With three victories away from home already under its belt, No. 21/25 BYU will return home to Utah to take on the University of Hawaii. The game will not be played in Provo but will be the first of two home games the Cougars will play in EnergySolutions Arena in Salt Lake City. The game is scheduled to tip off Saturday at 4 p.m. MT. BYU is now 7-0 on the season after winning their first true away game of the season against Creighton. Hawaii is 5-1 after a heartbreaking 54-53 loss to Cal Poly in their last outing. Jimmer Fredette leads the Cougars with 23.1 points, 4.6 assists and 2.3 steals per game while Jackson Emery contributes 12.9 points, 3.9 boards and 2.9 steals per game. Hawaii is led by Bill Amis who is currently averaging 15.8 points and 6.8 rebounds this season. Hawaii is coached by Gib Arnold. Wednesday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 3 p.m. MT on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on BYUtv.

No. 21/25 BYU will play Vermont on Wednesday, Dec. 8, at the Glens Falls Civic Center in Glens Falls, N.Y., at 7 p.m. ET. The game will be televised live by CBS College Sports. A live stats link will be available on www.byucougars.com and listen live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. ET on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com.

COUGAR OUICK HITS

- No. 23 BYU head coach Dave Rose is 134-40 in his six seasons at BYU and is the program's all-time leader in winning percentage at .770. From 2006 through last season, he led BYU to four-straight 25-win seasons, four-straight seasons ranked in the top 25 and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament.
- The Cougars were ranked in the AP Preseason Poll for the first time since the 1980-81 season and are currently ranked No. 21 in the AP Poll and No. 25 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Jimmer Fredette has been named to eight preseason All-America teams (AP, ESPN.com, Sporting News, Sl.com/ Sports Illustrated, Basketball Times, Athlon Sports, Dick Vitale and Blue Ribbon Magazine). Fredette is averaging 23.1 points, 3.9 assists and 2.9 steals per game this season.
- Jackson Emery and Jimmer Fredette have combined for 36 steals through seven games for a 5.1 combined average. Emery has 20 steals while Fredette has 16 steals. Fredette tied a career high with five steals against South Florida and Emery has recorded 18 steals in the last five games, including two games with five steals.

HAWAII'S LAST OUTING - 54-53 LOSS TO CAL POLY

SAN LUIS OBISPO, Calif. - The University of Hawai'i men's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season in excruciating fashion with 54-53 setback to Cal Poly Wednesday night at Mott Gym. Chris O'Brien's put-back as time expired proved the game-winner as UH fell to 5-1 after its first road game of the year.

O'Brien's put-back concluded a wild final minute of action. The 'Bows overcame a four-point deficit to take a one-point lead only to have the game snatched away on the final play. Trailing 52-48, UH trimmed the deficit to just one after Zane Johnson hit three straight free throws at the 1:01 mark. After forcing a Mustang turnover, UH got the ball back and capitalized on a Joston Thomas layup with 22 seconds left to take a 54-53 lead.

With its last possession Cal Poly (3-3) scrambled for a final shot with UH hunkering down with some tough defense. Shawn Lewis launched an errant three-pointer and Will Donahue's rebound a mid range shot was also off the mark. But O'Brien was waiting on the weakside to convert at the buzzer and hand Hawai'i its first blemish of the year.

Johnson led Hawai'i with 11 points and four assists. Thomas added 10 points while freshman Bobby Miles and Trevor Wiseman each contributed 8. Sophomore post Vander Joaquim hauled in 11 rebounds and added three blocks.

UH shot 51 percent from the floor, held the Mustangs to just 33 percent shooting and won the battle of the boards, 34-24. However, all of that still equated to a loss after the turnover-prone Rainbow Warriors finished with 27 turnovers, including 17 in the first half.

Hawai'i got off to a slow start. UH fell behind by double digits just seven minutes to the game committing twice as many turnovers (8) as they had shot attempts (4) But UH eventually crawled back into the game and took its first lead, 28-26, on a Bobby Miles three-pointer with less than a minute left in the half. The 'Bows took that slim lead into the locker room overcoming 17 first-half turnovers and holding the Mustangs to just 28 percent shooting.

The second half was nip-and-tuck with neither team leading by more than five points. UH held a 38-33 lead with 10 minutes left, but a 12-2 run gave the Mustangs a five point lead of their own with just over six minutes left. It was a lead they would hold onto until UH held the lead briefly in the final minute of the contest.

SERIES NOTES

Saturday's game will be the 45th meeting between BYU and Hawaii. The Cougars hold a 31-13 advantage overall, including a 4-3 record on neutral courts. BYU defeated Hawaii last season 83-65 at Hawaii.

