who posted a record of 257-101-3 (.716) over 29 seasons.

In his first season as head coach at BYU, Crowton constructed the nation's top-rated offense, posting a

12-2 record, including 10 straight victories to start his BYU career. For his efforts, he was named the MWC Coach of the Year as the Cougars won their first-ever, outright MWC championship.

Crowton, 47, came to BYU with a long and proven list of coaching accomplishments. Prior to serving as the offensive coordinator with the NFL's Chicago Bears, where his offense ranked third in the NFL in passing yardage during the 1999 season, Crowton was head coach at Louisiana Tech from 1996-1998. There he guided the Bulldogs to a 21-13 (.618) record over three seasons, including a 9-2 mark in 1997.

Competing as an independent for three straight years, Louisiana Tech recorded wins over the likes of Mississippi State, Cal and Alabama. Using its Crowton-designed, high-powered offense, the program also recorded impressive wins by scoring 50 or more points against eight different opponents, including games of 60 or more points in five different games. Crowton's offense ranked third in the nation, both in passing and total offense, while the Bulldogs racked up 12,746 yards passing in three years, an average of 4,249 yards per season. The prolific Tech offense also produced 115 touchdown receptions, averaging 38.3 TDs per season.

Under Crowton, NFL first-round draft pick Troy Edwards recorded a Tech-record 280 receptions and 4,352 yards receiving. Over a span of 34 games, Crowton's offense at Louisiana Tech engineered 22 different 300-yard passing games, including school-record 10, 300-yard outings during the 1998 season. In 1998, Crowton's final season at Louisiana Tech, the Bulldogs combined for a school record 4,943 yards passing.

Crowton's coaching career actually began in 1982 as a student assistant under Edwards at BYU. While at BYU, he worked with current Seattle Seahawks head coach Mike Holmgren and future NFL Hall of Famer Steve Young. From BYU, Crowton moved on to Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, where he coached from 1983-86. While at Snow College, Crowton moved from defensive backs coach to offensive coordinator. Under his offensive leadership, the Badgers won the National Junior College Athletic Association National Championship in 1985.

From Snow College, Crowton moved to Western Illinois, where he directed the Leathernecks' passing game for a single season. In 1988, Crowton was hired as the offensive coordinator at New Hampshire, where the Wildcats were the top-rated passing team in the Yankee Conference from 1988-90.

In 1991, Crowton was hired as the quarterback coach at Boston College under head coach Tom Coughlin. There he helped develop quarterback Glenn Foley as a candidate for the Heisman Trophy. After three successful seasons with the Eagles, Crowton was hired as the co-offensive coordinator at Georgia Tech, where his offense led the Yellow Jackets to a No. 21 national ranking in his first and only season in Atlanta. In 1995, Crowton was hired as the offensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech, where he would become the head coach the following season.

Crowton was an all-league quarterback at Orem High School before earning All-American honors at Snow College. Crowton transferred to Colorado State, where he finished his career. Following an LDS Church mission to South Korea, Crowton attended Idaho State, where he ran track for the Bengals. After returning to BYU in 1982, Crowton earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1983.

Crowton, who is the first-ever head football coach at BYU to serve an LDS Church mission, is married to the former Maren Peterson of Bountiful, Utah. The couple was married on August 3, 1985. The Crowtons have seven children, Dane (18), Tara (16), Jenessa (13), Quinn (10), Mikauli (8) Toriana (4) and Macloud (2).

## EDWARDS SELECTED TO HALL OF FAME



The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame has announced the 2004 College Football Hall of Fame Division I-A Class. Former BYU head football coach LaVell Edwards is among the list of 14 inductees to this year's class. A coaching icon, whose success and longevity are paralleled by few, Edwards guided BYU to heights never before reached in the program's history. Edwards posted a record of 257-101-3 (.716) over a span of 29 seasons at BYU. From 1972 until his retirement following the 2000 season, Edwards roamed the sidelines at BYU—a tenure that ranks fifth all-time among coaches at one school. In 21 of those 29 seasons, the Cougars claimed the league title. Guiding BYU to 22 bowl game appearances, including a streak of 17 straight bowl appearances, Edwards reached the pinnacle of coaching success in 1984 by winning the National Championship. His 257 wins rank him sixth in NCAA Division I-A history, and he has more victories than every other coach in BYU history combined. At the helm, Edwards compiled a program best .716 win percentage, coached one Heisman Trophy winner, two Outland Trophy recipients, four Davey O'Brien award winners and 32 All-Americans—not to mention countless players who went on to professional careers in the NFL. BYU's success didn't come without personal reward for Edwards either. He was named NCAA District 8 Coach of the Year eight times, the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in 1979 and AFCA National Coach of the Year in 1985. Named the State of Utah's Coach of the Century, Edwards is a member of the State of Utah Sports Hall of Fame. Edwards becomes the fifth person affiliated with BYU football to be inducted in to the College Football Hall of Fame. It is no surprise that the four BYU players who are currently enshrined in the Hall of Fame often credit Edwards for their success. BYU's other College Football Hall of Famers include Steve Young (Class of 2001), Jim McMahon (Class of 1998), Marc Wilson (Class of 1996), Gifford Nielsen (Class of 1994). Edwards, who will turn 74 in October, recently returned from an LDS Church mission to New York City. Along with his wife, Patti, the Edwards' served as public affairs missionaries for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the Northeastern United States, as well as Eastern Canada. The Edwards have been married for nearly 53 years and have three children, Ann, John and Jim. The Edwards have 14 grandchildren.

## RECORD WATCH

After kicking two field goals and two extra points against Notre Dame, senior kicker Matt Payne moved past Jamal Willis and Kurt Gunther into third place on BYU's all-time scoring list. One of Payne's field goals was a 53-yarder that matched his career-high that was set in 2003 against USC. In the history of Cougar football there have only been five kicks of 52 yards or more. Matt Payne has three of those kicks. During his sophomore and junior campaigns, he led the team in scoring. After scoring 11 points against Air Force, Payne passed Luke Staley to become the Cougars second leading scorer of all-time. Safety Aaron Francisco currently has 323 career tackles. He trails former Cougar and current Indianapolis Colts linebacker Rob Morris by 22 tackles for ninth place on BYU's all-time career tackle list.
