BYU AT CREIGHTON IN FIRST ROAD GAME OF 2010-11

After winning the South Padre Island Invitational with victories over South Florida and Saint Mary's, No. 21/25 BYU will head to Omaha, Neb., to take on Creighton in the Mountain West Missouri Valley Challenge on Wednesday, Dec. 1, at 7 p.m. The Cougars are 6-0 on the season after defeating South Florida and Saint Mary's to claim the South Padre Island title. Creighton is now 4-2 following a 65-52 loss at Northwestern on Sunday. Jimmer Fredette leads the Cougars with 24.8 points, 4.8 assists and 2.3 steals per game while Jackson Emery contributes 12.8 points, 3.5 boards and 3.2 steals per game. Creighton is led by Antoine Young and Doug McDermott, who average 14.3 points apiece. Creighton is coached by Greg McDermott. Wednesday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. CT on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on KMTV in Omaha.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

- No. 21/25 BYU head coach Dave Rose is 133-40 in his six seasons at BYU and is the program's all-time leader in winning percentage at .769. From 2006 through last season, he led BYU to four-straight 25-win seasons, four-straight seasons ranked in the top 25 and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament.
- The Cougars were ranked in the AP Preseason Poll for the first time since the 1980-81 season and are currently ranked No. 21/25.
- Jimmer Fredette has been named to eight preseason All-America teams (AP, ESPN.com, Sporting News, SI.com/ Sports Illustrated, Basketball Times, Athlon Sports, Dick Vitale and Blue Ribbon Magazine). Fredette is averaging 24.8 points, 4.8 assists and 2.3 steals per game this season.
- Jackson Emery and Jimmer Fredette have combined for 33 steals through six games for a 5.5 combined average. Emery has 19 steals while Fredette has 14 steals. Fredette tied a career high with five steals against South Florida and Emery has recorded 17 steals in the last four games, including two games with five steals.

CREIGHTON'S LAST OUTING - NORTHWESTERN TOPS MEN'S BASKETBALL, 65-52

EVANSTON, Ill. - Not even the presence of two-time All-American Kyle Korver could help Creighton in its first true road game of the 2010-11 season, as host Northwestern defeated the Bluejays, 65-52, on Sunday night. Korver, an eight-year NBA veteran who now plays for the Chicago Bulls, was in the crowd to watch his alma mater as well as his younger brother, senior Creighton guard Kaleb Korver.

Northwestern is off to its first 4-0 start since 1993-94, while Creighton dropped to 4-2 with the setback. Northwestern led for most of the first half, with Creighton's largest lead coming 15-12 on a score inside by Kenny Lawson Jr. Lawson had nine points and five rebounds early on before Northwestern's trapping zone gave the Jays some temporary fits.

A 10-0 NU run during a six-minute Bluejay drought gave the Wildcats their largest lead of the half at 36-24. Creighton would use a trey by Jahenns Manigat and hook shot from fellow freshman Doug McDermott closed the half with the Jays down just 40-32.

Lawson had 11 points and six rebounds in the first 20 minutes, but was limited to just 12 minutes by foul trouble. Three others had six points, including McDermott, Manigat and Antoine Young, who also dished four assists in the opening half. NU's John Shurna had 10 points in the opening seven minutes and led all players with 14 points before he, too, was sidelined with two fouls, while Michael Thompson had 10 points.

Both teams struggled to score in the first nine minutes of the second half, with nearly as many combined fouls (13) as there were points (14). NU's Thompson snapped that spell when he stepped back to hit a three-pointer from the right corner to make it 50-39 in favor of the hosts. He duplicated his efforts 90 seconds later, putting the Wildcats ahead 53-39 with 9:17 to play and prompting a Bluejay timeout.

Creighton had a chance to trim NU's deficit to 58-50 in the final six minutes, but an Ethan Wragge three-pointer was off the mark and NU's Shurna hit a pair of pair of charity shots after being fouled on the rebound. A short time later, Manigat's three-point attempt that could have made it a six-point game with 3:40 left was off the mark.

Shurna, a preseason National Player of the Year candidate, led Northwestern with 23 points, while Thompson added 18 points. NU made 49 percent of its 49 field goal attempts and 35 percent of its 20 three-point tries.

Creighton had three men in double-figures. Young had 18 points, McDermott added 14 and Lawson finished with 11 points and 12 rebounds. Creighton shot 37.3 percent from the field but struggled from long-range, hitting just 4-of-21 from downtown (19.0 percent).