LAST TIME OUT - DAVIES, COLLINSWORTH LIFT COUGARS OVER JAYS
AHA, Neb. (Dec. 1, 2010) - Brandon Davies and Kyle Collinsworth had career nights as the No. 21/25 BYU men's basketball team improved to a perfect 7-0 with a 77-65 win over Creighton (4-3) in Omaha, Neb.

Davies, a sophomore forward, grabbed six rebounds to add to his career-high 24 points. Collinsworth, a true freshman, posted his first-career double-double, tying his career high with 12 points, and setting a new career mark with

"It was a great team win," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "You take a look at the numbers and it's amazing how we shared the ball.

In the complete team effort, six Cougars finished with at least four rebounds and two assists and four scored in

Scoring was staggered to start the contest, with Collinsworth scoring four quick points to help put the Cougars up 11-6 with 15:49 remaining in the first half.

Davies started strong, going 2-for-4 from the field to tally five points as BYU took a 17-12 lead into the second media timeout. The Cougars gained their largest lead of the half with 9:36 remaining after a Jackson Emery trey put the Cougars up 24-12 and extended the lead to 12 again after a Collinsworth dribble drive made it 30-18.

After not starting due to a shin injury. Emery went on to play the entire second half, recording 13 points and seven

However, the Blue Jays went on an 8-2 run to bring the score to 34-28 going into halftime. Collinsworth led the Cougars in the first half, posting eight points, four rebounds and two assists

The Jays didn't go away as the second half began, pushing the Cougars to a 37-34 tally before Emery converted a steal with a layup to put the Cougars up by seven with 17:20 remaining in the game.

Freshman forward Doug McDermott led a Creighton charge to begin the second half, scoring five points on 2-of-3 shooting, pulling the Blue Jays to tie the contest at 48 with 11:38 remaining in the game

Senior guard Jimmer Fredette sparked a 10-0 run to give the Cougars a 61-51 lead after an Emery pass set up a Hartsock dunk with 8:52 to play. Davies scored four points during the run and took over in the final minutes, propelling the Cougars to a 75-63 lead with 2:30 left in the game.

Fredette finished with 13 points, five rebounds and four assists in his lowest scoring output of the season. The senior guard has scored in double figures in all seven games this season.

-Davies scored a career-high 24 points on 9-of-11 shooting and added 6 rebounds - including 5 offensive boards. Davies made his last 8 field goal attempts and completed 4 three-point plays.

-Kyle Collinsworth scored 8 points in the first half, tying his most points in a first half this season, and added 4 boards and 2 assists. He finished the game with 12 points to tie his career high and set a career high with 10 rebounds to give him his first-career double-double.

-Jimmer Fredette finished with 13 points, 5 rebounds, 3 assists and 2 steals against the Bluejays. He has scored in double figures in all seven games this season.

Despite missing practice on Monday and Tuesday due to shin soreness, Jackson Emery finished the game with 13 points, 6 rebounds, 3 assists and 1 steal. He also had 3 threes, his third game this season and 20th of his career with three-plus threes. BYU is 3-0 this season and 19-1 overall when Emery hits at least three threes.

-Noah Hartsock hit a three to give BYU an 11-6 lead. It was his second trey of the season and third of his career. Hartsock finished the game with 7 points, 4 rebounds, 2 assists, 2 steals and a career-best 5 blocks.

TEAM NOTES

-Coach Dave Rose started Jimmer Fredette, Kyle Collinsworth, Charles Abouo, Noah Hartsock and Brandon Davies. It was the fourth different starting lineup for the Cougars this season. Fredette is the only player to start all seven games this season. -The Cougars led 34-28 at the half against Creighton. BYU has led at the half five times this season, trailed once and been tied once.

-Four players scored in double figures, including Brandon Davies (24 points), Jimmer Fredette (13 points), Jackson Emery (13 points) and Kyle Collinsworth (12 points). BYU is 3-0 this season when four players score in double figures -With the 77-65 win, BYU handed Creighton its first Wednesday loss in the Qwest Center Omaha. The Bluejays were 23-0

on Wednesdays in their home arena heading into Wednesday's game.

-BYU head coach Dave Rose is now 134-40 in his sixth season at BYU. He is the Cougars' all-time leader in winning percentage (.770) and is three wins from tying Glen Potter for fifth all-time in wins at BYU.

-With 13 points at Creighton, Fredette has 1,693 career points and is 22 points from tying Mark Bigelow (1,715 points) for eighth all-time in scoring at BYU.

-BYU opened the game shooting 5-of-7 from the field for an 11-6 lead.

