2010-11 SEASON OPENS FRIDAY AGAINST FRESNO STATE

No. 24 BYU (0-0) men's basketball opens the 2010-11 season on Friday, Nov. 12, at 7 p.m. at home against Fresno State (0-0) of the Western Athletic Conference. The Cougars are coming off a 30-win season and a trip to the second round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament. Fresno State is coached by former BYU head coach Steve Cleveland. The Bulldogs were 15-18 and 7-9 in the WAC last season, including a 72-67 home loss to the Cougars. BYU welcomes back preseason All-American Jimmer Fredette for his senior season while Fresno State is led by sophomore center Greg Smith. Friday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. MT on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

- No. 24 BYU is 3-2 in season openers under head coach Dave Rose including wins in its last three openers.
- BYU head coach Dave Rose is 127-40 in his five seasons at BYU and is the program's all-time leader in winning percentage at .760. He has led BYU to four-straight 25-win seasons, four-straight seasons ranked in the top 25 and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament.
- The Cougars are opening the season ranked in the AP Preseason Poll for the first time since the 1980-81 season.
- BYU welcomes back its starting backcourt of seniors Jimmer Fredette and Jackson Emery. This will mark the third-straight season the duo has started for Dave Rose.
- Jimmer Fredette has been named to five preseason All-America teams (AP, Sporting News, Athlon, Dick Vitale and Blue Ribbon).
- The Cougars return three starters and five other letterwinners from a squad that went 30-6 overall and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1993. Two lettermen from 2007-08 also return after serving two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

LOOKING AT FRESNO STATE

Fresno State opens the 2010-11 season at BYU. The Bulldogs were 15-18 overall and 7-9 in the WAC—fifth place—in 2009-10. The team's top returning player is sophomore center Greg Smith, who averaged 11.5 points and 5.8 rebounds last season. Also back is Stephen Shepp, who started 27 games and averaged 5.5 points per game. In an exhibition against Fresno Pacific, Fresno State started Smith, Nedeljko Golubovic (started one game last season), Jonathan Wills (a transfer from New Mexico who sat out last season) and junior college transfers Tim Steed and Bennie Rhodes. The Bulldogs are coached by Steve Cleveland, who prior to coaching at Fresno State, was BYU's head coach for eight seasons. Cleveland is 78-81 in five seasons at Fresno State and 216-189 in 13 years as an NCAA Division I head coach.

FRESNO STATE'S LAST OUTING - FRESNO STATE DOWNS FRESNO PACIFIC IN EXHIBITION

FRESNO, Calif. - Sophomore center Greg Smith led the way with a game-high 16 points and eight rebounds in only 26 minutes of action Saturday night at the Save Mart Center to help propel the Fresno State men's basketball team to a 71-50 exhibition victory over the NAIA's Fresno Pacific. Garrett Johnson, a returning sophomore guard from Pomona, Calif., also made significant contributions coming off the bench grabbing six rebounds and scoring 12 points by going 4 for 5 from the field and notched a perfect 3-3 clip at the free throw line. The Bulldogs came out aggressive on the defensive end by not allowing the Sunbirds to score in the first 3:45 of the game. On the night, the Dogs held Fresno Pacific to only 50 points, the fewest by FPU against Fresno State in the past seven seasons, and 31 percent from the field. The highlight of the first half came with 1:35 left when junior guard Tim Steed delivered a perfect pass to Smith for a strong layup and a foul. Smith's free throw made it 28-16, the Dogs' largest lead in the first session, and entered the locker room with a 28-19 advantage. The Bulldogs wasted no time getting to work in the second half when junior guard Jonathan Wills flew in from the right base line to tip-in a miss with only nine seconds off the clock. In a test of playing against solely zone defense, Cleveland's squad kept fighting and pulled away late with the help of back-to-back three pointers from Kevin Olekaibe, a freshman guard from Las Vegas, Nev., which gave the Dogs' their biggest of the game at 68-45. During the evening, the Bulldogs shot 46 percent from the field and 16 of their 26 baskets came by way of assisted passes.