SERIES NOTES

Wednesday's game will be the ninth meeting between BYU and Creighton. The Cougars hold a 5-3 advantage overall, including a 2-0 record at home, 2-3 at Creighton and 1-0 at neutral sites. The teams last played in 2002 at Creighton with the Bluejays winning 74-64. BYU won 61-52 the year before in Provo.

LAST TIME OUT - HARTSOCK HITS GAME WINNER VS. SOUTH FLORIDA

SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, Texas (Nov. 27, 2010) – In a preview of future West Coast Conference contests, the BYU men's basketball team captured a dramatic 74-73 victory and the South Padre Island championship over St. Mary's Saturday.

With 11 seconds left and the Cougars down 70-69, senior guard Jimmer Fredette sank his first three pointer of the night to give BYU a two-point advantage and preserve its perfect record.

Fredette was named the tournament MVP, finishing the game with 24 points, three rebounds, four assists and three steals to lead the Cougars. Senior Jackson Emery added 15 points and five steals, with junior Noah Hartssock tallying seven points, five rebounds and two assists. Both Emery and Hartssock were named to the all-tournament team.

Emery started the scoring for BYU, going 2-for-2 from three-point range in the first three minutes of play to help the Cougars grab a 13-4 lead. With his second three, Emery moved into a tie with Lee Cumard for fifth place on the BYU career three-point field goal list. Emery would finish the first half with 11 points, including 3-of-4 from three-point range. The Cougars started the game shooting 8-for-12 from the field (66.7%) to take a 19-13 lead with 11:45 left in the first half.

The Gaels took their first lead of the game with seven minutes left in the first half, gaining a 27-25 advantage. The Cougars would answer with a 7-2 run to take a 35-29 lead and went into the break with a 43-40 advantage.

Fredette started the second half with four quick points to lift the Cougars to a 47-40 lead before the Gaels went on a 9-0 run of their own take capture their second lead of the game, a one-point 52-51 advantage.

The game went back and forth before senior Logan Magnussen hit a jumper with 11:57 left in the contest to give BYU a 59-52 lead, only to see the Gaels go on a quick 4-0 run to climb back to within three.

Brandon Davies fouled out with 4:09 left after the Cougars fell behind 66-63. Davies posted nine points and six rebounds on the night. The Gaels would maintain a 66-65 lead until Jimmer Fredette scored his 19th point with 2:45 left to give the Cougars a 67-66 lead. Four lead changes occurred in the second half.

St. Mary's continued to battle back, stealing a Hartssock inbound pass with 0:22 left and make two free throws to gain a one-point, 70-69 lead, setting the stage for Fredette's late game heroics.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...**BYU HEAD COACH DAVE ROSE**

"It's amazing how a couple of points can really change your life. This was a really, really great weekend for us. When we came down here without Chris Collinsworth, we knew we were going to have a challenge and our post guys were really going to have to step up."

"I was really thrilled for how the guys competed together as a group. The biggest thing we gained from this weekend is how to win together as a group. Finding the pieces of how this thing is going to come together is a big benefit of this weekend."

-Kyle Collinsworth started for the second time of his career, scoring 10 points and adding 2 assists.
-Noah Hartssock stayed hot for the Cougars after hitting the game-winning shot against South Florida, scoring 7 points on 3-of-5 shooting with 5 rebounds.
-With 7:24 left in the first half, Jimmer Fredette missed his first free throw in 14 attempts to halt his team-leading free throw streak at 9.
-Jackson Emery finished the first half with 11 points, the most he has scored in the first half this season. Emery was 3-for-4 from three-point land during the half.
-Fredette scored 20+ points for the 5th time this season and the 35th time of his career.
-Fredette was named MVP of the South Padre Invitational. Hartssock and Emery were named to the all-tournament team.

-With 5 steals, Emery surpassed Jonathan Tavernari for 3rd place on the BYU all-time list.

GAME TRENDS

-Jackson Emery started the game 2-for-2 from three-point range to give the Cougars an early 9-2 advantage.
-The Cougars started the contest going 5-for-7 from the field (71.4%), including 2-for-3 from three-point land to jump out to a 13-4 lead.
-BYU's biggest lead of the first half was 9, at 15-6 and 17-8.
-St. Mary's first lead since 2-1 came with 7 minutes left in the first half after a free throw put the Gaels up 27-26.
-The Cougars went on a 7-2 run to take back the lead at 35-29 with 4:33 left in the first half. A 5-2 run to end the first half gave the Cougars a 43-40 lead going into the break.
-BYU shot a season-best 64% from the field in the first half, going 16-for-25 from the field, including going 4-for-7 from behind the arc.
-The second half saw four lead changes.

NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

PROVO, Utah (Aug. 4, 2010) – BYU basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2010-11 schedule today, which features matchups with Arizona and UCLA, a trip to the South Padre Island Invitational and a nationally televised game at San Diego State on CBS. The Mountain West Conference also announced the games that will be televised by broadcast partners CBS College Sports Network (CBS C), VERSUS and The Mtn. The nonconference schedule includes teams from 10 different leagues and seven teams that qualified for postseason play. Including conference foes, the Cougars will face 11 teams that qualified for postseason play — seven of which played in the NCAA Tournament. BYU's game at San Diego State on Feb. 26 will be televised live on CBS while CBS C (at UNLV on Jan. 5 and vs. San Diego State on Jan. 26) and VERSUS (at New Mexico on Jan. 29 and vs. UNLV on Feb. 5) will broadcast two conference games apiece. The Mtn. will broadcast the remaining conference games as well as the Nov. 17 home game against Utah State. The Cougars will open the season by welcoming former coach Steve Cleveland and Fresno State to the Marriott Center on Nov. 12. That will be followed by the Utah State tilt and home matchups with Chicago State and Mississippi Valley State as part of the South Padre Island Invitational on Nov. 20 and 23, respectively. The Cougars will travel to South Padre Island, Texas, for a pair of games on Nov. 26 and 27 with potential opponents St. Mary's, Texas Tech and South Florida. BYU will remain on the road for a Dec. 1 matchup with Creighton as part of the Mountain West-Missouri Valley Challenge. On Dec. 4 BYU will face Hawaii at EnergySolutions Arena followed by a meeting with Vermont in Glens Falls, N.Y., at the Glens Falls Civic Center on Dec. 8. The Cougars head back to EnergySolutions on Dec. 11 to face Arizona of the Pac 10. On Dec. 18, BYU faces its second-straight Pac 10 foe in UCLA at the John R. Wooden Classic in Anaheim, Calif., at the Honda Center. The Cougars then play at Weber State on Dec. 21 before returning home to play UTEP on Dec. 23. BYU will also play at Buffalo (Dec. 30) and at home vs. Fresno Pacific before opening conference play at UNLV on Jan. 5. Following the conference opener the Cougars finish January with home games against Air Force (Jan. 8), TCU (Jan. 18) and San Diego State (Jan. 26) and road games at Utah (Jan. 11), Colorado State (Jan. 22) and New Mexico (Jan. 29). February starts with a road game at Wyoming (Feb. 2) to conclude the first half of the MWC slate. The second half of the league schedule starts with UNLV at home (Feb. 5) followed by a trip to Air Force (Feb. 9). The Cougars also host Utah (Feb. 12), Colorado State (Feb. 23), New Mexico (March 2) and Wyoming (March 5) in the second half and play at TCU (Feb. 19) and San Diego State (Feb. 26).

DENVER (Oct. 12, 2010) – BYU guard Jimmer Fredette received Mountain West Conference Preseason Player of the Year honors at the league's media day being held today at The MountainWest Sports Network studios. Kyle Collinsworth was also named the Preseason Freshman of the Year and the Cougars were picked to finish second in the MWC by the league's media.

Fredette, a preseason first-team All-American and national player-of-the-year candidate, repeats as the league's preseason player of the year. Also named to the preseason all-conference team, Fredette is a two-time All-MWC First Team honoree and last season led the league in scoring at 22.1 points per game while adding 4.7 assists.

Collinsworth is a versatile guard out of Provo High School who was named Utah's Mr. Basketball and the state's Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior. At Provo he helped the Bulldogs win two state titles and was a three-time first-team all-state honoree.

San Diego State was picked to finish first in the league and garnered 21 first-place votes compared to five for the Cougars. Last season, BYU was picked to finish first in the league and finished the season second in the regular season standings while setting a program record with 30 wins and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This marks the third time the Cougars were picked to finish second in the preseason media poll — the other years being the 2006-07 and 2008-09 seasons. BYU finished first in the MWC regular season in 2007 and tied for first in 2009.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

With a 133-40 record, Rose has produced a five-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His five-year resume ranks among the best in the history of NCAA Division I basketball. His 129 victories through five seasons place him fifth for best career starts (through five seasons) by wins in NCAA history, ahead of the likes of Jerry Tarkanian, Jim Boeheim and Thad Matta. He currently holds the school record for winning percentage (.769) and the MWC record for winning percentage in league games (.800).