-With the Cougars leading 14-12, Fredette assisted threes by Charles Abouo and Logan Magnusson and made a free throw for a 7-0 run. Emery added a three to make it a 10-0 run and a 24-12 lead — the team's biggest lead of the half. BYU equaled the lead in the first half at 30-18 and 32-20.

-With the score tied at 51-all with just under 11 minutes remaining in the second half, Fredette started a 10-0 BYU run with a three-point play. Davies followed with a three-point play, Collinsworth scored on a tip in and Hartsock made it 61-51 with a fast break dunk.

-With the Cougars leading 64-58, Brandon Davies scored twice on offensive rebounds and completed a three-point play on the second put back. Davies' 5-0 run gave BYU a 69-58 lead. He added another three-point play with 3:37 remaining to make it eight-straight points by Davies and a 72-60 BYU lead.



IN THE RANKINGS

BYU was ranked in the preseason top 25 for the first time since 1980. The Cougars were No. 24 in the AP Preseason Poll and received votes in the ESPN/USA Today Preseason Coaches Poll. The Cougars are currently No. 23 in the AP Poll and receiving votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

PROVO, Utah (Aug. 4, 2010) - BYU basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2010-11 schedule today, which features matchups with Arizona and UCLA, a trip to the South Padre Island Invitational and a nationally televised game at San Diego State on CBS. The Mountain West Conference also announced the games that will be televised by broadcast partners CBS College Sports Network (CBS C), VERSUS and The Mtn. The nonconference schedule includes teams from 10 different leagues and seven teams that qualified for postseason play. Including conference foes, the Cougars will face 11 teams that qualified for postseason play — seven of which played in the NCAA Tournament. BYU's game at San Diego State on Feb. 26 will be televised live on CBS while CBS C (at UNLV on Jan. 5 and vs. San Diego State on Jan. 26) and VERSUS (at New Mexico on Jan. 29 and vs. UNLV on Feb. 5) will broadcast two conference games apiece. The Mtn. will broadcast the remaining conference games as well as the Nov. 17 home game against Utah State. The Cougars will open the season by welcoming former coach Steve Cleveland and Fresno State to the Marriott Center on Nov. 12. That will be followed by the Utah State tilt and home matchups with Chicago State and Mississippi Valley State as part of the South Padre Island Invitational on Nov. 20 and 23, respectively. The Cougars will travel to South Padre Island, Texas, for a pair of games on Nov. 26 and 27 with potential opponents St. Mary's, Texas Tech and South Florida. BYU will remain on the road for a Dec. 1 matchup with Creighton as part of the Mountain West-Missouri Valley Challenge. On Dec. 4 BYU will face Hawaii at EnergySolutions Arena followed by a meeting with Vermont in Glens Falls, N.Y., at the Glens Falls Civic Center on Dec. 8. The Cougars head back to EnergySolutions on Dec. 11 to face Arizona of the Pac 10. On Dec. 18, BYU faces its second-straight Pac 10 foe in UCLA at the John R. Wooden Classic in Anaheim, Calif., at the Honda Center. The Cougars then play at Weber State on Dec. 21 before returning home to play UTEP on Dec. 23. BYU will also play at Buffalo (Dec. 30) and at home vs. Fresno Pacific before opening conference play at UNLV on Jan. 5. Following the conference opener the Cougars finish January with home games against Air Force (Jan. 8), TCU (Jan. 18) and San Diego State (Jan. 26) and road games at Utah (Jan. 11), Colorado State (Jan. 22) and New Mexico (Jan. 29). February starts with a road game at Wyoming (Feb. 2) to conclude the first half of the MWC slate. The second half of the league schedule starts with UNLV at home (Feb. 5) followed by a trip to Air Force (Feb. 9). The Cougars also host Utah (Feb. 12), Colorado State (Feb. 23), New Mexico (March 2) and Wyoming (March 5) in the second half and play at TCU (Feb. 19) and San Diego State (Feb. 26).

DENVER (Oct. 12, 2010) - BYU guard Jimmer Fredette received Mountain West Conference Preseason Player of the Year honors at the league's media day being held today at The MountainWest Sports Network studios. Kyle Collinsworth was also named the Preseason Freshman of the Year and the Cougars were picked to finish second in the MWC by the

Fredette, a preseason first-team All-American and national player-of-the-year candidate, repeats as the league's preseason player of the year. Also named to the preseason all-conference team, Fredette is a two-time All-MWC First Team honoree and last season led the league in scoring at 22.1 points per game while adding 4.7 assists.

Collinsworth is a versatile guard out of Provo High School who was named Utah's Mr. Basketball and the state's Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior. At Provo he helped the Bulldogs win two state titles and was a three-time firstteam all-state honoree.