SERIES NOTES

Friday's game will be the 18th meeting between BYU and Fresno State with the Cougars owning a 12-5 advantage. BYU won last season's meeting 72-67 at Fresno State with Jimmer Fredette leading the way with 24 points. Friday's game also marks Steve Cleveland's return to the Marriott Center. Prior to taking the reigns at Fresno State in 2005, Cleveland was BYU's head coach for eight seasons.

LAST YEAR AT FRESNO STATE - FREDETTE'S 24 LEADS COUGARS PAST FRESNO STATE

FRESNO, Calif. (Dec. 12, 2009) – Jimmer Fredette scored 18 points in the second half, finishing with 24, lifting BYU to a 72-67 win on the road against Fresno State Saturday. The Cougars improve to 8-1 on the year while the Bulldogs drop to 4-5. Tyler Haws tied the career high he set against Arizona State, scoring 17 points on 7-of-11 shooting and added four rebounds. Noah Hartsock was a point away from a double-double, grabbing a career best 11 rebounds and nine points. "It was a really competitive game," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "It wasn't the cleanest game but I think that's because both teams were really trying to compete." Chris Miles tied his own career high with eight rebounds on a night when the Cougars went up against a big and long Bulldog team. "Man he played hard, he played really hard," Rose said. "He is getting to where he feels more comfortable. We needed him in the game tonight against their big post players." BYU, which has never trailed at halftime this season, led the Bulldogs 35-29 after the first period. The Cougars stayed in front in large part to six three-pointers. Two treys by Tyler Haws and Jonathan Tavernari for six unanswered points opened up a 29-27 lead to 35-27. Fredette came out in the second period firing, hitting 6-of-10 from the field. The junior guard also dished out seven assists and had three rebounds and two steals. With BYU's lead down to five at 42-37 in the second half, the Cougars sprinted to their first double-digit lead on a 7-0 run that included back-to-back buckets by Fredette and a three by Jonathan Tavernari. After a Mike Ladd layup ended the run BYU reeled off seven more points, including five from Fredette and another bucket by Tavernari, to give the Cougars their biggest lead of 17 at 58-41. Playing against former BYU coach Steve Cleveland, now head coach of the Bulldogs, the Cougars were playing Fresno State for the first time since 1999. The win was the first of BYU over its former WAC foe since a 97-84 win in early 1996.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU HEAD COACH DAVE ROSE

- "It was a really competitive game. It wasn't the cleanest game but I think that's because both teams were really trying to compete."
- On zone defenses: "It was a little different for us with the zone they were in; it made us shoot early. We were just a little unsettled in the first half. We went to the zone late and I thought it gave us a couple steals and got us out in transition and some easy baskets."
- On Chris Miles: "Man he played hard, he played really hard. He is getting more to where he feels more comfortable. We needed him in the game tonight against their big post players."
- On Noah Hartsock: "Noah was really active in there and got his hands on a lot of balls. We're playing him a lot more minutes. It's really, really important that you keep that intes. That's a young player and he's getting better and that's good for our team."