Equally committed to excellence off the court, Rose was honored on April 6, 2008, by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. While Rose has never sought such attention, his actions and accomplishments — both on the court and in the community — have commanded the praises of faithful followers and casual observers alike. In April 2008 Rose became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award, given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA honored BYU with Public Recognition awards for three-straight seasons (2007 to 2010) for their high academic achievement. BYU is the only program in the nation to earn public recognition from the NCAA and an NCAA Tournament bid in each of the last four seasons.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. A tireless worker, gifted motivator and talented strategist, Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with four-straight seasons appearing in the top-25 polls and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament — both firsts in program history. In his first season, Rose and his staff produced the nation's second-most improved team by turning a 9-21 squad that finished tied for last with three wins in the Mountain West Conference into a 20-9 NIT qualifier and 12-4 second-place MWC finisher. Under his tutelage from 2007 to 2009, the Cougars achieved the MWC's first two-time outright league championships (2007 and 2008) while adding to the streak with a share of the regular season title in 2009 to make it three-consecutive. In 2010, BYU set a program record with 30 victories and defeated Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the programs first tournament victory since 1993. In addition to the record-setting win total, the 2009-10 Cougar squad set program records for winning percentage, scoring margin, field goals, three-point field goals, turnover margin and steals. Nationally, BYU finished the season first in free throw percentage, second in scoring offense, scoring margin and three-point field goal percentage.

The only BYU men's basketball coach to ever win top conference coaching honors in back-to-back seasons, Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. In his second season, Rose coached the 2006-07 Cougars to a 25-9 overall record and NCAA berth after winning the MWC regular-season title with a 13-3 mark. In his first season, Rose received conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year accolades as well as honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program after a 1-25 season. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as Associate Head Coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job just two days after Cleveland announced his departure. Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, including defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. His efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 11 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 13 years Rose has been in Provo. Seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Jonathan Tavernari was named the 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year after fellow Cougar and second-team Freshman All-American Trent Plaisted received the same honor in 2006. In 2010 Tyler Haws was named third-team All-MWC as a freshman and set the BYU record with 48-consecutive free throws without a miss.

With 27 years of coaching experience including 15 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels, Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah) while guiding six of his seven teams to top-20 rankings, including a national ranking as high as No. 2. He earned three conference titles and was honored by his peers as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as long-time NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU, Rose has coached six players who have received All-America recognition--Mekeli Wesley (2001 AP honorable mention), Rafael Araujo (2004 Basketball Times Second Team, AP honorable mention), Trent Plaisted (2006 Scout.com Freshman Second Team), Keena Young (2007 AP honorable mention), Lee Cummar (2008 AP honorable mention, FOXSports.com Fourth Team) and Jimmer Fredette (2010 third-team Sporting News and NABC, AP Honorable Mention and Lute

Olson All-America team)--and two players who have been selected in the NBA Draft--Travis Hansen (2003) and Araujo (2004).

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose is the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before the Texas native returned to his hometown, transferring to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up after suffering a buzzer-beating defeat to North Carolina State in the NCAA Championship game. Rose spent three years at Houston, playing in 1980-81, redshirting in 1981-82 and concluding his career in 1982-83.

PERSONAL

Rose is of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Rose followed Steve Cleveland as the second BYU head coach to have served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Rose served in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie State College.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. The National Association of Basketball Coaches honored Rose with its Game Pillar Award for Service in April 2008. While at Dixie State College, Rose became the first coach in the State of Utah to participate in the American Cancer Society's nationwide Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. He has also been a volunteer coach for youth groups. Dave and Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community, receiving the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005.

The fight against cancer became more personal for the family when Dave was diagnosed with pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor cancer in June 2009. Since the emergency surgery to remove the tumor, no other cancer has been found. Scans since the surgery by doctors at the Huntsman Cancer Institute have all come back clear. The United States Basketball Writers Association recognized Rose for his efforts with its Most Courageous Award.

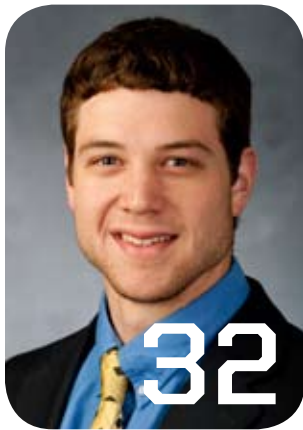