San Diego State was picked to finish first in the league and garnered 21 first-place votes compared to five for the Cougars. Last season, BYU was picked to finish first in the league and finished the season second in the regular season standings while setting a program record with 30 wins and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This marks the third time the Cougars were picked to finish second in the preseason media poll — the other years being the 2006-07 and 2008-09 seasons. BYU finished first in the MWC regular season in 2007 and tied for first in 2009.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

With a 134-40 record, Rose has produced a five-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His five-year resume ranks among the best in the history of NCAA Division I basketball. His 127 victories through five seasons place him fifth for best career starts (through five seasons) by wins in NCAA history, ahead of the likes of Jerry Tarkanian, Jim Boeheim and Thad Matta. He currently holds the school record for winning percentage (.770) and the MWC record for winning percentage in league games (.800).

Equally committed to excellence off the court, Rose was honored on April 6, 2008, by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. While Rose has never sought such attention, his actions and accomplishments — both on the court and in the community — have commanded the praises of faithful followers and casual observers alike. In April 2008 Rose became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award, given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA honored BYU with Public Recognition awards for three-straight seasons (2007 to 2010) for their high academic achievement. BYU is the only program in the last four seasons

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. A tireless worker, gifted motivator and talented strategist, Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with four-straight seasons appearing in the top-25 polls and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament — both firsts in program history. In his first season, Rose and his staff produced the nation's second-most improved team by turning a 9-21 squad that finished tied for last with three wins in the Mountain West Conference into a 20-9 NIT qualifier and 12-4 second-place MWC finisher. Under his tutelage from 2007 to 2009, the Cougars achieved the MWC's first two-time outright league championships (2007 and 2008) while adding to the streak with a share of the regular season title in 2009 to make it three-consecutive. In 2010, BYU set a program record with 30 victories and defeated Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the programs first tournament victory since 1993. In addition to the record-setting win total, the 2009-10 Cougar squad set program records for winning percentage, scoring margin, field goals, three-point field goals, turnover margin and steals. Nationally, BYU finished the season first in free throw percentage, second in scoring offense, scoring margin and three-point field goal percentage.

The only BYU men's basketball coach to ever win top conference coaching honors in back-to-back seasons, Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. In his second season, Rose coached the 2006-07 Cougars to a 25-9 overall record and NCAA berth after winning the MWC regular-season title with a 13-3 mark. In his first season, Rose received conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year accolades as well as honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program after a 1-25 season. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as Associate Head Coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job just two days after Cleveland announced his departure. Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, including defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. His efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 11 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 13 years Rose has been in Provo. Seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Jonathan Tavernari was named the 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year after fellow Cougar and second-team Freshman All-American Trent Plaisted received the same honor in 2006. In 2010 Tyler Haws was named third-team All-MWC as a freshman and set the BYU record with 48-consecutive free throws without a miss.

With 27 years of coaching experience including 15 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels, Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah) while guiding six of his seven teams to top-20 rankings, including a national ranking as high as No. 2. He earned three conference titles and was honored by his peers as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as long-time NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU, Rose has coached six players who have received All-America recognition—Mekeli Wesley (2001 AP honorable mention), Rafael Araujo (2004 Basketball Times Second Team, AP honorable mention), Trent Plaisted (2006 Scout.com Freshman Second Team), Keena Young (2007 AP honorable mention), Lee Cummard (2008 AP honorable mention, FOXSports.com Fourth Team) and Jimmer Fredette (2010 third-team Sporting News and NABC, AP Honorable Mention and Lute

Olson All-America team)--and two players who have been selected in the NBA Draft--Travis Hansen (2003) and Araujo (2004).

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose is the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before the Texas native returned to his hometown, transferring to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up after suffering a buzzer-beating defeat to North Carolina State in the NCAA Championship game. Rose spent three years at Houston, playing in 1980-81, redshirting in 1981-82 and concluding his career in 1982-83.

PERSONAL

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Rose followed Steve Cleveland as the second BYU head coach to have served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Rose served in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie State College.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. The National Association of Basketball Coaches honored Rose with its Game Pillar Award for Service in April 2008. While at Dixie State College, Rose became the first coach in the State of Utah to participate in the American Cancer Society's nationwide Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. He has also been a volunteer coach for youth groups. Dave and Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community, receiving the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005.

The fight against Cancer became more personal for the family when Dave was diagnosed with pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor cancer in June 2009. Since the emergency surgery to remove the tumor, no other cancer has been found. Scans since the surgery by doctors at the Huntsman Cancer Institute have all come back clear. The United States Basketball Writers Association recognized Rose for his efforts with its Most Courageous Award.