NOTES FROM LAST YEAR AT FRESNO STATE

PLAYER NOTES

- After making his first four free throws on the night, Jimmer Fredette missed his fifth, ending his consecutive free throw streak at 39, a new BYU record. Fredette is now 52 for his last 54.
- Noah Hartsock was one point away from his first career double-double with 9 points and 11 rebounds.
- Hartsock's 11 rebounds are a new career-high. His previous high was 7 boards, accomplished twice.
- Fredette posted 7 assists, his sixth of nine games and third-straight with 5 or more. He leads the team with 5.8 app, second-best in the MWC.
- Fredette 18 points in the second half, shooting 6-of-10 from the field. He finished with 24 points on 8-of-16, including 4-of-8 from three.
- Dating back to last season, with 24 points against Fresno State, Jimmer Fredette has now scored in double figures in 23 consecutive games. It's the longest streak in double-digits since Russell Larsen put together 44 consecutive games scoring at least 10 points during the 1993-94 and 1994-95 seasons.
- Tyler Haws tied the career-high he set last game against ASU with 17 points. His 7 makes and 11 attempts are both new career highs.
- Jackson Emery finished with 4 steals, his third game this season with at least 4 or more.
- Chris Miles had a season-high 3 assists, one short of his career high and 8 rebounds, tying his career best.
- Michael Loyd, Jr., also had a season-high 3 assists, tying his career high for the seventh time.

TEAM NOTES

- Having lost its last three games against the Bulldogs, BYU won its first against Fresno State since a 97-84 win on 1/10/96.
- BYU's 10 team three-pointers are the second-most in this season's nine games, three fewer than the Cougars' 13 against Southern.
- The Cougars scored 19 fast-break points, second-most behind their 21 versus San Francisco.

GAME TRENDS

- BYU has held a lead at halftime in all nine games this season.
- Back-to-back treys by Haws and Jonathan Tavernari gave the Cougars a 6-0 to go from 29-27 to 35-27 in the first half.
- BYU has now won 10 straight games when Fredette scores 20 points or more.

LAST TIME OUT - COUGARS CALM SEASIDERS

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 5, 2010) – BYU claimed the battle of the sister schools in the Cougars' second exhibition game, defeating BYU-Hawaii 85-60 on Friday at the Marriott Center. Senior Jimmer Fredette led all scorers with 18 points to go with four assists, three rebounds, one block and one steal. Junior Noah Hartsock and sophomore Chris Collinsworth both flirted with double-doubles with Hartsock scoring 10 points and grabbing nine rebounds while Collinsworth finished with eight points and nine rebounds. The Seasideers gave BYU trouble in the first half, maintaining a lead over the Cougars until the 12:39 mark in the first half. Sophomore Stephen Rogers hit a spot up three-pointer while getting sent to the floor by a BYU-Hawaii defender and converted the four-point play to give BYU its first lead. The first period was plagued with fouls, including 16 by the Seasideers and 11 for the Cougars. BYU shot 22 free throws in the first half alone, converting 15 to go to the locker room with a 41-32 lead at halftime. BYU came out much more energetic in the second half, outscoring BYU-Hawaii 44-28 in the period. The Cougars also improved their shooting percentage from 33-percent to 55-percent from the field. Up by 14 at 53-39 a few minutes into the second frame, BYU pushed its lead after Fredette converted a three-point play on a double-clutch layup and free throw. After a blocked shot by Noah Hartsock on the Seasideers' ensuing possession, Kyle Collinsworth hit Abouo with a behind-the-back pass for a jumper along the baseline. On the next Cougar possession, Fredette lost his man on a lightning-quick crossover before converting the layup to extend the lead to 57-39 with 12:47 remaining. BYU ultimately pulled away with less than six minutes remaining on back-to-back fast break dunks by Kyle Collinsworth and Chris Collinsworth to take an 80-46 lead. Four players scored in double-digits for BYU, including Brock Zylstra who hit three treys in the second half and had four steals. Abouo contributed 14 points, 10 in the first half. The junior hit two treys midway through the first half to help the Cougars gain some breathing room before sitting most of the second half.

"I was pleased with the game. I thought it was a great test for our team. A couple of our guys who didn't get off to a great start were able to recover. In the second half we were much more engaged and tried to challenge them. We've got a lot of things to work on. I'm glad we have a week before we play Fresno State."

"There are a handful of guys that have played quite a few minutes to see who rises to the top. I am really proud of Brock and how he's making good use of opportunities."

"I think Chris is really active for a big guy. He'll get his hands on the ball. He is always trying to get to the ball."

"BYU-Hawaii was really physical with us and they defended the ball well."

TEAM/PLAYER NOTEBOOK

— With a final record of 30-6, the 2009-10 BYU men's basketball squad set the Cougar record for regular season wins (28) and the overall record for wins (30). The 2007-08 team set the previous regular season records with 25 regular season victories and finished 27-8 after the postseason. The 1950-51 team was 24-7 in the regular season and finished with what was a program record 28 wins overall to go with nine losses.

— In 2009-10, BYU men's basketball entered the top-25 rankings for the first time this season on Jan. 4 at No. 25 in the AP Poll and No. 23 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Cougars finished the season ranked No. 17 in the AP Poll and No. 22 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. BYU was been ranked as high as No. 12 in the AP Poll and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Rose has led his teams to the rankings in each of the last four seasons to become the first Cougar coach to lead BYU into the rankings in four-straight seasons. BYU is ranked in the preseason AP Top 25, giving the Cougars a fifth-straight season appearing in the rankings.

— At 13-3 in the MWC in 2009-10, BYU finished second to go with another second-place finish (2006) and three conference titles (2007, 2008 and 2009) under Dave Rose. BYU is tied for seventh among all NCAA Division I programs for most regular-season titles won or shared with 28. BYU's 112 MWC wins in the 11-year history of the league lead all MWC teams.

— Junior guard Jimmer Fredette led BYU with 22.1 points and 4.7 assists per game. His totals of 751 points and 159 assists rank fourth all-time at BYU in a single season in their respective categories. Fredette enters the 2010-11 season 11th in career scoring (1,531) and eighth in career assists (355).

— With 91 steals in 2009-10, Jackson Emery set the BYU single season record for steals in a season, held previously by Marty Haws who had 66 in 1989-90. The 91 steals also ties the MWC record for steals in a season, set previously by Marcus Banks in 2002-03. Emery is currently fourth at BYU with 148 career steals, 48 from surpassing Danny Ainge for first.

HOME OPENER ATTENDANCE MARKS

The 16,276 on hand to witness the 2009-10 home opener—a 70-60 win over Bradley—was the largest crowd for a home opener since 1994-95 when there were 17,654 in the stands for BYU's 96-80 win over Nevada. The attendance for home openers has increased each year since 2006-07, when 8,854 were on hand to see BYU outlast Idaho State 84-78 in overtime. In 2007-08 the Cougars got the best of Idaho State again, winning 90-69 with 12,153 in the Marriott Center. In 2008-09, 15,753 seats were full as BYU defeated Long Beach State 75-65 in the home opener.

NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE

Junior guard/forward Charles Abouo has gained valuable experience during the summers of 2009 and 2010 playing for the Cote d'Ivoire national team. In 2009, Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire qualified for the 2010 FIBA World Championships in Turkey by taking second at the FIBA Afrobasket Tournament. That summer he averaged 5.2 points and 2.2 rebounds in nine contests. In 2010 he suited up at the World Championships where Cote d'Ivoire finished 1-4. He averaged 6.6 points and 2.6 rebounds and posted 19 points in and 88-79 win against Puerto Rico.

NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

PROVO, Utah (Aug. 4, 2010) – BYU basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2010-11 schedule today, which features matchups with Arizona and UCLA, a trip to the South Padre Island Invitational and a nationally televised game at San Diego State on CBS. The Mountain West Conference also announced the games that will be televised by broadcast partners CBS College Sports Network (CBS C), VERSUS and The Mtn. The nonconference schedule includes teams from 10 different leagues and seven teams that qualified for postseason play. Including conference foes, the Cougars will face 11 teams that qualified for postseason play — seven of which played in the NCAA Tournament. BYU's game at San Diego State on Feb. 26 will be televised live on CBS while CBS C (at UNLV on Jan. 5 and vs. San Diego State on Jan. 26) and VERSUS (at New Mexico on Jan. 29 and vs. UNLV on Feb. 5) will broadcast two conference games apiece. The Mtn. will broadcast the remaining conference games as well as the Nov. 17 home game against Utah State. The Cougars will open the season by welcoming former coach Steve Cleveland and Fresno State to the Marriott Center on Nov. 12. That will be followed by the Utah State tilt and home matchups with Chicago State and Mississippi Valley State as part of the South Padre Island Invitational on Nov. 20 and 23, respectively. The Cougars will travel to South Padre Island, Texas, for a pair of games on Nov. 26 and 27 with potential opponents St. Mary's, Texas Tech and South Florida. BYU will remain on the road for a Dec. 1 matchup with Creighton as part of the Mountain West-Missouri Valley Challenge. On Dec. 4 BYU will face Hawaii at EnergySolutions Arena followed by a meeting with Vermont in Glens Falls, N.Y., at the Glens Falls Civic Center on Dec. 8. The Cougars head back to EnergySolutions on Dec. 11 to face Arizona of the Pac 10. On Dec. 18, BYU faces its second-straight Pac 10 foe in UCLA at the John R. Wooden Classic in Anaheim, Calif., at the Honda Center. The Cougars then play at Weber State on Dec. 21 before returning home to play UTEP on Dec. 23. BYU will also play at Buffalo (Dec. 30) and at home vs. Fresno Pacific before opening conference play at UNLV on Jan. 5. Following the conference opener the Cougars finish January with home games against Air Force (Jan. 8), TCU (Jan. 18) and San Diego State (Jan. 26) and road games at Utah (Jan. 11), Colorado State (Jan. 22) and New Mexico (Jan. 29). February starts with a road game at Wyoming (Feb. 2) to conclude the first half of the MWC slate. The second half of the league schedule starts with UNLV at home (Feb. 5) followed by a trip to Air Force (Feb. 9). The Cougars also host Utah (Feb. 12), Colorado State (Feb. 23), New Mexico (March 2) and Wyoming (March 5) in the second half and play at TCU (Feb. 19) and San Diego State (Feb. 26).

BENCH POWER

The bench played a key role to BYU's success in 2009-10 as the Cougar reserves averaged 25.8 points per game compared to 19.7 by the opponent bench. The bench eclipsed 30 points 13 times and scored a season-best 61 points at TCU.

DENVER (Oct. 12, 2010) – BYU guard Jimmer Fredette received Mountain West Conference Preseason Player of the Year honors at the league's media day being held today at The MountainWest Sports Network studios. Kyle Collinsworth was also named the Preseason Freshman of the Year and the Cougars were picked to finish second in the MWC by the league's media.

Fredette, a preseason first-team All-American and national player-of-the-year candidate, repeats as the league's pre-season player of the year. Also named to the preseason all-conference team, Fredette is a two-time All-MWC First Team honoree and last season led the league in scoring at 22.1 points per game while adding 4.7 assists.

Collinsworth is a versatile guard out of Provo High School who was named Utah's Mr. Basketball and the state's Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior. At Provo he helped the Bulldogs win two state titles and was a three-time first-team all-state honoree.

San Diego State was picked to finish first in the league and garnered 21 first-place votes compared to five for the Cougars. Last season, BYU was picked to finish first in the league and finished the season second in the regular season standings while setting a program record with 30 wins and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This marks the third time the Cougars were picked to finish second in the preseason media poll — the other years being the 2006-07 and 2008-09 seasons. BYU finished first in the MWC regular season in 2007 and tied for first in 2009.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

With a 127-40 record, Rose has produced a five-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His five-year resume ranks among the best in the history of NCAA Division I basketball. His 127 victories place him fifth for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, ahead of the likes of Jerry Tarkanian, Jim Boeheim and Thad Matta. He currently holds the school record for winning percentage (.760) and the MWC record for winning percentage in league games (.800).

Equally committed to excellence off the court, Rose was honored on April 6, 2008, by the National

Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. While Rose has never sought such attention, his actions and accomplishments — both on the court and in the community — have commanded the praises of faithful followers and casual observers alike. In April 2008 Rose became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award, given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA honored BYU with Public Recognition awards for three-straight seasons (2007 to 2010) for their high academic achievement. BYU is the only program in the nation to earn public recognition from the NCAA and an NCAA Tournament bid in each of the last four seasons.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. A tireless worker, gifted motivator and talented strategist, Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with four-straight seasons appearing in the top-25 polls and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament — both firsts in program history. In his first season, Rose and his staff produced the nation's second-most improved team by turning a 9-21 squad that finished tied for last with three wins in the Mountain West Conference into a 20-9 NIT qualifier and 12-4 second-place MWC finisher. Under his tutelage from 2007 to 2009, the Cougars achieved the MWC's first two-time outright league championships (2007 and 2008) while adding to the streak with a share of the regular season title in 2009 to make it three-consecutive. In 2010, BYU set a program record with 30 victories and defeated Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the programs first tournament victory since 1993. In addition to the record-setting win total, the 2009-10 Cougar squad set program records for winning percentage, scoring margin, field goals, three-point field goals, turnover margin and steals. Nationally, BYU finished the season first in free throw percentage, second in scoring offense, scoring margin and three-point field goal percentage.

The only BYU men's basketball coach to ever win top conference coaching honors in back-to-back seasons, Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. In his second season, Rose coached the 2006-07 Cougars to a 25-9 overall record and NCAA berth after winning the MWC regular-season title with a 13-3 mark. In his first season, Rose received conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year accolades as well as honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program after a 1-25 season. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as Associate Head Coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job just two days after Cleveland announced his departure. Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, including defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. His efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 11 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 13 years Rose has been in Provo. Seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Jonathan Tavernari was named the 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year after fellow Cougar and second-team Freshman All-American Trent Plaisted received the same honor in 2006. In 2010 Tyler Haws was named third-team All-MWC as a freshman and set the BYU record with 48-consecutive free throws without a miss.

With 27 years of coaching experience including 15 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels, Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah) while guiding six of his seven teams to top-20 rankings, including a national ranking as high as No. 2. He earned three conference titles and was honored by his peers as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as long-time NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU, Rose has coached six players who have received All-America recognition—Mekeli Wesley (2001 AP honorable mention), Rafael Araujo (2004 Basketball Times Second Team, AP honorable mention), Trent Plaisted (2006 Scout.com Freshman Second Team), Keena Young (2007 AP honorable mention), Lee Cummar (2008 AP honorable mention, FOXSports.com Fourth Team) and Jimmer Fredette (2010 third-team Sporting News and NABC, AP Honorable Mention and Lute

Olson All-America team)—and two players who have been selected in the NBA Draft—Travis Hansen (2003) and Araujo (2004).

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose is the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before the Texas native returned to his hometown, transferring to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up after suffering a buzzer-beating defeat to North Carolina State in the NCAA Championship game. Rose spent three years at Houston, playing in 1980-81, redshirting in 1981-82 and concluding his career in 1982-83.

PERSONAL

Rose is of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Rose followed Steve Cleveland as the second BYU head coach to have served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Rose served in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie State College.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. The National Association of Basketball Coaches honored Rose with its Game Pillar Award for Service in April 2008. While at Dixie State College, Rose became the first coach in the State of Utah to participate in the American Cancer Society's nationwide Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. He has also been a volunteer coach for youth groups. Dave and Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community, receiving the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005.

The fight against Cancer became more personal for the family when Dave was diagnosed with pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor cancer in June 2009. Since the emergency surgery to remove the tumor, no other cancer has been found. Scans since the surgery by doctors at the Huntsman Cancer Institute have all come back clear. The United States Basketball Writers Association recognized Rose for his efforts with its Most Courageous Award.
